A public hearing will be conducted at 9 a.m. Thursday, October 16, in the offices of the Kansas Development Finance Authority, 555 S. Kansas Ave., Suite 202, Topeka, on the proposal for the Kansas Development Finance Authority to issue its Agricultural Development Revenue Bond for the projects numbered below in the respective maximum principal amount. The bond will be issued to assist the respective borrower named below (who will be the owner and operator of the project) to finance the cost in the amount of the bond of acquiring the project or for the purpose of refunding a bond previously issued to finance the project. The projects shall be located as shown:

**Project No. 000576—Maximum Principal Amount: \$93,000.** Owner/Operator: James A. and Cheryl A. Zeller. Description: Acquisition of 126 acres of agricultural land and related improvements and equipment to be used by the owner/operator for farming purposes. Description: Acquisition of 40 acres of agricultural land and related improvements and equipment to be used by the owner/operator for farming purposes. The project is located at Northwest Quarter of the Southeast Quarter

of Section 24, Township 23 South, Range 7 West in Reno County, Kansas, approximately 2 miles north, 1 mile east and .5 mile north of Partridge.

The bond, when issued, will be a limited obligation of the Kansas Development Finance Authority and will not constitute a general obligation or indebtedness of the State of Kansas or any political subdivision thereof, including K DFA, nor will it be an indebtedness for which the faith and credit and taxing powers of the State of Kansas are pledged. The bond will be payable solely from amounts received from the respective borrower, the obligation of which will be sufficient to pay the principal of, interest and redemption premium, if any, on the bond when it becomes due.

All individuals who appear at the hearing will be given an opportunity to express their views, and all written comments previously filed with K DFA at its offices at 555 S. Kansas Ave., Suite 202, Topeka, 66603, will be considered. Additional information regarding the projects may be obtained by contacting K DFA.

Any individual affected by the above-described projects may, at or prior to the hearing, file a written request with K DFA that a local hearing be held on the proposal to issue a bond to finance said project. A local hearing, if requested, would be conducted in the county where the project in question is located.

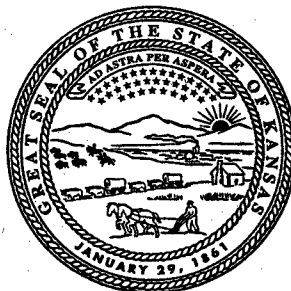

## Behavioral Sciences Regulatory Board

Notice of Hearing on Proposed  
Administrative Regulations

The Behavioral Sciences Regulatory Board will conduct a public hearing from 9 to 11 a.m. Wednesday, December 3, in the board conference room at 712 S. Kansas Ave., Topeka, to consider adopting proposed amendments to permanent rules and regulations for psychology, social work, professional counseling, master's level psychology, and marriage and family therapy.

This 60-day notice of the public hearing constitutes a public comment period for purposes of receiving written public comments on the proposed amendments. All interested parties may submit written comments prior to the hearing to Phyllis Gilmore, Executive Director, Behavioral Sciences Regulatory Board, 712 S. Kansas Ave., Topeka, 66603-3817. All interested parties will be given a reasonable opportunity to present their views orally at the hearing. In order to give all parties an opportunity to present their views, it may be necessary to request each participant to limit any oral presentation to five minutes.

Any individual with a disability may request accommodation in order to participate in the public hearing and may request the proposed regulations and economic impact statements in an accessible format. Requests for accommodation should be made at least five working days in advance of the hearing by contacting Phyllis Gilmore at (785) 296-3240 or the Kansas Relay Center at 1-800-766-3777. There is designated accessible parking on Kansas Ave., and the front entrance of the board office also is accessible.

A copy of the full text of each regulation and the economic impact statement may be reviewed or obtained at the board office or on the agency's Web site at [www.ksbsrb.org](http://www.ksbsrb.org). The following is a summary of the proposed amendments and economic impact statement. The board does not have a less costly or less intrusive method for achieving the stated purpose of each regulation.

**K.A.R. 102-1-10a** is the unprofessional conduct regulation for psychology. The change is clarification of the prohibition regarding having intimate relations with a previous client.

Economic impact: There is no economic impact to any entity.

**K.A.R. 102-2-7** is the unprofessional conduct regulation for social work. The change is clarification of the prohibition regarding having intimate relations with a previous client.

Economic impact: There is no economic impact to any entity.

**K.A.R. 102-3-12a** is the unprofessional conduct regulation for professional counseling. The change is clarification of the prohibition regarding having intimate relations with a previous client.

Economic impact: There is no economic impact to any entity.

**K.A.R. 102-4-12** is the unprofessional conduct regulation for master's level psychology. The change is clarification of the prohibition regarding having intimate relations with a previous client.

Economic impact: There is no economic impact to any entity.

K.A.R. 102-5-12 is the unprofessional conduct regulation for marriage and family therapy. The change is clarification of the prohibition regarding having intimate relations with a previous client.

Economic impact: There is no economic impact to any entity.

K.A.R. 102-4-3a is the regulation for the educational requirements for master's level psychology licensure. This amendment clarifies the statutory requirement of increasing the hours from 36 to 60 semester hours for the master's psychology program for those graduating after July 1, 2003. The requirement for 15 semester hours of diagnosis and treatment also is explained.

Economic impact: There is an increased educational cost to the applicant because of the 28 additional semester hours required for licensure. However, many applicants were already graduating from 60-hour programs.

K.A.R. 102-4-6a is the regulation for the requirements for an academically supervised practicum for master's level psychology licensure. This amendment clarifies that one hour of supervision is required for every 10 hours of direct client contact.

Economic impact: There is no economic impact to any entity as this is what the board has required even though it was not clearly stated.

### Request for Proposals

The Kansas Department of Health and Environment, Bureau of Epidemiology and Disease Prevention (BEDP), initiated West Nile Virus Surveillance in 2002 and added an education and awareness campaign for the general public on mosquito control and personal protection against West Nile Virus (WNV) in the winter of 2003. Funding is provided by a supplement to a cooperative agreement with the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC), Cooperative Agreement Number UC50/CCU712420-07/5.

Currently, KDHE does not provide funding for local mosquito control or for local initiatives related to WNV. Several counties and local health departments have requested assistance to augment their existing activities in addition to the state activities. Each locality has different needs, depending on the ecology and epidemiology in the area.

The goal of this project is to: (1) fund new creative, innovative and cost-effective ways to educate the public on WNV, and (2) fund methods to minimize exposure to mosquitoes that can potentially transmit WNV. A total of \$70,000 is available for local health departments for initiatives managed by local authorities as needed during the 2003 and/or 2004 mosquito season. This would include funds available to purchase and broadcast larvi-

cides, eliminate or mitigate mosquito-breeding areas on public land, and provide local educational campaigns. Depending on the specific requests, the total award per grantee will range from approximately \$1,000 to \$5,000, with an average of approximately \$2,000. The amount includes both direct and indirect costs. Funding estimates for the program overall and for the individual program areas may change. Up to 35 separate awards may be given, depending on available funds.

### WNV Supplemental Funding Proposal Guidelines

Each proposal must contain:

1. A detailed and time-phased operational plan for WNV education or mosquito reduction activities for the period beginning October 1, 2003 and ending June 30, 2004. Identify gaps in current capacity and develop applications that address the needs of your health jurisdiction. Educational activities that target specific groups at highest risk for severe complications of WNV are preferred over messages to the general public. Mosquito reduction plans that target reduction of breeding grounds or larviciding are preferred over adulticiding campaigns. Of some importance are activities that strengthen the collaboration between local health departments and other local stakeholders. Collaborations with other local health departments will be considered, but are not mandatory.

2. A detailed line-item budget and justification. To the extent possible, provide separate budgets for each activity addressed in your application. All budgets must be clearly broken out into line-item categories (salary, fringe, travel, supplies, equipment, contractual, other, and indirect costs).

3. Applicable updated IRB assurances (animal/human subjects) if needed for any project.

The maximum length of proposal (excluding supporting documents and budget) should not exceed 12 pages. An original and one copy of the proposal must be post-marked by October 24 and mailed to Dr. Gail Hansen, KDHE, Bureau of Epidemiology and Disease Prevention, 1000 S.W. Jackson, Suite 210, Topeka, 66612-1366. Late proposals will not be considered.

The state reserves the right to renew this contract for two additional one-year periods, dependent on funding availability.

Requests for funding will be evaluated on the following criteria:

1. Adequacy and completeness of submittal, including details, specificity and timeline (40%)
2. Agency demonstration of understanding of local WNV ecology, epidemiology, and identifying gaps in current capacity (30%)
3. Collaborations with other local agencies and stakeholders (20%)
4. Compliance with RFP requirements (10%)

The Kansas Department of Health and Environment, Division of Environment, will conduct two public hearings to consider the proposed revisions to the Kansas Surface Water Quality Standards, K.A.R. 28-16-28d, including revisions to the Kansas Surface Water Register. The first hearing will be at 7 p.m. Monday, December 1, at the Great Plains Nature Center, 6232 E. 29th St. North, Wichita. A second hearing will be at 7 p.m. Tuesday, December 2, in the Memorial Hall auditorium, 120 S.W. 10th Ave., Topeka. A public availability session will be held from 3 to 5 p.m. prior to each of the public hearings to provide persons an opportunity to review the findings of use attainability analyses (UAAs) used to establish designated uses.

The following is a summary of the proposed amendments:

K.A.R. 28-16-28d is the surface water use designation and classification section of the Kansas Surface Water Quality Standards. Designated uses of surface waters are listed in the Kansas Surface Water Register, which is adopted by reference in K.A.R. 28-16-28d (d) (2). The register identifies major classified streams, lakes and wetlands and the uses that are existing or attainable. In the period of April 1 through October 31, 2002, 312 stream segments and 107 lakes were evaluated by a UAA to determine the appropriate recreational use designation. This revision also includes 71 stream UAAs conducted in 2001 that were not included in the November 20, 2002, Kansas Surface Water Register. Fourteen stream segments are proposed to be removed from classification, 247 stream segments are proposed as secondary contact recreation, and 122 stream segments are proposed as primary contact recreation. Six lakes are proposed to be removed from classification, four lakes are proposed as sec-

ondary contact recreation, and 97 lakes are proposed as primary contact recreation and food procurement.

There are no additional costs of compliance resulting from these changes in recreational use designations. The department estimates an annual cost to perform 500 recreational UAAs as required by K.S.A. 82a-2004 and amendments thereto to be \$200,000 per year. Currently this cost is funded by the State Water Plan and federal grant money.

The time period between the publication of this notice and the scheduled hearing constitutes a 60-day public comment period for the purpose of receiving written public comments on the proposed regulatory action. Comments should be submitted to Craig Thompson, Kansas Department of Health and Environment, Bureau of Environmental Field Services, 1000 S.W. Jackson, Suite 430, Topeka, 66612-1367, prior to December 2. All interested parties will be given a reasonable opportunity to present their views orally on the proposed regulatory action during the hearings, as well as to submit their written comments at that time. In order to give all parties an opportunity to present their views, it may be necessary to require each participant to limit any oral presentation to five minutes.

Shell Pipeline Company, LP has applied for a Class I operating permit in accordance with the provisions of K.A.R. 28-19-510 et seq. The purpose of a Class I permit is to identify the sources and types of regulated air pollutants emitted from the facility; the emission limitations, standards and requirements applicable to each source; and the monitoring, record keeping

and reporting requirements applicable to each source as of the effective date of permit issuance. Notice also is given that certain requirements in the construction approvals dated October 30, 1980; November 20, 1980; October 9, 1997; and March 30, 1998, are being modified by a modification of approval conditions.

Shell Pipeline Company, Houston, Texas, operates a bulk petroleum distribution terminal located at 100 Highway 4, Scott City, Kansas.

The written request must be submitted to Connie Carreno, Bureau of Air and Radiation, not later than the close of business November 3 in order for the Secretary of Health and Environment to consider the request.

The U.S. Environmental Protection Agency has a 45-day review period, which will start concurrently with the 30-day public comment period, within which to object to the proposed permit. If the EPA has not objected in writing to the issuance of the permit within the 45-day review period, any person may petition the administrator of the EPA to review the permit. The 60-day public petition period will directly follow the EPA 45-day review period. If the EPA waives its 45-day review period, the 60-day public petition period will start directly after the 30-day public comment period. Interested parties may contact KDHE to determine if the EPA's 45-day review period has been waived.

Any such petition shall be based only on objections to the permit that were raised with reasonable specificity during the public comment period provided for in this notice, unless the petitioner demonstrates that it was impracticable to raise such objections within such period, or unless the grounds for such objection arose after such period. The bonds will bear interest from their dated date at rates to be determined when the bonds are sold, which interest will be payable semiannually on March 1 and September 1 in each year, beginning March 1, 2005.

**Delivery**

Upon the sale of the bonds, the city shall furnish the successful bidder with a reasonable number of copies of the final official statement without additional cost, upon request. Copies of the final official statement in excess of a reasonable number may be ordered by the successful bidder at its expense.

**Continuing Disclosure**

Securities and Exchange Commission Rule 15c2-12, as amended effective July 3, 1995, provides that brokers, dealers and municipal securities dealers must comply with certain requirements before acting as an underwriter in a primary offering of municipal securities with an aggregate principal amount of \$1,000,000 or more.

The bonds described herein will be offered in a primary offering with an aggregate principal amount of less than \$1,000,000. Accordingly, in the opinion of bond counsel, the offering and sale of the bonds described herein does not constitute an offering as defined by the rule, and the requirements of the rule do not apply to brokers, dealers and municipal securities dealers acting as underwriters in connection with the bonds described herein.

**Approval of Bonds**

The bonds will be sold subject to the legal opinion of Cosgrove, Webb & Oman, Topeka, Kansas, bond counsel, whose approving legal opinion as to the validity of the bonds will be furnished and paid for by the issuer, printed on the bonds and delivered to the successful bidder when the bonds are delivered.

**Article 2.—LOTTERY RETAILERS**

**111-2-143.** "Vegas Nights" retailer incentive. (a) In addition to compensation provided for in K.A.R. 111-2-4, the Kansas lottery shall also offer for all Kansas lottery retailers the "Vegas Nights" retailer incentive. It will be held in conjunction with the Kansas lottery's "Powerball Instant Millionaire Game Show" promotion drawing being held on June 20, 2003.

(b) Retailers will be eligible with each valid player entry submitted for the June 20, 2003 "Powerball Instant Millionaire Game Show" promotional drawing as provided in K.A.R. 111-5-96.

(c) For each "on-air player" selected at the "Powerball Instant Game Show" promotional drawing held on June 20, 2003, the retailer that sold the ticket drawn will receive a pack of game number 295, "Las Vegas Millionaire" instant tickets with a retail value of \$300.

(d) All prizes are subject to lottery validation, set-offs, and deductions authorized by law. (Authorized by and implementing K.S.A. 2002 Supp. 74-8710; effective, T-111-5-20-03, April 16, 2003; amended, T-111-9-9-03, July 16, 2003.)

**111-4-2044. Name, time, and place of drawing.**

(a) The Kansas lottery shall conduct an instant ticket drawing entitled "Sunflower Salute Drawing." The date of the drawing shall be August 9, 2003.

(b) The draw receptacle shall be open at the American Legion No. 5, 2921 West 12th Street, Emporia, Kansas, from approximately 11:00 a.m. until approximately 2:00 p.m. on August 9, 2003. The drawing shall take place at said American Legion No. 5 building at approximately 2:00 p.m. on August 9, 2003.

(c) Rules applicable to the "Sunflower Salute Drawing" are contained in K.A.R. 111-3-1 *et seq.* and 111-4-2044 through 111-4-2048. (Authorized by and implementing K.S.A. 2002 Supp. 74-8710; effective, T-111-9-9-03, July 16, 2003.)

**111-4-2045. Definitions.** (a) All definitions contained in the Kansas lottery act (K.S.A. 74-8701 *et seq.*) and amendments thereto and lottery regulations are hereby incorporated by reference and govern unless otherwise indicated.

(b) "Sunflower Salute Drawing" means the act of drawing prizes conducted by the Kansas lottery at the American Legion No. 5 building in Emporia, Kansas, in which participants are selected to win various prizes as described in K.A.R. 111-4-2047.

(c) "Non-winning ticket" means any valid Kansas lottery "Sunflower Salute" instant game lottery ticket not eligible to win a prize under any instant game rules.

(d) "Receptacle" or "drum" means a container in which non-winning Kansas instant game lottery tickets are placed and from which the drawing is made. Receptacles or drums may be sealable and shall be capable of being mixed or rotated for the purpose of ensuring random distribution.

(e) "Bare arm technique" means a type of drawing where the person drawing the winning ticket from the

receptacle or drum wears a long-sleeved shirt with sleeve rolled up above the elbow, a short-sleeved shirt (sleeve not extending past the elbow) or a non-sleeve shirt which exposes the drawer's bare arm and looks away from the drawing drum or receptacle while drawing.

(f) "Sunflower Salute Drawing" means the drawing which will occur at the time described at K.A.R. 111-4-2044. (Authorized by and implementing K.S.A. 2002 Supp. 74-8710; effective, T-111-9-9-03, July 16, 2003.)

**111-4-2046. Entry into drawing.** Entry into the drawing is accomplished as follows:

(a) Obtain a valid Kansas lottery Sunflower Salute instant lottery ticket at the American Legion No. 5 building, Emporia, Kansas, on August 9, 2003, from 11:00 a.m. until 2:00 p.m.;

(b) Determine if the ticket is a winning ticket in accordance with any instant game rules. If the ticket is a winning ticket, it is not eligible for the drawing and shall be redeemed in accordance with the instant game rules;

(c) If the ticket is a valid non-winning ticket, the ticket is eligible for winning the drawing and the holder of the ticket may enter the drawing;

(d) The holder of the non-winning ticket must complete the information form on the back of the ticket in a legible manner;

(e) The holder of the non-winning ticket must take the non-winning ticket with the completed information form to the location of the drawing and place it in the receptacle or drum provided;

(f) The receptacle or drum shall be available and entries may be made at the times stated in K.A.R. 111-4-2044. Entries shall be allowed until the actual winner selection process begins;

(g) The holder of the ticket is not required to personally attend the drawing or be present at the time of the drawing to be determined a winner;

(h) There is no limit to the number of entries an entrant may make, but each entrant may only win one prize;

(i) All eligible entrants must be at least 18 years of age. (Authorized by and implementing K.S.A. 2002 Supp. 74-8710; effective, T-111-9-9-03, July 16, 2003.)

**111-4-2047. Determination of "Sunflower Salute Drawing" winners and prizes.**

(a) At least five minutes before the drawing, a lottery drawing official designated by the executive director shall announce to the audience that the winner selection process will begin. Any persons wishing to enter the drawing who have not yet done so, shall immediately place their tickets into the receptacle or drum at this time.

(b) The drawing official shall announce that entries into the drawing are closed. No further entries will be accepted.

(c) The receptacle or drum shall be sealed and capable of being mixed with a shovel or by other means for two minutes or rotated a minimum of 10 times to ensure random selection.

(d) The drawing official shall designate one individual of his or her choice to participate in the selection process.

(e) The selection of drawing winners shall be accomplished by the individual designated by the drawing official, using a bare arm technique, removing one ticket

from the drawing receptacle or drum, at approximately 2:00 p.m. A designated drawing official and a person representing Kansas lottery security, shall review the selected ticket to determine if the name stated on the information form located on the back of the selected ticket is legible. If the ticket is determined to be valid and eligible to win and the name is determined to be legible, the name of the winner shall be announced to the audience. This process shall be repeated until three valid winners have been selected. Each valid entry drawn shall be marked in the order drawn, 1, 2, and 3.

(f) After the tickets have been drawn and each entry has been verified as valid by lottery security, three more entries will be drawn, one at a time, to serve as alternate entries. The alternate entries will be marked in order drawn, 1A, 2A, and 3A. The alternate ticket entries will be used only if the original winners cannot be located or are declared ineligible, or fail to present a fully-executed claim form as required herein. The alternates will be used, if necessary, in the order drawn.

(g) The first valid winner selected shall be awarded a prize of \$100. The second valid winner selected shall be awarded a prize of a \$100. The third valid winner selected shall be awarded a prize of \$100.

(h) The named persons are not required to be present in order to win the drawing prizes. The security representative conducting the drawing shall be responsible for the final determination concerning the eligibility of any ticket drawn. The first prize winning ticket drawn for each entrant invalidates all other entries for the drawing for that entrant.

(i) Each winner of a prize as a result of the drawing shall return to lottery headquarters a completed claim form as provided by the lottery no later than 5:00 p.m. on the forty-fifth day following the drawing or the person named on the ticket drawn will no longer be eligible for the prize. In such an event, the first eligible alternate entry drawn pursuant to subsection (f) herein shall be declared the winner of that prize. (Authorized by and implementing K.S.A. 2002 Supp. 74-8710; effective, T-111-9-9-03, July 16, 2003.)

**111-4-2048. Certifying of drawing.** (a) The "Sunflower Salute Drawing" shall be personally observed by a member of the Kansas lottery security department and a member of the Kansas lottery marketing department or other person or persons designated by the executive director of the lottery.

(b) Upon completion of the drawing, the security official and the event manager shall issue a report to the executive director, certifying that the name of each prize winner is correct, and that to the best of their knowledge the procedures required by these rules were followed in selecting the prize winner. (Authorized by and implementing K.S.A. 2002 Supp. 74-8710; effective, T-111-9-9-03, July 16, 2003.)

#### Article 5.—MULTI-STATE ON-LINE GAMES

**111-5-94. Entry into drawing.** Entry into each "Powerball Instant Millionaire Game Show" drawing ("drawing") is accomplished as follows:

(a) Obtain a valid Kansas lottery instant lottery ticket which offers a chance to win the "Powerball Instant Millionaire Game Show" prizes as described in K.A.R. 111-5-95.

(b) Determine if the ticket is a winning ticket in accordance with any ticket game rules. If the ticket is a winning ticket, it is not eligible for a drawing and shall be redeemed in accordance with the rules of that instant game;

(c) If the ticket is a valid non-winning ticket, the ticket is eligible for winning the drawing and the holder of the ticket may enter the drawing;

(d) The holder of the non-winning ticket must complete the information form on the back of the ticket in a legible manner;

(e) The holder of the non-winning ticket must mail the non-winning ticket with the completed information form as directed on the back of the ticket or deposit the completed non-winning ticket at such other location(s) as may be specifically designated by the lottery. All entries so deposited shall be transported to lottery headquarters and secured until the time of the drawing;

(f) The holder of the ticket is not required to personally attend the drawing or be present at the time of the drawing to be determined a winner;

(g) There is no limit on the number of entries an entrant may make, but each entrant may only win either one "on-air player" or one "at-home player" prize per "Powerball Instant Millionaire Game Show" taping and may not win any prize as a result of consecutive game shows;

(h) Entries for each "Powerball Instant Millionaire Game Show" drawing must be received no later than the morning mail pickup at the post office address set forth on the back of the instant ticket on the Tuesday immediately preceding the drawing scheduled by the Kansas lottery. All entries received after said deadline shall be eligible for the next occurring "Powerball Instant Millionaire Game Show" drawing, if any;

(i) Each "Powerball Instant Millionaire Game Show" drawing may select on-air and at-home winners for numerous "Powerball Instant Millionaire Game Show" tapings, which tapings shall then be individually aired on television as scheduled by the game show group;

(j) Completing the information on the back of the ticket and entering it into the drawing constitutes authorization to publicly identify the person whose entry is drawn and his or her city of residence; and,

(k) All eligible entrants must be at least 18 years of age. (Authorized by and implementing K.S.A. 2002 Supp. 74-8710; effective, T-111-7-15-02, June 21, 2002; amended, T-111-9-9-03, July 16, 2003.)

**111-5-96. Determination of "Powerball Instant Millionaire Game Show" winners.** The following process shall be used for the selection of winners in the "Powerball Instant Millionaire Game Show" drawings:

(a) Kansas lottery personnel shall pick up all mail containing entries for the "Powerball Instant Millionaire Game Show" at the United States Post Office in Topeka, Kansas, with the final pick up at the Topeka post office in the morning mail pickup on the Tuesday next preceding each scheduled drawing. Following each such morn-

(continued)

ing mail pickup, the envelopes containing mailed entries will be transported to lottery headquarters and opened by lottery personnel. All mailed entries and entries deposited at other locations as may be specifically designated by the lottery shall be securely stored by lottery personnel until such time as the entries are placed in the drawing receptacle or drum.

(b) The drawing shall be held at Kansas lottery headquarters and shall be open to the public with lottery security personnel present. The drawing shall be audio and video taped.

(c) At each scheduled drawing, lottery security personnel will be present with the person designated by the executive director to perform the drawing. Prior to the drawing, if a drum is used, the drum shall be sealed and the contents mixed by rotating the drum at least 10 times. If a receptacle other than a drum is used, the contents shall be mixed with a shovel or by other means for at least three minutes prior to the drawing.

(d) The designated individual shall then unseal the drum, if a drum is used, and using the bare-arm technique, while looking away, remove one entry from the receptacle or drum. The person whose name appears on the entry shall be the winner of the on-air prize package for the first available taping of the "Powerball Instant Millionaire Game Show" as identified in K.A.R. 111-5-95, subject to validation by the lottery as set forth in these rules. If valid, the entry shall be marked in such a way as to identify it as the winner for the applicable drawing and taping. This procedure shall be repeated for each game show taping for which entries are being drawn.

(e) After the required number of valid on-air winning entries have been selected, the drawing process shall continue until a pre-determined number of valid entries has been drawn to win the at-home prizes for each of the same game show tapings as identified in K.A.R. 111-5-95. Each valid entry shall be marked in numerical order drawn and in such a way as to identify it as one of the at-home winners for the applicable drawing and taping.

(f) After said on-air and at-home winning entries have been drawn, and the entries have been verified as valid, 10 more entries will be drawn, one at a time. The last 10 entries drawn will serve as alternate entries for the winners selected in that drawing. The alternate entries will be marked in order drawn, 1A, 2A, 3A, 4A, 5A, 6A, 7A, 8A, 9A, and 10A, and otherwise identified as having been selected for the applicable drawing. The alternate entries will be used only if one or more of the original winners cannot be located or is declared ineligible, or fails to timely present a fully-executed claim form to lottery headquarters, or is elevated to be an on-air winner. If an on-air winner cannot be located, is declared ineligible, or fails to timely present a fully-executed claim form to lottery headquarters, the next selected at-home winner for that taping shall be declared the winner, subject to the claim procedure as set forth in K.A.R. 111-5-97. If an at-home winner cannot be located, is declared ineligible, or fails to timely present a fully-executed claim forms to lottery headquarters, or is elevated to be an on-air winner, the next selected alternate winner shall be declared the winner, subject to the claim procedure as set forth in K.A.R. 111-5-97. The alternates will be used, if necessary,

in the order drawn. If an alternate winner cannot be located, is declared ineligible, or fails to timely present a fully-executed claim form to lottery headquarters, the alternate winner process shall be repeated until the prize is properly claimed or until such time as no alternate winners remain, whichever occurs first.

(g) The Kansas lottery security official present shall review each ticket drawn to determine the validity of the entry into the "Powerball Instant Millionaire Game Show" drawing in accordance with these regulations. If it is a valid entry and the name is legible, the event manager and the security person present shall record the name of the winner and the prize won.

(h) If the entry is determined to be ineligible, it shall be discarded by the security person present and another entry drawn, except that if the sole reason for ineligibility is because the person named thereon was determined to be a winner for the next preceding taping, then said entry shall be returned to the drawing receptacle. This procedure will be repeated until valid selections are obtained.

(i) All entries remaining in the drum or receptacle after the winners and alternates have been selected, and all entries not received in compliance with these rules, shall be destroyed pursuant to K.A.R. 111-3-34. (Authorized by and implementing K.S.A. 2002 Supp. 74-8710; effective, T-111-7-15-02, June 21, 2002; amended, T-111-8-20-02, Aug. 14, 2002; amended, T-111-9-9-03, July 16, 2003.)

**111-5-97. Claiming prizes.** (a) The winner of a travel package prize as a result of a "Powerball Instant Millionaire Game Show" drawing shall, within 14 calendar days of the drawing, or in the case of an elevated winner within 14 calendar days of the date a claim form is mailed or otherwise delivered to said winner, return to the lottery a completed claim form or the person named on the entry drawn will no longer be eligible for the prize. In such an event, the next eligible prize winner drawn pursuant to these rules shall be declared the on-air winner;

(b) The winner of an on-air or at-home prize other than a travel package as a result of a "Powerball Instant Millionaire Game Show" shall, within 30 calendar days of being given or sent a claim form, return to the lottery the completed claim form or the person named on the entry drawn will no longer be eligible for the prize. In such an event, the next eligible winner drawn pursuant to these rules shall be declared the winner; and,

(c) All completed claim forms must be actually received by the lottery no later than 5:00 p.m. on the last day of said 14 or 30 calendar day deadline. Article 1.—GENERAL

40-1-48. Risk-based capital instructions for managed care organizations. The following document prepared by the national association of insurance commissioners and dated July 16, 2002 is hereby adopted by reference:

"2002 NAIC health risk-based capital report including overview and instructions for companies, as of December 31, 2002." (Authorized by K.S.A. 40-2d29; implementing K.S.A. 40-2d02(a) and 40-2d03(a); effective Dec. 28, 2001; amended July 5, 2002; amended Oct. 17, 2003.)

Article 4.—ACCIDENT AND HEALTH INSURANCE

40-4-1. Accident and health insurance; individual policies; rate filings; requirements. The national association of insurance commissioners' "guidelines for filing of rates for individual health insurance forms," July 1989 edition, is hereby adopted by reference subject to the following exceptions: (a) Section II, subsection A.2. is amended by the addition of the following sentence to the definition of "Optionally Renewable":

"Short-term major medical policies are considered to be optionally renewable."

(b) Section II, subsection A.3. is not adopted, and the following is substituted:

"When the expected average annual premium for a policy, including riders and endorsements, is \$100 or more but less than \$200, five percentage points shall be subtracted from the anticipated loss ratios shown in Section II A.1. If the expected average annual premium is less than \$100, 10 percentage points shall be subtracted from the anticipated loss ratios shown in Section II A.1."

(c) Section II, subsection A.4. is not adopted.

(d) Section II, subsection A.8. is not adopted.

(e) Section II, subsection C.1.(b) is not adopted.

(f) The appendix is not adopted. (Authorized by K.S.A. 40-103 and 40-2215; implementing K.S.A. 40-2215; effective May 1, 1981; amended May 1, 1986; amended Oct. 17, 2003.)

Article 5.—CREDIT INSURANCE

40-5-110. Same; supervision of credit insurance operations. (a) Each insurer transacting credit insurance in this state shall be responsible to conduct a reasonable annual review of the procedures of each creditor with respect to credit insurance business to insure compliance with the insurance laws of this state and the regulations promulgated by the commissioner.

(b) The review required in subsection (a) shall include a determination that all of the following conditions are met:

- (1) The proper charges are being made by the creditor.
(2) The proper refunds are being made.
(3) All claims are being filed and properly handled.

(4) All amounts of insurance payable on death in excess of the amounts necessary to discharge the indebtedness are properly refunded.

(5) The creditor is promptly and fairly processing complaints concerning credit insurance operations and is maintaining proper procedures for, and records of, the complaints processed.

(c) Each insurer shall provide the results of the annual reviews for inspection during an examination, upon the request of the commissioner or the commissioner's designee. ## Article 18.—SIMULCASTING LICENSES

**112-18-9. Duties of receiving facility.** (a) A simulcasting licensee that conducts parimutuel wagering on a simulcast race or program shall act as a receiving facility on those dates. Each receiving facility shall provide communication facilities, which shall include all wire, radio, optical, satellite, and other electromagnetic systems used to receive audio and visual transmissions between the sending racetrack, host facility, and receiving facility.

(b) Before the beginning of the transmission of the first simulcast race or program of each day, each receiving facility shall initiate a test program of its receiver, decoder, and data communication to ensure the proper operation of the system. If a test program run under this subsection is unsuccessful or indicates a malfunction of any component of the receiving system, the licensee shall not conduct parimutuel wagering on a simulcast race or program until a successful test program is completed.

(c) After each simulcast race or program, each receiving facility shall provide the reports of its parimutuel operations as required by K.A.R. 112-9-8 for both simulcast and live races. (Authorized by and implementing K.S.A. 74-8804 and 74-8836; effective, T-112-4-27-92, April 27, 1992; effective, T-112-9-10-92, Sept. 10, 1992; effective Nov. 23, 1992; amended Sept. 6, 1994; amended Oct. 17, 2003.)

**112-18-11. Emergency procedures.** (a) A simulcasting licensee shall not accept wagers on a simulcast race until the simulcasting licensee is receiving the video signal from the sending racetrack. If the signal is not received, the simulcasting licensee shall establish a telephone linkup with the sending racetrack's stewards, racing judges, or simulcast official and shall announce to the patrons all pertinent information.

(b) If the simulcasting licensee loses the video signal from the sending racetrack, the simulcasting licensee shall immediately notify the sending racetrack of the lost signal.

(c) If the video signal is lost after wagering has commenced, wagering shall be suspended while it is determined if the signal can be reestablished. An announcement shall be made to the patrons advising them that wagering has been temporarily suspended due to video problems. The results and prices of each race that goes post while the signal is lost shall be received through the tote linkup. An announcement of the results shall be made to the patrons.

(d) If the video signal cannot be reestablished, the simulcast licensee shall cease accepting wagers. The licensee may order a refund of all monies wagered on future races, or at the determination of the mutuel manager, the outstanding wagers on future races may remain in the system. If the decision is made to keep outstanding wagers in the system, a ticket list shall be run showing all outstanding wagers on the remainder of the perform-

ance. The mutuel manager shall verify the prices and results of all races in which there are outstanding wagers, and the results of these races shall be announced to the patrons.

(e) If the licensee loses the video signal as described above in subsection (c) or (d), the licensee shall file a written report with the inspector of parimutuels.

(f) Wagers that encompass more than one race shall be unaffected by signal problems encountered in any race of the sequence other than the first. (Authorized by K.S.A. 74-8804; implementing K.S.A. 74-8836; effective, T-112-4-27-92, April 27, 1992; effective, T-112-9-10-92, Sept. 10, 1992; effective Nov. 23, 1992; amended Sept. 6, 1994; amended Jan. 11, 2002; amended Oct. 17, 2003.)

**112-18-18. Failure to merge.** (a) Except as otherwise provided by this regulation, if it becomes impossible to successfully merge a guest facility's wagers in the combined wagering pool, the simulcasting licensee may either order a refund of all monies wagered or calculate the pool as a separate pool to be distributed in accordance with the Kansas parimutuel racing act, including takeout. However, each pool containing a carry-over feature or a type of wager not available in Kansas shall be refunded.

(1) As soon as failure to merge is acknowledged, a parimutuel representative at the guest facility shall notify the simulcast coordinator.

(2) The simulcast coordinator shall immediately make an announcement to the patrons via intercom or TV monitors, explaining the circumstances.

(b) Each simulcast licensee shall be required to advise patrons of its failure-to-merge policy by prominently displaying notice in the wagering areas, other special patron areas, and the official racing program.

(c) Each contract for combined wagering pools entered into by a simulcasting licensee shall contain a provision stating that the simulcasting licensee is not liable for any measures taken that could result in a guest facility's wagers not being accepted into a combined wagering pool formed by the licensee if either of the following occurs:

(1) It becomes impossible to successfully merge the wagers placed in another state in the combined wagering pool formed by the simulcasting licensee.

(2) The commission's or simulcasting licensee's representative determines that attempting to transfer pool data from the guest facility will endanger the simulcasting licensee's wagering pool. Article 17.—DIVISION OF VITAL STATISTICS

**28-17-6. Fees for copies, abstracts, and searches.**

(a)(1) Subject to the restrictions of K.S.A. 65-2417, K.S.A. 65-2418, and K.S.A. 65-2423, and amendments thereto, certified copies or abstracts of certificates or parts of certificates shall be furnished by the state registrar upon request by an authorized applicant and payment of the required fee.

(2) The fees for making and certifying copies or abstracts of birth, delayed birth, fetal death, marriage, and divorce certificates shall be \$12.00 for the first copy or abstract and \$7.00 for each additional copy or abstract of the same record requested at the same time. The fees for making and certifying copies or abstracts of death certificates shall be \$13.00 for the first copy or abstract and \$8.00 for each additional copy or abstract of the same record requested at the same time.

(b) For any search of the files and records for birth, delayed birth, fetal death, marriage, and divorce when no certified copy or abstract is made, the fee shall be \$12.00 for each five-year period for which a search is requested, or for each fractional part of a five-year period. For any search of files and records for death when no certified copy or abstract is made, the fee shall be \$13.00 for each

five-year period for which a search is requested, or for each fractional part of a five-year period.

(c) For any search of the files necessary for preparing an amendment to a standard birth, fetal death, marriage, or divorce certificate or abstract already on file, the fee shall be \$12.00. For any search of the files necessary for preparing an amendment to a death certificate or abstract already on file, the fee shall be \$13.00.

(d) For non-certified copies or abstracts of certificates or parts of certificates requested for statistical research purposes, the fee and manner in which the fee is to be paid shall be determined by the state registrar on the basis of the costs for providing those services. 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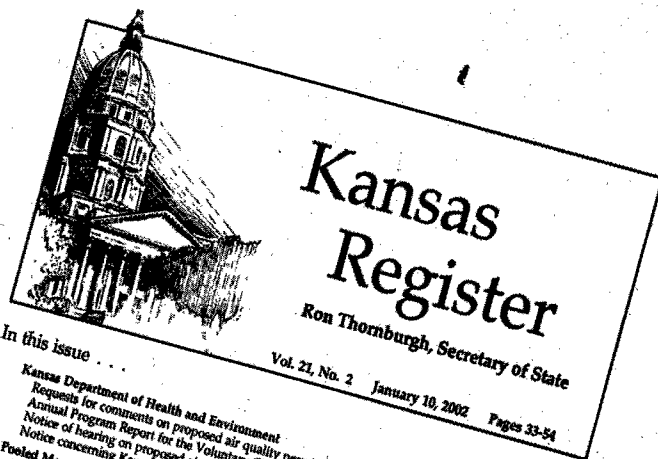


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
