A public hearing will be conducted at 2 p.m. Friday, May 1, in the third floor conference room, Kansas Insurance Department, 420 S.W. 9th, Topeka, to consider the adoption of a proposed rule and regulation.

This 60-day notice of the public hearing shall constitute a public comment period for the purpose of receiving written public comments on the proposed rule and regulation. A summary of the proposed regulation and its economic impact follows:

K.A.R. 40-4-37v. Long-term care; agent training. This regulation is being proposed to specify the training required for licensed agents selling long-term care partnership program policies. The proposed regulation requires agents to initially receive four hours of certified training and at least one hour of training every two years thereafter. It also permits the long-term care training to be used to satisfy general continuing education requirements.

The proposed regulation is not mandated by federal law.

The only economic impact will be the amount that agents or their employers will spend to obtain the training. Otherwise, the proposed regulation will not have significant economic impact on insurance companies, government agencies, regulated entities, large or small businesses, or the general public.

The proposed regulation achieves the stated purpose of prescribing the training requirements for agents selling long-term care insurance products by the most effective and least costly method in accordance with K.S.A. 2008 Supp. 40-2136 (2008 Senate Bill No. 443), and therefore no other methods were considered.

A summary of the proposed regulation and its economic impact follows:

K.A.R. 40-1-37. Audited financial reports; filing requirements. This regulation is being proposed to amend the current regulation relating to annual financial reports filed by insurance companies. K.S.A. 40-225 directs the commissioner to make amendments or additions to the reporting requirements prescribed by the National Association of Insurance Commissioners (NAIC). This proposed amendment to K.A.R. 40-1-37 adopts by reference the February 5, 2009 "Policy and Procedure Requiring Annual Audited Financial Reports," which is the current NAIC model regulation with Kansas-specific revisions. Companies currently voluntarily comply with the NAIC model regulation.

The proposed regulation is not mandated by federal law.

Some insurance companies having annual direct written and assumed premiums of \$500 million or more will be financially impacted if they do not currently prepare a report of the insurer's internal control over financial reporting. No other companies will change current practice and the proposed amended regulation will not have economic impact on other insurance companies, government agencies, regulated entities, large or small businesses, or the general public.

The proposed regulation achieves the stated purpose of prescribing the financial reporting requirements by the most effective and least costly method in accordance with K.S.A. 40-225, and therefore no other methods were considered.

Notice to Consulting Engineers

With the approval of the Economic Recovery Program, the Kansas Department of Transportation is seeking qualified consulting engineering firms to perform construction inspection, as needed, statewide. Firms with current contracts need not respond to this request because their contracts will continue. A response may be submitted by e-mail to neil@ksdot.org or seven signed copies of the response can be mailed to Neil Rusch, P.E., Assistant to the Director, KDOT, Division of Engineering and Design, Eisenhower State Office Building, 700 S.W. Harrison, Topeka, 66603-3754. Responses shall be limited to four pages and must be received by noon March 19 for the consulting engineering firm to be considered.

From the firms expressing interest, the Consultant Selection Committee will select a list of the most highly qualified (not less than three and not more than five) and invite them to attend an individual interview conference. At this time, the consulting firms can more thoroughly discuss their experience related to the type of project at hand and will be expected to discuss, in some detail, their approach to this project and the personnel to be assigned to the project. Firms not selected to be short-listed will be notified by letter.

The Consultant Negotiating Committee, appointed by the Secretary of Transportation, will conduct the discussions with the firms invited to the individual interview conferences. The committee will select the firm to perform the professional services required for completing the advertised project. After the selection of this firm, the remaining firms will be notified by letter of the outcome.

**Construction Inspection,
As-Needed Statewide**

The scope of services is to provide construction inspection services on an as-needed basis statewide. Firms selected will be required to provide the following services:

1. Grading inspection
2. Structures inspection
3. Asphalt inspection (plant and/or road)
4. Concrete pavement inspection (plant and/or road)
5. Materials testing
6. Contract documentation
7. Traffic control inspection

8. Seeding
9. Other similar services, etc.

The firms must be able to staff the project with KDOT-certified inspectors.

It is KDOT's policy to use the following criteria as the basis for selection of the consulting engineering firms:

1. Size and professional qualifications;
2. experience of staff;
3. location of firm with respect to proposed project;
4. work load of firm; and
5. firm's performance record.

The firm's accounting system must have the following capabilities before the firm may be awarded a contract:

- Valid, reliable and current costs must be available within the system to support cost and pricing data;
- capability to provide a means of measuring the reasonableness of incurred costs;
- capability to identify and accumulate allowable costs by contract or project records that will reconcile with the general ledger; and
- ability to provide supporting documentation of actual expenditures for each billing, based on costs.

The Kansas Department of Health and is soliciting comments regarding a proposed air quality operating permit. Oneok Field Services has applied for a Class II operating permit renewal in accordance with the provisions of K.A.R. 28-19-510 et seq. The purpose of a Class II permit is to identify the sources and types of regulated air pollutants emitted from the facility; the emission limitations, standards and requirements applicable to each source; and the monitoring, record keeping and reporting requirements applicable to each source as of the effective date of permit issuance.

Oneok Field Services, Tulsa, Oklahoma, owns and operates Haysville compressor station located at Section 33, T28S, R01W, Sedgwick County, Kansas.

A copy of the proposed permit, permit application, all supporting documentation and all information relied upon during the permit application review process is available for a 30-day public review during normal business hours at the KDHE, Bureau of Air and Radiation, 1000 S.W. In order to be considered in formulating a final permit decision, written comments must be received before the close of business March 26.

A person may request a public hearing be held on the proposed permit. The request for a public hearing shall be in writing and set forth the basis for the request. The written request must be submitted to Sharon Burrell, Bureau of Air and Radiation, not later than the close of business March 26 in order for the Secretary of Health and Environment to consider the request.

The U.S. Environmental Protection Agency has a 45-day review period, which will start concurrently with the 30-day public comment period, within which to object to the proposed permit. If the EPA has not objected in writing to the issuance of the permit within the 45-day review period, any person may petition the administrator of the EPA to review the permit. The 60-day public petition period will directly follow the EPA's 45-day review period. Interested parties may contact KDHE to determine if the EPA's 45-day review period has been waived.

Any such petition shall be based only on objections to the permit that were raised with reasonable specificity during the public comment period provided for in this

notice, unless the petitioner demonstrates that it was impracticable to raise such objections within such period, or unless the grounds for such objection arose after such period.
