The public hearing will continue concerning the department's proposed amendments to K.A.R. 115-21-1, K.A.R. 115-21-2 and K.A.R. 115-25-10. The commission is withdrawing proposed amendments to K.A.R. 115-2-1 from consideration at this time. A notice of this public hearing was published for these regulatory actions on June 19, 2003 in the Kansas Register.

In order to be considered in formulating a final permit decision, written comments must be received by the close of business September 15.

A person may request a public hearing be held on the proposed permit. The request for a public hearing shall be in writing and set forth the basis for the request. The written request must be submitted to Connie Carreno, Bureau of Air and Radiation, 1000 S.W. Jackson, Suite 310, Topeka, 66612-1366, not later than the close of business September 15 in order for the Secretary of Health and Environment to consider the request.

The U.S. Environmental Protection Agency has a 45-day review period, which will start concurrently with the 30-day public comment period, within which to object to the proposed permit. If the EPA has not objected in writing to the issuance of the permit within the 45-day review period, any person may petition the administrator of the EPA to review the permit. The 60-day public petition period will directly follow the EPA 45-day review period. If the EPA waives its 45-day review period, the 60-day public petition period will start directly after the 30-day public comment period. Interested parties may contact KDHE to determine if the EPA's 45-day review period has been waived.

Any such petition shall be based only on objections to the permit that were raised with reasonable specificity during the public comment period provided for in this notice, unless the petitioner demonstrates that it was impracticable to raise such objections within such period, or unless the grounds for such objection arose after such period.
