Wildlife and Parks Commission**Notice of Hearing on Proposed Administrative Regulations**

A public hearing will be conducted by the Wildlife and Parks Commission at 7 p.m. Thursday, August 16, at Bass Pro Shops, 12051 Bass Pro Drive, Olathe, to consider the approval and adoption of proposed administrative regulations of the Kansas Department of Wildlife and Parks.

A workshop meeting on business of the Wildlife and Parks Commission will begin at 1:30 p.m. August 16 at the location listed above. The meeting will recess at 5:30 p.m., then resume at 7 p.m. at the same location for the regulatory hearing. There will be public comment periods at the beginning of the afternoon and evening meetings for any issues not on the agenda, and additional comment periods will be available during the meeting on agenda items. Old and new business also may be discussed at this time. If necessary to complete the hearing or other business matters, the commission will reconvene at 9 a.m. August 17 at the same location.

Any individual with a disability may request accommodation in order to participate in the public hearing and may request the proposed regulations and economic impact statements in an accessible format. Requests for accommodation should be made at least five working days in advance of the hearing by contacting Sheila Kemmis, commission secretary, at (620) 672-5911. Persons with a hearing impairment may call the Kansas Commission for the Deaf and Hard of Hearing at (800) 432-0698 to request special accommodations.

This 60-day notice period prior to the hearing constitutes a public comment period for the purpose of receiving written public comments on the proposed administrative regulations. All interested parties may submit written comments prior to the hearing to the chairman of the commission, Kansas Department of Wildlife and Parks, 1020 S. Kansas Ave., Suite 200, Topeka, 66612, or to sheilak@wp.state.ks.us if electronically. All interested parties will be given a reasonable opportunity at the hearing to express their views orally in regard to the adoption of the proposed regulations. During the hearing, all written and oral comments submitted by interested parties will be considered by the commission as a basis for approving, amending and approving, or rejecting the proposed regulations.

The regulations that will be heard during the regulatory hearing portion of the meeting are as follows:

K.A.R. 115-30-1. This permanent regulation establishes display of identification number and decal for vessels. The proposed amendments clarify positioning of the department-issued decals on vessels.

Economic Impact Summary: The proposed amendments are not anticipated to have any appreciable economic impact on the department, other agencies or the public.

K.A.R. 115-30-5. This permanent regulation establishes rules for capacity plates and operation of vessels. The proposed amendment would provide a formula for calculation of person capacity for vessels that do not have a capacity plate.

Economic Impact Summary: The proposed amendments are not anticipated to have any appreciable economic impact on the department, other agencies or the public.

K.A.R. 115-30-7. This permanent regulation establishes steering and sailing requirements for the operation of vessels. The proposed amendments would clarify the duties of a vessel operator when operating a vessel in close proximity to other vessels and prohibit mooring to and interference with navigation buoys.

Economic Impact Summary: The proposed amendments are not anticipated to have any appreciable economic impact on the department, other agencies or the public.

K.A.R. 115-30-8. This permanent regulation establishes requirements for the reporting of boating accidents. The proposed amendments would allow the reporting of a vessel accident to any commissioned law enforcement officer as well as to the department and alter the reporting timeframe from five days to immediately after the accident.

Economic Impact Summary: The proposed amendments are not anticipated to have any appreciable economic impact on the department, other agencies or the public.

K.A.R. 115-30-10. This permanent regulation establishes definitions, requirements and restrictions. The proposed regulation would change the no wake distance from 100 feet to 200 feet in certain situations and alter the boater education requirements for personal watercraft operation to conform to current state law regarding boater education.

Economic Impact Summary: The proposed regulation is not anticipated to have any appreciable economic impact on the department, other agencies or the public.

K.A.R. 115-30-12. This new permanent regulation establishes vessel requirements for vessels with marine sanitation devices. The proposed regulation would require the use of a nonreleasing locking device on any sewage discharge valve in order to prevent the unlawful discharge of marine sewage into the waters of the state.

Economic Impact Summary: The proposed amendments are not anticipated to have any appreciable economic impact on the department, other agencies or the public.

K.A.R. 115-8-7. This permanent regulation establishes special requirements for boating on department lands and waters as well as federal reservoirs. The proposed amendments would conform this regulation to changes proposed in K.A.R. 115-30-10 regarding watercraft operation in certain situations and the use of no wake speeds.

Economic Impact Summary: The proposed amendments are not anticipated to have any appreciable economic impact on the department, other agencies or the public.

Sealed bids for **Fuel Management System, OP Project No. PB-0927, KDOT Project No. 46 N-0449-01**, will be received by the city of Overland Park, Kansas, at the office of the city clerk, City Hall, 8500 Santa Fe Drive, Overland Park, KS 66212, until 2 p.m. local time July 17, 2007. At that time all sealed bids will be transferred to the City Council Chamber, City Hall, where they will be publicly opened and read aloud. Any bid received after the designated closing time will be returned unopened.

All bids shall be submitted in sealed envelopes addressed to the city clerk of Overland Park, Kansas, and marked "Bid For: Fuel Management System." Copies of plans, specifications, bid documents and other contract documents are on file at the office of the city engineer located at the Overland Park City Hall, (913) 895-6040. Contractors desiring the contract documents for use in preparing bids may obtain a set of such documents upon payment of \$20, which amount is not refundable.

Contractors should read and be fully familiar with all contract documents before submitting a bid. In submitting a bid, the bidder warrants that it has read the contract documents and is fully familiar therewith and that it has visited the site of the work to fully inform itself as to all existing conditions and limitations, and shall include in its bid a sum to cover the cost of all items of the work.

Should a bidder find "defects" as defined in paragraph GC-3 of the general conditions, it shall follow the procedures outlined in paragraph GC-3 to bring same to the attention of the city. Changes necessitated thereby shall be in the form of addenda issued by the consulting engineer.

All bidders shall verify that they have considered all written addenda. Neither the city nor the consulting engineer shall be responsible for oral instructions.

Any written addenda issued during the time of bidding shall be covered and included in the bid. There will be

no clarifications or exceptions allowed on the bid. Bids are for a total bid package, total contract price.

Bids shall be made upon the form provided in ink or typewritten. Numbers shall be stated both in writing and in figures, the signature shall be long hand, and the complete form shall be without alteration or erasure. On alternate items for which a bid is not submitted, a written indication of "no bid" on the bid form is required.

No oral, telegraphic, facsimile or telephonic bids or alterations will be considered.

The following items must be included in the sealed envelope with the bid:

- a. Bid
- b. 5% bid security — bid bond, cashier's check or certified check (see below)
- c. Signed documents (KDOT certifications)
 - Certification — Noncollusion & History of Debarment
 - Certifications — Federal Funds for Lobbying
 - Required contract provisions — certification — contractual services with current legislator or legislator's firm
 - Required contract provision — DBE goals

Each bidder shall file with its bid a bid bond, a cashier's check or a certified check drawn on any acceptable bank, made payable to the city of Overland Park, Kansas, in an amount of not less than 5 percent of the total bid, which shall be retained by the city of Overland Park until a contract for the project has been executed. Bid bonds will be returned to the unsuccessful bidders, with the exception of the second qualifying bidder, at such time as their bids are rejected. The bid deposit of the successful bidder and the second qualifying bidder will be returned when satisfactory bonds in an amount equal to 100 percent of the contract amount, required insurance certificates and other required documents shall have been furnished and the contract documents have been executed.

In the event the successful bidder is unable to execute the contract, for whatever reason, the city may exercise its legal prerogatives, including, but not limited to, enforcement of its rights as to the bid security.

The city reserves the right to accept or reject any and all bids and to waive any technicalities or irregularities therein. Bids may be modified or withdrawn by written request of the bidder received in the office of the city clerk prior to the time and date for bid opening; provided, however, that no bidder may withdraw its bid for a period of 30 days from the date set for the opening thereof. All bidders agree that rejection shall create no liability on the part of the city because of such rejection. It is understood by all bidders that an unsuccessful bidder has no cause of action against the city for bid preparation costs. The filing of any bid in response to this invitation shall constitute an agreement of the bidder to these conditions.

All bidders are required to schedule a site visit prior to submitting a bid or the bid will not be considered valid.

Notice of Hearing on Proposed
Administrative Regulations

A public hearing will be conducted at 9 a.m. Tuesday, August 14, in Room 527-South, State Capitol, 300 S.W. 10th Ave., Topeka, to consider the adoption of a proposed rule and regulation of the Department of Administration on a permanent basis.

This 60-day notice of the public hearing shall constitute a public comment period for the purpose of receiving written public comments on the proposed rule and regulation. All interested parties may submit written comments prior to the hearing to Juliene Maska, Administrator, Governor's Grants Program, Room 304-North, Landon State Office Building, 900 S.W. Jackson, Topeka, 66612, or at juliene.maska@ks.gov. All interested parties will be given a reasonable opportunity to present their views orally on the adoption of the proposed regulation during the hearing. In order to give all parties an opportunity to present their views, it may be necessary to request that each participant limit any oral presentation to five minutes.

Any individual with a disability may request accommodation in order to participate in the public hearing and may request the proposed regulation and economic impact statement in an accessible format. Requests for accommodation should be made at least five working days in advance of the hearing by contacting Faith Loretto at (785) 296-6006 or (800) 766-3777 (TTY). The east entrance to the Kansas Capitol is accessible. Handicapped parking is located on the east side of the building.

A summary of the proposed regulation and its economic impact follows:

K.A.R. 1-64-1 establishes a new regulation that would authorize the Secretary of Administration to assess monetary penalties against wireless carriers and voice-over Internet protocol (VoIP) providers that fail to comply with the provisions of the Wireless Enhanced 911 Act (K.S.A. 2006 Supp. 12-5321 et seq.) or the VoIP enhanced 911 Act (K.S.A. 2006 Supp. 12-5351 et seq.). Under the terms of the proposed regulation, the local collection point administrator is to notify the secretary or the secretary's duly authorized agent of any wireless carrier or VoIP provider that (1) has not submitted the carrier's or provider's wireless enhanced 911 local fees or the corresponding return within 14 days of its due date; or (2) has submitted fees and a return that are substantially inconsistent with each other. A penalty of 10 percent of the enhanced 911 local fees due from a delinquent wireless carrier or VoIP provider is to be assessed by written order of the secretary against any carrier or provider that is determined to be in delinquent status. Written notice of the penalty assessment, the violation, and the right to a hearing is to be issued by the secretary. Interest at an annual rate of 10 percent will accrue if a wireless carrier or VoIP provider remains in delinquent status for 30 days or more after the date on which the fees and return were due.

The proposed regulation requires any monetary penalties to be remitted to the secretary or the secretary's

duly appointed agent. K.S.A. 2006 Supp. 12-5325 and 12-5354 direct any civil penalty recovered to be deposited with the local collection point administrator and subsequently routed back to the corresponding PSAP.

The secretary or a duly authorized agent of the secretary will be required to administer the processes for determining and assessing penalties, hearing any appeals of the penalties in accordance with the provisions of the Kansas Administrative Procedures Act (KAPA), and forwarding the recovered penalties to the local collection point administrator. Thus, there will be an economic impact on the Department of Administration associated with the administration of the penalty process. In addition to staff time associated with processing the assessment and collection and distribution of penalties, there would be costs associated with appeals of penalties. The rate charged by the Office of Administrative Hearings is \$70 per hour for agencies that utilize its services on a sporadic basis. Therefore, it is estimated that there would be a cost to the Department of Administration of \$500-\$1000 per year for hearings under KAPA.

There will be an economic impact on any wireless carrier or VoIP provider that does not accurately and timely remit data and fees as required by the Wireless Enhanced 911 Act and the VoIP Enhanced 911 Act. The full extent of the economic impact would depend on the amount of local money due to the local collection point administrator as the monetary penalty is 10 percent of the local E911 fee due. Monthly local fees submitted to date have ranged from \$.25 to \$88,913. Therefore, based on this historical data, a 10 percent penalty could be as minimal as \$.03 or as much as \$8,891. However, to the extent that a wireless carrier's or VoIP provider's customer base grows, the size of any penalty would increase proportionately.

Implementation of the regulation is anticipated to have a positive economic impact on PSAPs in the form of more consistent cash flow. It is the intent of the regulation to encourage the wireless carriers and the VoIP providers to remit their data and local fees in an appropriate and timely manner. When that task is accomplished, the local dollars will reach the PSAPs in a consistent timeframe and allow for accurate budgeting, which will in turn allow the PSAPs to more effectively serve Kansas citizens. In the event that civil penalties are recovered as a result of the regulation, those funds also will be funneled back to the corresponding PSAPs. As noted above, penalties could range from a few cents to several thousand dollars.

It is not anticipated that the size or frequency of penalties assessed to wireless carriers or VoIP providers would be significant enough to have any identifiable impact on subscriber rates or fees. However, to the extent that improved, more consistent cash flow and budgeting for PSAPs results in improved E911 services for wireless and VoIP subscribers, there may be an indirect, positive economic impact on those subscribers and the citizens of Kansas in the form of improved safety services and prompt assistance to subscribers in emergency situations.

There also is little or no fiscal impact on consumers, the Kansas Insurance Department and other governmental agencies.

Article 9.—EDUCATION

66-9-5. Surveying curriculum approved by the board. Any applicant seeking licensure as a land surveyor may fulfill the education requirement by any of the following:

- (a) Graduation from an approved engineering curriculum as defined in K.A.R. 66-9-4;
- (b) graduation from a four-year land surveying baccalaureate curriculum accredited by the accreditation board for engineering and technology (ABET);
- (c) graduation from an approved land surveying curriculum of two years from a school or college approved by the board;
- (d) graduation from an approved four-year related science curriculum, which may include geology, mathematics, chemistry, or physics; or
- (e) successful completion of the board's "land surveying curriculum," which was approved by the board on December 8, 2006 and is hereby adopted by reference. (Authorized by K.S.A. 74-7013 and 74-7022; implementing K.S.A. 74-7022; effective Feb. 22, 1993; amended Feb. 14, 1994; amended Nov. 1, 2002; amended June 29, 2007.)

Article 10.—EXPERIENCE

66-10-10a. Surveying experience required of applicant who completes land surveying curriculum or is

a graduate of an approved land surveying curriculum.

(a) Each graduate of a four-year land surveying curriculum, as described in K.A.R. 66-9-5(b), shall be required to provide documentation of four years of surveying experience, as required by K.S.A. 74-7022(a), and amendments thereto. The four years of experience shall have been in progressive land surveying, as described in K.A.R. 66-10-12(b)(1).

(b) Each person who has successfully completed the land surveying curriculum specified in K.A.R. 66-9-5(e) and each graduate of an approved land surveying curriculum of two years, as specified in K.A.R. 66-9-5(c), shall be required to provide documentation of six years of surveying experience, as required by K.S.A. 74-7022(a), and amendments thereto. At least four years of experience shall have been in progressive land surveying as specified in K.A.R. 66-10-12(b)(1), and the remainder shall have been in either progressive land surveying or basic land surveying, as specified in paragraphs (b)(2), (3), and (4) of K.A.R. 66-10-12. (Authorized by K.S.A. 74-7013 and 74-7022; implementing K.S.A. 74-7022; effective Feb. 22, 1993; amended Feb. 13, 1995; amended Jan. 5, 2007; amended June 29, 2007.)

Article 11.—INTERN CERTIFICATION AND ADMISSION TO THE FUNDAMENTALS EXAMINATION

66-11-5. Admission requirements for fundamentals of surveying examination. (a) Each application shall

be reviewed by the board to determine whether the requirements for admission to take the fundamentals of surveying examination have been met. Once the board establishes that these requirements have been met, the applicant shall be allowed to sit for the examination.

(b) Each applicant shall meet one of the following requirements for admission before taking the examination:

(1) Graduation from an accredited land surveying curriculum, as defined in K.A.R. 66-9-5 (b) and (c);

(2) successful completion of the land surveying curriculum specified in K.A.R. 66-9-5(e);

(3) verification of a combination of education and experience of a character satisfactory to the board. In evaluating an applicant's record, a determination shall be made by the board of whether, based on the applicant's educational background, the applicant requires no more than four years of additional progressive land surveying experience to qualify for admission to the practice of surveying examination; or

(4) through June 30, 2008, verification of four years of experience of a character satisfactory to the board, of which two years shall be in progressive land surveying as defined in K.A.R. 66-10-12. (Authorized by K.S.A. 74-7013; implementing K.S.A. 74-7022 and 74-7023; effective Nov. 1, 2002; amended Feb. 3, 2006; amended June 29, 2007.)
