Proposed Administrative Regulation/
Notice of Fact-Finding Hearing**

A public hearing was scheduled at 2:30 p.m. August 16 in the third floor conference room, Kansas Insurance Department, 420 S.W. 9th, Topeka, to consider the adoption of the following proposed regulation:

K.A.R. 40-3-56. Fire and casualty insurance companies; health care provider; claims. As used in K.S.A. 40-3402 and amendments thereto, a "claim" shall mean either of the following:

- (a) A notice of legal process received by an insured; or
- (b) an oral or written demand for money made against an insured. (Authorized by K.S.A. 40-103 and 40-3417; implementing K.S.A. 40-3402; effective P-_____.)

Please be advised that the Kansas Insurance Department is hereby postponing consideration of the proposed regulation until further notice. **Therefore, the public hearing has been cancelled.**

Pursuant to the authority granted to the Commissioner of Insurance by K.S.A. 40-281, a fact-finding hearing will be held at 1:30 p.m. September 20 in Room 123-S, State Capitol, 300 S.W. 10th Ave., Topeka. The purpose of this hearing is to obtain information that will allow the commissioner to evaluate the impact of the proposed regulation on the availability of insurance coverage to health care providers and, thus, the effect on the public, industry and health care providers.

All interested parties shall have an opportunity to be heard and to present material as the commissioner deems relevant. Written comments will be accepted prior to the hearing and may be submitted to Sandy Praeger, Commissioner of Insurance, Kansas Insurance Department, 420 S.W. 9th, Topeka, 66612. The written comments that are received will be posted on the department's Web site.

The Kansas Department of Health and Environment has reviewed an application from Universal Lubricants, LLC to operate a reclamation facility that will process used oil and oil filters. The facility will be located at 2824 N. Ohio St. in Wichita. The facility will have three areas of operation. The first area will consist of collecting, processing and blending used oil for fuel purposes. The second area will concentrate on collecting and recycling used oil filters, and the third area will re-refine used oil into base stock lubricating oil. The city of Wichita has certified that the application described herein is consistent with local zoning requirements, and the Sedgwick County Commission also certified that the application is consistent with its Solid Waste Management Plan. KDHE has reviewed the application and found it to be in conformance with state solid waste statutes and regulations.

KDHE is providing public notice of its intent to issue a permit to Universal Lubricants, LLC for the proposed solid waste processing facility described herein.
