Administrative Regulations**

A public hearing will be conducted at 9 a.m. Tuesday, October 25, in the State Conservation Commission's conference room, 109 S.W. 9th, Suite 500, Topeka, to consider the revocation of proposed permanent regulations of the State Conservation Commission Irrigation Transition Assistance Program (ITAP).

This 60-day notice constitutes a public comment period for the purpose of receiving written public comments on the proposed regulations. Comments may be sent to the State Conservation Commission, 109 S.W. 9th, Suite 500, Topeka, 66612-1299, prior to the hearing date. All interested parties will be given an opportunity to express their views during the hearing. The State Conservation Commission will consider all written and oral comments submitted by interested parties as a basis for approving, amending and approving or rejecting a proposed regulation.

Any individual with a disability may request accommodation in order to participate in the public hearing and may request the proposed regulations and economic impact statements in an accessible format. Requests for accommodation should be made at least five working days in advance of the hearing by contacting Scott Carlson at (785) 296-6803.

The regulations for revocation address the expenditure and accountability of State Water Plan special revenue funds and, if available, federal funds. The regulations address the administration of a grant program targeted to retire irrigation water rights. The Irrigation Transition Assistance Program (ITAP) is a result of 2004 Kansas legislative action that directed the commission to develop Kansas administrative regulations under the authority of K.S.A. 2-1915 and 2-1919 to receive and disburse irrigation assistance grant funds providing an incentive for water right holders to transition from irrigated to dry land production or permanent vegetation. Grantees would have their contracted water rights permanently dismissed. The goal of the program is to provide another tool in meeting the water management goals of the state and local units of government in restoring stream flows and reducing aquifer decline in priority areas. Funding for the ITAP could either be federal, state or local.

A summary of the regulations considered for revocation and the economic impact follows:

**K.A.R. 11-11-1 through 11-11-7. Irrigation Transition Assistance Program.** These proposed regulations address the eligibility requirements and contracting procedures

between the State Conservation Commission and applicants. There are no economic impacts on other governmental agencies or the public as this program was never implemented due to no appropriations.

The Kansas Department of Health and Environment is soliciting comments regarding a proposed air quality operating permit. Regency Gas Services, Lakin Gas Plant, has applied for a Class I operating permit renewal in accordance with the provisions of K.A.R. 28-19-510 et seq. The purpose of a Class I permit is to identify the sources and types of regulated air pollutants emitted from the facility; the emission limitations, standards and requirements applicable to each source; and the monitoring, record keeping and reporting requirements applicable to each source as of the effective date of permit issuance.

Regency Gas Services, Lakin Gas Plant, 401 Edwards St., Suite 1300, Shreveport, Louisiana, owns and operates Natural Gas Liquid located at S29, T24S, R36W, Kearny County, Kansas.

A copy of the proposed permit, permit application, all supporting documentation and all information relied upon during the permit application review process is available for a 30-day public review during normal business hours at the KDHE, Bureau of Air and Radiation, 1000 S.W. In order to be considered in formulating a final permit decision, written comments must be received before the close of business September 12.

A person may request a public hearing be held on the proposed permit. The request for a public hearing shall be in writing and set forth the basis for the request. The written request must be submitted to Christy Thurman, Bureau of Air and Radiation, not later than the close of

business September 12 in order for the Secretary of Health and Environment to consider the request.

The U.S. Environmental Protection Agency has a 45-day review period, which will start concurrently with the 30-day public comment period, within which to object to the proposed permit. If the EPA has not objected in writing to the issuance of the permit within the 45-day review period, any person may petition the administrator of the EPA to review the permit. The 60-day public petition period will directly follow the EPA's 45-day review period. Interested parties may contact KDHE to determine if the EPA's 45-day review period has been waived.

Any such petition shall be based only on objections to the permit that were raised with reasonable specificity during the public comment period provided for in this notice, unless the petitioner demonstrates that it was impracticable to raise such objections within such period, or unless the grounds for such objection arose after such period. ## Request for Proposals

The Kansas Department of Health and Environment Tobacco Use Prevention Program announces that a total of \$1,000,000 is available to communities for the implementation of comprehensive community-based tobacco control programs. Communities will be selected through a competitive application process for funding beginning approximately October 1, 2005 and ending June 30, 2006. Eligible applicants include those who have a comprehensive tobacco control plan, based on the CDC's *Best Practices*, and who can describe their state of readiness to implement the plan. Grant funds must be used for focused strategies to change systems, develop and implement policies to change the environment in which tobacco use occurs, and impact population groups rather than individuals.

Eligible applicants are the local health agency, to serve as project lead on behalf of the community. If the health department wishes to designate a partner organization to serve as the local lead agency, the application must include a letter from the local health department stating that it has designated another agency to be the applicant.

**Article 10.—ANIMAL HEALTH**

**112-10-5. Authorized medications.** (a) Furosemide may be administered to any horse that is entered in a race meeting, subject to the requirements of these racing regulations. Except upon the instructions of the animal health officer or an assistant animal health officer to remove the horse from the veterinarian's list or to facilitate the collection of a post-race urine sample, the administration of furosemide shall be permitted only if all of the following requirements are met.

(1) The animal health officer or an assistant animal health officer shall place the horse's name on the bleeder list or the furosemide list, or on both lists.

(2) The furosemide shall be administered at a location approved by the animal health officer or an assistant animal health officer and at least four hours before post time for the race in which each horse is entered, unless otherwise authorized in advance by the animal health officer or assistant animal health officer.

(3) Furosemide shall be administered only by a practicing veterinarian designated by the trainer to administer the furosemide to each horse under the supervision of the animal health officer or an assistant animal health officer.

(4) No dose of furosemide administered shall exceed 250 milligrams, unless otherwise authorized in advance by the animal health officer or an assistant animal health officer. In addition to the dosage restriction specified in this paragraph, furosemide shall be administered only intravenously and only in a single injection.

(5) Each horse to which furosemide is administered shall remain under the care, custody, and control of the trainer or the designated representative from the time the furosemide is administered until the time for the horse to be removed to the saddling paddock.

*(continued)*

(6) Each owner shall pay all expenses resulting from the administration of furosemide. These costs shall include the following:

- (A) Administration;
- (B) injection;
- (C) laryngoscopic examination;
- (D) custody; and
- (E) security.

(7) The use of furosemide shall be required to be approved in advance and shall be subject to the following requirements:

(A) The specific gravity of post-race urine samples shall be measured to ensure that the specific gravity (sg) of the urine is 1.010 or higher. If the sg of the post-race urine sample is below 1.010, quantitation of furosemide in serum or plasma shall then be performed.

(B) When a serum or plasma sample is quantitated, the concentration of furosemide in the sample shall not exceed 100 nanograms per milliliter of serum or plasma. Each concentration above 100 ng/ml shall be deemed a violation of this regulation.

(b) No person shall administer a medication to any horse entered to race except upon authorization of the animal health officer or assistant animal health officer in compliance with these regulations.

(c) No medication other than authorized bleeder medication shall be administered to any horse entered to race within 24 hours of the race in which the horse is entered.

(d)(1) No more than one approved nonsteroidal anti-inflammatory drug (NSAID) substance may be administered to a horse that is entered to race. The NSAID administered shall be one of the following authorized drug substances:

(A) Phenylbutazone in a dosage amount so that the test sample taken after the race contains no more than 5.0 micrograms of drug substance per milliliter of blood plasma or serum;

(B) flunixin in a dosage amount so that the test sample taken after the race contains no more than 20 nanograms of drug substance per milliliter of blood plasma or serum; or

(C) ketoprofen in a dosage amount so that the test sample taken after the race contains no more than 10 nanograms per milliliter of blood plasma or serum.

(2) Each trainer shall file a request for the use of any authorized NSAID with the animal health officer or an assistant animal health officer on an official request form approved by the animal health officer before the horse is entered in a race. #### Article 25.—TECHNICAL REQUIREMENTS FOR WEIGHING AND MEASURING DEVICES

**99-25-1. Adoption by reference, exceptions; availability of copies.** (a) Except for the codes pertaining to grain moisture meters, secs. 5.56(a) and 5.56(b), and the use requirements for ticket printers on vehicle-tank meters, sec. 3.31.UR.2, the "specifications, tolerances, and other technical requirements for weighing and measuring devices, as adopted by the 88th national conference on weights and measures 2004," published by the national institute of standards and technology, Washington, D.C., as the 2004 edition of the national institute of standards and technology handbook 44 and issued in November 2003, is hereby adopted by reference and shall apply to commercial, data-gathering, and weighing and measuring devices in the state.

(b) Vehicle-mounted metering systems manufactured on or after January 1, 1995 shall be equipped with a ticket printer. A copy of the ticket issued by the vehicle-mounted metering system shall be given to the customer at the time of delivery or as otherwise specified by the customer.

(c) Copies of the handbook adopted by this regulation or pertinent portions from it shall be available from the office of weights and measures, Kansas department of agriculture, Topeka, Kansas. (Authorized by K.S.A. 2004 Supp. 55-442 and K.S.A. 83-207; implementing K.S.A. 2004 Supp. 55-442, K.S.A. 83-207, K.S.A. 83-215, K.S.A. 2004 Supp. 83-304, and K.S.A. 2004 Supp. 83-404; effective May 1, 1979; amended May 1, 1981; amended May 1, 1986; amended Aug. 14, 1989; amended Oct. 21, 1991; amended March 6, 1998; amended March 5, 1999; amended Jan. 18, 2002; amended Aug. 26, 2005.)

**99-25-9. Adoption by reference.** Except as specified in subsection (c), the following uniform regulations published by the national institute of standards and technology, Washington, D.C., in the 2004 edition of national institute of standards and technology handbook 130 titled "uniform laws and regulations in the areas of legal metrology and engine fuel quality, as adopted by the 88th national conference on weights and measures 2003," and issued in October 2003, are hereby adopted by reference and shall apply to weighing and measuring devices in the state:

(a) "Uniform packaging and labeling regulation";

(b) "uniform regulation for the method of sale of commodities"; and

(c) "uniform engine fuels, petroleum products, and automotive lubricants regulation," except for the following sections:

(1) Sec. 2.2, which pertains to diesel fuel. However, this exception to the adoption by reference shall be in effect only through December 31, 2005; and

(2) secs. 3.2.6 and 3.8, which pertain to oxygenates and fuel ethanol.

Copies of the adopted material or the pertinent portions of it shall be available from the office of weights and measures, Kansas department of agriculture, Topeka, Kansas. **99-25-10. Retail dispenser labeling.** Each retail dispenser of fuel ethanol shall be labeled with the capital letter "E" followed by the percentage of denatured ethanol, by volume, and ending with the word "ethanol" if the percentage of fuel ethanol, by volume, exceeds 10 percent. (Authorized by and implementing K.S.A. 2004 Supp. 55-442; effective Aug. 26, 2005.)

##### Article 2.—LOTTERY RETAILERS

**111-2-177. Hummer's Market Chain No. 1625 and Retailer Nos. 14713 and 15661 \$5 and \$10 instant ticket promotion.** (a) During the period beginning August 1, 2005, and ending August 31, 2005, in addition to compensation provided for in K.A.R. 111-2-4, the Kansas lottery also offers all participating Hummer's Market lottery retailers located in Kansas an opportunity to participate in a \$5 and \$10 instant ticket sales promotion.

(b) At the end of the promotion, the store with the greatest percentage increase in \$5 and \$10 instant ticket sales for the period August 1, 2005, through August 31, 2005, over the base sales period of March 1, 2004, through March 31, 2004, will win a \$300 credit on the retailer's lottery account. The store with the second greatest percentage increase in \$5 and \$10 instant ticket sales for the period from August 1, 2005, through August 31, 2005, over the base sales period of March 1, 2004, through March 31, 2004, will win a \$50 credit on the retailer's lottery account. The store with the third greatest percentage increase in \$5 and \$10 instant ticket sales for the period from August 1, 2005, through August 31, 2005, over the base sales period of March 1, 2004, through March 31, 2004, will win a \$25 credit on the retailer's lottery account. Promotional items chosen by the lottery will also be awarded to all retail locations which show an increase in \$5 and \$10 instant tickets over the base period. (Authorized by and implementing K.S.A. 74-8710 and K.S.A. 74-8708; effective, T-111-7-29-05, July 15, 2005.)

**111-2-178. Hummer's Market "Ask for the sale" promotion.** (a) During the period beginning August 8, 2005, and ending August 12, 2005, in addition to compensation provided for in K.A.R. 111-2-4, the Kansas lottery also offers all Hummer's Market stores located in Kansas an opportunity to participate in a bonus retailer "ask for the sale" incentive promotion of lottery tickets.

(b) Every day beginning August 8, 2005, through August 12, 2005, Hummer's Market store personnel selling Kansas lottery tickets will ask every adult customer making a purchase if the customer would like to purchase a lottery ticket. If the employee fails to ask adult customers for the purchase of a lottery ticket and the customer brings it to the clerk's attention before leaving the premises, the retailer shall give the adult customer one \$1.00 instant lottery ticket at no charge.

(c) All retailer employees at each location shall wear promotional buttons and display special point-of-sale materials provided by the lottery each day during the promotion announcing the promotion to its customers. These promotional materials consist of:

(1) A tent card to be displayed at the point where tickets are sold.

(2) A window/monitor banner to be displayed at the front entrance of the business and/or below the lottery information display system monitor.

(continued)

These materials must be on display during all hours of the promotion at the times and dates established in subsections (b) and (c) for a store to be eligible for a prize.

(d) Any tickets given away above the \$35 allowance representing 35 tickets per location will be the responsibility of Hummer’s Market.

(e) Each retail location shall maintain a ticket log form to be completed every time a lottery ticket is given away. The log will be picked up by the Kansas lottery district manager servicing the retailer location at the end of the promotion. If all terms of the promotion have been complied with by the retail location, \$35 will be credited to the retailer’s lottery account. (Authorized by K.S.A. 74-8710; implementing K.S.A. 74-8710 and K.S.A. 74-8708; effective, T-111-7-29-05, July 15, 2005.)

**Article 5.—MULTI-STATE ON-LINE GAMES**

**111-5-23. Definitions.** The following definitions shall apply to the "Powerball" game:

(a) "Computer pick" means the random selection of two-digit numbers by the computer system, which appear on a ticket and are played by a player in the game.

(b) "Drawing" means the formal process of selecting winning numbers which determine the number of winners for each prize level of the game.

(c) "Game board" or "boards" means that area of the play slip which contains two sets of numbered squares to be marked by the player, the first set containing 55 squares, number one through 55, and the second set containing 42 squares, number one through 42.

(d) "Game ticket" or "ticket" means a computer generated ticket issued by a terminal to a person as a receipt for the combination a person has selected.

(e) "MUSL" means the Multi-State Lottery Association, a government-benefit association wholly owned and operated by the party lotteries.

(f) "MUSL Board" means the governing body of the MUSL which is comprised of the chief executive officer of each party lottery.

(g) "Power play" or "multiplier option" means the "Powerball" game option whereby a player may elect to pay an additional \$1 per play at the time of ticket purchase which will have the effect of multiplying any prize

won on the play, except the grand prize and the match 5 bonus prize, by a factor of two, three, four, or five.

(h) "On-line lottery game" means a lottery game connected by telephone lines or other similar communication methodology, owned or controlled by the lottery, to a central computer in which each player selects numbers out of a larger predetermined set or sets of numbers.

(i) "Party Lottery" means a state lottery or lottery of a political subdivision or entity which has joined the MUSL and, in the context of these Powerball product group rules, which has joined in selling the Powerball game.

(j) "Product group" means the group of lotteries which has joined together to offer a product pursuant to the terms of the multi-state lottery agreement and the group's own rules.

(k) "Play" means the six numbers, the first five from a field of 55 numbers and the last one from a field of 42 numbers, that appear on a ticket as a single lettered selection and are to be played by a player in the game.

(l) "Play slip" means a card used in marking a player's game plays and containing one or more boards and if the multiplier option is available for play, the play slip shall include a box to mark if the option is chosen.

(m) "Retailer" or "agent" means a person or entity authorized by the Kansas lottery to sell lottery tickets.

(n) "Set Prize" means all other prizes except the grand prize that are advertised to be paid by a single cash payment and, except in rare instances, outlined in these rules, will be equal to the prize amount established by the MUSL Board for the prize level.

(o) "Terminal" means a device authorized by a party lottery to function in an on-line, interactive mode with the lottery's computer system for the purpose of issuing lottery tickets and entering, receiving and processing lottery transactions, including purchases, validating tickets and transmitting reports.

(p) "Validation" or "validate" means the process of determining whether a ticket presented for a prize is a winning ticket.

(q) "Winning numbers" means the six numbers, the first five from a field of 55 numbers and the last one from a field of 42 numbers, randomly selected at each drawing which shall be used to determine winning plays contained on a game ticket, and in the event the multiplier option is available, one additional number randomly selected from a field of the following 16 numbers: 2, 2, 2, 2, 3, 3, 3, 3, 4, 4, 4, 4, 5, 5, 5, and 5. The Powerball product group may change one or more of these multiplier numbers for special promotions from time to time.

(r) These amendments shall take effect August 28, 2005. **111-5-24. Game description; retail sale of tickets.**

(a) "Powerball" is a five out of 55 plus one out of 42 on-line lottery game which pays the grand prize, at the election of the player made in accordance with the rules or by a default election made in accordance with these rules

at the time of play purchase, either on an annuitized parimutuel basis, or as a cash lump sum payment of the total cash held for this prize on a parimutuel basis. Except as provided in these rules, all other prizes are paid on a set cash basis. To play "Powerball" a player shall select five different numbers from one to 55 and one additional number from one to 42 for input into a terminal. The additional number may be the same as one of the first five numbers selected by the player.

(b) A "Powerball" game ticket shall sell for one dollar.

(c) Tickets shall not be sold to any person under the age of 18 years. Each retailer may require a person purchasing tickets to produce proof of age.

(d) Each ticket shall be purchased from a terminal operated by a retailer. The player may select a set of five numbers and one additional number by:

(1) communicating the six numbers to the retailer;

(2) marking six numbered squares in any one game board on a play slip and submitting the play slip to the retailer; or

(3) requesting a "computer pick" or "quick pick" from the retailer. If available at the time, a player may choose the multiplier option by marking the appropriate box on the play slip or by communicating to the retailer the desire to play the multiplier option. If the multiplier option is chosen, it shall apply to all boards played on that play slip. For each play upon which the multiplier option is chosen, the player shall pay one additional dollar. The retailer shall then issue a ticket from the terminal containing the selected set or sets of numbers, each of which constitutes a game play, and if applicable, whether or not the multiplier option has been chosen for all plays on that play slip.

(e) A validated ticket shall be the only proof of a game play or plays. The only method of claiming a prize or prizes shall be the submission of the winning ticket to and receipt of the ticket by the lottery or its authorized agent. A play slip shall have no pecuniary or prize value and shall not be used as evidence of a ticket purchase or of numbers selected.

(f) A ticket shall not be voided or cancelled by returning the ticket to the selling retailer, including tickets that are printed in error.

(g) Ticket sales will end at approximately 8:59 p.m. central time on Wednesdays and Saturdays and will resume at approximately 9:05 p.m.

(h) Drawings will be conducted twice weekly, on Wednesdays and Saturdays at approximately 9:58 p.m. central time (CT), after the game is closed at approximately 8:59 p.m. central time (CT) and the external auditor has verified that the game is closed, under conditions and procedures promulgated by the executive director of the lottery.

(i) Each player shall be responsible for verifying the accuracy of the game play or plays and other data printed on the ticket. The placing of plays is done at the player's own risk through the on-line retailer who is deemed to be acting on behalf of the player in entering the play or plays.

**111-5-25. Prize pool; reserve account.** (a) The prize pool for all prize categories shall consist of up to 49.3% of each drawing period's sales, including tax, after the prize reserve accounts are funded to the amounts set by the product group. Any amount remaining in the prize pool at the end of this game shall be carried forward to a replacement game or expended in a manner as directed by the product group.

(b) Two percent of sales shall be placed in trust in one or more prize reserve accounts until the prize reserve accounts reach the amount designated by the MUSL board. When the prize reserve accounts exceed the designated amount, the excess shall become part of the prize pool. Any amount remaining in prize reserve accounts at the end of this game shall be carried forward to a replacement prize reserve account or expended in a manner as directed by the product group in accordance with state law.

**111-5-26. Expected prize payout parimutuel prizes.** (a) The grand prize shall be determined on a parimutuel basis. Except as provided in these rules, all other prizes awarded shall be paid as set cash prizes with the following expected approximate prize payout percentages:

(b) The prize money allocated to the grand prize category shall be divided equally by the number of game boards winning the grand prize.

(c) The prize pool percentage allocated to the set prizes (the cash prizes of \$200,000 or less) shall be carried forward to subsequent draws if all or a portion of it is not needed to pay the set prizes awarded in the current draw. If the total of the set prizes awarded in a drawing exceeds

the percentage of the prize pool allocated to the set prizes, then the amount needed to fund the set prizes awarded shall be drawn from the following sources, in the following order: (1) the amount allocated to the set prizes and carried forward from previous draws, if any; (2) an amount from the prize reserve account, if available, not to exceed twenty-five million dollars (\$25,000,000) per drawing. If, after these sources are depleted, there are not sufficient funds to pay the set prizes awarded, then the highest set prize shall become a pari-mutuel prize. If the amount of the highest set prize, when paid on a pari-mutuel basis, drops to or below the next highest set prize and there are still not sufficient funds to pay the remaining set prizes awarded, then the next highest set prize shall become a pari-mutuel prize. This procedure shall continue down through all set prize levels, if necessary, until all set prize levels become pari-mutuel prize levels. In that instance the money available from the funding sources listed in this rule shall be divided among the winning plays in proportion to their respective prize percentages.

(d) For each drawing when the grand prize annuity is projected to reach a new record level, increases in the amount of the grand prize shall be limited to no more than \$25,000,000. All money allocated to the grand prize pool not necessary to fund said maximum \$25,000,000 increase shall instead be allocated to the match five of 55 prize level prize pool. At such time as one or more boards entitle the holder(s) to win the grand prize, all boards selected in the same drawing that entitle the holder(s) to win a match five of 55 prize shall win \$200,000, plus a pari-mutuel share of all accumulated additional money allocated hereinabove to the match five of 55 prize level. This additional prize shall be known as the match 5 bonus.

(e) If the match 5 bonus has been funded, the prize pool percentage allocated to the grand prize will be less than stated above, and the prize pool percentage allocated to the match five of 55 prize will be greater than stated above.

(f) If in the drawing wherein the match 5 bonus has been funded and one or more boards did not match five of 55 numbers, then the match 5 bonus prize pool shall be divided on a pari-mutuel basis between all boards matching the numbers for the four of 55 plus one of 42 prize level.

If the multiplier option is played, the prize won on that play, except for the grand prize and match 5 bonus prize, shall be multiplied by the multiplier option number selected for that game.

**111-5-28. Prize payments; annuitized and cash prizes.** (a) Grand prizes shall be paid, at the election of the player made no later than 60 days after the player becomes entitled to a prize with either a per winner annuity or cash payment. If the payment election is not made at the time of purchase and is not made by the player within 60 days after the player becomes entitled to the prize, then the prize shall be paid as an annuity prize. An election for an annuity payment made by a player before ticket purchase or by system default or design may be changed to a cash payment at the election of the player until the expiration of 60 days after the player becomes entitled to the prize. The election to take the cash payment may be made at the time of the prize claim or within 60 days after the player becomes entitled to the prize. An election made after the winner becomes entitled to the prize is final and cannot be revoked, withdrawn or otherwise changed. Shares of the grand prize shall be determined by dividing the cash available in the grand prize pool equally among all winners of the grand prize. Winner(s) who elected a cash payment shall be paid their share(s) in a single cash payment. The annuitized option prize shall be determined by multiplying a winner's share of the grand prize pool by the MUSL annuity factor. The MUSL annuity factor is determined by the best total securities price obtained through a competitive bid of qualified, pre-approved brokers made after it is determined that the prize is to be paid as an annuity prize or after the expiration of 60 days after the winner becomes entitled to the prize. Neither MUSL nor the party lotteries shall



be responsible or liable for changes in the advertised or estimated annuity prize amount and the actual amount purchased after the prize payment method is actually known to MUSL. In certain instances announced by the product group, the grand prize shall be a guaranteed amount and shall be determined pursuant to subsection (f) of K.A.R. 111-5-28. If individual shares of the cash held to fund an annuity are less than \$250,000, the product group, in its sole discretion, may elect to pay the winners their share of the cash held in the grand prize pool of the annuity. All annuitized prizes shall be paid annually in 30 equal payments with the initial payment being made in cash, to be followed by 29 payments funded by the annuity. All annuitized prizes shall be paid annually in thirty (30) graduated payments (increasing each year) by a rate as determined by the product group. Prize payments may be rounded down to the nearest one-thousand dollars (\$1,000). Annual payments after the initial payment shall be made by the lottery on the anniversary date, or if such date falls on a non-business day, then on the first business day following the anniversary date of the selection of the jackpot winning numbers. Funds for the initial payment of an annuitized prize shall be made available by MUSL for payment by a party lottery by the fifteenth calendar day following the drawing or the next banking day if the fifteenth day is a holiday. A state may elect to make the initial payment from its own funds after validation, with notice to MUSL.

(b) In the event of the death of a lottery winner during the annuity payment period, the product group, in its sole discretion, upon the petition of the estate of the lottery winner to the Kansas lottery, may accelerate the payment of all of the remaining lottery proceeds to the estate. If the product group makes such a determination, then securities and/or cash held to fund the deceased lottery winner's annuitized prize, may be distributed to the estate. The identification of the securities to fund the annuitized prize shall be at the sole discretion of the product group.

(c) All low tier cash prizes, which are all prizes except the grand prize, shall be paid in cash through the party lottery which sold the winning ticket(s). A party lottery may begin paying low-tier cash prizes after receiving authorization to pay from the MUSL central office.

(d) Annuitized payments of the grand prize or a share of the grand prize may be rounded to facilitate the purchase of an appropriate funding mechanism. Breakage on an annuitized grand prize win shall be added to the first cash payment to the winner or winners. Prizes other than the grand prize, which, under these rules, may become single-payment, pari-mutuel prizes, may be rounded down so that prizes can be paid in multiples of whole dollars. Breakage resulting from rounding these prizes shall be carried forward to the prize pool for the next drawing.

(e) If the grand prize is not won in a drawing, the prize money allocated for the grand prize shall roll over and

be added to the grand prize pool for the following drawing.

(f) The product group may offer guaranteed minimum grand prize amounts or minimum increases in the grand prize amount between drawings or make other changes in the allocation of prize money where the product group finds that it would be in the best interest of the game. If a minimum grand prize amount or a minimum increase in the grand prize amount between drawings is offered by the product group, then the grand prize shares shall be determined as follows. If there are multiple grand prize winners during a single drawing, each selecting the annuitized option prize, then a winner's share of the guaranteed annuitized grand prize shall be determined by dividing the guaranteed annuitized grand prize by the number of winners. If there are multiple grand prize winners during a single drawing and at least one of the grand prize winners has elected the annuitized option prize, then the best bid submitted by MUSL's pre-approved qualified brokers shall determine the cash pool needed to fund the guaranteed annuitized grand prize. If no winner of the grand prize during a single drawing has elected the annuitized option prize, then the amount of cash in the grand prize pool shall be an amount equal to the guaranteed annuitized amount divided by the average annuity factor of the most recent three best quotes provided by MUSL's pre-approved qualified brokers submitting quotes. In no case, shall quotes be used which are more than two weeks old and if less than three quotes are submitted, then MUSL shall use the average of all quotes submitted. Changes in the allocation of prize money shall be designed to retain approximately the same prize allocation percentages, over a year's time, set out in these rules. Minimum guaranteed prizes or increases may be waived if the alternate funding mechanism set out in K.A.R. 111-5-26 becomes necessary.

(g) The holder of a winning ticket may win only one prize per board in connection with the winning numbers drawn, and shall be entitled only to the prize won by those numbers in the highest matching prize category.

(h) All prizes must be claimed within 365 days of the day of the drawing in which the prize was won.
