These regulations are proposed for adoption on a permanent basis. A summary of proposed regulations and their economic impact follows:

**10-20-1. Definitions.** This section defines and clarifies terms used in the regulation. There is no economic impact with this section.

**10-20-2. Procedures and forms for reporting any missing person.** The proposed regulation amends and clarifies the procedure and forms for reporting any missing person. Some of the same reporting requirements were previously contained in a prior regulation, 10-20-2a, and are now contained in this regulation, which applies only to missing persons. There is no economic impact with this section.

**10-20-2a. Procedures and forms for reporting any unidentified person.** The proposed regulation amends and clarifies the procedure and forms for reporting any unidentified person. There is no economic impact with this section.

**10-20-4. Dissemination.** The proposed regulation amends and clarifies how information contained in the KBI missing and unidentified person system shall be disseminated. There is no economic impact with this section.

Administrative Regulations

A public hearing will be conducted at 10 a.m. Thursday, April 19, at the State Corporation Commission office, 1500 S.W. Arrowhead Road, Topeka, to consider the adoption of proposed permanent regulations for the conservation of crude oil and natural gas.

This 60-day notice period from the date of this publication to the date of the public hearing constitutes a public comment period for the purpose of receiving written public comments on the proposed rules and regulations. Comments may be submitted to John McCannon, Assistant General Counsel, State Corporation Commission, Room 2078, Finney State Office Building, 130 S. Market, Wichita, 67202. All interested parties will be given a reasonable opportunity at the hearing to present their views orally or in writing in regard to the adoption of the proposed regulations. All written or oral comments submitted by interested parties on or before April 19 will be considered by the commission as a basis for making changes to these proposed permanent regulations.

Any person requiring special accommodations under the Americans with Disabilities Act needs to give notice to the commission at least 10 days prior to the scheduled hearing date.

Copies of the proposed regulations and the economic impact statements may be obtained from the commission office at 130 S. Market, Room 2078, Wichita, 67202, or from the commission's Web site at [www.kcc.state.ks.us](http://www.kcc.state.ks.us). Persons requesting a copy of the proposed regulations and economic impact statements, in accordance with K.S.A. 45-129, will be required to compensate the commission for the cost of reproduction.

The following is a brief summary of the proposed regulations and economic impact statements:

**K.A.R. 82-3-303.** This regulation describes the method for determining the open flow of a gas well and the procedure that must be followed when performing the multipoint back-pressure and one-point stabilized flow tests. The amendments to this regulation would allow electronic recording of the rate of flow and would permit the use of turbine meters. These changes allow oil and gas operators to take advantage of newer technology. This regulation also is being amended to require that the metering devices be properly calibrated and that any recalibration or refurbishment be documented. The amendments also contain wording and sentence structure changes for clarification.

**Economic Impact Statement:** The amendments to this regulation may have a slight economic impact on the industry due to the costs of calibrating the gas meters; however, most operators are already calibrating their meters. The amendment to this regulation will have no direct economic impact on the agency, other governmental agencies or the general public.

**K.A.R. 82-3-304.** This regulation establishes the testing requirements for gas wells to obtain allowables. The amendment to this regulation is a correction to the current wording.

**Economic Impact Statement:** This amendment will have no economic impact on the agency, industry, other governmental agencies or the general public.

## House Bills

**HB 2001**, an act concerning the civil commitment of certain persons; relating to sexually violent predators; relating to rights of such predators; concerning battery against a mental health employee; amending K.S.A. 59-2978, 59-29a08 and 59-29a12 and K.S.A. 2006 Supp. 21-3448 and repealing the existing sections, by Representative Mitch Holmes.

**HB 2002**, an act concerning wildlife and parks; relating to the Kansas wildlife and parks commission; amending K.S.A. 32-805 and repealing the existing section, by Representatives Gatewood and Grant.

This regulation also prohibits the use by insurance companies of any claim filed more than three years after the date of the claim.

There will be minimal economic impact on insurance companies, the Kansas Insurance Department and other governmental agencies. There may be a positive impact on consumers because motor vehicle claims resulting in less than \$1,000 damage and claims that are more than three years old will no longer be a factor used when determining premiums.

Facility Description: The proposed action is to issue an Underground Injection Control Area - Class V injection well permit for a remediation project that includes the use of injection wells number RW1, RW2 and RW3. Injection is into the Quaternary alluvial aquifer through screens from a depth of approximately 18 feet to 71 feet below ground level. The permittee is authorized to inject liquid consisting of groundwater, which has been treated using a granular activated carbon (GAC) unit for removal of chlorinated volatile organic compounds. The maximum wellhead injection pressure limit for this project is 7 psig. The maximum rate of flow for the project is 6,048,000 gallons per week. The construction, monitoring and operation of these wells shall meet the requirements that apply to Class V Injection wells under K.A.R. 28-46-1 through 28-46-42 and K.A.R. 28-30-1 through K.A.R. 28-30-10.

Permanent Administrative Regulations

Article 15.—PLANTS AND PLANT PRODUCTS

**4-15-9. Fees for the certification of live plants, plants and plant products, bees, beekeeping equipment, and regulated articles.** (a) If a state certificate is required for the entry of an inspected article into another state or a foreign country, the person needing certification shall pay one or more of the following, as applicable:

(1) \$20 for a certificate for a commodity or article certified for domestic shipment;

(2) \$50 for a certificate for a commodity or article certified for international shipment; or

(3) 15 cents for each bale tag provided to satisfy a weed-free forage requirement.

(b) If a federal certificate is also required for the entry of an inspected article into another state or a foreign country, the associated fee shall be added to the amount specified in subsection (a). (Authorized by and implementing K.S.A. 2005 Supp. 2-2118, as amended by L. 2006, ch. 78, sec. 1, and 2-2126; effective Oct. 18, 2002; amended Feb. 2, 2007.)
