## Notice to Private Activity Bond Applicants

Applications for allocation of 2004 Private Activity Bond (PAB) authority are now being accepted for qualified uses, as defined by the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, and amendments thereto.

The State of Kansas is projected to receive \$233,800,000 of federal authority for the issuance of PABs in calendar year 2004. Historically, the primary uses of this federal authority have included "qualified small issue bonds" used for construction and equipping of manufacturing facilities and beginning farmer programs; "exempt facility bonds" used by for-profit entities providing a public benefit, i.e., certain waste treatment facilities, qualified residential rental facilities, etc.; and "qualified mortgage bonds" issued to benefit first-time homebuyers. Allocation awarded by the Secretary of Commerce are subject to the provisions of K.S.A. 74-5060 et seq. and the limitations of the state volume cap.

Fees associated with PAB application and issuance are as follows:

(1) Application Fee—A nonrefundable fee must accompany the application before the request can be processed. The application fee is determined as follows:

- \$250 for allocation requests up to \$5,000,000
- \$500 for allocation requests from \$5,000,001 to \$10,000,000

- \$1,000 for allocation requests from \$10,000,001 and above

(2) Issuance Fee—An issuance fee for allocation amounts utilized, other than "Qualified Mortgage Bonds" issued, shall be due and payable to the Kansas Department of Commerce at bond closing. Issuance fees shall be determined as follows:

Allocation Used	Fee
• To \$2,000,000	5 basis points (.05%)
• \$2,000,001 and above	10 basis points (.10%)

"Qualified Mortgage Bond" programs will be assessed a fee, upon issuance of each mortgage loan assisted through the program, equal to .5% of the PAB allocation used.

Issuance fees shall be remitted within 30 days of bond closing. Checks for both the application and issuance fees should be made payable to the Kansas Department of Commerce Bond Fee Fund.

Administrative Regulations**

A public hearing will be conducted at 9 a.m. Tuesday, March 9, in the conference/meeting room at the Americas Hotel, 6021 S.W. 6th Ave., Topeka, to consider the adoption of a proposed regulation of the Kansas Board of Pharmacy.

This 60-day notice of the public hearing shall constitute a public comment period for the purpose of receiving written public comments on the proposed regulation. All parties may submit written comments prior to the hearing to Debra Billingsley, Executive Director, Kansas Board of Pharmacy, Room 560, Landon State Office Building, 900 S.W. Jackson, Topeka, 66612-1231. All interested parties will be given a reasonable opportunity to present their views orally on the adoption of the proposed regulation during the hearing. In order to give all parties an opportunity to present their views, it may be necessary to request each participant to limit any oral presentation to five minutes.

Any individual with a disability may request accommodation in order to participate in the public hearing and may request the proposed regulation and economic impact statement in an accessible format. Requests for accommodation should be made at least five working days in advance of the hearing by contacting Debra Billingsley at (785) 296-4056. Handicapped parking is available, and the main entrance to the building is accessible to individuals with disabilities.

This regulation is proposed for adoption on a permanent basis. This regulation is not mandated by federal law as a requirement for participating in or implementing a federally-subsidized or assisted program. Copies of the regulation and its economic impact statement may be obtained by contacting Debra Billingsley. A summary of the regulation and its economic impact follows:

**K.A.R. 68-7-20. Shared services.** This is a new regulation that establishes certain organizational and operational requirements that must be met by any pharmacy that engages in either "shared order filling" or "shared order processing," as those terms are defined in the regulation.

Pharmacies that choose to engage in shared order filling or shared order processing will incur some nominal expense because of the record-keeping requirements of the regulations. Those record-keeping costs will not be significantly different than those that would be incurred if shared order filling or shared order processing were not being utilized. It is anticipated that any additional cost would be very minimal. It is anticipated that governmental units, private citizens and consumers will not be financially affected by this regulation. This is not an environmental regulation.

## 2003 Update to Guidelines for Takings of Private Property

The following cases contain analysis of issues relating to government takings of privately-owned property. Pursuant to K.S.A. 77-704 of the Private Property Protection Act, this summary of decisions constitutes the 2003 update to the Attorney General's Guidelines. The original guidelines may be found in Volume 14, Number 51 of the Kansas Register, published December 15, 1995. Annual updates may be found in the Kansas Register at Volume 16, Number 1, published January 2, 1997; Volume 16, Number 52, published December 25, 1997; Volume 17, Number 53, published December 31, 1998; Volume 18, Number 52, published December 30, 1999; Volume 20, No. 1, published January 4, 2001; Volume 21, No. 1, published January 3, 2002; and Volume 21, No. 52, published December 26, 2002.

*Brown et al. v. Legal Foundation of Washington*, 538 U.S. 216, 123 S.Ct. 1406, 155 L.Ed.2d 376 (March 26, 2003)

The United States Supreme Court a state supreme court's program for using interest earned on IOLTA accounts to pay for legal services for the needy. The Court held:

"A state law requiring that client funds that could not otherwise generate net earnings for the client be deposited in an IOLTA account is not a 'regulatory taking,' but a law requiring that the interest on those funds be transferred to a different owner for a legitimate public use could be a *per se* taking requiring the payment of 'just compensation' to the client." (Syllabus, citation omitted.)

The Court found that providing legal services to the needy under these circumstances met the "public use"

requirement of the Fifth Amendment and then went on to address whether "just compensation" was required.

"The Court first addresses the type of taking that this case involves. The Court's jurisprudence concerning condemnations and physical takings involves the straightforward application of *per se* rules, while its regulatory takings jurisprudence is characterized by essentially ad hoc, factual inquiries designed to allow careful examination and weighing of all relevant circumstances. *Tahoe-Sierra Preservation Council, Inc. v. Tahoe Regional Planning Agency*, 535 U.S. 302, 322." (Syllabus.)

The Court determined that there was no compensable taking in this case because the program called only for deposit of clients' funds in IOLTA accounts when they could generate no net income for the client. "Because 'just compensation' is measured by the owner's pecuniary loss—which is zero whenever the Washington law is obeyed—there has been no violation of the Just Compensation Clause." (Syllabus.)

*Gordon v. Norton*, 322 F.3d 1213 (10th Cir. 2003).

Takings claims that arise under the Endangered Species Act must be processed in accordance with the Tucker Act, which confers jurisdiction on the United States Court of Claims. The Court, therefore, held that it lacked substantive jurisdiction to hear the takings claims in this case.

*Pittsburg County Rural Water District No. 7 v. City of McAlester*, 346 F.3d 1260 (10th Cir. 2003).

The Court determined that application of 7 U.S.C. § 1926 under the circumstances did not constitute a taking under the Fifth Amendment to the United States Constitution.

*Microtronics, Inc. v. City of Iola*, 2003 WL 22149671 (D.Kan. Sept. 9, 2003).

Harm to plaintiffs held not to constitute a "taking" because no allegation that property was taken for public use. Cites *Brown v. Legal Foundation of Washington*, *supra*, for two conditions required under the Fifth Amendment: Public use; and just compensation.

*General Building Contractors, L.L.C. v. Board of Shawnee County Commissioners*, 275 Kan. 575, 66 P.3d 873 (2003).

The Court upheld the eminent domain taking of private property for industrial or economic development as a valid public purpose and within the home rule powers granted to counties.

*Esplanade Properties, L.L.C. v. City of Seattle*, 123 S.Ct. 2574, 156 L.Ed.2d 603 (June 16, 2003).

The United States Supreme Court denied certiorari in this appeal of the Ninth Circuit Court of Appeals ruling that the City's denial of a landowner's application to develop property did not rise to the level of an unconstitutional taking.

## Opinion No. 2003-27

Written December 4, 2003, to Jennifer VandeVelde, Topeka.

This opinion is in response to your letter of October 20, 2003, in which you request an opinion from the Kansas Governmental Ethics Commission concerning the state level conflict of interest laws (K.S.A. 46-215 *et seq.*). We note at the outset that the Commission's jurisdiction is limited to the application of K.S.A. 46-215 *et seq.*, and whether some other statutory system, common law theory or agency rule or regulation applies to your inquiry is not covered by this opinion.

## Factual Statement

We understand that you are asking for this opinion in your capacity as a Tuberculosis (TB) Information Consultant for the TB Prevention & Control Program within the Bureau of Epidemiology & Disease Prevention (BE&DP) at the Kansas Department of Health and Environment (KDHE). You are interested in accepting a part-time position with a new business that plans to provide nationwide training on bio-terrorism preparedness. You have explained that you do not work for the bio-terrorism unit of the BE&DP.

## Question

May a TB Information Consultant for the Bureau of Epidemiology & Disease Prevention at the Kansas Department of Health and Environment work part-time for a company that provides nationwide training on bio-terrorism preparedness?

## Opinion

Three statutes apply to the question you have raised: K.S.A. 46-235, which governs restrictions on compensation of state employees; K.S.A. 46-233(a), which involves participation in the making of contracts; and K.S.A. 46-241, which involves the use of confidential information. Each of these statutes will be addressed in turn.

K.S.A. 46-235 states in pertinent part:

No state officer or employee shall accept compensation for performance of official duties, other than that to which such person is entitled for such performance. . . . The receipt of wages or salary from an individual's non-state employer during a period of service as a state officer or employee shall not be construed as compensation for performance of official duties.

Pursuant to this statute, so long as it is not part of your current State duties to perform the services you propose to perform in your part-time employment, K.S.A. 46-235 would not prohibit you from accepting compensation for performing these services. Because it is not a part of your State duties to provide training on bio-terrorism preparedness, you would not be prohibited from accepting a part-time position to provide such training with this new company.

K.S.A. 46-233 states in pertinent part:

(a)(1) No state officer or employee shall in the capacity as such officer or employee be substantially involved in the preparation of or participate in the making of a contract with any person or business by which such officer or employee is employed. . . .

Under this provision, you would be prohibited, as a state employee, from being substantially involved in the preparation of, or from participating in the making of, a contract with an entity by which you are employed or in which you have a substantial interest. Absent your participation as a state employee in the making of such a contract with this new company, this statute would not prohibit you from accepting employment with this business.

Finally K.S.A. 46-241 states:

No state officer or employee shall disclose or use confidential information acquired in the course of his or her official duties in order to further his or her own economic interest or those of any other person.

This section is self-explanatory. Confidential information obtained during your official duties with the State may not be used for your financial gain or the financial gain of another.

## Opinion No. 2003-28

Written December 4, 2003, to Mary Blubaugh, MSN, RN, Executive Administrator, Kansas State Board of Nursing, Topeka.

This opinion is in response to your letter of November 20, 2003, in which you request an advisory opinion from the Kansas Governmental Ethics Commission concerning the application of the governmental ethics laws (K.S.A. 46-215 *et seq.*). We note at the outset that the Commission's jurisdiction is limited to the application of K.S.A. 46-215 *et seq.*, and whether some other statutory system, common law theory or agency rule or regulation applies to your inquiry is not covered by this opinion.

## Factual Statement

We understand you request this opinion in your capacity as the Executive Administrator of the Kansas State Board of Nursing (KSBN). You have explained that the KSBN and the Board of Emergency Medical Services (EMS) have prepared a plan to allow paramedics to matriculate to Registered Nursing (RN) schools and RN's to matriculate to paramedic schools. You indicate that several of the nursing schools in Kansas are planning to accept paramedics into their nursing programs, but lack clinical instructors and clinical sites. The KSBN would like to obtain a grant from the Federal Government that would fund this statewide program and place 18 instruc-

tors in 18 schools (the instructors would become employees of the nursing school) and purchase 8 meti-simulators to be placed in 8 hospitals across the state. The KSBN would hire one additional employee to work with the grant, and 10% of your salary would be paid by the grant to the KSBN as you would serve as the administrator of the grant.

A question has arisen as to whether it would be unethical for a regulatory agency to administer such an educational grant. You have noted that K.S.A. 74-1106(c)(2) provides the KSBN with statutory authority to apply for and accept grants.

#### Question

May a regulatory agency apply for and administer a Federal educational grant?

#### Opinion

We have reviewed the state level conflict of interest laws found in K.S.A. 46-215 *et seq.*, and there is nothing in those laws which would prohibit a regulatory agency from applying for and administering a Federal educational grant.

#### Opinion No. 2003-29

Written December 4, 2003, to Adrian J. Polansky, Secretary of Agriculture, Topeka.

This opinion is in response to your letter of December 2, 2003, in which you request an advisory opinion from the Kansas Governmental Ethics Commission concerning the application of the governmental ethics laws (K.S.A. 46-215 *et seq.*). We note at the outset that the Commission's jurisdiction is limited to the application of K.S.A. 46-215 *et seq.*, and whether some other statutory system, common law theory or agency rule or regulation applies to your inquiry is not covered by this opinion.

#### Factual Statement

We understand you request this opinion in your capacity as the Secretary of the Kansas Department of Agriculture (KDA). You have explained that a KDA Meat & Poultry Program inspector wishes to operate a deer processing business in his off duty hours. This business would also sell value added product in the form of summer sausage, jerky, and breakfast sausage. The KDA employee in this situation directly regulates individuals that also offer the same services. Depending on the amount of value added product that the employee sells, he may or may not be inspected under the Kansas Meat & Poultry Inspection Act administered by the KDA. The regulated community has expressed concern that this may be a conflict of interest.

#### Questions

1. Can a KDA employee who regulates businesses pursuant to the Kansas Meat & Poultry Act operate a deer processing business that is regulated by the KDA?

2. Can a KDA employee who regulates businesses pursuant to the Kansas Meat & Poultry Act, operate a deer processing business when the employee has access to confidential information, through the course of his employment, that has a direct bearing on how the employee's competitors operate?

3. Can a KDA employee who regulates businesses pursuant to the Kansas Meat & Poultry Act operate a deer processing business that places him in direct competition with the businesses that the employee regulates?

#### Opinion

Several sections of the state conflict of interest laws must be reviewed to answer your question: K.S.A. 46-286, which involves participation in licensure or regulation of a business in which the state employee holds a position, K.S.A. 46-233, which involves participation in the making of contracts, and K.S.A. 46-241, involving the use of confidential information. Each will be addressed in turn.

K.S.A. 46-286 states in pertinent part:

(a) No state officer or employee, in the officer's or employee's official capacity, shall participate directly in the licensure, inspection or administration or enforcement of any regulation of or in any contract with any outside organization with which the officer or employee holds a position.

Therefore, with regard to your first question, if the employee were to be directly involved in the licensure, inspection or administration or enforcement of any regulation involving his deer processing business, he would be in violation of this statute.

K.S.A. 46-233 should also be considered. It states in pertinent part:

(a) No state officer or employee shall in the capacity as such officer or employee be substantially involved in the preparation of or participate in the making of a contract with any person or business by which such officer or employee is employed or in whose business such officer or employee or any member of such officer's or employee's immediate family has a substantial interest. . . .

(d) Subsections (a) and (b) shall not apply to the following:

(1) Contracts let after competitive bidding has been advertised for by published notice . . . .

Pursuant to this statute, this employee would be prohibited, in his capacity as a state employee, from being substantially involved in the preparation of or from participating in the making of a negotiated contract with his deer processing company.

With regard to your second question, K.S.A. 46-241 applies. It states:

No state officer or employee shall disclose or use confidential information acquired in the course of his or her official duties in order to further his or her own economic interest or those of any other person.

Therefore, the employee would be prohibited from using any confidential information for his economic gain.

Finally, with regard to your third question, we have reviewed the state level conflict of interest laws found in K.S.A. 46-215 *et seq.*, and there is nothing in those laws which would prohibit an employee from operating a business that places him in direct competition with private sector businesses.

Jackson, Topeka, 66612. All interested parties will be given a reasonable opportunity to present their views orally on the proposed regulatory action during the hearing. In order to give all parties an opportunity to present their views, it may be necessary to require each participant to limit any oral presentation to five minutes.

The following is a summary of the proposed amendments and the economic impact statement:

**K.A.R. 28-1-20** lists all the vaccinations each child or adolescent is required to have before enrolling in any Kansas school.

**Adding the varicella (chickenpox) vaccine:**

Kansas is one of only nine states (as of February 2003) without a varicella vaccine school-entry or daycare requirement. While varicella doesn't usually cause a severe or complicated illness, this is not always the case. Persons of any age with a weakened immune system are at particular risk for complications. With mainstreaming of children with chronic diseases to conventional schools, there is an increasing risk that, in the absence of a varicella immunization requirement, susceptible persons at high risk of complicated disease will be exposed in the school setting. Complications include pneumonia, disseminated varicella, encephalitis, hemorrhage and secondary bacterial infections. Prior to licensing of an effective vaccine, over 95 percent of persons were infected naturally, mostly as children. The currently licensed vaccine is highly effective with a good safety record.

**Adding Hepatitis B:**

Hepatitis B is a virus transmitted among humans by blood and body fluids. Sharing of needles during illegal use of drugs and unprotected sexual intercourse with an infected person are the predominant risk factors for Hepatitis B observed in the United States. Transmission of Hepatitis B in home settings among persons who share intimate appliances such as razors and toothbrushes has been observed. Although chronic symptoms resulting from Hepatitis B infection become apparent more often in adulthood, infection is acquired years or decades earlier, and 30 percent of chronic infections in the U.S. originate in children less than five years old. For children less than one year of age who become infected, 90 percent will remain chronically infected. Persons who become chronically infected as young children or infants have a 25 percent chance of dying from Hepatitis B-related cirrhosis or liver cancer. Although needle sharing and sexual activity with infected individuals are effective and common methods to transmit the infection, about 30 percent of newly acquired cases have no identifiable risk factor for infection.

Reporting of acute and chronic Hepatitis B infection by physicians is required by Kansas state regulation. Children infected with Hepatitis B often do not show acute symptoms, and they are diagnosed when they become chronic carriers. In 2001, 390 cases of chronic Hepatitis B were reported in Kansas; 14 were in children under the age of 14.

KDHE recommends that all children receive Hepatitis B vaccine, preferably in the first year of life. KDHE recommends that children entering child care be fully immunized against Hepatitis B and has repeatedly issued similar recommendations for the entire period of K-12 school attendance. These recommendations are entirely consistent with the recommendations of the CDC and the American Academy of Pediatrics.
