Administrative Regulations**

A public hearing will be conducted at 9 a.m. Tuesday, November 25, in the SRS board room, sixth floor, Docking State Office Building, 915 S.W. Harrison, Topeka, to consider the adoption of amendments to an existing rule and regulation on a permanent basis effective 15 days after publication in the Kansas Register. Telephone conference is not available.

This 30-day notice of the public hearing shall constitute a public comment period for the proposed regulation as stated in K.S.A. 2002 Supp. 77-421(a)(3). All interested parties may submit written comments prior to the hearing to Hope Burns, Office of the Secretary for SRS, Room 603-N, Docking State Office Building, 915 S.W. Harrison, Topeka, 66612. All interested parties will be given a reasonable opportunity to present their views, but it may be necessary to request each participant to limit any oral presentation to five minutes.

Any individual with a disability may request accommodation in order to participate in the public hearing and may request the proposed regulation and economic impact statement in an accessible format. Requests for accommodation should be made at least five working days in advance of the hearing by contacting Hope Burns at (785) 296-3274 or by calling the Kansas Relay Center at 1-800-766-3777.

The adoption of the regulation will take place at 11:30 a.m. Monday, December 1, in the SRS executive conference room, 603-N, Docking State Office Building. Telephone conference will not be available.

**Article 5.—PROVIDER PARTICIPATION,
SCOPE OF SERVICES, AND REIMBURSEMENT
FOR THE MEDICAID (MEDICAL ASSISTANCE)
PROGRAM**

30-5-64. Prior authorization. The following changes will be made to K.A.R. 30-5-64 regarding prior authorization of pharmaceutical products:

To ensure the most clinically-appropriate utilization of these drugs in the most cost-effective manner, the following drugs will require prior authorization. These therapeutic classes of drugs have been evaluated by the Preferred Drug List Advisory Board and found to be clinically equivalent:

- Muscle relaxants: Tizanidine, Orphenadrine, Methocarbamol, Carisprodol, Carisprodol Compound, Metaxalone, Cyclobenzaprine 5 mg
- Oral antidiabetic drugs: Metaglip®, Glucovance®

Federal Mandate: This regulation change is not federally mandated.

Economic Impact: It is expected that this change will reduce Medicaid expenditures by \$93,440 SGF and \$140,160 FFP, annually.

Bearer of Cost: The cost of reviewing prior authorization (PA) will be borne by SRS. If a Medicaid consumer wishes to have a drug despite a PA denial, the cost will be borne by the consumer.

Affected Parties: Medicaid consumers, pharmacists and the Medicaid agency.

Other Methods: There were no other appropriate methods for the desired outcome.

Kansas Water Office**Request for Proposals**

A competitive federal grant program to encourage the protection and restoration of the United States' water bodies through use of watershed-based approaches has been announced by the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency (EPA). The Kansas Water Office will coordinate the grant proposal review process in Kansas. Proposals will be accepted through December 1.

Official notification of the "Watershed Initiative: Call for Nominations" was posted in the Federal Register/Volume 68, No. 196, dated October 9, 2003. Governors and tribal leaders are asked to submit nominations for the continuing grant program.

The President's fiscal year 2004 budget, now before Congress, requests \$21 million for this initiative. Subject to availability of appropriations, the EPA plans to select up to 20 watersheds throughout the country for grants to support promising watershed-based approaches to clean water. Only grant proposals received at the Kansas Water Office by December 1 will be considered. Two hard copies of the complete application package should be submitted. In addition, a portion of the application will be required to be submitted electronically. (See Federal Register section IVB1.) Submit the electronic portion to bmcdaneld@kwo.state.ks.us.

The Governor's Subcabinet on Natural Resources will consider and rank the proposals. Ranking will be based on the federal criteria posted at the Web site and applicability to the Kansas Water Plan. The proposals will be forwarded to the Governor for her nominations by December 15. The selected proposals will be submitted to the EPA by January 15.

Notice is hereby given of the commencement of negotiations for engineering services for hydrologic and hydraulic analysis and floodplain mapping for Butler County. The Kansas Department of Agriculture (KDA), Division of Water Resources, requests to contract for the performance of a field survey reconnaissance, hydrologic and hydraulic analysis of all streams that drain greater than 1 square mile in Butler County, except for streams with current effective detailed information, as well as the performance of redelineation of effective detailed information using updated topography for the portions of the following streams in Butler County: Walnut River from FEMA FBFM cross section B to cross section G, Walnut River from FEMA FBFM cross section AO to HWY 177, and Whitewater River from FEMA FBFM cross section N to cross section S. Subject to the terms and conditions of the complete official notice of bond sale and the preliminary official statement both dated October 23, 2003, of Jackson County, Kansas, in connection with the issuance of the county's General Obligation Bonds, Series 2003, as hereinafter described, sealed, written bids will be received at the office of the county clerk at the Jackson County Courthouse, 400 New York Ave., Holton, KS 66436, until 10 a.m. Monday, November 3, 2003, for the purchase of the bonds. All bids will be publicly opened, read aloud and tabulated on said date and at said time and will thereafter be immediately considered and acted upon by the governing body of the county.

No oral or auction bids for the bonds will be considered, and no bids for less than the entire series of bonds will be considered.

Bids will be accepted only on the official bid form that has been prepared for the public bidding on these bonds, which may be obtained from the county clerk. Bids may be submitted by mail or delivered in person, and must be received at the place and not later than the date and time herein specified. Each bid must be accompanied by a good faith deposit in the form of a qualified financial surety bond or certified or cashier's check drawn on a bank located within the United States, each made payable to the order of the county and in an amount equal to 2 percent of the principal amount of the bonds.

Details of the Bonds

The aggregate principal amount of the bonds is \$365,000. The bonds will be dated as of November 1, 2003, and will be issued as fully registered bonds in the denomination of \$5,000, or integral multiples in excess thereof not exceeding the principal amount of bonds maturing in any year. Payment of Principal and Interest

The Kansas State Treasurer will serve as the bond registrar and paying agent for the bonds, and the principal of the bonds will be payable upon surrender at the paying agent's principal office in the City of Topeka, Kansas. Interest will be paid by the mailing of a check or draft of the paying agent to the registered owners of the bonds.

Security for the Bonds

The bonds and the interest thereon will constitute general obligations of the county, and the full faith, credit and resources of the county will be pledged to the payment thereof. The county is obligated to levy ad valorem taxes without limitation as to rate or amount upon all of the taxable tangible property within the territorial limits of the county for the purpose of paying the bonds and the interest thereon.

Delivery of the Bonds

The bonds, duly prepared, executed and registered, will be furnished and delivered in book-entry form only at the expense of the county through the facilities of the Depository Trust Company, New York, New York, on or before November 14, 2003.

Legal Opinion

The bonds will be sold subject to the legal opinion of Jonathan P. Small, Chartered, Topeka, Kansas, bond counsel, whose fees will be paid by the county. Bond counsel's approving legal opinion as to the validity of the bonds will be printed on the bonds and delivered to the successful bidder upon delivery of the bonds. Financial Matters

The county's 2003 equalized assessed tangible valuation for computation of bonded debt limitations is \$70,005,596. The county's outstanding general obligation bonded indebtedness as of the date hereof totals the principal amount of \$2,446,022, which includes the bonds described herein, and \$401,031 principal amount in temporary notes, of which \$204,356 will be paid off in total from the proceeds of the bonds described herein.

The city reserves the right to modify the total amount of the Series 2003-C Bonds and the amount of any maturity in order to properly structure certain funds and accounts and substantially obtain annual debt service parameters determined by the city, based upon the interest rates and reoffering yields submitted by the successful bidder. RegulationsArticle 18.—ANIMAL FACILITY INSPECTION
PROGRAM—LICENSE AND REGISTRATION FEES

9-18-2. Inspections of premises. (a) Each premises that is licensed or is required to be licensed under K.S.A. 47-1701 *et seq.* and amendments thereto, which is known as the Kansas animal pet act, shall be subject to routine inspections by the commissioner or any of the commissioner's authorized representatives to determine compliance with the act and all regulations.

(b) In addition to the routine inspections, any of the premises may be subject to one or more further inspections under any of the following circumstances:

(1) A violation was found in a previous inspection.

(2) A complaint is filed regarding the premises.

(3) The ownership of the premises changed in the previous year.

(4) The license for the premises was not renewed on a timely basis.

(c) Inspections shall be made only on Monday through Friday, between the hours of 7:00 a.m. and 7:00 p.m., except that inspections may be conducted at alternate times, upon the agreement of all interested persons or entities.

(d) If the owner or operator of the premises is not routinely available between the hours of 7:00 a.m. and 7:00 p.m., the owner or operator shall designate a representative who will be present while the inspection is conducted and shall notify the commissioner in writing of the name of the designated representative. The designated representative shall be 18 years of age or older. The owner or operator shall notify the commissioner in writing of any new representative who is designated to be present during inspections.

(e) Inspections shall be made by the livestock commissioner or any employee, representative, or agent of the commissioner who the commissioner determines is trained in reasonable standards of animal care. (Authorized by K.S.A. 47-1712; implementing K.S.A. 47-1709; effective, T-9-7-1-03, July 1, 2003; effective Nov. 7, 2003.)

9-18-3. Inspection generated by a complaint. (a) Each premises that is licensed or is required to be licensed under K.S.A. 47-1701 *et seq.* and amendments thereto, which is known as the Kansas pet animal act, shall be subject to inspections by the commissioner or any of the commissioner's authorized, trained representatives as needed to investigate any specific complaint filed with the department regarding any violation of these regulations or other violations of this act.

(b) Inspections to investigate an unlicensed facility or to determine whether a licensed facility is in violation of these regulations or the act shall be conducted only on Monday through Friday, between the hours of 7:00 a.m. and 7:00 p.m., except as follows:

(1) Inspections to investigate allegations of violations adversely affecting the health, safety, and welfare of the animals may be conducted on any day of the week.

(2) Inspections may be conducted at alternate times, upon the agreement of all interested persons or entities.

(c) Inspections shall be made by the livestock commissioner or any employee, representative, or agent of the department who the commissioner determines is trained in reasonable standards of animal care.

(d) Inspections may be conducted without notice to the owner or operator of the premises. (Authorized by K.S.A. 47-1712; implementing K.S.A. 47-1709; effective, T-9-7-1-03, July 1, 2003; effective Nov. 7, 2003.)

Article 25.—RETAIL BREEDERS FACILITY
STANDARDS; ANIMAL HEALTH, HUSBANDRY,
AND OPERATIONAL STANDARDS

9-25-12. Age of animal. A retail breeder licensee shall not sell or exchange any dog or cat unless the dog or cat is at least eight weeks of age and has been weaned. "Weaned" means that an animal has become accustomed to taking solid food and has done so, without nursing, for a period of at least five days. Article 4.—INSTANT GAMES AND DRAWINGS

KANSAS SPEEDWAY SECOND CHANCE DRAWING

111-4-2058. Name, time, and place of drawing. (a)

The Kansas lottery shall conduct an instant ticket drawing on October 5, 2003, entitled "Kansas Speedway Second Chance Drawing."

(b) The draw receptacle for this drawing shall be open during lottery selling hours at the lottery's Kansas Speedway selling booth in Kansas City, Kansas, through 12:30 p.m. on October 5, 2003. The drawing shall take place at the lottery selling booth at the Kansas Speedway at approximately 12:30 p.m. on October 5, 2003.

(c) Rules applicable to this drawing are contained in K.A.R. 111-3-1 *et seq.* and 111-4-2058 through 111-4-2062. (Authorized by and implementing K.S.A. 74-8710; effective, T-111-9-18-03, Sept. 10, 2003.)

111-4-2059. Definitions. (a) All definitions contained in the Kansas lottery act (K.S.A. 74-8701 *et seq.*) and amendments thereto and lottery regulations are hereby incorporated by reference and govern unless otherwise indicated.

(b) "Kansas Speedway Second Chance Drawing" means the act of drawing for prizes conducted by the Kansas lottery at the Kansas Speedway in Kansas City, Kansas, in which participants are selected to win various prizes as described in K.A.R. 111-4-2061.

(c) "Non-winning ticket" means any valid \$2.00 Kansas instant game lottery ticket not eligible to win a prize under any instant game rules and purchased from the lottery selling location at the Kansas Speedway during selling hours until 12:30 p.m. on October 5, 2003.

(d) "Receptacle" or "drum" means a container in which non-winning Kansas instant game lottery tickets are placed and from which the "Kansas Speedway Second Chance Drawing" is made. Receptacles or drums may be sealable and shall be capable of being mixed or rotated for the purpose of ensuring random distribution.

(e) "Bare arm technique" means a type of drawing where the person drawing the winning ticket from the receptacle or drum wears a long-sleeved shirt with sleeve rolled up above the elbow, a short-sleeved shirt (sleeve not extending past the elbow) or a non-sleeve shirt which exposes the drawer's bare arm and looks away from the drawing drum or receptacle while drawing. (Authorized by and implementing K.S.A. 74-8710; effective, T-111-9-18-03, Sept. 10, 2003.)

111-4-2060. Entry into drawing. Entry into the "Kansas Speedway Second Chance Drawing" ("drawing") is accomplished as follows:

(a) Obtain a valid Kansas instant \$2.00 lottery ticket purchased from the lottery selling location at the Kansas Speedway during lottery selling hours until 12:30 p.m. on October 5, 2003;

(b) Determine if the ticket is a winning ticket in accordance with any instant game rules. If the ticket is a winning ticket, it is not eligible for the drawing and shall be redeemed in accordance with the instant game rules;

(c) If the ticket is a valid non-winning ticket, the ticket is eligible for winning the drawing and the holder of the ticket may enter the drawing;

(d) The holder of the non-winning ticket must complete the information form on the back of the ticket in a legible manner;

(e) The holder of the non-winning ticket must take the non-winning ticket with the completed information form to the location of the drawing and place it in the receptacle or drum provided;

(f) The receptacle or drum shall be available and entries may be made at the times stated in K.A.R. 111-4-2058. Entries shall be allowed until the actual winner selection process begins;

(g) The holder of the ticket is not required to personally attend the drawing or be present at the time of the drawing to be determined a winner;

(h) There is no limit to the number of entries an entrant may make, but each entrant may only win one prize;

(i) All eligible entrants must be at least 18 years of age. (Authorized by and implementing K.S.A. 74-8710; effective, T-111-9-18-03, Sept. 10, 2003.)

111-4-2061. Determination of "Kansas Speedway Second Chance Drawing" winners and prizes. (a) At least five minutes before the drawing, a lottery drawing official designated by the executive director shall announce to the audience that the winner selection process will begin. Any persons wishing to enter the drawing who have not yet done so, shall immediately place their tickets into the receptacle or drum at this time.

(b) The drawing official shall announce that entries into the drawing are closed. No further entries will be accepted.

(c) The receptacle or drum shall be sealed and capable of being mixed with a shovel or by other means for two minutes or rotated a minimum of 10 times to ensure random selection.

(d) The drawing official shall designate one individual of his or her choice to participate in the selection process.

(e) The selection of drawing winners shall be accomplished by the individual designated by the drawing official, using a bare arm technique, removing one ticket from the drawing receptacle or drum, at approximately 12:30 p.m. A designated drawing official and a person representing Kansas lottery security, shall review the selected ticket to determine if the information completed by the player located on the back of the selected ticket is legible. If the ticket is determined to be valid and eligible to win and the name is determined to be legible, the name of the winner shall be announced to the audience. This process shall be repeated until three valid winners have been selected. Each valid entry drawn shall be marked in the order drawn, 1, 2, and 3.

(f) After the tickets have been drawn and each entry has been verified as valid by lottery security, three more entries will be drawn, one at a time, to serve as alternate entries. The alternate entries will be marked in order drawn, 1A, 2A, and 3A. The alternate ticket entries will be used only if the original winners cannot be located or are declared ineligible, or fail to present a fully-executed claim form as required herein. The alternates will be used, if necessary, in the order drawn.

(g) The first valid winner selected shall be awarded a prize of \$1,000. The second valid winner selected shall be awarded a prize of \$500. The third valid winner selected shall be awarded a prize of \$300.

(h) The named persons are not required to be present in order to win the drawing prizes. The security representative conducting the drawing shall be responsible for the final determination concerning the eligibility of any ticket drawn. The first prize winning ticket drawn for each entrant invalidates all other entries for the drawing for that entrant.

(i) Each winner of a prize as a result of the drawing shall return to lottery headquarters a completed claim form as provided by the lottery, which claim form must be actually received by lottery no later than 5:00 p.m. on the forty-fifth day following the drawing or the person named on the ticket drawn will no longer be eligible for the prize. In such an event, the first eligible alternate entry drawn pursuant to subsection (f) herein shall be declared the winner of that prize. 111-4-2062. Certification of drawing. (a) The "Kansas Speedway Second Chance Drawing" shall be personally observed by a member of the Kansas lottery security department and a member of the Kansas lottery marketing department or other person or persons designated by the executive director of the lottery ("event manager").

(b) Upon completion of the drawing, the security official and the event manager shall issue a report to the executive director, certifying that the name of each prize winner is correct, and that to the best of their knowledge the procedures required by these rules were followed in selecting the prize winner. (g) "Tripler Bingo" is a two-part vertically oriented game. The first part consists of the "CALLER'S CARD" and the "BONUS NUMBERS." The "CALLER'S CARD" contains 24 draw numbers covered by opaque latex. The "BONUS NUMBERS" consist of six draw numbers covered by opaque latex.

111-4-2064. "Holiday Crossword" instant ticket lottery game number 320. (a) The Kansas lottery shall conduct an instant winner lottery game entitled "Holiday Crossword" commencing on or after September 25, 2003. The rules for this game are contained in K.A.R. 111-3-1 *et seq.* and 111-4-2064.

(b) The "play symbols" for this game are as follows: A - B - C - D - E - F - G - H - I - J - K - L - M - N - O - P - Q - R - S - T - U - V - W - X - Y - Z. There are no "play symbol captions" in this game.

(c) For this game, a play symbol shall appear in each of 18 play spots within the "YOUR NUMBERS" play area, in each of two play spots within the "BONUS" play area, and a variable number of times within the crossword puzzle grid.

(d) The ticket numbers in each book of tickets in this game shall start with 000 and end with 149.

(e) The three letters comprising the retailer validation codes used in this game shall appear in three of eight varying locations among the play symbols. The retailer validation codes for this game and their meanings are as follows:

In the "YOUR LETTERS" play area, located in the lower part of the ticket, there are 18 letters located under opaque latex. To the right of the "YOUR LETTERS" play area is the "BONUS" play area in which there are two letters covered by opaque latex. Imaged around each of the 18 "YOUR LETTERS" and two "BONUS" letters there will be a four-sided box composed of solid lines. A player will remove the latex from the "YOUR LETTERS" and "BONUS" play areas one letter at a time, and then for each matching letter in the crossword puzzle grid scratch off the transparent latex. Each letter revealed in the "YOUR LETTERS" and "BONUS" play areas may be used an unlimited number of times in the crossword puzzle grid. If a player reveals at least three complete words in the crossword puzzle grid, the player wins the corresponding prize in the prize legend. The prize legend on the front of the ticket indicates prizes won for number of words revealed.

(h) To qualify as a complete word to win a prize in this game, the words revealed must meet the following requirements:

- (1) must contain at least three letters;
- (2) cannot be formed diagonally, run right to left or from bottom to top;

(3) must appear in an unbroken horizontal or vertical string of letters in the "crossword" puzzle;

(4) an unbroken string of letters cannot be interrupted by a black space and must contain every single letter square between two black spaces;

(5) every single letter in the unbroken string must be revealed in "YOUR LETTERS," or "BONUS" areas and be included to form a word; and

(6) the three small letters outside the squares in the "YOUR LETTERS" area are for validation purposes and cannot be used to play "Holiday Crossword."

(i) Each ticket in this game may win up to one time. Only the highest prize won on each ticket will be awarded.

Article 5.—MULTI-STATE ON-LINE GAMES

111-5-81. Game description; retail sale of tickets.

(a) The "2by2" game is a two out of 26 "red" numbers plus two out of 26 "white" numbers online lottery game which pays each grand prize in a cash lump sum payment of \$20,000, except that said grand prize may become pari-mutuel as set forth in these rules. Except as provided in these rules, all other prizes are paid on a set cash basis. To play "2by2," a player shall select two different "red" numbers between one through 26, and two additional "white" numbers between one through 26 for input into a terminal. Each set of numbers is from one through 26. One or both numbers chosen from one set may be the same as the other set.

(b) A "2by2" game ticket shall sell for one dollar.

(c) Tickets shall not be sold to any person under the age of 18 years. Each retailer may require a person purchasing tickets to produce proof of age.

(d) Each ticket shall be purchased from a terminal operated by a retailer. The player may select four numbers by:

(1) communicating the four numbers to the retailer;
 (2) marking four numbered squares on any one game board on a play slip and submitting the play slip to the retailer; or
 (3) requesting a "quick pick" from the retailer.
 The retailer shall then issue a ticket from the terminal containing the selected sets of numbers, each of which constitutes a game play.

(e) A validated ticket shall be the only proof of a game play or plays. The only method of claiming a prize or prizes shall be the submission of the winning ticket to and receipt of the ticket by the lottery or its authorized agent. A play slip shall have no pecuniary or prize value and shall not be used as evidence of a ticket purchase or of numbers selected.

(f) A ticket shall not be voided or cancelled by returning the ticket to the selling retailer, including tickets that are printed in error.

(g) Ticket sales will end at approximately 8:59 p.m. central time on Mondays, Tuesdays, Wednesdays, Thursdays, Fridays, and Saturdays and will resume at approximately 9:05 p.m.

(h) Drawings will be conducted six times a week on Mondays, Tuesdays, Wednesdays, Thursdays, Fridays, and Saturdays at approximately 9:30 p.m. central time (CT), after the game is closed at approximately 8:59 p.m. central time (CT) and the external auditor has verified that the game is closed, under conditions and procedures promulgated by the executive director of the lottery.

(i) Each player shall be responsible for verifying the accuracy of the game play or plays and other data printed on the ticket. The placing of plays is done at the player's own risk through the online retailer who is deemed to be acting on behalf of the player in entering the play or plays.

(j) These amendments shall take effect on or after November 1, 2003. (Authorized by K.S.A. 74-8710; implementing K.S.A. 74-8710 and 74-8718; effective, T-111-7-15-02, May 15, 2002; amended, T-111-9-18-03, Sept. 10, 2003.)

POWER PLAY PRO FOOTBALL GETAWAY DRAWINGS

111-5-106. Name of drawing. The Kansas lottery shall conduct drawings entitled "Power Play Pro Football Getaway Drawings," and will accept entries starting October 5, 2003, for the drawings to be conducted at 10:00 a.m. November 7, 2003, and December 19, 2003. Two winners shall be selected November 7, 2003, and three winners shall be selected December 19, 2003. Rules applicable to the "Power Play Pro Football Getaway Drawings" are contained in K.A.R. 111-5-106 through 111-5-110 and K.A.R. 111-6-1, *et seq.* (Authorized by and implementing K.S.A. 74-8710; effective, T-111-9-9-03, Aug. 13, 2003; amended, T-111-9-18-03, Sept. 10, 2003.)

111-5-107. Prize. (a) The five prize winners selected in the "Power Play Pro Football Getaway Drawings" on the dates specified in K.A.R. 111-5-106 shall each receive a trip for two people to the National Football League Super Bowl on February 1, 2004, including the following: round-trip coach air transportation from Wichita, Kansas, or Kansas City, Missouri, to Houston, Texas; transportation to and from the airport and hotel; lodging

on January 30 and 31, and February 1, 2004; pre-game party; admission to the football game; seating, non-exclusive access to, and food and beverages in a reserved suite; VIP pass for access to certain portions of the football stadium; a commemorative leather jacket; \$500 spending money; and mandatory state and federal income withholding taxes. The following restrictions shall apply to the "Power Play Pro Football Getaway Drawings" prize packages:

(a) Trip packages are transferable one time, cannot be redeemed for cash, are not refundable, cannot be split into component parts, and cannot be extended. All transfers require a certified authorization from the winner.

111-5-108. Method of entry. (a) Entry into the "Power Play Pro Football Getaway Drawings" shall be accomplished as follows:

(1) Beginning at 5:00 a.m. on October 5, 2003, and ending at the close of business as defined in subsection (p) of K.A.R. 111-6-1, on December 13, 2003, for every \$10 or more single Powerball ticket purchased with the Power Play option, the purchaser shall receive free of charge an entry blank for the "Power Play Pro Football Getaway Drawings" as set forth in K.A.R. 111-5-107. For every such purchase made during the time period specified, whether for a single draw or multiple draws, lottery terminals shall automatically dispense an entry blank for said drawings.

(2) The holder of an entry blank must fill in the entry blank in a legible manner. Only one name shall appear on an entry blank.

(3) Place one or more completed entry blank(s) for said drawings into an envelope with proper postage and mail it to: "Power Play Pro Football Getaway Drawings," c/o Kansas lottery, P. O. Box 750980, Topeka, Kansas 66675-0980. Mailed entries must be received by morning mail pickup on the Tuesday before each Friday drawing.

(4) The holder of the ticket is not required to personally attend said drawings or be present at the time of the drawings to be determined a winner.

(5) The drawings will be conducted at the approximate times listed in K.A.R. 111-5-106.

(b) There is no limit on the number of entries a person may make, but a person may only win one time in this promotion.

(c) All eligible entries which are mailed and received by the morning mail pickup in Topeka, Kansas, on the

(b) Upon completion of the drawing, the security official and the event manager shall issue a report to the executive director, certifying that the name of each prize winner is correct, and that to the best of their knowledge the procedures required by these rules were followed in selecting the prize winners. (Authorized by and implementing K.S.A. 74-8710; effective, T-111-9-9-03, Aug. 13, 2003; amended, T-111-9-18-03, Sept. 10, 2003.)

111-5-110. Selection of winners. The following process shall be used for the selection of winners in the "Power Play Pro Football Getaway Drawings":

(a) Kansas lottery personnel shall pick up all mail containing "Power Play Pro Football Getaway Drawings" entries at the United States Post Office in Topeka, Kansas, with the final pick up on the Tuesday immediately prior to each drawing.

(b) Lottery personnel shall transport the mail to the lottery headquarters' mail room where the envelopes will be opened and the entries contained therein stored in a secure location until immediately prior to the drawing, at which time all entries will be placed into the drawing receptacle or drum.

The designated individual shall then unseal the receptacle or drum, and using the bare-arm technique, while looking away, remove one entry from the receptacle or drum. Security shall mark it in such a way as to identify it as the winning entry for that drawing. The person whose name appears on each of the entries shall be the winner of the prize identified in K.A.R. 111-5-107, subject to validation by the lottery as set forth in these rules.

(e) After the number of winning entries are drawn, one at a time, on the dates set forth in K.A.R. 111-5-106, and after each entry has been verified as valid by lottery security, two more entries will be drawn on each date, one at a time, to serve as alternate entries. The alternate entries will be marked in order drawn, 1A and 2A. The alternate ticket entries will be used only if the original winner cannot be located or is declared ineligible, or fails to present a fully-executed claim form to lottery headquarters by 5:00 p.m. on the fourteenth day following the drawing. The alternates will be used, if necessary, in the order drawn.

(f) The Kansas lottery security official present shall review each entry drawn to determine the validity of the entry into the said drawing in accordance with these regulations. If it is a valid entry and the information is legible, the event manager and the security person present shall record the name of the winner and each alternate. Each winner shall be given or sent a prize claim form to be completed and returned, and received by, to the lottery within 14 days of the drawing.

(g) If any entry is determined to be ineligible, it shall be discarded by the security person present and another entry drawn. This procedure will be repeated until valid selections are obtained.

(h) All entries not drawn in the first drawing, entries remaining in the drum or receptacle after the final drawing has been completed, and all entries not received in compliance with these rules, shall be destroyed pursuant to K.A.R. 111-3-34. (Authorized by and implementing K.S.A. 74-8710; effective, T-111-9-9-03, Aug. 13, 2003; amended, T-111-9-18-03, Sept. 10, 2003.)

Article 7.—ON-LINE GAMES

111-7-187. Buy \$10 in Keno tickets, get one free 10-spot Keno ticket with Bull's-eye. During the term of this promotion, for every Kansas Keno single ticket purchase of \$10.00 or more, a player will receive free of charge a \$1.00 10-spot Keno ticket together with the bull's-eye option (a \$2.00 total value).
