This sworn statement shall be in the form of an affidavit executed and sworn to by the bidder before a person who is authorized by the laws of the state to administer oaths. The required form of affidavit will be provided by the state to each prospective bidder. Failure to submit the sworn statement as part of the bid approval package will make the bid nonresponsive and not eligible for award consideration.

The Kansas Department of Health and Environment is soliciting comments regarding a proposed air quality operating permit. ONEOK Field Services Company—Medicine Lodge Compressor Station has applied for a Class I operating permit in accordance with the provisions of K.A.R. 28-19-510 et seq. The purpose of a Class I permit is to identify the sources and types of regulated air pollutants emitted from the facility; the emission limitations, standards and requirements applicable to each source; and the monitoring, record keeping and reporting requirements applicable to each source as of the effective date of permit issuance.

ONEOK Field Services Company—Medicine Lodge Compressor Station, Tulsa, Oklahoma, owns and operates Medicine Lodge natural gas compressor station lo-

cated at Section 25, Township 31 South, Range 12 West, Barber County, Kansas.

A copy of the proposed permit, permit application, all supporting documentation and all information relied upon during the permit application review process is available for a 30-day public review during normal business hours at the KDHE, Bureau of Air and Radiation, 1000 S.W. Jackson, Suite 310, Topeka; and at the KDHE South Central District Office, 130 S. Market, sixth floor, Wichita. To obtain or review the proposed permit and supporting documentation, contact Amer Safadi, (785) 296-1993, at the KDHE central office; or Don Mies, (316) 337-6107, at the KDHE South Central District Office. The standard departmental cost will be assessed for any copies requested.

Direct written comments or questions regarding the proposed permit to Amer Safadi, KDHE, Bureau of Air and Radiation, 1000 S.W. Jackson, Suite 310, Topeka, 66612-1366. In order to be considered in formulating a final permit decision, written comments must be received by the close of business March 10.

A person may request a public hearing be held on the proposed permit. The request for a public hearing shall be in writing and set forth the basis for the request. The written request must be submitted to Connie Carreno, Bureau of Air and Radiation, not later than the close of business March 10 in order for the Secretary of Health and Environment to consider the request.

The U.S. Environmental Protection Agency has a 45-day review period, which will start concurrently with the 30-day public comment period, within which to object to the proposed permit. If the EPA has not objected in writing to the issuance of the permit within the 45-day review period, any person may petition the administrator of the EPA to review the permit. The 60-day public petition period will directly follow the EPA 45-day review period. If the EPA waives its 45-day review period, the 60-day public petition period will start directly after the 30-day public comment period. Interested parties may contact KDHE to determine if the EPA's 45-day review period has been waived.

Any such petition shall be based only on objections to the permit that were raised with reasonable specificity during the public comment period provided for in this notice, unless the petitioner demonstrates that it was impracticable to raise such objections within such period, or unless the grounds for such objection arose after such period. ## Request for Comments

The Kansas Department of Health and Environment has received a request from Cornejo & Sons, Inc. for modification of its construction and demolition (C&D) landfill Permit No. 773 to allow continued C&D waste disposal until the originally permitted final elevations are achieved. The existing state permit for the landfill was issued based on a local Conditional Use Permit No. CU-425, which required disposal to cease by April 1, 2003, and this condition was specifically stated on the approved plans. However, on December 10, 2002, the City of Wichita granted a one-year extension of the conditional use, through April 1, 2004.

The landfill is located at 3299 Southeast Blvd., Wichita, which is in the Northeast Quarter and Southeast Quarter of Section 10 and the Northwest Quarter and Southwest Quarter of Section 11, Township 28 South, Range 1 East, in Sedgwick County. The landfill presently covers approximately 6 acres on the 26-acre property, and was designed to ultimately cover most of the property (as delineated on the design drawing). The landfill was designed with a capacity of approximately 500,000 cubic yards, and Cornejo estimates that another four to seven years of C&D waste disposal will be necessary for completion of the landfill in accordance with the original plans. The bottom of the landfill was designed at the then-existing ground surface elevations, ranging from approximately 1,260 feet to 1,300 feet. The highest final landfill elevation (including the final cover) was designed at approximately 1,315 feet, resulting in a maximum fill height of approximately 55 feet.

The application currently before the KDHE does not propose changes to the original design, only an extension on the time period of waste disposal. Sedgwick County has certified that the application described herein is consistent with local land use restrictions/zoning, and that the application is consistent with the county's solid waste management plan.

Before making a decision on this request, KDHE is soliciting public comments. A complicating factor is that the existing state permit for the landfill was inadvertently issued in violation of K.S.A. 65-3407(l), which prohibits landfills within .5 mile of a "navigable stream used for interstate commerce." The landfill is located directly adjacent to the Arkansas River.

While a permit for a new landfill at this site would not be issued if the application were considered under present knowledge, KDHE recognizes the city's support of the continued landfill operation as evidenced by the conditional use extension. KDHE also recognizes that a business investment has been made in this site. In its request, Cornejo has claimed that the continued operation of the C&D landfill will have environmental and community benefits including: (a) covering old sewage sludge pits; (b) preparing the site for use as a city park; (c) reducing erosion and transport of pollution; (d) aesthetic improvements; and (e) improved public safety. By presenting this

information, KDHE expresses neither support of nor opposition to the time extension—the information is presented strictly for the public's consideration.

KDHE is hereby soliciting public comments specifically on the following questions:

1. Should the requested time extension be granted? Why or why not?

2. In your opinion, do the potential benefits of the landfill or other factors justify perpetuating the violation of the statute that prohibits locating a landfill near the Arkansas River? Please explain your reasoning.

General comments or comments on other specific issues also will be considered, if relevant.

Anyone wishing to comment on the issues presented in this notice should submit written statements post-marked not later than March 21 to Paul Graves of KDHE (at the address listed above). In addition, an informational meeting and public hearing will be held in conjunction with the public comment period. The informational meeting will be at 6 p.m. Wednesday, March 12, in the Sedgwick County Extension Education Center, Sunflower Room, 7001 W. 21st St. North (southeast corner of 21st and Ridge Road), Wichita. At the informational meeting, KDHE staff will be present in an informal setting to respond to questions from concerned individuals regarding Cornejo's request. At 7 p.m., immediately following the informational meeting, a public hearing will be held to provide a format for individuals to make formal comments, which will be recorded by KDHE.

After consideration of all formal comments received during the public notice period, KDHE will make a final decision on whether to grant the requested time extension. Notice of the decision will be given to the applicant, to anyone who submitted formal comments, and to those who requested notice of the final decision.

The Kansas Department of Health and Environment is soliciting comments regarding a proposed air quality operating permit and amending previously-issued construction approval. Kansas State University has applied for a Class I operating permit in accordance with the provisions of K.A.R. 28-19-510 et seq. The purpose of a Class I permit is to identify the sources and types of regulated air pollutants emitted from the facility; the emission limitations, standards and requirements applicable to each source; and the monitoring, record keeping and reporting requirements applicable to each source as of the effective date of permit issuance. Notice also is given that certain requirements in the construction approval dated November 8, 1994, are being modified by a modification of approval conditions.

Kansas State University owns and operates a steam power plant and an incinerator located at the Kansas State University Campus, Manhattan, Riley County.

### Governmental Ethics Commission

#### Opinion No. 2002-25

Written December 19, 2002, to Joyce Allegrucci, Director of Transition, Governor-Elect Transition Office, Topeka.

This opinion is in response to your letter of December 11, 2002, in which you request an advisory opinion from the Kansas Governmental Ethics Commission concerning the application of the governmental ethics laws (K.S.A. 46-215 *et seq.*). We note at the outset that the Commission's jurisdiction is limited to the application of K.S.A. 46-215 *et seq.*, and whether some other statutory system, common law theory or agency rule or regulation applies to your inquiry is not covered by this opinion.

#### Factual Statement

We understand you request this opinion in your capacity as the Director of Transition for the Governor-Elect Kathleen Sebelius Transition Office. You have given the following hypothetical situation upon which you base your questions:

The Governor appoints the Chairperson of the board of directors of a private company as the Secretary of Administration. This individual receives compensation from the company in an amount greater than \$2,000.00 in a calendar year. In addition, this company has had contractual dealings with the State of Kansas through a competitive bid process in the past, and may wish to do so in the future.

#### Questions

I. Should this person accept the appointment as Secretary of Administration, would he or she be required to resign from his or her position as chairperson of the board of directors of the private company?

II. Should this person accept the appointment as Secretary of Administration, would he or she be required to forfeit his or her compensation from the private company?

III. Should this person accept the appointment as Secretary of Administration, may the private company submit competitive bids for contracts with the State?

#### Opinion

Three sections of the state conflict of interest laws must be reviewed to answer your questions: K.S.A. 46-233, which involves participation in the making of contracts; K.S.A. 46-229, which defines the term "substantial interest;" and K.S.A. 46-241, involving the use of confidential information. Each will be addressed in turn.

K.S.A. 46-233 states in pertinent part:

(a) No state officer or employee shall in the capacity as such officer or employee be substantially involved in the preparation of or participate in the making of a contract with any person or business by which such officer or employee is employed or in whose business such officer or employee or any member of such officer's or employee's immediate family has a substantial interest. . . .

. . .

(d) Subsections (a) and (b) shall not apply to the following:  
 (1) Contracts let after competitive bidding has been advertised for by published notice . . .

Pursuant to this statute, the new Secretary of Administration would be prohibited, as a state employee, from being substantially involved in the preparation of or from participating in the making of a negotiated contract with a business in which he or she holds a substantial interest or by which he or she is employed. K.S.A. 46-229 provides the definition of a substantial interest. It states in pertinent part:

(b) If an individual or an individual's spouse . . . has received during the preceding calendar year compensation . . . in an aggregate amount of \$2,000 from any business . . . the individual has a substantial interest in that business. . .

(d) If an individual or an individual's spouse holds the position of officer, director, associate, partner or proprietor of any business, the individual has a substantial interest in that business, irrespective of the amount of compensation received by the individual or individual's spouse.

Pursuant to these subsections, it is clear that the new Secretary of Administration will have a substantial interest in the private company. Therefore, the new Secretary of Administration, as a state employee, would be prohibited from being substantially involved with any negotiated contracts between the State of Kansas and the private company. Pursuant to K.S.A. 46-233(d)(1), this prohibition does not apply to contracts which are let pursuant to an advertised competitive bid procedure. Therefore, the private company would be able to bid on competitively bid contracts with the State of Kansas regardless of the new Secretary of Administration's participation in the contracts.

With respect to your first two questions, nothing in the conflict of interest laws would require the new Secretary of Administration to resign from the board or to forfeit his or her compensation from the private company.

Finally, K.S.A. 46-241 should be considered. It states:

No state officer or employee shall disclose or use confidential information acquired in the course of his or her official duties in order to further his or her own economic interest or those of any other person.

This section is self-explanatory. Confidential information obtained during the new Secretary of Administration's official duties may not be used for his or her financial gain or that of another.

In conclusion, the new Secretary of Administration would have a substantial interest in the private company, and therefore, be precluded from being involved, in his or her capacity as a state employee, in the making of a negotiated contract with that entity. The private company may bid on, and the new Secretary of Administration may participate in, any competitively bid contracts between the State and the private company. Nothing in the conflict of interest laws would require the new Secretary of Administration to resign from the board or to forfeit his or her compensation from the private company. Finally, confidential information obtained during the new

Secretary of Administration's official duties may not be used for his or her financial gain or that of another.

### Opinion No. 2002-26

Written December 19, 2002, to Jamie Clover Adams, Secretary of Agriculture, Topeka.

This opinion is in response to your letter of December 4, 2002, in which you request an opinion from the Kansas Governmental Ethics Commission concerning the state level conflict of interest laws (K.S.A. 46-215 *et seq.*). We note at the outset that the Commission's jurisdiction is limited to the application of K.S.A. 46-215 *et seq.*, and whether some other statutory system, common law theory or agency rule or regulation applies to your inquiry is not covered by this opinion.

### Factual Statement

We understand that you are asking for this opinion in your capacity as Secretary of the Kansas Department of Agriculture (KDA). You explained that you have an employee in your Division of Water Resources (DWR) who would like to perform contract work for Groundwater Management District 3 (GMD3) inspecting water flow meters. You explained that the KDA/DWR has authority under the Water Appropriations Act (the Water Act) to issue water appropriation permits and enforce compliance with the terms of those permits. The common terms and conditions of the water appropriation permits include: place of use, point of diversion, use made of the water, maximum rate at which water can be used, and total annual quantity.

In 1972, the Kansas Legislature created the Groundwater Management Districts Act (GMD Act) to give some degree of local control over groundwater in western Kansas. The GMD Act is subject to the Water Act. In addition, the local GMD offices do not have the ability to promulgate regulations. They may recommend to the KDA/DWR rules and regulations necessary to implement and enforce the policies of the GMD. The KDA/DWR then establishes those regulations.

GMD3 regulations (K.A.R. 5-23-6) give the GMD the power to require measuring devices and investigate and enforce compliance with these regulations. In 2003, the KDA/DWR will embark upon an intensified compliance program which will involve some inspections identical to standards inspected and enforced by GMD3.

### Questions

I. Under the State Governmental Ethics laws, may a KDA/DWR employee also serve as a contract employee with a GMD to conduct inspections if the KDA/DWR also inspects for the same compliance issues?

II. Is there any conflict under the state governmental ethics laws if a KDA/DWR employee operating as a contract employee of GMD3 finds no violation of district regulations on an inspection but a subsequent inspection of that well by that same employee or another KDA/DWR employee on state government time finds a violation of the KDA/DWR regulations?

III. Is there any conflict under the state governmental ethics laws if a KDA/DWR employee operating as a contract employee of GMD3 finds a violation of district reg-

ulations on an inspection but when compliance action is taken, the well owner contacts the KDA/DWR and finds no violation of KDA/DWR regulations?

IV. Is there any conflict under the state governmental ethics laws if water appropriation permit holders mistakenly believe it is a KDA/DWR employee performing inspections because they see a person whom they associate as a KDA/DWR employee performing the inspections when in fact he or she is operating as a contract inspector for GMD3?

#### Opinion

Three statutes apply to the questions you have raised: K.S.A. 46-233, which involves participation in the making of contracts; K.S.A. 46-235, which governs restrictions on compensation of state employees; and K.S.A. 46-241, which involves the use of confidential information. Each of these statutes will be addressed in turn.

K.S.A. 46-233 states in pertinent part:

(a)(1) No state officer or employee shall in the capacity as such officer or employee be substantially involved in the preparation of or participate in the making of a contract with any person or business by which such officer or employee is employed. . . .

(2) Except as otherwise provided in this subsection, whenever any individual has participated as a state officer or employee in the making of any contract with any person or business, such individual shall not accept employment with such person or business as an employee, independent contractor or subcontractor until two years after performance of the contract is completed or until two years after the individual terminates employment as a state officer or employee, whichever is sooner. . . .

Under subsection (a)(1) of this provision, the KDA/DWR employee would be prohibited, as a state employee, from being substantially involved in the preparation of or participation in the making of a non-competitively bid contract with the GMD. Additionally, under subsection (a)(2) he or she would be prohibited from accepting employment as an employee, independent contractor, subcontractor or as a consultant with the GMD, if he or she, as a state employee, had participated in the making of any non-competitively bid contract with the GMD.

K.S.A. 46-235 states in pertinent part:

No state officer or employee shall accept compensation for performance of official duties, other than that to which such person is entitled for such performance. . . . The receipt of wages or salary from an individual's non-state employer during a period of service as a state officer or employee shall not be construed as compensation for performance of official duties.

Pursuant to this statute, this state employee could not accept payment from GMD3 for performing duties he or she is assigned to perform pursuant to his or her position with the KDA/DWR. Because the KDA/DWR and GMD3 jointly have the ability to inspect and enforce the identical standards, a person hired to separately inspect for GMD3 would not be accepting compensation for the performance of his or her official duties while working for the State, so long as he or she actually performed a separate inspection for GMD3.

In addition, K.S.A. 46-241 should be considered. It states:

No state officer or employee shall disclose or use confidential information acquired in the course of his or her official duties in order to further his or her own economic interest or those of any other person.

This section is self-explanatory. Confidential information obtained during this employee's official duties with the State may not be used for his or her financial gain or the financial gain of another.

Finally, with respect to questions II. through IV., there is nothing in the state level conflict of interest laws which addresses the questions you have asked.

Therefore, under the circumstances presented, the State governmental ethics laws would not prohibit this employee from accepting contract employment with GMD3, so long as he or she had not been involved in the making of any negotiated contracts with GMD3.

#### Opinion No. 2002-27

Written December 19, 2002, to Mark A. Praeger, MD, Chairperson, Health Care Stabilization Fund, Topeka.

This opinion is in response to your letter of December 16, 2002, in which you request an advisory opinion from the Kansas Governmental Ethics Commission concerning the application of the governmental ethics laws (K.S.A. 46-215 *et seq.*). We note at the outset that the Commission's jurisdiction is limited to the application of K.S.A. 46-215 *et seq.*, and whether some other statutory system, common law theory or agency rule or regulation applies to your inquiry is not covered by this opinion.

#### Factual Statement

We understand that you request this opinion in your capacity as the Chairperson of the Kansas Health Care Stabilization Fund Board of Governors (Board). You have explained that you were appointed to the Board in 1994 by then Insurance Commissioner Ron Todd, and reappointed in 1996 and 2000 by Commissioner Kathleen Sebelius. Your current term expires in 2004 and you are not eligible for reappointment. You have also explained that your tenure on the Board is not subject to the control of the Insurance Commissioner. Your wife is State Senator Sandy Praeger, who will be sworn in as Kansas Insurance Commissioner on January 13, 2003.

#### Question

Is there a conflict of interest if you fulfill the remainder of your term as Chairperson after your wife becomes Insurance Commissioner?

#### Opinion

There is nothing in the conflict of interest laws which would prohibit you from fulfilling your term as Chairperson of the Board after your wife becomes Insurance Commissioner.

MEDICAID (MEDICAL ASSISTANCE) PROGRAM

**30-5-64. Prior authorization.** (a) Any medical service may be placed by the secretary on the published list of services requiring prior authorization or precertification for any of the following reasons:

(1) To ensure that provision of the service is medically necessary;

(2) to ensure that services that may be subject to overuse are monitored for appropriateness in each case; and

(3) to ensure that services are delivered in a cost-effective manner.

(b) Administration of covered pharmaceuticals in the following classes shall require prior authorization. A cross-reference of generic and trade names shall be made available upon request:

- (1) Acne and skin lesion products:
  - (A) Tretinoin; and
  - (B) alitretinoin;
- (2) antituberculosis products:
  - (A) Aminosalicylate sodium;
  - (B) capreomycin;
  - (C) ethambutol;
  - (D) ethionamide;
  - (E) isoniazid;
  - (F) pyrazinamide; and
  - (G) rifampin and rifampin/isoniazid combinations;
- (3) benzodiazepines:
  - (A) Alprazolam;
  - (B) clorazepate dipotassium; and
  - (C) diazepam;
- (4) all decubitus and wound care products;
- (5) all intravenous and oral dietary and nutritional products, including the following:
  - (A) Amino acids, injectable;
  - (B) l-cysteine;
  - (C) lipids, injectable; and
  - (D) sodium phenylbutyrate;
- (6) all cyclooxygenase 2 (cox 2) inhibitors:
  - (A) Celecoxib;
  - (B) rofecoxib; and
  - (C) valdecoxib;
- (7) all growth hormones and growth hormone stimulating factor, including the following:
  - (A) Somatrem;
  - (B) somatotropin; and
  - (C) sermorelin;
- (8) modafinil;
- (9) intranasal corticosteroids:
  - (A) Budesonide;
  - (B) mometasone;
  - (C) beclomethasone; and
  - (D) triamcinolone;

(10) proton pump inhibitors:

- (A) Esomeprazole;
- (B) omeprazole; and
- (C) rabeprazole;

(11) drugs for the treatment of impotence: alprostadil;

(12) monoclonal antibody for respiratory syncytial virus (RSV), including palivizumab;

(13) drugs for the treatment of obesity:

- (A) Orlistat; and
- (B) sibutramine;

(14) oxazolidinones, including linezolid;

(15) HMG-CoA reductase inhibitors: pravastatin;

(16) nonsedating antihistamines:

- (A) Desloratidine;
- (B) fexofenadine; and
- (C) loratadine;

(17) H<sub>2</sub> antagonists: nizatidine;

(18) triptans:

- (A) Naratriptan;
- (B) zolmitriptan; and
- (C) almotriptan; and

(19) the following drugs if specifically required by the physician, which shall require prior authorization to override maximum allowable cost (MAC) or federal upper limit (FUL) pricing:

- (A) Clozaril;
- (B) depakene;
- (C) tegretol; and
- (D) coumadin.

(c) Failure to obtain prior authorization, if required, shall negate reimbursement for the service and any other service resulting from the unauthorized or noncertified treatment. The prior authorization shall affect reimbursement to all providers associated with the service.

(d) The only exceptions to prior authorization shall be the following:

(1) Emergencies. If certain surgeries and procedures that require prior authorization are performed in an emergency situation, the request for authorization shall be made within two working days after the service is provided.

(2) Situations in which services requiring prior authorization are provided and retroactive eligibility is later established. When an emergency occurs or when retroactive eligibility is established, prior authorization for that service shall be waived, and if medical necessity is documented, payment shall be made.

(e) Services requiring prior authorization shall be considered covered services within the scope of the program unless the request for prior authorization is denied.
