Notice of Hearing on Proposed Administrative Regulations

A public hearing will be conducted at 10 a.m. Thursday, December 28, at the office of the Kansas State Board of Healing Arts, 235 S. Topeka Blvd., Topeka, to consider the adoption of one proposed amended rule and regulation (K.A.R. 100-28a-10) dealing with physician assistants.

This 60-day notice of the public hearing shall constitute a public comment period for the purpose of receiving written public comments on the above-referenced rule and regulation. All interested parties may submit comments prior to the hearing to the Board of Healing Arts at the address above. All interested parties will be given a reasonable opportunity to present their views, orally or in writing, concerning the adoption of the regulation during the hearing. In order to give all persons an opportunity to present their views, it may be necessary to request each participant to limit any oral presentations to five minutes.

Any individual with a disability may request accommodation in order to participate in the public hearing and may request the regulation being considered and the economic impact statement in an accessible format. Requests for accommodation should be made at least five working days in advance of the hearing by contacting Barbara Montgomery at (785) 296-8558. Handicapped parking is located at the west end of the Hutton Building, and the northwest entrance to the building is accessible.

The adoption of one proposed amended rule and regulation dealing with physician assistants to be considered at the hearing and the respective economic impact are as follows:

K.A.R. 100-28a-10. Supervision and direction; adequacy. This regulation identifies what is considered to be adequate direction and supervision of a physician assistant by the responsible physician. The proposed amendments to this regulation would require the physician to determine whether the physician assistant has performed patient services with reasonable skill and safety and whether drugs prescribed by the physician assistant were indicated and appropriate. In order to make this determination, it also requires the physician to perform a periodic review of records for patients treated by the physician assistant as well as specifying frequency and number of records to be reviewed.

There is no foreseen cost to either the board or to the public to implement this regulation.

Opinion No. 2006-17

Written October 18, 2006, to Milack Talia, Chairman, NeoDems PAC, Merriam.

This opinion is in response to your letter dated October 2, 2006, in which you request an opinion from the Kansas Governmental Ethics Commission concerning the Campaign Finance Act (K.S.A. 25-4142 *et seq.*). We note at the outset that the Commission's jurisdiction concerning your questions is limited to the application of K.S.A. 25-4142 *et seq.*, and whether some other statutory system, common law theory or agency rule or regulation applies to your inquiry is not covered by this opinion.

Factual Statement

We understand that you are asking for this opinion in your capacity as chairman of the political committee, NeoDems. You are also a candidate for the office of State Representative. The NeoDems PAC would like to make several mailings endorsing candidates and urging voters to vote for them. The PAC will send the mailings to households in various State Representative districts endorsing candidates for the U.S. House of Representatives and state offices, including State Representative. Your question involves the mailing to households in the State Representative district for which you are a candidate and will be endorsed.

Questions

- 1. Does a mailing by the NeoDems PAC that endorses and urges voters to vote for the chairman of the NeoDems PAC for State Representative constitute an in-kind contribution from the NeoDems PAC to the chairman's campaign?
- 2. If the mailing is an in-kind contribution to the campaign, is the value of the in-kind contribution divided among the total number of candidates endorsed in the mailing, with the contribution amount to the chairman's campaign being his proportional share?

Opinion

K.A.R. 19-20-2 defines "in-kind contribution" as follows:

(b) "In-kind contribution" means a contribution of goods, services, or anything of value to a candidate . . . without charge or provision of such items at a charge to the recipient of less than the fair market value. . . . "In-kind contribution" also means the use of any goods, services, or anything of value, or the spending of any money, for the benefit of any candidate . . . when the use or expenditure is made in cooperation with or with the consent of the candidate (Emphasis added.)

Because you are both the chairman of the NeoDems PAC and the candidate being endorsed by the NeoDems PAC, the expenditure for the mailing of your endorsement by the NeoDems PAC would be made in cooperation with you as the candidate. Therefore, the cost of the mailing constitutes an in-kind contribution from the NeoDems PAC to your campaign for State Representative.

In response to your second question regarding the value of the in-kind contribution, K.A.R. 19-24-1 addresses the value of an in-kind contribution as follows:

The value of an in-kind contribution shall equal the fair market value of the item or service if it had been purchased, sold or leased in the ordinary course of business. . . .

Under the Campaign Finance Act, the costs and profits of joint campaign activities participated in by multiple candidates are reported by each participating candidate according to the candidate's proportional share of the costs or profits. (See K.S.A. 25-4157a (c); K.A.R. 19-25-1.) Therefore, the cost of the mailings which expressly advocate the election of more than one candidate must be allocated to each candidate according to the candidate's proportionate share based on the fair market value to each candidate of the mailing. The value of the in-kind contribution from the NeoDems PAC to your campaign would be the fair market value of your proportional cost as if you were paying for the mailing to your district from your campaign funds.

105-5-6. Reasonable compensation; nontried cases.

- (a) Each appointed and assigned attorney shall be compensated for time expended in representing indigent defendants and other indigent persons at the hourly rate prescribed in K.A.R. 105-5-2. Except as provided in K.A.R. 105-5-8, reasonable compensation shall not exceed \$1,600 in the following cases:
- (1) Those felony cases in the trial court that are classified as non-drug offenses of severity levels 1 through 5 that are not submitted to a judge or jury, including services at a preliminary hearing and sentencing, if applicable; and
- (2) those felony cases in the trial court that are classified as drug offenses, that have not been submitted to a judge or jury, and in which there have been six hours or more spent in court in defense of the indigent defendant, including services at a preliminary hearing and sentencing, if applicable.
- (b) Except as provided in K.A.R. 105-5-8 and K.A.R. 105-5-6(a), reasonable compensation shall not exceed \$1,200 in the following cases:

- (1) Those felony cases in the trial court that are not submitted to a judge or jury, including services at a preliminary hearing and sentencing, if applicable, and are classified as severity levels 6 through 10 non-drug offenses; and
- (2) those felony cases in the trial court that are not submitted to a judge or jury, that are classified as drug offenses, and in which there have been fewer than six hours spent in court in defense of the indigent defendant, including services at a preliminary hearing and sentencing, if applicable.
- (c) Except as provided in K.A.R. 105-5-8, K.A.R. 105-5-6(a), and K.A.R. 105-5-6(b), reasonable compensation shall not exceed \$800 in the following types of cases:

- (a) \$2,400 for felonies classified as non-drug offenses of severity levels 5 through 10;
- (b) \$3,200 for felonies classified as non-drug offenses of severity level 4 and felonies classified as drug offenses of severity levels 2 through 4; and
- (c) \$8,000 for felonies classified as non-drug offenses of severity levels 1 through 3, off-grid felonies, and felo-

nies classified as drug offenses of severity level 1. - (b) Each claim for compensation in an exceptional case shall be accompanied by a specific finding in a court order setting forth the basis for the declaration that the case is exceptional.
- (c) Reasonable compensation for attorneys' services in exceptional cases shall not exceed \$8,000 per case. However, additional compensation may be approved by the board if warranted by the extreme complexity of the case.
