**Office of the State Bank Commissioner****Notice of Hearing on Proposed Administrative Regulations**

A public hearing will be conducted at 9 a.m. Tuesday, August 12, in the conference room of the Office of the State Bank Commissioner, Division of Consumer and Mortgage Lending, Suite 300, 700 S.W. Jackson, Topeka, to consider the adoption of proposed permanent regulation K.A.R. 75-6-34. The proposed regulation was drafted in response to a 2002 legislative change to K.S.A. 16a-3-308 of the Uniform Consumer Credit Code (UCCC).

**K.A.R. 75-6-34** sets out criteria for automobile loan programs containing a balloon payment where the creditor is not obligated to finance that balloon on terms that are no less favorable to the consumer than the original loan contract. Legislative testimony indicates the change in K.S.A. 16a-3-308 was made to allow banks to compete with entities offering auto lease programs, and the types of programs contemplated contain terms that are similar to leases. Adoption of the regulation will have minimal economic impact on the agency, lenders or consumers, and will have no economic impact on other government agencies or units.

Jackson, Suite 300, Topeka, 66603, (785) 296-2266, TTY (785) 296-4798. The standard departmental cost will be assessed for any copies requested.

This 60-day notice of hearing shall constitute a public comment period for the purpose of receiving public comments on the proposed regulation. Written comments should be submitted prior to the hearing to Kevin Glendening, administrator of the Kansas Uniform Consumer Credit Code, at the address listed above. Interested persons will be given reasonable opportunity at the hearing to present their views and arguments on the adoption of the proposed regulation. However, presentations should be in writing whenever possible.

Any individual with a disability may request accommodation in order to participate in the public hearing and may request the proposed regulation and economic impact statement in an accessible format. Requests for accommodation should be made at least five working days before the hearing by contacting Brenda Block at (785) 296-2266, fax (785) 296-0168.

Harrison, Topeka, to consider the adoption of the following proposed new permanent Kansas Department of Transportation administrative regulations: K.A.R. 36-40-1, 36-40-2, 36-40-3, 36-40-4, 36-40-5, 36-40-6, 36-40-7, 36-40-8 and 36-40-9. The new regulations are proposed for adoption on a permanent basis.

This 60-day notice constitutes a public comment period for the purpose of receiving written public comments on the proposed regulations. **K.A.R. 36-40-4. Fund use.** This regulation will describe the priority given by the Secretary of Transportation to applications for certain types of authorized financial assistance from the transportation revolving fund available for transportation projects.

**K.A.R. 36-40-5. Financial assistance agreement requirements.** This regulation will set out required provisions that must be a part of the financial assistance agreement between the applicant for such assistance from the transportation revolving fund and the Secretary of Transportation.

**K.A.R. 36-40-6. Interest rate and servicing fees.** Any interest rate will be consistent with K.S.A. 10-1009 and amendments thereto, and service fees are authorized.

**K.A.R. 36-40-7. Repayment of financial assistance.** This regulation will describe how a financial assistance agreement's terms and conditions control the financial assistance recipient's payment of debt service and prepayment of any debt service for such financial assistance. It also will describe how a financial assistance recipient's receipt of federal reimbursement monies for certain costs previously paid by financial assistance will be treated.

**K.A.R. 36-40-8. Approved project statements.** This regulation will require the recipient of financial assistance from the transportation revolving fund to provide the Secretary of Transportation certain statements from the recipient's engineer and inspector regarding the design and construction of the approved project for which it received the financial assistance. It also will state the time when such statements are to be submitted to the secretary.

**K.A.R. 36-40-9. Approved project costs; accounting requirement.** This regulation will mandate that each recipient of financial assistance from the transportation revolving fund will be required to implement certain accounting procedures. It also will authorize the Secretary of Transportation to review and audit the cost of projects that have received financial assistance from the transportation revolving fund.

Article 5.—PROVIDER PARTICIPATION, SCOPE OF SERVICES, AND REIMBURSEMENT FOR THE MEDICAID (MEDICAL ASSISTANCE) PROGRAM

30-5-64. Prior authorization. The following changes will be made to regulation 30-5-64 regarding prior authorization of pharmaceutical products:

To ensure the most clinically appropriate utilization of these drugs in the most cost-effective manner, the following drugs will require prior authorization:

- anti-psoriatics, alefacept
• antiretroviral, enfuvirtide
• anti-rheumatics, leflunomide, infliximab, anakinra, adalimumab, etonercept
• cervical dystonias, botulinum toxins A & B
• osteoporosis, teripavatide

Federal Mandate: This regulation change is not federally mandated.

Economic Impact: It is expected that this change will reduce Medicaid expenditures by \$48,000 state general fund (\$120,000 all funds), annually.

Bearer of Cost: The cost of reviewing prior authorization (PA) will be borne by SRS. If a Medicaid consumer wishes to have a drug despite a PA denial, the cost will be borne by the consumer.

Affected Parties: Medicaid consumers, pharmacists and the Medicaid agency.

Other Methods: There were no other appropriate methods for the desired outcome.

**Article 5.—PROVIDER PARTICIPATION, SCOPE OF SERVICES, AND REIMBURSEMENTS FOR THE MEDICAID (MEDICAL ASSISTANCE) PROGRAM**

**30-5-107. Scope of non-emergency medical transportation services.** (a) Non-commercial transportation, including wheelchair transportation, to and from medicaid-covered services, shall require prior authorization except for trips to receive emergency care. Services shall be provided only when transportation is not otherwise available to the recipient.

(b) The least expensive means of transportation suitable to the recipient's medical need shall be used.

(continued)

(c) Non-emergency medical transportation for nursing facility residents shall not be covered.

(d) This regulation shall be effective on and after July 1, 2003. (Authorized by and implementing K.S.A. 39-708c; effective May 1, 1981; amended, E-82-19, Oct. 21, 1981; amended May 1, 1982; amended May 1, 1983; amended May 1, 1984; amended May 1, 1986; amended April 1, 1995; amended Oct. 1, 1997; amended July 1, 2003.)

**30-5-107a. Reimbursement for non-emergency medical transportation services.** (a) Non-commercial, non-emergency medical transportation providers shall be paid 22 cents per mile.

(b) Each commercial, non-emergency medical transportation provider shall be reimbursed at one of the following rates:

(1) For level one general transportation, \$10.00 for each one-way trip to a medicaid-covered service for a medicaid beneficiary, plus \$1.00 per mile after 10 miles; or

(2) for level two transportation for a non-ambulatory medicaid beneficiary, transportation of medical equipment with a medicaid beneficiary, or transportation of a medicaid beneficiary following a treatment that will result in a disabling physical condition, \$20.00 for each one-way trip to a medicaid-covered service for a medicaid beneficiary plus \$1.00 per mile after 10 miles.

(c) Reimbursement for necessary meals and lodging may be allowed for Kan Be Healthy participants and one attendant, subject to prior authorization.

(d) This regulation shall be effective on and after July 1, 2003. (Authorized by and implementing K.S.A. 39-708c; effective May 1, 1981; amended July 1, 2003.)

#### Article 6.—MEDICAL ASSISTANCE PROGRAM— CLIENTS' ELIGIBILITY FOR PARTICIPATION

**30-6-65. Automatic eligibles.** (a) To be automatically eligible for medical assistance, a person shall meet the general eligibility requirements of K.A.R. 30-6-50 and K.A.R. 30-6-106(c)(2) and shall be within one of the following categories:

(1) A person who is legally entitled to and receiving SSI benefits and who is in compliance with the general eligibility requirements regarding residence;

(2) a person who is legally entitled to and receiving state supplemental payments from Kansas related to SSI;

(3) a person who is determined by the SSA to retain recipient status, although not currently receiving an SSI benefit;

(4) a person who is receiving public assistance, pursuant to article 4 of these regulations;

(5) a person who is not receiving public assistance for one of the following reasons:

(A) The person is eligible for less than \$10.00 of public assistance;

(B) the amount of recovery of an overpayment is greater than the budget deficit;

(C) the person is eligible using prospective budgeting, but ineligible due to retrospective accounting of income; or

(D) the person is eligible for TAF but does not wish to receive cash assistance;

(6) a person who is included in the assistance plan of a family that was receiving TAF, foster care assistance, or medical assistance based on the criteria of paragraph (a)(5)(D) in at least three of the six months immediately before the month in which the family became ineligible for TAF, foster care, or medical assistance based on the criteria of paragraph (a)(5)(D) as a result, in whole or in part, of collection or increased collection of support. Automatic eligibility for the medical assistance program shall continue for the four months immediately after the last month in which the family was eligible and legally entitled to receive TAF, foster care assistance, or medical assistance based on the criteria of paragraph (a)(5)(D) as long as the family remains ineligible for TAF, foster care, or medical assistance based on the criteria of paragraph (a)(5)(D) due to collection or increased collection of support;

(7) a person who is mandated to receive inpatient treatment for tuberculosis;

(8) a person who is not a public assistance recipient but is receiving maintenance payments from youth services;

(9) a child who is under 18 years of age and who meets the TAF income and resource requirements pursuant to article 4 of these regulations;

(10) a child born to a mother who is eligible for and receiving medicaid at the time of birth, for a period of up to one year, if both of the following requirements are met:

(A) The child shall remain eligible as long as the mother remains eligible for medicaid or would be eligible for medicaid if still pregnant; and

(B) the child shall remain in the same household with the mother;

(11) a child receiving foster care payments under title IV-E, regardless of the state making the payments;

(12) a child for whom an adoption assistance agreement under title IV-E is in effect, even if assistance payments are not being made or the adoption assistance agreement was entered into with another state. Automatic eligibility shall begin when the child is placed for adoption, even if an interlocutory decree of adoption or a judicial decree of adoption has not been issued;

(13) a child for whom a non-title IV-E adoption assistance agreement is in effect between the state and the adoptive parents and who cannot be placed without medical assistance because the child has special needs for medical or rehabilitative care; or

(14) a person who is included in the assistance plan of a family that meets the following conditions for transitional medical services:

(A) The family has received TAF or medical assistance based on the criteria in paragraph (a)(5)(D) in three of the six months immediately before the first month of transitional medical services; and

(B) the family has lost eligibility for TAF or medical assistance based on the criteria in paragraph (a)(5)(D) due solely to increased earned income or hours of employment of the caretaker.

Assistance shall be initially provided for a period not to exceed six months if the individual submits ongoing status reports as may be required by the secretary.

Assistance shall be provided for an additional six-month period if the individual submits ongoing status

reports as may be required by the secretary and if the individual's gross earned income, less the cost of child-care, does not exceed 185 percent of the federal poverty income guidelines.

**30-6-108. Real property.** (a) Definitions.

(1) "Home" means the house or shelter in which the applicant or recipient is living or from which the applicant or recipient is temporarily absent, as well as the tract of land and contiguous tracts of land upon which the house and other improvements essential to the use or enjoyment of the home are located. Tracts of land shall be considered to be contiguous if lying side by side, except for streets, alleys, or other easements. Pieces of property that touch only at the corners shall not be considered to be contiguous.

(2) For non-SSI, "other real property" means any of the following types of property:

- (A) Real property other than a home;
- (B) a home from which an applicant or recipient has been temporarily absent for at least 12 months; or
- (C) a home to which an applicant or recipient will be unable to return.

(3) For SSI, "other real property" means any of the following types of property:

- (A) Real property other than a home; or
- (B) a home from which an applicant or recipient has been absent and does not intend to return.

(4) For persons entering institutional living situations, the home shall become other real property after three months unless the absence is determined to be temporary, or a spouse, dependent child, or another dependent relative remains in the home.

(b) Treatment of real property. The equity value of nonexempt real property shall be considered as a resource.

(c) Exempted real property. The equity value of the following classifications of real property shall be exempt:

- (1) The home;
- (2) other real property that is essential for employment or self-employment;

(3) for non-SSI, other real property that is producing income consistent with its fair market value;

(4) for SSI, income-producing other real property that is used in an individual's trade or business; and

(5) for SSI, the equity value of non-business income-producing other real property if both of the following conditions are met:

(A) The equity value of the income-producing other real property plus the equity value of non-business income-producing personal property does not exceed \$6,000.00; and

(B) a net annual return of at least six percent of the total equity is produced.

(d) This regulation shall be effective on and after July 1, 2003. **30-6-109. Personal property.** (a) Definitions.

(1) "Personal property" means all property, excluding real property.

(2) "Cash assets" means the following resources:

- (A) Money;
- (B) investments;
- (C) cash surrender or loan values of life insurance policies;
- (D) trust funds; and
- (E) similar items on which a determinate amount of money can be realized.

(3) "Other personal property" means the following:

- (A) Personal effects;
- (B) household equipment and furnishings;
- (C) home produce;
- (D) livestock;
- (E) equipment;
- (F) vehicles;
- (G) inventory;
- (H) contracts from the sale of property; and
- (I) similar items on which a determinate amount of money can be realized.

(b) Treatment of personal property. Personal property, unless exempted, shall be considered a resource. Trust funds shall be subject to subsection (c).

(c) Treatment of trust funds. For purposes of determining an individual's eligibility for assistance or the amount of assistance, the following requirements shall apply to trust funds. The term "trust" shall include any legal instrument or device that is similar to a trust, including an annuity. The term "assets" shall be defined as specified in K.A.R. 30-6-56(a)(3).

(1) In the case of a revocable trust, the value of the trust shall be considered a resource available to the individual. Payments from the trust to or for the benefit of the indi-

(continued)

vidual shall be considered to be income. All other payments made from the trust shall be considered under the property transfer provisions of K.A.R. 30-6-56.

(2) Irrevocable trusts.

(A) If there are any circumstances under which payment from an irrevocable trust could be made to the individual or for the benefit of the individual, the portion of the trust from which payment could be made shall be considered as a resource available to the individual. Payments made from the trust to the individual or for the benefit of the individual shall be considered income. All other payments made from the trust shall be considered under the property transfer provisions of K.A.R. 30-6-56.

(B) Each portion of the trust from which no payment could be made to the individual under any circumstances shall be considered from the date of establishment of the trust, or if later, the date on which payment to the individual was restricted or foreclosed, under the property transfer provisions of K.A.R. 30-6-56.

(3) An individual shall be considered to have established a trust if assets of the individual were used to form all or part of the trust and if any of the following individuals established the trust, other than by will:

(A) The individual or the individual's spouse;

(B) any person, including a court or administrative body, with legal authority to act in place of or on behalf of the individual or the individual's spouse; or

(C) any person, including any court or administrative body, acting at the direction or upon the request of the individual or the individual's spouse.

(4) If the corpus of the trust includes assets of any other person or persons, the provisions of this subsection shall apply to the portion of the trust attributable to the assets of the individual.

(5) The provisions of this subsection shall apply without regard to the purposes for which the trust was established, whether or not the trustees have or exercise any discretion under the trust, any restrictions on when or whether distributions can be made from the trust, or any restrictions on the use of distributions from the trust.

(6)(A) The provisions of this subsection shall not apply to a trust that contains the assets of an individual under age 65 who meets the blindness or disability criteria of K.A.R. 30-6-85 and that is established for the benefit of the individual by a parent, grandparent, or legal guardian of the individual, or a court. The state shall receive all amounts remaining in the trust upon the death of the individual, up to an amount equal to the total medical assistance paid on behalf of the individual.

(B) The provisions of this subsection shall not apply to a trust containing the assets of an individual who meets the blindness or disability criteria of K.A.R. 30-6-85 if the trust meets all the following criteria:

(i) The trust is established by a nonprofit association.

(ii) A separate account is maintained for each beneficiary of the trust.

(iii) Accounts in the trust are established solely for the benefit of individuals who meet the blindness or disability criteria of K.A.R. 30-6-85.

(iv) Each account in the trust is established by that individual; the parent, grandparent, or legal guardian of the individual; or a court. The state shall receive all

amounts remaining in the individual's account upon the death of the individual up to an amount equal to the total medical assistance paid on behalf of the individual.

(7) The provisions of this subsection shall be waived if it is determined that a waiver is necessary to avoid undue hardship on the individual. A finding of undue hardship may be granted if the individual verifies that all of the following conditions have been met:

(A) The individual has exhausted all legal remedies for gaining access to the principal or income of the trust.

(B) All otherwise available assets have been expended to meet living and medical expenses.

(C) The individual's health or life would be endangered if the individual were deprived of medical care.

(d) Exempted personal property. The resource value of the following classifications of personal property shall be exempt:

(1) Personal effects;

(2) household equipment and furnishings in use or only temporarily not in use;

(3) tools in use and necessary for the maintenance of a house or a garden;

(4) the stock and inventory of any self-employed person that are reasonable and necessary in the production of goods and services;

(5) items for home consumption, which shall consist of the following:

(A) Produce from a small garden consumed from day to day and any excess that can be canned or stored; and

(B) a small flock of fowl or livestock that is used to meet the food requirements of the family;

(6) cash assets that are traceable to income exempted as income and as a cash asset;

(7) any contract for the sale of property, if the proceeds from the contract are considered as income;

(8) one vehicle for each assistance family. Additional vehicles may be exempt if used over 50 percent of the time for employment or self-employment, if used as the family's home, if needed for medical treatment of a specific medical problem, or if specially equipped for use by a handicapped person;

(9) individual development accounts funded under public law 105-285, authorized by section 404(h) of title VI of the social security act, or established by the state;

(10) individual training accounts administered by the Kansas department of human resources under the workforce investment act for purposes of job training or other employment readiness services. Deposits shall not exceed 50 percent of earned income in any calendar year and shall be maintained in a separate account;

(11) for non-SSI income-producing personal property, other than cash assets, that is essential for employment or self-employment or producing income consistent with its fair market value. Income-producing property may include any of the following items:

(A) Tools;

(B) equipment;

(C) machinery; or

(D) livestock;

(12) for non-SSI, proceeds from the sale of a home if the proceeds are conserved for the purchase of a new home and the funds so conserved are expended or com-



mitted to be expended in the month received or in the following month;

(13) for non-SSI, burial plots and funeral agreements that meet conditions established by the secretary of health and human services and approved by the secretary of social and rehabilitation services;

(14) for non-SSI, escrow accounts established for families participating in the family self-sufficiency program through the department of housing and urban development. Interest earned on the accounts shall also be exempted as income;

(15) for non-SSI, the cash value of any life insurance policy;

(16) for SSI, insurance not exceeding \$1,500.00 face value that is owned by any applicant or recipient. The face value shall not include and shall not be increased by accumulated dividends, but shall be decreased by any outstanding policy loan. If the total face value of insurance policies owned by any one individual exceeds \$1,500.00, the total cash surrender value of those policies shall be a nonexempt resource;

(17) for SSI, any personal property of a blind or disabled person that is covered by an approved plan of self-support;

(18) for SSI, burial plots that meet conditions established by the secretary of health and human services for the SSI program;

(19) for SSI, any burial contract that meets conditions established by the secretary of health and human services for the SSI program and approved by the secretary of social and rehabilitation services;

(20) for SSI, proceeds from the sale of a home if the proceeds are conserved for the purchase of a new home and the funds so conserved are expended or committed to be expended within three months of the sale;

(21) for SSI, a retroactive social security payment received by the applicant or recipient or an ineligible legally responsible person for the nine months following the month of receipt;

(22) for SSI, pension funds owned by an applicant's or recipient's spouse or parent if the spouse or parent is not an applicant for or recipient of SSI;

(23) for SSI, retirement accounts and pensions of any employed individual who meets the provisions of K.A.R. 30-6-88;

(24) for SSI, the equity value of income-producing personal property, other than cash assets, that is used in an individual's trade or business; and

(25) for SSI, the equity value of non-business income-producing property, other than cash assets, if both of the following conditions are met:

(A) The equity value of income-producing personal property plus the equity value of non-business income-producing real property does not exceed \$6,000.00; and

(B) a net annual return of at least six percent of the total equity is produced.

#### Article 44.—SUPPORT ENFORCEMENT

##### 30-44-5. Scope of services; judgment interest. (a)

Except as otherwise provided in subsection (b), the scope of child support enforcement services related to judgment interest shall be limited to enforcement of a lump sum previously determined by a tribunal of competent jurisdiction, if the judgment interest debt can be enforced in the same manner as that for a debt for child support.

(b) If the director of child support enforcement services determines that conducting or participating in a pilot project is in the best interests of the child support enforcement program, additional services related to judgment interest may be authorized by the director in cases selected for the pilot project.

(c) This regulation shall be effective on and after July 1, 2003. (Authorized by and implementing K.S.A. 39-753; effective July 1, 2003.)

##### FORD HARLEY-DAVIDSON F-150™ TRUCK DRAWING

**111-4-1970. Name of drawing.** The Kansas lottery shall conduct a drawing entitled "Ford Harley-Davidson™ F-150 Truck Drawing," and will accept entries starting the date "Ford Harley-Davidson™ F-150 Truck" instant tickets become available for the drawing to be conducted at 10:00 a.m. on April 18, 2003, and June 13, 2003. Rules applicable to the "Ford Harley-Davidson™ F-150 Truck Drawing" are contained in K.A.R. 111-4-1970 through 111-4-1975 and K.A.R. 111-3-1 *et seq.* (Authorized by K.S.A. 2001 Supp. 74-8710; implementing K.S.A. 2001 Supp. 74-8710 and K.S.A. 74-8720; effective, T-111-4-8-03, Dec. 17, 2002; amended, T-111-5-28-03, May 21, 2003.)

**111-4-2023. Prize.** (a) The winner of the grand prize at the "Thunderbird Drawing," which will be conducted on September 14, 2003, shall receive a 2003 Limited Edition 007™ Ford Thunderbird automobile. The value of the grand prize is approximately \$66,000, including the cost of the vehicle, all applicable sales and property taxes, registration, license tag, and title fees, and cash.

(b) There will be five additional winners selected at the drawing and they shall each receive a \$2,000 cash prize.

(c) All prizes are subject to lottery validation, set-offs and deductions authorized by law.

(d) The winner of the grand prize 2003 Limited Edition 007™ Ford Thunderbird automobile shall return to the lottery a completed claim form as provided by the lottery no later than 5:00 p.m. on the tenth day following the day the claim form is mailed to the person whose name was drawn or the person named on the ticket drawn will no longer be eligible for the prize. In such an event, the first eligible alternate entry drawn for that prize pursuant to subsection (e) of K.A.R. 111-4-2026 shall be declared the winner.

(e) The five additional winners of the \$2,000 cash prizes shall return to the lottery a completed claim form as provided by the lottery no later than 5:00 p.m. on the forty-fifth day following the day the claim form is mailed to the person whose name was drawn or the person named on the ticket drawn will no longer be eligible for the prize. In such an event, the first eligible alternate entry drawn for that prize pursuant to subsection (e) of K.A.R. 111-4-2026 shall be declared the winner. (Authorized by and implementing K.S.A. 2002 Supp. 74-8710; effective, T-111-5-20-03, April 16, 2003; amended, T-111-5-28-03, May 21, 2003.)

**111-4-2026. Selection of winners.** The following process shall be used for the selection of winners in the "Thunderbird Drawing:"

(a) Kansas lottery personnel shall pick up all mail containing "Thunderbird Drawing" tickets at the United States Post Office in Topeka, Kansas, with the final pick up at the Topeka post office in the morning mail pickup on Tuesday, September 9, 2003. Following the morning mail pickup on Tuesday, September 9, 2003, the envelopes containing mailed entries will be transported to lottery headquarters and opened by lottery personnel. All mailed entries shall then be placed in a secure receptacle, transported to the state fair, and placed in the drawing receptacle or drum with all entries deposited at the state fair and the Kansas Speedway.

(b) The drawing shall be held at the Kansas state fair lottery building and shall be open to the public with lottery security personnel present. The drawing shall be audio and video taped.

(c) At the final drawing on Sunday, September 14, 2003, lottery security personnel will be present with the person designated by the executive director to perform the drawing. Prior to the drawing, if a drum is used, the drum shall be sealed and the contents mixed by rotating the drum at least 10 times. If a receptacle other than a drum

is used, the contents shall be mixed with a shovel or by other means for at least three minutes prior to the drawing.

(d) The designated individual shall then unseal the drum, if a drum is used, and using the bare-arm technique, while looking away, remove a single entry from the receptacle or drum. The person whose name appears on the entry shall be the winner of the grand prize identified in K.A.R. 111-4-2023, subject to validation by the lottery as set forth in these rules.

(e) After a single entry has been drawn on September 14, 2003, and the entry has been verified as valid, nine more valid entries will be drawn, one at a time. The first five valid entries of these nine entries drawn will be awarded in the order drawn five secondary prizes of \$2,000 each. The last four entries drawn will serve as alternate entries for the grand prize and secondary prizes. The alternate entries will be marked in order drawn, 1A, 2A, 3A, and 4A. Each winner shall have until 5:00 p.m. on the forty-fifth day following mailing of a claim form to the winner to present the fully-executed claim form to lottery headquarters. If the grand prize winner cannot be located or is declared ineligible, or fails to timely present a fully-executed claim form to lottery headquarters, the grand prize will be awarded to the first alternate entry drawn for the five \$2,000 prizes. The alternates will be used, if necessary, in the order drawn. If a winner or an alternate winner for the grand prize or a secondary prize cannot be located, is declared ineligible, or fails to present a fully-executed claim form to lottery headquarters as required herein, the alternate winner process shall be repeated until all prizes are properly claimed or until such time as no alternate winners remain, whichever occurs first.

(f) The Kansas lottery security official present shall review each ticket drawn to determine the validity of the entry into the "Thunderbird Drawing" in accordance with these regulations. If it is a valid entry and the name is legible, the event manager and the security person present shall record the name of the winner and the prize won. The prize winners shall be given or sent a prize claim form to be completed and returned as set forth in subsection (e) herein.

(g) If any entry drawn is determined to be ineligible, it shall be discarded by the security person present and another entry drawn. This procedure will be repeated until the required number of apparently eligible selections is obtained.

(h) Only non-winning "Thunderbird" instant tickets are eligible for the drawing.

(i) All "Thunderbird" tickets remaining in the drum or receptacle on September 14, 2003, after the winners and alternates have been selected, and all entries not received in compliance with these rules, shall be destroyed pursuant to K.A.R. 111-3-34.
