Notice of Hearing on Proposed Administrative Regulations

The Juvenile Justice Authority will conduct a public hearing from 10 to 11 a.m. Friday, October 27, in the training room, 714 S.W. Jackson, third floor, Topeka, to consider adopting proposed permanent rules and regulations concerning good time credits for juveniles placed in a juvenile correctional facility.

This 60-day notice of the public hearing constitutes a public comment period for the purpose of receiving written public comments on the proposed regulations. All interested parties may submit written comments prior to the hearing to Don Jordan, Commissioner, Juvenile Justice Authority, 714 S.W. Jackson, Suite 300, Topeka, 66603. All interested parties will be given a reasonable opportunity to present their views orally at the hearing. In order to give all parties an opportunity to present their views, it may be necessary to request each participant to limit any oral presentation to five minutes.

Any individual with a disability may request accommodation in order to participate in the public hearing and may request the proposed regulations and economic impact statement in an accessible format. Requests for accommodation should be made at least five working days in advance of the hearing by contacting Sara Lister at (785) 296-4213 or the Kansas Relay Center at (800) 766-3777. There is designated accessible parking on Jackson Street.

A copy of the full text of each regulation and any referenced document therein may be reviewed or obtained at the Juvenile Justice Authority's office or from its Web site at <http://jja.state.ks.us/index.htm>. The following is a

summary of the proposed regulations and economic impact statement:

K.A.R. 123-6-101 contains the definitions of terms used in calculating a juvenile's sentence to a juvenile correctional facility and good time credits earned.

K.A.R. 123-6-102 describes the manner of application of good time credits.

K.A.R. 123-6-103 describes the method, manner and criteria for awarding and withholding good time credits.

K.A.R. 123-6-104 provides that juveniles are not eligible to earn good time credits for time lost on escape.

K.A.R. 123-6-105 references the Kansas juvenile justice authority's "good time credit rate charts" dated August 3, 2006, and provides that a juvenile's sentence may be reduced by no more than 30 percent through awarded and retained good time credits.

K.A.R. 123-6-106 references the Kansas Juvenile Justice Authority's "adjustment chart for sentences to the age of 22½" dated August 3, 2006, and describes the manner and method for calculating sentences for juveniles sentenced to the age of 22½.

Economic Impact: These regulations require no significant additional resources for the Juvenile Justice Authority. It is projected that these regulations will increase the juvenile correctional facilities' (JCF) statewide daily census by 14 youth. These regulations will impact youth admitted to a JCF for crimes committed on or after the effective date of the regulations, thus it may be several months before any actual impact is experienced. A statewide daily increase of 14 youth will not affect staffing and has minimal impact on operations.

Grant funds are available from the Governor's Discretionary Portion of the Federal Safe and Drug-Free Schools and Communities Act for the funding period October 1, 2006 through September 30, 2007. The purpose of the Federal Safe & Drug-Free Schools & Communities Act (SDFSCA) is to support programs that prevent violence in and around schools; prevent the illegal use of alcohol, tobacco and drugs; involve parents and communities; and coordinate with related federal, state, school and community efforts and resources to foster a safe and drug-free learning environment that supports student academic achievement. The Governor's Grants Program also defines prevention as the "active process that creates and rewards conditions that lead to healthy behaviors and lifestyles."

Priority will be given to mentoring program activities that prevent illegal drug use and violence for:

1. Children and youth who are not normally served by the state educational agencies or local educational agencies; or
2. Populations that need special services or additional resources, such as youth in juvenile detention facilities, runaway or homeless children and youth, pregnant and parenting teenagers, and suspended or expelled students.

Attorney General**Opinion 2006-16**

Counties and County Officers—Jails—County Jails; Compensation for Maintenance; Establishing Per Diem Prisoner Fee.

Counties and County Officers—Sheriff—Charge and Custody of Jail; Charging Prisoner Fees. Representative Lynne Oharah, 4th District, Uniontown, August 3, 2006.

K.S.A. 2005 Supp. 19-1930 permits a county to adopt a resolution authorizing assessment of a per diem fee charged to inmates of the county jail. This statute does not permit charging such costs to persons who are never convicted of a crime in this state but permits recoupment of pre and post conviction costs from those who are convicted of a crime in this state, and establishes priorities for payments. Counties and County Officers—County Commissioners; Powers and Duties—Powers of Board of Commissioners; Road Maintenance Agreements with Quarry Owners or Operators.

Counties and County Officers—General Provisions—Home Rule Powers; Limitations, Restrictions and Prohibitions; Procedure; Impact Fees Charged to Quarry Owners or Operators.

Counties and County Officers—Planning and Zoning in Counties Designated as Urban Areas—Zoning Regulations; Altering Terms of Conditional Use Permits. Elizabeth R. Cohn, Wabaunsee County Attorney, Alma, August 3, 2006.

K.S.A. 2005 Supp. 19-101a(a)(28), as amended, prohibits counties from using home rule authority to impose any “excise, severance or any other tax in the nature of an excise tax upon the physical severance and production of any mineral or other material from the earth or water.” K.S.A. 2005 Supp. 19-101a(a)(28), as amended, does not prohibit charging drivers on public roads an impact fee. Whether a particular charge is actually an excise tax on production of the rock, or whether it is an impact fee for wear and tear of county roads depends on how the assessment is structured and upon whom it is imposed. Any assessment imposed solely on one type of user of county roads calls into question whether it is in reality an impact fee. New agreements or conditional permits may include fees to help defray road maintenance costs, however any attempt to unilaterally revoke, change or limit rights already granted in a conditional use permit, absent a violation of the permit terms by its holder, may give rise to claims against the county. Opinion 2006-18

Livestock and Domestic Animals—Miscellaneous—Feral Swine: Prohibition of Such Swine in State; Duties of Livestock Commissioner; Penalties; Appeals. George Teagarden, Livestock Commissioner, Kansas Animal Health Department, Topeka, August 3, 2006.

The Legislature acted consistently, harmoniously and sensibly by authorizing a government sponsored feral swine control and eradication program along with a ban on hunting these animals except for property owners and other legal occupants, their employees and designees. The prohibition against killing feral swine “for sport, pleasure, amusement or production of a trophy” does not preclude the Kansas Animal Health Department from providing for the control and eradication of feral swine by aerial gunning, trapping, snaring or through a bounty program. Which of these or other methods would be more efficient and cost effective is left to the sound discretion of the Department. Opinion 2006-19

Cities and Municipalities—Emergency Telephone Services; Wireless Service—Grant Fund; Use of Fund Monies. Susan Robson, Marion County Attorney, Marion, August 3, 2006.

Marion County may use data, initially developed to implement a wireless enhanced 911 service, for other

county purposes. This conclusion would be different if a county received wireless enhanced 911 funds to purchase equipment, or to upgrade or modify equipment to process data elements of an enhanced 911 service. Cited herein: K.S.A. 2005 Supp. 12-5321; 12-5323; 12-5325. CN

Opinion 2006-20

Cities and Municipalities—Buildings, Structures and Grounds—Transportation Development District Act; Sales Tax; Director of Taxation, Duties; Fund of the District; When Collection Commences; Bonds. Gary A. Anderson, Olathe Bond Counsel, Kansas City, Missouri, August 17, 2006.

The Transportation Development District Act does not require that a transportation development district sales tax be levied only in conjunction with the issuance of bonds. The 22-year limitation in subsection (c) of K.S.A. 2005 Supp. 12-17,149 regards the time in which bonds must mature rather than the time during which the transportation development district sales tax may be levied. A municipality may levy a transportation development district sales tax prior to issuance of bonds, notwithstanding this may result in collection of the transportation development district sales tax for a period exceeding 22 years. Opinion 2006-21

Soldiers, Sailors and Patriotic Emblems—Veterans’ Preference; Public Service—Preferences in Appointments and Employments.

State Departments; Public Officers and Employees—Civil Service—Veterans’ Preference. George S. Webb, Executive Director, Kansas Commission on Veterans’ Affairs, Topeka, August 17, 2006.

K.S.A. 73-201, the veterans’ preference law, applies to all Kansas counties and cities when filling positions in public departments or upon public works. Given the way in which the Court has interpreted K.S.A. 73-201 and the actions of the Legislature, there is not a conflict between the veterans’ preference law and the provision giving veterans’ preference effect in the State Civil Service Act; under the administrative regulation implementing the veterans’ preference provision of the State Civil Service Act, veterans’ preference is conferred by interviewing any and all deserving veterans among the certified pool of eligible candidates for a position. Status as a veteran is not a “nonmerit” factor, as statutorily defined, and therefore the specific provisions requiring veterans’ preference be granted in the State’s civil service system are not superceded by the general provisions of the Civil Service Act requiring that personnel administration actions be based on merit principles and fitness to perform the work required. Each bidder shall file a sworn statement executed by or on behalf of the person, firm, association or corporation submitting the bid, certifying that such person, firm, association or corporation has not, either directly or indirectly, entered into any agreement, participated in any collusion, or otherwise taken any action in restraint of free competitive bidding in connection with the submitted bid.

This sworn statement shall be in the form of an affidavit executed and sworn to by the bidder before a person who is authorized by the laws of the state to administer oaths. The required form of affidavit will be provided by the state to each prospective bidder. Failure to submit the sworn statement as part of the bid approval package will make the bid nonresponsive and not eligible for award consideration.

6. Lake Anthony — Eutrophication and Siltation
