Negotiations for Engineering Services**

Notice is hereby given of the commencement of negotiations for civil engineering services for Fort Hays State University. Fort Hays State University, in collaboration with the city of Hays, will be selecting one firm to provide design services for Fort Hays State University's Soccer Facility, with a total project cost of \$2,100,000, and the city of Hays' Sports Complex, with a total project cost of \$8,000,000. Design services for each project will be contracted separately, with the respective owner. Both projects will be co-located on a 135-acre site, located adjacent to Fort Hays State University. Each entity will own the land on which its facility is located.

The Fort Hays State University Soccer Facility would include, but not be limited to, a complete synthetic turf soccer field, permanent bleacher seating, field lighting and locker room/restroom/concessions structure. Site development would include entrance roads, surface parking, site lighting, perimeter fencing, landscaping and utility service extensions to site. Final approval of the Fort Hays State University project is still pending in the 2009 Kansas legislative session.

The city of Hays' Sports Complex would include, but not be limited to, eight (8) complete baseball/softball nat-

ural turf fields with permanent bleachers, eight (8) complete natural turf soccer/football (multi-purpose) fields with portable bleachers, two (2) picnic areas, playground area, maintenance building, two (2) concession/restroom structures and field lighting. Site development would include entrance roads, entrance signage, perimeter fencing, surface parking, site lighting, landscaping and off-site extensions to complex.

Administrative Regulations

A public hearing will be conducted by the Wildlife and Parks Commission at 7 p.m. Thursday, April 16, at the Logan County Courthouse, 710 W. 2nd St., Oakley, to consider the approval and adoption of proposed administrative regulations of the Kansas Department of Wildlife and Parks.

A workshop meeting on business of the Wildlife and Parks Commission will begin at 1:30 p.m. April 16 at the location listed above. The meeting will recess at 5:30 p.m., then resume at 7 p.m. at the same location for the regulatory hearing. There will be public comment periods at the beginning of the afternoon and evening meetings for any issues not on the agenda, and additional comment periods will be available during the meeting on agenda items. Old and new business also may be discussed at this time. If necessary to complete the hearing or other business matters, the commission will reconvene at 9 a.m. April 17 at the same location.

Any individual with a disability may request accommodation in order to participate in the public hearing and may request the proposed regulations and economic impact statements in an accessible format. Requests for accommodation should be made at least five working days in advance of the hearing by contacting Sheila Kemmis, commission secretary, at (620) 672-5911. The regulations that will be heard during the regulatory hearing portion of the meeting are as follows:

K.A.R. 115-4-11. This permanent regulation establishes application provisions for big game and wild turkey applications. The proposed amendments would allow bonus points for additional chances for unsuccessful applicants from previous years in the elk permit drawing.

Economic impact summary: The proposed amendments are not anticipated to have any appreciable negative economic impact on the department, other agencies, small businesses or the public.

K.A.R. 115-8-1. This permanent regulation establishes certain requirements or restrictions for hunting, furhar-

vesting, and discharge of firearms on department lands and waters. The proposed amendment is to update the reference document with changes.

Economic impact summary: The proposed amendments are not anticipated to have any appreciable negative economic impact on the department, other agencies, small businesses or the public.

K.A.R. 115-25-8. This exempt regulation establishes open season, bag limit and permits for elk. The proposed version would decrease the number of permits by two from the previous season.

Economic impact summary: The proposed amendments are not anticipated to have any appreciable negative economic impact on the department, other agencies, small businesses or the public.

K.A.R. 100-55-9. Special permits. This regulation establishes the requirements to obtain a special permit for

student respiratory therapists issued and regulated by the board in the profession of respiratory therapy.

The amendment to K.A.R. 100-55-9 will not result in any economic impact to the public or licensees.

The regulation is not mandated by any federal law.

No other methods were considered.

Special Order 2009-1

This Order issued this 30th day of January, 2009, by the State Bank Commissioner ("Commissioner").

WHEREAS, 12 U.S.C. §51a and 12 C.F.R. §5.46 authorize a national bank to issue preferred stock of one or more classes, in such amount and with such par value as shall be approved by the Comptroller of the Currency; and

WHEREAS, state law provides that state banks may issue preferred stock, but that the par value shall be divided into shares of \$5 each or a multiple thereof; and

WHEREAS, K.S.A. 9-1715 provides the Commissioner with the power to authorize state banks or trust companies to engage in any activity in which such banks or trust companies could engage were they operating as any other insured depository institution, including a national bank; and

WHEREAS, the United States Treasury has established a Capital Purchase Program pursuant to which it may purchase preferred stock of certain banks pursuant to the authority granted in the Emergency Economic Stabilization Act of 2008, P.L. 110-343; and

WHEREAS, the Commissioner deems the issuance of this Order to be reasonably required to preserve and protect the welfare of state banks and to promote the competitive equality of state and national banks in connection with a state bank's ability to participate on the same terms as a national bank in the Capital Purchase Program;

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED that Kansas state banks shall have the authority to issue preferred stock of one or more classes, in such amount and with such par value as shall be approved by the Commissioner; and

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED, pursuant to K.S.A. 9-1715(b) as amended, that the terms of this Order shall become effective January 30, 2009 and shall remain in full force and effect until amended or revoked by the Commissioner.

Cities and Municipalities—Miscellaneous Provisions—Mayoral Appointments to Boards and Commissions; Specific Finding that Person is Unqualified or Not Fit to Hold Office. Robert Hecht, Shawnee County District Attorney, Topeka, November 3, 2008.

A city governing body that rejects a mayoral appointment must simply make a determination that the candidate is either not fit or is unqualified to hold the office or position. The law does not require that a governing body articulate the basis for its determination. A city is required to specify the purposes for which the revenues from a retailers' sales tax will be used regardless whether it is levied for general purposes or special purposes. Whether a retailers' sales tax is levied for general purposes or special purposes is determined by the degree of specificity stated by the city as being the purposes for the levy. A retailers' sales tax that will potentially provide funding to address necessary work on all city roads, all city parks, and all of the community's cultural and recreational facilities, rather than specific roads, parks, and community cultural and recreational facilities, constitutes a sales tax levied for general purposes under K.S.A. 2007 Supp. 12-189. Taxation—Property Exempt from Taxation—Property Exempt from Ad Valorem Taxation; Property Belonging Exclusively to the United States; Private Housing Project at Fort Riley.

Federal Jurisdiction—Federal Property; Fort Riley Military Reservation; Taxation of Housing Project on Military Reservation. Clancy Holeman, Riley County Counselor, Manhattan, January 13, 2009.

The act ceding jurisdiction to the United States for Fort Riley retained the authority to tax "the property of citizens, not otherwise exempt" from taxation. The term "citizen" is not defined and must be construed within the context of the ceding and taxation statutes. Exemptions to taxation are established by the legislature and narrowly applied. The burden of proving an exemption is upon the entity seeking the exemption. Absent a specific exemption, the property of a limited liability company operating within Fort Riley is subject to taxation based upon the ceding language. A county may offer an opinion concerning tax exemptions, but it is not binding. A recreation commission jointly created by a city and school district has the statutorily granted contract authority to enter into an interlocal agreement with a private organization for the provision of recreational programming with or without the city or school district's participation. The recreation commission must maintain a degree of oversight that reserves ultimate authority for programming, and other operational decisions in order to provide accountability. A city participating in a joint recreation commission may not enter into any other interlocal agreement for the provision of recreational services with either a public or private entity. A certified registered nurse anesthetist (CRNA) is not authorized under K.S.A. 65-1158 to issue preoperative and postoperative orders for medications and diagnostic tests related to anesthesia or analgesia care. We decline to opine on the issue of whether a physician can delegate such activity in light of the ambiguity in the physician delegation statute, K.S.A. 2007 Supp. 65-28,127, and because the health care professions are better suited to address this issue through appropriate legislation. Due to the conflict in the interpretation of K.S.A. 2007 Supp. 65-28,127, the conclusions in Attorney General Opinions No. 2000-26 and 2008-6 are withdrawn. The Kansas Department of Transportation requests proposals from qualified firms to perform all necessary professional engineering, surveying, planning and project management services related to the development of aeronautical information surveys for Kansas airports on an as-needed basis. Permanent Administrative Regulations

Article 26.—AGRICULTURAL ETHYL ALCOHOL PRODUCER INCENTIVE

92-26-1. Definitions. As used in this article, these terms shall have the following meanings: (a) "Agricultural commodities" shall mean all materials used in the production of agricultural ethyl alcohol, including grains and other starch products, sugar-based crops, fruits and fruit products, forage crops, and crop residue.

(b) "Director" shall mean the director of taxation of the department of revenue.

(c) "Fiscal year" means a period of time consistent with the calendar periods of July 1 through the following June 30.

(d) "Principal place of facility" means a plant or still located in the state of Kansas that produces or has the capacity to produce agricultural ethyl alcohol.

(e) "Production" means the process of manufacturing agricultural ethyl alcohol. For the purposes of this article, the terms "produce" and "produced" shall be consistent with the definition of "production."

(f) "Quarter" means a period of time consistent with the calendar periods of January 1 through March 31, April 1 through June 30, July 1 through September 30, and October 1 through December 31. For the purposes of this article, the term "quarterly" shall be consistent with the definition of "quarter."

(g) "Spirits" means an inflammable liquid produced by distillation.

(h) "Wine gallon" means 231 cubic inches measured at 60 degrees Fahrenheit. (Authorized by K.S.A. 2008 Supp. 79-34,163; implementing K.S.A. 2008 Supp. 79-34,161 and 79-34,163; effective, T-88-34, Sept. 17, 1987; amended May 1, 1988; amended Feb. 27, 2009.)

92-26-4. Filing of quarterly reports; deadline.

(a)(1) Each ethyl alcohol producer producing agriculture ethyl alcohol in the state of Kansas shall file a Kansas qualified agricultural ethyl alcohol producer's report with the director of taxation within 30 days from the last day of each quarter. Each producer not filing a report within 30 days after the last day of any quarter in a fiscal year shall be barred from seeking one quarter of any payment due from the agricultural ethyl alcohol producer's fund for that fiscal year. Upon proof satisfactory to the

secretary of extenuating circumstances preventing timely submission of the report by the producer, this penalty may be waived by the secretary.

(2) Production incentives shall be paid on a fiscal year basis from the new production account or the current production account in the agricultural ethyl alcohol producer incentive fund, whichever account is applicable. When the production incentive amount for the number of agricultural ethyl alcohol gallons sold by any producer to a qualified alcohol blender exceeds the balance in the applicable account at the time payment is to be made for that fiscal year's production, the incentive per gallon shall be reduced proportionately so that the current balance of the applicable account is not exceeded. Any amount remaining in the account following a fiscal year payment of producer incentives shall be carried forward in that account to the next fiscal year for payment of future production incentives, except when the current production account balance is required by K.S.A. 79-34,161, and amendments thereto, to be transferred to the new production account. The quarterly reports for a fiscal year shall be for the third and fourth quarters of one calendar year and the first and second quarters of the following calendar year.

(b) Each quarterly report shall be submitted on forms furnished by the director and shall contain the following information:

- (1) The beginning inventory of denatured alcohol;
- (2) the amount of alcohol produced and denaturant added;
- (3) the amount of agricultural ethyl alcohol sold to qualified blenders;
- (4) the amount of denatured alcohol sold to other than qualified blenders;
- (5) the amount of denatured alcohol sold or used for miscellaneous purposes, including denatured alcohol that has been lost, destroyed, or stolen;
- (6) the name of the liquid fuel carrier and the liquid fuel carrier's federal employer identification number;
- (7) the mode of transportation;
- (8) the point of origin, specifying city and state;
- (9) the point of destination, specifying city and state;
- (10) the name of the company to which the product was sold;
- (11) the date the product was shipped;
- (12) the identifying number from the bill of lading or manifest;
- (13) the number of gross gallons sold; and
- (14) the product code.

Each ethyl alcohol producer filing a quarterly report shall furnish all information required by the director before receiving the funds. 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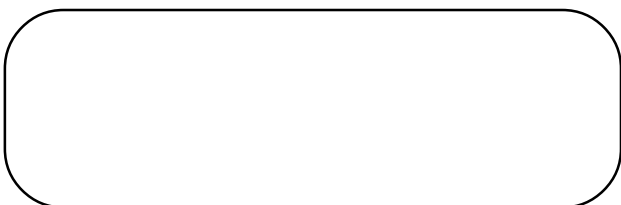
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
