Opinion 2007-28

State Boards, Commission and Authorities—Parimutuel Racing; Organization Licensees to Conduct Races; Board of Directors of Organization Licensee; Kansas Expanded Lottery Act. Stephen L. Martino, Executive Director, Kansas Racing and Gaming Commission, Topeka, September 10, 2007.

The Kansas Parimutuel Racing Act (Act) prohibits a state legislator from holding a compensated position with an organization licensee, including compensation for services as a member of the organization licensee's board of directors. A state legislator who is not compensated for his or her services as a board member does not violate the Act.

Section 31 of the Kansas Expanded Lottery Act prohibits a state legislator and a member of a city governing body where a racetrack gaming facility is located from holding, directly or indirectly, a financial interest in a racetrack gaming facility or a racetrack gaming facility manager. The fact that an organization licensee may itself—have a financial interest in a racetrack gaming facility manager by virtue of a facility management contract with the latter is not sufficient to impute such interest to an organization licensee's board members. Accordingly, a board member who is a state legislator and a board member who is a member of a city governing body where a racetrack gaming facility is located do not violate Section 31 by virtue of the contractual relationship between the organization licensee and the racetrack gaming facility manager. For purposes of the idle funds statute, K.S.A. 2006 Supp. 12-1675, Lawrence Memorial Hospital is not a governmental entity, unit or subdivision in the state of Kansas having authority to receive, hold and expend public moneys or funds. Public Health—Air Quality Control—Action to Protect Health or Environment; Authority to Deny, Modify or Stay Issuance of an Air Quality Permit. Roderick L. Bremby, Secretary, Kansas Department of Health and Evironment, Topeka, September 24, 2007.

If the Secretary of the Kansas Department of Health and Environment makes a factual determination that a particular emission constitutes air pollution and that such emission presents a substantial endangerment to the health of persons or to the environment, then even in the absence of federal or state regulations setting limitations for a particular pollutant, K.S.A. 65-3012 authorizes the Secretary to take actions as necessary to protect the health of persons or the environment. Such actions may include denying an air quality permit application on the basis of the anticipated emissions of a particular pollutant or modifying a proposed permit to address such pollutant. However, whether K.S.A. 65-3012 would allow the sec-

retary to stay issuance of a permit until such time—if ever—that state regulations are adopted addressing a particular pollutant, it is highly questionable whether such an action would survive a due process challenge or a challenge based upon such action being arbitrary, capricious, and unreasonable. Facility Description: The proposed action is to reissue an existing permit for a Class I nonhazardous waste injection well at the location described above. The fluids to be injected are described as nonhazardous liquid waste consisting brine contaminated water currently being disposed under the well's Class II permit, sanitary waste water, boiler blow down, blow down from cooling towers, rinse water from zeolite regeneration, and effluent from the Sequencing Bach Reactors (SBR's), which represent the final step in the treatment of oily water from the refinery. Injection is to be made into the Simpson and Arbuckle formations through openhole from a depth of 3,908 feet to 4,391 feet. Disposal will be by means of gravity flow; wellhead pressure will not be allowed. The maximum rate of injection will be 2,160,000 gallons per day. All construction, monitoring and operation of this well will meet the requirements that apply to Class I injection wells under the Kansas Underground Injection Control Regulations, K.A.R. 28-46-1 through 28-46-44.

Notice of Hearing on Proposed Administrative Regulations

The Kansas Department of Health and Environment, Division of Health, Bureau of Child Care and Health Facilities, will conduct a public hearing at 1 p.m. Tuesday, January 8, in Room 530 of the Curtis State Office Building, 1000 S.W. Jackson, Topeka, to consider the amendment of one general regulation for categories of child care, K.A.R. 28-4-122; the amendment of one family foster homes for children regulation, K.A.R. 28-4-311; the revocation of family foster homes for children regulations, K.A.R. 28-4-312 through 28-4-317; and the adoption of the following proposed new family foster home regulations: K.A.R. 28-4-800 through 28-4-825.

A summary of the proposed regulations and the estimated economic impact follows:

Summary of Regulations

28-4-122. Amended to remove family foster homes from the general regulations for family day care homes and child care facilities.

28-4-311. Amended to remove all previous family foster home regulations definitions with the exception of the definition of "family foster home."

28-4-312 through 28-4-317. Revoked. These were the previous family foster home regulations.

28-4-800. Provides specific definitions of terms used throughout the family foster home regulations.

28-4-801. Lists the situations for which a license is required and is not required.

28-4-802. Describes the application and additional requirements to obtain a license.

28-4-803. States that the secretary may refuse to grant a license if the applicant is not in compliance with specific statutes and regulations.

28-4-804. Describes the parameters of a temporary permit or a license; license renewals; procedures for requesting an amendment or an exception; an applicant may withdraw an application and a licensee may request to close the family foster home.

28-4-805. Background checks. Describes who is required to submit a request for a background check to comply with K.S.A. 65-516, and amendments thereto.

28-4-806. Training. Sets forth the training requirements for licensees and other caregivers, prelicensure and in-service including required content areas and number of hours; corrective action plans for licensees who fail to complete training.

28-4-807. Provides direction on reporting infectious or contagious diseases in the home, notification requirements in case of hospitalization or emergency medical treatment of a child in foster care; positive tuberculin tests; critical incidents to be reported; reporting suspected neglect, physical, mental, or emotional abuse, and sexual abuse of a child in foster care.

28-4-808. Details the records that must be kept by the licensee on the family foster home, caregivers, family fos-

ter home members, each child in foster care; confidentiality of records.

28-4-809. Lists the documents that must accompany a child into placement in the family foster home; documents that must be obtained within 10 calendar days of placement; documents and items that must accompany the child when departing from the family foster home.

28-4-810. Describes the role of the licensee in participating in the case plan development for each child placed in the home; licensee must follow the case plan; nondisclosure of information on child in foster care; process for conflict resolution between licensee and child in foster care.

28-4-811. Caregiver shall be qualified by temperament, maturity, judgment, understanding of children; levels of supervision required for children; guidelines for supervision in absence of licensee, including requirements for child to be allowed to do self-care.

28-4-812. Describes requirements for licensees to provide short term or long term respite care for children placed in other family foster homes.

28-4-813. Describes requirements for the licensee in providing care and opportunities for the child's social, cultural, religious, recreational, educational, and basic life skills.

28-4-814. Inclusion of child in foster care in daily activities, including access to school, church, recreational, and health facilities; daily routines; requirements for the licensee to provide essential items and obtain specific items of care as needed; allowances; work activities; informal visitation with extended family member of the licensee; sleepovers; requirements for the child's participation in high-risk sport and recreational activities.

28-4-815. Positive behavior management, including time out; prohibited punishments; use of physical restraint, including reporting requirements.

28-4-816. Vehicle and driver requirements for transporting children in foster care, including requirements for child in foster care being allowed to drive.

28-4-817. Guidelines for feeding children in care, planning meals, sanitary methods of food preparation and storage.

28-4-818. Guidelines for prescription and nonprescription medication for children in foster care, including training required for individuals administering medications; requirements for allowing self-medication by a child in foster care.

28-4-819. Household members must be free from any infectious or contagious diseases; health of caregivers, foster family members, and children in foster care, including health assessments, tuberculin testing, and immunizations.

28-4-820. Home must meet zoning and water requirements; structural and furnishing requirements for the home, including smoke detectors and carbon monoxide detectors; safe storage of firearms and other weapons; storage of household chemical, personal care products, tools, sharp instruments; requirements for heating appliances; requirements for mobile homes.

28-4-821. Information on sleeping space requirements; requirements for beds and cribs; safe sleeping positions for infants; room sharing.

28-4-822. Emergency plans; arrangements at hospital or clinic for emergency medical treatment for children in foster care; caregiver remains at emergency care facility with the child; fire and tornado drills.

28-4-823. General safety of outdoor premises and play area; trampolines prohibited; protection from safety hazards.

28-4-824. Safeguards for swimming or wading pools over 12 inches deep, or for hot tubs on premises of the foster home; requirements for swimming pools or wading pools on the premises; general safety off the premises, including water activities.

28-4-825. Requirements for pet area; any animal in contact with child in foster care is in good health and not a threat; rabies vaccinations; protection of child from any animal that represents a hazard to the child; pit bulls, exotic animals, and venomous or constricting reptiles prohibited.

Economic Impact

Cost to the agency:

There is no additional cost to the agency. Any costs will be absorbed in the current budget.

Cost to licensees:

1. The proposed new regulation K.A.R. 28-4-820 (d)(13) states that a smoke detector shall be installed on each level of the home and in each room used for sleeping by a child in foster care and by the licensee. Current regulation K.A.R. 28-4-315 (f) only requires a smoke detector on each level of the home. At the community level, smoke detectors are often available for free or at a reduced cost, up to \$5, for each smoke detector for each family foster home to come into compliance with the new regulation.

2. The proposed new regulation K.A.R. 28-4-820 (d)(14) states that one operable carbon monoxide detector shall be installed in an area adjacent to each room used for sleeping by a child in foster care and by the licensee. There is no current regulation requiring a carbon monoxide detector. There is an increased cost of approximately \$30 for each carbon monoxide detector for each family foster home to come into compliance with the new regulation.

3. The proposed new regulation K.A.R. 28-4-805 (c) requires the following for each individual at least 18 years of age who will be residing in the family foster home:

- A child abuse and neglect background check from each previous state of residence throughout the five-year period before the date of application, and
- a fingerprint-based check from the national crime identification databases (NCID)

The proposed new regulation K.A.R. 28-4-805 (d) requires the following for each individual at least 18 years of age before the individual begins residing in a family foster home:

- A child abuse and neglect background check from each previous state of residence throughout the previous five years, and
- · a fingerprint-based check from the NCID.

The proposed new regulation K.A.R. 28-4-805 (e) states that all fees associated with obtaining the background checks and NCID checks shall be the responsibility of the

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applicant or licensee. The approximate cost for each individual in sections (c) and (d) of this regulation is \$50. The cost of the child abuse registry checks in other states is unknown.

Costs to other governmental agencies or units: There is no known additional cost.

The time period between publication of this notice and the hearing serves as the required public comment period of at least 60 days for the purpose of receiving written public comments on the proposed regulations. At any time during the public comment period any interested parties may submit written comments to Dorothy Tenney, Kansas Department of Health and Environment, Child Care Licensing and Registration Program, 1000 S.W. Jackson, Suite 200, Topeka, 66612-1274. Written comments also may be e-mailed to dtenney@kdhe. state.ks.us. All interested parties will be given a reasonable opportunity at the hearing to orally present their view of the proposed regulations. In order to give each individual or entity an opportunity to present their view, it may be necessary for the hearing officer to request that each presenter limit any presentation to an appropriate time frame.

Article 13.—RURAL BUSINESS DEVELOPMENT TAX CREDIT PROGRAM

110-13-10. Administration of contributions and regional business development fund. (a) Until the secretary approves each contribution from a taxpayer to the regional foundation as being eligible for tax credits, the regional foundation shall not consider, and the foundation shall not communicate to any taxpayer, that the contribution is entitled to a tax credit under this act.

- (b) Each regional foundation being allocated tax credits shall open an account for the regional business development fund in a bank or other financial institution located in the state of Kansas that is insured by either the federal deposit insurance corporation (FDIC) or the national credit union share insurance fund (NCUSIF). The foundation shall deposit any funds related to each project in that account.
- (c) Each contribution by taxpayers made to the regional foundation shall indicate that the contribution is to be allocated to the regional foundation's regional business development fund as specified in the regional foundation's approved proposal.
- (d) Any regional foundation may amend its budget if the scope of work for the projects remains the same. Each amendment exceeding 10 percent of the regional foundation's total regional business development fund budget shall require the approval of both the regional foundation's board of directors and the secretary.
- (e) When requesting contributions from individuals and businesses, the regional foundation shall not utilize tax credits in excess of the amount allocated by the secretary. (Authorized by K.S.A. 2006 Supp. 74-5002r and K.S.A. 2006 Supp. 74-50,154; implementing K.S.A. 2006 Supp. 74-50,154; effective Aug. 12, 2005; amended Nov. 26, 2007.)
