Notice of Commencement of Negotiations for Architectural Services

Notice is hereby given of the commencement of negotiations for architectural services for the renovation of the district crew/equipment storage building for the Kansas Department of Transportation, Hutchinson. The existing building is a metal building with approximately 10,875 sq. ft. of space. It is comprised of office space, commodity and equipment storage. Twenty employees from paint striping, bridge and special maintenance crews currently use the building to store and maintain their equipment.

Renovation will allow the addition of 17 construction engineering technicians and 11 Highway Patrol troopers in approximately 5,800 sq. ft. of office and storage space

and 4,500 sq. ft. of covered storage. New covered storage will be provided for motorized equipment units.

The project architect will prepare a budget and construction documents and will provide construction administration services. KDOT construction crews will be utilized, and construction administration is expected to take longer than a normal project. Location of a project architect within a 60-mile radius of the facility is preferred.

Request for Proposals for Local Area I Workforce Investment Board

The Local Area I Workforce Investment Board in Kansas is issuing a request for proposals (RFP) from qualified entities to enter into contracts to accomplish the following services for the Workforce Investment Act (WIA) Program. Bidders may apply for any or all of these contracts:

- 1. Administrative Entity
- 2. Paymaster Services
- 3. Case Management Services (Adult and Dislocated Worker participants)

Local Area I is located in the western and central part of Kansas and is comprised of 62 counties. An Internet link to a map of the area, as it relates to the total size of Kansas, can be found at http://entkdhr.state.ks.us/One Stop/ENTMap03.htm. This area received approximately \$1.2 million for the current program year ending June 30, 2004. The funding available will pay the costs of the administrative entity, paymaster services, participant enrollments and all case management services.

The contract period will be from July 1, 2004 to June 30, 2006. If the bidder selected is other than the current administrative entity, paymaster or case manager, the July 1, 2004, date may be earlier to allow for a transition period.

Eligible entities for the Administrative Entity Contract or Case Management Services Contracts may be the following:

- 1. Postsecondary educational institution;
- Private nonprofit organization (includes community-based organizations);
- 3. Private for-profit entity;
- 4. Government agency; or
- 5. Other interested organization or entity (such as local chambers of commerce or other business organizations).

Eligible entities for the Paymaster Services Contract must meet the following requirements:

- 1. Be an established entity with experience providing paymaster or similar services;
- Have an accounting system to record and execute transactions and provide auditable reports and accounts;
- 3. Be able to generate all payments by check;
- 4. Use generally accepted accounting principles and follow state and WIA policy requirements;
- 5. Ensure each person acting on behalf of bidder to handle WIA funds be bonded at a minimum of \$150,000 to protect against loss.

Proposals will be issued upon request to all prospective bidders who have been prequalified by the Kansas Department of Transportation on the basis of financial condition, available construction equipment and experience. Also, a statement of unearned contracts (Form No. 284) must be filed. There will be no discrimination against anyone because of race, age, religion, color, sex, handicap or national origin in the award of contracts.

Each bidder shall file a sworn statement executed by or on behalf of the person, firm, association or corporation submitting the bid, certifying that such person, firm, association or corporation has not, either directly or indirectly, entered into any agreement, participated in any collusion, or otherwise taken any action in restraint of free competitive bidding in connection with the submitted bid.

This sworn statement shall be in the form of an affidavit executed and sworn to by the bidder before a person who is authorized by the laws of the state to administer oaths. The required form of affidavit will be provided by the state to each prospective bidder. Failure to submit the sworn statement as part of the bid approval package will make the bid nonresponsive and not eligible for award consideration.

Plans and specifications for the projects may be examined at the office of the respective county clerk or at the KDOT district office responsible for the work.

Temporary Administrative Regulations

Article 1.—GENERAL

40-1-50. Insurance scoring; definitions; requirements. (a) As used in this regulation and L. 2003, ch. 88, §2 through §15 and amendments thereto, these terms shall have the following meanings:

(1) "Farmowner insurance policy" means a policy that provides coverage for a dwelling and its contents, barns, stables, and other buildings. This term shall include lia-

bility coverage.

(2) "Insurer" means an insurance company.

(3) "Policy" means any personal insurance or individual farmowner insurance policy.

- (4) "Premium charge" means the payment required for an insurance policy as determined by rates and rating factors.
- (5) "Rerate" means to calculate premiums based on rates, rating factors, or rating procedures filed with the Kansas insurance department as required by K.S.A. 40-951 through K.S.A. 40-967 and amendments thereto.
- (6) "Reunderwrite" means to reexamine insurance risks to determine whether or not to renew policies.
- (7) "Third party" means any person or entity that creates an insurance score.
- (8) "Underwriting" means examining, accepting, or rejecting insurance risks.
- (b) No insurer authorized to write business in the state of Kansas shall use credit information or an insurance score that has an adverse premium or coverage impact on an insured, unless all of the following conditions are met:
- (1) The insurer has considered applicable factors other than credit.
 - (2) The insurer has documented the factors considered.
- (3) The insurer provides the insured with each reason for the change in the premium or coverage.
- (c) Each insurer using credit information for the purpose of rating shall have specific, written criteria governing how credit information is utilized by the insurer in underwriting, tier placement, and insurance scoring.
- (d) If an insurer takes an adverse action against a consumer, the insurer shall perform the following:
- (1) Maintain evidence of the notice to the consumer and a record of the contents of the credit information used, for a minimum of five years after the adverse action was taken;
- (2) provide to the consumer a written, electronic, or oral notice and an explanation. If an oral notice is given, the notice shall be followed by a written or electronic notice and an explanation to the consumer pursuant to L. 2003, ch. 88, §8, and amendments thereto; and
- (3) provide underwriting guidelines to the department upon request. All underwriting guidelines shall be considered trade secrets and confidential under the Kansas open records act.
- (e) Any insurer may require that a consumer provide documentation to establish the existence and duration of

personal circumstances justifying that certain adverse credit information not be used. (Authorized by K.S.A. 40-103 and L. 2003, ch. 88, §14; implementing K.S.A. 40-222(a) and L. 2003, ch. 88, §§3, 4, 5, 6, 7, 8, 9, 10, 13, 14, and 15; effective, T-40-2-19-04, Feb. 19, 2004.)

Article 5.—MULTI-STATE ON-LINE GAMES

THE GRAND CANYON 2BY2 TRUCK GIVEAWAY

- **111-5-111.** Name of drawing. The Kansas lottery shall conduct a drawing entitled "The Grand Canyon 2by2 Truck Giveaway," and will accept entries starting February 8, 2004, for the drawing to be conducted at approximately 4:00 p.m. on April 24, 2004. Rules applicable to this drawing are contained in K.A.R. 111-5-111 through 111-5-115 and K.A.R. 111-6-1 *et seq.* (Authorized by and implementing K.S.A. 74-8710; effective, T-111-2-19-04, Feb. 5, 2004.)
- **111-5-112. Prize.** (a) One prize winner selected in the "The Grand Canyon 2by2 Truck Giveaway" on the date specified in K.A.R. 111-5-111 shall receive a 2004 GMC Canyon pickup truck chosen by the Kansas lottery, all applicable sales and property taxes, registration fees, license tag fees, cash, and mandatory state and federal income withholding taxes.
- (b) All prizes are subject to lottery validation, set-offs and deductions authorized by law.
- (c) The winner of a prize as the result of the said drawing shall return to the lottery a completed claim form as provided by the lottery within 45 days of the date his or her entry was drawn or the person named on the entry drawn will no longer be eligible for the prize. In such an event, the first eligible alternate entry drawn pursuant to subsection (e) of K.A.R. 111-5-114 shall be declared the winner. (Authorized by and implementing K.S.A. 74-8710; effective, T-111-2-19-04, Feb. 5, 2004.)
- **111-5-113. Method of entry.** (a) Entry into the "The Grand Canyon 2by2 Truck Giveaway" shall be accomplished as follows:
- (1) Beginning at 5:00 a.m. on February 8, 2004, and ending at the close of business as defined in subsection (p) of K.A.R. 111-6-1, on April 17, 2004, for every single 2by2 ticket purchase of \$2.00 or more, the purchaser shall receive free of charge an entry blank for the drawing, which entry blank shall be automatically dispensed from the terminal upon qualifying purchase. In addition, from the time the Kansas lottery begins selling 2by2 tickets using lottery terminal(s) at the 3i Show in Great Bend, Kansas, on April 22, 2004, through and including 3:00 p.m. on April 24, 2004, for every single 2by2 ticket purchased from said terminal(s) of \$2.00 or more, the purchaser shall

receive free of charge an entry blank for the drawing, which entry blank shall be automatically dispensed from the terminal(s) upon the qualifying purchase.

(2) The holder of an entry blank must fill in the entry blank in a legible manner. Only one name shall appear

on an entry blank.

- (3) Place one or more completed entry blank(s) for said drawing into an envelope with proper postage and mail it to: "Canyon Truck Giveaway," c/o Kansas lottery, P. O. Box 1494, Great Bend, Kansas 67530-1494, or deposit completed entry blank(s) into the lottery receptacle designated at the 3i Show from April 22, 2004, until 3:00 p.m. on April 24, 2004. Mailed entries must be received by morning mail pickup on Tuesday, April 20, 2004.
- (4) The holder of the entry is not required to personally attend said drawing or be present at the time of the drawing to be determined a winner.
- (5) The drawing will be conducted at the approximate time listed in K.A.R. 111-5-111.
- (b) There is no limit on the number of entries a person may make, but a person may only win one time.
- (c) All eligible entries which are mailed and received by the morning mail pickup in Great Bend, Kansas, on Tuesday, April 20, 2004, and those deposited at the 3i Show pursuant to subsection (a) herein, shall be entered into said drawing.
- (d) Eligible entrants in the drawing must be 18 years of age or older.
- (e) Completing the information form on the entry blank and entering it into the drawing constitutes authorization to publicly identify the person whose entry is drawn.
- (f) The executive director of the Kansas lottery may, in his sole discretion, cancel this promotion at any time. (Authorized by and implementing K.S.A. 74-8710; effective, T-111-2-19-04, Feb. 5, 2004.)
- **111-5-114. Selection of winners.** The following process shall be used for the selection of winners in the "The Grand Canyon 2by2 Truck Giveaway":
- (a) Kansas lottery personnel shall pick up all mail containing entries mailed to P. O. Box 1494 for the drawing at the United States Post Office in Great Bend, Kansas, with final pick up on Tuesday, April 20, 2004.
- (b) Lottery personnel shall transport the mail to the Great Bend regional office where the envelopes will be opened and the entries contained therein stored in a secure location until immediately prior to the drawing, at which time all entries will be placed into the drawing receptacle or drum, along with all entries deposited at the 3i Show pursuant to the rules herein.
- (c) The drawing shall be held at the 3i Show in Great Bend, Kansas, in a place accessible to the public and open for public attendance with lottery security personnel present. The drawing shall be audio and video taped.
- (d) At the start of the drawing, lottery security personnel shall present the receptacle or drum to the person designated by the executive director to perform the drawing. The receptacle or drum for the said drawing shall contain all eligible entries. The entries shall be thoroughly mixed prior to the entries actually being drawn. The designated individual shall then unseal the receptacle or

drum, and using the bare-arm technique, while looking away, remove one entry from the receptacle or drum and mark it in such a way as to identify it as the winning entry. The person whose name appears on the entry shall be the winner of the prize identified in K.A.R. 111-5-112, subject to validation by the lottery as set forth in these rules.

- (e) After one entry has been drawn and verified as valid by lottery security, two more entries will be drawn, one at a time, to serve as alternate entries. The alternate entries will be marked in order drawn, 1A and 2A. The alternate entries will be used only if the original winner cannot be located or is declared ineligible, or fails to present a fully-executed claim form to lottery headquarters by 5:00 p.m. of the forty-fifth day following the drawing. The alternates will be used, if necessary, in the order drawn.
- (f) The Kansas lottery security official present shall review each entry drawn to determine the validity of the entry into the said drawing in accordance with these regulations. If it is a valid entry and the information is legible, the event manager and the security person present shall record the name of the winner and each alternate. Each winner shall be given or sent a prize claim form to be completed and received by the lottery within 45 days of the drawing.

- (g) If any entry is determined to be ineligible, it shall be discarded by the security person present and another entry drawn. This procedure will be repeated until valid selections are obtained.
- (h) Entries remaining in the drum or receptacle after the drawing has been completed and all entries not received in compliance with these rules shall be destroyed pursuant to K.A.R. 111-3-34. (Authorized by and implementing K.S.A. 74-8710; effective, T-111-2-19-04, Feb. 5, 2004.)
- **III-5-II5.** Certification of drawing. (a) The "The Grand Canyon 2by2 Truck Giveaway" shall be personally observed by a member of the Kansas lottery security department and a member of the Kansas lottery marketing department or other person or persons designated by the executive director of the lottery ("event manager").
- (b) Upon completion of the drawing, the security official and the event manager shall issue a report to the executive director, certifying that the name of each prize winner is correct, and that to the best of their knowledge the procedures required by these rules were followed in selecting the prize winner. (Authorized by and implementing K.S.A. 74-8710; effective, T-111-2-19-04, Feb. 5, 2004.)
