The Kansas Department of Health and Environment is soliciting comments regarding a proposed air quality construction permit. Panhandle Eastern Pipe Line Company has applied for an air quality construction permit in accordance with the provisions of K.A.R. 28-19-300 to install a new engine. Emissions of oxides of nitrogen (NO_x), sulfur dioxide (SO₂), carbon monoxide (CO), particulate matter (PM), particulate matter less than 10 microns (PM₁₀), volatile organic compounds (VOCs) and hazardous air pollutants (HAPs) were evaluated during the permit review process.

Panhandle Eastern Pipe Line Company, Houston, Texas, owns and operates the stationary source located at S18-T28S-R18W, Kiowa County, Kansas, at which the new engine is to be installed.

A copy of the proposed permit, permit application, all supporting documentation and all information relied upon during the permit application review process is available for public review for a period of 30 days from the date of publication during normal business hours at the KDHE, Bureau of Air and Radiation, 1000 S.W. Request for Comments

The Kansas Department of Health and Environment has reviewed an application from Norton County to construct and operate a municipal solid waste landfill called a small arid landfill (SAL). The SAL would be located in the Southwest Quarter of Section 25, Township 2 South, Range 23 West, approximately 1 mile northeast from the city of Norton. The site has been permitted for waste management activities since 1976, and includes a closed municipal solid waste landfill, an inactive solid waste incinerator, an inactive incinerator ash landfill, an active construction and demolition waste landfill, and an active yard waste composting facility. The site also includes a recycling center, tree and brush burn area, waste tire storage and appliance salvaging.

The proposed SAL would cover approximately 18 acres on the county's existing 60-acre facility. The SAL is designed with approximately 393,000 cubic yards (approximately 45 years) of capacity for municipal solid waste disposal and daily/intermediate cover material. The bottom of the SAL is proposed at elevations ranging from approximately 2,275 feet to 2,305 feet, resulting in excavation depths up to 20 feet below the existing ground surface. The completed surface of the SAL (including the final cover) is proposed at elevations ranging from approximately 2,297 feet to 2,335 feet, representing fill depths up to 10 feet above the existing ground surface. The final cover on the SAL is proposed to consist of at least 56 inches of soil with native grasses established on the surface.

Norton County has certified that the application described herein is consistent with the regional solid waste management plan and is compatible with the surrounding land use. KDHE has reviewed the application and found it to be in conformance with the state solid waste statutes and regulations.

KDHE is providing public notice of its intent to issue an amended permit to Norton County to allow the proposed SAL described herein. A copy of the administrative record, which includes the permit application, engineering drawings, draft permit and other information with respect to this permit action, will be available for public review through May 17 during normal business hours at the following locations:

Notice of the decision will be given to the applicant, to anyone who submitted formal comments and to those who requested notice of the final permit decision.

A public hearing will be conducted at 10 a.m. Tuesday, June 15, in Room 108, Landon State Office Building, 900 S.W. Jackson, Topeka, to consider the adoption of proposed rules and regulations of the Department of Administration, Division of Facilities Management.

This 60-day notice of the public hearing shall constitute a public comment period for the purpose of receiving written public comments on the proposed rules and regulations. All interested parties may submit written comments prior to the hearing to the Secretary of Administration, 1000 S.W. Jackson, Suite 500, Topeka, 66612. All interested parties will be given a reasonable opportunity to present their views orally on the adoption of the proposed regulations during the hearing. In order to give all parties an opportunity to present their views, it may be necessary to request that each participant limit any oral presentation to five minutes.

Any individual with a disability may request accommodation in order to participate in the public hearing and may request the proposed regulations and economic impact statements in an accessible format. Requests for accommodation should be made at least five working days in advance of the hearing by contacting Faith Loretto at (785) 296-6006 or TTY 1-800-766-3777. The north entrance to the Landon State Office Building is accessible. Handicapped parking is located at the south end of building, across the street from the north entrance to the building, and on Ninth Street just around the corner from the north entrance.

Article 45 of the Department of Administration regulations establishes the conditions under which motor vehicles are authorized to park in state-owned and state-operated parking lots and garages in Shawnee County, other than parking on the Statehouse grounds.

ments to five of these regulations are proposed on a permanent basis. Summaries of the proposed regulations and their economic impact follow:

The proposed amendments to **K.A.R. 1-45-18, Definitions and application of regulations**, would amend the definition of "person" and add a definition of the term "visitor." The definition of "person" would be limited to the individual, partnership, corporation, association or governmental body to whom the motor vehicle is registered. This amendment is consistent with the way in which the term "person" is used elsewhere in Article 45; "person" is used only in the context of establishing responsibility for violations of the regulations in Article 45.

The new definition would identify as a "visitor" any person who is not eligible to enter into a parking contract with the Department of Administration for the parking lot in which that person's vehicle is parked.

The proposed amendments to **K.A.R. 1-45-19, Application for a parking contract and issuance of a parking permit**, would clarify the Secretary of Administration's authority to determine the form and number of parking permits that are issued for each parking contract. Two other amendments clarify the scope of the secretary's discretion with respect to issuing parking contracts to state agencies and temporary parking permits.

The proposed amendments to **K.A.R. 1-45-20, Parking permit required**, would delete the word "person" because it is not used in the context of responsibility for violations of the regulations in Article 45.

K.A.R. 1-45-23, Parking restrictions, identifies the locations in which vehicles are prohibited from parking. A proposed amendment would expressly prohibit vehicles from parking in a manner contrary to posted signs.

K.A.R. 1-45-24, Violations and enforcement, establishes the administrative fines for violations of any of the regulations in Article 45 and a process for appeal of those fines. Several amendments to this regulation are proposed. First, the administrative fines are reduced from \$15 to \$3 for a first violation, from \$25 to \$10 for a second violation, and from \$50 to \$25 for a third violation. In addition, vehicles would not be subject to being mechanically immobilized for the third violation. Instead, for each violation after the third violation, the vehicle would be subject to being mechanically immobilized or to removal. A \$100 fine that can be imposed under the existing regulation for the fourth and subsequent violations would be eliminated.

A second proposed amendment would add an administrative fee of \$25 when an administrative fine is not paid within 90 days of the date on which the citation was issued or, if the person submits an appeal, within 90 days of the date on which the hearing officer affirms the fine. Further amendments would provide for the appeals to be heard by a hearing officer rather than a three-person appeals committee. In addition, language would be added stipulating that the decision of the hearing officer is considered a final agency action, which may be appealed to district court under K.S.A. 77-601 *et seq.*

A final proposed amendment to K.A.R. 1-45-24 would replace the word "person" with the word "individual" in subsection (d) in order to limit the use of the term "per-

son" to situations involving responsibility for violations of the parking regulations.

In general, the proposed amendments simply clarify and restate existing policies and practices under these regulations. Therefore, no economic impact on the Department of Administration, individuals and entities parking in the parking lots and garage subject to these regulations, or the general public, is expected as a result of the amendments, except as noted below.

The revised administrative fine structure may reduce slightly the revenues deposited in the state general fund. Since January 1, 2003, 1,871 tickets have been issued. Of those tickets, 829 have been paid (with revenues from fines totaling \$13,588), 629 remain unpaid (with \$12,560 in unpaid fines), and 413 have been either overturned on appeal or voided. Therefore, if it is assumed that 80 percent of tickets issued are for a first violation, 15 percent of tickets are for a second violation, 4 percent of tickets are for third violations, and 1 percent are for four or more violations, and that 1,458 tickets are issued each year, the fines assessed would be \$7,228—a reduction of almost \$20,000.

However, the proposed amendments to the administrative fine structure would reduce the overall cost for the people who receive fines for parking violations and might substantially reduce the costs to the Department of Administration with respect to its administration and enforcement of the parking program under K.S.A. 75-4508. The Department of Administration believes that reducing the amount of each fine may result in a higher rate of payment of parking fines and fewer appeals of parking tickets. Since January 1, 2003, 351 appeals have been filed. However, lower fines are expected to reduce the number of appeals and, therefore, to significantly reduce the administrative costs of the appeals process.

The addition of a \$25 administrative fee for administrative fines not paid within 90 days also may improve the collection rate and offset some of the reduction in revenues resulting from the change in the administrative fine structure. This administrative fine both recognizes the additional staff time required for collection efforts and makes it possible to increase the use of an effective collection tool, the debt setoff program.

The proposed use of a hearing officer in place of a three-person appeals committee also is expected to have a positive economic impact on the Department of Administration, without any substantive reduction in the due process rights afforded to individuals appealing parking tickets. In light of the reduced fine structure, using a hearing officer would be a more efficient and appropriate use of the agency's staff resources.

Section 7 of the Kansas Bill of Rights, which prohibits the compelled support of religious worship, is not more restrictive than the First Amendment to the United States Constitution when analyzing government aid to students who attend private sectarian schools and post secondary educational institutions. Therefore, when examining challenges under Section 7, the appropriate standard of review is *Lemon v. Kurtzman*, 403 U.S. 602 (1973), and its progeny. Applying this standard, the State Scholarship Program and the Kansas Comprehensive Grant Program do not, on their face, violate Section 7 of the Kansas Bill of Rights. Moreover, Article 6, Section 6(c) of the Kansas Constitution, which prohibits control of educational funds by religious sects, does not prohibit government aid to students attending sectarian schools and post secondary educational institutions where the aid is for the benefit of the student, not the sectarian institution. As the State Scholarship and Kansas Comprehensive Grant Programs award scholarships/grants to qualified students who use the funds to purchase educational services at either a public or private sectarian or secular college or university, neither program facially violates Article 6, Section 6(c). Monies raised through bonds issued pursuant to K.S.A. 12-1770 *et seq.* (STAR bonds) may be used to pay the costs of constructing a building or structure that is included in a redevelopment district plan, provided the building or structure is not to be either owned by or leased to a developer. However, if the building or structure includes an auto race track facility or is in a redevelopment district that includes some or all of the land and buildings formerly comprising a state mental facility that was closed pursuant to state law, the costs of constructing the building or structure are deemed to be redevelopment project costs and, as such, may be paid by STAR bonds even though the building or structure is to be owned by or leased to a developer. SENATE BILL No. 373

AN ACT concerning school district; relating to consolidation of districts; amending K.S.A. 72-8701 and repealing the existing section.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Kansas:

Section 1. K.S.A. 72-8701 is hereby amended to read as follows: 72-8701. In accordance with the provisions of this act the boards of education of any two (2) or more school districts are hereby authorized to discuss issues relating to consolidation of such districts and enter into agreements to form one consolidated unified school district. Such meetings may be held within the boundaries of any of the districts proposing to form the consolidated district.

Sec. 2. K.S.A. 72-8701 is hereby repealed.

Sec. 3. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its publication in the Kansas register.

HOUSE BILL No. 2706

AN ACT concerning the state finance council; voting procedures; amending K.S.A. 75-3711 and repealing the existing section.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Kansas:

Section 1. K.S.A. 75-3711 is hereby amended to read as follows: 75-3711. (a) The governor shall:

(1) Hear and determine appeals by any state agency from final decisions or final actions of the secretary of administration or the director of computer services.

(2) Approve, modify and approve or reject proposed rules and regulations submitted by the secretary of administration as provided in K.S.A. 75-3706, and amendments thereto.

(3) Make allocations to, and approve expenditures by a state agency, from any appropriations to the governor for that purpose, of funds for unanticipated and unbudgeted needs, under guidelines and limitations prescribed by K.S.A. 75-3711c, *and amendments thereto*, or other legislative enactment enhancing or altering K.S.A. 75-3711c, *and amendments thereto*.

(4) Exercise powers and perform functions specified for the state finance council or governor by the Kansas civil service act.

(b) (1) The chairperson and five or more other members of the state finance council shall constitute a quorum. Approval by the governor and approval by a majority vote of the legislative members of the state finance council shall govern, unless a unanimous vote is required by statute in any particular case.

(2) *Whenever a matter is to be acted on by the state finance council and a unanimous vote is required to approve the particular matter by K.S.A. 48-924, 75-3713, 75-3713b or 75-3713c, and amendments thereto, or by any other statute, each member who is unable to attend the meeting at which the matter was voted on, may vote on the motion by written absentee vote in the manner prescribed by this subsection. In any such case, an absent member may vote on the motion by (A) writing the member's signature on a copy of the resolution setting forth the matter that is the subject of the motion, writing the date and indicating the member's vote for or against adoption of the resolution, and (B) submitting the copy of the resolution bearing the absentee vote to the secretary of the state finance council either before or not more than 10 days after the date of the meeting at which the motion was voted on. The secretary of the state finance council shall maintain each copy of a resolution bearing an absentee vote as part of the minutes and records of the meeting at which the motion on the resolution was voted on. The secretary shall indicate in the minutes of the meeting the name of each member voting in writing by absentee vote and the date on which the absentee vote was submitted to the secretary. If a particular matter requiring a unanimous vote receives the affirmative vote of each member of the state finance council attending the meeting and the affirmative absentee vote pursuant to this subsection of each member not attending the meeting, then the matter shall be deemed to have received the unanimous vote of all members of the state finance council.*

(c) Whenever statutes provide for any matter to receive state finance council action, the same shall be made a matter of business before said council, if and only if the matter is characterized as a legislative delegation, and in other such cases the governor shall exercise the function specified for the state finance council by applying the guidelines and limitations of K.S.A. 75-3711c, *and amendments thereto*, or other legislative enactment enhancing or altering the same.

Sec. 2. K.S.A. 75-3711 is hereby repealed.

Sec. 3. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its publication in the Kansas register.

AN ACT concerning institutional licenses under the Kansas healing arts act; amending K.S.A. 65-2895 and repealing the existing section.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Kansas:

Section 1. K.S.A. 65-2895 is hereby amended to read as follows: 65-2895. (a) There is hereby created a designation of an institutional license which may be issued by the board to a person who:

(1) Is a graduate of an accredited school of the healing arts *medicine or osteopathic medicine* or a school which has been in operation for not less than 15 years and the graduates of which have been licensed in another state or states which have standards similar to Kansas;

(2) *has completed at least two years in a postgraduate training program in the United States approved by the board;* and

(3) who is employed as provided in this section.

(b) Subject to the restrictions of this section, the institutional license shall confer upon the holder the right and privilege to practice ~~that branch of the healing arts in which the holder of the institutional license is proficient~~ *medicine and surgery* and shall obligate the holder to comply with all requirements of such license.

(c) ~~The practice privileges of institutional license holders are restricted as follows. The institutional license and shall be valid only during the period in which:~~

(1) The holder is employed by *any institution within* the department of social and rehabilitation services, employed by any institution within the department of corrections or employed pursuant to a contract entered into by the department of social and rehabilitation services or the department of corrections with a third party, and only within the institution to which the holder is assigned;

(2) ~~the holder was issued an institutional license prior to May 8, 1997, has been employed for at least three years as described in subsection (c)(1) and is employed to provide mental health services in the employ of a Kansas licensed community mental health center, or one of its contracted affiliates, or a federal, state, county or municipal agency, or other political subdivision, or a contractor of a federal, state, county or municipal agency, or other political subdivision, or a duly chartered educational institution, or a medical care facility licensed under K.S.A. 65-425 et seq, and amendments thereto, in a psychiatric hospital licensed under K.S.A. 75-3307b and amendments thereto, or a contractor of such educational institution, medical care facility or psychiatric hospital, and whose practice, in any such employment, is limited to providing mental health services, is a part of the duties of such licensee's paid position and is performed solely on behalf of the employer; or~~

(3) ~~the holder was issued an institutional license prior to May 8, 1997, and is providing mental health services pursuant to a written protocol with a person who holds a license to practice medicine and surgery other than an institutional license has been employed for at least three years as described in subsection (c)(1) and is providing mental health services pursuant to a written protocol with a person who holds a license to practice medicine and surgery other than an institutional license.~~

(~~b~~) (d) An institutional license shall be valid for a period of two years after the date of issuance and may be renewed for *additional two-year periods* if the applicant for renewal ~~is eligible to obtain an institutional license under this section, has successfully completed the examination required under subsection (a)(3) of K.S.A. 65-2879 and amendments thereto meets the requirements under subsection (c) of this section, has submitted an application for renewal on a form provided by the board, has paid the renewal fee established by rules and regulations of the board of not to exceed \$500 and has submitted evidence of satisfactory completion of a program of continuing education required by the board. The board shall require each applicant for renewal of an institutional license under this section to submit evidence of satisfactory completion of a program of continuing ed-~~

~~education required by the board of licensees of the branch of the healing arts in which the applicant is proficient. In addition, an applicant for renewal who is employed as described in subsection (c)(1) shall submit with the application for renewal a recommendation that the institutional license be renewed signed by the superintendent of the institution to which the institutional license holder is assigned.~~

~~(c) Notwithstanding the provisions of subsection (b), an institutional license may be renewed once for two years if the holder was issued an institutional license prior to May 8, 1997, has successfully completed two years of postgraduate training in the United States and has submitted evidence of satisfactory completion of a program of continuing education required by the board.~~

~~(d) (e) Nothing in this section shall prohibit any person who was issued an institutional license prior to the effective date of this act from having the institutional license reinstated by the board if the person meets the requirements for an institutional license described in subsection (a).~~

(f) This section shall be a part of and supplemental to the Kansas healing arts act.

Sec. 2. K.S.A. 65-2895 is hereby repealed.

HOUSE BILL No. 2582

AN ACT creating the horsethief reservoir benefit district; providing for a governing board; prescribing powers and duties thereof; taxing and bonding authority.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Kansas:

Section 1. (a) Sections 1 through 11, and amendments thereto, shall be known and may be cited as the horsethief reservoir benefit district act.

(b) The powers conferred by this act are for public uses, economic development purposes or purposes for which public money may be expended.

(c) Powers granted pursuant to this act shall be in addition to any other power provided by law.

Sec. 2. As used in sections 1 through 11, and amendments thereto: (a) "Act" means the provisions of sections 1 through 11, and amendments thereto;

(b) "bonds" mean special obligation bonds or special obligation notes payable from the sources described in this act, issued by the district in accordance with the provisions of this act;

(c) "district" means the horsethief reservoir benefit district created pursuant to this act, the boundaries of which shall include all property located within the boundaries of Finney, Ford, Gray and Hodgeman counties;

(d) "governing board" means the governing body of the horsethief reservoir benefit district created pursuant to this act;

(e) "project" means the construction of a dam and recreation facilities within the district; and

(f) "horsethief reservoir benefit district sales tax" means the tax authorized by this act.

Sec. 3. There is hereby created the horsethief reservoir benefit district for the purposes provided by this act.

Sec. 4. (a) The governing board of the horsethief reservoir benefit district shall consist of eight members, as follows:

(1) Four members to be appointed one each by the board of county commissioners of the four counties in the district;

(2) one member to be appointed one each by the governing body of the cities of Dodge City and Garden City;

(3) one member appointed by the Pawnee watershed district; and

(4) the secretary of wildlife and parks or the secretary's designee.

(b) The member appointed by the Pawnee watershed district shall serve as chairperson of the governing board.

(c) The board shall meet upon call of the chairperson as necessary to carry out its duties under this act.

(d) The initial appointment for the members appointed by Finney and Gray counties and Dodge City shall be for a term of one year. The initial appointment for the members appointed by Ford and Hodgeman counties, Garden City and the Pawnee watershed district shall be for a term of two years. For each subsequent appointment, each appointed member of the board shall be appointed for a term of two years. Each member shall continue in such position until a successor is appointed and qualified. Members shall be eligible for reappointment. Whenever a vacancy occurs in the membership of the board, a successor shall be selected to fill such vacancy in the same manner as and for the unexpired term of the member such person is succeeding.

(e) The governing body shall have the following powers and duties: (1) Authority to impose a district wide sales tax pursuant to the provisions of this act;

(2) authority to issue bonds pursuant to the provisions of this act; and

(3) authority to manage recreational facilities within the district.

(f) The governing body shall provide that any fee schedule imposed for users of recreational facilities within the district may be set at a reduced rate or schedule for residents of any county which is a part of the district.

Sec. 5. (a) In addition to and notwithstanding any limitations on the aggregate amount of the retailers' sales tax contained in K.S.A. 12-187 through 12-197, and amendments thereto, the district may impose a horsethief reservoir benefit district sales tax on the selling of tangible personal property at retail or rendering or furnishing services taxable pursuant to the provisions of the Kansas retailers' sales tax act, and amendments thereto, within the district for purposes of financing the project in increments of .05% and in an aggregate amount not to exceed .25% and pledge the revenue received therefrom to pay the costs of the project, the costs to manage and operate the project and to make debt service payments on any bonds issued to finance the project. Any horsethief reservoir benefit district sales tax imposed pursuant to this section shall expire no later than the maturity date of the bonds issued to finance such project or refunding bonds issued therefor.

(b) Prior to the imposition of the horsethief reservoir benefit district sales tax, the governing board shall adopt a resolution stating its intention to levy a horsethief reservoir benefit district sales tax for the purpose of financing the project and continued management and operational expenses thereof as proposed by this act. The governing board shall give notice of the public hearing on the imposition of such horsethief reservoir benefit district sales tax. Such notice shall be published at least once a week for two consecutive weeks in the official county newspaper of each county whose boundaries are located within the district. The second notice shall be published at least seven days prior to the date of hearing. The notice shall contain the following information:

(1) The time and place of the hearing;

(2) the nature of the project;

(3) the estimated cost of the project;

(4) the proposed method of financing the project; and

(5) the proposed amount of the horsethief reservoir benefit district sales tax to be imposed and the termination date of such horsethief reservoir benefit district sales tax.

(c) The hearing may be adjourned from time to time. Following the hearing, the governing board may authorize the project, approve the estimated cost of the project and the method of financing of the project by adoption of the appropriate resolution. Such resolution shall be effective upon publication once in the official county newspaper of each county whose boundaries are located within the district.

(continued)

(d) If at the conclusion of the public hearing, the governing board of the district proposes to impose a horsethief reservoir benefit district sales tax, the governing board shall submit a proposition to impose such tax to the qualified electors within the district. Notice of such election shall be provided in accordance with the provisions of K.S.A. 10-120, and amendments thereto. Any such election shall be called and held in the manner provided by K.S.A. 25-431 *et seq.*, and amendments thereto. If an election is held and the proposition is approved by a majority of the voters of the district voting at such election, the governing board, by resolution, may levy such tax. If such a resolution is adopted pursuant to this act, the horsethief reservoir benefit district sales tax shall be imposed in the district. Except as provided in this act, the tax authorized by this section shall be administered, collected and subject to provisions of K.S.A. 12-187 to 12-197, inclusive, and amendments thereto.

(e) Upon receipt of a certified copy of the resolution authorizing the levy of the horsethief reservoir benefit district sales tax pursuant to this section, the state director of taxation shall cause such tax to be collected in the district at the same time and in the same manner provided for the collection of the state retailers' sales tax. All taxes collected under the provisions of this act shall be remitted by the secretary of revenue to the state treasurer in accordance with the provisions of K.S.A. 75-4215, and amendments thereto. Upon receipt of each such remittance, the state treasurer shall deposit the entire amount of all taxes collected under the provisions of this act in the state treasury to the credit of the horsethief reservoir benefit district sales tax fund, which fund is hereby established in the state treasury. All moneys in the horsethief reservoir benefit district sales tax fund shall be remitted at least quarterly by the state treasurer, on instruction from the secretary of revenue, to the district. Any refund due on any horsethief reservoir benefit district sales tax collected pursuant to this section shall be paid out of the horsethief reservoir benefit district sales tax refund fund which is hereby established in the state treasury and reimbursed by the director of taxation from collections of the horsethief reservoir benefit district sales tax authorized by this section and applied by the district in the manner provided pursuant to this act.

Sec. 6. No suit to set aside the creation of the district, the authorization or funding of the project or the horsethief reservoir benefit district sales tax shall be brought after the expiration of 30 days from the date of certification of canvass of the votes at an election which authorizes the imposition of a horsethief reservoir benefit district sales tax.

Sec. 7. The costs of the project shall be paid from all or any of the following sources: (a) The revenue received from the horsethief reservoir benefit district sales tax authorized by this act;

(b) the proceeds of any bonds issued pursuant to this act; and

(c) any other funds made available to the district, including funds appropriated by the state or the Pawnee watershed district.

Sec. 8. A fund shall be created by the district for the project and identified by a suitable title. The proceeds from the sale of bonds and any other moneys appropriated by the governing board for such purpose shall be credited to such fund. Such fund shall be used solely to pay the costs of the project. Upon payment of the principal and interest on the bonds, if any, the governing board shall have authority to spend any moneys remaining in the fund for the purpose of management and operation of the project.

Sec. 9. (a) The district may issue bonds in one or more series to finance the undertaking of the project in accordance with the provisions of this act. Such bonds shall be made payable, both as to principal and interest solely from a pledge of the sources of funds described in section 5, and amendments thereto. The district may pledge such revenue to the repayment of such bonds prior to, simultaneously with or subsequent to the issuance of such bonds.

(b) Bonds issued pursuant to subsection (a) shall not be general obligations of the district, give rise to a charge against its general credit or taxing powers, or be payable out of any funds or properties

other than any of those set forth in subsection (a) and such bonds shall so state on their face.

(c) Bonds issued pursuant to subsection (a) shall be special obligations of the district and are declared to be negotiable instruments. Such bonds shall be executed by the authorized representatives of the district and sealed with the corporate seal of the district. All details pertaining to the issuance of the bonds and terms and conditions thereof shall be determined by resolution of the district. The provisions of K.S.A. 10-106, and amendments thereto, requiring a public sale of bonds shall not apply to bonds issued under this act. All bonds issued pursuant to this act and all income or interest therefrom shall be exempt from all state taxes except inheritance taxes. Such bonds shall contain none of the recitals set forth in K.S.A. 10-112, and amendments thereto. Such bonds shall contain the following recitals: The authority under which such bonds are issued; that such bonds are in conformity with the provisions, restrictions and limitations thereof; and that such bonds and the interest thereon are to be paid from the money and revenue received as provided in subsection (a).

(d) Any district issuing bonds under the provisions of this act may refund all or part of such issue pursuant to the provisions of K.S.A. 10-116a, and amendments thereto.

(e) Bonds issued under the provisions of this act shall be in addition to and not subject to any statutory limitation of bonded indebtedness imposed on such district.

Sec. 10. The secretary of revenue, in connection with the horsethief reservoir benefit district for which sales tax revenues are pledged or otherwise intended to be used in whole or in part for the payment of bonds issued to finance project costs in such district for which a horsethief reservoir benefit district sales tax has been imposed, shall provide reports identifying each retailer having a place of business in such district setting forth the tax liability and the amount of such tax remitted by each retailer during the preceding month and identifying each business location maintained by the retailer within the district. Such report shall be made available to the bond trustee, escrow agent or paying agent for such bonds within a reasonable time after it has been requested from the director of taxation. The bond trustee, escrow agent or paying agent shall keep such retailers' district sales tax returns and the information contained therein confidential, but may use such information for purposes of allocating and depositing such district sales tax revenues in connection with the bonds used to finance the costs of the project in the district. Except as otherwise provided, the sales tax returns received by the bond trustee, escrow agent or paying agent shall be subject to the provisions of K.S.A. 79-3614 and amendments thereto.

Sec. 11. If the horsethief reservoir benefit district sales tax authorized pursuant to this act is not imposed by December 31, 2008, the provisions of this act shall expire.

Sec. 12. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its publication in the Kansas register.

AN ACT concerning levies on fire insurance business and the disposition of the moneys remitted therefor; relating to financial support for the state fire marshal, emergency medical services board and the fire service training program of the university of Kansas; amending K.S.A. 2003 Supp. 75-1508 and 75-1514 and repealing the existing sections.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Kansas:

Section 1. K.S.A. 2003 Supp. 75-1508 is hereby amended to read as follows: 75-1508. (a) For the purpose of maintaining the department of the state fire marshal and the payment of the expenses incident thereto, each fire insurance company doing business in this state shall pay to the commissioner of insurance, on or before March 15 each year, ~~beginning with the year 1984, and each year thereafter,~~

in addition to the taxes, fees and charges now required by law to be paid by it, such levy as may be made by the state fire marshal. The levy shall not be more than ~~1.0%~~ .80% for calendar years 2002 and 2003, and 1.25% for calendar year 2004 and ensuing years, for calendar year 2004, and each calendar year thereafter, of a sum equal to the gross cash receipts as premiums of such company on all fire business transacted by it in the state of Kansas during the calendar year next preceding, as shown by its annual statement under oath to the state insurance department.

(b) For the purposes of maintaining the emergency medical services board and the payment of the expenses incident thereto, each fire insurance company doing business in this state shall pay to the commissioner of insurance, on or before March 15 each year, beginning with calendar year 2002 and ~~ending with each calendar year 2003 thereafter~~, in addition to the taxes, fees and charges now required by law to be paid by it, such levy as may be made by the emergency medical services board. The levy shall not be more than .25% of a sum equal to the gross cash receipts as premiums of such company on all fire business transacted by it in the state of Kansas during the calendar year next preceding, as shown by its annual statement under oath to the state insurance department. ~~The provisions of this subsection (b) shall expire on July 1, 2004.~~

(c) For the purposes of maintaining the fire service training program of the university of Kansas and the payment of the expenses incident thereto, each fire insurance company doing business in this state shall pay to the commissioner of insurance, on or before March 15 each year, beginning with calendar year 2004, and each calendar year thereafter, in addition to the taxes, fees and charges now required by law to be paid by it, such levy as may be made by the Kansas fire service training commission. The levy shall not be more than .20% of a sum equal to the gross cash receipts as premiums of such company on all fire business transacted by it in the state of Kansas during the calendar year next preceding, as shown by its annual statement under oath to the state insurance department.

(d) The director of the fire service training program of the university of Kansas shall submit a report concerning expenditures and activities of the fire service training program of the university of Kansas to the house committee on appropriations on or before February 1, 2005, and each ensuing year thereafter.

Sec. 2. K.S.A. 2003 Supp. 75-1514 is hereby amended to read as follows: 75-1514. (a) The commissioner of insurance shall remit all moneys received by the commissioner under subsection (a) of K.S.A. 75-1508, and amendments thereto, to the state treasurer in accordance with the provisions of K.S.A. 75-4215, and amendments thereto. Upon receipt of each such remittance, the state treasurer shall deposit the entire amount in the state treasury to the credit of the fire marshal fee fund for the fiscal years ending June 30, 2003, and June 30, 2004, and the state treasurer shall credit 20% of each such deposit to the state general fund and shall credit the remainder of each such deposit to the fire marshal fee fund for the fiscal year ending June 30, 2005, and ensuing fiscal years.

(b) There is hereby created the fire marshal fee fund in the state treasury. All expenditures from the fire marshal fee fund shall be made in accordance with appropriations acts upon warrants of the director of accounts and reports issued pursuant to vouchers approved by the state fire marshal or a person or persons designated by the state fire marshal.

(c) The commissioner of insurance shall remit all moneys received by the commissioner under subsection (b) of K.S.A. 75-1508, and amendments thereto, to the state treasurer in accordance with the provisions of K.S.A. 75-4215, and amendments thereto. Upon receipt of each such remittance, the state treasurer shall deposit the entire amount in the state treasury to the credit of the emergency medical services board operating fund.

(d) The commissioner of insurance shall remit all moneys received by the commissioner under subsection (c) of K.S.A. 75-1508, and amendments thereto, to the state treasurer in accordance with the provisions of K.S.A. 75-4215, and amendments thereto. Upon

receipt of each such remittance, the state treasurer shall deposit the entire amount in the state treasury to the credit of the fire service training program fund.

Sec. 3. K.S.A. 2003 Supp. 75-1508 and 75-1514 are hereby repealed.

(b) At the end of the promotion, the store with the greatest percentage increase in cumulative \$5 and \$10 instant ticket sales for the period from April 1, 2004, through May 31, 2004, over the base sales period of April 1, 2003, through May 31, 2003, will win a \$40 credit on the retailer's lottery account.

The store with the second greatest percentage increase in cumulative \$5 and \$10 instant ticket sales for the period from April 1, 2004, through May 31, 2004, over the base sales period of April 1, 2003, through May 31, 2003, will win a \$20 credit on the retailer's lottery account.

The store with the third greatest percentage increase in cumulative \$5 and \$10 instant ticket sales for the period from April 1, 2004, through May 31, 2004, over the base sales period of April 1, 2003, through May 31, 2003, will win a \$10 credit on the retailer's lottery account.

All retail locations with any percentage increase in cumulative \$5 and \$10 instant ticket sales over the base period will be entered into a drawing to win a color television chosen by the lottery. The drawing shall be conducted by the lottery to award one color television to the first eligible retailer location drawn. Promotional items chosen by the lottery will also be awarded to all retail locations which show an increase in cumulative \$5 and \$10 instant ticket sales over the base period. (Authorized by and implementing K.S.A. 74-8710 and K.S.A. 74-8708; effective, T-111-4-1-04, March 19, 2004.)

111-4-2126. "Bonus Crossword" instant ticket lottery game number 360. (a) The Kansas lottery shall conduct an instant winner lottery game entitled "Bonus Crossword" commencing on or after April 1, 2004. The rules for this game are contained in K.A.R. 111-3-1 *et seq.* and 111-4-2126.

(b) The "play symbols" for this game are as follows: A - B - C - D - E - F - G - H - I - J - K - L - M - N - O - P - Q

(continued)

- R - S - T - U - V - W - X - Y - Z. There are no "play symbol captions" in this game.

(c) For this game, a play symbol shall appear in each of 18 play spots within the "YOUR NUMBERS" play area, in each of two play spots within the "BONUS" play area, and a variable number of times within the crossword puzzle grid.

(d) The ticket numbers in each book of tickets in this game shall start with 000 and end with 149.

(e) The three letters comprising the retailer validation codes used in this game shall appear in three of eight varying locations among the play symbols. The retailer validation codes for this game and their meanings are as follows:

FRE	=	Free ticket
FIV	=	\$5.00
TEN	=	\$10.00
TWY	=	\$20.00
HUN	=	\$100.00
FHN	=	\$500.00

(f) The price of instant tickets sold by a retailer for this game shall be \$2.00 each.

(g) "Bonus Crossword" consists of three play areas. In the upper part of the ticket there is a crossword puzzle grid that contains 11 spaces (height) by 11 spaces (width) covered by transparent latex. In the "YOUR LETTERS" play area, located in the lower part of the ticket, there are 18 letters located under opaque latex. To the right of the "YOUR LETTERS" play area is the "BONUS" play area in which there are two letters covered by opaque latex. Imaged around each of the 18 "YOUR LETTERS" and two "BONUS" letters there will be a four-sided box composed of solid lines. A player will remove the latex from the "YOUR LETTERS" and "BONUS" play areas one letter at a time, and then for each matching letter in the crossword puzzle grid scratch off the transparent latex. Each letter revealed in the "YOUR LETTERS" and "BONUS" play areas may be used an unlimited number of times in the crossword puzzle grid. If a player reveals at least three complete words in the crossword puzzle grid, the player wins the corresponding prize in the prize legend. The prize legend on the front of the ticket indicates prizes won for number of words revealed.

(h) To qualify as a complete word to win a prize in this game, the words revealed must meet the following requirements:

- (1) must contain at least three letters;
- (2) cannot be formed diagonally, run right to left or from bottom to top;
- (3) must appear in an unbroken horizontal or vertical string of letters in the "crossword" puzzle;
- (4) an unbroken string of letters cannot be interrupted by a black space and must contain every single letter square between two black spaces;

Rules applicable to the “Kansas Speedway Fall 2004 Drawing” are contained in K.A.R. 111-4-2141 through 111-4-2146 and K.A.R. 111-3-1, *et seq.* (Authorized by and implementing K.S.A. 74-8710; effective, T-111-4-1-04, March 19, 2004.)

111-4-2142. Definitions. (a) All definitions contained in the Kansas lottery act (K.S.A. 74-8701 *et seq.*) and lottery regulations are hereby incorporated by reference and govern unless otherwise indicated.

(b) “Kansas Speedway Fall 2004 Drawing” means the act of drawing prizes conducted by the Kansas lottery at lottery headquarters in Topeka, Kansas, at the time described in K.A.R. 111-4-2144, in which participants are

selected to win various prizes as described in K.A.R. 111-4-2143.

(c) “Non-winning ticket” means any valid Kansas “Kansas Speedway” instant game lottery ticket not eligible to win a prize under the rules of the “Kansas Speedway” instant game.

(d) “Receptacle” or “drum” means a container in which non-winning Kansas instant game lottery tickets are placed and from which the “Kansas Speedway Fall 2004 Drawing” entries are drawn. Receptacles or drums may be sealable and shall be capable of being mixed or rotated for the purpose of ensuring random distribution.

(e) “Bare arm technique” means a type of drawing where the person drawing the winning ticket from the receptacle or drum wears a long-sleeved shirt with sleeve rolled up above the elbow, a short-sleeved shirt (sleeve not extending past the elbow) or a no-sleeve shirt which exposes the drawer’s bare arm and looks away from the drawing drum or receptacle while drawing. (Authorized by and implementing K.S.A. 74-8710; effective, T-111-4-1-04, March 19, 2004.)

111-4-2143. Prize. (a) The winner of a grand prize at the “Kansas Speedway Fall 2004 Drawing,” which will be conducted on August 27, 2004, shall receive a racing weekend package for two persons. The racing weekend package for two persons shall consist of two tickets for each day of the October 9 and 10, 2004, races conducted at Kansas Speedway in Kansas City, Kansas, one double occupancy hotel room and room taxes for the evenings of October 8, 2004, and October 9, 2004, standard hotel parking, round-trip transportation between Kansas Speedway and the hotel, food and other amenities at the Kansas lottery hospitality chalet located at Kansas Speedway, \$300 cash, and mandatory state and federal withholding taxes. The following restrictions shall apply to this prize:

(1) The Kansas lottery is not responsible for any losses caused by delay or cancellation of said automobile race.

(2) Prize packages are transferable one time and cannot be redeemed for cash.

(3) The lottery shall choose and reserve all hotel rooms.

(4) The lottery shall provide transportation to and from Kansas Speedway on a scheduled basis. All other transportation is the responsibility of the prize winners.

(5) Prize winners will receive notification of their prize, but the actual prize will be delivered at a time and place to be announced by the lottery.

(6) Any meals, drinks, gratuities, taxes, and other expenses that are not specifically mentioned are not included.

(7) The hotel may require winners to produce a major credit card at the time of check-in. Winners are responsible for all hotel charges incurred in excess of the room charge, and standard parking fees for one vehicle for each prize package.

(b) There will be 48 (forty-eight) winners selected at the drawing.

(c) All prizes are subject to lottery validation, set-offs and deductions authorized by law.

(d) The winner of a prize shall return to the lottery a completed claim form as provided by the lottery within

14 calendar days in which his or her ticket was drawn or the person named on the ticket drawn will no longer be eligible for the prize. In such an event, the first eligible alternate entry drawn for that prize pursuant to subsection (e) of K.A.R. 111-4-2146 shall be declared the winner. (Authorized by and implementing K.S.A. 74-8710; effective, T-111-4-1-04, March 19, 2004.)

111-4-2144. Method of entry. (a) Entry into the "Kansas Speedway Fall 2004 Drawing" to be conducted on August 27, 2004, shall be accomplished as follows:

(1) Obtain a valid "Kansas Speedway" Kansas instant lottery ticket.

(2) Determine if the ticket is a winning ticket in accordance with "Kansas Speedway" game rules. If the ticket is a winning ticket, it is not eligible for the drawing and shall be redeemed in accordance with the instant game rules.

(3) If the ticket is a valid non-winning ticket, the ticket is eligible for the drawing and the holder of the ticket may use it to enter the drawing.

(4) The holder of the non-winning ticket must complete the information form on the back of the ticket in a legible manner. Only one name shall appear on a non-winning ticket entered.

(5) A receptacle or drum may be available for deposit of entries at the Kansas Speedway and other locations as may be specifically designated by the lottery. All entries so deposited shall be transported to lottery headquarters and secured until the time of the drawing.

(6) Entries may also be mailed with proper postage to "Kansas Speedway Drawing," c/o Kansas lottery, P. O. Box 750980, Topeka, Kansas 66675-0980. Mailed entries must be received by morning mail pickup on Tuesday, August 24, 2004. More than one entry may be mailed in one envelope.

(7) The holder of the ticket is not required to personally attend the drawing or be present at the time of the drawing to be determined a winner.

(8) The drawing will be conducted on Friday, August 27, 2004.

(b) There is no limit on the number of entries a person may make, but a person may only win one time in the drawing.

(c) Only valid non-winning "Kansas Speedway" tickets which are mailed to "Kansas Speedway Drawing," c/o Kansas lottery, P. O. Box 750980, Topeka, Kansas 66675-0980 with proper postage and received by the morning mail pickup in Topeka, Kansas, on Tuesday, August 24, 2004, and non-winning "Kansas Speedway" tickets entered at the Kansas lottery location at Kansas Speedway and other locations as may be specifically designated by the lottery shall be eligible for the drawing.

(d) Eligible entrants in the "Kansas Speedway Fall 2004 Drawing" must be 18 years of age or older.

(e) Completing the information form on the non-winning ticket and entering the ticket into the drawing constitutes authorization to publicly identify the person whose entry is drawn. (Authorized by and implementing K.S.A. 74-8710; effective, T-111-4-1-04, March 19, 2004.)

111-4-2145. Certification of drawing. (a) The "Kansas Speedway Fall 2004 Drawing" shall be person-

ally observed by a member of the Kansas lottery security department and a member of the Kansas lottery marketing department or other person or persons designated by the executive director of the lottery (hereinafter "event manager").

(b) Upon completion of the drawing, the security official and the event manager shall issue a report to the executive director, certifying that the name of each prize winner is correct, and that to the best of their knowledge the procedures required by these rules were followed in selecting the prize winners. (Authorized by and implementing K.S.A. 74-8710; effective, T-111-4-1-04, March 19, 2004.)

111-4-2146. Selection of winners. The following process shall be used for the selection of winners in the "Kansas Speedway Fall 2004 Drawing:"

(a) Kansas lottery personnel shall pick up all mail containing "Kansas Speedway Fall 2004 Drawing" tickets at the United States Post Office in Topeka, Kansas, with the final pick up at the Topeka post office in the morning mail pickup on Tuesday, August 24, 2004. Following the morning mail pickup on Tuesday, August 24, 2004, the envelopes containing mailed entries will be transported to lottery headquarters and opened by lottery personnel. All mailed entries and entries retained from the Kansas lottery selling location at Kansas Speedway and such other locations as specifically designated by the lottery shall then be placed in the drawing receptacle or drum.

(b) The drawing shall be held at Kansas lottery headquarters and shall be open to the public with lottery security personnel present. The drawing shall be audio and video taped.

(c) At the final drawing on Friday, August 27, 2004, lottery security personnel will be present with the person designated by the executive director to perform the drawing. Prior to the drawing, if a drum is used, the drum shall be sealed and the contents mixed by rotating the drum at least 10 times. If a receptacle other than a drum is used, the contents shall be thoroughly mixed prior to the drawing.

(d) The designated individual shall then unseal the drum, if a drum is used, and using the bare-arm technique, while looking away, remove 48 entries from the receptacle or drum, one at a time. The person whose name appears on each entry shall be the winner of one of the prize packages identified in K.A.R. 111-4-2143, subject to validation by the lottery as set forth in these rules. Each valid entry shall be numbered from one through 48.

(e) After 48 entries have been drawn, and the entries have been verified as valid, 10 more entries will be drawn, one at a time. The last 10 entries drawn will serve as alternate entries for the prize packages. The alternate entries will be marked in order drawn, 1A, 2A, 3A, 4A, 5A, 6A, 7A, 8A, 9A, and 10A. The alternate entries will be used only if one or more of the original winners cannot be located or is declared ineligible, or fails to present a fully-executed claim form to lottery headquarters by 5:00 p.m. of the fourteenth calendar day following the drawing. The alternates will be used, if necessary, in the order drawn. If an alternate winner cannot be located, is de-

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clared ineligible, or fails to present a fully-executed claim form to lottery headquarters by 5:00 p.m. of the fourteenth calendar day following the claim form being given or sent to the alternate winner, the alternate winner process shall be repeated until the prize is properly claimed or until such time as no alternate winners remain, whichever occurs first.

(f) The Kansas lottery security official present shall review each ticket drawn to determine the validity of the entry into the "Kansas Speedway Fall 2004 Drawing" in accordance with these regulations. If it is a valid entry and the name is legible, the event manager and the security person present shall record the name of the winner and the prize won. Each winner shall be given or sent a prize claim form to be completed and returned to the lottery within 14 calendar days of the drawing.

(g) If the entry is determined to be ineligible, it shall be discarded by the security person present and another entry drawn. This procedure will be repeated until valid selections are obtained.

(h) Only non-winning "Kansas Speedway" instant tickets as defined by these rules are eligible for the drawing.

(i) All "Kansas Speedway" tickets remaining in the drum or receptacle on August 27, 2004, after the winners and alternatives have been selected, and all entries not received in compliance with these rules, shall be destroyed pursuant to K.A.R. 111-3-34. (Authorized by and implementing K.S.A. 74-8710; effective, T-111-4-1-04, March 19, 2004.)

Article 5.—MULTI-STATE ON-LINE GAMES

111-5-113. Method of entry. (a) Entry into the "The Grand Canyon 2by2 Truck Giveaway" shall be accomplished as follows:

(1) Beginning at 5:00 a.m. on February 8, 2004, and ending at the close of business as defined in subsection (p) of K.A.R. 111-6-1, on April 17, 2004, for every single 2by2 ticket purchase of \$2.00 or more, the purchaser shall receive free of charge an entry blank for the drawing, which entry blank shall be automatically dispensed from the terminal upon qualifying purchase. In addition, from the time the Kansas lottery begins selling 2by2 tickets using lottery terminal(s) at the 3i Show in Great Bend, Kansas, on April 22, 2004, through and including 3:00 p.m. on April 24, 2004, for every single 2by2 ticket purchased from said terminal(s) of \$2.00 or more, the purchaser shall receive free of charge an entry blank for the drawing, which entry blank shall be automatically dispensed from the terminal(s) upon the qualifying purchase.

(2) The holder of an entry blank must fill in the entry blank in a legible manner. Only one name shall appear on an entry blank.

(3) Place one or more completed entry blank(s) for said drawing into an envelope with proper postage and mail it to: "Canyon Truck Giveaway," c/o Kansas lottery, P. O. Box 1494, Great Bend, Kansas 67530-1494, or deposit completed entry blank(s) into the lottery receptacle designated at the 3i Show from April 22, 2004, until 3:00 p.m. on April 24, 2004. Mailed entries must be received by morning mail pickup on Tuesday, April 20, 2004. A receptacle or drum may also be available for deposit of en-

tries at locations specifically designated by the lottery. All entries so deposited shall be transported to the lottery office in Great Bend, Kansas, and secured until the time of the drawing.

(4) The holder of the entry is not required to personally attend said drawing or be present at the time of the drawing to be determined a winner.

(5) The drawing will be conducted at the approximate time listed in K.A.R. 111-5-111.

(b) There is no limit on the number of entries a person may make, but a person may only win one time.

(c) All eligible entries which are mailed and received by the morning mail pickup in Great Bend, Kansas, on Tuesday, April 20, 2004, those deposited at the 3i Show, and those deposited at locations specifically designated by the lottery pursuant to subsection (a) herein, shall be entered into said drawing.

(d) Eligible entrants in the drawing must be 18 years of age or older.

(e) Completing the information form on the entry blank and entering it into the drawing constitutes authorization to publicly identify the person whose entry is drawn.

(f) The executive director of the Kansas lottery may, in his sole discretion, cancel this promotion at any time. (Authorized by and implementing K.S.A. 74-8710; effective, T-111-2-19-04, Feb. 5, 2004; amended, T-111-4-1-04, March 19, 2004.)

111-5-114. Selection of winners. The following process shall be used for the selection of winners in the "The Grand Canyon 2by2 Truck Giveaway":

(a) Kansas lottery personnel shall pick up all mail containing entries mailed to P. O. Box 1494 for the drawing at the United States Post Office in Great Bend, Kansas, with final pick up on Tuesday, April 20, 2004.

(b) Lottery personnel shall transport the mail to the Great Bend regional office where the envelopes will be opened and the entries contained therein stored in a secure location until immediately prior to the drawing, at which time all entries will be placed into the drawing receptacle or drum, along with all entries deposited at the 3i Show pursuant to the rules herein, and all entries retained from any other locations as specifically designated by the lottery.

(c) The drawing shall be held at the 3i Show in Great Bend, Kansas, in a place accessible to the public and open for public attendance with lottery security personnel present. The drawing shall be audio and video taped.

(d) At the start of the drawing, lottery security personnel shall present the receptacle or drum to the person designated by the executive director to perform the drawing. The receptacle or drum for the said drawing shall contain all eligible entries. The entries shall be thoroughly mixed prior to the entries actually being drawn. The designated individual shall then unseal the receptacle or drum, and using the bare-arm technique, while looking away, remove one entry from the receptacle or drum and mark it in such a way as to identify it as the winning entry. The person whose name appears on the entry shall be the winner of the prize identified in K.A.R. 111-5-112, subject to validation by the lottery as set forth in these rules.

(e) After one entry has been drawn and verified as valid by lottery security, two more entries will be drawn, one at a time, to serve as alternate entries. The alternate entries will be marked in order drawn, 1A and 2A. The alternate entries will be used only if the original winner cannot be located or is declared ineligible, or fails to present a fully-executed claim form to lottery headquarters by 5:00 p.m. of the forty-fifth day following the drawing. The alternates will be used, if necessary, in the order drawn.

(f) The Kansas lottery security official present shall review each entry drawn to determine the validity of the entry into the said drawing in accordance with these regulations. If it is a valid entry and the information is legible, the event manager and the security person present shall record the name of the winner and each alternate. Each winner shall be given or sent a prize claim form to be completed and received by the lottery within 45 days of the drawing.

(g) If any entry is determined to be ineligible, it shall be discarded by the security person present and another entry drawn. This procedure will be repeated until valid selections are obtained.

(h) Entries remaining in the drum or receptacle after the drawing has been completed and all entries not received in compliance with these rules shall be destroyed pursuant to K.A.R. 111-3-34. (Authorized by and implementing K.S.A. 74-8710; effective, T-111-2-19-04, Feb. 5, 2004; amended, T-111-4-1-04, March 19, 2004.)

Article 7.—ON-LINE GAMES

111-7-190. Method of entry. (a) Entry into the "Buy \$3 Get an Entry Free Drawing 2004" shall be accomplished as follows:

(1) With every single purchase of \$3 or more for the Kansas lottery "Super Kansas Cash" game from February 29, 2004, through May 22, 2004, the purchaser shall receive one entry form for this drawing.

(2) The purchaser must complete the information on the entry form in a legible manner. Only one name shall appear on each entry form.

(3) Place one or more entry form(s) into an envelope with proper postage and mail it to: "Buy \$3 Get an Entry Free Drawing," c/o Kansas lottery, P. O. Box 4526, Topeka, Kansas 66604-0526. Mailed entries must be received by morning mail pickup on Tuesday, May 25, 2004. A receptacle or drum may also be available for deposit of entries at locations specifically designated by the lottery. All entries so deposited shall be transported to lottery headquarters and secured until the time of the drawing.

(4) The holder of the ticket is not required to personally attend the drawing or be present at the time of the drawing to be determined a winner.

(5) Forty-eight entries and 10 alternate entries will be drawn.

(6) Entry forms obtained during the stated period of time may be entered in the drawing.

(b) There is no limit on the number of entries a person may make, but a person may only win one time during the entire promotion.

(c) All eligible entry forms which are mailed and received by the morning mail pickup in Topeka, Kansas, on Tuesday, May 25, 2004, and all entries deposited at

locations specifically designated by the lottery shall be entered into the drawing to be conducted on Friday, May 28, 2004.

(d) Eligible entrants in this drawing must be 18 years of age or older.

(e) Completing the information form on the entry form and entering the ticket into any drawing constitutes authorization to publicly identify the person whose entry is drawn. (Authorized by and implementing K.S.A. 74-8710; effective, T-111-2-20-04, Feb. 18, 2004; amended, T-111-4-1-04, March 19, 2004.)

111-7-192. Selection of winners. The following process shall be used for the selection of winners in the "Buy \$3 Get an Entry Free Drawing 2004":

(a) Kansas lottery personnel shall pick up all mail containing entries for this drawing at the United States Post Office in Topeka, Kansas, with final pick up for the drawing after the morning mail delivery on Tuesday, May 25, 2004, prior to the drawing on Friday, May 28, 2004.

(b) Lottery personnel shall transport the mail to the Kansas lottery mail room where the envelopes will be opened and emptied into the drawing receptacle or drum. All entries retained from any other locations as specifically designated by the lottery shall also be placed in the drawing receptacle or drum.

(c) The drawing shall be held at the lottery headquarters in a place accessible to the public and open for public attendance with lottery security personnel present. The drawing shall be audio and video taped.

(d) At the start of the drawing, lottery security personnel shall present the receptacle or drum to the person designated by the executive director to perform the drawing. The receptacle or drum for the drawing shall contain all entries eligible for the drawing. The drum shall be rotated 10 times or receptacle mixed thoroughly as may be applicable. The designated individual shall then unseal the receptacle or drum, and using the bare-arm technique, while looking away, remove 48 valid entries, one at a time, from the receptacle or drum and mark them in order drawn from one through and including 48. The person whose name appears on each of the entries shall be the winner of the prize identified in K.A.R. 111-7-189, subject to validation by the lottery as set forth in these rules.

(e) After 48 entries have been drawn and verified as valid by lottery security, 10 more entries will be drawn, one at a time, to serve as alternate entries. The alternate entries will be marked in order drawn, 1A, 2A, 3A, 4A, 5A, 6A, 7A, 8A, 9A, and 10A. The alternate ticket entries will be used only if one or more of the original winners cannot be located or are declared ineligible, or fail to present a fully-executed claim form to lottery headquarters as required by K.A.R. 111-7-189(i). The alternates will be used, if necessary, in the order drawn.

(f) The Kansas lottery security official present shall review each entry drawn to determine the validity of the entry into the drawing in accordance with these regulations. If it is a valid entry and the name is legible, the event manager and the security person present shall record the name of the winner. Each winner shall be given or sent a prize claim form to be completed and returned to the lottery within 14 calendar days of the drawing.

(continued)

(g) If the entry is determined to be ineligible, it shall be discarded by the security person present and another entry drawn. This procedure will be repeated until valid selections are obtained.

(h) All entries remaining in the drum or receptacle after the winners have been selected and certified and all entries not received in compliance with these rules shall be

destroyed pursuant to K.A.R. 111-3-34. (Authorized by and implementing K.S.A. 74-8710; effective, T-111-2-20-04, Feb. 18, 2004; amended, T-111-4-1-04, March 19, 2004.)
