#### Request for Comments

The Kansas Department of Health and Environment is soliciting comments regarding a proposed air quality operating permit. ANR Pipeline Company has applied for a Class I operating permit renewal in accordance with the provisions of K.A.R. 28-19-510 et seq. The purpose of a Class I permit is to identify the sources and types of regulated air pollutants emitted from the facility; the emission limitations, standards and requirements applicable to each source; and the monitoring, record keeping and reporting requirements applicable to each source as of the effective date of permit issuance.

ANR Pipeline Company, 717 Texas St., Suite 2400, Houston, TX 77002, owns and operates Greensburg compressor station located at Section 16, T28S, R19W, Kiowa County, Kansas.

A copy of the proposed permit, permit application, all supporting documentation and all information relied upon during the permit application review process is available for a 30-day public review during normal business hours at the KDHE, Bureau of Air and Radiation, 1000 S.W. Jackson, Suite 310, Topeka; and a copy of the proposed permit can be reviewed at the KDHE Southwest District Office, 302 W. McArtor Road, Dodge City. To obtain or review the proposed permit and supporting documentation, contact Michael J. The standard departmental cost will be assessed for any copies requested.

Direct written comments or questions regarding the proposed permit to Michael J. Parhomek, KDHE, Bureau of Air and Radiation, 1000 S.W. Jackson, Suite 310, Topeka, 66612-1366. In order to be considered in formulating a final permit decision, written comments must be received before the close of business December 1.

A person may request a public hearing be held on the proposed permit. The request for a public hearing shall be in writing and set forth the basis for the request. The written request must be submitted to Sharon Burrell, Bureau of Air and Radiation, not later than the close of business December 1 in order for the Secretary of Health and Environment to consider the request.

The U.S. Environmental Protection Agency has a 45-day review period, which will start concurrently with the 30-day public comment period, within which to object to the proposed permit. If the EPA has not objected in writing to the issuance of the permit within the 45-day review period, any person may petition the administrator of the EPA to review the permit. The 60-day public petition period will directly follow the EPA's 45-day review period. Interested parties may contact KDHE to determine if the EPA's 45-day review period has been waived.

Any such petition shall be based only on objections to the permit that were raised with reasonable specificity during the public comment period provided for in this notice, unless the petitioner demonstrates that it was impracticable to raise such objections within such period, or unless the grounds for such objection arose after such period. Description: The Kansas Department of Health and Environment issued Kansas Water Pollution Control Permit No. C-KS23-NO01 (permit) to Alan Higgins, dba Holton Bowling Center (permittee), 21650 S. Highway 75; Holton, KS 66436, effective September 1, 2007, and expiring December 31, 2011, to operate a one-cell wastewater stabilization lagoon system. The permit contained a schedule of compliance requiring the permittee to hire a Kansas-licensed engineer to provide a plan and proposed schedule to upgrade the facility, take weekly readings of the water depth in the lagoon, record the readings and provide them in a report to the KDHE by the 10th of each month, reinstall the fence around the lagoon by October 1, 2007, and obtain the services of a KDHE-certified wastewater treatment plant

operator by November 1, 2007. The requirements of the permit were not fulfilled.

The KDHE issued Public Water Supply Permit No. KS2108502-PW003941 to the Holton Bowling Center on November 2, 2007. The permit provided permission to supply water to the public for domestic purposes. Since the permit was issued, the Holton Bowling Center failed to comply with the bacteriological monitoring requirements of K.A.R. 28-15a-21, the public notice reporting requirements of K.A.R. 28-15a-31 and the drinking water disinfection requirements of K.A.R. 28-15-19.

On May 14, 2008, KDHE issued an administrative order to the permittee requiring the permittee to take corrective actions regarding the operation of the wastewater stabilization lagoon system and the public water supply system. The order assessed a civil penalty against the permittee. The permittee did not appeal this order and the order became a final order May 29, 2008. The permittee has failed to comply with the requirements of the final order and the current permits. Therefore, pursuant to K.A.R. 28-16-60 and K.A.R. 28-16-62, KDHE is hereby providing notice of intent to terminate the permits to operate the lagoon system and the public water supply system for failure to comply with the current permits and a final order of the secretary of KDHE.

The following is a summary of the proposed amendments and economic statements. The board does not have a less costly or less intrusive method for achieving the stated purpose of each regulation.

**K.A.R. 102-2-8** contains the supervision requirements for clinical social work licensure. The changes are related to a change in supervisor qualifications and the mode of allowable supervision. Supervisors would now be required to have two years of clinical experience prior to commencing clinical supervision responsibilities where previously none was required. Teleconferencing would be permitted for a portion of the required hours of supervision for clinical supervision where previously none was required.

**Economic impact:** There would be a negative fiscal impact on a licensee who gains income from providing supervision as he/she would now have to practice for two years before being allowed to be a supervisor. There would be a positive fiscal impact on licensees being supervised as they would not need to travel as often to see their supervisor face to face as is now required. This would save the supervisee both time and money.

**K.A.R. 102-2-12** contains the requirements for clinical social work licensure. The changes are clarifying the

requirements for the clinical training plan and the way in which videoconferencing hours may be obtained.

**Economic impact:** There would be no economic impact from the clarification of training plan requirements. There would be a positive fiscal impact on individuals being supervised as they would not need to travel as often to see their supervisor face to face as is now required. This would save the supervisee both time and money.

The following is a summary of the proposed regulations:

**Article 101.—FACILITY MANAGER  
CERTIFICATION**

**Economic Impact of New Article 101:** Under the Expanded Lottery Act, all of the costs of oversight and regulation by the Kansas Racing and Gaming Commission are required to be paid by the gaming facility managers. Therefore, there are no costs anticipated to the agency or other governmental agencies, or to the people of Kansas, as a result of this new article.

**K.A.R. 112-101-1. Prohibition against uncertified management of a gaming facility.** This regulation establishes that no person may manage a gaming facility unless they are a lottery gaming facility manager or race-track gaming facility manager certified by the commission with a current facility manager's certificate.

**K.A.R. 112-101-2. Facility manager application procedure.** This regulation establishes the items required to be submitted to the commission from each lottery gaming facility manager and each racetrack gaming facility manager seeking to be certified as a facility manager.

**K.A.R. 112-101-3. Background investigations.** This regulation establishes the criteria for background investigations for applicants for a gaming certificate and others having a material relationship to the applicant.

**K.A.R. 112-101-4. Affirmative duty to demonstrate qualifications.** This regulation establishes that each applicant for a facility manager certificate shall have an affirmative duty to the commission to demonstrate that the applicant, applicant's directors, officers, owners and key employees are qualified for certification.

**K.A.R. 112-101-5. Fees and costs.** This regulation establishes the fees and costs to be assessed to applicants for a certificate as a lottery gaming facility manager and for a certificate as a racetrack gaming facility manager.

**K.A.R. 112-101-6. Disqualification criteria.** This regulation establishes the criteria for denial or revocation by the commission of a person subject to a background investigation.

**K.A.R. 112-101-7. Certificate duration.** This regulation establishes the duration of a certificate for a gaming manager.

**K.A.R. 112-101-8. Certificate renewal.** This regulation establishes that each renewal application for a gaming certificate shall be submitted to commission staff at least 120 days before the expiration of the current certificate.

**K.A.R. 112-101-9. Notice of anticipated or actual change.** This regulation establishes that each gaming facility manager or applicant shall notify the commission in writing of changes in its directors, officers, or key employees or persons directly or indirectly owning an interest of at least 0.5 percent in the facility manager or applicant.

**K.A.R. 112-101-10. Advertising; promotion of responsible gaming.** This regulation establishes the definition of "advertisement" and guidelines for promotion of responsible gaming.

**K.A.R. 112-101-11. Material debt transaction.** This regulation establishes guidelines the gaming facility manager shall follow regarding the consummation of a material debt transaction.

**K.A.R. 112-101-12. Notice of bankruptcy or liquidation.** This regulation establishes the gaming facility manager's responsibility to the commission regarding bankruptcy or liquidations.

**K.A.R. 112-101-13. Access to gaming facility and information.** This regulation establishes that each applicant and each facility manager, including their intermediary companies and holding companies, shall consent to inspections of the gaming facility by commission staff.

**K.A.R. 112-101-14. Certification of employees.** This regulation establishes that each employee, contractor, and agent of an applicant or facility manager shall be certified by the commission with a current occupation certificate before performing any tasks or duties or assuming any responsibilities for matters regulated by the commission for the applicant or facility manager.

**K.A.R. 112-101-15. Reporting requirements.** This regulation establishes the required reports and contents of each report that each certificate holder shall submit to the commission.

**K.A.R. 112-101-16. Prohibitions.** This regulation establishes the prohibitions and sanctions for each facility manager.

## Article 102.—GAMING SUPPLIER AND NON-GAMING SUPPLIER CERTIFICATION

**Economic Impact of New Article 102:** Under the Expanded Lottery Act, all of the costs of oversight and regulation by the Kansas Racing and Gaming Commission are required to be paid by the gaming facility managers. Therefore, there are no costs anticipated to the agency or other governmental agencies, or to the people of Kansas, as a result of this new article.

**K.A.R. 112-102-1. Prohibition against uncertified business.** This regulation establishes the requirement that no person may provide any equipment or services related to a gaming facility or gaming facility games, or in any other manner carry on business directly related to a gaming activity with a gaming facility, unless the person is certified by the commission with a current gaming supplier certificate, non-gaming supplier certificate or temporary supplier permit.

**K.A.R. 112-102-2. Gaming supplier and non-gaming supplier defined.** This regulation establishes the definitions for gaming and non-gaming suppliers.

**K.A.R. 112-102-3. Gaming and non-gaming supplier employees.** This regulation establishes that any employee or agent of a gaming or non-gaming supplier may be required by the commission to be separately investigated or certified.

**K.A.R. 112-102-4. Application for a certificate.** This regulation establishes items that a gaming supplier or non-gaming supplier shall submit to the commission staff when seeking a gaming supplier license or a non-gaming supplier certificate.

**K.A.R. 112-102-5. Temporary supplier permit.** This regulation establishes the conditions that a temporary supplier must meet in order to be issued a temporary supplier permit.

**K.A.R. 112-102-6. Affirmative duty to demonstrate qualifications.** This regulation establishes that each applicant for a certificate as a gaming supplier or non-gaming supplier shall have an affirmative duty to demonstrate to the commission evidence that the applicant should not be disqualified.

**K.A.R. 112-102-7. Background investigation.** This regulation establishes that each applicant and person whom the executive director deems to have a material relationship to the applicant shall submit to a background investigation to be conducted by the commission's director of security or other person designated by the executive director.

**K.A.R. 112-102-8. Disqualification criteria.** This regulation establishes that a certificate shall be denied or revoked by the commission if an applicant or certificate holder has been convicted of any felony, crime involving gambling, or crime of moral turpitude and establishes the conditions for denial of certification.

**K.A.R. 112-102-9. Certificate duration.** This regulation establishes that each certificate for a gaming supplier or non-gaming supplier shall be issued by the commission for no longer than two years and one month and establishes the expiration date of certificates.

**K.A.R. 112-102-10. Certificate renewal application.** This regulation establishes that each renewal application

for a gaming or non-gaming supplier certificate shall be filed with the commission staff at least 120 days before the expiration date of the certificate.

**K.A.R. 112-102-11. Change in ownership.** This regulation establishes the changes in ownership which shall be sufficient causes for invalidating any certificate or temporary permit granted by the commission.

**K.A.R. 112-102-12. Certificates, temporary supplier permits, and badges to be commission property.** This regulation establishes that each gaming supplier certificate, non-gaming supplier certificate, temporary supplier permit, and badge issued by the commission shall be the property of the commission and shall be returned to the commission after the holder's business is terminated.

**K.A.R. 112-102-13. Records.** This regulation establishes that each gaming supplier and non-gaming supplier certified by the commission shall maintain their business records in a place which is secure against loss and destruction and that each certificate holder shall make these records available to the commission upon the commission's request. The regulation establishes what the records shall include.

#### Article 103.—EMPLOYEE LICENSING

**Economic Impact of New Article 103:** Under the Expanded Lottery Act, all of the costs of oversight and regulation by the Kansas Racing and Gaming Commission are required to be paid by the gaming facility managers. Therefore, there are no costs anticipated to the agency or other governmental agencies, or to the people of Kansas, as a result of this new article.

**K.A.R. 112-103-1. Prohibition of unlicensed employment with a facility manager.** This regulation prohibits any person from working as an employee or independent contractor of a facility manager unless the person is certified to do so with a current occupation license or temporary work permit issued by the commission for that actual job or duty.

**K.A.R. 112-103-2. License levels.** This regulation establishes the three levels of temporary work permits or occupation licenses and the levels of responsibility or authority for each level type.

**K.A.R. 112-103-3. Temporary work permit.** This regulation establishes the conditions which must be met by an applicant to be issued a temporary work permit. The temporary work permit may be issued for an initial period not to exceed 90 days, which may be extended by the commission's licensing staff for an additional 90 days and not to extend the duration of the level I, II or III license for which the applicant has applied.

**K.A.R. 112-103-4. Application for a license.** This regulation establishes that each applicant for any level of occupation license shall submit a completed application on a commission-approved form to the human resources department of the gaming licensee with which the applicant seeks employment.

**K.A.R. 112-103-5. Applicant identification.** This regulation establishes the types of required identification that each applicant shall have the responsibility to present to identify that person to commission staff when submitting an application.

**K.A.R. 112-103-6. Affirmative duty to demonstrate qualifications.** This regulation establishes that each applicant for an occupation license shall have an affirmative duty to the commission to demonstrate by clear and convincing evidence that the applicant should not be disqualified as specified in K.A.R. 112-103-8.

**K.A.R. 112-103-7. Background investigations.** This regulation establishes that each applicant shall submit to a background investigation conducted by the commission's director of security or other person designated by the executive director.

**K.A.R. 112-103-8. Disqualification criteria for a level I, level II or level III license.** This regulation establishes the criteria for disqualification for a level I, level II or level III license.

**K.A.R. 112-103-9. Examinations.** This regulation establishes that any applicant for an occupation license may be required to demonstrate knowledge, qualifications, and proficiency related to the license for which application is made through an examination approved by the commission or its designee and establishes the criteria for any applicant failing the examination to be retested.

**K.A.R. 112-103-10. License duration.** This regulation establishes that each occupation license shall be issued for a period of no longer than two years and one month and shall expire on the last day of the month in which the license was issued.

**K.A.R. 112-103-11. License renewal.** This regulation establishes that each occupation licensee wanting to renew the license shall file an application renewal with the commission.

**K.A.R. 112-103-12. Reapplication after license denial or revocation.** This regulation establishes the duration of time required for when a person who is denied licensure or whose license is revoked as at least one year from the date of the denial or revocation before reapplication can occur.

**K.A.R. 112-103-13. Reserved.**

**K.A.R. 112-103-14. Reserved.**

**K.A.R. 112-103-15. License mobility; limitations.** This regulation establishes the other positions that a licensee may work in and the timeframe that these position changes are allowed.

**K.A.R. 112-103-16. Licenses, temporary work permits, and badges to be commission property.** This regulation establishes that each license, temporary work permit, and badge issued by the commission shall be the property of the commission and upon termination of employment or a contract each badge shall be returned to commission staff within one day.

#### Article 111.—INVOLUNTARY EXCLUSIONS

**Economic Impact of New Article 111:** Under the Expanded Lottery Act, all of the costs of oversight and regulation by the Kansas Racing and Gaming Commission are required to be paid by the gaming facility managers. Therefore, there are no costs anticipated to the agency or other governmental agencies, or to the people of Kansas, as a result of this new article.

**K.A.R. 112-111-1. Involuntary exclusion list.** This regulation establishes an "involuntary exclusion list" consisting of the names of those people who the executive

director determines meet any one of several criteria for commission staff to place them on this list.

**K.A.R. 112-111-2. Inclusion on list, notice.** This regulation establishes the procedure for the executive director to file a notice of exclusion and the items the notice of exclusion shall identify. That person has the right to timely file a request for hearing, and the hearing shall be held before the commission.

**K.A.R. 112-111-3. Effect of placement on the exclusion list.** This regulation establishes that each excluded person shall be prohibited from entry to a gaming facility and establishes the procedures for the removal of the person from that list.

**K.A.R. 112-111-4. Licensees' duties.** This regulation establishes that each facility manager shall exclude from the gaming facility any person on the involuntary exclusion list and the internal procedures the facility must follow if an excluded person attempts entry to the gaming facility.

**K.A.R. 112-111-5. Petition for removal.** This regulation establishes that an excluded person shall not petition the commission for removal from the involuntary exclusion list until at least five years have passed from the date of the commission's final order affirming placement of the person on the list. Each petition for removal from the list shall be verified with supporting affidavits and the petition may be decided by the commission on the basis of the documents submitted by the excluded person.

#### Article 113.—SANCTIONS

**Economic Impact of New Article 113:** Under the Expanded Lottery Act, all of the costs of oversight and regulation by the Kansas Racing and Gaming Commission are required to be paid by the gaming facility managers. Therefore, there are no costs anticipated to the agency or other governmental agencies, or to the people of Kansas, as a result of this new article.

**K.A.R. 112-113-1. Sanctions.** This regulation establishes the sanctions for any licensee or applicant who violates any provisions of the act or the regulations.

#### Article 114.—RULES OF HEARINGS

**Economic Impact of New Article 114:** Under the Expanded Lottery Act, all of the costs of oversight and regulation by the Kansas Racing and Gaming Commission are required to be paid by the gaming facility managers. Therefore, there are no costs anticipated to the agency or other governmental agencies, or to the people of Kansas, as a result of this new article.

**K.A.R. 112-114-1. Definitions.** This regulation defines "disciplinary review board" and "hearing body" within this article.

**K.A.R. 112-114-2. Report of an alleged violation.** This regulation establishes that any person may file a report of an alleged violation with any commission office on a commission-approved report form available in commission offices.

**K.A.R. 112-114-3. Notice of alleged violation and hearing.** This regulation establishes that the respondent shall be provided by the commission with reasonable notice of the alleged violation and hearing if disposition of the allegation raised in a report could result in a fine, suspension, or revocation. The regulation defines what

information shall be included on the notice of alleged violation and hearing.

**K.A.R. 112-114-4. Waiver.** This regulation establishes that a person may waive any right conferred upon that person by these regulations except to the extent precluded by another provision of law.

**K.A.R. 112-114-5. Informal settlements.** This regulation establishes that nothing in these regulations shall preclude the informal settlement of matters that could make a hearing unnecessary.

**K.A.R. 112-114-6. Participation by and representation of respondents.** This regulation establishes that a person or for-profit or not-for-profit corporation, unincorporated association, or other respondent may be represented by an attorney licensed to practice law in the state of Kansas in any evidentiary hearing conducted before the commission or its designated presiding officer(s) in accordance with the Kansas administrative procedure act, K.S.A. 77-501 et seq. and amendments thereto. The attorney shall represent the respondent at the respondent's own expense.

**K.A.R. 112-114-7. Reserved.**

**K.A.R. 112-114-8. Presiding officer.** This regulation establishes who the presiding officer shall be and provides for a substitute to be appointed by the executive director if the presiding officer or other member of the hearing body is unavailable for any reason.

**K.A.R. 112-114-9. Hearing procedure.** This regulation establishes the guidelines and procedures to be followed at a hearing.

**K.A.R. 112-114-10. Evidence.** This regulation establishes the rules of evidence to be followed by the presiding officer and the guidelines for testimony and evidence to be received.

**K.A.R. 112-114-11. Orders.** This regulation establishes that the hearing body shall enter a written order within 30 days after the hearing. The regulation details the information to be included in the order and establishes that each order shall be effective when rendered and copies of the order shall be served upon each party to the proceedings.

**K.A.R. 112-114-12. Service of order.** This regulation establishes that service of an order shall be made upon the party and the party's attorney of record, if any. It further establishes that service is presumed if the presiding officer makes a written certificate of service and that service by mail shall be complete upon mailing. Three days shall be added to the prescribed period whenever a party has the right or is required to do some act or take some proceedings within a prescribed period after service or an order is made by mail.

**K.A.R. 112-114-13. Reserved.**

**K.A.R. 112-114-14. Appeals of disciplinary review board hearings.** This regulation establishes that each order entered by the disciplinary review board that imposes a fine or suspension shall be subject to appeal to the commission, and it further outlines the steps of the appeal process.

**Article 6.—WATER SUPPLY  
RESTORATION PROGRAM**

**11-6-1. Definitions.** (a) "Commission" means the state conservation commission.

(b) "Land treatment" means structures or conservation practices that constitute viable methods of erosion abatement or sediment and pollution control.

(c) "Letter of interest" means an initial written request from a sponsor for a determination of whether a proposed project is eligible for funding.

(d) "Letter of intent" means a letter providing the necessary information for establishing the funds required for

a proposed project. Project plans and specifications, budgets, and schedules shall be developed in sufficient detail to support the funding request. The signed letter of intent and supporting documentation shall be reviewed by the environmental review agencies specified in K.A.R. 11-6-6.

(e) "Project" means the restoration of a water supply structure by a sponsor, including land treatment.

(f) "Public water supply" means a water supply that has beneficial municipal use.

(g) "Restoration" means the act of returning an existing water supply structure to safe and efficient functioning, including the installation or repair of erosion control measures and land treatment.

(h) "Restoration plan" means a document providing sufficient details to support the letter of intent.

(i) "Sponsor" means any of the following:

- (1) A political subdivision of the state that has the power of taxation and the right to eminent domain;
- (2) a public wholesale water supply district; or
- (3) a rural water district.

(j) "Total maximum daily load" means the maximum amount of a pollutant that a body of water can receive without violating water quality standards.

(k) "Watershed protection" means land treatment that reduces sediment load and abates erosion.

(l) "Water supply structure" means a structure that impounds a public water supply. (Authorized by and implementing K.S.A. 2007 Supp. 82a-2101; effective Nov. 14, 2008.)

**11-6-2. Eligible components of projects.** The eligible components of a project shall include the following:

- (a) Engineering, including project design, plans, and specifications;
- (b) repairs of the structure and its appurtenant works;
- (c) mobilization and demobilization of equipment;
- (d) dredge and sediment disposal facilities; and
- (e) watershed protection and restoration. (Authorized by and implementing K.S.A. 2007 Supp. 82a-2101; effective Nov. 14, 2008.)

**11-6-3. Letter of interest.** (a) Each prospective sponsor shall submit a letter of interest to the commission to determine if the proposed project is eligible for consideration for funding. The letter of interest shall be submitted on a form furnished by the commission.

(b) In the letter of interest, the sponsor shall provide the commission with evidence that the proposed project meets the following initial eligibility requirements:

- (1) The structure shall currently provide local public water supply benefits or be reasonably expected to do so in the future.
- (2) The sponsor shall demonstrate that existing or planned infrastructure and practices are capable of preserving the improvements and address watershed protection.

(c) The letter of interest shall be reviewed by the commission and the Kansas water office. The sponsor shall be notified in writing whether the proposed project is eligible for consideration for funding. (Authorized by and im-

*(continued)*

plementing K.S.A. 2007 Supp. 82a-2101; effective Nov. 14, 2008.)

**11-6-4. Letter of intent.** (a) Any sponsor may submit a letter of intent following receipt of a letter from the commission acknowledging that the proposed project is eligible for consideration for funding. The letter of intent, submitted on a form furnished by the commission, shall include a restoration plan as specified in K.A.R. 11-6-5.

(b) The sponsor shall submit the original of the letter of intent, plus one copy for each environmental review agency specified in K.A.R. 11-6-6, to the commission no later than June 1 to be considered in the budget request for the next state fiscal year. (Authorized by and implementing K.S.A. 2007 Supp. 82a-2101; effective Nov. 14, 2008.)

**11-6-5. Restoration plan.** (a) Each restoration plan shall consist of the following:

- (1) Restoration scope;
- (2) design plans and specifications;
- (3) watershed protection plan, if applicable;
- (4) cost estimates;
- (5) project schedule; and
- (6) any other relevant documents that pertain to renovation, protection, or restoration of the water supply structure, as determined by the commission.

(b) Each modification of the original restoration plan shall require the prior notification and approval of the commission. (Authorized by and implementing K.S.A. 2007 Supp. 82a-2101; effective Nov. 14, 2008.)

**11-6-6. Review process.** (a) Each letter of intent shall be reviewed by the environmental review agencies listed in K.S.A. 82a-326(b) and amendments thereto.

(b) Prioritization of projects shall be based on the following:

- (1) The current use of the water;
- (2) the population served;
- (3) the age of the structure;
- (4) any loss of storage capacity due to sedimentation or deficiencies, or both;
- (5) any documented efforts to provide watershed protection;
- (6) the status of operation and maintenance;
- (7) the current and potential recreational uses of the lake;
- (8) specification of whether the watershed has a high total maximum daily load;
- (9) any prior use of multipurpose small lake program funds;
- (10) the percentage of sponsor funding for the project; and
- (11) the proposed location of the project with respect to federal reservoirs that provide water supply.

(c) Each agency's review comments shall be considered by the commission in the final priority-ranking process. Each sponsor shall be notified in writing if that sponsor's proposed project is approved for funding. (Authorized by and implementing K.S.A. 2007 Supp. 82a-2101; effective Nov. 14, 2008.)

(d) At each drawing, the designated individual shall then unseal the drum, if a drum is used, and using the bare-arm technique, while looking away, remove a single

entry from the receptacle or drum. The person whose name appears on the entry shall be the winner of one of the grand prizes identified in these rules, subject to validation by the lottery as set forth in these rules. This process shall be repeated for the second drawing.

(e) After 10 valid entries have been selected in each drawing for the grand prize, four more valid entries will be drawn, one at a time, to serve as alternate entries for the prizes. The alternate entries will be marked in order drawn, 1A, 2A, 3A, and 4A. Each winner shall have until 5:00 p.m. on the thirtieth day following the drawing to present the fully-executed claim form to lottery headquarters. If a prize winner cannot be located or is declared ineligible, or fails to timely present a fully-executed claim form to lottery headquarters, that prize will be awarded to the first alternate entry drawn. The alternates will be used, if necessary, in the order drawn.

(f) The Kansas lottery security official present shall review each ticket drawn to determine the validity of the entry into this drawing in accordance with these regulations. If it is a valid entry and the name is legible, the

event manager and the security person present shall record the name of the winner and the prize won. The prize winners shall be given or sent a prize claim form to be completed and returned as set forth in subsection (f) herein.

(g) If any entry drawn is determined to be ineligible, it shall be discarded by the security person present and another entry drawn. This procedure will be repeated until the required number of apparently eligible selections is obtained.

(h) Only non-winning "Garmin" instant tickets are eligible for the drawing.

(i) All tickets remaining in the drum or receptacle after the winners and alternates have been selected in each drawing, and all entries not received in compliance with these rules, shall be destroyed pursuant to K.A.R. 111-3-34. (Authorized by and implementing K.S.A. 74-8710; effective, T-111-9-24-08, April 16, 2008.)
