Notice of Available Grant Funding

The Kansas Department of Transportation's Office of Public Transportation announces it is accepting funding requests for the next state fiscal year under 49 U.S.C. § 5310; 49 U.S.C. § 5311, including funding for Intercity Bus transportation; 49 U.S.C. § 5316; and 49 U.S.C. § 5317 under the Safe, Accountable, Flexible, Efficient Transportation Equity Act: A Legacy for Users (SAFETEA-LU) for transportation services. In addition, KDOT is accepting requests for state funding made available under the Comprehensive Transportation Program (CTP) for rural transportation providers.

Under 49 U.S.C. § 5310, funding is made available for the purchase of vehicles and equipment for services to the elderly and persons with disabilities. 49 U.S.C. § 5311 provides operating assistance and/or vehicles for transportation services to the elderly, persons with disabilities and the general public. 49 U.S.C. § 5316, Job Access and Reverse Commute Program (JARC), is to improve access to transportation services to employment and employment-related activities for welfare recipients and eligible low-income individuals and to transport residents of urbanized areas and nonurbanized areas to suburban employment opportunities. 49 U.S.C. § 5317, New Freedom Formula Grant Program, aims to provide additional tools to overcome existing barriers facing Americans with disabilities seeking integration into the work force and full participation in society.

Eligible applicants for 49 U.S.C. § 5310 grant funds from the Federal Transit Administration must be private, nonprofit organizations that have been incorporated and registered with the Kansas Secretary of State to do business in Kansas. Applicants for 49 U.S.C. § 5311, 5316 and 5317 grants must be local units of government, Indian tribes, private nonprofit organizations or private operators contracting through any of these parties. Applicants for Section 5311, 5316 and 5317 funds also must be registered with the Kansas Secretary of State to do business in Kansas. All applicants must be active members of their local Coordinated Transit District (CTD) in order to receive federal and/or state transit funding.

A total of approximately \$1.1 million in 49 U.S.C. § 5310 funds, \$8.2 million in 49 U.S.C. § 5311 funds, \$1.2 million in 49 U.S.C. § 5316 funds and \$700,000 in 49 U.S.C. § 5317 funds will be available for the upcoming state fiscal year (July 1, 2008 - June 30, 2009). The federal share of eligible capital cost will not exceed 80 percent of the net cost of each project, and the grant applicant share shall be 20 percent of the net cost. The federal share of operating cost will not exceed 50 percent of the net cost of each project. The grant applicant share will not be less than 50 percent of the net cost.

State funds in the amount of \$2,460,000 for rural transit providers are available for state fiscal year 2009 for those who are currently in the 49 U.S.C. § 5310 or 49 U.S.C. § 5311 program or are eligible to be in either of those pro-

Request for Comments

The Kansas Department of Health and Environment is soliciting comments regarding a proposed air quality operating permit. Southern Star Central Gas Pipeline has applied for a Class I operating permit renewal in accordance with the provisions of K.A.R. 28-19-510 et seq. The purpose of a Class I permit is to identify the sources and

types of regulated air pollutants emitted from the facility; the emission limitations, standards and requirements applicable to each source; and the monitoring, record keeping and reporting requirements applicable to each source as of the effective date of permit issuance.

Southern Star Central Gas Pipeline, Owensboro, Kentucky, owns and operates Otis Compressor Station located at Section 11, T17S, R16W, Rush County, Kansas.

A copy of the proposed permit, permit application, all supporting documentation and all information relied upon during the permit application review process is available for a 30-day public review during normal business hours at the KDHE, Bureau of Air and Radiation, 1000 S.W. Jackson, Suite 310, Topeka; and a copy of the proposed permit can be reviewed at the KDHE Northwest District Office, 2301 E. 13th, Hays. In order to be considered in formulating a final permit decision, written comments must be received before the close of business January 7.

A person may request a public hearing be held on the proposed permit. The request for a public hearing shall be in writing and set forth the basis for the request. The written request must be submitted to Sherry Walker, Bureau of Air and Radiation, not later than the close of business January 7 in order for the Secretary of Health and Environment to consider the request.

The U.S. Environmental Protection Agency has a 45day review period, which will start concurrently with the 30-day public comment period, within which to object to the proposed permit. If the EPA has not objected in writing to the issuance of the permit within the 45-day review period, any person may petition the administrator of the EPA to review the permit. The 60-day public petition period will directly follow the EPA's 45-day review period. Interested parties may contact KDHE to determine if the EPA's 45-day review period has been waived.

Any such petition shall be based only on objections to the permit that were raised with reasonable specificity during the public comment period provided for in this notice, unless the petitioner demonstrates that it was impracticable to raise such objections within such period, or unless the grounds for such objection arose after such period. Request for Comments

The Kansas Department of Health and Environment is soliciting comments regarding a proposed air quality construction permit. Ethanex Northeast Kansas, LLC, has applied for an air quality construction permit in accordance with the provisions of K.A.R. 28-19-300 to construct an ethanol manufacturing plant. Emissions of particulate matter (PM), PM equal to or less than 10 microns in diameter (PM₁₀), volatile organic compounds (VOCs), oxides of nitrogen (NOx), sulfur oxides (SOx), carbon monoxide (CO) and hazardous air pollutants (HAPs) were evaluated during the permit review process.

Ethanex Northeast Kansas, LLC, proposes to own and operate a stationary source located in Pottawatomie County (north of St. Marys adjacent to the Jeffrey Energy Center), at which a 140-million-gallon per year fuel grade ethanol plant is to be constructed and operated.

A public comment period has been established until noon January 7 to allow citizens the opportunity to express any concerns they may have about this proposed permitting action. Notice of Hearing on Proposed Administrative Regulations

A public hearing will be conducted at 1:30 p.m. Tuesday, February 5, in the Azure Conference Room, fourth floor, Curtis State Office Building, 1000 S.W. Jackson, Topeka, to consider the adoption of new breath alcohol testing regulations and the revocation of existing breath alcohol testing regulations. The proposed new regulations apply primarily to evidential breath alcohol testing devices and certification procedures, but also include preliminary breath screening devices. The Kansas Department of Health and Environment proposes to revoke the existing breath alcohol testing regulations and to adopt new breath alcohol testing regulations that better correlate to the technological changes in breath testing that have occurred in the 20 years since the existing regulations were first adopted. The proposed new regulations also will improve the clarity and organization of the regulations.

One of the key changes to the regulatory scheme is the elimination of the operator proficiency-testing requirements found in K.A.R. 28-32-2, which is proposed for revocation. Proficiency testing involves the shipment of standards to law enforcement agencies four times per year at an annual cost to KDHE of about \$5,000. Because breathtesting instrument technology has changed and the operation of the breath-testing instrument has been simplified over the years, it is believed the requirement of continuing education is a more effective way of maintaining operator proficiency with the instrument. Another regulatory change shifts the operator certificate from a one-year certificate to a two-year certificate, thus reducing the staff time required to issue certifications.

A summary of changes to the regulations follows. The new regulations will not result in any increased cost to the regulated community.

K.A.R. 28-32-8. Definitions. The current breath alcohol testing regulations do not include definitions. Many of the terms contained in this proposed new regulation have been in use as defined through KDHE operator training manuals. Key terms defined in this regulation include "agency," "agency custodian," "alcohol" (from K.S.A. 2006 Supp. 8-2,128), "alcohol concentration" (from K.S.A. 2006 Supp. 8-1013), "certified agency," "certified operator," "device custodian," "evidential breath alcohol test," "evidential breath alcohol test device," "preliminary breath-screening device" and "quality control."

K.A.R. 28-32-9. Agency certification. K.A.R. 28-32-9 establishes the program elements required for a law enforcement agency to maintain an evidential breath alcohol-testing program and provides for the agency certificate's term, renewal, and suspension or revocation. This proposed new regulation replaces K.A.R. 28-32-4, which is proposed for revocation in this rulemaking.

K.A.R. 28-32-10. Operator certification. To become certified, K.A.R. 28-32-10 requires an operator to complete a

course of instruction and a written examination and sets the parameters for the operator certificate's term, renewal (including a requirement for continuing evidential breath alcohol testing education), and suspension or revocation. K.A.R. 28-32-10 also makes new provision for military service or official leave of absence and the effect on an operator's certification status. This proposed new regulation replaces K.A.R. 28-32-5, which is proposed for revocation in this rulemaking.

K.A.R. 28-32-11. EBAT device certification. In addition to the test device certification requirements, K.A.R. 28-32-11 includes device maintenance, repair and modification provisions. This proposed new regulation replaces K.A.R. 28-32-1, which is proposed for revocation in this rule-making.

K.A.R. 28-32-12. Certified operator instruction and continuing education requirements. This regulation places the operator training requirements currently in K.A.R. 28-32-1 in a new regulation devoted entirely to training. The only "new" provisions are the addition of "a law enforcement training center" to the list of training entities and to make continuing evidential breath alcohol testing education course requirements and the course instructor subject to the secretary's approval.

K.A.R. 28-32-13. Records and reports. This proposed new regulation establishes certified agency recordkeeping and reporting requirements for certified operators and evidential breath alcohol testing devices assigned to the agency and subjects the records to annual inspection by the secretary. These requirements are not new to the breath alcohol program; they have been relocated from other regulations to a single regulation for ease of reference.

K.A.R. 28-32-14. Preliminary breath-screening test devices. K.A.R. 28-32-14 combines and restructures the provisions for preliminary breath screening devices that are currently found in K.A.R. 28-32-6 and 28-32-7, which are proposed for revocation in this rulemaking. The most significant change to the regulation is the expansion of the list of approved devices in the regulation.

The time period between publication of this notice and the scheduled hearing serves as the required public comment period of at least 60 days for the purpose of receiving written public comments on the proposed regulations. All interested parties may submit written comments prior to 5 p.m. on the day of the hearing to Shari Albrecht, Kansas Department of Health and Environment, 1000 S.W. Jackson, Suite 400, Topeka, 66612-1367, by fax to (785) 291-3266, or by e-mail to sfeistal@kdhe.state.ks.us. All interested parties will be given a reasonable opportunity to present their views orally on the adoption of the proposed regulations during the hearing. - (g) "Out of production" means that no commercial crude oil processing or refinement into petroleum products has taken place five or more years before the date of an application submitted under the act.
- (h) "Placed in service," when used to describe a date, means the date on which an asset is placed into service. This date is considered to be when the asset is in a condition of readiness and availability for a specifically assigned function.
- (i) "Project" means a new refinery, an expanded refinery, or a refinery whose production has been restored.
- (j) "Qualified investment" has the meaning specified in K.S.A. 79-32,217, and amendments thereto. This term shall not include expenditures financed, in whole or in part, by public funds or grants or by any similar type of financial assistance.
- (k) "Real property" means land and real estate. This term shall include not only the land itself but also all buildings, fixtures, improvements, mines, minerals, quarries, mineral springs, and wells.
- (l) "Secretary" means the secretary of the Kansas department of commerce.
- (m) "Tangible investment" means an investment in tangible personal or real property.

Temporary Administrative Regulations

Article 4.—INSTANT GAMES AND DRAWINGS

- **111-4-2617. Prize.** The two prize winners selected in the "Deal or No Deal Second Chance Drawing" on the date specified in these regulations shall receive a trip for four persons, including round trip coach airfare from Kansas City, Missouri, to Hollywood, California, two double occupancy hotel rooms, room taxes, transportation between the hotel and airport, a chance for the winner to participate in a non-televised edition of the "Deal or No Deal" television show, \$2,000 cash, and mandatory income withholding taxes, not including income taxes that may be won during the "Deal or No Deal" game, which shall be the sole responsibility of the winner. - (a) Prize packages are not transferable; however, any prize winner in this drawing may designate, in writing, another person to participate on his or her behalf in the "Deal or No Deal" show, if selected.

In such an event, the first eligible alternate entry drawn pursuant to these regulations shall be declared the winner. All alternate winners shall then be subject to the same rules of eligibility as original winners.
 - (i) A total of two prize packages shall be awarded.
- (j) All entries not selected for the trip prize packages described above pursuant to these rules shall be eligible for entry into the bonus grand prize drawing for a single prize of \$1,000,000 cash to be paid by MDI. The bonus grand prize drawing will be held on September 17, 2008, and will also contain entries from other state lotteries.
