Failure to submit the sworn statement as part of the bid approval package will make the bid nonresponsive and not eligible for award consideration.

Notice of Hearing

The Kansas Department of Health and Environment, Division of Environment, Bureau of Environmental Field Services, will conduct a public hearing to consider the proposed revisions to the Kansas Surface Water Quality Standards, K.A.R. 28-16-28g, including revisions to the Kansas Surface Water Register. The hearing will be held via video conferencing at 10 a.m. Wednesday, April 4, at the KDHE Northwest District Office, 2301 E. 13th, Hays; the KDHE North Central District Office, 2501 Market Place, Suite D, Salina; the KDHE Northeast District Office, 800 W. 24th, Lawrence; the KDHE Southwest District Office, 302 W. McArtor Road, Dodge City; the KDHE South Central District Office, 130 S. Market, sixth floor, Wichita; the KDHE Southeast District Office, 1500 W. 7th, Chanute; and the Curtis State Office Building, Room 530, 1000 S.W. Jackson, Topeka. If an alternate hearing location is necessary, the hearing will be held at 2 p.m. April 6 in

the IS Conference Room B, Garden Level, Curtis State Office Building, 1000 S.W. Jackson, Topeka.

Following is a summary of the proposed amendments:

K.A.R. 28-16-28g is the classification and use designation section of the Kansas Surface Water Quality Standards. Designated uses of surface waters are listed in the Kansas Surface Water Register, which is adopted by reference in K.A.R. 28-16-28g. The register identifies major classified streams, lakes and wetlands and the uses that are existing or attainable. In the period of April 1 through October 31, 2005, 560 stream segments and 140 lakes/wetlands were evaluated by a UAA to determine the appropriate use designation. Eighty stream segments are proposed for deletion from the Kansas Surface Water Register (removed from classification), 352 stream segments are proposed as secondary contact recreation, and 111 stream segments are proposed as primary contact recreation. One stream segment is proposed for restricted aquatic life and 17 stream segments have been rerouted and combined to form one segment. Forty-four lakes and wetlands are proposed for primary contact recreation and food procurement, and 96 lakes and wetlands are proposed for irrigation, livestock watering, domestic water supply, industrial water supply and groundwater recharge. There are no additional costs of compliance resulting from these changes in recreational use designations. The department estimates an annual cost to perform 500 recreational UAAs as required by K.S.A. 82a-2004 and amendments thereto to be \$200,000 per year. Currently, this cost is funded by the State Water Plan and state general fund.

The time period between the publication of this notice and the scheduled hearing constitutes a 60-day public comment period for the purpose of receiving written public comments on the proposed regulatory action. Notice of Hearing on Proposed Administrative Regulations

The Kansas Department of Health and Environment, Bureau of Air and Radiation, will conduct a public hearing at 1:30 p.m. Thursday, April 5, in Room 530 of the Curtis State Office Building, 1000 S.W. Jackson, Topeka, to consider the adoption of proposed air quality regulations **K.A.R. 28-19-720** (new source performance standards and mercury), **K.A.R. 28-19-728** and **28-19-728a through 28-19-728f** (mercury), **K.A.R. 28-19-735** (national emission standards for hazardous air pollutants) and **K.A.R. 28-19-750** (maximum achievable control technology). KDHE also will consider the adoption of a Mercury Emissions Control Implementation Plan at this hearing in order to satisfy the requirements of §111 of the federal Clean Air Act.

The primary purpose of the proposed amendments to K.A.R. 28-19-720, 28-19-735 and 28-19-750 is to incorporate by reference changes made to the respective federal standards since the last update of the state regulations in 2003. Amendments to these regulations will align them with the requirements of federal regulations for standards of performance for new sources of air pollution emissions and federal regulations for hazardous air pollutants. These regulations adopt the respective federal standards for stationary sources of air pollutant emissions as state-enforceable requirements. Kansas' adoption of these regulations does not create any new requirements, however, as facilities are already subject to the federal rules.

In addition to the updates, some of the amendments to K.A.R. 28-19-720 and the proposed new regulations K.A.R. 28-19-728 and 28-19-728a through 28-19-728f incorporate federal regulations that were promulgated as the Clean Air Mercury Rule (CAMR) by publication in the Federal Register between July 1, 2003 and June 31, 2005. In addition, amendments published in the Federal Register on August 30, 2005, and June 9, 2006, are adopted by reference to complete the CAMR set of requirements. The purpose of adopting the August 30, 2005, and June 9, 2006, amendments is to include the federal Clean Air Mercury Rule (CAMR), which was issued on May 18, 2005. Because the May 18, 2005, rule did not take effect until July 18, 2005, the language in the regulation was changed from "in effect" to "as revised" to accurately reflect its status.

Except for K.A.R. 28-19-728d, K.A.R. 28-19-728 and 28-19-728a through 28-19-728f adopt trading provisions of the model Clean Air Mercury Rule as published by the EPA in the Federal Register May 18, 2005, and subsequent Federal Register notices listed above. K.A.R. 28-19-728d contains a Kansas-specific provision to distribute the mercury trading allowances that were allocated to Kansas in the Clean Air Mercury Rule. The new source performance standards for subject mercury sources are contained in proposed K.A.R. 28-19-720.

Section 111 of the CAA, as amended in 1990, directs the EPA to establish new source performance standards (NSPS) and emission guidelines for new and existing sources, respectively. Section 111 of the CAA requires states that want to have the primary authority to regulate these sources adopt the EPA NSPS and, under section 111(d), to submit a plan to implement and enforce the emission guidelines to the EPA for review and approval. To be approvable, state emission guideline plans must be at least as protective of the public health and the environment as are the EPA emission guidelines. The federal regulations for mercury sources were finalized May 18, 2005. The proposed Implementation Plan describes how the department will implement the CAMR through the proposed air quality regulations, K.A.R. 28-19-720, 28-19-728 and 28-19-728a through 28-19-728f.

The cost of compliance for facilities is not increased by the proposed regulations because these rules are already in force, or soon will be, at the federal level. There are no additional costs that would result from these proposed amendments and new regulations beyond those resulting from the initial federal rule adoption and promulgation. At the time the EPA's rules become effective, the facilities regulated therein are subject to the costs associated with meeting the respective federal standards, whether or not the state acts to adopt the particular standards. The only effect of the state regulations that adopt these standards is to shift the responsibility and the authority for the administration of these standards from the EPA to the state.

As required by 42 U.S.C. 1396a(a)(13), the Secretary of the Kansas Department on Aging (KDOA) is publishing the proposed Medicaid per diem rate for Medicaid-certified nursing facilities, the methodology underlying the establishment of the proposed nursing facility rate, and the justifications for the proposed rate for ventilator-dependent residents. The KDOA also is providing notice of the state's intent to submit the proposed amendment to the Medicaid State Plan to the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services' Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services (CMS) on or before March 31, 2007.

I. Methodology Used to Calculate Medicaid Per Diem Rate for Ventilator-Dependent Residents.

The following are the policies and procedures for determining a rate for a ventilator-dependent resident in a nursing facility.

- (1) The request for additional reimbursement for a ventilator-dependent resident shall be submitted to the Kansas Department on Aging (KDOA) in writing for prior approval. Each request shall include the most current Minimum Data Set (MDS) resident assessment.
- (2) All of the following criteria shall be present in order for a resident to be considered ventilator dependent:
 - (A) The resident shall not be able to breathe without a volume ventilator with a backup.
 - (B) The resident shall use the ventilator 24 hours a day, seven days a week.
 - (C) The resident shall have a tracheostomy or endotracheal tube.
- (3) The provider shall be reimbursed the Kansas Medical Assistance Program daily rate determined for the nursing facility plus an additional per diem amount approved by KDOA for the ventilator-dependent resident. The sum of the nursing facility per diem rate and the additional per diem for the ventilator dependent resident shall equal \$450.

The cost of durable medical equipment (DME) shall be reimbursed separately from the per diem rate and in accordance with the DME program in the Kansas Medical Assistance Programs Manual.

The per diem cost of providing services to the ventilator dependent residents shall be reviewed at least every two years to determine the adequacy of the \$450 flat rate. Both the direct and indirect costs of providing care shall be included in the review.

- (4) No additional amount above the current nursing facility daily rate shall be allowed until the service is prior authorized by KDOA.
- (5) The criteria shall be reviewed quarterly to determine if the resident continues to be ventilator-dependent. If a resident is no longer ventilator-dependent, the provider shall not receive additional reimbursement beyond the Kansas Medical Assistance Program per diem rate determined for the facility.
- (6) The additional reimbursement for the ventilator-dependent resident shall be offset to the cost center of benefit on the Nursing Facility Financial and Statistical Report.

II. Proposed Medicaid Per Diem Rate for Kansas Nursing Facilities.

The overall per diem rate for a ventilator-dependent resident shall equal \$450.

III. Justifications for the Proposed Rate.

1. The higher rate will assist in securing placements in nursing facilities that can meet the long-term care needs for ventilator-dependent residents.

2a. Estimated impact of the rate change due to the implementation of the per diem rate for ventilator dependent residents:

Estimated Average Rate February 1, 2007	\$123.50
Estimated Average Rate July 1, 2006	\$123.32
Amount of Change	\$.18
Percent of Change	.15%

2b. The above estimated average rates are in the aggregate.

The rate change is resident specific and will have a minor impact on the overall nursing facility rates.

3. Estimated annual aggregate expenditures in the Medicaid nursing facility services payment program will increase by approximately \$648,000.

4. The state estimates that the proposed rates would continue to make quality care and services available under the Medicaid State Plan at least to the extent that care and services are available to the general population. The state's studies indicate:

a. Service providers operating a total of 301 nursing facilities (representing 96% of all the licensed nursing facilities in Kansas) participate in the Medicaid program, while an additional 41 hospital-based long-term care units also are certified to participate in the Medicaid program;

b. There is at least one Medicaid-certified nursing facility or Medicaid-certified hospital-based long-term care unit in each of the 105 counties in Kansas;

c. The statewide average occupancy rate for nursing facilities participating in Medicaid is 85%;

d. The statewide average Medicaid occupancy rate for participating facilities is 56%; and

e. The proposed rates would enhance the coverage that is already at 93% of the estimated Medicaid health care costs incurred by participating nursing facilities statewide.

5. Federal Medicaid regulations at 42 C.F.R. 447.272 impose an aggregate upper payment limit that states may pay for Medicaid nursing facility services. The state's analysis indicates that the proposed methodology would result in compliance with the federal regulation.

IV. Request for Comments; Request for Copies.

The state requests providers, beneficiaries and their representatives, and other concerned Kansas residents to review and comment on the proposed ventilator-dependent rate, the methodology used to calculate the proposed rate, the justifications for the proposed rate and the intent to amend the Medicaid State Plan. CONTINUING EDUCATION OF EMBALMERS
AND FUNERAL DIRECTORS

63-1-1. Definitions. (a) "Board" means the Kansas state board of mortuary arts.

(b) "Casket" means a rigid container that is designed for the encasement and burial of dead human bodies.

(c) "Disposition" means burial, cremation, or permanent delivery of a dead human body to a medical institution.

(d) "Embalmer" means any person licensed in embalming.

(e) "Apprentice embalmer" means any person that has passed the written Kansas embalmer examination.

(f) "Student embalmer" means any person that meets both of the following conditions:

(1) Is currently enrolled or has graduated from mortuary college with the intention of becoming an embalmer; and

(2) has registered with the board.

(g) "Embalming" means the chemical preparation of a dead human body for disposition. This term shall include all activities leading up to and including arterial and cavity embalming, including the setting of features, raising of vessels, and suturing of incisions.

(h) "Funeral service or funeral" means a religious service or other rite or ceremony with a dead human body present.

(i) "Suitable combustible container" means any receptacle or enclosure other than a casket that is of sufficient strength to be used to hold and transport human remains. This term shall include the following enclosures:

(1) A cardboard container;

(2) a pressed wood container;

(3) a composition container; and

(4) a canvas pouch. (Authorized by K.S.A. 65-1730 and K.S.A. 2006 Supp. 74-1704; implementing K.S.A. 65-1703 and K.S.A. 65-1730; effective Jan. 1, 1966; amended Jan. 1, 1974; modified by L. 1978, ch. 465, May 1, 1978; amended May 1, 1979; amended May 1, 1982; amended May 1, 1986; amended May 1, 1987; amended May 1, 1988; amended Jan. 6, 1992; amended Feb. 16, 2007.)

Article 5.—ADMINISTRATIVE HEARINGS AND
DISCIPLINARY ACTION

63-5-1. Definition of unprofessional or dishonorable conduct. "Unprofessional or dishonorable conduct" by a licensee shall include any of the following: (a) Misrepresentation or fraud in the conduct of the licensee's business;

(b) refusing or neglecting to promptly obtain, complete, and file any death certificate, out-of-state transportation permit, or coroner's permit to cremate;

(c) refusing or neglecting to file monthly reports of bodies prepared for burial in accordance with K.A.R. 28-17-16;

(d) refusing or neglecting to file quarterly progress reports as specified in K.A.R. 63-1-3 and K.A.R. 63-2-12;

(e) committing abuse or showing disrespect in the handling of a dead human body;

(f) interference with, failure in, breach of, or obstruction of the performance of the contractual duties or services between a licensee and either the next of kin or a legal representative of any deceased person;

(g) requiring the purchase of a casket as a condition to providing funeral services if the dead body is to be cremated;

(h) disclosure of the confidences or secrets of any party served or the use of these confidences or secrets to the disadvantage of any party served;

(i) using alcoholic liquor or using illegally a controlled substance while performing the duties or services of a licensee;

(j) placing any item on a funeral bill that is not a reasonable funeral expense;

(k) failure to pay, in a timely manner, the prefinanced funeral agreement audit fees assessed by the secretary of state; or

(l) gross negligence or repeated instances of ordinary negligence in the rendering of professional services as an embalmer, funeral director, or assistant funeral director. Article 4.—PERMITS TO PRACTICE

74-4-1a. Experience requirement for attest services. (a) Each permit holder who supervises attest services or who signs or authorizes a person to sign a report on any audit, attest, review, or compilation engagement on behalf of a firm shall meet the requirements set forth in the "statements on quality control standards" issued by the auditing standards board of the American institute of certified public accountants and contained in the "AICPA professional standards," as adopted by reference in K.A.R. 74-5-2.

(b) Notwithstanding subsection (a), each permit holder who supervises attest services or signs or authorizes a person to sign a report on any applicable engagement on behalf of a firm that is registered with the PCAOB shall comply with the applicable standards of the PCAOB, which are adopted by reference in K.A.R. 74-5-2.

(c) Each permit holder who supervises attest services or who signs or authorizes a person to sign a report for a governmental audit engagement on behalf of a firm shall comply with the government auditing standards adopted by reference in K.A.R. 74-5-2. (Authorized by

and implementing K.S.A. 1-202 and K.S.A. 1-302b; effective Nov. 17, 2000; amended May 27, 2005; amended May 19, 2006; amended Feb. 16, 2007.)

Article 5.—RULES OF PROFESSIONAL CONDUCT

74-5-2. Definitions. The following definitions shall be applicable wherever this terminology is used in the rules of professional conduct: (a) "AICPA" means the American institute of certified public accountants.

(b) "AICPA professional standards" means the "AICPA professional standards," volumes 1 and 2, published by the AICPA, as in effect on July 1, 2006, which are hereby adopted by reference.

(c) "Audit" means an independent examination of financial information or assertions of any entity, regardless of profit orientation, size, and legal form, if the examination is conducted to express an opinion thereon.

(d) "Board" means the Kansas state board of accountancy.

(e) "Certified public accountant" and "CPA" mean any of the following:

(1) A holder of a Kansas certificate;

(2) a person practicing certified public accountancy under the authorization to practice by notification as provided in K.S.A. 1-322 and amendments thereto; or

(3) a firm.

(f) "Compilation" shall have the meaning specified in K.S.A. 1-321 and amendments thereto.

(g) "Firm" shall have the meaning specified in K.S.A. 1-308 and amendments thereto.

(h) "Generally accepted accounting principles" means the following standards, as applicable, in effect on July 1, 2006 and hereby adopted by reference:

(1) "Federal accounting standards," issued by the federal accounting standards advisory board;

(2) "current text," volumes I and II, issued by the financial accounting standards board;

(3) "EITF abstracts," volumes 1 and 2, issued by the emerging issues task force of the financial accounting standards board;

(4) "statements of position accounting," issued by the accounting standards executive committee of the AICPA and contained in the "AICPA technical practice aids"; and

(5) "governmental accounting and financial reporting standards," issued by the governmental accounting standards board.

(i) "Government auditing standards" means the "government auditing standards," 2003 revision, and interpretations issued by the comptroller general of the United States, as in effect on July 1, 2006 and hereby adopted by reference.

(j) "Licensed municipal public accountant" and "LMPA" mean a holder of a permit issued under the laws of Kansas to practice as a municipal public accountant.

(k) "Practice of certified public accountancy" means performing or offering to perform attest or nonattest services for the public while using the designation "certified public accountant" or "C.P.A." in conjunction with these services. "Attest" and "nonattest" services shall have the

meaning specified in K.S.A. 1-321 and amendments thereto.

(l) "PCAOB" means the public company accounting oversight board created by the Sarbanes-Oxley act of 2002.

(m) "Standards of the PCAOB" mean the following standards in the "bylaws and rules of the public company accounting oversight board as of May 12, 2006," which are hereby adopted by reference:

(1) The four auditing standards; and

(2) the professional standards, parts one and five, in section three.

(n) "Staff accountant" means a certified public accountant who meets the following requirements:

(1) Holds both a Kansas certificate and a Kansas permit;

(2) is employed by a firm that is the certified public accountant's primary employer; and

(3) works at least 1,040 hours for the firm during a calendar year. (Authorized by and implementing K.S.A. 1-202 and K.S.A. 75-1119; effective Jan. 1, 1974; amended May 1, 1978; amended May 1, 1979; amended May 1, 1985; amended July 22, 1991; amended July 13, 1992; amended April 5, 1993; amended Aug. 23, 1993; amended Jan. 12, 1996; amended Jan. 8, 1999; amended Nov. 17, 2000; amended Nov. 2, 2001; amended May 27, 2005; amended May 19, 2006; amended Feb. 16, 2007.)

74-5-101. Independence. (a) Each certified public accountant and each licensed municipal public accountant who performs professional services requiring independence shall comply with the following standards, as applicable:

(1) Rule 101 of the code of professional conduct, including the definitions and interpretations, as contained in the "AICPA professional standards" adopted by reference in K.A.R. 74-5-2. Rule 101, including the definitions and interpretations, shall be used by the board in determining whether independence is impaired;

(2) chapter three of the government auditing standards adopted by reference in K.A.R. 74-5-2;

(3) regulation S-X codified at 17 C.F.R. Part 210, as in effect on July 1, 2006, which is hereby adopted by reference; and

(4) interim rule 3600T promulgated by the PCAOB, as contained in volume 1 of the "AICPA professional standards" adopted by reference in K.A.R. 74-5-2.

(b) In determining whether a certified public accountant's or a licensed municipal public accountant's independence is impaired, any other circumstances, relationship, or activity that the board determines could impair independence may be considered by the board. 74-5-202. Compliance with standards. (a) Each certified public accountant who performs auditing, attesta-

tion, review, compilation, management consulting, tax, or other professional services shall comply with the applicable professional standards promulgated by the following entities, which are adopted by reference in K.A.R. 74-5-2 and this regulation:

- (1) The federal accounting standards advisory board;
- (2) the financial accounting standards board;
- (3) the emerging issues task force;
- (4) the governmental accounting standards board;
- (5) the AICPA accounting and review services committee;
- (6) the AICPA auditing standards board;
- (7) the AICPA accounting standards executive committee;
- (8) the AICPA management consulting services executive committee;
- (9) the AICPA tax executive committee;
- (10) the PCAOB; and
- (11) the municipal accounting section of the division of accounts and reports, department of administration.

(b) Each licensed municipal public accountant shall comply with applicable, generally accepted auditing standards in the 2006 revised "Kansas municipal audit guide," prescribed by the municipal accounting section of the division of accounts and reports, department of administration, and hereby adopted by reference. 74-5-403. Advertising. (a) A certified public accountant shall not advertise in a manner that is false, misleading, or deceptive.

(b) The use of any non-CPA's name or the name of any entity not registered with the board as a CPA firm in any advertisement or publication or under any heading used for certified public accountants shall be prohibited.

(c) Rule 502 of the code of professional conduct, including the definitions and interpretations, as contained in the "AICPA professional standards" adopted by reference in K.A.R. 74-5-2, shall be used by the board in determining whether a certified public accountant has violated subsection (a). (Authorized by and implementing K.S.A. 1-202; effective May 1, 1978; amended May 1, 1985; amended July 22, 1991; amended May 27, 2005; amended Feb. 16, 2007.)

74-5-403. Change of address. Each certified public accountant shall notify the board in writing of any change in the person's home address, business name, or business address within 30 days of the change. (Authorized by and implementing K.S.A. 1-202; effective Feb. 16, 2007.)

Article 11.—PEER REVIEW PROGRAM

74-11-6. Definitions. (a) "AICPA" means the American institute of certified public accountants.

(b) "AICPA professional standards" means the "AICPA professional standards," volumes 1 and 2, published by the American institute of certified public accountants, as in effect on July 1, 2006, which are adopted by reference in K.A.R. 74-5-2.

(c) "Firm" shall have the meaning specified in K.S.A. 1-308 and amendments thereto.

(d) "Peer review" means a review of a firm's accounting and auditing practice in accordance with the standards for performing and reporting on peer reviews.

(e) "Peer review team" means persons or organizations participating in the peer review program required by the regulations in article 11. This term shall specifically include the team captain, team members, the report acceptance committee, and the oversight body, but shall not include the board.

(f) "Standards for performing and reporting on peer reviews" means either of the following:

(1) The AICPA "standards for performing and reporting on peer review" contained in volume two of the AICPA professional standards, as adopted by reference in K.A.R. 74-5-2; or

(2) standards published by the center for public company audit firms in the "peer review program manual" and "reference manual," as in effect on July 1, 2006, which are hereby adopted by reference.

(g)(1) "Substantially similar program" means a peer review program that meets the following requirements:

(A) The peer review team shall be approved by a nationally recognized accounting organization as having the qualifications, training, and experience to perform the peer review function required by this regulation.

(B)(i) The peer review shall be conducted pursuant to peer review standards as issued by a nationally recognized peer review program that has received prior approval by the board; or

(ii) the peer review shall be conducted pursuant to a written submission detailing the qualifications of the peer review team to conduct the peer review and providing a written plan for the peer review illustrating the means of compliance with this regulation with the prior specific approval of the board.

(2) Each inspection performed by the public company accounting oversight board of areas of a firm's practice related to audits of issuers, as defined by the public company accounting oversight board, shall be deemed to satisfy the peer review related to this element of the firm's practice. Article 2.—LOTTERY RETAILERS

111-2-191. ConocoPhillips Nos. 1384, 1274 retailer instant ticket incentive. (a) During the period beginning December 1, 2006, and ending December 31, 2006, in addition to compensation provided for in K.A.R. 111-2-4, the Kansas lottery also offers all participating Conoco-Phillips lottery retailers located in Kansas an opportunity to participate in an instant ticket sales promotion.

(b) At the end of the promotion, the store with the greatest percentage increase in cumulative instant ticket sales for the period from December 1, 2006, through December 31, 2006, over the base sales period of December 1, 2005, through December 31, 2005, will win a \$300 credit on the retailer's lottery account.

The store with the second greatest percentage increase in cumulative instant ticket sales for the period from December 1, 2006, through December 31, 2006, over the base sales period of December 1, 2005, through December 31, 2005, will win a \$150 credit on the retailer's lottery account.

The store with the third greatest percentage increase in cumulative instant ticket sales for the period from December 1, 2006, through December 31, 2006, over the base sales period of December 1, 2005, through December 31, 2005, will win a \$75 credit on the retailer's lottery account.

Promotional items chosen by the lottery will also be awarded to all retail locations participating in the promotion which show any increase in cumulative instant ticket sales over the base period. (Authorized by and implementing K.S.A. 74-8710 and K.S.A. 74-8708; effective, T-111-10-24-06, Oct. 18, 2006.)

ZARCO 66 DRAWING 2006

111-2-192. Name of drawing. The Kansas lottery shall conduct a drawing entitled "Zarco 66 Drawing 2006" and will accept entries starting at the opening of business for each participating Zarco 66 store on November 1, 2006, through the end of business for each store on November 26, 2006, for the drawing to be conducted on November 30, 2006. Rules applicable to the "Zarco 66 Drawing 2006" are contained in K.A.R. 111-2-192 through 111-2-196 and K.A.R. 111-2-1 *et seq.* (Authorized by and implementing K.S.A. 74-8710; effective, T-111-10-24-06, Oct. 18, 2006.)

111-2-193. Prize. (a) The seven preliminary prize winners selected in the "Zarco 66 Drawing 2006" on the date specified in K.A.R. 111-2-192 shall receive \$20 in lottery coupons. All remaining entries shall then be automatically entered into the drawing for the grand prize. The grand prize shall consist of two tickets to the Kansas City Chiefs versus Baltimore Ravens football game on December 10, 2006, one parking pass, and a \$50 VISA gift card.

(b) Prize winners will receive notification of their prize, but the actual prize will be delivered at a time and place determined by the lottery.

(c) No later than 5:00 p.m. on the third calendar day following the drawing, the lottery shall contact by telephone the winner of the grand prize as the result of this drawing. If the lottery is unable to contact the winner within said three days, the person named on the entry drawn will no longer be eligible for the prize. In such an event, the first eligible alternate entry drawn pursuant to subsection (e) of K.A.R. 111-2-195 shall be declared the winner. All alternate winners shall then be subject to the same rules of eligibility as original winners. (Authorized by and implementing K.S.A. 74-8710; effective, T-111-10-24-06, Oct. 18, 2006.)

111-2-194. Method of entry. (a) Entry into the "Zarco 66 Drawing 2006" shall be accomplished as follows:

(1) With every single purchase of a Kansas Powerball ticket with Power Play from the opening of business of that store on November 1, 2006, through the end of business for that store on November 26, 2006, the lottery terminal shall automatically produce one entry form for the "Zarco 66 Drawing 2006."

(2) The purchaser must complete the information on the entry form in a legible manner. Only one name shall appear on each entry form.

(3) The completed entry form must be placed into the designated drawing receptacle provided at each Zarco 66 store no later than the close of business for that store on November 26, 2006.

(4) The holder of the entry is not required to personally attend the drawing or be present at the time of the drawing to be determined a winner.

(5) The drawing will be conducted at the Zarco 66 corporate office located in Lawrence, Kansas, on the day set forth in K.A.R. 111-2-192.

(6) Entry forms obtained during the stated period of time may be entered in the drawing.

(b) There is no limit on the number of entries a person may make, but each person may only win one preliminary prize and one grand prize.

(c) All eligible entry forms which are deposited into the drawing receptacles by the end of business for that store on November 26, 2006, shall be entered into the drawing.

(d) Eligible entrants in the "Zarco 66 Drawing 2006" must be 18 years of age or older, and may not be an employee of any Zarco 66 store in Kansas.

(e) Completing the information form on the entry form and entering the ticket into any drawing constitutes authorization to publicly identify the person whose entry is drawn. (Authorized by and implementing K.S.A. 74-8710; effective, T-111-10-24-06, Oct. 18, 2006.)

111-2-195. Selection of winners. The following process shall be used for the selection of winners in the "Zarco 66 Drawing 2006":

(a) Personnel of the Zarco 66 stores shall pick up all drawing receptacles containing "Zarco 66 Drawing 2006" entries after the deadline for entry into the drawing, and transport the receptacles to the Zarco 66 corporate office in Lawrence, Kansas, where they shall be secured by personnel at Zarco 66 stores.

(b) On November 30, 2006, the drawing shall be held at the Zarco 66 corporate office in Lawrence, Kansas, in a place accessible to the public and open for public attendance with lottery security personnel present. The drawing shall be conducted by the lottery and shall be audio and video taped.

(c) At the start of the drawing, lottery security personnel shall present the seven drawing receptacles to the person designated by the executive director to perform the drawing. The receptacles for the drawing shall contain all entries eligible for the drawing from each of the seven stores. The contents of each receptacle shall be mixed or shaken thoroughly. The designated individual shall then using the bare-arm technique, while looking away, remove one valid entry from each receptacle. The person whose name appears on each of the entries shall be the winner of a \$20 Kansas lottery coupon, subject to validation by the lottery as set forth in these rules.

(d) After one entry has been drawn from each receptacle and verified as valid by lottery security, all remaining entries shall be placed into another drawing receptacle. The contents of the receptacle shall be mixed or shaken thoroughly. The designated individual shall then using the bare-arm technique, while looking away, remove one valid entry from the receptacle. The person whose name appears on the entry shall be the winner of the grand prize identified in K.A.R. 111-2-193. After one valid entry has been drawn, two more entries shall be drawn in the same manner and marked in the order drawn as 1A and 2A to act as alternate entries to be used in the order drawn in the event the grand prize winner fails to claim the prize as provided herein.

(e) The Kansas lottery security official present shall review each entry drawn to determine the validity of the entry into the "Zarco 66 Drawing 2006" in accordance with these regulations. If it is a valid entry and the name is legible, the event manager and the security person present shall record the name of the winner.

(f) If the entry is determined to be ineligible, it shall be discarded by the security person present and another entry drawn. This procedure will be repeated until valid selections are obtained.

(g) All "Zarco 66 Drawing 2006" entries remaining in the receptacles after the winners and alternates have been selected and certified and all entries not received in compliance with these rules shall be destroyed pursuant to K.A.R. 111-3-34. (Authorized by and implementing K.S.A. 74-8710; effective, T-111-10-24-06, Oct. 18, 2006.)

111-2-196. Certification of drawing. (a) The "Zarco 66 Drawing 2006" shall be personally observed by a member of the Kansas lottery security department and a member of the Kansas lottery marketing or sales department or other person or persons designated by the executive director of the lottery (hereinafter "event manager").

(b) Upon completion of the drawing, the security official and the event manager shall issue a report to the executive director, certifying that the name of each prize winner is correct, and that to the best of their knowledge the procedures required by these rules were followed in selecting each prize winner. (Authorized by and imple-

111-4-2492. Definitions. (a) All definitions contained in the Kansas lottery act (K.S.A. 74-8701 *et seq.*) and lottery regulations are hereby incorporated by reference and govern unless otherwise indicated.

(b) "Flint Hills Treasures Second Chance Drawing" means the act of drawing prizes conducted by the Kansas lottery at lottery headquarters in Topeka, Kansas, on the date set forth in K.A.R. 111-4-2495, in which participants are selected to win prizes as described in K.A.R. 111-4-2493.

(c) "Non-winning ticket" means any valid Kansas lottery "Flint Hills Treasures" instant game lottery ticket not eligible to win a prize under the rules of that instant game.

(d) "Receptacle" or "drum" means a container in which non-winning Kansas instant game lottery tickets are placed and from which the "Flint Hills Treasures Second Chance Drawing" entries are drawn. Receptacles or drums may be sealable and shall be capable of being mixed or rotated for the purpose of ensuring random distribution.

(e) "Bare arm technique" means a type of drawing where the person drawing the winning ticket from the receptacle or drum wears a long-sleeved shirt with sleeve rolled up above the elbow, a short-sleeved shirt (sleeve not extending past the elbow) or a no-sleeve shirt which exposes the drawer's bare arm and looks away from the drawing drum or receptacle while drawing. (Authorized by and implementing K.S.A. 74-8710; effective, T-111-10-24-06, Oct. 18, 2006.)

(d) The winner of a prize shall return to the lottery a completed claim form as provided by the lottery within 30 calendar days in which his or her ticket was drawn or the person named on the ticket drawn will no longer be eligible for the prize. In such an event, the first eligible alternate entry drawn for that prize pursuant to subsection (e) of K.A.R. 111-4-2495 shall be declared the winner. (Authorized by and implementing K.S.A. 74-8710; effective, T-111-10-24-06, Oct. 18, 2006.)

111-4-2494. Method of entry. (a) Entry into the "Flint Hills Treasures Second Chance Drawing" shall be accomplished as follows:

(1) Obtain a valid "Flint Hills Treasures" Kansas lottery instant lottery ticket.

(2) Determine if the ticket is a winning ticket in accordance with "Flint Hills Treasures" game rules. If the ticket is a winning ticket, it is not eligible for the drawing and shall be redeemed in accordance with the instant game rules.

The person whose name appears on each entry shall be the winner of a prize package identified in K.A.R. 111-4-2493, subject to validation by the lottery as set forth in these rules.

(i) No later than 5:00 p.m. on the fourteenth calendar day following the drawing, the winner of a prize as the result of this drawing shall return to the lottery a completed claim form as provided by the lottery or the person named on the entry drawn will no longer be eligible for the prize. (a) Kansas lottery personnel shall pick up all mail containing "Kansas Lottery \$150 Grand ARCA Drawing" entries at the United States Post Office in Topeka, Kansas, with final pick up for the drawing after the morning mail delivery on Tuesday, March 20, 2007, prior to the drawing on Friday, March 23, 2007.

(b) Lottery personnel shall transport the mail to the Kansas lottery mail room where the envelopes will be opened and emptied into the drawing receptacle or drum, along with entries deposited at events specifically designated by the lottery, if any.

(c) The drawing shall be held at the lottery headquarters in a place accessible to the public and open for public attendance with lottery security personnel present. The drawing shall be audio and video taped.

(d) At the start of the drawing, lottery security personnel shall present the receptacle or drum to the person

designated by the executive director to perform the drawing. The receptacle or drum for the drawing shall contain all entries eligible for the drawing. The drum shall be rotated 10 times or receptacle mixed thoroughly as may be applicable. The designated individual shall then unseal the receptacle or drum, and using the bare-arm technique, while looking away, remove 45 valid entries, one at a time, from the receptacle or drum and mark them in order drawn from one through and including 45. The person whose name appears on each of the entries shall be the winner of the prize identified in K.A.R. 111-7-209, subject to validation by the lottery as set forth in these rules.

(e) After 45 entries have been drawn and verified as valid by lottery security, 10 more entries will be drawn, one at a time, to serve as alternate entries. The alternate entries will be marked in order drawn, 1A, 2A, 3A, 4A, 5A, 6A, 7A, 8A, 9A, and 10A. The alternate ticket entries will be used only if one or more of the original winners cannot be located or are declared ineligible, or fail to present a fully-executed claim form to lottery headquarters as required by K.A.R. 111-7-209. The alternates will be used, if necessary, in the order drawn.

(f) The Kansas lottery security official present shall review each entry drawn to determine the validity of the entry into this drawing in accordance with these regulations. If it is a valid entry and the name is legible, the event manager and the security person present shall record the name of the winner. Each winner shall be given or sent a prize claim form to be completed and returned to the lottery within 14 calendar days of the drawing.

(g) If the entry is determined to be ineligible, it shall be discarded by the security person present and another entry drawn. This procedure will be repeated until valid selections are obtained.

(h) All entries remaining in the drum or receptacle after the winners have been selected and certified and all entries not received in compliance with these rules shall be destroyed pursuant to K.A.R. 111-3-34. (Authorized by and implementing K.S.A. 74-8710; effective, T-111-10-24-06, Oct. 18, 2006.)

111-7-212. Certification of drawing. (a) The "Kansas Lottery \$150 Grand ARCA Drawing" shall be personally observed by a member of the Kansas lottery security department and a member of the Kansas lottery marketing department or other person or persons designated by the executive director of the lottery (hereinafter "event manager").

(b) Upon completion of the drawing, the security official and the event manager shall issue a report to the executive director, certifying that the name of each prize winner is correct, and that to the best of their knowledge the procedures required by these rules were followed in selecting each prize winner. (Authorized by and implementing K.S.A. 74-8710; effective, T-111-10-24-06, Oct. 18, 2006.)

KANSAS SPEEDWAY \$150 GRAND SECOND CHANCE DRAWING

111-7-213. Name, time, and place of drawing. (a) The Kansas lottery shall conduct a drawing entitled

"Kansas Speedway \$150 Grand Second Chance Drawing."

(b) The drawing shall take place at the Great Wolf Lodge in Kansas City, Kansas, on April 26, 2007.

(c) Rules applicable to this drawing are contained in K.A.R. 111-3-1 *et seq.* and 111-7-213 through 111-7-217. (Authorized by and implementing K.S.A. 74-8710; effective, T-111-10-24-06, Oct. 18, 2006.)

111-7-214. Definitions. (a) All definitions contained in the Kansas lottery act (K.S.A. 74-8701 *et seq.*) and amendments thereto and lottery regulations are hereby incorporated by reference and govern unless otherwise indicated.

(b) "Kansas Speedway \$150 Grand Second Chance Drawing" means the act of drawing for prizes conducted by the Kansas lottery at the Great Wolf Lodge in Kansas City, Kansas, in which participants are selected to win prizes as described in K.A.R. 111-7-216.

(c) "Entry" means the forty-five (45) valid entries previously selected during the drawing entitled "Kansas Lottery \$150 Grand ARCA Drawing" as set forth in K.A.R. 111-7-208 through 111-7-212, and amendments thereto, or the name of each entrant named thereon.

(d) "Receptacle" or "drum" means a container in which entry tickets are placed and from which the "Kansas Speedway \$150 Grand Second Chance Drawing" is made. Receptacles or drums may be sealable and shall be capable of being mixed or rotated for the purpose of ensuring random distribution.

(e) "Bare arm technique" means a type of drawing where the person drawing the winning ticket from the receptacle or drum wears a long-sleeved shirt with sleeve rolled up above the elbow, a short-sleeved shirt (sleeve not extending past the elbow) or a non-sleeve shirt which exposes the drawer's bare arm and looks away from the drawing drum or receptacle while drawing. (Authorized by and implementing K.S.A. 74-8710; effective, T-111-10-24-06, Oct. 18, 2006.)

111-7-215. Entry into drawing. (a) Entry into the "Kansas Speedway \$150 Grand Second Chance Drawing" ("drawing") is accomplished automatically by the forty-five (45) winners selected in the "Kansas Lottery \$150 Grand ARCA Drawing," as set forth in K.A.R. 111-7-208 through 111-7-212, and amendments thereto, or if applicable the person to whom an entry has been transferred pursuant to said drawing rules.

(b) At a time and place designated by the lottery, all entries or the names of all persons named on said entries shall be placed into the drawing receptacle. Entrants must be present to have their name or entry placed into the drawing receptacle.

(c) Entrants are required to be present at the time of the drawing to be determined a winner.

(d) All eligible entrants must be at least 18 years of age.

(e) Employees, agents, successors, and assignees of Kansas Speedway, its advertising agencies, and promotional companies involved in this drawing and contest, as well as immediate family and household members of the same, shall be ineligible to participate in the drawing or contest and shall be ineligible for any prize awarded therein. Names and likenesses of the drawing and contest

winner(s) may be used by Kansas Speedway and Kansas Speedway's designee(s) for promotional purposes without further compensation to Kansas Speedway or the drawing and contest winner(s). (Authorized by and implementing K.S.A. 74-8710; effective, T-111-10-24-06, Oct. 18, 2006.)

111-7-216. Determination of "Kansas Speedway \$150 Grand Second Chance Drawing" winners and prizes. (a) At least five minutes before the drawing, a lottery drawing official designated by the executive director shall announce to the audience that the winner selection process will begin.

(b) The drawing receptacle or drum containing the names or entries (hereinafter "entries") shall be rotated a minimum of 10 times to ensure random selection.

(c) The drawing official shall designate one individual of his or her choice to participate in the selection process.

(d) The selection of two winners shall be accomplished by the individual designated by the drawing official, using a bare arm technique, removing two entries from the drawing receptacle or drum, one at a time. Each entry drawn shall be marked in the order drawn, 1 and 2.

(e) Immediately after the winning entries have been selected, a lottery official or person designated by the lottery official shall announce to the audience the names on the two entries drawn, and the time and location at the racetrack the persons are to appear on the day of the race to make their predictions of the outcome of the race. If any winner fails to appear at the designated location by the announced time, that person shall no longer be eligible to participate in the contest. The lottery official shall satisfy himself or herself that the persons who present themselves are the persons named on each entry.

(f) The lottery official shall determine and give each contestant an equal amount of time to predict in correct order the official first, second, and third place finishers of that day's ARCA RE/MAX race or as said race may be postponed or continued from time to time. The contestants may not select the same racers in the same finishing order. In the event both contestants have selected the same racers in the same finishing order, the first of the two contestants whose name was selected shall have the opportunity to retain his or her predictions, or change one or more of the predictions. If that contestant chooses to retain the first selections made, the other contestant must change one or more of his or her predictions. Each person's predictions shall be reduced to writing and signed by the persons making the predictions and delivered to the lottery official. All predictions must be made, reduced to writing, delivered to the lottery official, and signed no less than 20 minutes before the official start of the race.

(g) The official final results of the race shall be compared to the predictions made by each contestant. In the event a contestant correctly predicted the exact correct official finishing order of the first, second, and third place finishers in the race, that contestant shall receive a prize from the lottery of one hundred fifty thousand dollars (\$150,000), subject to withholding and offsets as provided by law.

(h) Each of the two contestants competing in the contest shall also receive a race weekend prize package for two

consisting of reserved admission to races conducted at the Kansas Speedway on September 29 and 30, 2007, double-occupancy hotel accommodations on September 28 and 29, 2007, food and beverages in the lottery's hospitality chalet located at the racetrack, and \$1,500 cash, together with payment by the lottery of all mandatory income withholding taxes on the prize, except that a contestant winning the \$150,000 prize shall not receive an additional \$1,500 cash or payment of mandatory income withholding taxes on the \$150,000 prize.

(i) Each winner of a prize as a result of the drawing shall return to lottery headquarters a completed claim form as provided by the lottery, which claim form must be actually received by lottery no later than 5:00 p.m. on the fourteenth day following the drawing or the person will no longer be eligible for the prize.

(j) In the event there are fewer than 20 drivers actually participating in the ARCA RE/MAX race on April 27, 2007, or as postponed, this contest shall not be conducted and shall be declared null and void. (Authorized by and implementing K.S.A. 74-8710; effective, T-111-10-24-06, Oct. 18, 2006.)

111-7-217. Certification of drawing. (a) The "Kansas Speedway \$150 Grand Second Chance Drawing" shall be personally observed by a member of the Kansas lottery security department and a member of the Kansas lottery marketing department or other person or persons designated by the executive director of the lottery ("event manager").

(b) Upon completion of the drawing, the security official and the event manager shall issue a report to the executive director, certifying that the name of each prize winner is correct, and that to the best of their knowledge the procedures required by these rules were followed in selecting the prize winners. (Authorized by and implementing K.S.A. 74-8710; effective, T-111-10-24-06, Oct. 18, 2006.)

Article 9.—PULL-TAB GAMES

111-9-136. "Silver Slots" pull tab ticket lottery game number 629. (a) The Kansas lottery shall conduct a pull tab lottery game entitled "Silver Slots" commencing on or after November 1, 2006. The rules for this game are contained in K.A.R. 111-8-1 *et seq.* and K.A.R. 111-9-136.

(b) The price of pull tab tickets sold by a retailer for this game shall be \$1.00 each.

(c) Approximately 600,000 tickets shall be ordered initially for this pull tab game which shall be packaged in packs of 300 tickets each. The ticket numbers in each pack in this game shall start with 000 and end with 299. Additional ticket orders shall have the same prize structure, the same number of prizes per pool of 300,000 tickets, and the same odds as were contained in the initial ticket order.

(d) The play symbols for this game are as follows:

- Symbol of a bar
- Symbol of a 7
- Symbol of a horseshoe
- Symbol of a crown
- Symbol of a bell
- Symbol of a stack of bills

(e) For this game, three play symbols shall appear under each of eight tabs on the back of each ticket. On the front of each ticket shall appear a legend of all winning combinations using the play symbols for this game along with the corresponding prize amount for each combination, as follows: three diamond symbols equal \$2.00; three star symbols equal \$5.00; three symbols of stacks of bills equal \$10.00; three bell symbols equal \$25.00; three crown symbols equal \$50.00; three horseshoe symbols equal \$100.00; three 7 symbols equal \$250.00; and three bar symbols equal \$2,500.00.

(f) All tabs on the back of each ticket are to be pulled open. For each combination of three play symbols matching the legend on the front of the ticket, the player wins the prize amount corresponding to each combination as shown in (h) below. All winning combinations shall be within a single window in a horizontal line.
