Administrative Regulations**

The Behavioral Sciences Regulatory Board will conduct a public hearing from 2:30 to 3:30 p.m. Wednesday, December 21, in the board conference room, 712 S. Kansas Ave., Topeka, to consider adopting proposed amendments to permanent rules and regulations for psychology.

This 60-day notice of the public hearing constitutes a public comment period for the purpose of receiving written public comments on the proposed amendments. All interested parties may submit written comments prior to the hearing to Phyllis Gilmore, Executive Director, Behavioral Sciences Regulatory Board, 712 S. Kansas Ave., Topeka, 66603-3817. Written comments also may be submitted by fax at (785) 296-3112 or by e-mail at phyllis.gilmore@bsrb.state.ks.us.

All interested parties will be given a reasonable opportunity to present their views orally at the hearing. In order to give all parties an opportunity to present their views, it may be necessary to request each participant to limit any oral presentation to five minutes.

The following is a summary of the proposed amendments and economic impact statement. The board does not have a less costly or less intrusive method for achieving the stated purpose of each regulation.

**K.A.R. 102-1-5a** contains the requirements for predoctoral and postdoctoral supervision for licensure as a psychologist. These changes clarify current requirements.

**Economic Impact:** There would be no change in the economic impact to the Kansas Behavioral Sciences Regulatory Board, other governmental agencies, the public, applicants or licensees.

**K.A.R. 102-1-12** contains the educational requirements for licensure as a psychologist. These changes clarify current requirements, define residency requirements and specify course work that shall be completed while in residence.

**Economic Impact:** There would be no change in the economic impact to the Kansas Behavioral Sciences Regulatory Board, other governmental agencies, the public, applicants or licensees.

The Kansas Department of Transportation is seeking qualified consulting engineering firms for the project listed below. The committee will select the firm to perform the professional services required for completing the advertised project. The scope of services is to provide a highway/railroad safety study of improvement alternatives for the BNSF Railway mainline crossings in the city of Fort Scott. Each

safety alternative investigated will measure the positive and negative impacts to the city of Fort Scott. Improvement alternatives should include all ranges of improvement strategies available, including but not limited to: grade separations, active flashing light and gate warning systems, crossing closures, construction of connecting roads, automated horn system, adjacent highway traffic signal improvements, adjacent highway traffic signal interconnection with highway/railroad signal systems and pedestrian crossings. Three specific alternatives to be investigated are (1) best future location for additional grade separation, (2) determine feasibility of increasing vertical clearance at Third Street underpass, and (3) recommend feasible supplementary safety measures to allow for a locomotive horn quiet zone.

Impacts of the safety alternatives should be evaluated with both objective and subjective measures. Measures to be used in evaluating the alternatives should include but not be limited to: estimated construction costs, vehicular travel and delay times, emergency services access, predicted accident rates, train operations, access to public services, access to private properties, impacts to historical features and pedestrian mobility.

The study shall be completed within nine months of the consultant receiving the notice to proceed.

It is KDOT's policy to use the following criteria as the basis for selection of the consulting engineering firms:

1. Size and professional qualifications;
2. experience of staff;
3. location of firm with respect to proposed project;
4. work load of firm; and
5. firm's performance record.

The Kansas Department of Health and Environment is soliciting comments regarding a proposed air quality construction permit. Kansas City Power and Light Company has applied for an air quality construction permit in accordance with the provisions of K.A.R. 28-19-300 to modify the La Cygne Generating Station Unit Number 1 by installing a selective catalytic reduction system to reduce oxides of nitrogen (NOx) emissions. Emissions of particulate matter (PM), PM equal to or less than 10 microns in diameter (PM<sub>10</sub>), volatile organic compounds (VOCs), oxides of nitrogen (NOx), sulfur oxides (SOx) and carbon monoxide (CO) were evaluated during the permit review process.

Kansas City Power and Light, Kansas City, Missouri, owns and operates a coal-fired electric generating station located at 25166 E. 2200 Road, La Cygne, Kansas.

A public comment period has been established until November 14 to allow citizens the opportunity to express any concerns or comments they may have about this permitting action. KDHE has tentatively scheduled a public hearing at 7 p.m. November 14 at the Community Building, 204 Commercial, Lacygne, to receive comments on the proposed issuance of the draft air quality construction permit. All comments should be submitted in writing to Dana S. Morris, Bureau of Air and Radiation, 1000 S.W. Jackson, Suite 310, Topeka, 66612-1366, or at the public hearing.

Request for Comments

The Kansas Department of Health and Environment is soliciting comments regarding a proposed air quality operating permit. Aquila - Clifton Station has applied for a Class I operating permit renewal in accordance with the provisions of K.A.R. 28-19-510 et seq. The purpose of a Class I permit is to identify the sources and types of regulated air pollutants emitted from the facility; the emission limitations, standards and requirements applicable to each source; and the monitoring, record keeping and reporting requirements applicable to each source as of the effective date of permit issuance.

Aquila - Clifton Station, 105 S. Victoria, Pueblo, Colorado, owns and operates an electrical generation facility located at 319 Eagle Road, Clifton, Kansas.

A copy of the proposed permit, permit application, all supporting documentation and all information relied upon during the permit application review process is available for a 30-day public review during normal business hours at the KDHE, Bureau of Air and Radiation, 1000 S.W. Jackson, Suite 310, Topeka; and a copy of the proposed permit can be reviewed at the KDHE North Central District Office, 2501 Market Place, Suite D, Salina. To obtain or review the proposed permit and supporting documentation, contact Jeffrey C. The standard departmental cost will be assessed for any copies requested.

Direct written comments or questions regarding the proposed permit to Jeffrey C. Nash, KDHE, Bureau of Air and Radiation, 1000 S.W. Jackson, Suite 310, Topeka, 66612-1366. In order to be considered in formulating a final permit decision, written comments must be received before the close of business November 14.

A person may request a public hearing be held on the proposed permit. The request for a public hearing shall be in writing and set forth the basis for the request. The written request must be submitted to Christy Thurman, Bureau of Air and Radiation, not later than the close of business November 14 in order for the Secretary of Health and Environment to consider the request.

The U.S. Environmental Protection Agency has a 45-day review period, which will start concurrently with the 30-day public comment period, within which to object to the proposed permit. If the EPA has not objected in writing to the issuance of the permit within the 45-day review period, any person may petition the administrator of the EPA to review the permit. The 60-day public petition period will directly follow the EPA's 45-day review period. Interested parties may contact KDHE to determine if the EPA's 45-day review period has been waived.

Any such petition shall be based only on objections to the permit that were raised with reasonable specificity during the public comment period provided for in this notice, unless the petitioner demonstrates that it was impracticable to raise such objections within such period, or

**Notice of 2005 Kansas Mortgage Savers Program**

Sedgwick County, Kansas, in cooperation with the Kansas Department of Commerce and other political subdivisions of the state of Kansas, announces the 2005 Kansas Mortgage Savers Program, a Qualified Mortgage Credit Certificate Program. Section 25 of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended, authorizes issuers of qualified mortgage bonds, such as Sedgwick County, to elect to issue mortgage credit certificates (MCCs) in lieu of qualified mortgage bonds. MCCs entitle qualifying individuals to a credit against the individual's federal income tax. The amount of the credit is determined by multiplying the certificate credit rate by the amount of interest paid or accrued during each taxpayer's taxable year on the mortgage loan for the taxpayer's "principal residence." In order for an individual to claim the credit provided by Section 25(a), the MCC must be a "qualified mortgage credit certificate" issued pursuant to a "qualified mortgage credit certificate program." The following criteria/requirements must be met:

**Principal Residence Requirement**

The homebuyer(s) must use the residence as his or her principal residence within a reasonable time (60 days) after the MCC is issued. The MCC holder must notify the issuer of the MCC if the residence ceases to be his or her principal residence.

**New Mortgage Requirements**

An MCC cannot be issued in conjunction with the acquisition, replacement or refinancing of an existing mortgage. However, a certificate can be used in conjunction with the replacement of construction period loans, bridge loans or other temporary initial financing with a term of 24 months or less.

**Three-Year No Prior Homeownership Requirement**

The homebuyer(s) cannot have had any present ownership interest in a principal residence at any time during the preceding three years ending on the date the MCC is issued. This three-year, first-time homebuyer requirement does not have to be met if the residence for which a mortgage loan application is being made is located in a federally designated targeted area. A targeted area is a particular area in the state determined or approved by

the federal government that will receive special consideration to provide an added stimulus to housing in that area.

**Purchase Price Requirements**

There are maximum allowable purchase prices for residences assisted by MCCs that vary based upon location, whether the residence being purchased is new or existing and whether the home is in a targeted area. The maximum purchase prices at this time are as follows:

 (1) Emergencies. If certain surgeries and procedures that require prior authorization are performed in an emergency situation, the request for authorization shall

be made within two working days after the service is provided.

(2) Situations in which services requiring prior authorization are provided and retroactive eligibility is later established. When an emergency occurs or when retroactive eligibility is established, prior authorization for that service shall be waived, and if medical necessity is documented, payment shall be made.

(e) Services requiring prior authorization shall be considered covered services within the scope of the program unless the request for prior authorization is denied. **Article 4.—ENTITLEMENT TO LEGAL  
 REPRESENTATION**

**105-4-1. Determination of eligibility.** (a) At the commencement of proceedings against any defendant, the defendant may make application for legal representation at state expense by submitting, to the court, an affidavit of indigency on a form provided by the board. The court shall determine if the defendant is indigent, based upon consideration of the following factors, as defined in K.A.R. 105-4-2:

- (1) The defendant's liquid assets;
- (2) the defendant's household income;
- (3) either the defendant's actual, reasonable, and necessary expenses incurred to support the defendant's household or the most current federal poverty guidelines, as published by the U.S. department of health and human services, for the defendant's family unit;
- (4) the anticipated cost of private legal representation; and
- (5) any transfer of property by the defendant without adequate monetary consideration after the date of the alleged commission of the offense.

(b) An eligible indigent defendant shall mean a person whose combined household income and liquid assets equal less than either of the following, plus the anticipated cost of private legal representation:

- (1) The sum of the defendant's actual, reasonable, and necessary living expense; or
- (2) the most current federal poverty guidelines, as published by the U.S. department of health and human services, for the defendant's family unit.

(c) The court may also consider any special circumstances affecting the defendant's eligibility for legal representation at state expense.

(d) If the court determines that the defendant is financially able to employ counsel after counsel has been appointed, the court shall require the defendant to reimburse the board in accordance with the provisions of K.S.A. 22-4510, and amendments thereto, for all or part of the expenditures made on the defendant's behalf. (Authorized by K.S.A. 2004 Supp. 22-4504 and K.S.A. 2004 Supp. 22-4522; implementing K.S.A. 2004 Supp. 22-4504 and K.S.A. 22-4510; effective May 1, 1984; amended, T-105-10-3-05, Oct. 3, 2005.)

**105-11-1. Defendant reimbursement of attorney fees.** The document titled "tables to determine defendant reimbursement of attorney fees for assigned counsel and public defenders," as revised by the state board of indigents' defense services on June 30, 2005, is hereby adopted by reference. #### Temporary Administrative Regulations

#### Article 2.—LOTTERY RETAILERS

**111-2-182. Determination of "Kansas Retailers Newsletter Incentive and Drawings" winners and prizes.** (a) At the time of the drawing, all entries shall be placed into the drawing receptacle and mixed thoroughly to ensure random selection.

(b) The drawing official shall designate one individual of his or her choice to participate in the selection process.

(c) The selection of drawing winner(s) shall be accomplished by the individual designated by the drawing official, using a bare arm technique, removing one entry from the drawing receptacle. A designated drawing official and a person representing Kansas lottery security shall review the selected entry to determine if the information required on the entry has been completed and if the question posed has been correctly answered. If the entry is determined to be valid and eligible to win, the first prize shall be awarded to that retailer. If additional prizes are to be awarded, this process shall be repeated until all valid winners have been selected. Each valid entry drawn shall be marked in such a way as to identify the order in which they were drawn.

(d) Each valid winner selected shall be awarded the prize identified and set forth in the applicable *Kansas Retailers* newsletter, not to exceed \$300 cash or \$300 credit on the winner's Kansas lottery retailer account.

(e) The security representative conducting the drawing shall be responsible for the final determination concerning the eligibility of any entry drawn. A retailer location entrant may only win one prize in each drawing. The first prize winning entry drawn for each entrant invalidates all other entries for the drawing for that entrant. (Authorized by and implementing K.S.A. 74-8710; effective, T-111-9-8-05, Aug. 17, 2005; amended, T-111-9-20-05, Sept. 12, 2005.)

**111-2-184. Convenience Plus "Ask for the sale" promotion.** (a) During the period beginning October 1, 2005, and ending October 31, 2005, in addition to compensation provided for in K.A.R. 111-2-4, the Kansas lottery also offers all Convenience Plus stores located in Kansas an opportunity to participate in a bonus retailer "ask for the sale" incentive promotion of lottery tickets.

(b) Every Wednesday, beginning October 1, 2005, through October 31, 2005, all Convenience Plus store personnel selling Kansas lottery tickets will ask every adult customer making a purchase if the customer would like to purchase a lottery ticket. If the employee fails to ask adult customers for the purchase of a lottery ticket and the customer brings it to the clerk's attention before leaving the premises, the retailer shall give the adult customer one \$1.00 instant lottery ticket at no charge.

(c) All retailer employees at each location shall wear promotional buttons and display special point-of-sale materials provided by the lottery during the promotion

announcing the promotion to its customers. These promotional materials consist of:

(1) A tent card to be displayed at the point where tickets are sold.

(2) A window/monitor banner to be displayed at the front entrance of the business and/or below the lottery information display system monitor.

These materials must be on display during all hours of the promotion on the dates established in subsection (b) for a store to be eligible for a prize.

(d) Any tickets given away above the \$35 allowance representing 35 tickets per location will be the responsibility of Convenience Plus.

(e) Each retail location shall maintain a ticket log form to be completed every time a lottery ticket is given away. The log will be picked up by the Kansas lottery district manager servicing the retailer location at the end of the promotion. If all terms of the promotion have been complied with by the retail location, \$35 will be credited to the retailer's lottery account. (Authorized by K.S.A. 74-8710; implementing K.S.A. 74-8710 and K.S.A. 74-8708; effective, T-111-9-20-05, Sept. 12, 2005.)

**111-2-185. Smoker Friendly "Ask for the sale" promotion.** (a) During the period beginning October 1, 2005, and ending October 31, 2005, in addition to compensation provided for in K.A.R. 111-2-4, the Kansas lottery also offers all Smoker Friendly stores located in Kansas an opportunity to participate in a bonus retailer "ask for the sale" incentive promotion of lottery tickets.

(b) Every Wednesday, beginning October 1, 2005, through October 31, 2005, all Smoker Friendly store personnel selling Kansas lottery tickets will ask every adult customer making a purchase if the customer would like to purchase a lottery ticket. If the employee fails to ask adult customers for the purchase of a lottery ticket and the customer brings it to the clerk's attention before leaving the premises, the retailer shall give the adult customer one \$1.00 instant lottery ticket at no charge.

(c) All retailer employees at each location shall wear promotional buttons and display special point-of-sale materials provided by the lottery during the promotion announcing the promotion to its customers. These promotional materials consist of:

(1) A tent card to be displayed at the point where tickets are sold.

(2) A window/monitor banner to be displayed at the front entrance of the business and/or below the lottery information display system monitor.

These materials must be on display during all hours of the promotion on the dates established in subsection (b) for a store to be eligible for a prize.

(d) Any tickets given away above the \$35 allowance representing 35 tickets per location will be the responsibility of Smoker Friendly.

(e) Each retail location shall maintain a ticket log form to be completed every time a lottery ticket is given away. The log will be picked up by the Kansas lottery district manager servicing the retailer location at the end of the promotion. If all terms of the promotion have been complied with by the retail location, \$35 will be credited to the retailer's lottery account. (Authorized by K.S.A. 74-

8710; implementing K.S.A. 74-8710 and K.S.A. 74-8708; effective, T-111-9-20-05, Sept. 12, 2005.)

**111-2-186. Kwik Shop "Ask for the sale" promotion.** (a) During the period beginning November 1, 2005, and ending November 30, 2005, in addition to compensation provided for in K.A.R. 111-2-4, the Kansas lottery also offers all Kwik Shop stores located in Kansas an opportunity to participate in a bonus retailer "ask for the sale" incentive promotion of lottery tickets.

(b) Every day, beginning November 1, 2005, through November 30, 2005, all Kwik Shop store personnel selling Kansas lottery tickets will ask every adult customer making a purchase if the customer would like to purchase a lottery ticket. If the employee fails to ask adult customers for the purchase of a lottery ticket and the customer brings it to the clerk's attention before leaving the premises, the retailer shall give the adult customer one \$1.00 instant lottery ticket at no charge.

(c) All retailer locations shall display special point-of-sale materials provided by the lottery during each day of the promotion announcing the promotion to its customers. These materials must be on display during the entire promotion on the dates established in subsection (b) for a store to be eligible for a prize.

(d) Any tickets given away above the \$100 allowance representing 100 tickets per location will be the responsibility of Kwik Shop.

(e) Each retail location shall maintain a ticket log form to be completed every time a lottery ticket is given away. The log will be picked up by the Kansas lottery district manager servicing the retailer location at the end of the promotion. If all terms of the promotion have been complied with by the retail location, \$100 will be credited to the retailer's lottery account.

(f) If a store does not give away any tickets by failing to ask for the sale throughout the duration of the promotion, an additional \$100 will be credited to the retailer's lottery account.

(g) Promotional items designated by the lottery will also be given to all participating stores. (Authorized by K.S.A. 74-8710; implementing K.S.A. 74-8710 and K.S.A. 74-8708; effective, T-111-9-20-05, Sept. 12, 2005.)

#### Article 4.—INSTANT GAMES AND DRAWINGS

##### KANSAS SPEEDWAY SECOND CHANCE DRAWING

**111-4-2186. Name, time, and place of drawing.** (a) The Kansas lottery shall conduct an instant ticket drawing in October of each year entitled "Kansas Speedway Second Chance Drawing."

(b) The draw receptacle for this drawing shall be open during lottery selling hours at the lottery's selling booth at the October Kansas Speedway races conducted in Kansas City, Kansas. The drawing shall take place immediately following the start of the last race of the weekend. No less than five minutes prior to the drawing, a lottery official at the lottery's Kansas Speedway selling booth shall verbally announce the time by which all entries must be deposited into the draw receptacle in accordance with the rules herein.

(c) Rules applicable to this drawing are contained in K.A.R. 111-3-1 *et seq.* and 111-4-2186 through 111-4-2190. (Authorized by and implementing K.S.A. 74-8710; effective, T-111-9-16-04, Sept. 10, 2004; amended, T-111-9-20-05, Sept. 12, 2005.)

**111-4-2187. Definitions.** (a) All definitions contained in the Kansas lottery act (K.S.A. 74-8701 *et seq.*) and amendments thereto and lottery regulations are hereby incorporated by reference and govern unless otherwise indicated.

(b) "Kansas Speedway Second Chance Drawing" means the act of drawing for prizes conducted by the Kansas lottery at the Kansas Speedway in Kansas City, Kansas, in which participants are selected to win various prizes as described in K.A.R. 111-4-2189.

(c) "Non-winning ticket" means any valid \$2.00 Kansas instant game lottery ticket not eligible to win a prize under any instant game rules and purchased from the lottery selling location at the Kansas Speedway during selling hours until the start of the last race of that weekend at Kansas Speedway.

(d) "Receptacle" or "drum" means a container in which non-winning Kansas instant game lottery tickets are placed and from which the "Kansas Speedway Second Chance Drawing" is made. Receptacles or drums may be sealable and shall be capable of being mixed or rotated for the purpose of ensuring random distribution.

(e) "Bare arm technique" means a type of drawing where the person drawing the winning ticket from the receptacle or drum wears a long-sleeved shirt with sleeve rolled up above the elbow, a short-sleeved shirt (sleeve not extending past the elbow) or a non-sleeve shirt which exposes the drawer's bare arm and looks away from the drawing drum or receptacle while drawing. (Authorized by and implementing K.S.A. 74-8710; effective, T-111-9-16-04, Sept. 10, 2004; amended, T-111-9-20-05, Sept. 12, 2005.)

**111-4-2188. Entry into drawing.** Entry into the "Kansas Speedway Second Chance Drawing" ("drawing") is accomplished as follows:

(a) Obtain a valid Kansas instant \$2.00 lottery ticket purchased from the lottery selling location at the Kansas Speedway during lottery selling hours until the start of the last race of that weekend at Kansas Speedway;

(b) Determine if the ticket is a winning ticket in accordance with any instant game rules. If the ticket is a winning ticket, it is not eligible for the drawing and shall be redeemed in accordance with the instant game rules;

(c) If the ticket is a valid non-winning ticket, the ticket is eligible for winning the drawing and the holder of the ticket may enter the drawing;

(d) The holder of the non-winning ticket must complete the information form on the back of the ticket in a legible manner;

(e) The holder of the non-winning ticket must take the non-winning ticket with the completed information form to the location of the drawing and place it in the receptacle or drum provided;

(f) The receptacle or drum shall be available and entries may be made at the times stated in K.A.R. 111-4-2186.

Entries shall be allowed until the actual winner selection process begins;

(g) The holder of the ticket is not required to personally attend the drawing or be present at the time of the drawing to be determined a winner;

(h) There is no limit to the number of entries an entrant may make, but each entrant may only win one prize;

(i) All eligible entrants must be at least 18 years of age. (Authorized by and implementing K.S.A. 74-8710; effective, T-111-9-16-04, Sept. 10, 2004; amended, T-111-9-20-05, Sept. 12, 2005.)

**111-4-2318. "Made In Kansas" instant ticket lottery game number 508.** (a) The Kansas lottery shall conduct an instant winner lottery game entitled "Made In Kansas" commencing on or after October 1, 2005. The rules for this game are contained in K.A.R. 111-3-1 *et seq.* and 111-4-2318.

If a player matches either of the "WINNING NUMBERS" to any of the "YOUR NUMBERS," the player wins the prize shown below that matched number. A player can win up to eight times in this play area.

The bonus game is an instant win game. If a player reveals any prize amount, the player wins that amount instantly. A player can only win once in this play area.

(h) Each ticket in this game may win up to nine times.

In "TABLE 1" and "TABLE 2," the player will remove the scratch-off material covering each "TABLE" play area to reveal five "HANDS," "HAND 1," "HAND 2," "HAND 3," "HAND 4," and "HAND 5," and one "DEALER'S HAND." If the sum of a "HAND" is higher than the sum of the "DEALER'S HAND" on that "TABLE," the player wins the "PRIZE" directly below that "HAND." If the player gets "BLACKJACK" (21) in any "HAND," the player wins double the prize for that "HAND." If the dealer busts, the player wins all five prizes for that "TABLE." The cards "J," "Q," and "K" will have a point value of 10. The card "A" will have a point value of 11. A player can win up to five times on each "TABLE."

In the "BONUS" play area, the player will remove the scratch-off material covering the bonus play area. If an "ACE" (A) symbol is revealed, the player wins \$10 instantly. A player can win once in this play area.

- (h) Each ticket in this game may win up to 11 times.
- (i) Approximately 600,000 tickets shall be ordered initially for this instant game. Additional ticket orders shall have the same prize structure, the same number of prizes per prize pool of 300,000 tickets, and the same odds as were contained in the initial ticket order.
- (j) The expected number and value of instant prizes in this game shall be as follows:

**111-4-2325. "Fantastic \$500s" instant ticket lottery game number 521.** (a) The Kansas lottery shall conduct an instant winner lottery game entitled "Fantastic \$500s" commencing on or after October 1, 2005. The rules for this game are contained in K.A.R. 111-3-1 *et seq.* and 111-4-2325.

(b) The "play symbols" and "play symbol captions" for this game are as follows:

(g) "Fantastic \$500s" is a ticket with two play areas. Game 1 is a match three of nine game. If a player gets three like prize amounts, the player wins that amount. Game 2 is an instant win game. If a player reveals a "MONEY BAG" symbol, the player wins \$50 instantly.

(h) Each ticket in this game may win up to two times.

(i) Approximately 300,000 tickets shall be ordered initially for this instant game. Additional ticket orders shall have the same prize structure, the same number of prizes per prize pool of 300,000 tickets, and the same odds as were contained in the initial ticket order.

**Article 6.—ON-LINE GENERIC GAME RULES**

**111-6-7. Validation requirements.** (a) To be a valid winning on-line ticket, all of the following conditions must be met:

(1) The ticket data must have been recorded in the central computer system prior to the drawing and the information appearing on the ticket must correspond with the computer record to the extent necessary to determine whether the ticket is a winning ticket.

(2) The ticket shall be intact to the extent that all information appearing on the ticket corresponds with the lottery's computer records.

(3) The ticket shall not be mutilated to the extent that the lottery is unable to determine whether the ticket is a winning ticket.

(4) The ticket shall not be altered or tampered with in any manner.

(5) The ticket shall not be counterfeit or a duplicate of another winning ticket.

(6) The ticket must have been issued by an authorized on-line retailer in an authorized manner.

(7) The ticket must not have been stolen or cancelled.

(8) The ticket must not have been previously paid.

(9) The ticket must contain numbers which make it eligible to win a prize pursuant to specific game rules as determined by the lottery.

(10) The ticket shall pass all other confidential security checks of the lottery.

(11) The ticket must be validated through the lottery's computer system.

(12) The ticket shall be the only valid evidence for claiming a prize. A play slip or a copy of the ticket has no monetary or prize value and shall not constitute evidence of a ticket purchase or of numbers selected.

(b) Any ticket failing any of the validation requirements listed above is invalid and ineligible for a prize. The final decision on whether a prize is paid will be made by the executive director.

(c) In the event of a dispute between the executive director and a claimant as to whether a ticket is a valid winning ticket, and if the executive director determines that the ticket is not a valid winning ticket and a prize is not paid, the executive director may replace the disputed ticket with a ticket of equivalent sales price for a future drawing of the current game or refund the cost of the ticket. These shall be the sole and exclusive remedies of the claimant.

(d) In the event a defective on-line ticket is purchased or is damaged as it is issued from an authorized terminal to the extent that it does not contain all validation and

the lottery's security requirements, the only responsibility or liability of the lottery or the on-line retailer shall be the replacement of the defective on-line ticket with another on-line ticket for a future drawing of the same game.

(e) In the event an incorrect number is entered into the lottery's on-line computer system terminals following a drawing described in specific game rules and the incorrect number is reflected in reports generated by the computer system, the lottery shall not be responsible for the payment of claims presented as a result of the entry of an incorrect number in a computer system terminal which may have been used in the validation process.

(f) Subject to certain conditions, prize payment may be made for an on-line ticket that is not received or not recorded by the lottery by applicable deadlines. The following conditions may constitute exceptions to the validation requirements previously identified in subsections (a), (b), (c), (d) and (e):

(1) Consideration will only be given to claimants with on-line tickets or shares that have been destroyed or lost during or following a validation attempt or win-check at an authorized retail location.

(2) A record of the event must be contained within the database of the lottery's central computer system accurately identifying the retailer, the validation attempt or win-check, the date, ticket serial number, the time of the event, the terminal number, and the prize amount.

(3) The claimant must present the claim to lottery headquarters office in Topeka, be authorized to purchase an on-line ticket or share, be eligible to claim a prize, and be the rightful recipient of the prize claimed as determined by the lottery.

(4) The claimant will complete and sign both a Kansas lottery winner claim form and an affidavit providing the following information: the prize amount claimed, the retailer name, address, and city where the ticket was purchased, the game played, the date of purchase, the time of purchase, the type of wager (quick pick or personal selection), the numbers wagered if personal selection, the dollar value wagered, the retailer name, address, and city where the validation attempt or win check occurred, the date and time the validation attempt or win check occurred, the manner or means by which the ticket or share was destroyed or lost, if applicable a description of the clerk or retailer who performed the validation attempt and destroyed or lost the ticket, and any other information that will establish the validity of the claim.

(5) The lottery will enter information from the winner claim form and the affidavit into a database contained within the lottery's central computer system.

(6) Lottery security will conduct an investigation to determine if the claim is or is not supported by the investigation and will submit a report with a recommendation to that effect to the executive director of the lottery.

(7) If the executive director determines that the claim is otherwise supported by the investigation, and if no other claimant has presented the ticket in question, the prize will be validated through the lottery's central computer system on the last day of the expiration period. If the validation period expires on a weekend or on a holiday when the lottery is closed, the validation will be conducted on the next working day.

(8) Following expiration of the validation period, a valid claim will be paid. Such payment will be restricted to the original prize amount only. No interest will be paid.

(9) The final decision on whether a prize will be paid shall be made by the executive director.

(g) In the event a retailer performs a win check on a ticket without validating it and pays a player any low-tier prize, but prior to validation the ticket expires, upon proof deemed sufficient by the executive director, the retailer may be reimbursed for the amount of the prize so paid.

(h) In the event a retailer performs a win check on a ticket without validating it and does not pay a player any low-tier prize, but prior to validation the ticket expires, upon proof deemed sufficient by the executive director, the player may be paid the prize. ### Article 13.—ELECTRONIC GAME CARD GENERIC GAME RULES

#### ELECTRONIC CARD GAME RULES

**111-13-1. Definitions.** (a) The following definitions apply to all Kansas lottery electronic card games, along with all definitions contained in the Kansas lottery act (K.S.A. 74-8701 *et seq.*) and amendments thereto, and in lottery regulations adopted pursuant to the Kansas lottery act, which are hereby incorporated by reference.

(b) "Electronic card game" or "game" means an instant lottery game in which a player purchases an electronic card that has been pre-programmed with a lottery game as set forth in the rules for each such game. Each electronic card shall contain the corresponding number of reveals and prizes selected from a set pool of prizes established by the rules for each electronic card game. Each card holder, whose valid card includes a winning combination, shall be instantly entitled to the prize contained thereon if the card and, if applicable, a valid claim form are submitted within the specified time period. A player may reveal the prize(s) won by playing the game contained on the electronic card, which game may simulate the action of a slot machine or other similar device. Winning a prize shall not be dependent upon revealing the prize(s) or by playing the game(s) on the card, whether in whole or in part.

(c) "Electronic card retailer" or "retailer" means a person or business authorized by the Lottery to sell electronic cards.

(d) "Electronic card" or "card" means a battery operated electronic device sold by a Kansas lottery retailer to a player, pre-programmed to contain plays and prize(s) that have been randomly selected for said electronic device. The card shall contain a read-only type integrated circuit and one or more liquid crystal display (LCD) windows used to display the plays or reveals. The card shall have one or more labels adhered thereto with a bar code

(continued)

printed thereon, which is readable by a lottery terminal and is used for purposes of validation of the card. That card shall be the only acceptable evidence of the selections and plays purchased.

(e) Prize tiers:

(1) "high-tier prize" means an electronic card game prize of not less than \$600;

(2) "low-tier prize" means an electronic card game prize of less than \$600.

(f) "Validation" means the process of determining whether an electronic card presented for payment is a winning card.

(g) "Card holder" or "holder" means the person who has possession of an unsigned electronic card or the person whose written name, signature or mark appears on the back of the card.

(h) "Executive director" means the executive director of the Kansas lottery or the person designated by the executive director.

(i) "Reveal" or "play" means the combination of one or more computer-generated play symbols displayed on the electronic card to the player indicating the win(s) or loss(es) to which each card is entitled.

(j) "Pool" means each set of predetermined winning and losing reveals, and the value of each such reveal, as determined by the rules for each electronic card. Each electronic card game may contain multiple numbers of pools.

(k) "Problem card" means any electronic card that fails to operate normally due to battery failure or otherwise.

(l) "Receptacle" or "drum" means a container in which non-winning cards or entry forms are placed and from which drawings are made. Receptacles or drums may be sealable and drums shall be capable of being mixed or rotated for the purpose of ensuring random distribution.

(m) "Day," "business day," or "operations day," when referring to an electronic card game, means the 20-hour period starting at 5:00 a.m. and ending at 1:00 a.m., the following day, unless specified otherwise in individual game rules.

(n) "Play symbol" means the number, letter, or other symbol appearing on each liquid crystal display window of an electronic card which determines if the card holder is entitled to a prize. (Authorized by and implementing K.S.A. 74-8710; effective, T-111-9-20-05, Sept. 12, 2005.)

**111-13-3. Sale of cards.** (a) No person other than a retailer under a contract for the sale of Kansas lottery products with the lottery may sell electronic cards except that nothing in this section shall be construed to prevent a person who may lawfully purchase products from making a gift of lottery products to another.

(b) An electronic card retailer must have a current retailer certificate and must be actively engaged in the sale to the public of at least one of the lottery's most current instant ticket games unless otherwise approved as a social environment establishment by the executive director.

(c) Cards may not be sold at a location other than the address listed on the retailer's certificate with the lottery.

(d) Nothing in this section shall be construed to prohibit the lottery from designating certain of its agents and employees to sell lottery products directly to the public.

(Authorized by and implementing K.S.A. 74-8710; effective, T-111-9-20-05, Sept. 12, 2005.)

**111-13-4. Electronic card games criteria.** (a) The purchase price of an electronic card shall be in the amount established by the rules of each electronic card game except to the extent of discounts specifically authorized by regulation of the commission.

(b) No person may sell an electronic card at a price other than that established in accordance with these rules.

(c) For each purchase, the retailer shall issue to the player an electronic card.

(d) Each card shall be issued out of only one card pool, with each pool having such odds and percentages of payout as determined by the rules for each electronic card game.

(e) An electronic card bearer entitled to a prize shall submit the winning card as specified by K.A.R. 111-13-5. The winning card must be validated by the lottery or an electronic card retailer through use of the lottery terminal or any other means as specified by the executive director. (Authorized by and implementing K.S.A. 74-8710; effective, T-111-9-20-05, Sept. 12, 2005.)

**111-13-5. Payment of prizes.** (a) Prior to the payment of any prize, the claimant shall present the winning electronic card to any retailer, or any Kansas lottery office for validation.

(b) The procedure for payment of a prize on any single game card which totals less than \$600.00 is as follows:

(1) The holder of the card may present it to any retailer. Upon validation of the card, the retailer shall immediately pay the holder of the card. If the retailer cannot validate the card, the claimant must obtain and complete a claim form and timely submit it with the card to any Kansas lottery office by mail or in person.

(2) Prizes payable by retailers shall be paid during all normal business hours of the retailer, provided the online computer system is operational and cards can be validated.

(3) A retailer may pay prizes in cash or by business check, certified check, or money order, or any combination thereof.

(4) A winning card offering a free card or cards may be claimed at any retailer location or at any Kansas lottery office. A player claiming a free card prize at a lottery office may be issued either a free card or a prize payment in the face amount of the free card at the discretion of the executive director.

(c) To claim a prize of \$600 or more, the claimant shall obtain and complete a claim form and submit it with the winning card to any Kansas lottery office by mail or in person. Although claims may be submitted to any Kansas lottery office, such prizes can only be paid from the lottery's headquarters in Topeka. Upon determination that the card is a winning card and receipt of a completed claim form, the lottery shall process for payment the amount due, less any withholding required by state and federal laws. If the card is determined to be a non-winning card, the claim shall be denied and the claimant shall be promptly notified.

(d) If the claim is presented to a lottery regional office or to lottery headquarters, the claimant must complete a

claim form regardless of the prize amount and submit it with the winning card, either by mail or in person. Upon determination that the card is a winning card and receipt of a completed claim form, the lottery shall present or mail a check to the claimant in payment of the amount due, less any withholding required by state and federal laws.

(e) All prizes must be claimed within 180 days of the date the executive director announces the end of that game. To claim a prize at lottery headquarters, the holder of the winning card must present or mail the winning card and claim form to the Kansas lottery, and the lottery must actually receive it within the above time period. Any prizes not claimed within the specified period shall be added to the prize pools of subsequent Kansas lottery games.

(f) Non-winning cards will not be returned to the claimant.

(g) A validated card shall be the only proof of a game play or plays, and the submission of a winning card to and receipt of the card by the lottery or its authorized retailer shall be the sole method of claiming a prize.

(h) Claims in excess of \$600 or more shall not be paid by lottery retailers. The lottery has no obligation to reimburse retailers paying claims of \$600 or more. (Authorized by and implementing K.S.A. 74-8710; effective, T-111-9-20-05, Sept. 12, 2005.)

**111-13-6. Validation requirements.** (a) To be a valid winning electronic card, all of the following conditions must be met:

(1) The card data must have been recorded on the card at the time the card was manufactured and the electronic and printed information appearing on the card must correspond with the computer record to the extent necessary to determine whether the card is a winning card.

(2) The card shall be intact to the extent that all electronic and printed information appearing on the card corresponds with the lottery's computer records.

(3) The card shall not be mutilated or otherwise damaged to the extent that the lottery is unable to determine whether the card is a winning card.

(4) The card shall not be altered or tampered with in any manner.

(5) The card shall not be counterfeit or a duplicate of another winning card.

(6) The card must have been issued by an authorized retailer in an authorized manner.

(7) The card must not have been stolen.

(8) The card must not have been previously paid.

(9) The card must contain numbers, characters, or other information which make it eligible to win a prize pursuant to rules for that game.

(10) The card shall pass all other confidential security checks of the lottery.

(11) The card must be validated through the lottery's computer system.

(12) The card, including information printed thereon, shall be the only valid evidence for claiming a prize. A copy of the card or any part thereof has no monetary or prize value and shall not constitute evidence of a card purchase or of plays or prizes contained thereon.

(b) Any card failing any of the validation requirements listed above is invalid and ineligible for a prize. The executive director will make the final decision on whether a prize is paid.

(c) In the event of a dispute between the executive director and a claimant as to whether a card is a valid winning card, and if the executive director determines that the card is not a valid winning card and a prize is not paid, the executive director may replace the disputed card with a card of equivalent sales price or refund the cost of the card. These shall be the sole and exclusive remedies of the claimant.

(d) In the event a valid electronic card is unplayable, the only responsibility or liability of the lottery shall be payment of the prize won on said card.

(e) Subject to certain conditions, prize payment may be made for a card or share of \$600 or more in value that is not received or not recorded by the lottery by applicable deadlines. The following conditions may constitute exceptions to the validation requirements previously identified in subsections (a), (b), (c), and (d):

(1) Consideration will only be given to claimants with cards that have been destroyed or lost during or following a validation attempt at an authorized retail location.

(2) A record of the event must be contained within the database of the lottery's central computer system accurately identifying the retailer, the validation attempt, the date, card serial number, the time of the event, the terminal number, and the prize amount.

(3) The claimant must present the claim to lottery headquarters office in Topeka, be authorized to purchase a card, be eligible to claim a prize, and be the rightful recipient of the prize claimed as determined by the lottery.

(4) The claimant must complete to the extent possible and sign both a Kansas lottery winner claim form and an affidavit providing the following information: the prize amount claimed, the retailer name, address, and city where the card was purchased, the game played, the date of purchase, the time of purchase, the dollar value wagered, the retailer name, address, and city where the validation attempt occurred, the date and time the validation attempt occurred, the manner or means by which the card was destroyed or lost, a description of the clerk or retailer who performed the validation attempt and destroyed or lost the card, if applicable, and any other information that will establish the validity of the claim.

(5) The lottery will enter information from the winner claim form and the affidavit into a database contained within the lottery's central computer system.

(6) Lottery security will conduct an investigation to determine if the claim is or is not supported by the investigation and will submit a report with a recommendation to that effect to the executive director of the lottery.

(7) If the executive director determines that the claim is otherwise supported by the investigation, and if no other claimant has presented the card in question, the prize will be validated through the lottery's central computer system on the last day of the expiration period. If the validation period expires on a weekend or on a holiday when the lottery is closed, the validation will be conducted on the next business day.

*(continued)*

(8) Following expiration of the validation period, a valid claim will be paid. Such payment will be restricted to the original prize amount only. No interest will be paid.

(9) The final decision on whether a prize will be paid shall be made by the executive director. (Authorized by and implementing K.S.A. 74-8710; effective, T-111-9-20-05, Sept. 12, 2005.)

**111-13-7. Card responsibility.** (a) If there is no signature on the back of an electronic card, the card shall be owned by the physical possessor of the card. When a signature or name appears on the back of a card, the person whose signature or name appears on the card shall be the owner of the card and shall be entitled, subject to all validation requirements, to any prize attributable to the card.

(b) If the signature or name of more than one person appears on the card, all persons whose signatures or names appear must identify one person to whom payment should be made. If all persons whose signatures or names appear on the card cannot identify one person to whom payment should be made, the lottery shall retain the prize until a determination of entitlement is made by the parties. In no event shall more than one person be entitled to a particular prize.

(c) The Kansas lottery shall not be responsible for lost or stolen cards, and shall not be responsible for lost or stolen entry forms of any type which may be used for entry into a lottery drawing. (Authorized by and implementing K.S.A. 74-8710 and K.S.A. 74-8720; effective, T-111-9-20-05, Sept. 12, 2005.)

**111-13-8. Retailer compensation and charges.** The compensation paid to electronic card lottery retailers shall be a discount of five percent applied to cards sold. (Authorized by and implementing K.S.A. 74-8710; effective, T-111-9-20-05, Sept. 12, 2005.)

**111-13-9. Retailer settlement.** (a) Electronic card retailers specified by the executive director shall establish an account for deposit of monies derived from lottery games with a financial institution which has the capability of electronic funds transfer (EFT).

(b) The amount deposited shall be sufficient to cover monies due the lottery. The lottery will withdraw by EFT the amount due to the lottery on the day specified by the executive director. In the event the day specified for withdrawal falls on a state holiday, withdrawal will be accomplished on the next following business day. (Authorized by and implementing K.S.A. 74-8710; effective, T-111-9-20-05, Sept. 12, 2005.)

**Article 14.—ELECTRONIC GAME CARD GAMES**

**111-14-1. "Triple 7's" electronic card lottery game number 1.** (a) The lottery shall conduct an electronic card lottery game entitled "Triple 7's" commencing on or after October 5, 2005. The rules for this game are contained in K.A.R. 111-13-1 *et seq.* and 111-14-1.

(b) The plays symbols for this game are 1, 2, 3, 4, 5, and 7.

(c) For this game, a play symbol shall appear in each of three liquid crystal display windows on the face of the electronic card.

(d) The card numbers in each pack of cards in this game shall start with 000 and end with 014.

(e) The price of cards sold by a retailer for this game shall be \$20.00 each.

(f) "Triple 7's" is a symbol matching game whereby a player accumulates points, each point having a prize value of 25 cents. A player will activate the electronic card by removing a tab. A player may repeatedly press the "PLAY" button, which will cause a play symbol to appear in each of the three windows on the card. Each card contains a total of 80 plays with three symbols each.

(g) Points awarded on the card shall accumulate until such time as all 80 plays have been made. Points shall be awarded based on the following combination of play symbols in a single play:

| Any one "7" symbol  | 1 point      |

(h) Each card in this game may only win one time.

(i) Approximately 120,000 cards shall be ordered initially for this game. Additional card orders shall have the same prize structure, the same number of prizes per pool of 60,000 cards, and the same odds as were contained in the initial order.

(j) The expected number and value of prizes in this game shall be as follows:
