Notice to Private Activity Bond Applicants

Applications for allocation of 2006 Private Activity Bond (PAB) authority are now being accepted for qualified uses, as defined by the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, and amendments thereto.

The state of Kansas is projected to receive \$246,610,000 of federal authority for the issuance of PABs in calendar year 2006. Historically, the primary uses of this federal authority have included "qualified small issue bonds" used for construction and equipping of manufacturing facilities and beginning farmer programs; "exempt facility bonds" used by for-profit entities providing a public benefit, i.e., certain waste treatment facilities, qualified residential rental facilities, etc.; and "qualified mortgage bonds" issued to benefit first-time homebuyers. Allocations awarded by the Secretary of Commerce are subject to the provisions of K.S.A. 74-5060 et seq. and the limitations of the state volume cap.

Fees associated with PAB application and issuance are as follows:

(1) Application fee—A nonrefundable fee must accompany the application before the request can be processed. The application fee is determined as follows:

- \$250 for allocation requests up to \$5,000,000
- \$500 for allocation requests from \$5,000,001 to \$10,000,000

- \$1,000 for allocation requests from \$10,000,001 and above

(2) Issuance fee—an issuance fee for allocation amounts utilized, other than "qualified mortgage bonds" issued, shall be due and payable to the Kansas Department of Commerce at bond closing. Issuance fees shall be determined as follows:

Allocation Used	Fee
To \$2,000,000	5 basis points (.05%)
\$2,000,001 and above	10 basis points (.10%)

"Qualified mortgage bond" programs will be assessed a fee, upon issuance of each mortgage loan assisted through the program, equal to .5% of the PAB allocation used.

Issuance fees shall be remitted within 30 days of bond closing. Checks for both the application and issuance fees for nonhousing issues should be made payable to the Kansas Department of Commerce Bond Fee Fund. Checks for the issuance fees for housing activities should be made payable to the State Housing Trust Fund.

Contractors should read and be fully familiar with all contract documents before submitting a bid. In submitting a bid, the bidder warrants that it has read the contract documents and is fully familiar therewith and that it has visited the site of the work to fully inform itself as to all existing conditions and limitations, and shall include in its bid a sum to cover the cost of all items of the work.

Should a bidder find "defects" as defined in paragraph GC-3 of the General Conditions, it shall follow the procedures outlined in paragraph GC-3 to bring same to the attention of the city. Changes necessitated thereby shall be in the form of addenda issued by the consulting engineer.

All bidders shall verify that they have considered all written addenda. Neither the city nor the consulting engineer shall be responsible for oral instructions.

Any written addenda issued during the time of bidding shall be covered and included in the bid. There will be no clarifications or exceptions allowed on the bid. Bids are for a total bid package, total contract price.

Bids shall be made upon the form provided in ink or typewritten. Numbers shall be stated both in writing and in figures, the signature shall be long hand, and the complete form shall be without alteration or erasure. On alternate items for which a bid is not submitted, a written indication of "no bid" on the bid form is required.

No oral, telegraphic, facsimile or telephonic bids or alterations will be considered.

The following items must be included in the sealed envelope with the bid:

- b. 5% Bid Security—Bid Bond, Cashier's Check or Certified Check (see below)
- c. Signed Documents (KDOT Certifications)
 - Certification—Noncollusion & History of Debarment

Each bidder shall file with its bid a bid bond, a cashier's check or a certified check drawn on any acceptable bank, made payable to the city of Overland Park, Kansas, in an amount of not less than 5 percent of the total bid, which shall be retained by the city of Overland Park until a contract for the project has been executed. Bid bonds will be returned to the unsuccessful bidders, with the exception of the second qualifying bidder, at such time as their bids are rejected. The bid deposit of the successful bidder and the second qualifying bidder will be returned when satisfactory bonds in an amount equal to 100 percent of the contract amount, required insurance certificates and other required documents shall have been furnished and the contract documents have been executed.

In the event the successful bidder is unable to execute the contract, for whatever reason, the city may exercise its legal prerogatives, including, but not limited to, enforcement of its rights as to the bid security.

The city reserves the right to accept or reject any and all bids and to waive any technicalities or irregularities therein. Bids may be modified or withdrawn by written request of the bidder received in the office of the city clerk, prior to the time and date for bid opening, provided, however, that no bidder may withdraw its bid for a period of 30 days from the date set for the opening thereof. All bidders agree that rejection shall create no liability on the part of the city because of such rejection. It is understood by all bidders that an unsuccessful bidder has no cause of action against the city for bid preparation costs. The filing of any bid in response to this invitation shall constitute an agreement of the bidder to these conditions.

The work consists of the following: The reconstruction of approximately 8,800 feet of Burlington Northern Santa Fe (BNSF) double track from 3,600 feet north of Ridgeview Road to 2,100 feet south of Loula Street in Olathe, Kansas. Track reconstruction includes alignment shift and elevation of railroad mainline on retaining wall structure for the majority of alignment and the construction of railroad bridge structures over Ridgeview Road (steel I-girder with composite cast in place deck), Santa Fe Street (steel I-girder with cast in place deck), Park Street (steel thru plate with steel ballast pan deck) and Loula Street (steel thru plate with steel ballast pan deck). Other work items include grading, retaining walls, bridges, fencing, lighting, storm sewers and waterlines.

Facility Description: The proposed action is to modify and reissue a permit for an existing facility treating primarily domestic wastewater. The permit is being modified to cover an expansion of the wastewater treatment facility and to include monitoring of copper levels in the effluent discharge. The permit modification also includes a variance to K.A.R. 28-16-161, part a as noted below. The proposed permit includes limits for biochemical oxygen demand, total suspended solids and fecal coliform. Monitoring for ammonia, total recoverable copper and pH also will be required. Included in this permit is a schedule of compliance requiring the permittee complete construction of the expanded facility and achieve compliance with the permit not later than July 1, 2007. The permit requirements are pursuant to the Kansas Surface Water Quality Standards, K.A.R. 28-16-28(b-f), and Federal Surface Water Criteria, and are technology based.

Notice of variance from the requirements in K.A.R. 28-16-161:

The variance to K.A.R. 28-16-161 will allow the modification and expansion of existing Cell 3 without the minimum 10 feet of separation between the bottom of the cell and underlying groundwater table. The variance allows for an alternate design method to provide equivalent or increased protection of groundwater. The alternative design utilizes a constructed soil liner with a maximum seepage of less than 0.01 inches per day. The constructed soil liner will be installed over the entire modified cell including the expansion area and existing cell bottom and sides. Additionally, a thick layer of in-situ soils, with hydraulic conductivities of 2.3 X 10⁻⁷ cm/sec or less, underlies the lagoon site.

The Kansas Department of Health and Environment is soliciting comments regarding a proposed air quality construction permit. Goodland Energy Resources, LLC has applied for an air quality construction permit in accordance with the provisions of K.A.R. 28-19-300 to install a coal-fired steam electric generating facility near Goodland. Emissions of particulate matter (PM), PM equal to or less than 10 microns in diameter (PM₁₀), volatile organic compounds (VOCs), oxides of nitrogen (NOx), sulfur oxides (SOx) and carbon monoxide (CO) were evaluated during the permit review process.

The Kansas Department of Health and Environment is soliciting comments regarding a proposed reopening of an air quality-operating permit. A Class I Air Operating Permit was issued for the operation of a solid waste landfill located at 213 N.E. Belleview, Columbus. Wheatland Landfill owns and operates the landfill. The effective date of the permit was April 21, 2004. KDHE intends to reopen the permit for the purpose of removing inapplicable NSPS requirements. K.A.R. 28-19-513(e)(2) states that only those parts of the permit for which cause to reopen exists shall be affected by the reopening.

A copy of the proposed permit as modified, all supporting documentation and all information relied upon during the reopening process is available for a 30-day public review during normal business hours at the KDHE, Bureau of Air and Radiation, 1000 S.W. Jackson, Suite 310, Topeka, and at the KDHE Southeast District Office, 1500 W. 7th, Chanute. To obtain or review the proposed reopening and supporting documentation, contact Jennifer Burgdorfer, (785) 296-1581, at the KDHE central office, or Doug Cole, (620) 431-2390, at the KDHE Southeast District Office. The standard departmental cost will be assessed for any copies requested.

Direct written comments or questions regarding the documents to Jennifer Burgdorfer, KDHE, Bureau of Air and Radiation, 1000 S.W. Jackson, Suite 310, Topeka, 66612-1366. In order to be considered in formulating a final decision, written comments must be received before the close of business February 6.

A person may request a public hearing be held on the proposed action. The request for a public hearing shall be in writing and set forth the basis for the request. The written request must be submitted to Christy Thurman, KDHE, Bureau of Air and Radiation, not later than the close of business February 6 in order for the Secretary of Health and Environment to consider the request.

The U.S. Environmental Protection Agency has a 45-day review period, which will start concurrently with the 30-day public comment period, within which to object to the proposed reopening of the Class I operating permit. If the EPA has not objected in writing to the reopening

within the 45-day review period, any person may petition the administrator of the EPA to review the action. The 60-day public petition period will directly follow the EPA's 45-day review period. If the EPA waives its 45-day review period, the 60-day public petition period will start directly after the 30-day public comment period. Interested parties may contact KDHE to determine if the EPA's 45-day review period has been waived.

Any such petition shall be based only on the objections to the action that were raised with reasonable specificity during the public comment period provided for in this notice, unless the petitioner demonstrates that it was impracticable to raise such objections within such period or unless the grounds for such objection arose after such period.
