A public hearing will be conducted at 10 a.m. Monday, September 18, in the State Board of Indigents' Defense Services' board room, Suite 200, 714 S.W. Jackson, Topeka, to consider the adoption of proposed changes in existing rules and regulations of the State Board of Indigents' Defense Services.

This 60-day notice of the public hearing shall constitute a public comment period for the purpose of receiving written public comments on the proposed rules and regulations. All interested parties may submit written comments prior to the hearing to the executive director, 714 S.W. Jackson, Room 200, Topeka, 66603. All interested parties will be given a reasonable opportunity to present their views orally on the adoption of the proposed regulations during the hearing. In order to give all parties an opportunity to present their views, it may be necessary to request that each participant limit any oral presentation to five minutes.

Any individual with a disability may request accommodation in order to participate in the public hearing and may request the proposed regulations and economic impact statements in an accessible format. Requests for accommodation should be made at least five working days in advance of the hearing by contacting Beth Child at (785) 296-8416. Accessible parking is located in front of the building.

These regulations are proposed for adoption on a temporary and permanent basis. A summary of proposed regulations and their economic impact follows:

K.A.R 105-5-2. Rates of compensation. Amendments to this regulation establish the hourly rate of compensation paid to assigned counsel at \$80 per hour, from the previous \$50 per hour, to reflect a statutory change in K.S.A. 2005 Supp. 22-4507. These regulations are not mandated by federal law. Only the proposing state agency will be affected by the proposed amendments. Private citizens will not be affected. However, consumers of public

defender services will be required to pay higher sums to reimburse the state general fund for the cost of assigned counsel or public defender services.

K.A.R. 105-5-3. Appellate courts; compensation. Amendments to this regulation reflect the change in the maximum amount paid for appeals from \$1,000 to \$1,600, representing a maximum of 20 hours compensation. These regulations are not mandated by federal law. Only the proposing state agency will be affected by the proposed amendments. Private citizens will not be affected. However, consumers of public defender services will be required to pay higher sums to reimburse the state general fund for the cost of assigned counsel or public defender services.

K.A.R. 105-5-6. Reasonable compensation; nontried cases. Amendments to this regulation reflect the change in the maximum amount paid in nontried cases from \$1,000 to \$1,600 in high-level felonies; from \$750 to \$1,200 in lower-level felonies; from \$410 to \$800 in habeas cases; and from \$200 to \$320 in miscellaneous matters. These regulations are not mandated by federal law. Only the proposing state agency will be affected by the proposed amendments. Private citizens will not be affected. However, consumers of public defender services will be required to pay higher sums to reimburse the state general fund for the cost of assigned counsel or public defender services.

K.A.R. 105-5-7. Reasonable compensation; tried cases. Amendments to this regulation reflect the change in the maximum amount paid in tried cases from \$1,500 to \$2,400 for lower-level felonies; from \$2,000 to \$3,200 for mid-level felonies; and from \$5,000 to \$8,000 for highlevel felonies. These regulations are not mandated by federal law. Only the proposing state agency will be affected by the proposed amendments. Private citizens will not be affected. However, consumers of public defender services will be required to pay higher sums to reimburse the state general fund for the cost of assigned counsel or public defender services.

**K.A.R. 105-5-8. Compensation; exceptional cases.** The amendment to this regulation reflects the change in the maximum amount paid for exceptional cases from \$5,000 to \$8,000 without additional approval by the board. These regulations are not mandated by federal law. Only the proposing state agency will be affected by the proposed amendments. Private citizens will not be affected. However, consumers of public defender services will be required to pay higher sums to reimburse the state general fund for the cost of assigned counsel or public defender services.

**K.A.R. 105-11-1. Defendant reimbursement of attorney fees.** This amendment adopts by reference the June 2, 2006, reimbursement table. The table reflects the average cost per case at the increased hourly rate.

#### **Request for Comments**

The Kansas Department of Commerce is requesting comments to a proposed modification to the two-year Strategic State Plan for Title I of the Workforce Investment Act and the Wagner-Peyser Act. The plan documents the Governor's vision and goals for the Kansas workforce development system, as well as the strategies, policies, activities and measures of success for this system.

Section X.D.8 of the plan will be modified to incorporate the final negotiated standards for WIA and Wagner-Peyser programs for PY06. For WIA performance, this reflects the negotiated standards for Adult and Dislocated Worker Average Wage Rate. For Wagner-Peyser programs, the modification reflects the Entered Employment Rate, the Employment Retention Rate and the Average Wage Rate. The proposed modification will be submitted to the U.S. Department of Labor to become effective July 1, 2006 through June 30, 2007.

A public hearing will be conducted at 10:15 a.m. Thursday, September 14, in Suite 701, Jayhawk Tower, 700 S.W. Jackson, Topeka, to consider the adoption of proposed rules and regulations of the Kansas Commission on Veterans' Affairs.

This 60-day notice of the public hearing shall constitute a public comment period for the purpose of receiving written public comments on the proposed rules and regulations. All interested parties may submit written comments prior to the hearing to the executive director of the Kansas Commission on Veterans' Affairs, Suite 701, Jayhawk Tower, 700 S.W. Jackson, Topeka, 66603-3758. All interested parties will be given a reasonable opportunity to present their views orally on the adoption of the proposed regulations during the hearing. In order to give all parties an opportunity to present their views, it may be necessary to request that each participant limit any oral presentation to five minutes.

Any individual with a disability may request accommodation in order to participate in the public hearing and may request the proposed regulations and economic impact statements in an accessible format. These regulations are proposed for adoption on a permanent basis. A summary of the proposed regulations and their economic impact follows:

# Article 4.—VETERAN MEMORIAL DONATIONS TO THE KANSAS COMMISSION ON VETERANS' AFFAIRS FOR THE CONSTRUCTION AND MAINTENANCE OF CAPITAL IMPROVEMENT PROJECTS

**K.A.R. 97-4-1. Definitions.** As used in this article, unless the context clearly requires otherwise, the following terms shall have the meanings ascribed to them in this regulation: advisory committee, capital improvement project, improvement, commission, director, project representative, suitable memorial and undesignated donations.

There is no significant economic impact to state agencies, employees or the general public.

K.A.R. 97-4-2. Criteria for memorials for veterans. This regulation establishes the criteria memorials must meet including designating a project representative to work with the director in meeting the specific capital improvement needs of the Kansas Veterans' Home, the Kansas Soldiers' Home and the Veterans' Cemetery Program. This regulation also requires memorials to be nondiscriminatory and nonpartisan in nature and to be sensitive to architectural and historic plans and specifications of existing facilities at that location.

There is no significant economic impact to state agencies, employees or the general public.

**K.A.R. 97-4-3. Financing.** This regulation requires capital improvement projects funded by donations be totally

financed with private monies. Each proposal for a capital improvement project shall include a cost estimate to include necessary fees and expenses for consultants and any interest accrued on borrowed money during the period of construction and the cost of land, materials, labor, and ongoing maintenance and support.

This regulation ensures the agency and the state are aware of all costs associated with the project and includes provisions for including ongoing maintenance in the planning of the project. It also ensures the funds are available for completion of the project by requiring that once a project is accepted by the agency all funds raised for the construction of the capital improvement project, including funds necessary for ongoing maintenance, are deposited into the Kansas veterans' memorial fund of the state treasury before the acceptance of bids or the start of construction.

This regulation benefits the agency and serves to protect donors, ensures that monies given for a project will be used for the intended purpose, and has no effect on other governmental units. There are minimal anticipated costs to the state agency. Depending on the size of the capital improvement project and the amount of construction involved, it could have considerable positive economic impact on the community and public involved in the project.

**K.A.R. 97-4-4. Proposals; use of names and references.** This is a new regulation that outlines what constitutes a proposal and provides guidance for submission.

There is no significant economic impact to state agencies, employees or the general public.

K.A.R. 97-4-5. Fund raising materials for proposed memorials. This regulation requires commission approval of fund-raising materials for a proposed memorial ensuring full disclosure before the commission approves the use of any material referencing the KCVA, staff or any of its subsidiaries. It requires donors wishing to make reference to the KCVA in fund-raising materials to provide a cost estimate, disclose the percentage of funds raised that can be used for administrative expenses, and requires the statement, "If the project is not completed, all funds shall be returned to donors by the project representative, who shall make full restitution to donors less the administrative cost of returning the funds. This administrative cost of returning the funds shall not exceed the administrative cost outlined above."

This regulation benefits the agency and serves to protect donors. It ensures that monies given for a project will be used for the intended purpose and has no effect on other governmental units.

There is no significant economic impact to state agencies, employees or the general public.

**K.A.R. 97-4-6. Financial reporting.** This regulation requires quarterly progress reporting at agency commission meetings once a project is accepted by the KCVA. Reporting is to be made quarterly through completion providing full disclosure to the public and ensuring commission review and involvement in memorial projects once they are accepted.

There is no significant economic impact to state agencies, employees or the general public.

**K.A.R. 97-4-7. Procedures for appointment of the advisory committee.** When a project is accepted by the commission, an advisory committee shall be appointed by the commission, during a scheduled commission meeting, to further develop and refine the project.

There is no significant economic impact to state agencies, employees or the general public.

K.A.R. 97-4-8. Procedures following advisory committee submission of a final project plan. This regulation outlines the duties of the director upon receipt of a final project plan from an advisory committee. It provides guidelines for submitting plans to the secretary of administration for review.

There is no significant economic impact to state agencies, employees or the general public.

# Article 63. — DEVELOPMENTAL DISABILITIES — LICENSING PROVIDERS OF COMMUNITY SERVICES

**30-63-20. Mandated requirements.** This regulation is amended to draw in portions of Article 64 for community service provider licensure. Developmental disabilities case management functions and requirements, etc., are in Article 64 and are now being drawn into service provider licensure requirements by this amendment.

Economic Impact: None.

Bearer of Cost: N/A.

Affected Parties: Case managers and service providers that employ them will continue to be required to meet Article 63 and 64 standards. However, the impact for not complying with Article 64 requirements will now effect the status of a service providers license.

Other Methods: Other options were considered but this option best met the needs of the developmental disabilities service system.

**30-63-22.** Individual rights and responsibilities. This regulation is amended to ensure that persons served are assisted in providing 30 days notice when changing providers.

Economic Impact: None.

Bearer of Cost: N/A.

Affected Parties: Persons served and service providers will now have a 30-day time-frame of transition planning to promote ethical practices by service providers and a smooth transition from one provider to another.

Other Methods: Other options were considered but this option best met the needs of the developmental disabilities service system.

#### Article 64. — DEVELOPMENTAL DISABILITIES— COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENTAL DISABILITY ORGANIZATIONS (CDDOs)

**30-64-24.** Case management. This regulation is amended to give the enrolled provider (Community Developmental Disability Organization) more authority to manage its subcontractors' billing practices in the event of noncompliance with regulatory standards. This amendment also incorporates a Case Management Rule of Conduct for regulatory enforcement purposes.

Economic Impact: None.

Bearer of Cost: N/A.

Affected Parties: The enrolled provider now has a mechanism to control billing practices of subcontractors that might lead to funding recoupment of the enrolled provider.

Other Methods: Other options were considered but this option best met the needs of the developmental disabilities service system.
