House Bills

HB 3015, An act concerning the Kansas commission on veterans affairs; establishing a veterans claims assistance program and a service grant program; prescribing guidelines and limitations; powers, duties and functions for the commission and veterans service organizations; providing for annual reporting to and study and review by the legislative budget committee, by Committee on Appropriations.

HB 3016, An act concerning taxation; relating to imposition of tax upon the privilege of engaging in business of distributing, manufacturing or wholesale dealing of soft drinks, by Committee on Taxation.

HB 3017, An act concerning income taxation; relating to credits; employers who employ certain members of the Kansas army and air national guard or a Kansas unit of the reserved forces of the United States, by Committee on Taxation.

HB 3018, An act concerning the equine industry; creating the equine industry research and promotion board, by Committee on Appropriations.

HB 3019, An act concerning legal public holidays; amending K.S.A. 2005 Supp. 35-107 and repealing the existing section, by Committee on Federal and State Affairs.

House Concurrent Resolutions

HCR 5043, A proposition to amend section 13 of article 2 of the constitution of the state of Kansas, relating to two-thirds majority required for passage of certain bills.

HCR 5044, A concurrent resolution relating to teacher training regarding ESOL and culturally responsive pedagogy.

Senate Bills

SB 592, An act enacting the asbestos compensation fairness act; concerning asbestos claims, by Committee on Ways and Means.

SB 595, An act concerning taxation; relating to school ad valorem tax levy; income tax surtax; sales and use tax rates; amending K.S.A. 2005 Supp. 72-6431, 79-32,110, 79-3603, 79-3620, 79-3703 and 79-3710 and repealing the existing sections, by Committee on Ways and Means.

SCR 1625, A concurrent resolution relating to the 2006 regular session of the legislature; extending such session beyond 90 calendar days; and providing for adjournment thereof.

Executive Order 06-04

WHEREAS, the Director of the Kansas Water Office has informed me, pursuant to K.S.A. 74-2608, of the continuing presence of drought conditions within the state; and

WHEREAS, Kansas has just experienced one of its driest winters on record; and numerous grass and range fires, below normal reservoir levels and streamflow, and deficient soil moisture attest to the dryness as we approach the growing season; and

WHEREAS, the Kansas Emergency Management Act (K.S.A. 48-924 et seq.) states that the Governor shall be responsible for meeting the dangers to the state and its people from disasters, including drought.

NOW, THEREFORE, pursuant to the authority vested in me as Governor of the State of Kansas, I hereby:

1. Declare a Drought Warning or Drought Watch for the counties identified below; and
2. Authorize and direct all agencies under the jurisdiction of the Governor to implement the appropriate Watch or Warning level drought response actions assigned to them in the Operations Plan of the Governor's Drought Response Team.

Drought Warning counties by Climate/Crop Reporting District

Northwest: Cheyenne, Rawlins, Decatur, Norton, Sherman, Thomas, Sheridan and Graham.

West Central: Greeley, Wichita, Scott, Lane, Ness, Gove, Logan, Trego and Wallace.

Southwest: Clark, Finney, Ford, Grant, Gray, Hamilton, Haskell, Hodgeman, Kearny, Meade, Morton, Seward, Stanton and Stevens.

North Central: Phillips, Rooks, Smith, Jewell, Osborne, Mitchell, Republic, Washington, Cloud, Clay and Ottawa.

Central: Barton, Dickinson, Ellis, Ellsworth, Lincoln, McPherson, Marion, Rice, Rush, Russell and Saline.

South Central: Barber, Comanche, Edwards, Harper, Harvey, Kingman, Kiowa, Pawnee, Pratt, Reno, Sedgwick, Stafford and Sumner.

Southeast: Allen, Bourbon, Butler, Chautauqua, Cherokee, Cowley, Crawford, Elk, Greenwood, Labette, Montgomery, Neosho, Wilson and Woodson.

Drought Watch counties by Climate/Crop Reporting District

Northeast: Atchison, Brown, Doniphan, Jackson, Jefferson, Leavenworth, Marshall, Nemaha, Pottawatomie, Riley and Wyandotte.

East Central: Anderson, Chase, Coffey, Douglas, Franklin, Geary, Johnson, Linn, Lyon, Miami, Morris, Osage, Shawnee and Wabaunsee.

County drought stages declared in this Executive Order shall remain in effect until revised or rescinded by a subsequent Executive Order.

This document shall be filed with the Secretary of State as Executive Order No. 06-04 and shall become effective immediately.

Request for Comments

The Kansas Department of Health and Environment is soliciting comments regarding a proposed air quality construction permit. Spirit AeroSystems, Inc. has applied for an air quality construction permit in accordance with the provisions of K.A.R. 28-19-300 to install four natural gas and distillate oil-fired process boilers, each rated at 73 MMBtu/hour. Emissions of NO_x, CO, PM, PM₁₀, SO₂ and VOC were evaluated during the permit review process.

Spirit AeroSystems, Inc., Wichita, owns and operates the stationary source located at 3801 S. Oliver, Wichita, at which the four natural gas and distillate oil-fired process boilers are to be installed.

A copy of the proposed permit, permit application, all supporting documentation and all information relied upon during the permit application review process is available for public review for a period of 30 days from the date of publication during normal business hours at the KDHE, Bureau of Air and Radiation, 1000 S.W. The standard departmental cost will be assessed for any copies requested.

In order to be considered in formulating a final permit decision, written comments must be received before the close of business May 1.

A person may request a public hearing be held on the proposed permit. The request for a public hearing shall be in writing and set forth the basis for the request. The written request must be submitted to Sherry Walker, Bureau of Air and Radiation, not later than the close of business May 1 in order for the Secretary of Health and Environment to consider the request.

The drawing will be held on Friday, May 12, 2006, at Kansas lottery headquarters in Topeka, Kansas. Rules applicable to the "Golf Giveaway Second Chance Drawing" are contained in K.A.R. 111-4-2372 through 111-4-2377 and K.A.R. 111-3-1, *et seq.* (Authorized by and im-

plementing K.S.A. 74-8710; effective, T-111-3-14-06, Jan. 18, 2006.)

111-4-2373. Definitions. (a) All definitions contained in the Kansas lottery act (K.S.A. 74-8701 *et seq.*) and lottery regulations are hereby incorporated by reference and govern unless otherwise indicated.

(b) "Golf Giveaway Second Chance Drawing" means the act of drawing prizes conducted by the Kansas lottery at lottery headquarters in Topeka, Kansas, at the time described in K.A.R. 111-4-2375, in which participants are selected to win various prizes as described in K.A.R. 111-4-2374.

(c) "Non-winning ticket" means any valid Kansas lottery "Golf Giveaway" instant game lottery ticket not eligible to win a prize under the rules of that instant game.

(d) "Receptacle" or "drum" means a container in which non-winning Kansas instant game lottery tickets are placed and from which the "Golf Giveaway Second Chance Drawing" entries are drawn. Receptacles or drums may be sealable and shall be capable of being mixed or rotated for the purpose of ensuring random distribution.

(e) "Bare arm technique" means a type of drawing where the person drawing the winning ticket from the receptacle or drum wears a long-sleeved shirt with sleeve rolled up above the elbow, a short-sleeved shirt (sleeve not extending past the elbow) or a no-sleeve shirt which exposes the drawer's bare arm and looks away from the drawing drum or receptacle while drawing. 111-4-2374. Prize. marketing department or other person or persons designated by the executive director of the lottery (hereinafter "event manager").

(b) Upon completion of the drawing, the security official and the event manager shall issue a report to the executive director, certifying that the name of each prize winner is correct, and that to the best of their knowledge the procedures required by these rules were followed in selecting the prize winners. (Authorized by and implementing K.S.A. 74-8710; effective, T-111-3-14-06, Jan. 18, 2006.)

111-4-2377. Selection of winners. The following process shall be used for the selection of winners in the "Golf Giveaway Second Chance Drawing:"

HOUSE BILL No. 2759

AN ACT concerning cities; relating to the limitation of bonded indebtedness; amending K.S.A. 10-308 and repealing the existing section.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Kansas:

Section 1. K.S.A. 10-308 is hereby amended to read as follows: 10-308. (a) Except as provided in this section and K.S.A. 10-309, and amendments thereto, and in any other statute which specifically exempts bonds from the statutory limitations on bonded indebtedness, the limitation on bonded indebtedness of cities shall be governed by this section. The authorized and outstanding bonded indebtedness of any city shall not exceed 30% of the assessed valuation of the city.

(b) The authorized and outstanding bonded indebtedness of Olathe shall not exceed 35% of the assessed valuation of the city. The provisions of this subsection shall expire on June 30, 1990.

(b) (1) The authorized and outstanding bonded indebtedness of the city of Junction City shall not exceed 40% of the assessed valuation of such city. The provisions of this paragraph shall expire on June 30, 2011.

(2) On and after July 1, 2011, the authorized and outstanding bonded indebtedness of the city of Junction City shall not exceed 37% of the assessed valuation of such city. The provisions of this paragraph shall expire on June 30, 2013.

(3) On and after July 1, 2013, the authorized and outstanding bonded indebtedness of the city of Junction City shall not exceed 34% of the assessed valuation of such city. The provisions of this paragraph shall expire on June 30, 2015.

(c) For the purpose of this section, assessed valuation means the value of all taxable tangible property as certified to the county clerk on the preceding August 25 which includes the assessed valuation of

motor vehicles as provided by K.S.A. 10-310, and amendments thereto.

Sec. 2. K.S.A. 10-308 is hereby repealed.

Sec. 3. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its publication in the Kansas register.

HOUSE BILL No. 2951

AN ACT relating to road and highways; designating a portion of United States highway 36 the World War I veterans memorial highway; designating interstate highway 335 as the United States submarine veterans memorial highway.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Kansas:

Section 1. That portion of United States highway 36 from the eastern boundary of Smith county then west to the western boundary of Smith county is hereby designated the World War I veterans memorial highway. The secretary of transportation shall place signs along the highway right-of-way at proper intervals to indicate that the highway is the World War I veterans memorial highway, except that such signs shall not be placed until the secretary has received sufficient moneys from gifts and donations to reimburse the secretary for the cost of placing such signs and an additional 50% of the initial cost to defray future maintenance or replacement costs of such signs. The secretary of transportation may accept and administer gifts and donations to aid in obtaining and installing suitable signs.

Sec. 2. Interstate highway 335 from junction of interstate highway 335 with interstate highway 470 south to the junction of interstate highway 335 with interstate highway 35 is hereby designated the United States submarine veterans memorial highway. The Kansas turnpike authority shall place signs along the highway right-of-way at proper intervals to indicate that the highway is the United States submarine veterans memorial highway, except that such signs shall not be placed until the Kansas turnpike authority has received sufficient moneys from gifts and donations to reimburse the Kansas turnpike authority for the cost of placing such signs and an additional 50% of the initial cost to defray future maintenance or replacement costs of such signs. The Kansas turnpike authority may accept and administer gifts and donations to aid in obtaining and installing suitable signs.

Sec. 3. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its publication in the Kansas register.
