Administrative Regulations

A public hearing will be conducted at 10:30 a.m. Tuesday, October 7, 2003, in Room 108, Landon State Office Building, 900 S.W. Jackson, Topeka, to consider the adoption of a proposed rule and regulation of the Division of Personnel Services, Department of Administration, on a permanent basis.

This 60-day notice of the public hearing shall constitute a public comment period for the purpose of receiving written public comments on the proposed rule and regulation. All interested parties may submit written comments prior to the hearing to the Secretary of Administration, 1000 S.W. Jackson, Suite 500, Topeka, 66612. All interested parties will be given a reasonable opportunity to present their views orally on the adoption of the proposed regulation during the hearing. In order to give all parties an opportunity to present their views, it may be necessary to request that each participant limit any oral presentation to five minutes.

Any individual with a disability may request accommodation in order to participate in the public hearing and may request the proposed regulation and economic impact statement in an accessible format. Requests for accommodation should be made at least five working days in advance of the hearing by contacting Faith Loretto at (785) 296-6000. The north entrance to the Landon State Office Building is accessible. Handicapped parking is located at the south end of building, across the street from the north entrance to the building, and on Ninth Street just around the corner from the north entrance.

Summaries of the proposed regulation and its economic impact follow:

K.A.R. 1-6-21, candidate pools for regular positions, is being amended to reflect changes that are being made to the registration, recruitment, certification and selection processes for the state of Kansas. Beginning in fiscal year 2004, these processes have been decentralized so that each state agency is able to establish and implement certification, recruitment and selection processes and procedures that best fit that agency's capabilities and goals. Under the decentralized approach, agencies will not be required to use a standardized procedure in which applicants are ranked based on points assigned to selected skills and experience requirements.

As a result of these changes, amendments to K.A.R. 1-6-21 are necessary relating to the preference that veterans receive for classified positions with the state of Kansas. The proposed amendments to K.A.R. 1-6-21 would require that each individual who is identified and verified as eligible for the veterans' preference and who meets the minimum qualifications for any vacancy posted to the notice of vacancies will be offered an opportunity to interview for the position.

Additional proposed amendments to K.A.R. 1-6-21 involve a reorganization and rewording of subsections (a) and (b). The first clarification is to the language that al-

lows agencies to fill multiple vacancies from the same candidate pool. This provision is the current subject of paragraphs (a)(1) and (a)(2), but the language has been condensed and is now contained in one paragraph. The time frame during which this process can occur also has been extended to 60 days instead of the current 30 days, in order to allow for greater flexibility. In addition, the language regarding the application of selection criteria to candidates is being changed, but the change has no substantive impact. These amendments are not expected to have an economic impact on the Department of Administration, other state agencies, state employees, applicants for classified jobs or the general public.

The most significant economic impact on state agencies that could result from the proposed veterans' preference amendments would be in the form of the additional staff time that it may take to contact, make arrangements for, and interview applicants who identify themselves as veterans. Since there is no way to determine how many vacancies will be posted in any given year, there is no way to accurately estimate how often the veterans' preference will be exercised. The only pertinent, available information is data indicating that veterans have represented only 5.38 percent of the state's total applicant pool since 1996. Therefore, it is anticipated that the overall economic impact of this amendment should be minimal and that state agencies should be able to conduct interviews for veterans with existing resources. Implementation of the proposed amendments will not have any additional economic impact on the Department of Administration other than the potential costs identified above for all state agencies.

For those applicants for classified positions who are veterans and who choose to identify themselves as such, the veterans' preference may have a positive economic impact since veterans will be guaranteed an opportunity to interview for the position. By design, this preference could enhance the possibility that the veteran will be hired for the position. However, this preference for veterans is not expected to have an adverse economic impact on other applicants who are not veterans. Ensuring that qualified veterans have an opportunity to interview for classified positions should not, in and of itself, have an adverse impact on another qualified applicant for the position since agencies are allowed to determine how many applicants they will interview for the position. No economic impact on the general public is anticipated.

Bond Details

The bonds will consist of fully registered bonds in the denomination of \$5,000 or any integral multiple thereof. The bonds will initially be registered in the name of Cede & Co., as nominee of the Depository Trust Company, New York, New York, to which payments of principal of and interest on the bonds will be made. Individual purchases of bonds will be made in book-entry form only. Purchasers will not receive certificates representing their interest in bonds purchased. The bonds will be subject to optional redemption prior to maturity as provided in the official notice of bond sale and preliminary official statement.

The bonds will bear interest from the date thereof at rates to be determined when the bonds are sold as hereinafter provided, which interest will be payable semiannually on March 1 and September 1 in each year, beginning March 1, 2004.

Notice of Hearing on Proposed
Administrative Regulations

A public hearing will be conducted by the Governmental Ethics Commission at 2 p.m. Thursday, October 16, in the conference room of the commission's office at 109 W. 9th, Suite 504, Topeka, to consider the approval and adoption of proposed changes in existing rules and regulations.

This 60-day notice of the public hearing shall constitute a public comment period for the purpose of receiving written public comments on the proposed rules and regulations. All interested parties may submit written comments prior to the hearing to the chairman of the Governmental Ethics Commission, 109 S.W. 9th, Topeka, 66612. All interested parties will be given a reasonable opportunity to present their views orally in regard to the adoption of the proposed regulations during the hearing. In order to give all parties an opportunity to present their views, it may be necessary to request that each participant limit any oral presentation to five minutes.

Any individual with a disability may request accommodation in order to participate in the public hearing and may request the proposed regulations and economic impact statements in an accessible format. Requests for accommodation should be made at least five working days before the hearing by contacting Donna Williams. Handicapped parking is located in the front of the building. The front entrance to the building is accessible to individuals with disabilities.

These regulations are proposed for adoption on a permanent basis. A brief summary of the regulations is set forth below:

K.A.R. 19-2-2. Advisory opinions. This regulation is being amended to require each applicant submitting an advisory opinion request to submit such request so it is received in the commission's office 10 or more days before the commission's next regularly scheduled meeting. The commission can determine that a longer or shorter period of time is necessary. In addition, an applicant will be required to provide a telephone number with his or her advisory opinion request. The purpose of this amendment is to provide the commission's attorney sufficient time to analyze, research and draft an opinion and provide sufficient time for commissioners to review the draft prior to their meeting. Requiring the applicant to provide a telephone number will permit commission staff to contact and discuss the request with the applicant.

K.A.R. 19-20-4. Disclosure required on political advertising. This regulation is being proposed to clarify the requirements for using the paid for by attribution statement for political advertisements, brochures and political fact sheets that expressly advocate the election or defeat of a state or local candidate under the Campaign Finance Act. The guidelines for where the attribution statement must be placed and what names must appear are set forth in this regulation. The regulation also outlines what does and what does not constitute the statutory phrase brochure, flier or other political fact sheet. This regulation will codify prior advisory opinions issued by the commission.

K.A.R. 19-40-5. Contracts. The new language being added to this regulation sets forth the requirements that determine when a state officer or employee is substantially involved in the preparation of a contract or participates in the making of a contract that contains both competitively bid and negotiated elements. Currently, state statutes prohibit a state officer or employee from being substantially involved in the making of a contract with any person or business the employee or a member of the employee's immediate family is employed by or has a substantial interest in. The proposed language clarifies the situations that determine an individual's substantial involvement in these hybrid contracts.

K.A.R. 19-63-6. Lobbyist's records. This regulation sets forth what records a lobbyist must maintain. In 2000, K.S.A. 46-269 was amended to require lobbyists to provide more detailed information on their employment and expenditure reports concerning hospitality, gifts and entertainment provided to legislators and legislative staff. This regulation is being amended to clarify what additional records a lobbyist must keep to substantiate the reportable expenditures on his or her report.

K.A.R. 19-60-3. Definitions. This regulation defines some of the terms used in the lobbying sections of the governmental ethics laws, K.S.A. 46-215 et seq. Many of the definitions in this regulation have been amended to change the phrase "state officer or employee" to "officers or employees of the legislative branch, candidates for the legislature, or legislators-elect." This phrase change is necessary to bring the regulation in compliance with state statutes since a lobbyist can no longer provide hospitality, entertainment or gifts to executive branch officers and employees. The definition of "invitation" is being added to clarify what factors will be considered in determining whether an invitation is issued in good faith.

Economic Impact Summary: The above proposed regulations are not anticipated to have a significant economic impact on the commission, other agencies, or the general public. These regulations are not mandated by federal law.

Notice of Hearing on Proposed Administrative Regulations

A public hearing will be conducted at 1:30 p.m. Wednesday, October 8, in Room 530 of the Curtis State Office Building, 1000 S.W. Jackson, Topeka, to consider the adoption of proposed new solid waste regulations K.A.R. 28-29-300, 28-29-302, 28-29-304, 28-29-308, 28-29-321 and 28-29-325. These proposed regulations will apply to construction and demolition (C&D) landfills.

The regulations are proposed to be adopted on a permanent basis. A summary of the proposed regulations, their environmental benefit and the estimated economic impact follows:

K.A.R. 28-29-300. Applicability and definitions. This regulation clarifies who the C&D regulations apply to and defines terms used in the C&D regulations. This proposed regulation does not provide any direct environmental benefit and will not impose any costs on the regulated community.

K.A.R. 28-29-302. Construction and demolition (C&D) landfill location restrictions. This regulation specifies location restrictions on new C&D landfills and expansions of existing C&D landfills with respect to the following: flood plains, threatened or endangered species, surface waters, schools and other occupied buildings, navigable streams and public drinking water supplies, groundwater, unstable areas and cultural resources.

The regulation consolidates location restriction requirements currently found in federal regulations, Kansas statutes and regulations, and Kansas Department of Health and Environment policies into one regulation specific to C&D landfills. It provides specific criteria to replace the current vague regulation concerning departmental approval of landfill locations. This regulation will make the criteria for siting C&D landfills easier for applicants to understand and facilitate the permit application process.

Since in practice all the requirements of this regulation are already in place, this regulation will not have any direct environmental benefit, but rather will facilitate the permit application process. This proposed regulation will not impose any additional costs on the regulated community.

K.A.R. 28-29-304. Construction and demolition (C&D) landfill design. This regulation specifies design requirements for C&D landfills, including facility access, signs, on-site roads, stormwater control, contact water control, phasing of operation and final cover. Many of these requirements are already in effect through existing regulations that apply to all solid waste facilities, but specific requirements are provided in areas where the existing regulation is vague.

These requirements are necessary to ensure that each C&D landfill is designed to minimize the potential for risks to human health and contamination of the environment. The estimated average economic impact to each regulated facility is a \$4,650 one-time cost and a \$100 annual cost.

K.A.R. 28-29-308. Construction and demolition (C&D) landfill operations. This regulation specifies operating requirements for C&D landfills, including dust and litter control, air quality, fire protection, water management, access control, waste screening, waste placement and compaction, waste disposal and recycling records, cover requirements, salvaging, scavenging, on-site communications, safety, record keeping and reporting.

Many of these requirements are already in effect through existing regulations that apply to all solid waste facilities, but specific requirements are provided in areas where the existing regulation is vague. There are new requirements for record keeping and post-closure inspections, which will facilitate departmental monitoring of C&D landfill operations.

Since C&D landfills are not designed to prevent the escape of hazardous waste constituents, the disposal of inappropriate waste in these landfills could lead to groundwater contamination. The requirements in this regulation are necessary to ensure that each C&D landfill is operated in a manner that minimizes the potential for risks to human health and contamination of the environment. The estimated average economic impact to each regulated facility is a \$100 one-time cost and a \$600 annual cost.

K.A.R. 28-29-321. Construction and demolition (C&D) landfill closure and post-closure care. This regulation specifies requirements for landfill closure and requirements for post-closure care of the landfill. Most of the requirements are already in effect through existing regulation.

The proposed regulation requires annual inspection of the landfill by the owner for at least five years after closure. This will help ensure the effectiveness and integrity of the landfill cover, thus preventing exposure of waste and excessive infiltration of water into the landfill. The estimated average economic impact to each regulated facility is \$200 annually for five years.

K.A.R. 28-29-325. Construction and demolition (C&D) landfill permits. This regulation specifies requirements and procedures for permit applications, permit modifi-

cations and permit renewal. Many of the requirements are already in effect through existing regulation or are requirements on the permit application form.

The proposed regulation requires that design and operating plans that do not meet the requirements of the proposed regulations must be revised and submitted to the department not more than 90 days after the effective date of the regulation. This helps ensure that landfills will be operated in a manner that minimizes risks to human health and the environment.

The proposed regulation also requires that certain documents be prepared and sealed by an engineer. This ensures compliance with statutes governing the technical professions and helps ensure that landfills are properly designed, thus minimizing risks to human health and the environment. The estimated average economic impact to each regulated facility is a \$175 one-time cost.

KDHE will have the responsibility for implementing and enforcing the proposed amendments to the regulations. The proposed amendments will not result in an increase in cost to the agency or an increase in paperwork.

Failure to adopt these regulations will make the criteria for siting, designing, operating, and permitting C&D landfills more difficult for applicants, owners, operators, and consultants to understand, resulting in wasted time and money. Failure to adopt these regulations could also result in contamination of groundwater and/or surface water and the consequent risks to human health.

The time period between publication of this notice and the scheduled hearing serves as the required public comment period of at least 60 days for the purpose of receiving written public comments on the proposed regulations. All interested parties may submit written comments prior to the hearing to George McCaskill, Department of Health and Environment, Bureau of Waste Management, 1000 S.W. Jackson, Suite 320, Topeka, 66612-1366, (785) 296-1606. All interested parties will be given a reasonable opportunity to present their views orally on the adoption of the proposed regulations during the hearing. In order to give all parties an opportunity to present their views, it may be necessary to request that each participant limit any oral presentation to five minutes.

Any individual with a disability may request accommodation in order to participate in the public hearing and may request the proposed regulations and regulatory impact statements in an accessible format.
