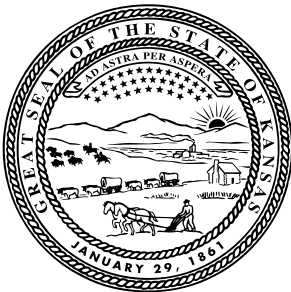

## Notice to Consulting Engineers

The Kansas Department of Transportation is seeking qualified consulting engineering firms for the projects listed below. A response may be submitted by e-mail to neil@ksdot.org, or seven signed copies of the response can be mailed to Neil Rusch, P.E., Assistant to the Director, Division of Engineering and Design, KDOT, Room 1084-West, Docking State Office Building, 915 S.W. Harrison, Topeka, 66612-1568. Responses shall be limited to four pages. Responses must be received in Room 1084-West by 5 p.m. April 14 for the consulting engineering firm to be considered.

From the firms expressing interest, the Consultant Selection Committee will select a list of the most highly qualified (not less than three and not more than five) and invite them to attend an individual interview conference. At this time, the consulting firms can more thoroughly discuss their experience related to the type of project at hand and will be expected to discuss, in some detail, their approach to this project and the personnel to be assigned to the project. Firms not selected to be short-listed will be notified by letter.

The Consultant Negotiating Committee, appointed by the Secretary of Transportation, will conduct the discussions with the firms invited to the individual interview conferences. The committee will select the firm to perform the professional services required for completing the advertised projects. After the selection of this firm, the remaining firms will be notified by letter of the outcome.

The scope of services is to prepare right-of-way plans for a freeway section on US-54 from the existing freeway west of Goddard, east 5.0 miles to near 183rd Street. There will be interchanges at 247th Street, 215th Street and 199th Street. KDOT will provide all the required surveys, which will be available in March 2005. Right-of-way plans are scheduled to be completed in June 2006.

The scope of services is to prepare right-of-way plans for a freeway section on US-54 from near 183rd Street east to near 151st Street and on K-254 from US-54 north to near 167th Street. Right-of-way plans are scheduled to be completed in June 2006.

Negotiations for Architectural Services**

Notice is hereby given of the commencement of negotiations for architectural services for the phased renovation of two dormitory wings of the Roth Administration/Dormitory Building for the Kansas State School for the Deaf, Olathe. The facility was built in the 1930s, and each wing is three-levels with approximately 5,400 sq. ft. per level for a total of 16,200 sq. ft. per wing. The renovation requires interior demolition of existing walls and systems in order to provide new spaces with new windows, HVAC, lighting, electrical, wiring for future technological equipment, plumbing, and sprinkler and fire alarm systems. Fire alarms, tornado and intruder systems will need to match similar systems on campus already meeting the needs of deaf students and staff. Renovation will be designed and constructed in two phases. The first phase will be designed and constructed in 2004 at a construction cost of approximately \$1,250,000; the second phase in 2005 at a construction cost of \$1,100,000.

**Wildlife and Parks Commission****Notice of Hearing on Proposed  
Administrative Regulations**

A public hearing will be conducted by the Wildlife and Parks Commission at 7 p.m. Thursday, April 22, at the City Building, 401 Main, Courtland, to consider the approval and adoption of proposed regulations of the Kansas Department of Wildlife and Parks.

A workshop meeting on business of the Wildlife and Parks Commission will begin at 1:30 p.m. April 22 at the location listed above. The meeting will recess at 5 p.m., then resume at 7 p.m. at the same location for the regulatory hearing. There will be public comment periods at the beginning of the afternoon and evening meetings for any issues not on the agenda, and additional comment periods will be available during the meeting on agenda items. Old and new business also may be discussed at this time. If necessary to complete the hearing or other business matters, the commission will reconvene at 9 a.m. April 23 at the same location.

Any individual with a disability may request accommodation in order to participate in the public hearing and may request the proposed regulations and economic impact statements in an accessible format. Requests for accommodation should be made at least five working days in advance of the hearing by contacting Sheila Kemmis, commission secretary, at (620) 672-5911. Persons with a hearing impairment may call the Kansas Commission for the Deaf and Hard of Hearing at 1-800-432-0698 to request special accommodations.

This 30-day notice period prior to the hearing constitutes a public comment period for the purpose of receiving written public comments on the proposed administrative regulations.

All interested parties may submit written comments prior to the hearing to the chairman of the commission, Kansas Department of Wildlife and Parks, 1020 S. Kansas

Ave., Suite 200, Topeka, 66612. All interested parties will be given a reasonable opportunity at the hearing to express their views orally in regard to the adoption of the proposed regulations. During the hearing, all written and oral comments submitted by interested parties will be considered by the commission as a basis for approving, amending and approving, or rejecting the proposed regulations.

The administrative regulations that will be heard during the regulatory hearing portion of the meeting are as follows:

**K.A.R. 115-25-5.** This exempt regulation establishes the 2004 fall turkey hunting season, bag limits and permits. The proposed changes allow for unlimited fall turkey permits in unit 1.

**Economic Impact Summary:** It is anticipated that 14,600 turkey permits and game tags will be issued generating \$234,910. The department anticipates that more than 20,000 days of hunting activity would occur, thus providing economic benefit to businesses providing goods and services.

**K.A.R. 115-25-7.** This exempt regulation establishes the 2004 antelope hunting season, bag limits and permits. Proposed changes keep stable the number of permits as authorized in 2003. Unlimited archery permits are proposed, and a total of 104 firearms permits and 30 muzzleloader permits are proposed.

**Economic Impact Summary:** It is anticipated that 260 antelope permits may be authorized, which would generate \$9,165 in revenue. Approximately 750 days of hunting activity may occur, thus providing economic benefit to businesses providing goods and services.

**K.A.R. 115-25-8.** This exempt regulation establishes the 2004-2005 elk season, bag limits and permits. Proposed changes would decrease the number of any-elk permits available from ten to seven permits. This regulation would allow permits to be used during muzzleloader, archery or rifle season. However, only five antlerless-only elk permits would be valid for use at a single time on Fort Riley. In addition, unlimited hunt-on-your-own-land antlerless-only elk permits would be authorized off Fort Riley.

**Economic Impact Summary:** It is estimated that a total of 38 elk permits may be authorized. Estimated revenue if these permits are issued would be approximately \$7,500. Approximately 440 days of hunting activity may occur, thus providing economic benefit to businesses providing goods and services.

**K.A.R. 115-25-9.** This regulation establishes the 2004-2005 deer season, bag limits and permits. Proposed changes include shortening the January extended firearms season to two days, reducing the number of antlerless game tags valid in certain units, reducing the number of units open for the January extended firearms season, and establishing a January antlerless-only white-tailed deer season for a subunit of units 7 and 8.

**Economic Impact Summary:** Estimated revenue based on 2003-2004 permit and game tags sales would be approximately \$4,000,000. Approximately 415,000 days of hunting activity may occur, thus providing economic benefit to businesses providing goods and services.

**K.A.R. 115-25-10.** This regulation establishes the 2005 special southeast firearms deer season. No changes are proposed other than a reauthorization of the special season.

**Economic Impact Summary:** Estimated revenue if all permits authorized are issued would be approximately \$4,235.

#### Notice of Hearing on Proposed Administrative Regulations

The State Board of Education will conduct a public hearing at 1:30 p.m. Tuesday, June 8, in the board room of the State Education Building, 120 S.E. 10th Ave., Topeka, to consider proposed Institutional Accreditation and Program Approval regulations numbered K.A.R. 91-1-230, 91-1-231, 91-1-232, 91-1-235 and 91-1-236. These regulations will replace current regulations numbered 91-1-68a through 91-1-68e, which are being repealed. Numbers 91-1-233 and 91-1-234 are reserved for future use.

A summary of each of the regulations is provided in this notice, along with a summary of the economic impact of each regulation:

**91-1-230. Institutional accreditation and program approval definitions.** This section defines terms that are used throughout the remainder of the regulations. No economic impact is anticipated for the State Board of Education or school districts, individuals, or for other governmental agencies or private businesses.

**91-1-231. Procedures for initial accreditation of teacher education institutions.** This regulation establishes the procedures that must be followed for institutions to be initially accredited by the State Board of Education. Under this regulation, an institution must go through a series of steps to be fully accredited. Once fully accredited, the institution may seek renewal. The accreditation cycle is being changed from five years to seven years. No economic impact is anticipated for the State Board of Education or school districts, individuals, or for other governmental agencies or private businesses.

**91-1-232. On-site visits; recommendation; appeal.** This regulation establishes the procedures for accreditation on-site visits and reports, and the process for institutions to appeal initial accreditation recommendations. These procedures are substantially the same as existing procedures. No economic impact is anticipated for the State Board of Education or school districts, individuals, or for other governmental agencies or private businesses.

**91-1-235. Procedures for initial approval of teacher education programs.** This regulation provides the process for approval of new education preparation programs. The processes for program approval are not changed from that provided in existing regulations. However, editorial changes in terminology are incorporated into the regulation and three substantive changes from the existing regulation are made. First, the program approval cycle has been changed from five years to seven years to align with the accreditation cycle. Also, students, in their initial teacher education programs, will be required to complete coursework that constitutes a major in their subject area or that is equivalent to a major. Finally, a minimum requirement for student teaching is established at 12 weeks. No economic impact is anticipated for the State Board of Education or school districts, individuals, or for other governmental agencies or private businesses.

**91-1-236. Procedures for renewal of teacher education program approval.** This regulation provides the process for renewal of existing programs. The requirements follow the procedures in existing regulations. No economic impact is anticipated for the State Board of Education or school districts, individuals, or for other governmental agencies or private businesses.

A copy of each of the proposed regulations and its economic impact statement may be obtained by contacting the secretary of the State Board of Education at the address above prior to the date of the hearing.

All interested persons will be given a reasonable opportunity at the hearing to present their views, either orally or in writing, in regard to the proposed regulations. In addition, the period of public notice hereby provided constitutes a public comment period for the purpose of receiving written public comments on the proposed regulations. Such written comments may be submitted to the secretary of the State Board of Education at the address above. The hearing shall be conducted in compliance with the public hearing procedures of the State Board of Education.

Any individual with a disability may request accommodation in order to participate in the public hearing and may request the proposed regulations and economic impact statements in an accessible format.
