Notice of Hearing on Proposed  
Administrative Regulations

A public hearing will be conducted at 10 a.m. Tuesday, May 30, in the first floor hearing room of the State Corporation Commission, 1500 S.W. Arrowhead, Topeka, to consider the adoption of the proposed revision of the Kansas motor carrier regulation K.A.R. 82-4-3a. A summary of the regulation and its economic impact follows:

**K.A.R. 82-4-3a. Hours of service.** Prior to April 29, 2005, all regulations regarding motor carrier safety were encompassed in K.A.R. 82-4-3. On April 29, 2005, K.A.R. 82-4-3 was amended and the various safety regulations contained in K.A.R. 82-4-3 were separated into 13 new regulations, K.A.R. 82-4-3a through K.A.R. 82-4-3m. The Federal Motor Carrier Safety Administration (FMCSA) has recently determined that the state is not in compliance with the Federal Motor Carrier Safety Regulations (FMCSR) by not adopting 49 CFR Part 395, specifically Part 395.8(e) as written. As such, the state is in jeopardy of losing millions of dollars in Motor Carrier Safety Assistance Program (MCSAP) funding and Kansas highway funds. 49 CFR Part 395.8(e) states: "Failure to complete the record of duty activities of this section or § 395.15, failure to preserve a record of such duty activities, or making of false reports in connection with such duty activities shall make the driver and/or the carrier liable to prosecution."

If a state fails to adopt the required federal regulations, identical to or within the tolerance guidelines for the FMCSRs and identical to the hazardous material regulations (HMRs), but enacts a law or regulation that results in an incompatible rule, the state will not be eligible for

Basic Program Funds nor Incentive Funds. Simply, the state is at risk of losing a large amount of federal funding and programming if the state is found to be out of compliance with federal regulations.

The commission anticipates no economic impact through the implementation of this regulation. The commission anticipates impact on other governmental agencies or private entities and individuals because failure of the commission to be in compliance with FMCSRs means the state loses millions of dollars in federal grants and at least 40 full-time equivalent (FTE) employees that are funded through MCSAP.

Due to the nature of the regulation, the proposed revision of the regulation constitutes the least expensive and least intrusive means by which to protect the public interests in this area.

This 60-day notice of the public hearing shall constitute a public comment period for the purpose of receiving written public comments on the proposed rule and regulation. All interested parties may submit written comments prior to the hearing to Laurie Pickle, Assistant General Counsel, State Corporation Commission, 1500 S.W. Arrowhead, Topeka, 66604. All interested parties will be given a reasonable opportunity to present their views orally on the adoption of the proposed regulation during the hearing.

## Request for Comments

The Kansas Department of Health and Environment is soliciting comments regarding a proposed air quality construction permit. Coffeyville Resources Refining & Marketing, LLC has applied for an air quality construction permit in accordance with the provisions of K.A.R. 28-19-300 to modify the refinery in Coffeyville by making several modifications to process units that allow the facility to increase production. Emissions of particulate matter (PM), PM equal to or less than 10 microns in diameter (PM<sub>10</sub>), volatile organic compounds (VOCs), oxides of nitrogen (NOx), sulfur oxides (SOx) and carbon monoxide (CO) were evaluated during the permit review process.

Coffeyville Resources Refining & Marketing owns and operates a petroleum refinery located at 400 N. Linden, Coffeyville.

A public comment period has been established until April 24 to allow citizens the opportunity to express any concerns or comments they may have about this permitting action. A public hearing has been tentatively scheduled by KDHE at 7 p.m. April 25 at the Coffeyville Community College, Wilson Hall East, ITV Conference Room, 400 W. 11th, Coffeyville, to receive comments on the proposed issuance of the draft air quality construction permit. Topeka, 66612-1366. Comments also may be submitted at the public hearing.

#### Notice of Hearing on Proposed Administrative Regulations

The Kansas Department of Health and Environment, Division of Environment, Bureau of Environmental Field Services, will conduct a public hearing to consider the proposed revisions to the Kansas Surface Water Quality Standards, K.A.R. 28-16-28g, including revisions to the Kansas Surface Water Register. The hearing will be held via video conferencing at 2 p.m. Thursday, May 25, at the following locations: KDHE Northwest District Office, 2301 E. 13th, Hays; KDHE North Central District Office, 2501 Market Place, Suite D, Salina; KDHE Northeast District Office, 800 W. 24th, Lawrence; KDHE Southwest District Office, 302 W. McArtor Road, Dodge City; KDHE South Central District Office, 130 S. Market, sixth floor, Wichita; KDHE Southeast District Office, 1500 W. 7th, Chanute; and Curtis State Office Building, Garden Level, IS Conference Room B, 1000 S.W. Jackson, Topeka. A public availability session will be held at 1 p.m. prior to the public hearing to provide persons an opportunity to review the findings of use attainability analyses (UAAs) used to establish designated uses. If an alternate hearing location is necessary, the hearing will be held in Room

530 of the Curtis State Office Building with an informational meeting being held prior to the hearing at 1 p.m.

Following is a summary of the proposed amendments:

**K.A.R. 28-16-28g** is the classification and use designation section of the Kansas Surface Water Quality Standards. Designated uses of surface waters are listed in the Kansas Surface Water Register, which is adopted by reference in K.A.R. 28-16-28g. The register identifies major classified streams, lakes and wetlands and the uses that are existing or attainable. In the period of April 1-October 31, 2004, 658 stream segments and 89 lakes were evaluated by a UAA to determine the appropriate use designation. Seventy-nine stream segments are proposed to be removed from classification, 352 stream segments are proposed as secondary contact recreation, and 223 stream segments are proposed as primary contact recreation. Two stream segments are proposed for expected aquatic life, and four stream segments have been rerouted and combined to form one segment. Eighty-seven lakes are proposed for irrigation, livestock watering, domestic water supply, industrial water supply and groundwater recharge, and two lakes are proposed for primary contact recreation and food procurement.

There are no additional costs of compliance resulting from these changes in recreational use designations. The department estimates an annual cost to perform 500 recreational UAAs as required by K.S.A. 82a-2004 and amendments thereto to be \$200,000 per year. Currently, this cost is funded by the State Water Plan and state general fund.

The time period between the publication of this notice and the scheduled hearing constitutes a 60-day public comment period for the purpose of receiving written public comments on the proposed regulatory action. ## Request for Comments

The Kansas Department of Health and Environment has received a permit modification request to expand the Franklin County construction and demolition landfill currently operating under KDHE Permit 159. The landfill is located at 3323 Osborne Terrace, east of Ottawa in the Northwest Quarter of Section 28 and the Northeast Quarter of Section 29, Township 16 South, Range 20 East. Only construction and demolition wastes, as defined by Kansas statutes, would be allowed for disposal into the landfill. The landfill's proposed expansion will increase the disposal area from approximately 5.1 acres to 22.6 acres. With an estimated capacity of 463,000 cubic yards, the expanded construction and demolition landfill's estimated life is about 17 years.

The Franklin County Commission has certified that the application described herein is consistent with the county's solid waste management plan and local land use restrictions or zoning. KDHE has reviewed the application and found it to be in conformance with state solid waste statutes and regulations.

KDHE is providing public notice of its intent to approve Franklin County's proposed landfill expansion. However, a final decision to approve the expansion has not been made, and KDHE will consider information gathered during the public comment period before making a final decision. A copy of the administrative record, which includes the permit application, engineering drawings, draft permit and other information with respect to this permit action, will be available for public review through April 28, during normal business hours, at the following locations:

For the purposes of these regulations, a "hazardous waste facility" as defined in K.S.A. 65-3430, and amendments thereto, shall not be considered to be an eligible property.

(d) "Environmental contamination" means "pollution" or "contamination," as those terms are used in the following acts and statutes, as well as any regulations adopted under the authority of those statutes, unless this act or any of the following acts specifically exclude or exempt certain forms of pollution or contamination from the provisions of this act:

(1) K.S.A. 65-3452a through K.S.A. 65-3457a, and amendments thereto, concerning hazardous substances;

(2) the voluntary cleanup and property redevelopment act, K.S.A. 65-34,161 through K.S.A. 65-34,174, and amendments thereto;

(3) the Kansas drycleaner environmental response act, K.S.A. 65-34,141 through K.S.A. 65-34,155, and amendments thereto;

(4) K.S.A. 65-3430 through K.S.A. 65-3447, and amendments thereto, concerning hazardous waste;

(5) K.S.A. 65-161 through K.S.A. 65-171y, and amendments thereto, concerning the waters of the state;

(6) the Kansas storage tank act, K.S.A. 65-34,100 through K.S.A. 65-34,130, and amendments thereto; and

(7) K.S.A. 65-3401 through K.S.A. 65-3427, and amendments thereto, concerning solid waste.

(e) "Environmental use control agreement" means a legal document specifically defining the environmental use controls and other related requirements for an eligible property according to K.A.R. 28-73-3. The agreement shall be issued by the secretary and shall be signed by the applicant. The signatures of the secretary and applicant shall be notarized, and as required by K.S.A. 65-1,225, and amendments thereto, the agreement shall be recorded by the register of deeds in the county where the eligible property is located.

(f) "Financial assurance" means any method of guaranteeing or ensuring adequate financial capability that is approved by the secretary as part of a long-term care agreement. One or more of the following methods of financial assurance may be required by the secretary as a part of a long-term care agreement:

- (1) An environmental insurance policy;
- (2) a financial guarantee;
- (3) a surety bond guaranteeing payment or performance or a similar performance bond;
- (4) an irrevocable letter of credit;
- (5) documentation of the applicant's qualification as self-insurer; and
- (6) other methods the secretary determines are adequate to ensure the protection of public health and safety and the environment.

Federal and state governmental entities that qualify as applicants under these regulations shall not be required to provide financial assurance.

(g) "Legal description" means identification of the land boundaries of an eligible property that is subject to an environmental use control agreement. The identification of land boundaries shall be provided by one or more of the following methods:

(1) A definite and unequivocal identification of lines and boundaries that contains dimensions to enable the description to be plotted and retraced and that describes the legal surveys by county and by at least one of the following additional identifiers:

(A) Government lot;

(B) aliquot parts; or

(C) quarter section, section, township, and range;

(2) a metes and bounds legal survey commencing with a corner marked and established in the U.S. public land survey system; or

(3) the identifying number or other description of the subject lot, block, or subdivision if the land is located in a recorded subdivision or recorded addition to the subdivision.

(h) "Legal survey" means a boundary survey or land survey that is performed by a land surveyor licensed in the state of Kansas and that is conducted for both of the following purposes:

(1) Describing, documenting, and locating the boundary lines of an eligible property, a portion of an eligible property, or both; and

(2) plotting a parcel of land that includes the eligible property.

(i) "Long-term care agreement" means a legally binding document that is entered into as provided in K.A.R. 28-73-4 by an applicant and the secretary and that describes the responsibilities and financial obligations of the applicant to fund the department's inspection and maintenance activities at a category 3 property, as described in K.S.A. 65-1,226, and amendments thereto.

(j) "Residual contamination" means environmental contamination remaining at a property that prohibits the unrestricted use of that property.

(k) "Unrestricted use" means that there are no limits or conditions placed on the use of a property, including use for residential purposes. (Authorized by K.S.A. 2004 Supp. 65-1,232; implementing K.S.A. 2004 Supp. 65-1,224 and 65-1,228; effective April 7, 2006.)

**28-73-2. Application.** (a) Each applicant shall submit an application to the secretary, as provided by the act and these regulations.

(b) If an application is determined by the secretary to be incomplete, written notification shall be provided to the applicant by the secretary identifying the documentation, data, or other information that is needed to complete the application, and the application shall be returned to the applicant. The applicant may then submit a revised application package, provide the additional information as required by the secretary, or withdraw the application.

(c) If the applicant is a person or entity that does not own the eligible property, but is the landowner's authorized representative, the applicant shall provide a notarized statement from the landowner or landowners specifically authorizing the applicant to act on the

landowner's behalf or a judicial decree assigning this authority to the applicant.

(d) If the owner of the eligible property is a local, state, or federal governmental entity, the signature of an authorized governmental official shall be considered as a sufficient basis for executing and submitting the application. (Authorized by K.S.A. 2004 Supp. 65-1,232; implementing K.S.A. 2004 Supp. 65-1,221, 65-1,222, and 65-1,224; effective April 7, 2006.)

**28-73-3. Environmental use control agreements.**

(a) If the secretary approves an application for environmental use controls, an environmental use control agreement for the eligible property shall be issued by the secretary in a standardized format that contains all of the following components, as applicable to that eligible property:

(1) A description of the control, restriction, prohibition, or limitation that constitutes each of the environmental use controls proposed by the applicant in the application package and approved by the secretary;

(2) a legal description of the eligible property;

(3) authorization for the department and the department's contractors to have access to the eligible property as required by the act;

(4) a statement of the funding requirements established by the secretary as specified in the act or, for category 3 property, a reference incorporating the long-term care agreement required by K.S.A. 65-1,226 and amendments thereto and K.A.R. 28-73-4;

(5) for category 3 property, a statement indicating whether financial assurance is required, as specified in K.S.A. 65-1,224, and amendments thereto, K.A.R. 28-73-1, and K.A.R. 28-73-5;

(6) the length of time during which the environmental use control agreement is to be in effect;

(7) a description of any monitoring, inspection, or maintenance requirements;

(8) a description of the specific terms and conditions that are to be applied as part of the environmental use controls for the eligible property;

(9) a description of the enforcement provisions that are authorized by K.S.A. 65-1,229, and amendments thereto;

(10) a list of any local, state, or federal government restrictions, prohibitions, or zoning requirements that pertain to the eligible property;

(11) an acknowledgment of the environmental use control agreement that is to be endorsed with the seal of the register of deeds in and for the county where the eligible property is located, pursuant to K.S.A. 19-1206, and amendments thereto; and

(12) a description of any other requirements established for the eligible property by the secretary to ensure the protection of public health and safety and the environment.

(b) Upon approval of an application, the following documents shall be sent to the applicant by the secretary:

(1) A letter approving the application; and

(2) the environmental use control agreement with the notarized signature of the secretary.

(c) In order for the environmental use control agreement to be effective, upon receipt of the agreement the

applicant shall return to the secretary the environmental use control agreement with the notarized signature of the applicant and the seal of the register of deeds indicating that the agreement has been recorded as required by K.S.A. 65-1,225, and amendments thereto. The applicant shall submit with the agreement any payment necessary to fulfill the funding requirements established by the environmental use control agreement.

(d) The recorded copy of the environmental use control agreement shall be tracked by the department as specified in K.S.A. 65-1,230, and amendments thereto. (Authorized by K.S.A. 2004 Supp. 65-1,232; implementing K.S.A. 2004 Supp. 65-1,224, 65-1,225, 65-1,226, and 65-1,228; effective April 7, 2006.)

**28-73-4. Long-term care agreements for category 3 property.** (a) As provided in K.S.A. 65-1,226, and amendments thereto, a long-term care agreement between the secretary and the applicant shall be required for each category 3 property.

(b) Each long-term care agreement for a category 3 property entered into by an applicant and the secretary as provided by K.S.A. 65-1,226, and amendments thereto, shall include a provision for a funding requirement in an amount that will reimburse the department for all direct and indirect costs incurred by the department in implementing and administering the environmental use control agreement and performing long-term care at the property, including costs for the following departmental activities conducted for the purpose of inspecting, monitoring, investigating, and evaluating environmental use controls and remedial progress at the property:

(1) Reviewing documents related to the site, including the following:

(A) Inspection, monitoring, and progress reports;

(B) operation and maintenance records;

(C) reports related to spills of contaminants at the site;

(D) reports related to permits issued for the eligible property; and

(E) pertinent historical documents;

(2) monitoring and inspecting remediation activities and monitoring wells, protective structures, remedial systems, and any other features directly related to or associated with an environmental use control on the eligible property;

(3) searching and reviewing records and files related to the eligible property, including historical files, county tax records, county property records, and zoning records;

(4) collecting environmental samples, including quality assurance and quality control samples; and

(5) performing laboratory analyses on environmental samples collected to monitor and evaluate remedial progress at the eligible property.

(c) (1) If the applicant is required to provide financial assurance for a category 3 property, the long-term care agreement shall identify the initial amount of financial assurance required and one or more of the financial assurance methods established by the secretary in accordance with K.A.R. 28-73-5, which the applicant shall maintain for the period of time the long-term care agreement is in effect.

*(continued)*

(2) The long-term care agreement shall state that, as the amount of the financial assurance or the financial assurance method is revised in subsequent years as provided in K.A.R. 28-73-5, the most recent revised amount or method approved by the secretary shall be deemed to be incorporated into the long-term care agreement and shall supercede any prior amount or method.

(d) The long-term care agreement shall clearly define the requirements that apply to the secretary and the applicant and their respective responsibilities. (Authorized by K.S.A. 2004 Supp. 65-1,232; implementing K.S.A. 2004 Supp. 65-1,224, 65-1,226, and 65-1,230; effective April 7, 2006.)

**28-73-5. Financial assurance.** (a) Any applicant requesting approval of an environmental use control for a category 3 property may be required by the secretary to provide and maintain financial assurance in an amount equal to or greater than one or both of the following:

(1) The estimated amount of the funding requirement set out in the long-term care agreement as provided by K.A.R. 28-73-4; and

(2) the estimated amount of the funding necessary to implement contingent remedies that will be used to protect public health and safety and the environment if the proposed remedial activity fails.

(b) Each applicant required by the secretary to provide and maintain financial assurance shall submit a detailed written estimate to the secretary, in current dollars, of the estimated amount of financial assurance required as specified in subsection (a) and shall propose one or more methods of financial assurance. The written estimate and the proposed method or methods of financial assurance shall be reviewed by the secretary and either approved or, if the secretary determines that either the written estimate or the proposed financial assurance method is inadequate, disapproved. If the secretary disapproves the written estimate or the proposed financial assurance method, or both, a written notice shall be provided by the secretary to the applicant explaining the basis for the disapproval. The applicant may correct the identified inadequacies and submit a revised written estimate and proposed financial assurance method to the secretary for further review.

(c) Once approved by the secretary, the initial amount and method of financial assurance shall be documented in the long-term care agreement for the eligible property.

(d) Each applicant required to provide and maintain financial assurance shall submit proof of the initial, approved financial assurance to the secretary before the environmental use control agreement is issued.

(e) On or before March 31 of each calendar year, each owner, as defined by the act, who entered into a long-term care agreement that establishes a financial assurance requirement shall submit to the secretary a revised written estimate, in current dollars, of the amount of financial assurance required in subsection (a).

(f) The revised written estimate shall be reviewed by the secretary. Written notice that the revised written estimate has been approved or that additional adjustments are required to the revised written estimate or method of financial assurance shall be provided by the secretary.

Adjustments to the amount of the required financial assurance or the financial assurance method, or both, may be required for any of the following reasons:

(1) Changes in the estimated costs of the funding requirement for the eligible property as specified in paragraph (a)(1);

(2) changes in the estimated costs of implementing contingent remedies that will be used to protect public health and safety and the environment if the proposed remedial activity fails as specified in paragraph (a)(2);

(3) changes in the risks to public health and safety and the environment posed by a potential release from the eligible property;

(4) documented changes in the financial viability of an owner or the provider of a financial assurance method; or

(5) changes in estimated costs based on inflation.

(g) Each owner required by the secretary to maintain financial assurance shall submit an updated proof of financial assurance within 45 days of receipt of the secretary's written notice in subsection (f). The proof shall be based on the approved amount and method of financial assurance described in the notice.

(h) Each applicant who enters into an environmental use control agreement for a category 3 property that includes a financial assurance requirement shall comply with the following conditions:

(1) Provide and continuously maintain financial assurance in an amount equal to or greater than the latest approved written cost estimate throughout the period the environmental use control agreement is in effect; and

(2) comply with the provisions of the document titled, "procedure for demonstrating financial assurance at property with environmental use controls" as published by the department on August 31, 2005, and hereby adopted by reference. (Authorized by K.S.A. 2004 Supp. 65-1,232; implementing K.S.A. 2004 Supp. 65-1,224 and 65-1,226; effective April 7, 2006.)

**28-73-6. Duration of environmental use controls.**

(a) Each environmental use control shall remain in effect in perpetuity, unless the secretary approves, in writing, the removal of an environmental use control or, by its own terms, the environmental use control agreement expires.

(b) Any applicant may submit with the application a written request for approval of a provision in the environmental use control agreement specifying the number of years the environmental use control is to remain in effect. The request shall be reviewed by the secretary, and the applicant shall be notified by the secretary of the secretary's approval or denial of the request.

(c) If an approved environmental use control agreement will expire after a stated term of years or the owner seeks to terminate an environmental use control agreement, the owner shall submit a detailed work plan to the secretary that outlines the proposed methods of sampling and evaluating the residual contaminant levels on the eligible property. The owner shall submit the work plan before the expiration or termination of the environmental use control agreement. After consideration and approval of the work plan by the secretary, all of the following shall occur:



(1) The owner shall execute the approved work plan.

(2) The owner shall document and submit the results of the sampling to the secretary in a report and include recommendations for future actions to protect public health and safety and the environment at the eligible property.

(3) Following the secretary's review of the report and recommendations for future actions, the report and recommendations shall be approved, approved with conditions, or disapproved by the secretary. (Authorized by K.S.A. 2004 Supp. 65-1,232; implementing K.S.A. 2004 Supp. 65-1,227; effective April 7, 2006.)

**28-73-7. Restrictions, prohibitions, and zoning requirements.** (a) Restrictions, prohibitions, and zoning requirements placed on an eligible property by a local, state, or federal government may be approved by the secretary in lieu of or in addition to one or more environmental use controls if the restriction, prohibition, or zoning requirement meets the following conditions:

(1) Has been legally established;

(2) is enforceable by a governmental entity; and

(3) is determined by the secretary to be in effect and applicable to the environmental contamination for which a particular environmental use control is otherwise considered to be a necessary component of an environmental use control agreement for the eligible property.

(b) Use of these restrictions, prohibitions, or zoning requirements in lieu of or in addition to an environmental use control may be considered in either of the following cases:

(1) For contamination that is contained exclusively within the boundaries of an eligible property; or

(2) for contamination that is both contained within and extends beyond the boundaries of an eligible property if the local, state, or federal governmental restriction, prohibition, or zoning requirement is in effect and applies to all of the following areas:

(A) All of those contaminated areas that are beyond the boundary of the eligible property; and

(B) All of those areas surrounding or extending beyond the contaminated areas for a distance that is determined by the secretary to be necessary to ensure the protection of public health and safety and the environment.

(c) Each applicant submitting an application for an environmental use control agreement shall submit to the secretary a copy of any existing local, state, or federal governmental restrictions, prohibitions, or zoning requirements that are proposed for inclusion in the environmental use control agreement in lieu of or in addition to one or more of the proposed environmental use controls. Each applicant shall submit for the secretary's review documentation sufficient to demonstrate the applicant's compliance with each restriction, prohibition, or zoning requirement that is enforceable by a local, state, or federal governmental entity.

(d) If the secretary approves the inclusion of governmental restrictions, prohibitions, or zoning requirements in the environmental use control agreement, the agreement shall reference the appropriate local, state, or federal restriction, prohibition, or zoning requirement and shall identify the governmental unit establishing these requirements.

(e) Each owner who enters into an environmental use control agreement that incorporates local, state, or federal governmental restrictions, prohibitions, or zoning requirements in lieu of or in addition to one or more environmental use controls shall remain subject to all other applicable requirements of the act and these regulations.

(f) An environmental use control agreement that incorporates local, state, or federal governmental restrictions, prohibitions, or zoning requirements shall be considered not to be effectively implemented and shall be subject to appropriate enforcement action in accordance with K.S.A. 65-1,229, and amendments thereto, if the secretary determines that both of the following conditions exist:

(1) The local, state, or federal governmental restrictions, prohibitions, or zoning requirements have been modified by the governmental entity after the environmental use control agreement was approved by the secretary.

(2) These modifications reduce the effectiveness of the environmental use control agreement to the extent that public health and safety and the environment are not protected adequately. (Authorized by K.S.A. 2005 Supp. 65-1,232; implementing K.S.A. 2005 Supp. 65-1,228; effective April 7, 2006.)

(c) "Non-winning ticket" means any valid Kansas "Kansas Chopper" instant game lottery ticket not eligible to win a prize under the rules of the "Kansas Chopper" instant game.

(d) "Receptacle" or "drum" means a container in which non-winning Kansas instant game lottery tickets are placed and from which the "Kansas Chopper Drawing" entries are drawn. Receptacles or drums may be sealable and shall be capable of being mixed or rotated for the purpose of ensuring random distribution.

(e) "Bare arm technique" means a type of drawing where the person drawing the winning ticket from the receptacle or drum wears a long-sleeved shirt with sleeve rolled up above the elbow, a short-sleeved shirt (sleeve not extending past the elbow) or a no-sleeve shirt which exposes the drawer's bare arm and looks away from the drawing drum or receptacle while drawing. (Authorized by and implementing K.S.A. 74-8710; effective, T-111-3-10-06, Dec. 13, 2005.)

**111-4-2359. Prize.** (a) The first winner drawn in the "Kansas Chopper Drawing," shall receive a 2006 Big Dog brand motorcycle chosen by the lottery, together with various Big Dog motorcycle products, mandatory federal and state income withholding taxes, property taxes, registration fee, title fee, and cash.

(b) All prizes are subject to lottery validation, set-offs and deductions authorized by law.

(c) The winner of a prize shall return to the lottery a completed claim form as provided by the lottery no later than 5:00 p.m. on the thirtieth day following the day of the drawing or the person named on the ticket drawn will no longer be eligible for the prize. In such an event, the first eligible alternate entry drawn for that prize pursuant to subsection (e) of K.A.R. 111-4-2361 shall be declared the winner. (Authorized by and implementing K.S.A. 74-8710; effective, T-111-3-10-06, Dec. 13, 2005.)

**111-4-2360. Method of entry.** (a) Entry into the "Kansas Chopper Drawing" shall be accomplished as follows:

(1) Obtain a valid "Kansas Chopper" Kansas instant lottery ticket;

(2) Determine if the ticket is a winning ticket in accordance with "Kansas Chopper" game rules. If the ticket is a winning ticket, it is not eligible for the "Kansas Chopper Drawing" and shall be redeemed in accordance with the instant game rules.

(3) If the ticket is a valid non-winning ticket, the ticket is eligible for the drawing and the holder of the ticket may use it to enter the "Kansas Chopper Drawing."

(4) The holder of the non-winning ticket must complete the information form on the back of the ticket in a legible manner. Only one name shall appear on a non-winning ticket entered.

(5) Players may deposit entries for the "Kansas Chopper Drawing" at any Kansas lottery event at which the lottery has specifically designated a receptacle for deposit



of said entries, including the receptacle provided at the Kansas lottery booth at the Wichita River Festival from May 12, 2006, through 6:00 p.m. on May 20, 2006.

(6) Entries other than those entered pursuant to subsection a(5) herein shall be mailed with proper postage to "Kansas Chopper Drawing," c/o Kansas lottery, P. O. Box 8099, Topeka, Kansas 66608-0099. Mailed entries must be received by morning mail pickup on Tuesday, May 13, 2006. More than one entry may be mailed in one envelope.

(7) The holder of the ticket is not required to personally attend the "Kansas Chopper Drawing" or be present at the time of the drawing to be determined a winner.

(8) The drawing will be conducted by the lottery on at the Wichita River Festival in Wichita, Kansas, on May 20, 2006, shortly after 6:00 p.m.

(b) There is no limit on the number of entries a person may make.

(c) Only valid non-winning "Kansas Chopper" tickets which are mailed to the "Kansas Chopper Drawing," c/o Kansas lottery, P. O. Box 8099, Topeka, Kansas 66608-0099 with proper postage and received by the morning mail pickup in Topeka, Kansas, on Tuesday, May 13, 2006, and non-winning "Kansas Chopper" tickets entered into any other receptacle designated by the lottery as provided in the rules herein shall be eligible for the drawing. All tickets so mailed or deposited shall be secured by the lottery until the drawing is conducted.

(d) Eligible entrants in the "Kansas Chopper Drawing" must be 18 years of age or older.

(e) Completing the information form on the non-winning ticket and entering the ticket into the drawing constitutes authorization to identify publicly the person whose entry is drawn. (Authorized by and implementing K.S.A. 74-8710; effective, T-111-3-10-06, Dec. 13, 2005.)

**111-4-2361. Selection of winners.** The following process shall be used for the selection of winners in the "Kansas Chopper Drawing:"

(a) Kansas lottery personnel shall pick up all mail containing "Kansas Chopper Drawing" tickets at the United States Post Office in Topeka, Kansas, with the final pick up at the Topeka post office in the morning mail pickup on Tuesday, May 13, 2006. The envelopes containing mailed entries will be transported to lottery headquarters and opened by lottery personnel. All mailed entries shall then be placed in the drawing receptacle or drum with all entries deposited at any other receptacle designated by the lottery.

(b) The drawing shall be held at the Kansas lottery booth at the Wichita River Festival and shall be open to the public with lottery security personnel present. The drawing shall be audio and video taped.

(c) At the drawing, lottery security personnel will be present with the person designated by the executive director to perform the drawing. Prior to the drawing, if a drum is used, the drum shall be sealed and the contents mixed by rotating the drum at least 10 times. If a receptacle other than a drum is used, the contents shall be thoroughly mixed with a shovel or by other means.

(d) At the drawing, the designated individual shall then unseal the drum, if a drum is used, and using the

bare-arm technique, while looking away, remove a single entry from the receptacle or drum. The person whose name appears on the entry shall be the winner of the grand prize identified in K.A.R. 111-4-2359, subject to validation by the lottery as set forth in these rules.

(e) After an entry has been drawn and verified as valid, two more valid entries will be drawn, one at a time to serve as alternate entries for the prize. The alternate entries will be marked in order drawn, 1A, 2A, and 3A. The winner shall have until 5:00 p.m. on the thirtieth day following the drawing to present the fully-executed claim form to lottery headquarters. If the grand prize winner cannot be located or is declared ineligible, or fails to timely present a fully-executed claim form to lottery headquarters, the grand prize will be awarded to the first alternate entry drawn. The alternates will be used, if necessary, in the order drawn.

(f) The Kansas lottery security official present shall review each ticket drawn to determine the validity of the entry into the "Kansas Chopper Drawing" in accordance with these regulations. If it is a valid entry and the name is legible, the event manager and the security person present shall record the name of the winner and the prize won. The prize winner shall be given or sent a prize claim form to be completed and returned as set forth in subsection (e) herein.

(g) If any entry drawn is determined to be ineligible, it shall be discarded by the security person present and another entry drawn. This procedure will be repeated until the required number of apparently eligible selections is obtained.

(h) Only non-winning "Kansas Chopper" instant tickets are eligible for the drawing.

(i) All "Kansas Chopper" tickets remaining in the drum or receptacle after the winners and alternatives have been selected in the drawing, and all entries not received in compliance with these rules, shall be destroyed pursuant to K.A.R. 111-3-34. (Authorized by and implementing K.S.A. 74-8710; effective, T-111-3-10-06, Dec. 13, 2005.)

**111-4-2362. Certification of drawing.** (a) The "Kansas Chopper Drawing" drawing shall be personally observed by a member of the Kansas lottery security department and a member of the Kansas lottery marketing department or other person or persons designated by the executive director of the lottery.

(b) Upon completion of the drawing, the security official and the event manager shall issue a report to the executive director, certifying that the name of the prize winner is correct, and that to the best of their knowledge the procedures required by these rules were followed in selecting the prize winner. (Authorized by and implementing K.S.A. 74-8710; effective, T-111-3-10-06, Dec. 13, 2005.)

#### Article 7.—ON-LINE GAMES

**111-7-81. Determination of winners.** (a) "Keno" tickets may be sold every day of the year between 5:00 a.m. and 1:52 a.m. with validation allowed until 2:00 a.m.

(continued)

(b) The selection of winning numbers shall take place as nearly as possible, at four-minute intervals. The first drawing will be at 5:04 a.m. with subsequent drawings every four minutes thereafter with the last drawing at 1:52 a.m. If a drawing cannot be held at the scheduled drawing time, the delayed drawing will take place at the next scheduled drawing time. Ticket sales for each drawing will end momentarily immediately prior to the scheduled drawing and then resume for the next drawing without delay. Keno wagering will not be inhibited between games. Each game is identified by a 6-digit consecutive game number that is assigned by the central system and the game number(s) for the drawing(s) for which the ticket was purchased will appear on the ticket. In the event a drawing does not occur at the drawing time scheduled, sales for that drawing will remain closed. Sales for the following drawing will remain open until four minutes after the results of the delayed drawing have been posted by the system. Winning game number selections for any games remaining on a player's ticket at the end of daily sales shall take place the next day.

(c) Winning number combinations shall be generated every four minutes through the use of a computer-driven random number generator located at lottery headquarters. The 20 numbers randomly generated for each drawing shall include one randomly generated number which is designated as the bull's-eye. The generator shall be statistically analyzed, tested, and certified by an independent qualified statistician for integrity. Periodic checks shall be made to ensure the security and integrity of the system at least quarterly.

(d) The Kansas lottery director of security shall establish the procedures for the operation and security of the random number generator, including the specification of those individuals who shall have access to the system. A security officer shall accompany anyone needing access to the secured area containing the generator for any reason.

(e) All Keno prizes, including bull's-eye prizes, shall be the prizes set forth in subsection (a) of K.A.R. 111-7-80 and 111-7-80a except when the prize in any game from a 5 spot game through a 10 spot game exceeds \$599 where total prizes for that game and prize category for a single draw exceeds \$1,500,000. If that occurs, each valid winner's share for the game and prize category shall be calculated as a parimutuel prize from a prize pool of \$1,500,000. #### HOUSE BILL No. 2665

AN ACT concerning adoption; relating to the termination of parental rights; amending K.S.A. 59-2136 and repealing the existing section.

*Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Kansas:*

Section 1. K.S.A. 59-2136 is hereby amended to read as follows: 59-2136. (a) The provisions of this section shall apply where a relinquishment or consent to an adoption has not been obtained from a parent and K.S.A. 59-2124 and 59-2129, and amendments thereto, state that the necessity of a parent's relinquishment or consent can be determined under this section.

(b) Insofar as practicable, the provisions of this section applicable to the father also shall apply to the mother and those applicable to the mother also shall apply to the father.

(c) In stepparent adoptions under subsection (d), the court may appoint an attorney to represent any father who is unknown or whose whereabouts are unknown. In all other cases, the court shall appoint an attorney to represent any father who is unknown or whose whereabouts are unknown. If no person is identified as the father or a possible father, the court shall order publication notice of the hearing in such manner as the court deems appropriate.

(d) In a stepparent adoption, if a mother consents to the adoption of a child who has a presumed father under subsection (a)(1), (2) or (3) of K.S.A. 38-1114 and amendments thereto, or who has a father as to whom the child is a legitimate child under prior law of this state or under the law of another jurisdiction, the consent of such father must be given to the adoption unless such father has failed or refused to assume the duties of a parent for two consecutive years next preceding the filing of the petition for adoption or is incapable of giving such consent. In determining whether a father's consent is required under this subsection, the court may disregard incidental visitations, contacts, communications or contributions. In determining whether the father has failed or refused to assume the duties of a parent for two consecutive years next preceding the filing of the petition for adoption, there shall be a rebuttable presumption that if the father, after having knowledge of the child's birth, has knowingly failed to provide a substantial portion of the child support as required by judicial decree, when financially able to do so, for a period of two years next preceding the filing of the petition for adoption, then such father has failed or refused to assume the duties of a parent. *The court may consider the best interests of the child and the fitness of the nonconsenting parent in determining whether a stepparent adoption should be granted.*

(e) Except as provided in subsection (d), if a mother desires to relinquish or consents to the adoption of such mother's child, a petition shall be filed in the district court to terminate the parental rights of the father, unless the father's relationship to the child has been previously terminated or determined not to exist by a court. The petition may be filed by the mother, the petitioner for adoption, the person or agency having custody of the child or the agency to which the child has been or is to be relinquished. Where appropriate, the request to terminate parental rights may be contained in a pe-

tion for adoption. If the request to terminate parental rights is not filed in connection with an adoption proceeding, venue shall be in the county in which the child, the mother or the presumed or alleged father resides or is found. In an effort to identify the father, the court shall determine by deposition, affidavit or hearing, the following:

- (1) Whether there is a presumed father under K.S.A. 38-1114 and amendments thereto;
  - (2) whether there is a father whose relationship to the child has been determined by a court;
  - (3) whether there is a father as to whom the child is a legitimate child under prior law of this state or under the law of another jurisdiction;
  - (4) whether the mother was cohabitating with a man at the time of conception or birth of the child;
  - (5) whether the mother has received support payments or promises of support with respect to the child or in connection with such mother's pregnancy; and
  - (6) whether any man has formally or informally acknowledged or declared such man's possible paternity of the child.
- If the father is identified to the satisfaction of the court, or if more than one man is identified as a possible father, each shall be given notice of the proceeding in accordance with subsection (f).
- (f) Notice of the proceeding shall be given to every person identified as the father or a possible father by personal service, certified mail return receipt requested or in any other manner the court may direct. Proof of notice shall be filed with the court before the petition or request is heard.
- (g) If, after the inquiry, the court is unable to identify the father or any possible father and no person has appeared claiming to be the father and claiming custodial rights, the court shall enter an order terminating the unknown father's parental rights with reference to the child without regard to subsection (h). If any person identified as the father or possible father of the child fails to appear or, if appearing, fails to claim custodial rights, such person's parental rights with reference to the child shall be terminated without regard to subsection (h).
- (h) (1) When a father or alleged father appears and asserts parental rights, the court shall determine parentage, if necessary pursuant to the Kansas parentage act. If a father desires but is financially unable to employ an attorney, the court shall appoint an attorney for

the father. Thereafter, the court may order that parental rights be terminated, upon a finding by clear and convincing evidence, of any of the following:

- (A) The father abandoned or neglected the child after having knowledge of the child's birth;
  - (B) the father is unfit as a parent or incapable of giving consent;
  - (C) the father has made no reasonable efforts to support or communicate with the child after having knowledge of the child's birth;
  - (D) the father, after having knowledge of the pregnancy, failed without reasonable cause to provide support for the mother during the six months prior to the child's birth;
  - (E) the father abandoned the mother after having knowledge of the pregnancy;
  - (F) the birth of the child was the result of rape of the mother; or
  - (G) the father has failed or refused to assume the duties of a parent for two consecutive years next preceding the filing of the petition.
- (2) In making a finding *whether parental rights shall be terminated* under this subsection, the court may:
- (A) Consider and weigh the best interest of the child; and
  - (B) disregard incidental visitations, contacts, communications or contributions.
- (3) In determining whether the father has failed or refused to assume the duties of a parent for two consecutive years next preceding the filing of the petition for adoption, there shall be a rebuttable presumption that if the father, after having knowledge of the child's birth, has knowingly failed to provide a substantial portion of the child support as required by judicial decree, when financially able to do so, for a period of two years next preceding the filing of the petition for adoption, then such father has failed or refused to assume the duties of a parent.
- (i) A termination of parental rights under this section shall not terminate the right of the child to inherit from or through the parent. Upon such termination, all the rights of birth parents to such child, including their right to inherit from or through such child, shall cease.

Sec. 2. K.S.A. 59-2136 is hereby repealed.

Sec. 3. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its publication in the Kansas register.
