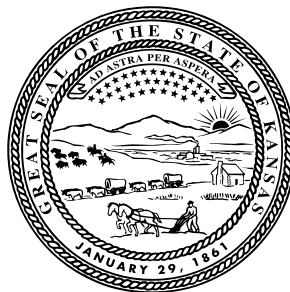

anyone because of race, age, religion, color, sex, handicap or national origin in the award of contracts.

Each bidder shall file a sworn statement executed by or on behalf of the person, firm, association or corporation submitting the bid, certifying that such person, firm, association or corporation has not, either directly or indirectly, entered into any agreement, participated in any collusion, or otherwise taken any action in restraint of free competitive bidding in connection with the submitted bid.

This sworn statement shall be in the form of an affidavit executed and sworn to by the bidder before a person who is authorized by the laws of the state to administer oaths. The required form of affidavit will be provided by the state to each prospective bidder. Failure to submit the sworn statement as part of the bid approval package will make the bid nonresponsive and not eligible for award consideration.

Plans and specifications for the projects may be examined at the office of the respective county clerk or at the KDOT district office responsible for the work.

The bids will be considered by the governing body at its meeting at 7:30 p.m. on the sale date.

No oral or auction bids for the bonds shall be considered, and no bids for less than 99 percent of the total principal amount of the bonds and accrued interest to the date of delivery shall be considered.

Good Faith Deposit

Each bidder must submit a good faith deposit in the form of a certified or cashier's check made payable to the order of the city, or a financial surety bond, if available, in an amount equal to 2 percent of the principal amount of the bonds.

Details of the Bonds

The bonds are dated November 1, 2008, and will be issued as registered bonds in the denomination of \$5,000, or any integral multiple thereof. Notice of Proposed Nursing Facility Disaster Relief Provision, Methodology for Calculating Rates for Disaster Relief, and Rate Justifications; Notice of Intent to Amend the Medicaid State Plan and Request for Written Comments

Under the Medicaid program, 42 U.S.C. 1396 et seq., the state of Kansas pays nursing facilities, nursing facilities for mental health and hospital long-term care units (hereafter collectively referred to as nursing facilities) a daily rate for care provided to residents who are eligible for Medicaid benefits. The Kansas Secretary of Aging administers the nursing facility program, which includes hospital long-term care units. The secretary acts on behalf of the Kansas Health Policy Authority (KHPA), the single state Medicaid agency. As required by 42 U.S.C. 1396a(a)(13), as amended by Section 4711 of the Balanced Budget Act of 1997, P.L. No. 105-33, 101 Stat. 251, 507-08 (August 5, 1997), the Secretary of Aging (KDOA) is publishing the proposed methodology underlying the establishment of the nursing facility rates and the justifications for the proposed rates for disaster relief. The KDOA also is providing notice of the state's intent to submit proposed amendments to the Medicaid State Plan to the U. S. Department of Health and Human Services' Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services (CMS) on or before December 31, 2008.

I. Methodology Used to Calculate Medicaid Per Diem Rate for Disaster Relief.

As provided for in L. 2008, ch. 184, sec. 40, to recognize the high cost of cleanup and renovations made necessary by the 2007 natural disaster that occurred in Southeast Kansas, per diem rates for providers forced to close and subsequently reopen as new providers within the affected area will be determined from a projected cost report.

Qualifying Providers

Only providers located within a county designated by major disaster declaration FEMA-1711-DR, which also remained closed for a period of nine months or more as a result of such 2007 disaster caused by the flooding and

other severe weather in Southeast Kansas, and which subsequently reopened as new providers (unrelated to the previous operator or owner), will be eligible for this provision. These providers will be considered in disaster relief status.

Rate Determination

The per diem rate for each qualifying provider shall be determined on an interim basis from a projected cost report. Once the qualifying provider has completed its first 12 months of operation, the provider will be required to file an historical cost report covering the same period as the projected cost report. The historical cost report will be used to recalculate all rates set from the projected cost report and a direct cash settlement will be required to cover the cost of any overpayment or underpayment.

All cost data used to set rates for qualifying providers shall be adjusted to the midpoint of the rate payment period. This adjustment will be based on the Data Resources, Inc., National Skilled Nursing Facility Market Basket Without Capital Index (DRI Index). The DRI indices listed in the latest available quarterly publication will be used to adjust the reported cost data from the midpoint of the cost report period to the midpoint of the rate payment period. The provider shall remain in disaster relief status until they have completed one full calendar year in the Medicaid program and the base data is reestablished. During this time, the adjusted cost data from the projected and subsequent historical cost reports shall be used to determine all rates for the provider. Any additional factor for inflation that is applied to cost data for established providers shall be applied to the adjusted cost data for each provider in disaster relief status.

Once the provider exits disaster relief status, the per diem rates will be determined from its historical calendar year cost reports that fall within the base period.

II. Proposed Medicaid Per Diem Rate for Kansas Nursing Facilities.

One provider meets the qualifying provider criteria established for the disaster relief provision. The estimated rate for Windsor Place of Independence is \$135.00.

III. Justifications for the Proposed Rates.

1. The proposed rates are calculated according to the rate-setting methodology in the Kansas Medicaid State Plan and pending amendments thereto.
2. The proposed rates are calculated according to a methodology which satisfies the requirements of L. 2008, ch. 184 sec. 40, K.S.A 39-708c(x) and K.A.R. Article 30-10 implementing that statute, and applicable federal law.
3. Estimated impact of the rate change due to the implementation of the per diem rate for disaster relief provision:

a. Estimated average rate October 3, 2008	\$136.36
Average payment rate July 1, 2008	\$136.30
Amount of change	\$0.06
Percent of change	0.04%
4. Estimated annual aggregate expenditures in the Medicaid nursing facility services payment program will increase by approximately \$190,793.

5. The state estimates that the proposed rates will continue to make quality care and services available under the Medicaid State Plan at least to the extent that care and services are available to the general population in the geographic area. The state's analyses indicate:
 - a. Service providers operating a total of 294 nursing facilities (representing 97% of all the licensed nursing facilities in Kansas) participate in the Medicaid program, while an additional 40 hospital-based long-term care units are also certified to participate in the Medicaid program;
 - b. There is at least one Medicaid-certified nursing facility and/or nursing facility for mental health, or Medicaid-certified hospital-based long-term care unit in each of the 105 counties in Kansas;
 - c. The statewide average occupancy rate for nursing facilities participating in Medicaid is 84.1%;
 - d. The statewide average Medicaid occupancy rate for participating facilities is 55.8%; and
 - e. The proposed rates would enhance the coverage that is already at 96.84% of the estimated Medicaid health care costs incurred by participating nursing facilities statewide.
6. Federal Medicaid regulations at 42 C.F.R. 447.272 impose an aggregate upper payment limit that states may pay for Medicaid nursing facility services. The state's analysis indicates that the proposed methodology would result in compliance with the federal regulation.

IV. Request for Comments; Request for Copies.

The state requests providers, beneficiaries and their representatives, and other concerned Kansas residents to review and comment on the proposed disaster relief provision, the methodology used to calculate the proposed rates, the justifications for the proposed rates and the intent to amend the Medicaid State Plan. The proposed change to **K.A.R. 28-73-1** will modify the definition of "eligible property" in K.A.R. 28-73-1(c). This modification will eliminate the sentence that prevents dozens of Kansas hazardous waste facilities from participating in the Environmental Use Controls Program.

The amendment to the regulation will have no adverse economic impact to the agency, other government agencies or the regulated community.

The time period between publication of this notice and the scheduled hearing serves as the required public comment period of at least 60 days for the purpose of receiving written public comments on the proposed amended regulation. The written request must be submitted to Christy Thurman, Bureau of Air and Radiation, not later than the close of business November 3 in order for the Secretary of Health and Environment to consider the request.

The U.S. Environmental Protection Agency has a 45-day review period, which will start concurrently with the 30-day public comment period, within which to object to the proposed permit. If the EPA has not objected in writing to the issuance of the permit within the 45-day review period, any person may petition the administrator of the EPA to review the permit. The 60-day public petition period will directly follow the EPA's 45-day review period. Interested parties may contact KDHE to determine if the EPA's 45-day review period has been waived.

Any such petition shall be based only on objections to the permit that were raised with reasonable specificity during the public comment period provided for in this notice, unless the petitioner demonstrates that it was impracticable to raise such objections within such period, or

Article 5.—MULTI-STATE ON-LINE GAMES

111-5-81. Game description; retail sale of tickets.

(a) The “2by2” game is a two out of 26 “red” numbers plus two out of 26 “white” numbers online lottery game which pays each grand prize in a cash lump sum payment of \$22,000, except that said grand prize may be doubled and may become pari-mutuel as set forth in these rules. Except as provided in these rules, all other prizes are paid on a set cash basis. To play “2by2,” a player shall select

two different “red” numbers between one through 26, and two additional “white” numbers between one through 26 for input into a terminal. Each set of numbers is from one through 26. One or both numbers chosen from one set may be the same as the other set.

(b) A “2by2” game ticket shall sell for one dollar.

(c) Tickets shall not be sold to any person under the age of 18 years. Each retailer may require a person purchasing tickets to produce proof of age.

(d) Each ticket shall be purchased from a terminal operated by a retailer. The player may select four numbers by:

- (1) communicating the four numbers to the retailer;
- (2) marking four numbered squares on any one game board on a play slip and submitting the play slip to the retailer; or
- (3) requesting a “quick pick” from the retailer.

The retailer shall then issue a ticket from the terminal containing the selected sets of numbers, each of which constitutes a game play.

(e) A validated ticket shall be the only proof of a game play or plays. The only method of claiming a prize or prizes shall be the submission of the winning ticket to and receipt of the ticket by the lottery or its authorized agent. A play slip shall have no pecuniary or prize value and shall not be used as evidence of a ticket purchase or of numbers selected.

(f) A ticket shall not be voided or cancelled by returning the ticket to the selling retailer, including tickets that are printed in error.

(g) Ticket sales will end at approximately 8:59 p.m. central time daily and will resume at approximately 9:05 p.m.

(h) Drawings will be conducted daily at approximately 9:30 p.m. central time (CT), after the game is closed at approximately 8:59 p.m. central time (CT) and the external auditor has verified that the game is closed, under conditions and procedures promulgated by the executive director of the lottery.

(i) A multi-draw ticket with one or more plays for only seven consecutive draws or only multiples of seven consecutive draws shall qualify for double prizes won on the included Tuesday draw, as limited by K.A.R. 111-5-83. Plays purchased for any number of draws other than in multiples of seven draws shall not qualify for double prizes won on any Tuesday.

(j) Each player shall be responsible for verifying the accuracy of the game play or plays and other data printed on the ticket. The placing of plays is done at the player’s own risk through the online retailer who is deemed to be acting on behalf of the player in entering the play or plays.

(k) These amendments shall take effect on or after February 22, 2008. (Authorized by K.S.A. 74-8710; implementing K.S.A. 74-8710 and 74-8718; effective, T-111-7-15-02, May 15, 2002; amended, T-111-9-18-03, Sept. 10, 2003; amended, T-111-9-23-08, Feb. 13, 2008.)

eligible tickets (taking into account eligible double prizes) and divided equally per prize type (standard prize and double Tuesday prize winners each receiving their proportionate share) on a pari-mutuel basis on the number of winning game play areas. This is done by marking one of the multi-draw boxes designated by 2, 3, 4, 5, 6, 7, 14, 21, or 28 on the play slip. The additional draw period(s) for which the ticket is valid will then appear on the computer generated ticket given to the player by the retailer.

(b) A player must pay an additional \$1.00 per play for each additional drawing in which he or she wishes to play.

(c) Unless one of the multi-draw boxes is marked and the additional amount paid, the play will only be eligible for the current drawing up to 8:59 p.m. the day of the drawing.

(d) A player may purchase only the same numbers on the same boards for multiple drawings.

In addition, from the time the Kansas lottery begins selling Hot Lotto tickets using lottery terminal(s) at the 3i Show in Great Bend, Kansas, on May 7, 2008, through and including 4:00 p.m. on May 9, 2008, for every single \$2.00 or more Kansas Hot Lotto with Sizzler ticket purchased from said terminal(s), the purchaser shall receive free of charge an entry blank for the drawing, which entry blank shall be automatically dispensed from the terminal(s) upon the qualifying purchase.

Rules applicable to the "Kansas Lottery Race Weekend Drawing" are contained in K.A.R. 111-7-223 through 111-7-227 and K.A.R. 111-6-1 *et seq.* (Authorized by and implementing K.S.A. 74-8710; effective, T-111-9-23-08, Feb. 13, 2008.)

111-7-224. Prize. The 45 prize winners selected in the "Kansas Lottery Race Weekend Drawing" on the date specified in K.A.R. 111-7-223 shall receive two tickets for each day of the 2008 races conducted at the Kansas Speedway in Kansas City, Kansas, on April 26 and 27, 2008, one double occupancy hotel room and room taxes at Great Wolf Lodge in Kansas City, Kansas, for the evenings of April 25, 2008, and April 26, 2008, round-trip transportation between the Kansas Speedway and the hotel, food and other amenities at the Kansas lottery hospitality chalet during said races at the Kansas Speedway, \$300 cash, mandatory income withholding taxes, and automatic entry into the "Kansas Speedway \$150 Grand Second Chance Drawing" conducted by the Kansas lottery on April 26, 2008, pursuant to the rules of the said drawing. The following restrictions shall apply to the "Kansas Lottery Race Weekend Drawing" prize packages:

(a) The Kansas lottery is not responsible for any losses caused by delay or cancellation of any of said automobile races.

(b) Prize packages, except cash, are transferable one time, but cannot be redeemed for cash.

(c) The lottery shall choose and reserve all hotel rooms.

(h) All prizes are subject to lottery validation, set-offs and deductions authorized by law.

(i) No later than 5:00 p.m. on the fourteenth calendar day following the drawing, the winner of a prize as the result of the "Kansas Lottery Race Weekend Drawing" shall return to the lottery a completed claim form as provided by the lottery or the person named on the entry drawn will no longer be eligible for the prize. In such an event, the first eligible alternate entry drawn pursuant to subsection (e) of K.A.R. 111-7-226 shall be declared the winner. All alternate winners shall then be subject to the same rules of eligibility as original winners.

(j) A total of 45 prize packages shall be awarded. (Authorized by and implementing K.S.A. 74-8710; effective, T-111-9-23-08, Feb. 13, 2008.)

(2) The executive director may suspend or terminate this promotion at any time or modify the qualifying purchase necessary to receive an entry during periods of high sales of Super Kansas Cash tickets, which renders the generation of entries impractical.

(3) The holder of the entry form must complete the information requested thereon in a legible manner. Only one name shall appear on an entry form entered.

(4) Place one or more entry form(s) into an envelope with proper postage and mail it to: "Kansas Lottery Race Weekend Drawing," c/o Kansas lottery, P. O. Box 4568, Topeka, KS 66604-0568. Mailed entries must be received by morning mail pickup on Tuesday, March 18, 2008.

(5) Players may also deposit entries for this drawing at any Kansas lottery event at which the lottery has specifically designated a receptacle for deposit of said entries.

(6) The holder of the entry is not required to personally attend the drawing or be present at the time of the drawing to be determined a winner.

(b) Lottery personnel shall transport the mail to the Kansas lottery mail room where the envelopes will be opened and emptied into the drawing receptacle or drum, along with entries deposited at events specifically designated by the lottery, if any.

(c) The drawing shall be held at the lottery headquarters in a place accessible to the public and open for public attendance with lottery security personnel present. The drawing shall be audio and video taped.

(d) At the start of the drawing, lottery security personnel shall present the receptacle or drum to the person(s) designated by the executive director to perform the drawing. The receptacle or drum for the drawing shall contain all entries eligible for the drawing. The drum shall be rotated 10 times or receptacle mixed thoroughly as may be applicable. The designated individual shall then unseal the receptacle or drum, and using the bare-arm technique, while looking away, remove 45 valid entries, one at a time, from the receptacle or drum and mark them in order drawn from one through and including 45. The person whose name appears on each of the entries shall be the winner of the prize identified in K.A.R. 111-7-224, subject to validation by the lottery as set forth in these rules.

(g) If the entry is determined to be ineligible, it shall be discarded by the security person present and another en-

try drawn. This procedure will be repeated until valid selections are obtained.

(h) All entries remaining in the drum or receptacle after the winners have been selected and certified and all entries not received in compliance with these rules shall be destroyed pursuant to K.A.R. 111-3-34. (Authorized by and implementing K.S.A. 74-8710; effective, 111-9-23-08, Feb. 13, 2008.)

111-7-227. Certification of drawing. (a) The "Kansas Lottery Race Weekend Drawing" shall be personally observed by a member of the Kansas lottery security department and a member of the Kansas lottery marketing department or other person or persons designated by the executive director of the lottery (hereinafter "event manager").

(b) Upon completion of the drawing, the security official and the event manager shall issue a report to the executive director, certifying that the name of each prize winner is correct, and that to the best of their knowledge the procedures required by these rules were followed in selecting each prize winner. (Authorized by and implementing K.S.A. 74-8710; effective, T-111-9-23-08, Feb. 13, 2008.)

KANSAS SPEEDWAY \$150 GRAND SECOND CHANCE DRAWING

111-7-228. Name, time, and place of drawing. (a) The Kansas lottery shall conduct a drawing entitled "Kansas Speedway \$150 Grand Second Chance Drawing."

(b) The drawing shall take place at the Kansas Speedway in Kansas City, Kansas, on April 26, 2008.

(c) Rules applicable to this drawing are contained in K.A.R. 111-3-1 *et seq.* and 111-7-228 through 111-7-232. (Authorized by and implementing K.S.A. 74-8710; effective, T-111-9-23-08, Feb. 13, 2008.)

111-7-229. Definitions. (a) All definitions contained in the Kansas lottery act (K.S.A. 74-8701 *et seq.*) and amendments thereto and lottery regulations are hereby incorporated by reference and govern unless otherwise indicated.

(b) "Kansas Speedway \$150 Grand Second Chance Drawing" means the act of drawing for prizes conducted by the Kansas lottery at the Great Wolf Lodge in Kansas City, Kansas, in which participants are selected to win prizes as described in K.A.R. 111-7-216.

(c) "Entry" means the forty-five (45) valid entries previously selected during the drawing entitled "Kansas Lottery Race Weekend Drawing" as set forth in K.A.R. 111-7-223 through 111-7-227, and amendments thereto, or the name of each entrant named thereon.

(d) "Receptacle" or "drum" means a container in which entry tickets are placed and from which the "Kansas Speedway \$150 Grand Second Chance Drawing" is made. Receptacles or drums may be sealable and shall be capable of being mixed or rotated for the purpose of ensuring random distribution.

(e) "Bare arm technique" means a type of drawing where the person drawing the winning ticket from the receptacle or drum wears a long-sleeved shirt with sleeve rolled up above the elbow, a short-sleeved shirt (sleeve

not extending past the elbow) or a non-sleeve shirt which exposes the drawer's bare arm and looks away from the drawing drum or receptacle while drawing. (Authorized by and implementing K.S.A. 74-8710; effective, T-111-9-23-08, Feb. 13, 2008.)

111-7-230. Entry into drawing. (a) Entry into the "Kansas Speedway \$150 Grand Second Chance Drawing" ("drawing") is accomplished automatically by the forty-five (45) winners selected in the "Kansas Lottery Race Weekend Drawing," as set forth in K.A.R. 111-7-223 through 111-7-227, and amendments thereto, or if applicable the person to whom an entry has been transferred pursuant to said drawing rules.

(b) At a time and place designated by the lottery, all entries or the names of all persons named on said entries shall be placed into the drawing receptacle.

(c) Entrants are required to be present at the time of the drawing to be determined a winner.

(d) All eligible entrants must be at least 18 years of age.

(e) Employees, agents, successors, and assignees of Kansas Speedway, its advertising agencies, and promotional companies involved in this drawing and contest, as well as immediate family and household members of the same, shall be ineligible to participate in the drawing or contest and shall be ineligible for any prize awarded therein. Names and likenesses of the drawing and contest winner(s) may be used by Kansas Speedway and Kansas Speedway's designee(s) for promotional purposes without further compensation to Kansas Speedway or the drawing and contest winner(s). (Authorized by and implementing K.S.A. 74-8710; effective, T-111-9-23-08, Feb. 13, 2008.)

111-7-231. Determination of "Kansas Speedway \$150 Grand Second Chance Drawing" winners and prizes. (a) At least five minutes before the drawing, a lottery drawing official designated by the executive director shall announce to the audience that the winner selection process will begin.

(b) The drawing receptacle or drum containing the names or entries (hereinafter "entries") shall be rotated a minimum of 10 times to ensure random selection.

(c) The drawing official shall designate one individual of his or her choice to participate in the selection process.

(d) The selection of two winners shall be accomplished by the individual designated by the drawing official, using a bare arm technique, removing two entries from the drawing receptacle or drum, one at a time. Each entry drawn shall be marked in the order drawn, 1 and 2.

(e) Immediately after the winning entries have been selected, a lottery official or person designated by the lottery official shall announce to the audience the names on the two entries drawn, and the time and location at the racetrack the persons are to appear on the day of the race to make their predictions of the outcome of the race. If any winner fails to appear at the designated location by the announced time, that person shall no longer be eligible to participate in the contest. The lottery official shall satisfy himself or herself that the persons who present themselves are the persons named on each entry.

(f) The lottery official shall determine and give each contestant an equal amount of time to predict in correct order the official first, second, and third place finishers of that day's ARCA RE/MAX race or as said race may be

postponed or continued from time to time. The contestants may not select the same racers in the same finishing order. In the event both contestants have selected the same racers in the same finishing order, the first of the two contestants whose name was selected shall have the opportunity to retain his or her predictions, or change one or more of the predictions. If that contestant chooses to retain the first selections made, the other contestant must change one or more of his or her predictions. Each person's predictions shall be reduced to writing and signed by the persons making the predictions and delivered to the lottery official. All predictions must be made, reduced to writing, delivered to the lottery official, and signed no less than 20 minutes before the official start of the race.

(g) The official final results of the race shall be compared to the predictions made by each contestant. In the event a contestant correctly predicted the exact correct official finishing order of the first, second, and third place finishers in the race, that contestant shall receive a prize from the lottery of one hundred fifty thousand dollars (\$150,000), subject to withholding and offsets as provided by law.

(h) Each of the two contestants competing in the contest shall also receive a race weekend prize package for two consisting of reserved admission to races conducted at the Kansas Speedway on September 27 and 28, 2008, double-occupancy hotel accommodations on September 26 and 27, 2008, food and beverages in the lottery's hospitality chalet located at the racetrack, and \$1,500 cash, together with payment by the lottery of all mandatory income withholding taxes on the prize, except that a contestant winning the \$150,000 prize shall not receive an additional \$1,500 cash or payment of mandatory income withholding taxes on the \$150,000 prize.

(i) Each winner of a prize as a result of the drawing shall return to lottery headquarters a completed claim form as provided by the lottery, which claim form must be actually received by lottery no later than 5:00 p.m. on the fourteenth day following the drawing or the person will no longer be eligible for the prize.

(j) In the event there are fewer than 20 drivers actually participating in the ARCA RE/MAX race on April 26, 2008, or as postponed, this contest shall not be conducted and shall be declared null and void. (Authorized by and implementing K.S.A. 74-8710; effective, T-111-9-23-08, Feb. 13, 2008.)

111-7-232. Certification of drawing. (a) The "Kansas Speedway \$150 Grand Second Chance Drawing" shall be personally observed by a member of the Kansas lottery security department and a member of the Kansas lottery marketing department or other person or persons designated by the executive director of the lottery ("event manager").

(b) Upon completion of the drawing, the security official and the event manager shall issue a report to the executive director, certifying that the name of each prize winner is correct, and that to the best of their knowledge the procedures required by these rules were followed in selecting the prize winners. (Authorized by and implementing K.S.A. 74-8710; effective, T-111-9-23-08, Feb. 13, 2008.)
