A public hearing will be conducted at 9 a.m. Thursday, November 17, in the offices of the Kansas Development Finance Authority, 555 S. Kansas Ave., Suite 202, Topeka, on the proposal for the KDFFA to issue its Agricultural Development Revenue Bond for the project numbered below in the respective maximum principal amount. The bond will be issued to assist the respective borrower named below (who will be the owner and operator of the project) to finance the cost in the amount of the bond of acquiring the project or for the purpose of refunding a bond previously issued to finance the project. The project shall be located as shown:

Project No. 000645—Maximum Principal Amount: \$52,000. Owner/Operator: Craig Schurle. Description: Acquisition of 80 acres of agricultural land and related improvements and equipment to be used by the owner/operator for farming purposes. The project is located at the East Half of the Southeast Quarter of Section 21, Township 7, Range 4, Clay County, Kansas, approximately .5 mile south of Green on 859 and 1 mile east on 21st Road.

The bond, when issued, will be a limited obligation of the KDFFA and will not constitute a general obligation or indebtedness of the state of Kansas or any political subdivision thereof, including the KDFFA, nor will it be an indebtedness for which the faith and credit and taxing powers of the state of Kansas are pledged. The bond will be payable solely from amounts received from the respective borrower, the obligation of which will be sufficient to pay the principal of, interest and redemption premium, if any, on the bond when it becomes due.

All individuals who appear at the hearing will be given an opportunity to express their views, and all written comments previously filed with the KDFFA at its offices

at 555 S. Kansas Ave., Suite 202, Topeka, 66603, will be considered. Additional information regarding the project may be obtained by contacting the KDFFA.

Any individual affected by the above-described project may, at or prior to the hearing, file a written request with the KDFFA that a local hearing be held on the proposal to issue a bond to finance said project. A local hearing, if requested, would be conducted in the county where the project in question is located.

Request for Proposals

The Attorney General's Office hereby provides notice of the availability of funds under the Young Kansans — Safe Kids grant program and seeks grant proposals from interested groups and organizations. The Young Kansans — Safe Kids grant program was created during the 2005 Kansas Special Legislative Session to encourage and aid in the funding of programs designed to provide Internet safety education and training for school-age children throughout the state of Kansas. The Attorney General's Office has accepted the responsibility for managing \$250,000 of state funds allocated for the Young Kansans — Safe Kids program. The funding available through the Young Kansans — Safe Kids program is intended to provide start-up/expansion grants to aid in providing online safety training to more children across the state by creating and expanding programs that will give Kansas kids the knowledge and skills they need to have fun, learn, and be safe when they are online.

Pursuant to the language of 2005 Special Session Senate Bill 4, the funding available through the Young Kansans — Safe Kids grant program only may be awarded on the basis of a 1/1 match of non-state to state moneys. All grant applicants wishing to be considered to receive monetary awards from the Young Kansans — Safe Kids program will be required to provide documentation confirming the existence of non-state funds to be utilized by the applicant sufficient to match on a 1/1 basis the amount of the award made by the Attorney General to the applicant from the Young Kansans — Safe Kids grant program prior to the transfer of any funds from the program to the applicant.

Applying for Young Kansans — Safe Kids Grant Funds:

Applications for grant funding under the Young Kan-

sans — Safe Kids program must be received by the Attorney General's Office not later than November 11.

Applicants must complete the "Young Kansans — Safe Kids Grant Application Form" providing all contact information regarding the organization seeking to obtain grant funds, financial information for the organization and a summary of the methodology to be employed by the organization to provide on-line safety training to Kansas school-age children. Applicants also must provide samples of the curriculum/materials proposed to be utilized by the organization to educate Kansas children and provide assurances that sufficient quantities of any such materials will be available to distribute to the number of children proposed to be served under the grant application.

Following receipt of grant applications, staff members from the Attorney General's Office may contact applicants for further information regarding the applicants' organization, ability to comply with requirements for participation in the grant program, proposed non-state funding sources, curriculum materials or other information necessary to the grant application/review process. Decisions on grant awards will be made by December 1, and applicants chosen to receive awards from the available funds will be contacted by the Attorney General's Office to complete the grant award process.

Regulations****Article 4.—MOTOR CARRIERS OF PERSONS
AND PROPERTY**

82-4-3a. Hours of service. (a) With the following exceptions, 49 C.F.R. Part 395, as in effect on October 1, 2005, is hereby adopted by reference:

(1) 49 C.F.R. 395.0 shall be deleted.

(2) The following revisions shall be made to 49 C.F.R. 395.1:

(A) 49 C.F.R. 395.1(a)(2), 49 C.F.R. 395.1(h), and 49 C.F.R. 395.1(i) shall be deleted.

(B) 49 C.F.R. 395.1(k) shall be deleted and replaced by the following:

“(k)(1) The provisions of this regulation shall not apply to drivers transporting agricultural commodities or farm supplies for agricultural purposes in the state if the transportation meets the following conditions:

“(A) Is limited to an area within a 100-air-mile radius from the source of the commodities or the distribution point for the farm supplies; and

“(B) is conducted within the planting and harvesting seasons.

“(2) ‘Planting and harvesting seasons’ means the time periods for planting and harvesting that occur between January 1 and December 31.

“(3) ‘Agricultural commodities’ means the unprocessed products of agriculture, horticulture, and cultivation of the soil, including wheat, corn, hay, milo, sorghum, sunflowers, and soybeans. Agricultural commodities shall not include livestock and livestock products, milk, honey, poultry products, timber products, and nursery stock, nor shall the term include the transportation of hazardous materials of the type or quantity that requires the vehicle to be placarded.

“(4) ‘Farm supplies’ means supplies or equipment for use in the planting or harvesting of agricultural commodities, but shall not include the transportation of hazardous materials of the type or quantity that requires the vehicle to be placarded.

“(5) ‘Hazardous materials of the type or quantity that requires the vehicle to be placarded,’ as used in 49 C.F.R. 395.1(k)(3) and (4), means materials that require placarding pursuant to 49 C.F.R. Part 172, as adopted in K.A.R. 82-4-20, but shall not include fertilizer, animal waste used as fertilizer, anhydrous ammonia, and pesticides.”

(3) The following revisions shall be made to 49 C.F.R. 395.2:

(A) The definition of “sleeper berth” shall be deleted and replaced by the following: “‘Sleeper berth’ means a berth conforming to the requirements of 49 C.F.R. 393.76, as adopted in K.A.R. 82-4-3(a)(4).”

(B) The phrase “found by the Secretary to be hazardous under 49 U.S.C. 5103 in a quantity requiring placarding under regulations issued to carry out such section,” which appears in the definition of “transportation of con-

struction materials and equipment," shall be deleted and replaced by "requiring placarding pursuant to 49 C.F.R. Part 172, as adopted in K.A.R. 82-4-20."

(4) The following revisions shall be made to 49 C.F.R. 395.8:

(A) The last sentence in 49 C.F.R. 395.8(a)(1) shall be deleted.

(B) The "Note" that appears between 49 C.F.R. 395.8(c) and (d) shall be deleted.

(C) 49 C.F.R. 395.8(e) shall be deleted.

(D) The "Note" that appears between 49 C.F.R. 395.8(h)(5) and (i) shall be deleted.

(E) The "Note," including the graphic, that appears after 49 C.F.R. 395.8(k)(2) shall be deleted.

(5) The following revisions shall be made to 49 C.F.R. 395.13:

(A) 49 C.F.R. 395.13(c)(2) shall be deleted and replaced by the following:

"Within fifteen days following the date any driver is placed out of service, the motor carrier that employed the driver shall personally deliver or place in the U.S. mail to the division administrator or the state director of the federal motor carrier safety administration a signed certification in a form acceptable to the commission. Any signed certification acceptable to the commission shall include the following information:

"(i) All violations have been corrected;

"(ii) action has been taken to assure compliance with 49 C.F.R. 395.1, 49 C.F.R. 395.2, 49 C.F.R. 395.3, 49 C.F.R. 395.5, 49 C.F.R. 395.8, 49 C.F.R. 395.13, and 49 C.F.R. 395.15; and

"(iii) the motor carrier understands that false certification can result in appropriate enforcement action."

(B) The phrase "as adopted in K.A.R. 82-4-3k" shall be added before the phrase "pertaining to attendance and surveillance of commercial motor vehicles," which appears in 49 C.F.R. 395.13(d)(4).

(6) The last sentence in 49 C.F.R. 395.15(b)(3) shall be deleted.

(7)(A) The phrase "special agent of the Federal Motor Carrier Safety Administration (as defined in appendix B to this subchapter)," which appears in 49 C.F.R. 395.1, 49 C.F.R. 395.2, 49 C.F.R. 395.3, 49 C.F.R. 395.5, 49 C.F.R. 395.8, 49 C.F.R. 395.13, and 49 C.F.R. 395.15, shall be deleted and replaced by "any authorized representative of the commission, and any member of the Kansas highway patrol or any other law enforcement officer in the state who has been certified in the inspection of motor carriers based on the motor carrier safety assistance program standards."

(B) The phrases "Federal Motor Carrier Safety Administration" and "FMCSA," which appear in 49 C.F.R. 395.1, 49 C.F.R. 395.2, 49 C.F.R. 395.3, 49 C.F.R. 395.5, 49 C.F.R. 395.8, 49 C.F.R. 395.13, and 49 C.F.R. 395.15, shall be deleted and replaced by "commission."

(b) Whenever the federal regulations adopted in this regulation refer to portions of the federal regulations or other operating standards that are not already adopted by reference in article 4 of the commission's regulations, the references shall not be applicable to this regulation unless otherwise specifically adopted.

(c) No wrecker or tow truck, as defined by K.S.A. 66-1329 and amendments thereto, with a gross vehicle weight rating or gross combination vehicle weight rating of 26,000 pounds or less shall be subject to this regulation.

This regulation shall be effective on and after November 1, 2005. Article 3.—PERSONS HOLDING LICENSES; DUTIES

86-3-29. Participation of salesperson or associate broker in affiliated business arrangement with title agency. (a) Any salesperson or associate broker may have a financial interest, as defined in K.S.A. 40-2404(14)(e)(ii) and amendments thereto, in an affiliated business arrangement with a title insurer or title insurance agency created or regulated pursuant to K.S.A. 40-2404(14)(e)-(j) and amendments thereto, 12 U.S.C. §2607(c) of the real estate settlement procedures act (RESPA), and 24 C.F.R. 3500.15 if, upon commencement of the affiliated business arrangement, the salesperson or associate broker notifies the supervising broker or branch broker, by certified mail, of the proposed affiliated business arrangement in order to allow supervision pursuant to K.S.A. 58-3035(d) and (n) and K.S.A. 58-3062(c)(3), and amendments thereto.

(b) Each salesperson or associate broker who has a financial interest in an affiliated business arrangement as specified in subsection (a) shall notify the supervising broker or branch broker in writing within five business days after the effective date of each contract in any real estate transaction from which the salesperson or associate broker will receive compensation due to an affiliated business arrangement. Article 10.—CHILD RAPE PROTECTION

16-10-1. Definitions. As used in this article, the following terms shall have the meanings specified in this regulation:

(a) "Abortion" has the meaning specified in K.S.A. 65-6701, and amendments thereto.

(b) "K.B.I." means the Kansas bureau of investigation.

(c) "Fetal tissue" means any tissue, organs, or body parts obtained from a dead human embryo or fetus after an abortion.

(d) "Medical care facility" has the meaning specified in K.S.A. 65-425, and amendments thereto. (Authorized by and implementing L. 2005, Ch. 149, § 3; effective, T-16-7-11-05, July 11, 2005; effective Nov. 18, 2005.)

16-10-2. Preservation and submission of fetal tissue. (a) Each physician who performs an abortion on a minor who is younger than 14 years of age shall perform, or shall ensure that the physician's staff performs, the following steps:

(1) Keep at least one fetal tissue collection kit provided by the K.B.I. on hand at all times and obtain replacement kits from the K.B.I. as needed; and

(2) collect, preserve, and ship fetal tissue using one of these fetal tissue collection kits.

(b) The document titled "Kansas bureau of investigation fetal tissue collection kit instructions," dated October 26, 2005, is hereby adopted by reference. In accordance with the kit instructions and within two hours after completing the abortion, each physician shall perform, or shall ensure that the physician's staff performs, the following:

(1) Complete the evidence custody receipt form provided by the K.B.I. and contained in the kit;

(2) collect the amount and type of tissue prescribed by the kit instructions;

(3) preserve, secure, and label the tissue specimen as instructed;

(4) ship the tissue specimen and the original of the evidence custody receipt form to the K.B.I. within the time limit and in the manner specified by the kit instructions; and

(5) mail a copy of the evidence custody receipt form by first-class mail to the appropriate law enforcement department as follows:

(A) The city police department, if the abortion is performed within the city limits; or

(B) the county sheriff's department, if the abortion is performed outside the city limits.

(c) The evidence custody receipt form shall contain the following information in plain, legible printing or type-face:

(1) The name, address, and telephone number of the medical care facility or other location where the abortion is performed;

(2) the name, address, and telephone number of the physician performing the abortion;

(3) the name, date of birth, residential address, and telephone number of the minor upon whom the abortion is performed;

(4) the name, residential address, and telephone number of the parent or legal guardian of the minor upon whom the abortion is performed;

(5) the date and time when the tissue specimen is collected;

(6) the date on which the tissue specimen is shipped;

(7) the signature of the person collecting the tissue specimen; and

(8) the signature of the person shipping the tissue specimen. (Authorized by and implementing L. 2005, Ch. 149,

§ 3; effective, T-16-7-11-05, July 11, 2005; effective Nov. 18, 2005.)

16-10-3. Disposal of fetal tissue. When fetal tissue collected pursuant to K.A.R. 16-10-2 is no longer needed for evidentiary purposes, the fetal tissue shall be shipped by the K.B.I. to the medical care facility or other location at which the abortion was performed. The physician who performed the abortion shall ensure that all returned fetal tissue is properly handled and disposed of in accordance with K.A.R. 28-29-27. (Authorized by and implementing L. 2005, Ch. 149, § 3; effective, T-16-7-11-05, July 11, 2005; effective Nov. 18, 2005.)
