#### Notice of Hearing

A public hearing on the state's possible purchase of the Circle K Ranch in Edwards County will be held at 2 p.m. Tuesday, December 16, at the Edwards County Fairgrounds Building in Kinsley. The hearing was authorized by the Kansas Water Authority at its November 25 meeting.

Buying the 7,000-acre Circle K Ranch from Hays and Russell is part of a proposed broader strategy to stabilize groundwater levels and restore baseflow to the middle reach of the Arkansas River. Irrigation wells on the ranch in that stretch of the river, if retired, would decrease the draw on the alluvial, or streamside, aquifer.

If acquired, proposed plans call for a portion of the land to be leased back for production agriculture. Irrigated land that's taken out of production would be converted to wildlife habitat and managed by the Kansas Department of Wildlife and Parks. The area would be open to the public for hunting, birding and hiking.

Administrative Regulations

The Kansas Department of Health and Environment, Division of Health, Bureau of Epidemiology, will conduct a public hearing at 9 a.m. Wednesday, February 11, in the Prairie Conference Room, third floor, Curtis State Office Building, 1000 S.W. Jackson, Topeka, to consider the adoption of proposed amendments to existing disease regulations K.A.R. 28-1-2 and 28-1-4.

**K.A.R. 28-1-2** and **K.A.R. 28-1-4** both deal with diseases reportable to local health departments and the Kansas Department of Health and Environment. K.A.R. 28-1-2 includes the list of diseases reportable by physicians, while K.A.R. 28-1-4 describes reporting requirements for laboratories. Most reportable conditions are infectious. These lists need to be updated periodically, to reflect changes in diagnostic tests and in the list of national notifiable diseases maintained by the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) and the Council of State and Territorial Epidemiologists (CSTE).

When a condition is added to the list, providers and facilities that submit reports for that condition are protected from liability incurred as a result of their reporting (K.S.A. 65-118).

Adding **Tuberculosis infection** to 28-1-2: Tuberculosis active disease has been reportable in Kansas for many decades. In an effort to move closer to elimination of Tuberculosis in Kansas, collection of infection data will al-

low the agency to better address the disease at a much earlier stage and potentially treat infected individuals before active disease develops. It also will allow for measures to be taken to improve case finding activities by monitoring the infection rate by regions and counties.

Adding **Severe Acute Respiratory Syndrome (SARS)** to 28-1-2: SARS is a new disease recognized for the first time in 2003. Its appearance caused severe disruptions of the health care system in some Asian countries and in Canada. While no SARS cases have been reported anywhere in the world for several months, it is widely believed that the disease may reappear in the fall.

Adding **arboviral meningitis** to 28-1-2: This is a group of diseases that includes the West Nile virus, which has surfaced as an important public health problem in the past couple of years.

Adding **Cyclospora infection** to 28-1-2: This is a gastrointestinal infection usually transmitted through contaminated food. Food imported from countries with low sanitation standards is more often involved. The disease has the potential to cause sudden, large outbreaks. The CDC and CSTE recommend that states conduct surveillance for this condition.

Adding **varicella (chickenpox)** to 28-1-2: Deaths from varicella have been reportable in Kansas for several years. With the expansion of the use of the varicella vaccine, and the planned requirement of varicella vaccination for school entry to be introduced soon, the number of cases of varicella is expected to decrease considerably, and it is important to track these cases for prevention purposes. The Council of State and Territorial Epidemiologists has recommended that by 2005, states establish or enhance varicella surveillance programs that provide individual case reporting.

Other changes to 28-1-2: The word "immediately" has been replaced with "within four hours" to avoid different interpretations. Some other editorial changes that do not alter the scope of the regulation have been introduced to clarify its intent and meaning.

Adding information on utilization of care services to 28-1-4: The addition will provide the secretary authority to request, when necessary to assist in the detection or monitoring of disease outbreaks, information from hospitals on the utilization of some health care services. This information will be required only for a limited period of time.

**Economic Impact:**

*Cost to the agency:* The number of disease reports submitted to the Bureau of Epidemiology and Disease Prevention in the Kansas Department of Health and Environment will increase and will be incorporated into the existing staff workload. The Kansas Health and Environmental Laboratory will have to pay for the cost of additional tests on isolates sent by clinical laboratories, but most of the testing is anticipated to be requested by physicians in commercial laboratories and will not be a result of these changes in the regulation.

*Costs related to varicella reports:* Centers for Disease Control and Prevention estimates that Kansas has 2,688 cases of varicella per year. Assuming that 80 percent or 2,150 cases would be reported to KDHE, KDHE costs are esti-

mated at five minutes of an epidemiologist's time per report received at \$2 per report equaling \$4,300 per year.

*Costs related to Tuberculosis infection:* It is expected that the TB Program at KDHE will receive an increase of approximately 25 percent in reporting activity or about 500 new infection reports. This increase can be absorbed by the current staff in the program. There may be an increase in people choosing to take preventative treatment offered by the state, but it is unlikely that the agency will see much of this as the present policy is to require reporting of any case who chooses to receive medications from the state, so it should be expected that the current unreported infections are those among people who have chosen and will choose not to receive preventative treatment. The cost to the state for preventative treatment medications is less than \$20 per patient depending on the length of treatment (\$14.92 for six-month regiment and \$19.92 for nine-month regiment). If the agency assumes that 10 percent of the newly reported cases choose to accept preventative treatment of six months as recommended by KDHE, the cost to KDHE would be \$895 per year.

*Costs related to other reportable conditions:* The number of new reports received as a result of these changes, not including TB and varicella, is expected to be less than 100, for a total cost of about \$200 to \$400.

*Cost related to receiving information from hospitals on utilization of health care services:* This information will only be collected for brief periods of time, and the cost of receiving and processing it at KDHE will be part of the cost to detect and monitor outbreaks, which is already done. It is estimated that over a period of a year the cost to KDHE for this indicator will be less than \$500.

*Total cost to KDHE:* Estimated to a maximum of \$6,000 per year.

#### **Cost to persons who will bear the costs and to those who will be affected:**

*Costs related to Tuberculosis infection:* Data comparisons were made with the state of Missouri where reporting of TB infection has been required since 1991. The general populations and the TB prevalence rates of the two states are similar. Currently, Missouri is receiving an average of 6,000 infection reports per year. Based on this analysis, the agency can expect around 3,000 cases per year to be reported in Kansas. At present, KDHE already receives about 2,500 reports of infection per year. The new regulation would likely add 500 more reports. The additional cost associated for providers to report will be approximately \$1.25 per report, including staff time and mail or fax charges. This translates to about \$650 spread over the multitude of providers (private physicians, occupational health offices, student health centers and nursing homes).

*Cost related to varicella/chickenpox reporting:* Estimating 2,150 cases reported to KDHE at a cost of \$1.25 each to providers, the total would be \$2,688.

*Costs related to other reportable conditions:* The number of new reports for other conditions generated as a result of the new regulation is likely to be less than 100, for a cost of about \$100 spread across all reporting providers.

*Cost related to sending information from hospitals on utilization of health care services:* This information will only be collected for brief periods of time, and it is already in the

possession of hospitals. There will be some cost for assembling and transmitting this information to KDHE. It is likely that even when this information is collected, the secretary will require only a few hospitals in the state to report it, depending on the nature and location of the public health emergency being addressed. Since most of the information is expected to already be stored in a computerized form, the cost over a period of a year to hospitals is estimated at less than \$500 per reporting hospital.

#### **Costs to other governmental agencies or units:**

Local health departments will incur some modest additional costs when they receive a case report from a provider and they transmit it to KDHE. Most (80 percent) local health departments are linked to the KDHE HAWK system, an electronic disease reporting system that they can access to report these conditions to KDHE. It is estimated that each case report will require about five minutes of clerical staff time at an average cost of less than \$2 per case. Therefore, the total cost of the additional reporting requirements will be  $2,850 \text{ cases} \times 80\% \times \$2 = \$4,560$  per year, spread across all local health departments linked to HAWK. Local health departments not linked to HAWK are primarily small local agencies and will experience a very low number of cases (about 20 percent of the total in the state) that they will report by mail or fax. This reporting method will add about \$0.50 to each report for a total additional cost of \$285 ( $2,850 \text{ cases} \times 20\% \times \$0.50 = \$285$ ) spread across all the agencies.

The time period between the publication of this notice and the scheduled hearing constitutes a 60-day public comment period for the purpose of receiving written public comments on the proposed regulatory action. All interested parties may submit written comments prior to the hearing to Sharon Patnode, Bureau of Epidemiology, Curtis State Office Building, 1000 S.W. Jackson, Suite 210, Topeka, 66612. All interested parties will be given a reasonable opportunity to present their views orally on the proposed regulatory action during the hearing. In order to give all parties an opportunity to present their views, it may be necessary to require each participant to limit any oral presentation to five minutes.

The Kansas Department of Health and Environment is soliciting comments regarding two proposed air quality permits. Marble Products has applied for a construction permit in accordance with the provisions of K.A.R. 28-19-300 and a Class II operating permit in accordance with the provisions of K.A.R. 28-19-540. Emissions of volatile organic compounds (VOCs) and hazardous air pollutants (HAPs) were evaluated during the permit review process. The purpose of a Class II permit is to limit the potential-to-emit for these pollutants to below major source thresholds.

Marble Products, Wichita, owns and operates a shampoo basin manufacturing facility located at 2080 S. Edwards, Wichita, at which the shampoo basin manufacturing facility is to be operated.

A copy of the proposed permits, permit applications, all supporting documentation and all information relied upon during the permit application review process is available for public review for a period of 30 days from the date of publication during normal business hours at the KDHE, Bureau of Air and Radiation, 1000 S.W. Jackson, Suite 310, Topeka; and a copy of the proposed permits can be reviewed at the Wichita Department of Environmental Health, 1900 E. 9th, Wichita. This 60-day notice of the public hearing shall constitute a public comment period for purpose of receiving written public comments on the proposed rule and regulation. All interested parties may submit written comments prior to the hearing to Deletria Nash, Kansas Insurance Department, 420 S.W. 9th, Topeka, 66612-1678. All interested parties will be given a reasonable opportunity to present their views orally on the adoption of the proposed regulation during the hearing.

Any individual with a disability may request accommodation in order to participate in the public hearing and may request the proposed regulation and economic impact statement in an accessible format. Requests for accommodation should be made at least five working days in advance of the hearing by contacting Deletria Nash at (785) 296-7811.

A copy of the full text of the regulation and the economic impact statement may be obtained by contacting Deletria Nash. A summary of the regulation and its economic impact follows:

**K.A.R. 40-1-51. Securities valuation; requirements.** This regulation adopts the National Association of Insurance Commissioners' "Purposes and Procedures of the Securities Valuation Office of the National Association of Insurance Commissioners" manual. The primary purpose of the regulation is financial in nature. It adopts industry standards that are currently in use by companies.

There is little fiscal impact as a result of these changes inasmuch as insurance companies currently use the standards as outlined in the manual. There also is little or no fiscal impact on the Kansas Insurance Department or other government agencies.

Article 4.—OCCUPATION AND  
CONCESSIONAIRE LICENSES

**112-4-1. Occupation licenses.** (a) Before engaging in the following occupations at a racetrack facility, each person shall pay the required fee and secure the appropriate license or licenses from the commission:

- (1) Administration-facility;
- (2) administration-organization;
- (3) administrative support-facility;
- (4) administrative support-organization;
- (5) amateur jockey;
- (6) apprentice jockey;
- (7) assistant trainer-horse/greyhound;
- (8) authorized agent;
- (9) backup greyhound racetrack official;
- (10) backup horse racetrack official;
- (11) blacksmith/plater/farrier;
- (12) breed registry;
- (13) concession employee;

- (14) concession manager/operator;
- (15) driver;
- (16) exercise person;
- (17) greyhound racetrack official;
- (18) groom/hot walker;
- (19) horse racetrack official;
- (20) horseman/kennel representative;
- (21) jockey;
- (22) jockey agent;
- (23) jockey guild representative;
- (24) kennel helper;
- (25) kennel owner;

(b) Each applicant for an occupation license shall apply in writing on the application form approved and furnished by the commission.

(c) Each applicant for an occupation license acting as an employer required to carry workers compensation insurance pursuant to the workers compensation act of the state of Kansas, K.S.A. 44-501 et seq., and amendments thereto, shall submit proof of this insurance to the commission within 10 working days of the applicant's filing an application for an occupation license.

(d) Each person who is appointed by an owner or trainer to act as an authorized agent shall secure an occupation license. Each owner, trainer, or authorized agent shall file each authorized agent agreement form with the commission. Each authorized agent shall perform for the owner or trainer only the duties that are the subject of the authorized agent agreement form. Each authorized agent shall notify the commission in writing when the authorized agent agreement is terminated.

(e) An applicant for an occupation license shall not knowingly provide false information on any occupation license application form.

(f) An applicant for an occupation license shall not fail to disclose any material fact on any occupation license application form.

(g) No licensee shall alter or attempt to alter any information contained on an occupation license badge.

(continued)

(h) Each person who loses an occupation license shall immediately perform the following:

(1) Notify the commission office at the racetrack facility;

(2) secure a duplicate license; and

(3) pay the required fee.

(i) An applicant shall pay each required fee when the occupation license is issued. Occupational licenses issued by the commission shall be for one-year or three-year periods.

(1) Each one-year or annual license shall be valid for a period commencing on January 1 and terminating on December 31 of the calendar year for which the license is issued.

(2) Each three-year or triennial license shall be valid for a period commencing on January 1 of the year in which the license is issued and terminating on December 31 of the final year.

(j) A computer check of license records from other racing jurisdictions shall be run annually on all licensees by the commission.

(k) Any applicant may be required to submit with the application at least two complete sets of fingerprint cards approved by the commission. If the fingerprints are not acceptable for processing, each applicant shall be required to resubmit fingerprint cards.

(l) Each applicant for an occupation license shall be at least 16 years of age. This provision shall not preclude dependent children under the age of 16 from working for a parent or guardian if the parent or guardian is licensed as a kennel owner, trainer, or assistant trainer and the parent or guardian has obtained approval from the organization licensee. Each licensed trainer or assistant trainer at a horse or greyhound racetrack facility shall be at least 18 years of age. Each racing official, security employee, and mutuel employee shall be at least 18 years of age.

(m) Each employer at a racetrack facility shall ensure that each employee is properly licensed and shall immediately notify the commission office at the racetrack facility and the organization licensee when a licensee's employment status changes or when an employee is terminated. Each employer shall make an effort to secure the employee's occupation license and, if the license is secured, shall deliver the license to the commission office at the racetrack facility. #### Notice of Hearing on Proposed Permanent Quarantine

Pursuant to the provisions of K.S.A. 2-2117, a hearing will be conducted at 9:30 a.m. Thursday, January 22, in Room 401, Kansas Department of Agriculture, 109 S.W. 9th, Topeka, in the matter of the issuance of a permanent quarantine prohibiting the importation of and the distribution of spread of federal noxious weeds within the state of Kansas. The proposed quarantine would affect the entire state of Kansas and prohibit the importation of or distribution or spread of federal noxious weeds.

All interested parties may attend the hearing and will be given the opportunity to express comments either orally or in writing, or both. Interested parties may appear in person or by counsel.

Written comments and requests for information concerning the proposed quarantine should be directed to Tom Sim IV, Manager, Plant Protection and Weed Control Section, Kansas Department of Agriculture, Forbes Field, Building 282, P.O. Box 19282, Topeka, 66619, at or before the time of hearing. For persons intending to present oral testimony at the hearing, prior notice to the department would be helpful in arranging the agenda. In order to give all parties an opportunity to present their views, it may be necessary to request each participant to limit oral presentation to five minutes.

The proposed quarantine order is as follows:

#### *BEFORE THE SECRETARY OF AGRICULTURE, TOPEKA, KANSAS FEDERAL NOXIOUS WEED QUARANTINE*

The Secretary of the Kansas Department of Agriculture, pursuant to authority authorized by K.S.A. 2-2117, hereby determines that quarantine action is necessary to prevent the further introduction and spread of federal noxious weeds into and within the State of Kansas.

The Secretary does hereby make the following findings relevant to these federal noxious weeds:

WHEREAS, the U.S. Department of Agriculture (USDA); Animal and Plant Health Inspection Service (APHIS); and Plant Protection and Quarantine (PPQ) has designated 96 species of plants as noxious weeds pursuant to authority provided in the federal Plant Protection Act (Public Law 106-224).

WHEREAS, the Kansas Department of Agriculture has determined that all federal noxious weeds are plant pests as defined in K.S.A. 2-2113.

WHEREAS, federal noxious weeds have innate tendencies for invasiveness which requires that an internal and external quarantine of all federal noxious weeds be established in the State of Kansas.

#### **THE SECRETARY DOES THEREFORE ORDER THAT:**

In order to prevent and retard, suppress, and control the spread of the plant pests, the movement of federal noxious weeds **into the State of Kansas** from any other state of the United States, by any person is prohibited. Further, the movement of federal noxious weeds **within the State of Kansas** by any person is prohibited.

## DEFINITIONS

This quarantine shall apply to any "person" as defined by K.S.A. 2-2113, and all other terms used within this quarantine shall have the meanings as defined or established pursuant to K.S.A. 2-2113 *et seq.* as amended and supplemented.

## REGULATED AREAS

All areas within the borders of the State of Kansas shall be subject to the restrictions of this quarantine. As established by K.S.A. 2-2115, "the Secretary shall have the right to enter and inspect any property in this state," for the purpose of enforcement of this act, except private dwellings, or to inspect any means of conveyance upon probable cause that it contains material subject to this quarantine.

This Order of Quarantine shall become effective on the date of signature and shall remain in effect until rescinded or modified by order of the Secretary.

**VIOLATION OF THIS QUARANTINE**

Any person who knowingly moves a regulated article in violation of this quarantine may be subject to criminal prosecution or civil penalty pursuant to K.S.A. 2-2124 and 2-2125.

**Authority, Purpose and Security**

The lease was originally entered into for the acquisition, construction, installation and equipping of certain educational facilities (the improvements), all pursuant to K.S.A. 71-201 *et seq.*, as amended. The Series 2004 Certificates are secured by and payable from the trust estate established under the declaration of trust (the trust indenture), which consists, in part, of basic rent payments received by the trustee under the lease. The obligation of the college to make basic rent payments under the lease is a limited obligation, payable from available revenues of the college, including those raised through ad valorem taxation, but shall not in any way be construed to be a general obligation or indebtedness of the college. The original term of the lease extends to January 1, 2014, with a renewal term extending the final lease term to February 1, 2014. The lease also is subject to change or termination by act of the Kansas Legislature.

**Conditions of Bids**

Proposals will be received on the Series 2004 Certificates bearing such rate or rates of interest as may be specified by the bidders, subject to the following conditions: (a) the same rate shall apply to all of the principal portion due in each year; (b) each interest rate specified shall be a multiple of 1/8 or 1/20 of 1 percent; (c) no interest rate may exceed a rate equal to the daily yield for the 30-year treasury certificate published by *The Bond Buyer*, in New York, New York, on the Monday next preceding the day on which the Series 2004 Certificates are sold, plus 2 percent; and (d) no supplemental interest payments will be considered. The difference between the highest rate specified and the lowest rate specified cannot exceed 3 percent. #### **Optional Lease Only Bid**

A bidder may choose to submit a bid for a lease purchase agreement transaction only, with no certificates of participation. If a bidder so chooses, the bidder should check the "lease only" box in the official bid form and indicate the "fee" that would be proposed. In that instance, certificate maturity amounts set forth herein and in the official bid form will then reference principal portions of lease payments.

#### **Basis of Award**

The award of the Series 2004 Certificates will be made on the basis of the lowest net interest cost (expressed in dollars), which will be determined by subtracting the amount of the premium bid, if any, from or adding the amount of the discount or fee bid, if any, to the total interest cost to the college. With respect to a "lease only" bid, the college also will consider costs of issuance savings. #### **Certification as to Offering Prices**

To provide the college with information necessary for compliance with Section 148 of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended, the successful bidder will be required to complete, execute and deliver to the college prior to the delivery of the Series 2004 Certificates, a certificate regarding the "issue price" of the Series 2004 Certificates (as defined in Section 148 of the code), reflecting the initial offering prices (excluding accrued interest and expressed as dollar prices) at which a substantial amount (*i.e.*, 10 percent or more) of the Series 2004 Certificates of each maturity have been or are expected to be sold to the public. The term "public" excludes bond houses, brokers or similar persons or organizations acting in the capacity of underwriters or wholesalers.
