This 60-day notice of the public hearing shall constitute a public comment period for the purpose of receiving written public comment on the proposed regulation. Economic Impact: The proposed regulation will provide fees to offset the Board of Regents' staff time required to review and approve requests by private and out-of-state postsecondary institutions to operate in the state and grant degrees within the state. The economic impact on individual institutions will vary. Institutions that do not grant degrees are not affected by this regulation.

Not later than seven business days after the date of the sale of the bonds, the city shall furnish the successful bidder with a reasonable number of copies of the final official statement, without cost.

Continuing Disclosure

The city has adopted an ordinance establishing a master undertaking to provide ongoing disclosure concerning the city in connection with its general obligation bonds for the benefit of owners of the bonds, as required under Section (b)(5)(i) of Securities and Exchange Com-

mission Rule 15c2-12. A copy of that ordinance is included as an appendix to the official statement.

Permanent Administrative Regulations

Article 10.—ANIMAL HEALTH

112-10-5. Authorized medications. (a) Furosemide may be administered to any horse that is entered in a race meeting, subject to the requirements of these racing regulations. Except upon the instructions of the animal health officer or an assistant animal health officer to remove the horse from the veterinarian's list or to facilitate the collection of a post-race urine sample, the administration of furosemide shall be permitted only if all of the following requirements are met.

(1) The animal health officer or an assistant animal health officer shall place the horse's name on the bleeder list or the furosemide list, or on both lists.

(2) The furosemide shall be administered at a location approved by the animal health officer or an assistant animal health officer and at least four hours before post time for the race in which each horse is entered, unless otherwise authorized in advance by the animal health officer or assistant animal health officer.

(3) Furosemide shall be administered only by a practicing veterinarian designated by the trainer to administer the furosemide to each horse under the supervision of the animal health officer or an assistant animal health officer.

(4) No dose of furosemide administered shall exceed 250 milligrams, unless otherwise authorized in advance by the animal health officer or an assistant animal health officer. In addition to the dosage restriction specified in this paragraph, furosemide shall be administered only intravenously and only in a single injection.

(5) After furosemide is administered to each horse, it shall remain under the care, custody, and control of the trainer or the designated representative until it is time for each horse to be removed to the saddling paddock.

(6) Each owner shall pay all expenses resulting from the administration of furosemide. These costs shall include the following:

- (A) Administration;
- (B) injection;
- (C) laryngoscopic examination;
- (D) custody; and
- (E) security.

(7) The use of furosemide shall be required to be approved in advance and shall be subject to the following requirements:

(A) The specific gravity of post-race urine samples shall be measured to ensure that the specific gravity (sg) of the urine is 1.010 or higher. If the sg of the post-race

urine sample is below 1.010, quantitation of furosemide in serum or plasma shall then be performed.

(B) When a serum or plasma sample is quantitated, the concentration of furosemide in the sample shall not exceed 100 nanograms per milliliter of serum or plasma. Each concentration above 100 ng/ml shall be deemed a violation of this regulation.

(b) No person shall administer a medication to any horse entered to race except upon authorization of the animal health officer or assistant animal health officer in compliance with these regulations.

(c) No medication other than authorized bleeder medication shall be administered to any horse entered to race within 24 hours of the race in which the horse is entered.

(d)(1) No more than one approved nonsteroidal anti-inflammatory drug (NSAID) substance may be administered to a horse that is entered to race. The NSAID administered shall be restricted to horses three years of age or older and shall be one of the following authorized drug substances:

(A) Phenylbutazone in a dosage amount so that the test sample taken after the race contains no more than 5.0 micrograms of drug substance per milliliter of blood plasma or serum;

(B) flunixin in a dosage amount so that the test sample taken after the race contains no more than 20 nanograms of drug substance per milliliter of blood plasma or serum; or

(C) ketoprofen in a dosage amount so that the test sample taken after the race contains no more than 10 nanograms per milliliter of blood plasma or serum.

(2) Each trainer shall file a request for the use of any authorized NSAID with the animal health officer or an assistant animal health officer on an official request form approved by the animal health officer before the horse is entered in a race. (Authorized by K.S.A. 74-8804; implementing K.S.A. 74-8811; effective, T-112-3-31-89, March 31, 1989; effective June 26, 1989; amended, T-112-8-13-92, Aug. 13, 1992; amended, T-112-12-10-92, Dec. 10, 1992; amended Feb. 15, 1993; amended Oct. 24, 1997; amended July 30, 2004.)

112-10-6. Bleeder list. (a)(1) "Bleeder" means any equine exhibiting exercise-induced pulmonary hemorrhage (EIPH) manifested by the presence of frank blood appearing from either nostril or the presence of frank blood in the trachea.

(2) "Exercise-induced pulmonary hemorrhage" and "EIPH" mean a commonly recognized condition in race horses that is manifested by bleeding into the lung tissue during or after strenuous exercise. The presence of frank blood can be seen in the trachea by means of endoscopic exam, or by the appearance of blood emanating from the nostrils.

(3) "Furosemide" means a diuretic that is recognized for its benefit in the medical management of the EIPH syndrome in horses.

(b) Subject to the requirements of these racing regulations, furosemide may be administered to any horse that is entered in a race if its name is on the bleeder list or the furosemide list. A horse's name shall be placed on the bleeder list if any one of the following conditions is met:

(continued)

(1) The animal health officer or an assistant animal health officer observes the horse shedding blood from one or both nostrils during or following exercise or a race.

(2) A practicing veterinarian who is employed by the owner or trainer of the horse, and the animal health officer or an assistant animal health officer determine that the horse should be certified as a bleeder after an endoscopic examination of the respiratory tract conducted by the practicing veterinarian under the supervision of the animal health officer or an assistant animal health officer.

(3) A bleeder certificate for the horse is attached to the horse's papers on file in the racing secretary's office, and the certificate is from a jurisdiction that uses bleeder qualification criteria satisfactory to the animal health officer or an assistant animal health officer. Each certificate shall bear the signature of the racing commission official in the state of origin.

(c) For each horse that does not have a bleeder certificate and that is observed bleeding for the first time ever, both of these requirements shall be met:

(1) The horse's name shall be placed on the bleeder list for a minimum of 10 days or until the animal health officer or assistant animal health officer removes the horse's name from the list.

(2) The horse's owner shall receive an official Kansas bleeder certificate signed by the animal health officer or assistant animal health officer and attached to the registration certificate of this horse.

(d) Each horse that has a bleeder certificate and is racing after the administration of furosemide shall be subject to the following restrictions:

(1) The first time a horse is observed bleeding, its name shall be placed on the bleeder list, and the name shall remain there for a minimum of 20 days or until the animal health officer or assistant animal health officer removes the horse's name from the list.

(2) The second time a horse is observed bleeding within a 12-month period, its name shall be placed on the bleeder list, and the name shall remain there for a minimum of 30 days or until the animal health officer or assistant animal health officer removes the horse's name from the list.

(3) The third time a horse is observed bleeding within a 12-month period, the horse shall be barred from pari-mutuel racing in Kansas for a minimum of one year or any additional time as determined by the animal health officer or designee after an endoscopic examination of the horse's respiratory tract. (Authorized by K.S.A. 74-8804; implementing K.S.A. 74-8806 and 74-8811; effective, T-112-3-31-89, March 31, 1989; effective June 26, 1989; amended, T-112-8-13-92, Aug. 13, 1992; amended, T-112-12-10-92, Dec. 10, 1992; amended Feb. 15, 1993; amended March 21, 1997; amended July 16, 1999; amended Nov. 16, 2001; amended July 30, 2004.)

112-10-6a. Furosemide list. (a) A horse may be allowed to race after the administration of furosemide if any of the following conditions is met:

(1) After consultation with the horse's trainer or practicing veterinarian, or both, the animal health officer or an assistant animal health officer determines that it would be in the best interest of the horse's health to allow the horse to race with furosemide.

(2) The horse's name appears on the bleeder list from any racing jurisdiction.

(3) The horse has an official bleeder stamp or certificate attached to the registration papers.

(4) The horse is observed to bleed as described in K.A.R. 112-10-6(a).

(5) The past performance lines indicate that the horse has been racing with furosemide.

(b) A list of all horses racing after the administration of furosemide shall be maintained by the animal health officer or an assistant animal health officer.

(c) An "application to administer furosemide" form approved by the animal health officer shall be submitted by the trainer with the names of all horses racing with furosemide. This form shall be on file with the animal health officer or an assistant animal health officer before the first race in which each listed horse competes. (Authorized by K.S.A. 74-8804; implementing K.S.A. 74-8806 and 74-8811; effective July 30, 2004.)

(c) For this game, a play symbol shall appear in each of 18 play spots within the "YOUR NUMBERS" play area, in each of two play spots within the "BONUS" play area, and a variable number of times within the crossword puzzle grid.

In the "YOUR LETTERS" play area, located in the lower part of the ticket, there are 18 letters located under opaque latex. To the right of the "YOUR LETTERS" play area is the "BONUS" play area in which there are two letters covered by opaque latex. Imaged around each of the 18 "YOUR LETTERS" and two "BONUS" letters there will be a four-sided box composed of solid lines. A player will remove the latex from the "YOUR LETTERS" and "BONUS" play areas one letter at a time, and then for each matching letter in the crossword puzzle grid scratch off the transparent latex. Each letter revealed in the "YOUR LETTERS" and "BONUS" play areas may be used an unlimited number of times in the crossword puzzle grid. If a player reveals at least three complete words in the crossword puzzle grid, the player wins the corresponding prize in the prize legend. The prize legend on the front of the ticket indicates prizes won for number of words revealed, as is also set forth in subsection (k) hereinafter.

(h) To qualify as a complete word to win a prize in this game, the words revealed must meet the following requirements:

- (1) must contain at least three letters;
- (2) cannot be formed diagonally, run right to left or from bottom to top;
- (3) must appear in an unbroken horizontal or vertical string of letters in the "crossword" puzzle;
- (4) an unbroken string of letters cannot be interrupted by a black space and must contain every single letter square between two black spaces;
- (5) every single letter in the unbroken string must be revealed in "YOUR LETTERS," or "BONUS" areas and be included to form a word; and
- (6) the three small letters outside the squares in the "YOUR LETTERS" area are for validation purposes and cannot be used to play "Bonus Crossword."

(i) Each ticket in this game may win up to one time. Only the highest prize won on each ticket will be awarded.

(j) Approximately 2,400,000 tickets shall be ordered initially for this instant game. Additional ticket orders shall have the same prize structure, the same number of prizes per prize pool of 300,000 tickets, and the same odds as were contained in the initial ticket order.

Article 11.—eSCRATCH GENERIC GAME RULES

111-11-1. Definitions. (a) The following definitions apply to the Kansas lottery eScratch game, along with all definitions contained in the Kansas lottery act (K.S.A. 74-8701 et seq.) and amendments thereto, and in lottery regulations adopted pursuant to the Kansas lottery act, which are hereby incorporated by reference.

(b) "eScratch game" or "game" means an online lottery game in which a player purchases one or more tickets in one-dollar increments and selects from the denomination of play(s) available for that game. Denominations of play may be \$.10, \$.50, or \$1.00, or in such other amounts as set by rules for each eScratch game. In return for paying the appropriate amount, the player receives a randomly computer-generated ticket containing the corresponding number of reveals selected from a set pool of reveals established by the rules for each eScratch game. Each ticket holder whose valid ticket includes a winning combination shall be instantly entitled to a prize if the ticket and, if applicable, a valid claim form are submitted within the specified time period. In addition, until such time as a ticket is validated or win-checked, all prize(s) won on a ticket, if any, shall be capable of being revealed by entering certain information onto an Internet web site and playing a variety of computer-generated games. The prize(s) to which an eScratch ticket is entitled shall be determined at the time of purchase, and shall not be dependent upon revealing the prize(s) by playing the internet game(s), whether in whole or in part.

(c) "eScratch ticket retailer" or "retailer" means a person or business authorized by the Lottery to sell eScratch game tickets.

(d) "eScratch lottery terminal" or "terminal" means the computer hardware by which an eScratch ticket retailer or player enters the combination selected by the player and by which eScratch tickets are generated and claims are validated.

(e) "eScratch ticket" or "ticket" means a computer-generated ticket issued by an eScratch ticket terminal to a player containing the selections and plays purchased by the player. That ticket shall be the only acceptable evidence of the selections and play purchased.

(f) Prize tiers:

(1) "high-tier prize" means an eScratch ticket game prize of not less than \$600;

(2) "low-tier prize" means an eScratch ticket game prize of less than \$600.

(g) "Validation" means the process of determining whether an eScratch ticket presented for payment is a winning ticket.

(h) "Ticket holder" or "holder" means the person who has possession of an unsigned eScratch ticket or the person whose written name, signature or mark appears on the back of the ticket.

(i) "Executive director" means the executive director of the Kansas lottery or the person designated by the executive director.

(j) "Reveal" or "play" means each individual computer-generated animation or other graphic displayed by the eScratch internet site to the player indicating the win(s) or loss(es) to which each eScratch ticket is entitled.

(k) "Pool" means each set of reveals that contains a predetermined number of winning and losing reveals, and the value of each such reveal, as determined by the rules for each eScratch game. Each eScratch game may contain multiple numbers of pools.

(l) "Problem ticket" means any eScratch ticket erroneously produced either by terminal malfunction or by miscommunication between a player and a retailer.

(m) "Receptacle" or "drum" means a container in which non-winning tickets or entry forms are placed and from which drawings are made. Receptacles or drums may be sealable and drums shall be capable of being mixed or rotated for the purpose of ensuring random distribution.

(n) "Day," "business day," or "operations day," when referring to an eScratch game, means the 20-hour period starting at 5:00 a.m. and ending at 1:00 a.m., the following day, unless specified otherwise in individual game rules.

(o) "Win-check" means the act of electronically determining whether an eScratch ticket is entitled to win a prize by scanning the eScratch ticket on a retailer lottery terminal or on a player-activated device provided for said purpose, but without validating the ticket. (Authorized by and implementing K.S.A. 74-8710; effective, T-111-5-21-04, April 22, 2004; amended, T-111-7-2-04, June 17, 2004.)
