**Notice of Hearing on Proposed
Administrative Regulations**

A public hearing will be conducted by the Wildlife and Parks Commission at 7 p.m. Thursday, March 16, at the Kansas Natural History Museum, 6425 S.W. 6th Ave., Topeka, to consider the approval and adoption of proposed administrative regulations of the Kansas Department of Wildlife and Parks.

A workshop meeting on business of the Wildlife and Parks Commission will begin at 1:30 p.m. March 16 at the location listed above. The meeting will recess at 5:30 p.m., then resume at 7 p.m. at the same location for the regulatory hearing. There will be public comment periods at the beginning of the afternoon and evening meetings for any issues not on the agenda, and additional comment periods will be available during the meeting on agenda items. Old and new business also may be discussed at this time. If necessary to complete the hearing or other business matters, the commission will reconvene at 9 a.m. March 17 at the same location.

Any individual with a disability may request accommodation in order to participate in the public hearing and may request the proposed regulations and economic impact statements in an accessible format. Requests for accommodation should be made at least five working days in advance of the hearing by contacting Sheila Kemmis, commission secretary, at (620) 672-5911. Persons with a hearing impairment may call the Kansas Commission for the Deaf and Hard of Hearing at (800) 432-0698 to request special accommodations.

This 60-day notice period prior to the hearing constitutes a public comment period for the purpose of receiving written public comments on proposed administrative regulations. All interested parties may submit written comments prior to the hearing to the chairman of the commission, Kansas Department of Wildlife and Parks, 1020 S. Kansas Ave, Suite 200, Topeka, 66612, or to sheilak@wp.state.ks.us if electronically. All interested parties

will be given a reasonable opportunity at the hearing to express their views orally in regard to the adoption of the proposed regulations. During the hearing, all written and oral comments submitted by interested parties will be considered by the commission as a basis for approving, amending and approving, or rejecting the proposed regulations.

The regulations that will be heard during the regulatory hearing portion of the meeting are as follows:

K.A.R. 115-2-1. This permanent regulation sets general fee requirements for various issuances of the department. The proposed amendments include increasing big game hunt on your own land permit types to conform with big game landowner/tenant permit prices, making big game permits for youths under 16 half-price of the corresponding adult big game permits, and creation of a fee for a nonresident archery antelope permit.

Economic Impact Summary: The increase of various fees for permit types could result in an increase of \$102,575, all of which would accrue to the wildlife fee fund. Otherwise, the proposed amendments are not anticipated to have any appreciable economic impact on the department, other agencies or the public.

K.A.R. 115-2-4. This permanent regulation provides for fees related to boating and vessel registrations. The proposed amendment includes increasing the cost of duplicate issuances by \$5 to conform with the cost of other duplicate issuances within the department.

Economic Impact Summary: The increase could result in an additional \$1,660 generated in FY 2006 and an additional \$3,320 in FY 2007, all of which would accrue to the boating fee fund. Otherwise, the proposed amendments are not anticipated to have any appreciable economic impact on the department, other agencies or the public.

K.A.R. 115-4-6. This permanent regulation sets the boundaries for deer firearm management units. The proposed amendment includes adding Fort Leavenworth to the areas with urban unit designations, thereby allowing greater flexibility in season dates.

Economic Impact Summary: The proposed regulation is not anticipated to have any appreciable economic impact on the department, other agencies or the public.

K.A.R. 115-25-5. This exempt regulation sets the fall turkey season bag limits, dates and permit allocations. The proposed amendment would allow the fall turkey season to run continuously from the opening date of October 1 through January 31 of the following year.

Economic Impact Summary: The proposed regulation is not anticipated to have any appreciable economic impact on the department, other agencies or the public.

The Kansas Department of Health and Environment is soliciting comments regarding a proposed air quality operating permit. Krause Plow Corporation has applied for a Class I operating permit renewal in accordance with the provisions of K.A.R. 28-19-510 et seq. The purpose of a Class I permit is to identify the sources and types of regulated air pollutants emitted from the facility; the emission limitations, standards and requirements applicable to each source; and the monitoring, record keeping and reporting requirements applicable to each source as of the effective date of permit issuance.

Krause Plow Corporation, Hutchinson, owns and operates Farm Machinery and Equipment Manufacturing Facility located at 305 S. Monroe, Hutchinson.

A copy of the proposed permit, permit application, all supporting documentation and all information relied upon during the permit application review process is available for a 30-day public review during normal business hours at the KDHE, Bureau of Air and Radiation, 1000 S.W. Jackson, Suite 310, Topeka; and a copy of the proposed permit can be reviewed at the KDHE North Central District Office, 2501 Market Place, Suite D, Salina. To obtain or review the proposed permit and supporting documentation, contact Dayne Moreton, (785) 296-1691, at the KDHE central office; and to review the proposed permit only, contact Stan Marshall, (785) 827-9639, at the KDHE North Central District Office. The standard departmental cost will be assessed for any copies requested.

Direct written comments or questions regarding the proposed permit to Dayne Moreton, KDHE, Bureau of Air and Radiation, 1000 S.W. Jackson, Suite 310, Topeka, 66612-1366. In order to be considered in formulating a final permit decision, written comments must be received before the close of business February 13.

A person may request a public hearing be held on the proposed permit. The request for a public hearing shall be in writing and set forth the basis for the request. The written request must be submitted to Christy Thurman,

Bureau of Air and Radiation, not later than the close of business February 13 in order for the Secretary of Health and Environment to consider the request.

The U.S. Environmental Protection Agency has a 45-day review period, which will start concurrently with the 30-day public comment period, within which to object to the proposed permit. If the EPA has not objected in writing to the issuance of the permit within the 45-day review period, any person may petition the administrator of the EPA to review the permit. The 60-day public petition period will directly follow the EPA's 45-day review period. Interested parties may contact KDHE to determine if the EPA's 45-day review period has been waived.

Any such petition shall be based only on objections to the permit that were raised with reasonable specificity during the public comment period provided for in this notice, unless the petitioner demonstrates that it was impracticable to raise such objections within such period, or unless the grounds for such objection arose after such period. This 60-day notice of the public hearing shall constitute a public comment period for the purpose of receiving written public comments on the proposed rules and regulations. All interested parties may submit written comments prior to the hearing to the executive director of the Board of Accountancy, Suite 556, Landon State Office Building, 900 S.W. Jackson, Topeka, 66612. All interested parties will be given a reasonable opportunity to present their views orally on the adoption of the proposed regulations during the hearing. In order to give all parties an opportunity to present their views, it may be necessary to request that each participant limit any oral presentation to five minutes.

Any individual with a disability may request accommodation in order to participate in the public hearing and may request the proposed regulations and economic impact statements in an accessible format. Requests for accommodation should be made at least five working days in advance of the hearing by contacting Joanne Peterson at (785) 296-2162. Handicapped parking is located at the south end of Landon Building, and the north entrance to the building is accessible to individuals with disabilities.

These regulations are proposed for adoption on a permanent basis. A summary of the proposed regulations and their economic impact follows:

K.A.R. 74-4-1a. Experience requirement for attest services. Amendments to this regulation are to incorporate new standards promulgated by the Public Company Accounting Oversight Board (PCAOB) relative to firms who perform audits for public companies, and update materials adopted by reference.

K.A.R. 74-4-7. Continuing professional education requirements. Amendments to this regulation eliminate the minimum 20-hour requirement of continuing professional education hours in each year of the biennial period and restrict the number of hours allowed to be claimed as instructor, discussion leader or speaker, to include preparation.

K.A.R. 74-4-8. Continuing professional education programs; requirements. Amendments to this regulation restrict the number of continuing professional education hours allowed to be claimed for personal development courses and clarify the requirements for self-study programs.

K.A.R. 74-5-2. Definitions. Amendments to this regulation update and add materials adopted by reference.

K.A.R. 74-5-101. Independence. Amendments to this regulation are for clarification and to update materials adopted by reference.

K.A.R. 74-5-102. Integrity and objectivity. Amendments to this regulation are for clarification.

K.A.R. 74-5-202. Compliance with standards. Amendments to this regulation add a new entity that promulgates standards and update materials adopted by reference.

K.A.R. 74-5-203. Accounting principles. Amendments to this regulation are for clarification.

K.A.R. 74-11-6. Definitions. Amendments to this regulation are for clarification and to update materials adopted by reference.

K.A.R. 74-11-7. Renewal of a firm's registration. Amendments to this regulation are for clarification.

This 60-day notice of the public hearing shall constitute a public comment period for the purpose of receiving written public comments on the proposed rules and regulations. All interested parties may submit written comments prior to the hearing to George Teagarden, Livestock Commissioner, 708 S.W. Jackson, Topeka, 66603. All interested parties will be given a reasonable opportunity to present their views orally on the adoption of the proposed regulations during the hearing. In order to give all parties an opportunity to present their views, it may be necessary to request each participant to limit any oral presentation to five minutes.

K.A.R. 9-32-1 adopts the "definitions" from part I of "scrapie eradication: uniform methods and rules," publication APHIS 91-55-079 of the United States Department

of Agriculture's Animal and Plant Health Inspection Service (USDA/APHIS), dated June 1, 2005.

K.A.R. 9-32-2 establishes the "identification requirements."

K.A.R. 9-32-3 establishes the criteria for the "movement of scrapie-infected or scrapie-exposed sheep and goats."

K.A.R. 9-32-4 establishes the criteria for the "movement into Kansas of sheep and goats intended for breeding."

K.A.R. 9-32-5 establishes the criteria for the "movement into Kansas of sheep and goats intended for slaughter."

K.A.R. 9-32-6 establishes the criteria for the "exhibition sheep and goats."

K.A.R. 9-32-7 establishes the criteria for "sheep and goats consigned to Kansas livestock markets."

K.A.R. 9-32-8 establishes the criteria for "recordkeeping requirements."

The costs associated with these regulations shall be paid by the owner or seller. There is no fiscal impact to consumers or the agency due to the regulations.

(6) The fee for all inspections performed by the chief or deputy inspector, including shop inspections, shop reviews, inspections performed at the request of the boiler operator, inspections conducted due to a determination that a boiler operator is not operating a boiler in compli-

ance with boiler operation regulations, and inspections of secondhand or used boilers, shall be \$500.00 per day. If a state boiler inspector participates in a national board "R" stamp review conducted by the national board of boiler and vessel inspectors or if a state boiler inspector inspects welded repairs to a boiler, the fee shall be \$500.00 per day.

(b) Certificate fee.

(1) The certificate of inspection fee shall be \$30.00.

(2) Replacement of lost or misplaced certificates shall be \$10.00.
