## Notice of Hearing

The Kansas Department of Health and Environment has prepared seven Total Maximum Daily Loads (TMDLs) for water bodies in the Kansas-Lower Republican Basin that are impaired by not meeting state water quality standards. Four of these TMDLs address new impairments on streams and lakes in Johnson and Shawnee counties. These TMDLs are:

1. Cedar Creek in Johnson County — Nitrate
2. Lake Olathe in Johnson County — Eutrophication
3. Shunganunga Creek in Shawnee County — Dissolved Oxygen
4. Soldier Creek in Shawnee and Jackson Counties — Impaired Biology

Three of the TMDLs are revisions of existing TMDLs completed in 1999. These TMDLs are updated with current data, revised water quality standards and applicable water quality management programs to implement the TMDLs. These TMDLs are:

1. Lower Kansas River from Lecompton to Kansas City — E. coli Bacteria
2. Mill Creek in Johnson County — Impaired Biology
3. Tuttle Creek Lake — Atrazine

The TMDLs may be viewed at the Kansas Department of Health and Environment Web site: <http://kdheks.gov/tmdl/>. Additionally, copies of the TMDLs can be obtained by contacting the Bureau of Water, Watershed Planning Section, at (785) 296-6170.

A public hearing is scheduled to take public comments on any of these TMDLs at 1 p.m. Monday, January 30, in Room 530 of the Curtis State Office Building, 1000 S.W. Jackson, Topeka. Written comments will continue to be accepted by KDHE until 5 p.m. February 10.

The Watershed Planning Section will prepare a response to any comments received at the hearing or in writing and submit those comments and the KDHE response to the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency at the time these seven TMDLs are submitted. The seven TMDLs will be submitted to the EPA after consideration of any comments received during the public hearing process.

Any individual with a disability may request accommodation in order to participate in the public hearing process and may request the proposed TMDLs in an accessible format. Requests for accommodation should be made at least five working days in advance of the hearing by contacting KDHE.

## Executive Order 06-01

WHEREAS, on August 15, 2003, at approximately 6:00 a.m., the small city of Westwood, Kansas experienced its first reported homicide.

WHEREAS, David "Ray" Ninemire, a long tenured store manager of the Westwood Apple Market, 4701 Mission Road, Westwood, Kansas, was finishing up his work shift. A female employee had just reported for work and was preparing to open her checkout lane. She was approached from behind by a male subject wearing a top hat, with a fake beard pulled up high on his face, a black medium length coat and black pants. The subject was described as being about 5'5" and thin build.

WHEREAS, the subject displayed a .9 mm handgun, grabbed the female employee by the arm, and pulled her towards the customer service window.

WHEREAS, upon hearing the female employee scream, Mr. Ninemire ran to the front of the store to her aid where he encountered the armed subject. The subject began shooting towards Mr. Ninemire, who was struck in the upper right thigh area, severing the femoral artery.

WHEREAS, the subject then calmly walked towards the exit doors where a customer was entering the store. The customer dropped to the floor, posing no threat. The subject began firing the weapon at the customer, who was subsequently struck by two bullet fragments, one lodging in an ear and one in an arm.

WHEREAS, the killer was last seen walking east from the store along West 47th Street and then north on Lloyd Street into Kansas City, Kansas.

WHEREAS, Mr. Ninemire's coworkers and responding police officers did what they could to save his life. He bled to death while lying on the floor before medical help could arrive.

WHEREAS, Westwood Assistant Chief of Police Dan Brewster states, "Ray Ninemire was a hero. He came to the aid of a female friend and coworker and was killed in the process. Ray has a loving family and a community that demands that this case be solved. Anything that I could write about this man, the Christian path he lived, the imprint he left on those who knew him would fall short in describing the person he was before 6:00 a.m. on August 15, of 2003."

NOW, THEREFORE, by virtue of authority vested in me by K.S.A. 75-113, I, Kathleen Sebelius, Governor of the State of Kansas, do hereby offer a reward of five thousand dollars (\$5,000) for information leading to the arrest and conviction of the individual or individuals who committed the homicide of David "Ray" Ninemire.

This document shall be filed with the Secretary of State as Executive Order 06-01, and shall become effective immediately.

**Executive Order 06-02**

WHEREAS, military forces in Kansas, composed of Active, Reserve and National Guard, contribute to peace for the state, nation and world; and

WHEREAS, the four major military installations in Kansas provide thousands of jobs and more than \$2 billion annually for Kansas' economy; and

WHEREAS, men and women in the military, and their families, whose talents contribute to the well being of their communities are valued as important assets to our State; and

WHEREAS, it is essential to preserve all military and related jobs for the benefit of Kansas families and the Kansas economy; and

WHEREAS, the State of Kansas desires to strengthen the presence and expansion of military facilities; and

WHEREAS, the State of Kansas should support and appreciate the men and women who serve our nation; and

WHEREAS, by Executive Order 98-5 dated July 2, 1998, Governor Bill Graves established the Governor's Military Affairs Coordinating Council; and

WHEREAS, the provision of Executive Order 98-5 provided for the expiration of the Executive Order on May 1, 2000; and

WHEREAS, Executive Order 00-06 extended the Governor's Military Affairs Coordinating Council until November 1, 2002; and

WHEREAS, Executive Order 02-05 extended the Governor's Military Affairs Coordinating Council until May 1, 2003; and

WHEREAS, Executive Order 03-06 issued by Governor Sebelius extended the Governor's Military Affairs Coordinating Council until May 1, 2005; and

WHEREAS, Executive Order 05-01 issued by Governor Sebelius extended the Governor's Military Affairs Coordinating Council until May 7, 2007 unless rescinded earlier or lengthened by executive order.

NOW, THEREFORE, pursuant to the authority vested in me as Governor of the State of Kansas, I hereby incor-

porate by reference Executive Orders 98-5, 00-06, 02-05, 03-06 and 05-01 and continue said Governor's Military Affairs Coordinating Council which will be renamed and hereinafter known as the Governor's Military Council, until May 1, 2007 unless rescinded earlier or lengthened by executive order, with the following purposes and charges:

1. The Council shall be composed of no more than thirty members appointed by the Governor. The Governor will designate one member as Chair. Base/Post Commanders may serve as ex-officio members of the Council.
2. Members of the Council shall serve at the pleasure of the Governor and shall meet upon the call of the chairperson as necessary to carry out the duties outlined in this executive order.
3. Members of the Council shall receive no compensation, subsistence allowance, mileage or expenses from the State of Kansas.
4. The Council's duty will be to initiate, act upon and consider all necessary strategies to:
  - a. Optimize the military presence in Kansas through removal of operational impediments, increasing operating efficiencies, and recruitment/acquisition of new missions and force structure;
  - b. Actively foster close, effective cooperation among the installations and public and private sectors throughout the State;
  - c. Aggressively pursue initiatives to enhance the quality of life for all military personnel, active and retired;
  - d. Promote Kansas as a desired location for all Department of Defense retirees;
  - e. Assist in the transfer of technology between the military and the private sector to enhance the competitive posture of both in the national and global market;
  - f. Explore and develop outreach opportunities for individuals retiring from military service to use their talents and skills as members of the Kansas workforce;
  - g. Assist in the development, coordination and execution of strategy required by any future change in missions proposed by the Department of Defense.

This document shall be filed with the Secretary of State as Executive Order No. 06-02 and shall become effective immediately.

**Economic Impact:** The Department of Commerce requested the increase from 5 percent to 10 percent administrative overhead cost to better reflect the expense of fund raising and marketing of the tax credits that these

foundations incur. The foundations must solicit donors through mail, phone and personal meetings, and thus incur travel, printing and postage costs well above the initial 5 percent allowed. They also must pay for an independent audit each year and provide record keeping and quarterly reports to the Department of Commerce and Department of Revenue.

## Article 9.—EDUCATION

(Editor's Note: A portion of subsection (b) in K.A.R. 66-9-4 was published incorrectly in the January 19, 2006 Kansas Register. The entire regulation is being republished below. The effective date of this regulation will remain February 3, 2006.)

**66-9-4. Engineering curriculum approved by the board.** "A college or university program that is adequate in its preparation of students for the practice of engineering" shall mean any of the following:

(a) A baccalaureate engineering curriculum accredited by the accreditation board for engineering and technology (ABET);

(b) a curriculum for a master's degree or doctorate in engineering, if all college coursework is reviewed and approved by the board and found to be of a standard equivalent to that of an ABET-approved baccalaureate engineering curriculum; or

(c) a baccalaureate engineering curriculum outside the United States that has not been accredited by ABET but meets the following requirements:

(1) Is evaluated by an organization approved by the board and found to be of a standard equivalent to that of ABET; and

(2) is reviewed and approved by the board. (Authorized by K.S.A. 74-7013; implementing K.S.A. 74-7021; effective May 1, 1984; amended May 4, 1992; amended Feb. 22, 1993; amended Feb. 14, 1994; amended Feb. 4, 2000; amended Feb. 3, 2006.)
