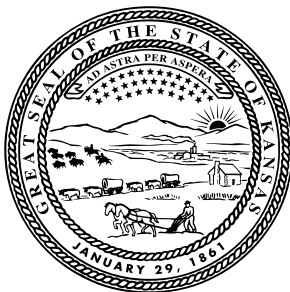

Kansas Water Authority**Notice of Meeting**

The Kansas Water Authority will conduct business by conference call at 8 a.m. Tuesday, July 12. The conference call will originate at the Kansas Water Office, 901 S. Kansas Ave., Topeka. Anyone interested in listening to the discussion may attend in person at the Kansas Water Office.

Decisions will be made on three contracts, one agreement, one internal policy memo and the calendar year 2006 Water Marketing rates. The proposed contracts include:

- A four-year study of the Ozark and Springfield Plateau aquifers in Kansas, Missouri and Oklahoma by the U.S. Geological Survey. Included will be development of a simulation of the groundwater flow system and water quality assessment of the aquifers. The groundwater flow model will be used to provide estimates of sustainable yield from groundwater and surfacewater sources.
- Fiscal year 2006 contract with the U.S. Geological Survey to conduct the statewide streamgaging network. Total cost will be \$898,140, with \$412,668 in Kansas Water Plan Funds; \$350,792 contributed by the U.S. Geological Survey; and \$134,680 contributed by other agencies.
- Fiscal year 2006 contract with the Western Kansas Groundwater Management District No. 1 for \$120,000 to conduct weather modification for hail suppression.

A calendar year 2005 agreement is proposed with the Bureau of Reclamation to provide technical and financial assistance to offset the effects of drought on Kansas Bostwick Irrigation District No. 2, the Kirwin Irrigation District No. 1 and the Webster Irrigation District No. 4. The financial assistance will provide the irrigation districts with incentives to leave irrigation water in storage in Harlan County Lake, Kirwin Reservoir and Webster Reservoir, respectively, for future years' use. Such action will help sustain irrigation and in-reservoir uses for fish, wildlife and recreation.

Internal Policy Memo No. 11 has been revised to reflect administrative procedures regarding the appointment of three advisors to the Kansas Water Authority's Public Water Supply Operations Committee. The three advisors represent customers of the state's Water Marketing Program.

The Kansas Water Authority is required to approve the water rate charged customers of the state's Water Marketing Program. The calculated rate will be \$0.12289 per 1,000 gallons, compared to \$0.11667 in 2005.

The Kansas Arts Commission is accepting applications for 2006 Kansas Artist Fellowships and Mini-Fellowships. The application deadline is Thursday, October 13.

The commission will award up to five Kansas Artist Fellowships of \$5,000 each. The eligible disciplines are: fiction, poetry, crafts, two-dimensional art and three-dimensional art, including installations and site-specific work.

The commission also will award up to 12 Mini-Fellowships of \$500 each in the following disciplines: choreography, music composition, play-writing, film/video, performance art, fiction, poetry, crafts, two-dimensional art and three-dimensional art, including installations and site-specific work.

Eligible applicants must have resided in Kansas since July 1, 2004, and must intend to remain residents through July 1, 2007. Undergraduate or graduate degree-seeking students may not apply.

The Artist Fellowships are intended for working artists and are based upon artistic merit and recognition of sustained achievement and excellence. Mini-Fellowships are intended to recognize artistic excellence among emerging artists. Previous recipients of Mini-Fellowships may apply for Artist Fellowships, but it is not a requirement to have received one before seeking a Fellowship.

The meeting will recess at 5:30 p.m., then resume at 7 p.m. at the same location for the regulatory hearing. There will be public comment periods at the beginning of the afternoon and evening meetings for any issues not on the agenda, and additional comment periods will be available during the meeting on agenda items. Old and new business also may be discussed at this time. If necessary to complete the hearing or other business matters, the commission will reconvene at 9 a.m. August 26 at the same location.

K.A.R. 115-25-20. This exempt regulation sets the management unit, hunting season, shooting hours, bag and possession limit, and permit validation for sandhill crane season. The proposed version considers an opening date on the Wednesday following the first Saturday in November rather than the traditional first Saturday in November opening date.

Economic Impact Summary: The proposed regulation is not anticipated to have any substantive economic impact on the department, other agencies or the public.

Permanent Administrative Regulations

Article 41.—PUBLIC SAFETY COMMUNICATION SYSTEM REVOLVING FUND

36-41-1. Definitions. For the purposes of this article, the following words and phrases shall be defined as specified in this regulation: (a) "Access lease agreement" means a contract between the secretary and any one of the following that permits and confirms the purpose and terms of access to the department's communication system equipment and any other agreed-upon conditions:

- (1) An authorized governmental entity;
 - (2) an authorized nongovernmental entity; or
 - (3) an authorized public safety agency.
- (b) "Act" means K.S.A. 75-5073 through 75-5077, and amendments thereto.

(c) "Applicant" means any of the following:

- (1) A governmental entity filing an application under the act with the secretary for an access lease agreement;
- (2) a nongovernmental entity filing an application under the act with the secretary for an access lease agreement; or

(3) a public safety agency filing an application under the act with the secretary for an access lease agreement or an equipment lease agreement.

(d) "Authorized governmental entity" means a governmental entity whose application for an access lease agreement has been approved by the secretary. This term shall not include public safety agencies.

(e) "Authorized nongovernmental entity" means a nongovernmental entity whose application for an access lease agreement has been approved by the secretary.

(f) "Authorized public safety agency" means a public safety agency whose application for an access lease agreement or equipment lease agreement has been approved by the secretary.

(g) "Communication system equipment access" means the acquisition, construction, enhancement, installation, improvement, maintenance, repair, rehabilitation, relocation, security, or extension of any equipment necessary to use, implement, support, and maintain the department's communication system.

(h) "Equipment lease agreement" means a contract between an authorized public safety agency and the secretary that confirms the purpose and terms of the lease of communication system equipment from the department and any other agreed-upon conditions.

(i) "Prevailing rate" means the amount of money that the secretary determines shall be charged for the communication system equipment access sought by an authorized nongovernmental entity, as specified in an access lease agreement. (Authorized by K.S.A. 2004 Supp. 75-5076; implementing K.S.A. 2004 Supp. 75-5074; effective, T-36-2-18-05, Feb. 18, 2005; effective July 22, 2005.)

36-41-2. Application and supporting documents.

(a) Any governmental entity, nongovernmental entity, or public safety agency may submit an application for an access lease agreement under the act to the secretary for consideration for approval at any time. Any public safety agency may submit an application for an equipment lease agreement under the act to the secretary for consideration for approval at any time.

(b) Each applicant shall submit the following application documents for the secretary's review and consideration for approval:

(1) A completed application for an access lease agreement or an equipment lease agreement, on a form furnished by the department;

(2) a detailed statement that establishes the need for the requested access to communication system equipment or the leasing of communication system equipment;

(3) documentation that provides sufficient detail regarding the need for access to communication system equipment or the leasing of communication system equipment to enable the secretary to determine the following:

(A) The exact nature of the requested access or equipment, or both;

(B) the applicable estimated costs for the access or equipment, or both; and

(C) the proposed lease period; and

(4) financial information regarding the applicant's revenues and expenditures for the three calendar years immediately preceding the date of the application that establishes to the secretary's satisfaction that the applicant has the capability to satisfy its financial obligations under the requested lease agreement. (Authorized by K.S.A. 2004 Supp. 75-5076; implementing K.S.A. 2004 Supp. 75-5074; effective, T-36-2-18-05, Feb. 18, 2005; effective July 22, 2005.)

36-41-3. Access lease agreement and equipment lease agreement: restrictions and requirements.

(a) No access lease agreement shall permit interference with or impair the existing use of the department's communication system equipment by any governmental entity, any nongovernmental entity, or any public safety agency.

(b) The initial term of each access lease agreement shall not exceed five years. An access lease agreement may be renewed by the secretary after its initial term for a maximum of four five-year periods.

(c) The rate charged to an authorized governmental entity or an authorized public safety agency for communication system equipment access and the rate charged to an authorized public safety agency for the lease of communication system equipment shall be the actual incremental costs of the administration, equipment, installation, and maintenance attributable to the specific lease

activity, as determined by the secretary. The lease agreement shall specifically detail the actual incremental costs upon which the rate is based.

(d) The term of each equipment lease agreement shall not exceed the service life of the equipment or 10 years, whichever is less. (Authorized by K.S.A. 2004 Supp. 75-5076; implementing K.S.A. 2004 Supp. 75-5074; effective, T-36-2-18-05, Feb. 18, 2005; effective July 22, 2005.)

36-41-4. Interest rate and service fees. (a) Each equipment lease agreement payment shall include an interest component based on the amortized balance of the cost of the equipment, in accordance with the amortization schedule incorporated in the equipment lease agreement. The interest rate for each equipment lease agreement shall be the published rate in effect on the effective date of the agreement, as that rate is established and published by the secretary on the first day of each month. This rate shall be consistent with the provisions of K.S.A. 10-1009 and amendments thereto.

(b) Any access lease agreement with an authorized governmental entity or an authorized public safety agency and any equipment lease agreement with an authorized public safety agency may include fees for services provided by the department related to the applicable lease agreement, which shall be detailed in the agreement. (Authorized by K.S.A. 2004 Supp. 75-5076; implementing K.S.A. 2004 Supp. 75-5074; effective, T-36-2-18-05, Feb. 18, 2005; effective July 22, 2005.)

36-41-5. Prevailing rates. (a) The rate charged to any authorized nongovernmental entity pursuant to an access lease agreement shall be the prevailing rate in effect on the effective date of the access lease agreement. This rate may include fees determined reasonable by the secretary for services provided by the department related to the access lease agreement.

(b) The prevailing rate to be charged to an authorized nongovernmental entity for communication system equipment access shall be established for the access location sought by that entity for the communication system equipment access. The prevailing rate shall be calculated using the average of rates for similar access and any services related to the access charged by entities other than the entity seeking access and the department, within a 40-mile radius of the location for which access is sought. A good faith effort shall be made by the secretary to secure estimates for the service and access from at least three entities. If estimates from three entities can not be secured within the 40-mile radius, then the radius shall be expanded by the secretary in 10-mile increments until three estimates are received. (Authorized by K.S.A. 2004 Supp. 75-5076; implementing K.S.A. 2004 Supp. 75-5074; effective, T-36-2-18-05, Feb. 18, 2005; effective July 22, 2005.)

Permanent Administrative Regulations

Article 9.—LICENSES, PERMITS, STAMPS, AND OTHER DEPARTMENT ISSUES

115-9-9. Electronic licenses, permits, stamps, tags, and other issues of the department; other requirements. The requirements specified in this regulation shall apply to licenses, permits, stamps, tags, and other issues of the department purchased from electronic or telephone license vendors or by means of a computer network. These requirements shall consist of the following:

(a) Each individual who receives an issue of the department purchased from an electronic or telephone license vendor or by means of a computer network shall sign the issue, attesting that all information on the issue is true and correct.

(b) Each individual who receives a departmental issue from a telephone vendor shall carry the confirmation number while actively engaged in any activity authorized by the departmental issue. When the individual receives the physical copy of any issue received from a telephone vendor, the individual shall sign and carry the physical copy of the departmental issue while actively engaged in any activity authorized by the departmental issue.

(c) Each stamp received from an electronic or telephone license vendor or by means of a computer network shall be validated if the individual signs the issue displaying the valid stamp purchase. The confirmation number of each stamp purchased from a telephone license vendor shall be proof of signature until the individual receives the physical copy of the stamp purchased from the license vendor.

(d) Any current issue of the department that is destroyed or lost may be replaced by an electronic license vendor or by means of a computer network. Each individual whose current issue was destroyed or lost shall sign the new issue, attesting to the destruction or loss of the current issue.

(e) An application form shall not be required for an individual to purchase any issue from an electronic or telephone license vendor or by means of a computer network. The signature on the issue by the individual receiving the issue shall satisfy the signature requirement on application forms.

(f) The removal of the carcass tag from any big game or wild turkey permit or game tag purchased from an electronic license vendor or by means of a computer network shall not invalidate the permit, game tag, or carcass tag for hunting. However, signing any carcass tag before harvesting an animal for which the carcass tag was issued shall invalidate the carcass tag and either the permit or the game tag for use.

(g) Each temporary annual park permit purchased from an electronic or telephone license vendor or by means of a computer network shall be valid only if visibly displayed on the vehicle or camping unit for which the annual park permit was purchased. Each individual with

a temporary annual park permit purchased from an electronic license vendor or by means of a computer network shall exchange the permit for a permanent annual park permit at a department office or automated park license vendor. Permanent Administrative Regulations

Article 15.—LICENSE RENEWAL; CONTINUING EDUCATION

100-15-2. (Authorized by K.S.A. 65-2809, 65-2865; effective Feb. 15, 1977; amended May 1, 1979; revoked July 22, 2005.)

100-15-4. Continuing education standards; definitions. (a) "Continuing education" shall mean an activity designed to maintain, develop, or increase the knowledge, skills, and professional performance of persons licensed to practice a branch of the healing arts. Each continuing education activity shall have significant intellectual or practical content, shall be relevant to the branch of the healing arts for which the practitioner is licensed, and shall meet at least one of the following content requirements:

- (1) Have a direct bearing on patient care;
- (2) have a direct bearing on the person's ability to deliver patient care; or
- (3) relate to the teaching, ethical, legal, or social responsibilities of a person licensed to practice the healing arts.

(b) "Category I" continuing education shall mean a continuing education activity that meets the requirements of subsection (a) of this regulation and is presented by a person qualified by practical or academic experience, using any of the following methods:

- (1) Lecture, which shall mean a discourse given before an audience for instruction;
- (2) panel discussion, which shall mean the presentation of a number of views by several professional individuals on a given subject, with none of the views considered a final solution;
- (3) workshop, which shall mean a series of meetings designed for intensive study, work, or discussion in a specific field of interest;
- (4) seminar, which shall mean a directed advanced study or discussion in a specific field of interest;
- (5) symposium, which shall mean a conference of more than a single session organized for the purpose of discussing a specific subject from various viewpoints and by various speakers; or

(6) any other structured, interactive, and formal learning method that the board deems to meet the requirements of subsection (a).

(c) "Category II" continuing education shall mean attendance at a lecture, panel discussion, workshop, seminar, symposium, college course, professional publication, in-service training, or professional activity that the board determines does not meet the requirements of category I, but that is in a health-related field indirectly related to healing arts skill and knowledge. Category II continuing education shall include the following:

- (1) Clinical consultations with other healing arts practitioners that contribute to a practitioner's education;
- (2) participation in activities to review the quality of patient care;
- (3) instructing healing arts and other health care practitioners;
- (4) patient-centered discussions with other health care practitioners;
- (5) participating in journal clubs;
- (6) using searchable electronic databases in connection with patient care activities; and
- (7) using self-instructional materials.

(d) Credit for continuing education activities shall be awarded on the basis of one credit for each 50 minutes actually spent in attendance at a continuing education activity.

(e) Each instructor of a healing arts continuing education activity shall be awarded category I continuing education credit at the rate of one credit for each three hours of the instructor's first-time preparation of the presentation of a category I continuing education activity.

(f) For successful completion of a postbaccalaureate program awarding a degree in an area related to the healing arts, 25 credits of category I continuing education shall be awarded. A copy of the transcript shall be maintained as proof of successful completion of the program.

(g) For successful completion of one year of postgraduate training, 50 credits of category I continuing education credit shall be awarded.

(h) Any other activity may be approved by the board for category I or category II continuing education upon the board's determination that the activity furthers the ethical and competent practice of the healing arts. (Authorized by K.S.A. 65-2809 and 65-2865; implementing K.S.A. 65-2809; effective July 22, 2005.)

100-15-5. Continuing education requirement. (a) Each person who is licensed to practice a branch of the healing arts and who is required to submit proof of completion of continuing education as a condition to renewing a license shall certify, on a form provided with the license renewal application, that during the 12-month period immediately preceding the license expiration date the person completed at least 50 credits of continuing education, of which at least 20 credits shall be in category I and the remaining credits in category II. This requirement shall not apply to a person renewing a license for the first time.

(b) Each person who applies for conversion of an inactive or exempt license to a regular license or for rein-

statement of a cancelled license and whose license has been inactive, exempt, or cancelled for a period of less than the two-year period immediately preceding the application for conversion shall certify, on a form provided with the conversion or reinstatement application, that the person completed at least 50 credits of continuing education, of which at least 20 credits shall be in category I and the remaining credits in category II.

(c) Any licensee may request that the board grant an extension of the time to complete the required continuing education if, during the 12-month period immediately preceding the license expiration date, the person experienced an undue hardship resulting from illness, injury, or other circumstance preventing the timely completion of continuing education. (Authorized by K.S.A. 65-2809 and 65-2865; implementing K.S.A. 65-2809; effective July 22, 2005.)

100-15-6. Documentation of continuing education. (a) Each person who certifies completion of continuing education shall, for at least three years following the date of certification, maintain documentation of completion that shall include one of the following:

(1) A verification of completion issued by a national, state, or local organization with standards for continuing education that are at least as stringent as the standards of the board;

(2) a copy of the written materials provided with a category I continuing education activity, along with documentation of all of the following:

(A) The name, address, and telephone number of the activity sponsor, and the name and telephone number of a contact person for the activity sponsor;

(B) the title of the continuing education activity;

(C) the date and location of the activity;

(D) specification of whether the activity was presented in person or by video, satellite, or internet;

(E) the number of continuing education hours completed;

(F) the activity agenda;

(G) the identification and professional biographical information of the presenters; and

(H) written proof of participation; or

(3) a list of category II continuing education activities, identifying the date of each activity, a description or program title, and the number of hours claimed.

(b) Within 30 days following a written request by the board to a licensee, the licensee shall provide the board with proof of completion of continuing education as specified in this regulation. (Authorized by K.S.A. 65-2809 and 65-2865; implementing K.S.A. 65-2809; effective July 22, 2005.)

100-15-7. Category I continuing education using distance-learning media. Each continuing education activity offered using distance-learning media shall qualify for category I continuing education credit if the activity meets the requirements in K.A.R. 100-15-4 and meets all of the following conditions:

(a) The activity has a mechanism in place for the user to be able to contact the provider regarding questions about the continuing education activity.

(b) The provider of the activity evaluates the user's knowledge of the subject matter discussed in the continuing education activity.

(c) The activity limits the amount of time within which a user can complete the activity, which shall be no more than twice the number of hours for each credit awarded for the activity.

(d) The person or organization offering the activity provides a printed verification of completion of the activity or allows the user to print verification when the activity is completed. (Authorized by K.S.A. 65-2809 and 65-2865; implementing K.S.A. 65-2865; effective July 22, 2005.)

Article 28a.—PHYSICIAN ASSISTANTS

100-28a-14. Different practice location. (a) "Different practice location" means an office or location that is maintained or utilized by a responsible physician to regularly meet patients or to receive calls and that is not the primary practice location of the responsible physician.

(b) A physician assistant may perform acts that constitute the practice of medicine and surgery at a different practice location only if all of the following conditions are met:

(1) Before providing any services at the different practice location, the physician assistant has spent a minimum of 80 hours since being licensed under the immediate or physical supervision and direction of a physician licensed in this state.

(2) A physician licensed in this state periodically sees and treats patients at the different practice location.

(3) Written notice is conspicuously posted that the different practice location is staffed primarily by a physician assistant. (Authorized by K.S.A. 2004 Supp. 65-28a03; implementing K.S.A. 65-28a08; effective, T-100-2-13-01, Feb. 13, 2001; effective June 1, 2001; amended July 22, 2005.)

100-28a-17. Limitation on number of physician assistants supervised. (a) A responsible physician shall not provide direction and supervision to more than two physician assistants without the board's prior approval.

(b) Each responsible physician wishing to provide direction and supervision to more than two physician assistants shall provide a written and signed request to the board with the following information:

(1) The name of each physician assistant to whom the responsible physician proposes to provide direction and supervision; and

(2) the reason for the request.

(c) The reasons for requesting approval to provide direction and supervision to more than two physician assistants shall include at least one of the following:

(1) The usual number of hours worked each week by one or more of the physician assistants is less than full time.

(2) The usual number of days worked each week by one or more of the physician assistants is less than full time.

(3) One or more of the physician assistants will temporarily leave the responsible physician's direction and supervision. (Authorized by K.S.A. 65-28a03, as amended by L. 2004, Ch. 117, Sec. 17; implementing K.S.A. 65-

28a10, as amended by L. 2004, Ch. 117, Sec. 7; effective July 22, 2005.)

100-28a-18. Physician assistant; ownership of corporation or company. (a) Licensed physician assistants shall not hold more than 49 percent of the total number of shares issued by a professional corporation that is organized to render the professional services of a physician, surgeon or doctor of medicine, or osteopathic physician or surgeon.

(b) Licensed physician assistants shall not contribute more than 49 percent of the total amount of capital to a professional liability company that is organized to render the professional services of a physician, surgeon or doctor of medicine, or osteopathic physician or surgeon. (Authorized by K.S.A. 17-2716 and K.S.A. 2004 Supp. 65-28a13; implementing K.S.A. 2004 Supp. 65-28a13; effective July 22, 2005.)

Article 72.—NATUROPATHY

100-72-6. Professional liability insurance. (a) Each person registered by the board as a naturopathic doctor shall, before rendering professional services within the state, submit to the board evidence that the person is maintaining professional liability insurance coverage as required by K.S.A. 65-7217 and amendments thereto for which the limit of the insurer's liability is not less than \$200,000 per claim, subject to an annual aggregate of not less than \$600,000 for all claims made during the period of coverage.

(b) Each person registered by the board as a naturopathic doctor and rendering professional services in this state shall submit, with the annual application for renewal of the registration, evidence that the person is maintaining the professional liability insurance coverage specified in subsection (a). (Authorized by K.S.A. 65-7203; implementing K.S.A. 2004 Supp. 65-7217; effective, T-100-1-2-03, Jan. 2, 2003; effective May 23, 2003; amended July 22, 2005.)

COMPUTER CASH DRAWING

111-4-2287. Name of drawing. The Kansas lottery shall conduct a drawing entitled "Computer Cash Drawing," and will accept entries on and after the day Kansas lottery "Computer Cash" instant tickets are first offered for sale to the general public and ending on September 27, 2005, as specified in K.A.R. 111-4-2290. The drawing will be held on Friday, September 30, 2005, at the Kansas lottery headquarters in Topeka, Kansas. Rules applicable to the "Computer Cash Drawing" are contained in K.A.R. 111-4-2287 through 111-4-2292 and K.A.R. 111-3-1, *et seq.* (Authorized by and implementing K.S.A. 74-8710; effective, T-111-6-22-05, June 17, 2005.)

111-4-2288. Definitions. (a) All definitions contained in the Kansas lottery act (K.S.A. 74-8701 *et seq.*) and lottery regulations are hereby incorporated by reference and govern unless otherwise indicated.

(b) "Computer Cash Drawing" means the act of drawing prizes conducted by the Kansas Lottery in which participants are selected to win prizes as described in K.A.R. 111-4-2289.

(c) "Non-winning ticket" means any valid Kansas "Computer Cash" instant game lottery ticket not eligible to win a prize under the rules of the "Computer Cash" instant game.

(d) "Receptacle" or "drum" means a container in which non-winning Kansas instant game lottery tickets are placed and from which the "Computer Cash Drawing" entries are drawn. Receptacles or drums may be sealable and shall be capable of being mixed or rotated for the purpose of ensuring random distribution.

(e) "Bare arm technique" means a type of drawing where the person drawing the winning ticket from the receptacle or drum wears a long-sleeved shirt with sleeve rolled up above the elbow, a short-sleeved shirt (sleeve not extending past the elbow) or a no-sleeve shirt which exposes the drawer's bare arm and looks away from the drawing drum or receptacle while drawing. (Authorized by and implementing K.S.A. 74-8710; effective, T-111-6-22-05, June 17, 2005.)

111-4-2289. Prize. (a) The winner of each of 20 grand prizes at the "Computer Cash Drawing," which will be conducted on September 30, 2005, shall receive their choice of one of three computer prize packages, together with mandatory federal and state income withholding taxes, and cash, with each prize having a total cumulative value of approximately \$2,000.00.

(b) All prizes are subject to lottery validation, set-offs and deductions authorized by law.

(c) The winner of a grand prize shall return to the lottery a completed claim form as provided by the lottery no later than 5:00 p.m. on the thirtieth day following the day of the drawing or the person named on the ticket drawn will no longer be eligible for the prize. In such an event, the first eligible alternate entry drawn for that prize pursuant to subsection (e) of K.A.R. 111-4-2291 shall be declared the winner. (Authorized by and implementing K.S.A. 74-8710; effective, T-111-6-22-05, June 17, 2005.)

111-4-2290. Method of entry. (a) Entry into the "Computer Cash Drawing" to be conducted on September 30, 2005, shall be accomplished as follows:

(1) Obtain a valid "Computer Cash" Kansas instant lottery ticket.

(2) Determine if the ticket is a winning ticket in accordance with "Computer Cash" game rules. If the ticket is a winning ticket, it is not eligible for the "Computer Cash Drawing" and shall be redeemed in accordance with the instant game rules.

(3) If the ticket is a valid non-winning ticket, the ticket is eligible for the drawing and the holder of the ticket may use it to enter the "Computer Cash Drawing."

(4) The holder of the non-winning ticket must complete the information form on the back of the ticket in a legible

manner. Only one name shall appear on a non-winning ticket entered.

(5) Players may also deposit entries for the "Computer Cash Drawing" at any Kansas lottery event at which the lottery has specifically designated a receptacle for deposit of said entries.

(6) Entries other than those entered per subsection (a)(5) herein shall be mailed with proper postage to "Computer Cash Drawing," c/o Kansas lottery, P. O. Box 750980, Topeka, Kansas 66675-0980. Mailed entries must be received by morning mail pickup on Tuesday, September 27, 2005. More than one entry may be mailed in one envelope.

(7) The holder of the ticket is not required to personally attend the "Computer Cash Drawing" or be present at the time of the drawing to be determined a winner.

(8) The drawing will be conducted at Kansas lottery headquarters on Friday, September 30, 2005.

(b) There is no limit on the number of entries a person may make, but a person may only win one time in the drawing.

(c) Only valid non-winning "Computer Cash" tickets which are mailed to the "Computer Cash Drawing," c/o Kansas lottery, P. O. Box 750980, Topeka, Kansas 66675-0980 with proper postage and received by the morning mail pickup in Topeka, Kansas, on Tuesday, September 27, 2005, and non-winning "Computer Cash" tickets entered into any other receptacle designated by the lottery as provided in the rules herein shall be eligible for the drawing. All tickets so mailed or deposited shall be secured by the lottery until the drawing is conducted.

(d) Eligible entrants in the "Computer Cash Drawing" must be 18 years of age or older.

(e) Completing the information form on the non-winning ticket and entering the ticket into the drawing constitutes authorization to publicly identify the person whose entry is drawn. (Authorized by and implementing K.S.A. 74-8710; effective, T-111-6-22-05, June 17, 2005.)

111-4-2291. Selection of winners. The following process shall be used for the selection of winners in the "Computer Cash Drawing:"

(a) Kansas lottery personnel shall pick up all mail containing "Computer Cash Drawing" tickets at the United States Post Office in Topeka, Kansas, with the final pickup at the Topeka post office in the morning mail pickup on Tuesday, September 27, 2005. Following the morning mail pickup on Tuesday, September 27, 2005, the envelopes containing mailed entries will be transported to lottery headquarters and opened by lottery personnel. All mailed entries shall then be placed in the drawing receptacle or drum with all entries deposited at the state fair and into any other receptacle designated by the lottery.

(b) The drawing shall be held at the Kansas lottery headquarters and shall be open to the public with lottery security personnel present. The drawing shall be audio and video taped.

(c) At the final drawing on Friday, September 30, 2005, lottery security personnel will be present with the person designated by the executive director to perform the drawing. Prior to the drawing, if a drum is used, the drum shall be sealed and the contents mixed by rotating the

drum at least 10 times. If a receptacle other than a drum is used, the contents shall be thoroughly mixed with a shovel or by other means.

(d) The designated individual shall then unseal the drum, if a drum is used, and using the bare-arm technique, while looking away, remove a single entry from the receptacle or drum. The person whose name appears on the entry shall be the winner of one of the grand prizes identified in K.A.R. 111-4-2289, subject to validation by the lottery as set forth in these rules. This process shall be repeated for the remaining 19 grand prizes.

(e) After 20 entries have been drawn on September 30, 2005, and the entries have been verified as valid, five more valid entries will be drawn, one at a time to serve as alternate entries for the grand prizes. The alternate entries will be marked in order drawn, 1A, 2A, 3A, 4A, and 5A. Each winner shall have until 5:00 p.m. on the thirtieth day following the drawing to present the fully-executed claim form to lottery headquarters. If a grand prize winner cannot be located or is declared ineligible, or fails to timely present a fully-executed claim form to lottery headquarters, the grand prize will be awarded to the first alternate entry drawn. The alternates will be used, if necessary, in the order drawn.

(f) The Kansas lottery security official present shall review each ticket drawn to determine the validity of the entry into the "Computer Cash Drawing" in accordance with these regulations. If it is a valid entry and the name is legible, the event manager and the security person present shall record the name of the winner and the prize won. The prize winners shall be given or sent a prize claim form to be completed and returned as set forth in subsection (e) herein.

(g) If any entry drawn is determined to be ineligible, it shall be discarded by the security person present and another entry drawn. This procedure will be repeated until the required number of apparently eligible selections is obtained.

(h) Only non-winning "Computer Cash" instant tickets are eligible for the drawing.

(i) All "Computer Cash" tickets remaining in the drum or receptacle on September 30, 2005, after the winners and alternatives have been selected, and all entries not received in compliance with these rules, shall be destroyed pursuant to K.A.R. 111-3-34. (Authorized by and implementing K.S.A. 74-8710; effective, T-111-6-22-05, June 17, 2005.)

111-4-2292. Certification of drawing. (a) The "Computer Cash Drawing" shall be personally observed by a member of the Kansas lottery security department and a member of the Kansas lottery marketing department or other person or persons designated by the executive director of the lottery.

(b) Upon completion of the drawing, the security official and the event manager shall issue a report to the executive director, certifying that the name of each prize winner is correct, and that to the best of their knowledge the procedures required by these rules were followed in selecting the prize winners. (Authorized by and implementing K.S.A. 74-8710; effective, T-111-6-22-05, June 17, 2005.)

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
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
