The Kansas Department of Transportation is offering for sale a 1968 Cessna TU-206C aerial survey aircraft. This aircraft was purchased new by KDOT in 1968 and has been used exclusively for aerial surveys, and is equipped with a Leica RC-20 fixed-focus aerial camera with Forward Motion Compensation (FMC). A current USPAP-certified appraisal reports the airframe to be in very good condition at 4100.97 hours with no damage history. Engine SMHO: 289. McCauley three-blade propeller TSO/NEW: 453.98. The aircraft was repainted in 1989 and is in good condition. The headliner was replaced in 2000 and the windows are in good condition with minor scratching and no discoloration or crazing. Otherwise, the remainder of the interior is in low average original condition. All but one of the passenger seats have been removed to accommodate the aerial camera, but are included with the plane. The plane has an average avionics package that includes: ADF, altimeter, aero mechanism, audio panel, engine analyzer, GPS, Nav-Comm, transponder and VOR. It is equipped with: dual controls, stall warning system, rotating beacon, strobe light, long range fuel, navigation lights and Airtex ELT 200. All aircraft log books are original, complete and thorough. This aircraft is not IFR certified.

 Facility Description: The proposed action is to reissue an existing permit for operation of an existing wastewater treatment facility. This is a small production center for various water-based lotions/creams and for wound dressings using collagen received from off-site. Under normal day-to-day standby and minor manufacturing operations, the three employees produce about 9,000 gallons of domestic wastewater per month. The domestic wastewater is routed through a septic tank to a single-cell lagoon. Occasionally, this facility restarts the wound dressings operation for limited production runs. During these times, the permittee uses about 90,000 gpd of water from a rural water district for noncontact cooling of the production machinery. This cooling water and other floor washing wastewater is routed to floor drains that are connected through various holding tanks to the earthen lagoon. Discharge of wastewater from this treatment facility to surface waters of the state of Kansas is prohibited by this permit. The permit requirements are pursuant to the Kansas Surface Water Quality Standards, K.A.R. 28-16-28(b-f).

A public hearing will be conducted at 10 a.m. Tuesday, August 30, in Room 3-West of the New England Building, 503 S. Kansas Ave., Topeka, to consider the adoption of proposed rules and regulations of the Kansas Department on Aging.

This 60-day notice of the public hearing shall constitute a public comment period for the purpose of receiving written public comments on the proposed rules and regulations. All interested parties may submit written comments prior to the hearing to Tina Langley, Policy Analyst, Kansas Department on Aging, 503 S. Kansas Ave., Topeka, 66603. All interested parties will be given a reasonable opportunity to present their views orally on the adoption of the proposed regulations during the hearing. In order to give all parties an opportunity to present their views, it may be necessary to request that each participant limit any oral presentation to five minutes.

Any individual with a disability may request accommodation in order to participate in the public hearing and may request the proposed regulations and economic impact statements in an accessible format. Requests for accommodation should be made at least five working days in advance of the hearing by contacting Tina Langley at (785) 368-7331 or TTY (785) 291-3167. Handicapped parking is located on the east side of the New England Building, directly in front of the building's entrance on Kansas Avenue. The New England Building is accessible to individuals with disabilities.

The content of the proposed regulations is largely the same as regulations that were previously administered by the Kansas Department of Health and Environment. Pursuant to K.S.A. 2004 Supp. 39-925, the administration of the adult care home licensure act has been transferred to the Secretary of Aging, and regulations are being revised accordingly. These regulations are proposed for adoption on a permanent basis. A summary of the proposed regulations and their economic impact follows:

K.A.R. 26-39-144. Definitions. These definitions, which apply to all adult care homes except nursing facilities for mental health and intermediate care facilities for the mentally retarded, were previously contained in K.A.R. 28-39-144. These definitions have been revised for consistency with federal and state program terms and with terms used in the Department on Aging's regulations. Definitions of paid nutrition assistant and terms related to the use of a paid nutrition assistant also have been added.

The Department on Aging will experience administrative costs associated with the adoption of this regulation. The Kansas Department of Health and Environment will experience costs associated with developing a training curriculum, approving sponsors, and expanding the abuse, neglect and exploitation record to include paid nutrition assistants. Sponsors providing training programs will determine the tuition for their programs, and individuals choosing to become paid nutrition assistants may incur tuition and other costs related to training. Adult care homes choosing to employ paid nutrition assistants may experience costs related to hiring and orientation of new staff members, which has the potential to affect Medicaid reimbursement rates for certified nursing facilities. Additional expenses incurred by adult care homes could be passed on to residents through increased rates.

K.A.R. 26-39-243. Resident functional capacity screening. This regulation, which applies to assisted living or residential health care facilities, was previously contained in K.A.R. 28-39-243. The regulation has been revised to include the requirement that residents who receive assistance with eating from a paid nutrition assistant shall receive a quarterly screening of their functional capacity. The Department on Aging will experience administrative costs associated with the adoption of this regulation. Facilities choosing to utilize paid nutrition assistants may experience an increase in cost due to the requirement to provide quarterly screenings to residents who use this service.

K.A.R. 26-39-278. Resident functional capacity screening. This regulation, which applies to adult day care facilities, was previously contained in K.A.R. 28-39-278. The regulation has been revised to include the requirement that residents who receive assistance with eating from a paid nutrition assistant shall receive a quarterly screening of their functional capacity. The Department on Aging will experience administrative costs associated with the adoption of this regulation. Facilities choosing to utilize paid nutrition assistants may experience an increase in cost due to the requirement to provide quarterly screenings to residents who use this service.

K.A.R. 26-39-427. Resident functional capacity screening. This regulation, which applies to home plus facilities, was previously contained in K.A.R. 28-39-427. The regulation has been revised to include the requirement that residents who receive assistance with eating from a paid nutrition assistant shall receive a quarterly screening of their functional capacity. The Department on Aging will experience administrative costs associated with the adoption of this regulation. Facilities choosing to utilize paid nutrition assistants may experience an increase in cost

All interested parties will be given a reasonable opportunity at the hearing to present their views orally regarding the adoption of the proposed rules and regulations. In order to give all parties an opportunity to present their views, it may be necessary to request that each participant limit any oral presentation to five minutes.

Any individual with a disability may request accommodation in order to participate in the public hearing and may request the proposed rules and regulations and related economic impact statements in an accessible format. Requests for accommodation should be made at least five working days in advance of the hearing by contacting Melissa Wangemann at (785) 296-4801 or 1-800-262-8683 (TTD/TTY). Handicapped parking is located on the south side of Memorial Hall, and the entrance to the building for individuals with disabilities is located directly adjacent to the handicapped parking.

The proposed rules and regulations are requested for permanent adoption. A summary of the proposed regulations and their economic impact follows:

K.A.R. 7-42-1. Charitable organizations; registration. This proposed regulation allows charitable organizations to register with the Secretary of State's Office using either the office's prepared form or the unified registration statement. There is no significant economic impact on state agencies or the general public. If anything, this regulation may save charitable organizations money by al-

lowing them to use the same unified registration statement form to register in multiple states rather than filling out separate forms for each state.

K.A.R. 7-42-2. Professional fund raisers; registration. This regulation prescribes the registration requirements for professional fund raisers. It describes all the information that must be provided in order to register as a professional fund raiser. Along with the registration application, this regulation requires a professional fund raiser to provide a copy of the operating statement for each charitable organization for which the professional fund raiser solicits. There is no anticipated economic impact on state agencies or the general public.

K.A.R. 7-42-3. Professional fund raisers; annual report. This regulation prescribes the various information that professional fund raisers must provide on their annual report to the Secretary of State. There is no anticipated economic impact on state agencies or the general public.

K.A.R. 7-42-4. Professional solicitors; registration. This regulation prescribes the registration requirements for professional solicitors. There is no significant economic impact on state agencies or the general public.

K.A.R. 7-42-5. Changes to registration. This regulation requires charitable organizations, professional fund raisers and professional solicitors to notify the Secretary of State of any material changes to their registration within 30 days after the change occurs. There is no anticipated economic impact on any state agencies or the general public.

Opinion No. 2005-09

Written June 22, 2005, to Janet Schalansky, Topeka.

This opinion is in response to your letter dated June 9, 2005, requesting an opinion from the Kansas Governmental Ethics Commission concerning state level conflict of interest laws, K.S.A. 46-215 *et seq.* We note at the outset that the Commission's jurisdiction concerning your question is limited to the application of K.S.A. 46-215 *et seq.*, and whether some other statutory system, common law theory or agency rule or regulation applies to your inquiry is not covered by this opinion.

Factual Statement:

You request this opinion in your capacity as the former Secretary of the Department of Social and Rehabilitation Services (SRS). You left that position and state employment on December 31, 2004. You indicate that as Secretary of SRS, you signed contracts on behalf of SRS with child welfare agencies. You are exploring the possibility of ac-

cepting contract work or employment with one or more of those child welfare agencies. You state that the contracts you signed were the result of a competitive bid process which was managed by the Kansas Department of Administration. You also state that you did not review the proposals for these contracts and you did not sit on the negotiating committee.

Question:

As the former Secretary of SRS, can you accept employment with an agency that had a contract with SRS which you signed on behalf of SRS.

Opinion:

K.S.A.2004 Supp. 46-233(a)(2) places restrictions on a state employee's ability to accept employment after terminating their employment with the State. That statute states in pertinent part as follows:

(a)(2) Except as otherwise provided in this subsection, whenever any individual has participated as a state officer or employee in the making of any contract with any person or business, such individual shall not accept employment with such person or business as an employee, independent contractor or subcontractor until two years after performance of the contract is completed or until two years after the individual terminates employment as a state officer or employee, whichever is sooner.

...

(d) Subsections (a) and (b) shall not apply to the following:

(1) Contracts let after competitive bidding has been advertised for by published notice; and

(2) Contracts for property or services for which the price or rate is fixed by law.

(e) When used in this section:

...

(2) "Substantially involved in the preparation or participate in the making of a contract" means having approved or disapproved a contract or having provided significant factual or specific information or advice or recommendations in relation to the negotiated terms of the contract. (Emphasis added.)

According to subsection K.S.A. 2004 Supp. 46-233(e)(2), by signing a contract, you participated in the making of the contract. However, you have informed us that the contracts you signed were a result of a competitive bidding process. If that competitive bidding process included advertising by published notice, and the contracts were not renegotiated, the contracts fall within the exception for competitively bid contracts and you would not be subject to the prohibitions stated in K.S.A. 2004 Supp. 46-233(a)(2). If you signed any contract that was not let after competitive bidding had been advertised for by published notice, or that was renegotiated after competitive bidding, then pursuant to K.S.A. 2004 Supp. 46-233(a)(2), you would be prohibited from accepting employment, which includes contract work, with an agency that was a party to the state contract you signed on behalf of SRS, for two years after performance of the contract is completed or until January 1, 2007, whichever is sooner.

Below is a findings and order of the chief engineer that affects: (1) any feedlot, or group of related feedlots, that had the capacity to confine 1,000 or more head of cattle, and (2) any other confined livestock operation or dairy, or group of related operations or dairies, that diverted 15 acre-feet (4.89 million gallons) or more of water per calendar year **prior to 1985**.

Prior to 1985, such uses of water had sometimes been deemed a domestic use of water and did not require a permit. Now they are considered "stockwatering," and are required to be permitted as stockwatering use by the Department of Agriculture, Division of Water Resources. The chief engineer is allowing persons the remainder of this calendar year to file an application to document any

such pre-1985 domestic use and then convert that use to stockwatering use.

As stated in the order, the deadline for filing such applications is **December 31, 2005**.

NOW ON THIS 24th day of May, 2005, the Chief Engineer, Division of Water Resources, Kansas Department of Agriculture, makes the following Findings and Order regarding the use of water for "stockwatering" purposes:

FINDINGS

1. That the Kansas Water Appropriation Act (KWAA), K.S.A. 82a-728(a), provides that; Except for the appropriation of water for...domestic use...it shall be unlawful for any person to appropriate or threaten to appropriate water from any source without first applying for and obtaining a permit to appropriate water in accordance with the provisions of chapter 7 of article 82a of the Kansas Statutes Annotated...(Emphasis supplied)
2. That "domestic uses" is defined in the KWAA to include "the watering of livestock, poultry, farm and domestic animals used in operating a farm..." K.S.A. 82a-701(c)
3. That in 1985, at the recommendation of the Governor's Task Force, the KWAA regulations were amended to provide that water used for confined livestock operations of 1,000 head or more was not a "domestic" use of water.
4. That the definition of "stockwatering" was clarified in 2000 to read, "Stockwatering" means the watering of livestock and other uses of water directly relating to either of the following: (A) The operation

of a feedlot with the capacity to confine 1,000 head or more of cattle; or (B) any other confined livestock operation or dairy that would divert 15 acre-feet or more of water per calendar year." See K.A.R. 5-1-1 (www)

5. That since 1985 any person using water for stockwatering purposes has been required to have a water right or permit to appropriate water for stockwatering purposes from the Chief Engineer.
6. That since 1985, the Division of Water Resources has actively attempted to identify and work with those persons who had a pre-1985 confined feeding operation that was operating under a "domestic use" of water, but after 1985 was no longer domestic use because it became a "stockwatering" use as a result of a change in the regulations. For 20 years the Chief Engineer has allowed a grace period to change those domestic water rights into stockwatering rights and thereby bring those operations into compliance with the applicable requirements of the KWAA. This grace period will end on December 31, 2005.

ORDER

NOW THEREFORE, IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that the Chief Engineer shall not approve any application to change the use made of water from domestic use to stockwatering use if: (a) the application is filed after **December 31, 2005**; and (b) the annual quantity exceeds the quantity of water actually used for: (1) the operation of a feedlot with the capacity to confine 1,000 head or more of cattle; or (2) any other confined livestock operation or dairy that diverted 15 acre-feet or more of water per calendar year.
