A public hearing will be conducted at 9 a.m. Thursday, October 21, in Suite 303, 555 S. Kansas Ave., Topeka, to consider the adoption and revocation of rules and regulations of the Kansas Board of Examiners in Optometry.

This 60-day notice of the public hearing shall constitute a public comment period for the purpose of receiving written public comments on the proposed adoption and revocation of the rules and regulations. All parties may submit written comments prior to the hearing to the secretary-treasurer of the Kansas Board of Examiners in Optometry, 3111 W. 6th, Suite A, Lawrence, 66049. All interested parties will be given a reasonable opportunity to present their views orally on the adoption and revocation of the regulations during the hearing. In order to give all parties an opportunity to present their views, it may be necessary to request each participant to limit any oral presentation to five minutes.

Any individual with a disability may request accommodation in order to participate in the public hearing and may request the regulations proposed for adoption and revocation in an accessible format. Requests for accom-

A summary of the regulation proposed for adoption is as follows:

K.A.R. 65-5-12. Reinstatement of license. This is a new regulation that establishes requirements for reinstatement of a license that was cancelled for failure to renew more than 12 months prior to the application.

A summary of the regulation proposed for revocation is as follows:

K.A.R. 65-5-5. Renewal of license. This is a regulation regarding license renewal. The current regulation requires an applicant to submit an application and pay an application fee on an annual basis. Those requirements are being revised and moved to K.A.R. 65-5-11.

Notice of Hearing on Proposed Administrative Regulations

A public hearing will be conducted at 7 p.m. Tuesday, September 14, at 313 Spruce, Halstead, to consider the adoption of 13 new and amended regulations recommended by the Equus Beds Groundwater Management District No. 2 Board to the chief engineer of the Division of Water Resources, Kansas Department of Agriculture. The proposals are summarized as follows:

K.A.R. 5-22-1. Definitions. Adds 21 new definitions (13 of which relate to aquifer storage and recovery) and amends two definitions.

K.A.R. 5-22-4b. Water flowmeter maintenance. Requires a water flowmeter must be repaired if it is out of compliance and sets standards for determining when a water flowmeter is out of compliance.

K.A.R. 5-22-4c. Water flowmeter testing by a nondistrict person. Sets standards for the training a person must have to do a water flowmeter test to be accepted by the district and the equipment the person must have to conduct the test.

K.A.R. 5-22-4d. Water flowmeter installation procedures. Sets time limits for installation of a water flowmeter.

K.A.R. 5-22-6. Noncompliance; penalties; appeal procedures. Sets procedures for investigation of alleged violations and enforcement procedures.

K.A.R. 5-22-7. Safe yield. This amended regulation reduces the quantity of water exempt from the safe yield requirements from 25 acre-feet to 15 acre-feet and adds other restrictions. It also exempts from the safe yield criteria nonconsumptive uses, certain change in point of di-

version applications, and bank storage wells to the extent they divert surface water.

K.A.R. 5-22-8. Change applications. This amended regulation requires that each point of diversion drilled as a change in point of diversion shall be equipped with a water flowmeter.

K.A.R. 5-22-9. Exceptions. This amended regulation requires the chief engineer to consider any exemption or waiver recommended by the district.

K.A.R. 5-22-10. Aquifer storage and recovery: data reporting requirements. This new regulation specifies the data concerning an aquifer storage and recovery operation that is to be submitted to the district not later than June 1 each year.

K.A.R. 5-22-13. Potential net evaporation. This new regulation adopts by reference a map of the annual potential net evaporation from a free water surface.

K.A.R. 5-22-14. Maximum reasonable quantity for beneficial use. This new regulation sets the maximum annual quantity of water reasonable for irrigation, livestock, poultry, municipal use, industrial use, and to replace evaporation in a pond by pumping a well.

K.A.R. 5-22-15. Limitations on the use of fresh groundwater. This new regulation provides that fresh water shall not be used for certain specified purposes if poorer quality of water is available for such use.

K.A.R. 5-22-17. Bank storage wells. This new regulation requires that an applicant for a bank storage well has to demonstrate that the bank storage well is actually withdrawing water from the bed and banks of the stream at the same rate the well is being pumped.

This 60-day notice of the public hearing shall constitute a public comment period for the purpose of receiving written public comments on the proposed rules and regulations. All interested parties may submit written comments prior to the hearing to the Chief Engineer, Division of Water Resources, Kansas Department of Agriculture, Attention: Leslie Garner, 109 S.W. 9th, 4th Floor, Topeka, 66612. All interested parties will be given a reasonable opportunity to present their views orally on the adoption of the proposed regulations during the hearing. In order to give all parties an opportunity to present their views, it may be necessary to limit any oral presentation to five minutes.

K.A.R. 40-3-52. Fire and casualty insurance; mobile homes; rates and charges. This regulation governs the establishment of rates and premium charges for fire and casualty insurance on mobile homes. It specifically requires insurers to use the age and condition of mobile homes when setting rates and premium charges.

The fiscal impact on insurers is indeterminable. The impact on consumers will be positive in that consumers will be charged premiums that more accurately reflect the coverage they are receiving, while the impact on the Kansas Insurance Department and other governmental agencies is minimal, if any.

The Kansas Department of Health and Environment is soliciting comments regarding a proposed air quality operating permit. API Foils, Inc. has applied for a Class I operating permit in accordance with the provisions of K.A.R. 28-19-510 et seq. The purpose of a Class I permit is to identify the sources and types of regulated air pollutants emitted from the facility; the emission limitations, standards and requirements applicable to each source; and the monitoring, record keeping and reporting requirements applicable to each source as of the effective date of permit issuance.

API Foils, Inc., Rahway, New Jersey, owns and operates a hot stamping foil and coated and metallized film located at 3841 Greenway Circle, Lawrence, Kansas.

A person may request a public hearing be held on the proposed permit. The request for a public hearing shall be in writing and set forth the basis for the request. The written request must be submitted to Brie Wilkins, Bureau of Air and Radiation, not later than the close of business August 2 in order for the Secretary of Health and Environment to consider the request.

The U.S. Environmental Protection Agency has a 45-day review period, which will start concurrently with the 30-day public comment period, within which to object to the proposed permit. If the EPA has not objected in writing to the issuance of the permit within the 45-day review period, any person may petition the administrator of the EPA to review the permit. The 60-day public petition period will directly follow the EPA 45-day review period. If the EPA waives its 45-day review period, the 60-day public petition period will start directly after the 30-day public comment period. Interested parties may contact KDHE to determine if the EPA's 45-day review period has been waived.

Any such petition shall be based only on objections to the permit that were raised with reasonable specificity

during the public comment period provided for in this notice, unless the petitioner demonstrates that it was impracticable to raise such objections within such period, or unless the grounds for such objection arose after such period. In such an event, the first eligible alternate entry drawn for that prize pursuant to subsection (e) of K.A.R. 111-4-2173 shall be declared the winner. (Authorized by and implementing K.S.A. 74-8710; effective, T-111-6-16-04, May 19, 2004.)

111-4-2171. Method of entry. (a) Entry into the "Lights, Camera, Money Second Chance Drawing" to be conducted on December 3, 2004, shall be accomplished as follows:

(1) Obtain a valid "Lights, Camera, Money" Kansas lottery instant lottery ticket.

(2) Determine if the ticket is a winning ticket in accordance with "Country Stampede Doubler" game rules. If the ticket is a winning ticket, it is not eligible for the drawing and shall be redeemed in accordance with the instant game rules.

(3) If the ticket is a valid non-winning ticket, the ticket is eligible for the drawing and the holder of the ticket may use it to enter the drawing.

(4) The holder of the non-winning ticket must complete the information form on the back of the ticket in a legible manner. Only one name shall appear on a non-winning ticket entered.

(5) A receptacle or drum may be available for deposit of entries at locations as may be specifically designated by the lottery. All entries so deposited shall be transported to lottery headquarters and secured until the time of the drawing.

(6) Entries may also be mailed with proper postage to "Lights, Camera, Money Drawing c/o Kansas Lottery, P. O. Box 5596, Topeka, Kansas 66605-0596." Mailed entries must be received by morning mail pickup on Tuesday, November 30, 2004. More than one entry may be mailed in one envelope.

(7) The holder of the ticket is not required to personally attend the drawing or be present at the time of the drawing to be determined a winner.

(8) The drawing will be conducted on Friday, December 3, 2004.

(b) There is no limit on the number of entries a person may make, but a person may only win one time in the drawing.

(c) Only valid non-winning "Lights, Camera, Money" tickets which are mailed to the address set forth above with proper postage and received by the morning mail pickup in Topeka, Kansas, on Tuesday, November 30, 2004, and non-winning "Lights, Camera, Money" tickets entered at locations as may be specifically designated by the lottery, shall be eligible for the drawing.

(d) Eligible entrants in the "Lights, Camera, Money Second Chance Drawing" must be 18 years of age or older.

(e) Completing the information form on the non-winning ticket and entering the ticket into the drawing constitutes authorization to publicly identify the person whose entry is drawn. (Authorized by and implementing K.S.A. 74-8710; effective, T-111-6-16-04, May 19, 2004.)

111-4-2172. Certification of drawing. (a) The "Lights, Camera, Money Second Chance Drawing" shall be personally observed by a member of the Kansas lottery security department and a member of the Kansas lottery marketing department or other person or persons designated by the executive director of the lottery (hereinafter "event manager").

(b) Upon completion of the drawing, the security official and the event manager shall issue a report to the executive director, certifying that the name of each prize winner is correct, and that to the best of their knowledge the procedures required by these rules were followed in selecting the prize winners. (Authorized by and imple-

menting K.S.A. 74-8710; effective, T-111-6-16-04, May 19, 2004.)

111-4-2173. Selection of winners. The following process shall be used for the selection of winners in the "Lights, Camera, Money Second Chance Drawing":

(a) Kansas lottery personnel shall pick up all mail containing "Lights, Camera, Money Second Chance Drawing" tickets at the United States Post Office in Topeka, Kansas, with the final pickup at the Topeka post office in the morning mail pickup on Tuesday, November 30, 2004. Following the morning mail pickup on Tuesday, November 30, 2004, the envelopes containing mailed entries will be transported to lottery headquarters and opened by lottery personnel. All mailed entries and entries retained from any other locations as specifically designated by the lottery shall also be placed in the drawing receptacle or drum.

(b) The drawing shall be held at Kansas lottery headquarters and shall be open to the public with lottery security personnel present. The drawing shall be audio and video taped.

(c) At the final drawing on Friday, December 3, 2004, lottery security personnel will be present with the person designated by the executive director to perform the drawing. Prior to the drawing, if a drum is used, the drum shall be sealed and the contents mixed by rotating the drum at least 10 times. If a receptacle other than a drum is used, the contents shall be thoroughly mixed with a shovel or by other means prior to the drawing.

(d) The designated individual shall then unseal the drum, if a drum is used, and using the bare-arm technique, while looking away, remove one entry from the receptacle or drum. The person whose name appears on the entry shall be the winner of the grand prize package identified in K.A.R. 111-4-2170, subject to validation by the lottery as set forth in these rules. This entry shall be marked as the grand prize winner.

(e) After said grand prize entry has been drawn, and the entry has been verified as valid, four more entries will be drawn, one at a time. The person whose name appears on each entry shall be the winner of one of the second prize packages identified in K.A.R. 111-4-2170, subject to validation by the lottery as set forth in these rules. Entries will be marked in the order drawn, 1, 2, 3, and 4, and otherwise identified as having been selected for the applicable drawing. If the grand prize winner cannot be located, is declared ineligible, or fails to timely present a fully-executed claim form to lottery headquarters, the next selected second prize winner for this drawing shall be declared the winner, subject to the claim procedure as set forth in these rules. If a second prize winner cannot be located, is declared ineligible, or fails to timely present a fully-executed claim form to lottery headquarters, or is elevated to be the grand prize winner, the next selected

second prize winner shall be declared the winner, subject to the claim procedure as set forth in these rules. The second prize winners will be used, if necessary, in the order drawn. If a second prize winner cannot be located, is declared ineligible, or fails to timely present a fully-executed claim form to lottery headquarters, the process shall be repeated until the prize is properly claimed or until such time as no winners remain, whichever occurs first.

(f) After the grand prize and second prize entries have been drawn, and the entries have been verified as valid, five more entries will be drawn, one at a time. The last five entries drawn will serve as alternate entries for the prize packages. The alternate entries will be marked in order drawn, 1A, 2A, 3A, 4A, and 5A. The alternate entries will be used only if one or more of the original second prize winners cannot be located or is declared ineligible, fails to present a fully-executed claim form to lottery headquarters by 5:00 p.m. of the thirtieth calendar day following the drawing, or is elevated to a grand prize winner. The alternates will be used, if necessary, in the order drawn. If an alternate winner cannot be located, is declared ineligible, or fails to present a fully-executed claim form to lottery headquarters by 5:00 p.m. of the thirtieth calendar day following the claim form being given or sent to the alternate winner, the alternate winner process shall be repeated until the prize is properly claimed or until such time as no alternate winners remain, whichever occurs first.

(g) The Kansas lottery security official present shall review each ticket drawn to determine the validity of the entry into the "Lights, Camera, Money Second Chance Drawing" in accordance with these regulations. If it is a valid entry and the name is legible, the event manager and the security person present shall record the name of the winner and the prize won. Each winner shall be given or sent a prize claim form to be completed and returned to the lottery within 30 calendar days of the drawing.

(h) If the entry is determined to be ineligible, it shall be discarded by the security person present and another entry drawn. This procedure will be repeated until valid selections are obtained.

(i) Only non-winning "Lights, Camera, Money" instant tickets as defined by these rules are eligible for the drawing.

(j) All "Lights, Camera, Money" tickets remaining in the drum or receptacle on December 3, 2004, after the winners and alternates have been selected, and all entries not received in compliance with these rules, shall be destroyed pursuant to K.A.R. 111-3-34. (Authorized by and implementing K.S.A. 74-8710; effective, T-111-6-16-04, May 19, 2004.)
