## Notice to Private Activity Bond Applicants

Applications for allocation of 2009 Private Activity Bond (PAB) authority are now being accepted for qualified uses, as defined by the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, and amendments thereto.

The state of Kansas is projected to receive \$273,270,000 of federal authority for the issuance of PABs in calendar year 2009. Historically, the primary uses of this federal authority have included "qualified small issue bonds" used for construction and equipping of manufacturing facilities and beginning farmer programs; "exempt facility bonds" used by for-profit entities providing a public benefit, i.e., certain waste treatment facilities, qualified residential rental facilities, etc.; and "qualified mortgage bonds" issued to benefit first-time homebuyers. Allocations awarded by the Secretary of Commerce are subject to the provisions of K.S.A. 74-5060 et seq. and the limitations of state volume cap.

Fees associated with PAB application and issuance are as follows:

(1) Application fee—A nonrefundable fee must accompany the application before the request can be processed. The application fee is determined as follows:

- \$250 for allocation requests up to \$5,000,000
- \$500 for allocation requests from \$5,000,001 to \$10,000,000
- \$1,000 for allocation requests from \$10,000,001 and above

(2) Issuance fee—An issuance fee for allocation amounts utilized, other than "qualified mortgage bonds" issued, shall be due and payable to the Kansas Department of Commerce at bond closing. Issuance fees shall be determined as follows:

Allocation Used	Fee
To \$2,000,000	5 basis points (.05%)
\$2,000,001 and above	10 basis points (.10%)

"Qualified Mortgage Bond" programs will be assessed a fee, upon issuance of each mortgage loan assisted through the program, equal to .5 percent of the PAB allocation used.

Issuance fees shall be remitted within 30 days of bond closing. Checks for both the application and issuance fees for nonhousing issues should be made payable to the Kansas Department of Commerce Bond Fee Fund. Checks for the issuance fees for housing activities should be made payable to the State Housing Trust Fund.

The Kansas Department of Health and Environment is soliciting comments regarding a proposed air quality operating permit. Regency Gas Services has applied for a Class I operating permit renewal in accordance with the provisions of K.A.R. 28-19-510 et seq. The purpose of a Class I permit is to identify the sources and types of regulated air pollutants emitted from the facility; the emission limitations, standards and requirements applicable to each source; and the monitoring, record keeping and reporting requirements applicable to each source as of the effective date of permit issuance.

In order to be considered in formulating a final permit decision, written comments must be received before the close of business February 9.

A person may request a public hearing be held on the proposed permit. The request for a public hearing shall be in writing and set forth the basis for the request. The written request must be submitted to Sharon Burrell, Bureau of Air and Radiation, not later than the close of business February 9 in order for the Secretary of Health and Environment to consider the request.

The U.S. Environmental Protection Agency has a 45-day review period, which will start concurrently with the 30-day public comment period, within which to object to the proposed permit. If the EPA has not objected in writing to the issuance of the permit within the 45-day review period, any person may petition the administrator of the EPA to review the permit. The 60-day public petition period will directly follow the EPA's 45-day review period. Interested parties may contact KDHE to determine if the EPA's 45-day review period has been waived.

Any such petition shall be based only on objections to the permit that were raised with reasonable specificity during the public comment period provided for in this notice, unless the petitioner demonstrates that it was im-

practicable to raise such objections within such period, or unless the grounds for such objection arose after such period. ### Kansas Lottery

#### Application and Review Procedures for Lottery Gaming Facility Manager Contracts Pursuant to the Kansas Expanded Lottery Act (Revised December 11, 2008)

#### Introduction.

Senate Bill 66, otherwise known as the Kansas Expanded Lottery Act (KELA), was enacted by the 2007 Kansas Legislature. The KELA became effective on April 19, 2007, and has been codified at KSA 74-8733, et seq. The KELA may be viewed on the official Website of the Kansas Lottery at [www.kslottery.com](http://www.kslottery.com). Applicants desiring to become a "Lottery Gaming Facility Manager" (Manager) within any "Gaming Zone" in the State of Kansas, as those terms are defined in the KELA, are advised to familiarize themselves with the provisions of the KELA and any amendments thereto.

The Kansas Lottery (Lottery) shall own and operate, and the Kansas Racing and Gaming Commission (KRGC) shall regulate, all gaming conducted at the Gaming Facilities authorized by the KELA. The KELA places with the Lottery full, complete and ultimate ownership and operational control of all such gaming operations. The Lottery's ownership and operational control include, but are not limited to, the following rights and authorities:

1. To designate what table games and electronic gaming machines will be played at each facility;
2. To require the manager to lease or purchase gaming machines on behalf of the Lottery;
3. The ability to deactivate any or all machines from play at any time;
4. The right to choose the central computer system operating the games;
5. The power to audit all aspects of the gaming operations;
6. To determine qualifications of employees at the gaming facilities; and,
7. The ability to overrule any action of the Manager affecting the gaming operation without prior notice.

Nothing contained in the following application and review procedure is in any way intended to limit or otherwise affect the Lottery's rights of ownership and operational control.

#### Application and Review Procedure.

1. **Duty to Monitor Website.** These procedures and other matters pertaining thereto will be posted on the official Website of the Kansas Lottery as referenced above, and are subject to amendment at any time. All prospective Managers shall be responsible for monitoring said Website for any changes or additions to this procedure or matters pertaining thereto. Once in final form, an application form will also be posted on said Website.
2. **Definitions.** All definitions set forth in the K.S.A. 74-8702, and amendments thereto, shall apply to the procedures set forth herein, unless the context of the word or term clearly indicates a contrary meaning.
3. **Application Procedure for Lottery Gaming Facility Manager Applicant.**



- (a) All persons or other entities applying to become a Lottery Gaming Facility Manager pursuant to the KELA shall meet the minimum requirements as provided in the KSA 74-8734(g). In order to have an application to become a Lottery Gaming Facility Manager considered by the Kansas Lottery Commission (Commission), an applicant shall provide information to the Commission and otherwise prove to the satisfaction of the Commission that it:
- (1) has sufficient access to financial resources to support the activities required of a Lottery Gaming Facility Manager under the KELA;
  - (2) has no less than three (3) consecutive years' experience in the management of gaming which would be class III gaming, as defined in K.S.A. 46-2301, and amendments thereto, operated pursuant to state or federal law; and,
  - (3) is current in filing all applicable tax returns and in payment of all taxes, interest and penalties owed to the State of Kansas and any taxing subdivision where such prospective manager is located in the State of Kansas, excluding items under formal appeal pursuant to applicable statutes, except that the requirements set forth in this subsection 3 shall not apply to any resident Kansas American Indian tribe.
- (b) Each applicant shall complete all information upon the written application form provided by the Commission, and shall include the following as an appendage thereto:
- (1) all documents and other attachments as may be required in the application;
  - (2) such additional documents and other information as the Commission may at any time require; and,
  - (3) a table of contents for the application and all appendages thereto, with all sections and appendages clearly tab indexed.
- (c) Responses to all application questions, and all documents supporting the application, shall be typed or printed on 8.5 by 11-inch white paper in 12-point font or larger, with margins on each page of no less than one inch in width. All pages shall be numbered in continuous numerical sequence. Each and every question on the application shall be answered with no question left blank. In the event a question does not apply to applicant the words "Not applicable" or "N/A" shall be inserted.
- (d) Each applicant shall disclose, and as applicable provide supporting documentation for, the following:
- (1) A detailed rendering and other descriptions of the proposed "Lottery Gaming Enterprise," including but not necessarily limited to the size of the gaming facility itself, the site, buildings, parking, amenities, and all other improvements proposed for the Lottery Gaming Enterprise. It is not necessary that applicants submit detailed final blueprint drawings of the proposed gaming enterprise. The Lottery merely requires preliminary plans and renderings sufficient in detail to adequately convey the general appearance and composition of the proposed enterprise. The Lottery does not expect or require an applicant to cause detailed architectural blueprints to be prepared until a contract has actually been awarded;
  - (2) the geographic area in the State of Kansas in which the Lottery Gaming Enterprise is to be located, including the name of the governing municipality;
  - (3) an analysis of the proposed Lottery Gaming Enterprise's location as a tourist and entertainment destination designed to attract consumers residing outside the immediate area of the enterprise;
  - (4) an estimate of the number of patrons that would be attracted to the proposed Lottery Gaming Enterprise each year, including an estimate of the number of tourist patrons that reside outside the State of Kansas;
  - (5) an estimate of the number of patrons that would be attracted to the proposed Lottery Gaming Facility each year, including an estimate of the number of tourist patrons that reside outside the State of Kansas;
  - (6) the number and type of Lottery Facility Games proposed to be operated at the gaming facility at start-up, including all proposed temporary facilities, if any;
  - (7) proposals and agreements related to all Ancillary Lottery Gaming Facility Operations;
  - (8) utilizing the date of final execution of a binding contract to operate a Lottery Gaming Enterprise as the point of beginning, an estimated timeline for all major events related to the project, including but not necessarily limited to:
    - (a) approval of zoning and planning requirements by the city and/or county in which the Lottery Gaming Enterprise is to be located;
    - (b) commencement of construction on the Lottery Gaming Facility;
    - (c) commencement of construction on the Ancillary Gaming Facility Operations;
    - (d) completion of construction on the Lottery Gaming Facility;
    - (e) completion of construction on the Ancillary Gaming Facility Operations;
    - (f) commencement of actual gaming in the proposed temporary Lottery Gaming Facility, if any
    - (g) commencement of actual gaming in the permanent Lottery Gaming Facility, and if the facility will not be completely operational on that date, the expected percentage of gaming that will be in operation;
    - (h) commencement of activities in each of the Ancillary Gaming Facility Operations; and,

(continued)

- (i) such other key dates or milestones the applicant deems relevant.
- (9) information sufficient to demonstrate that:
- (a) the proposed Lottery Gaming Enterprise, will consist of an investment in infrastructure of no less than \$225,000,000;
  - (b) none of the minimum amount of said investment in infrastructure will be derived from or financed by state or local retailers' sales tax revenues, and no part of the financing for the Lottery Gaming Facility will be derived from revenue bonds, tax increment financing, or similar financing;
  - (c) the power of eminent domain has not been used, and will not be used, to acquire any interest in real property for use in the lottery gaming enterprise;
  - (d) applicant owns the real property upon which the Lottery Gaming Enterprise is to be located, has a binding option to purchase said real property, or otherwise has the right to occupy said real property for said purposes;
  - (e) applicant has received, or a disclosure of when applicant is expected to receive, any necessary approval under planning and zoning requirements of the municipality and/or county in which the Lottery Gaming Facility is to be located; and,
  - (f) applicant has received, or a disclosure of when applicant is expected to receive, a resolution of endorsement from the city governing body, if the proposed Lottery Gaming Enterprise is within the corporate limits of a city, or from the county commission, if the proposed Lottery Gaming Enterprise is located in the unincorporated area of the county (see KSA 74-8734(h)(10) and 74-8736(a)). All resolutions of endorsement must be obtained no later than execution of a contract between the Manager and the Lottery.
- (10) a description of:
- (a) the equipment and plans proposed by applicant to directly link all gaming machines in the Lottery Gaming Facility to a central computer system to provide monitoring, auditing and other available program information to the Lottery;
  - (b) the equipment and plans proposed by applicant to require all gaming machines to be on-line and in constant communication with a central computer situated at a location determined by the Executive Director of the Lottery; and,
  - (c) the ability of each machine to be individually deactivated by order of the Executive Director of the Lottery.
- (11) the name, address, telephone number, and other identifying information regarding each "affiliated person" and "state or local official," as those terms are defined in KSA 74-8762,
- who holds, directly or indirectly, an interest in, is to be employed by, or will represent or appear for the lottery gaming facility, or for the Lottery Gaming Facility Manager, or any holding or intermediary company with respect thereto, in connection with any cause, application or matter; and,
- (12) the name, address, telephone number, and other identifying information regarding any "person," as defined by KSA 74-8702(x), in any way affiliated with the applicant who is, or who is proposed to be, the manager of a racetrack gaming facility located in the same gaming zone as the Lottery Gaming Facility proposed by the application.
- (e) Each application and all documents appended thereto shall be submitted as a single package. An original and six (6) copies of the application and documents shall be filed with the Executive Director as provided in section (f), along with at least two (2) legible electronic copies of those items scanned or otherwise transferred onto one or more compact discs (CD's). Items applicant believes to be "confidential" shall be placed onto one or more separate CD's. The Lottery may use those electronic copies, among other things, as a means to more easily disseminate the information in response to open records requests after the deadline for applications has passed and the applicable documents are otherwise deemed open records under laws of the State of Kansas.
  - (f) Each application shall be verified under oath by the authorized officer or officers of the applicant, shall be dated, and shall be manually signed in ink.
  - (g) In order for an application to be considered, and unless otherwise extended by the Commission or Governor of the State of Kansas, the application along with all documents and other items supporting the application shall be delivered by applicant or common carrier to the Executive Director of the Kansas Lottery, 128 N. Kansas Avenue, Topeka, Kansas 66603. The application and all documents and other items supporting the application must be actually received by the Kansas Lottery at said address not later than:
    - (1) **Southeast Gaming Zone: 5:00 p.m. CST on Wednesday January 21, 2009;**
    - (2) **South Central Gaming Zone: 5:00 p.m. CDT on Wednesday April 1, 2009; and,**
    - (3) **Northeast Gaming Zone: 5:00 p.m. CDT on Wednesday April 1, 2009.**
  - (h) All applications and supporting documents shall also be subject to the following:
    - (1) They shall be delivered in sturdy boxes or other containers clearly marked with the name of the applicant and which boxes or containers comprise the original and each set of copies;
    - (2) If the initial application submission consists of more than fourteen (14) standard bank-size boxes (including the original), for ease of unloading and moving all such boxes shall be de-

livered on, and secured to (whether by clear wrap or otherwise), a standard warehouse pallet, with a total height of no more than approximately five (5) feet. In the event items are delivered at a later date (such as supplements or amendments to applications), Applicants need not palletize the boxes unless twelve (12) or more standard bank-size boxes are delivered at one time.

- (3) If delivered by common carrier, applicant shall cause written proof of delivery to be included in the delivery thereof and produce a copy of said proof of delivery if so requested by the Commission;
- (4) If delivered other than by common carrier, the applicant will be provided a written receipt of delivery by the Lottery; and,
- (5) Applications and supporting documents may also be delivered on any Kansas Lottery business day prior to the deadline set forth above, but if delivery will be prior to said date it is requested the applicant notify the Executive Director of the Lottery at least one business day prior to delivery if other than by common carrier, or the estimated day of delivery if by common carrier.
- (i) The Commission or the Executive Director may in their sole discretion require any or all applicants to produce or provide by a date certain such additional documents, information, testimony, or other items as they deem appropriate under the circumstances.
- (j) Each exhibit, statement, report, paper or other document submitted in support of the application shall be current, accurate and complete, and any change in any of said items shall be reported immediately to the Executive Director.

#### 4. Review of Applications and Execution of a Contract.

- (a) Upon expiration of the deadline established by the Commission for the receipt of applications for Lottery Gaming Facility Managers, the Commission shall review all applications and related documents submitted as provided by the procedures herein. The Kansas Lottery and/or the Kansas Racing and Gaming Commission may require clarification of the items requested in the Application and may require additional documents or disclosures.
- (b) The Commission may conduct hearings, solicit testimony, consult with experts, request additional information, seek clarification, or take such other action as may be deemed appropriate by the Commission in order to determine if a contract and related documents submitted as provided by these rules meet the minimum requirements set forth in the KELA and these procedures.
- (c) Not later than ninety (90) days after the deadline for submission of proposals as provided in these rules, or as otherwise extended by the Governor of the State of Kansas as provided in KSA 74-8736(f),

the Executive Director and each qualifying prospective Lottery Gaming Facility Manager shall execute a contract.

- (d) Not later than thirty (30) days after approval of a contract by the Commission, the prospective Lottery Gaming Facility Manager shall pay to the Treasurer of the State of Kansas for deposit into the Lottery Gaming Facility Manager fund the statutory privilege fee of \$25,000,000. In the event any privilege fee is not paid within thirty (30) days of approval of the underlying contract, that contract shall be deemed null and void.
- (e) Pursuant to the KSA 74-8736(b), all contracts executed as provided in subsection (c) of the procedures herein (above) shall be transmitted to the Lottery Gaming Facility Review Board (Board) for further review and consideration.
- (f) In the event the Board returns any proposed contract to the Executive Director for further negotiations, the Executive Director shall take such other and further action on the application as is deemed appropriate by the Executive Director.
- (g) In the event the Board refers a prospective Manager to the KRGC for the background investigation required by KSA 74-8736(e), but the KRGC does not approve the background of the prospective Lottery Gaming Facility Manager, or the directors, officers and other persons having an interest in such prospective Manager, the Executive Director shall recommence the process for selection of said Lottery Gaming Facility Manager.
- (h) If no manager or prospective manager applicant remains in a gaming zone for any reason (including applicant withdrawal), the Executive Director may recommence the process for selection of a Lottery Gaming Facility Manager in that gaming zone.

EXAMINATION

**66-11-5. Admission requirements for fundamentals of surveying examination.** (a) Each application shall be reviewed by the board to determine whether the

requirements for admission to take the fundamentals of surveying examination have been met. Once the board establishes that these requirements have been met, the applicant shall be allowed to sit for the examination.

(b) Each applicant shall meet one of the following requirements for admission before taking the examination:

(1) Graduation from an accredited land surveying curriculum, as defined in K.A.R. 66-9-5 (b) and (c);

(2) successful completion of the land surveying curriculum specified in K.A.R. 66-9-5(e); or

(3) verification of a combination of education and experience of a character satisfactory to the board. In evaluating an applicant's record, a determination shall be made by the board of whether, based on the applicant's educational background, the applicant requires no more than four years of additional progressive land surveying experience to qualify for admission to the practice of surveying examination. (Authorized by K.S.A. 74-7013; implementing K.S.A. 74-7022 and 74-7023; effective Nov. 1, 2002; amended Feb. 3, 2006; amended June 29, 2007; amended Jan. 23, 2009.)

Article 12.—MINIMUM STANDARDS FOR THE  
PRACTICE OF LAND SURVEYING

**66-12-1. Minimum standards for the practice of land surveying.** The board hereby adopts by reference the following:

(a) The "2005 minimum standard detail requirements for ALTA/ACSM land title surveys";

(b) the "accuracy standards for ALTA/ACSM land title surveys," published in 2005; and

(c) the "Kansas minimum standards for boundary surveys and mortgagee title inspections standards of practice #1" adopted by the Kansas society of land surveyors and last amended on October 23, 1998, except that the preface and scope sections shall be deleted. (Authorized by K.S.A. 74-7013; implementing K.S.A. 74-7037; effective May 4, 1992; amended Feb. 14, 1994; amended Feb. 13, 1995; amended March 1, 1996; amended Feb. 4, 2000; amended Jan. 23, 2009.)

Article 14.—CONTINUING EDUCATION  
REQUIREMENTS

**66-14-1. Requirements.** (a) Each licensee shall have completed 30 professional development hours (PDHs) of acceptable continuing education requirements during the two-year period immediately preceding the biennial renewal date established in K.A.R. 66-6-6 as a condition for license renewal. If the licensee exceeds the requirement in any renewal period, the licensee may carry a maximum of 30 PDHs forward into the subsequent renewal period.

(b) Commencing with the renewal of licenses that expire on March 31, 2010, each land surveyor shall have completed, as part of the 30 PDHs required, at least two PDHs of continuing education activity on the Kansas minimum standards adopted by reference in K.A.R. 66-12-1(c). (Authorized by and implementing K.S.A. 74-7013 and 74-7025; effective March 1, 1996; amended Feb. 4, 2000; amended Jan. 23, 2009.)

**66-14-2. Definitions.** The terms used in this article shall have the following meanings:

(a) "Contact hour" means one clock-hour of not less than 50 minutes.

(b) "Continuing education activity" means an activity that enhances a licensee's level of technical, professional, managerial, or ethical competence in order to further the goal of protecting the health, safety, and welfare of the public.

(c) "Continuing education unit" (CEU) means a unit of credit customarily used for continuing education courses.

(d) "Dual licensee" means a person who is licensed in two or more technical professions.

(e) "Mentoring" means guiding or tutoring another individual in the areas of technical, professional, managerial, or ethical competence in the technical professions.

(f) "Professional development hour" (PDH) means a unit of credit given by the board for participation in a continuing education activity as specified in this article.

(g) "Sponsor" means an individual, organization, association, institution, or other entity that provides an educational offering for the purpose of fulfilling the continuing educational requirements of these regulations. (Authorized by and implementing K.S.A. 74-7013 and 74-7025; effective March 1, 1996; amended Jan. 23, 2009.)

**66-14-3. Continuing education activities.** (a) Continuing education activities that satisfy the continuing education requirement shall include the following:

(1) Attending professional or technical presentations at meetings, conventions, or conferences;

(2) attending in-house programs sponsored by corporations or other organizations;

(3) successfully completing seminars, tutorials, short courses, correspondence courses, televised courses, or videotaped courses;

(4) making professional or technical presentations at meetings, conventions, or conferences;

(5) teaching or instructing, as described in K.A.R. 66-14-5(a)(2);

(6) authoring published papers, articles, or books;

(7) serving as an officer or committee member of a technical profession society or organization, as described in K.A.R. 66-14-5(a)(4);

(8) successfully completing courses sponsored by a college or university;

(9) successfully completing courses that are awarded continuing educational units; and

(10) mentoring one or more individuals who are preparing for licensure, as described in K.A.R. 66-14-5(a)(8).

(b) Each of the continuing education activities identified in paragraphs (a)(1), (2), (3), (8), and (9) shall meet all of the following criteria:

(1) The activity has a definable purpose and objective.

(2) The program is conducted by a person qualified in the subject area.

(3) The licensee retains a record of registration and attendance.

(Authorized by and implementing K.S.A. 74-7013 and 74-7025; effective March 1, 1996; amended Feb. 4, 2005; amended Jan. 23, 2009.)

**66-14-4.** (Authorized by K.S.A. 74-7013, as amended by L. 1995, ch. 104, sec. 1; implementing K.S.A. 74-7025, as amended by L. 1995, ch. 104, sec. 1; effective March 1, 1996; revoked Jan. 23, 2009.)

**66-14-5. Computation of credit.** (a) Continuing education credits shall be measured in professional development hours (PDHs) and shall be computed as follows:

(1) Successfully completing one contact hour of professional development education in coursework or seminars or making professional or technical presentations at meetings, conventions, or conferences shall be the equivalent of one PDH.

(2) Teaching or instructing, as specified in K.A.R. 66-14-3(a)(5), shall constitute four PDHs for each contact hour spent in the classroom. Teaching credit shall be valid for teaching a course or seminar in its initial presentation only. Full-time faculty at a college, university, or other educational institution shall not receive teaching credit for teaching their regularly assigned courses.

(3) Authoring a published paper, article, or book shall be the equivalent of 10 PDHs.

(4) Serving as an officer or committee member of a technical profession society or organization shall be the equivalent of two PDHs. Professional development hours shall be limited to two PDHs for each organization and shall not be earned until the completion of each year of service.

(5) Successfully completing one university semester hour of credit shall be the equivalent of 45 PDHs.

(6) Successfully completing one university quarter hour of credit shall be the equivalent of 30 PDHs.

(7) Successfully completing one continuing education unit shall be the equivalent of 10 PDHs.

(8) Mentoring one or more individuals who are preparing for licensure shall be limited to six PDHs each year.

(b) Final authority shall rest with the board, with respect to the approval of continuing education activities. (Authorized by and implementing K.S.A. 74-7013 and 74-7025; effective March 1, 1996; amended Nov. 2, 2001; amended Feb. 4, 2005; amended Jan. 23, 2009.)

**66-14-7. Records.** (a) Each licensee shall maintain records on forms prescribed and furnished by the board to support the professional development hours claimed by the licensee. The records shall include the following:

(1) A log showing the type of activity claimed, the number of professional development hours earned, and other information as applicable; and

(2) supporting documentation, which may include documentation of any of the following:

(A) Presentations or attendance at meetings, conventions, conferences, programs, seminars, and similar activities, which shall be documented by verification records in the form of completion certificates or other documents supporting evidence of attendance;

(B) authoring published papers or books, which shall be documented by proof of publication; or

(C) mentoring, which shall be documented by completion of a board-approved form signed by both the mentor

and the mentored individual indicating dates and a description of the activities.

(b) The licensee shall maintain the records for at least four years and shall provide a copy to the board, upon request. (Authorized by and implementing K.S.A. 74-7013 and 74-7025; effective March 1, 1996; amended Jan. 23, 2009.)

#### Temporary Administrative Regulations

#### Article 2.—LOTTERY RETAILERS

##### ZARCO 66 DRAWING 2008

**111-2-219. Name of drawing.** The Kansas lottery shall conduct a drawing entitled “Zarco 66 Drawing 2008” and will accept entries starting at the opening of business for each participating Zarco 66 store on November 1, 2008, through the end of business for each store on November 29, 2008, for the drawing to be conducted on December 3, 2008. Rules applicable to the “Zarco 66 Drawing 2008” are contained in K.A.R. 111-2-219 through 111-2-223 and K.A.R. 111-2-1 *et seq.* (Authorized by and implementing K.S.A. 74-8710; effective, T-111-10-31-08, Oct. 15, 2008.)

**111-2-220. Prize.** (a) The seven preliminary prize winners selected in the “Zarco 66 Drawing 2008” on the date specified in K.A.R. 111-2-219 shall receive \$20 in lottery coupons and a “works” car wash. All entries shall then be automatically entered into the drawing for the grand prize. The grand prize shall consist of two tickets to the Kansas City Chiefs versus San Diego Chargers football game on December 14, 2008, one parking pass, \$20 in lottery coupons, and 10 “works” car washes.

(b) Prize winners will receive notification of their prize, but the actual prize will be delivered at a time and place determined by the lottery.

(c) No later than 5:00 p.m. on the third calendar day following the drawing, the lottery shall contact by telephone the winner of the grand prize as the result of this drawing. If the lottery is unable to contact the winner within said three days, the person named on the entry drawn will no longer be eligible for the prize. In such an event, the first eligible alternate entry drawn pursuant to subsection (e) of K.A.R. 111-2-222 shall be declared the winner. All alternate winners shall then be subject to the same rules of eligibility as original winners. (Authorized by and implementing K.S.A. 74-8710; effective, T-111-10-31-08, Oct. 15, 2008.)

**111-2-221. Method of entry.** (a) Entry into the “Zarco 66 Drawing 2008” shall be accomplished as follows:

(1) With every single purchase of a \$2 or more 2by2 ticket from the opening of business of that store on November 1, 2008, through the end of business for that store

on November 29, 2008, the lottery terminal shall automatically produce one entry form for the “Zarco 66 Drawing 2008.”

(2) The purchaser must complete the information on the entry form in a legible manner. Only one name shall appear on each entry form.

(3) The completed entry form must be placed into the designated drawing receptacle provided at each Zarco 66 store no later than the close of business for that store on November 29, 2008.

(4) The holder of the entry is not required to personally attend the drawing or be present at the time of the drawing to be determined a winner.

(5) The drawing will be conducted at the Zarco 66 corporate office located in Lawrence, Kansas, on the day set forth in K.A.R. 111-2-219.

(6) Entry forms obtained during the stated period of time may be entered in the drawing.

(b) There is no limit on the number of entries a person may make, but each person may only win one preliminary prize and one grand prize.

(c) All eligible entry forms which are deposited into the drawing receptacles by the end of business for that store on November 29, 2008, shall be entered into the drawing.

(d) Eligible entrants in the “Zarco 66 Drawing 2008” must be 18 years of age or older, and may not be an employee of any Zarco 66 store in Kansas.

(e) Completing the information form on the entry form and entering the ticket into any drawing constitutes authorization to publicly identify the person whose entry is drawn.

(f) All receptacles for entries into this drawing and the security of said receptacles shall be approved by the Kansas lottery director of security. At a minimum, said receptacles shall be sealed in such a manner as to evidence any tampering thereof (by way of example, sealed with “evidence” tape commonly utilized by law enforcement personnel). Only lottery employees shall remove the entry receptacles from the retailers’ premises and deliver the receptacles to the drawing location. (Authorized by and implementing K.S.A. 74-8710; effective, T-111-10-31-08, Oct. 15, 2008.)

**111-2-222. Selection of winners.** The following process shall be used for the selection of winners in the “Zarco 66 Drawing 2008”:

(a) Personnel of the Zarco 66 stores shall pick up all drawing receptacles containing “Zarco 66 Drawing 2008” entries after the deadline for entry into the drawing, and transport the receptacles to the Zarco 66 corporate office in Lawrence, Kansas, where they shall be secured by personnel at Zarco 66 stores.

(b) On December 3, 2008, the drawing shall be held at the Zarco 66 corporate office in Lawrence, Kansas, in a place accessible to the public and open for public attendance with lottery security personnel present. The drawing shall be conducted by the lottery and shall be audio and video taped.

(c) At the start of the drawing, lottery security personnel shall present the seven drawing receptacles to the person designated by the executive director to perform the drawing. The receptacles for the drawing shall contain all

entries eligible for the drawing from each of the seven stores. The contents of each receptacle shall be mixed or shaken thoroughly. The designated individual shall then using the bare-arm technique, while looking away, remove one valid entry from each receptacle. The person whose name appears on each of the entries shall be the winner of a \$20 Kansas lottery coupon and a "works" car wash, subject to validation by the lottery as set forth in these rules.

(d) After one entry has been drawn from each receptacle and verified as valid by lottery security, all entries shall be placed into another drawing receptacle. The contents of the receptacle shall be mixed or shaken thoroughly. The designated individual shall then, using the bare-arm technique, while looking away, remove one valid entry from the receptacle. The person whose name appears on the entry shall be the winner of the grand prize identified in K.A.R. 111-2-220. After one valid entry has been drawn, two more entries shall be drawn in the same manner and marked in the order drawn as 1A and 2A to act as alternate entries to be used in the order drawn in the event the grand prize winner fails to claim the prize as provided herein.

(e) The Kansas lottery security official present shall review each entry drawn to determine the validity of the entry into the "Zarco 66 Drawing 2008" in accordance with these regulations. If it is a valid entry and the name is legible, the event manager and the security person present shall record the name of the winner.

(f) If the entry is determined to be ineligible, it shall be discarded by the security person present and another entry drawn. This procedure will be repeated until valid selections are obtained.

(g) All "Zarco 66 Drawing 2008" entries remaining in the receptacles after the winners and alternates have been selected and certified and all entries not received in compliance with these rules shall be destroyed pursuant to K.A.R. 111-3-34. (Authorized by and implementing K.S.A. 74-8710; effective, T-111-10-31-08, Oct. 15, 2008.)

**111-2-223. Certification of drawing.** (a) The "Zarco 66 Drawing 2008" shall be personally observed by a member of the Kansas lottery security department and a member of the Kansas lottery marketing or sales department or other person or persons designated by the executive director of the lottery (hereinafter "event manager").

(b) Upon completion of the drawing, the security official and the event manager shall issue a report to the executive director, certifying that the name of each prize winner is correct, and that to the best of their knowledge the procedures required by these rules were followed in selecting each prize winner. (Authorized by and implementing K.S.A. 74-8710; effective, T-111-10-31-08, Oct. 15, 2008.)

If the player gets a "\$\$" (outlined) symbol, the player wins double the prize amount shown below that symbol. If the player gets a "\$\$\$" (outlined) symbol, the player wins triple the prize amount shown below that symbol. A player can win once in this play area.

#### Article 7.—ON-LINE GAMES

**111-7-233. Name of drawing.** The Kansas lottery shall conduct a drawing entitled "Buy \$3 Get an Entry Free Drawing" and will accept entries starting November 9, 2008, for the drawing to be conducted on Friday, March 13, 2009. Rules applicable to the "Buy \$3 Get an Entry Free Drawing" are contained in K.A.R. 111-7-233 through 111-7-237 and K.A.R. 111-6-1 *et seq.* (Authorized by and implementing K.S.A. 74-8710; effective, T-111-10-31-08, Oct. 15, 2008.)

**111-7-234. Prize.** The 45 prize winners selected in the "Buy \$3 Get an Entry Free Drawing" on the date specified in K.A.R. 111-7-233 shall receive two tickets for each day of the 2009 races conducted at the Kansas Speedway in Kansas City, Kansas, on April 25, 2009, and April 26, 2009, one double occupancy hotel room and room taxes

at Great Wolf Lodge in Kansas City, Kansas, for the evenings of April 24, 2009, and April 25, 2009, round-trip transportation between the Kansas Speedway and the hotel, food and other amenities at the Kansas lottery hospitality chalet during said races at the Kansas Speedway, \$500 cash, and mandatory state and federal income withholding taxes. The following restrictions shall apply to the "Buy \$3 Get an Entry Free Drawing" prize packages:

(a) The Kansas lottery is not responsible for any losses caused by delay or cancellation of any of said automobile races.

(b) Prize packages, except cash, are transferable one time, but cannot be redeemed for cash.

(c) The lottery shall choose and reserve all hotel rooms.

(d) The lottery shall provide transportation to and from the Kansas Speedway on a scheduled basis. All other transportation is the responsibility of the prize winners.

(e) Prize winners will receive notification of their prize, but the actual prize will be delivered at a time and place to be announced by the lottery.

(f) Any meals, drinks, gratuities, taxes, and other expenses that are not specifically mentioned are not included.

(g) The hotel may require winners to produce a major credit card at the time of check-in. Winners are responsible for all hotel charges incurred in excess of the room charge, and parking.

(h) All prizes are subject to lottery validation, set-offs and deductions authorized by law.

(i) No later than 5:00 p.m. on the fourteenth calendar day following the drawing, the winner of a prize as the result of the "Buy \$3 Get an Entry Free Drawing" shall return to the lottery a completed claim form as provided by the lottery or the person named on the entry drawn will no longer be eligible for the prize. In such an event, the first eligible alternate entry drawn pursuant to subsection (f) of K.A.R. 111-7-237 shall be declared the winner. All alternate winners shall then be subject to the same rules of eligibility as original winners.

(j) A total of 45 prize packages shall be awarded. (Authorized by and implementing K.S.A. 74-8710; effective, T-111-10-31-08, Oct. 15, 2008.)

**111-7-235. Method of entry.** (a) Entry into the "Buy \$3 Get an Entry Free Drawing" shall be accomplished as follows:

(1) With every single purchase of \$3 or more for the Kansas lottery "Super Kansas Cash" game from November 9, 2008, through March 7, 2009, the purchaser shall receive one entry form for the "Buy \$3 Get an Entry Free Drawing."

(2) The purchaser must complete the information on the entry form in a legible manner. Only one name shall appear on each entry form.

(3) Place one or more entry form(s) into an envelope with proper postage and mail it to: "Kansas Lottery Race Weekend Drawing" c/o Kansas lottery, P. O. Box 750980, Topeka, KS 66675-0980. Mailed entries must be received by morning mail pickup on Tuesday, March 10, 2009.

(4) No later than 5:00 p.m. CDT on March 10, 2009, players may also deposit entries for this drawing into any

receptacle the Kansas lottery has specifically designated for deposit of said entries.

(5) The holder of the ticket is not required to personally attend the drawing or be present at the time of the drawing to be determined a winner.

(6) Forty-five entries and 10 alternate entries will be drawn.

(7) Entry forms obtained during the stated period of time may be entered in the drawing.

(b) There is no limit on the number of entries a person may make, but a person may only win one prize package.

(c) All eligible entry forms which are mailed and received by the morning mail pickup in Topeka, Kansas, on Tuesday, March 10, 2009, shall be entered into the drawing to be conducted on Friday, March 13, 2009.

(d) Eligible entrants in the "Buy \$3 Get an Entry Free Drawing" must be 18 years of age or older.

(e) Completing the information form on the entry form and entering the ticket into any drawing constitutes authorization to publicly identify the person whose entry is drawn. (Authorized by and implementing K.S.A. 74-8710; effective, T-111-10-31-08, Oct. 15, 2008.)

**111-7-236. Certification of drawing.** (a) The "Buy \$3 Get an Entry Free Drawing" shall all be personally observed by a member of the Kansas lottery security department and a member of the Kansas lottery marketing department or other person or persons designated by the executive director of the lottery (hereinafter "event manager").

(b) Upon completion of the drawing, the security official and the event manager shall issue a report to the executive director, certifying that the name of each prize winner is correct, and that to the best of their knowledge the procedures required by these rules were followed in selecting each prize winner. (Authorized by and implementing K.S.A. 74-8710; effective, T-111-10-31-08, Oct. 15, 2008.)

**111-7-237. Selection of winners.** The following process shall be used for the selection of winners in the "Buy \$3 Get an Entry Free Drawing":

(a) Kansas lottery personnel shall pick up all mail containing "Buy \$3 Get an Entry Free Drawing" entries at the United States Post Office in Topeka, Kansas, with final pickup for the drawing after the morning mail delivery on Tuesday, March 10, 2009, prior to the drawing on Friday, March 13, 2009.

(b) Only valid entry forms which are mailed and received by the lottery as provided by these rules and entry forms entered into any other receptacle designated by the lottery as provided in the rules herein shall be eligible for the drawing. All entries so mailed or deposited shall be secured by the lottery until the drawing is conducted.

(c) Lottery personnel shall transport the mail to the Kansas lottery mail room where the envelopes will be opened and emptied into the drawing receptacle or drum.

(d) The drawing shall be held at the lottery headquarters in a place accessible to the public and open for public attendance with lottery security personnel present. The drawing shall be audio and video taped.

(e) At the start of the drawing, lottery security personnel shall present the receptacle or drum to the person designated by the executive director to perform the drawing. The receptacle or drum for the drawing shall contain all entries eligible for the drawing. The drum shall be rotated 10 times or receptacle mixed thoroughly as may be applicable. The designated individual shall then unseal the receptacle or drum, and using the bare-arm technique, while looking away, remove 45 valid entries, one at a time, from the receptacle or drum and mark them in order drawn from one through and including 45. The person whose name appears on each of the entries shall be the winner of the prize identified in K.A.R. 111-7-234, subject to validation by the lottery as set forth in these rules.

(f) After 45 entries have been drawn and verified as valid by lottery security, 10 more entries will be drawn, one at a time, to serve as alternate entries. The alternate entries will be marked in order drawn, 1A, 2A, 3A, 4A, 5A, 6A, 7A, 8A, 9A, and 10A. The alternate ticket entries will be used only if one or more of the original winners cannot be located or are declared ineligible, or fail to present a fully-executed claim form to lottery headquarters as required by K.A.R. 111-7-234(i). The alternates will be used, if necessary, in the order drawn.

(g) The Kansas lottery security official present shall review each entry drawn to determine the validity of the entry into the "Buy \$3 Get an Entry Free Drawing" in accordance with these regulations. If it is a valid entry and the name is legible, the event manager and the security person present shall record the name of the winner. Each winner shall be given or sent a prize claim form to be completed and returned to the lottery within 14 calendar days of the drawing.

(h) If the entry is determined to be ineligible, it shall be discarded by the security person present and another entry drawn. This procedure will be repeated until valid selections are obtained.

(i) All "Buy \$3 Get an Entry Free Drawing" entries remaining in the drum or receptacle after the winners have been selected and certified and all entries not received in compliance with these rules shall be destroyed pursuant to K.A.R. 111-3-34. (Authorized by and implementing K.S.A. 74-8710; effective, T-111-10-31-08, Oct. 15, 2008.)
