**Notice of Cancellation of Hearing on Proposed Administrative Regulations**

A public hearing was scheduled at 9 a.m. September 18 in Room 108, Landon State Office Building, 900 S.W. Jackson, Topeka, to consider the proposed revocation of K.A.R. 71-5-1 through K.A.R. 71-5-6 and the proposed adoption of K.A.R. 71-5-7 through K.A.R. 71-5-13. A summary of the regulations follows:

**K.A.R. 71-5-1 through K.A.R. 71-5-6** cancel existing regulations.

**K.A.R. 71-5-7.** This regulation defines the terms used for, and applicable to, the administration of a sedative agent as part of a dental procedure.

**K.A.R. 71-5-8.** This regulation describes that the regulations to be considered for proposed adoption apply in all treatment settings except when a dentist is treating a patient in a medical care facility.

**K.A.R. 71-5-9.** This regulation outlines the general requirements that shall be met for the administration of a sedative agent as part of a dental procedure.

**K.A.R. 71-5-10.** This regulation identifies the specific eligibility requirements for the acquisition and renewal

of a Level I permit and the conditions that apply to the performance of a dental procedure in which a Level I permit is required.

**K.A.R. 71-5-11.** This regulation identifies the specific eligibility requirements for the acquisition and renewal of a Level II permit and the conditions that apply to the performance of a dental procedure in which a Level II permit is required.

**K.A.R. 71-5-12.** This regulation identifies the specific eligibility requirements for the acquisition and renewal of a Level III permit and the conditions that apply to the performance of a dental procedure in which a Level III permit is required.

**K.A.R. 71-5-13.** This regulation specifies the grounds for refusal to issue a sedation permit or for revocation, suspension, or limitation of the permit.

**Please be advised that the Kansas Dental Board is hereby withdrawing the proposed regulations; therefore, the public hearing has been cancelled.**

Notice of Hearing on Proposed  
Administrative Regulations

A public hearing will be conducted by the Wildlife and Parks Commission at 7 p.m. Thursday, October 15, at the VFW, 610 E. Walnut, Sedan, to consider the approval and adoption of proposed administrative regulations of the Kansas Department of Wildlife and Parks.

A workshop meeting on business of the Wildlife and Parks Commission will begin at 1:30 p.m. October 15 at the location listed above. The meeting will recess at 5:30 p.m., then resume at 7 p.m. at the same location for the regulatory hearing. There will be public comment periods at the beginning of the afternoon and evening meetings for any issues not on the agenda, and additional comment periods will be available during the meeting on agenda items. Old and new business also may be discussed at this time. If necessary to complete the hearing or other business matters, the commission will reconvene at 9 a.m. October 16 at the same location.

Any individual with a disability may request accommodation in order to participate in the public hearing and may request the proposed regulations and economic impact statements in an accessible format. Requests for accommodation should be made at least five working days in advance of the hearing by contacting Sheila Kemmis, commission secretary, at (620) 672-5911. Persons with a hearing impairment may call the Kansas Commission for the Deaf and Hard of Hearing at (800) 432-0698 to request special accommodations.

This 60-day notice period prior to the hearing constitutes a public comment period for the purpose of receiving written public comments on the proposed administrative regulations. All interested parties may submit written comments prior to the hearing to the chairman of the commission, Kansas Department of Wildlife and Parks, 1020 S. Kansas Ave., Suite 200, Topeka, 66612, or to sheilak@wp.state.ks.us if electronically. All interested parties will be given a reasonable opportunity at the hearing to express their views orally in regard to the adoption of the proposed regulations. During the hearing, all written and oral comments submitted by interested parties will be considered by the commission as a basis for approving, amending and approving, or rejecting the proposed regulations.

The regulations that will be heard during the regulatory hearing portion of the meeting are as follows:

**K.A.R. 115-2-1.** This permanent regulation sets the fees for various licenses, permits and other issues of the department. The proposed amendments would offer a price decrease for spring turkey permits and game tags if purchased in combination prior to the start of the season.

Economic Impact Summary: No appreciable negative economic impact is anticipated for the department, other agencies, small businesses or the public.

**K.A.R. 115-2-3a.** This permanent regulation sets the fees for cabin camping permits. The proposed amendments would add new cabins anticipated to be available in the next calendar year.

Economic Impact Summary: No appreciable negative economic impact is anticipated for the department, other agencies, small businesses or the public.

**K.A.R. 115-7-1.** This permanent regulation establishes the legal equipment, methods of taking and other provisions for fishing. The proposed amendments would remove mandatory take provisions for paddlefish snagging and allow archery and crossbow equipment for taking of certain sportfish.

Economic Impact Summary: The proposed amendments are not anticipated to have any appreciable negative economic impact on the department, other agencies, small businesses or the public.

**K.A.R. 115-7-3.** This permanent regulation establishes requirements for the taking of bait fish or minnows. The proposed amendments would allow the take of gizzard shad larger than 12 inches in total length.

Economic Impact Summary: The proposed amendments are not anticipated to have any appreciable negative economic impact on the department, other agencies, small businesses or the public.

**K.A.R. 115-7-10.** This new permanent regulation establishes special provisions related to fishing. The proposed version of the regulation would prohibit tagging or marking of fish.

Economic Impact Summary: The proposed amendments are not anticipated to have any appreciable negative economic impact on the department, other agencies, small businesses or the public.

**K.A.R. 115-8-6.** This permanent regulation establishes requirements for fishing, fish bait, and seining on department-managed or -owned lands and waters. The proposed amendments would change the minimum acreage of department-managed waters from 500 to 1201 acres related to the use of set lines or trot lines.

Economic Impact Summary: The proposed amendments are not anticipated to have any appreciable negative economic impact on the department, other agencies, small businesses or the public.

**K.A.R. 115-20-7.** This new permanent regulation establishes legal equipment, taking methods, and possession for doves. The proposed version of the regulation is necessary to address legal methods of take due to the expansion of dove hunting seasons for exotic dove species.

Economic Impact Summary: The proposed amendments are not anticipated to have any appreciable negative economic impact on the department, other agencies, small businesses or the public.

**K.A.R. 115-25-6.** This exempt regulation establishes the spring turkey season, bag limit, permits and game tags. The proposed version would increase the number of permits available in Unit 4 by eliminating special youth Unit 4 permits and make all statewide youth turkey permits valid in Unit 4.

Economic Impact Summary: The proposed amendments are not anticipated to have any appreciable negative economic impact on the department, other agencies, small businesses or the public.

**K.A.R. 115-25-14.** This exempt regulation establishes fishing requirements related to creel limit, size limit, possession limit and open season. The proposed version

makes changes to the reference document and the addition or deletion of waters from the special creel limits, length limits or bait restrictions.

Economic Impact Summary: The proposed amendments are not anticipated to have any appreciable negative economic impact on the department, other agencies, small businesses or the public.

**Statewide**

This is a two-phase project to complete inspections of fracture-critical bridges and scour assessments for bridges owned by Local Public Authorities statewide. The state will be divided into three regions, with approximately 7,000 bridges in each region, for the purpose of this project. Region 1 includes those cities and counties within KDOT Districts 1 and 4, Region 2 includes those cities and counties within KDOT Districts 2 and 3, and Region 3 includes those cities and counties within KDOT Districts 5 and 6. Phase 1 is a study phase in which all

##### Opinion No. 2009-07

Written July 22, 2009, to Michael R. Santos, Deputy City Attorney, City of Overland Park, Kansas.

This opinion is in response to your letter dated June 19, 2009, requesting an opinion from the Kansas Governmental Ethics Commission concerning the local level conflict of interest laws, K.S.A. 75-4301 *et seq.* We note at the outset that the Commission's jurisdiction concerning your question is limited to the application of K.S.A. 75-4301 *et seq.*, and whether some other statutory system, common law theory or agency rule or regulation applies to your inquiry is not covered by this opinion.

##### Factual Statement:

You request this opinion in your capacity as Deputy City Attorney for Overland Park on behalf of Overland Park City Councilmember David White. On May 14, 2009, Councilmember White attended an Overland Park Convention and Visitor's Bureau National Tourism Week luncheon. A thirty-five dollar registration fee for his attendance was paid for by the City of Overland Park, Kansas. As in past years, the Overland Park Convention and Visitor's Bureau conducted a random drawing for a door prize donated by Midwest Airlines and Agenda: Kansas City. The prize consists of two round-trip tickets anywhere in the United States that Midwest Airlines flies and transportation to and from the airport provided by Agenda: Kansas City. Midwest Airlines estimated that the "trade" value of the airline tickets is \$350 per ticket; however, the actual value of the tickets is tied to the destination and the dates that the travel would actually oc-

cur. The value of the transportation to and from the airport is estimated at \$160. The luncheon attendees were not asked whether they wanted to participate in the door prize drawing. Through the process of randomly selecting attendee names from a container, it was determined that Councilmember White had won the door prize.

The Overland Park Convention and Visitor's Bureau is a not-for-profit organization that contracts with the City of Overland Park to provide convention and tourism services to the City. Pursuant to its contractual relationship with the Bureau, the City approves the Bureau's annual budget and funds the Bureau's budget from collected transient guest tax funds in accordance with and as authorized by applicable City ordinances, resolutions and other documents. Two members of the Overland Park City Council serve as members of the Overland Park Convention and Visitors Bureau. Councilmember White is not currently a member of the Overland Park Convention and Visitor's Bureau.

##### Questions:

(1) Pursuant to the conflict of interest laws applicable to local government or any other law, is Councilmember White prohibited from accepting the door prize he won at the Overland Park Convention and Visitor's Bureau luncheon?

(2) Pursuant to the conflict of interest laws applicable to local governments, would acceptance of the door prize result in Councilmember White having a "substantial interest" in the Overland Park Convention and Visitor's Bureau, Midwest Airlines and/or Agenda: Kansas City?

(3) The Governing Body of the City of Overland Park approves the budget for the Overland Park Convention and Visitor's Bureau. As a governing body member, if Councilmember White has a substantial interest in the Overland Park Convention and Visitor's Bureau, would he be in violation of K.S.A. 75-4301 *et seq.* by voting on the annual budget for the Overland Park Convention and Visitor's Bureau?

(4) If Councilmember White has a substantial interest in Midwest Airlines or Agenda: Kansas City, would he be in violation of the legal requirements of K.S.A. 75-4301 *et seq.* by making or participating in a contract between the City of Overland Park and Midwest Airlines or between the City of Overland Park and Agenda: Kansas City?

(5) If Councilmember White has a substantial interest in Midwest Airlines or Agenda: Kansas City, would he be in violation of K.S.A. 75-4301 *et seq.* by participating as a member of the Overland Park Governing Body in discussions and/or voting on matters relating to either Midwest Airlines or Agenda: Kansas City?

(6) Are there other legal concerns that Councilmember White should consider regarding his winning and/or accepting the aforementioned door prize?

##### Opinion:

The Commission first notes conflict of interest laws applicable to local government do not prohibit Councilmember White from accepting the door prize. The Commission cannot opine on whether acceptance of the door prize is prohibited by any other laws as the Commission does not opine on matters outside its jurisdiction.



In answer to your second question, the Overland Park Convention and Visitor's Bureau was merely the host of the luncheon and a conduit for the prize; therefore, Councilmember White would have no "substantial interest" in the Bureau.

K.S.A. 75-4301a (a) (3) provides in part, "If an individual or an individual's spouse, either individually or collectively, has received in the preceding 12 months, without reasonable and valuable consideration, goods and services having an aggregate value of \$500 or more from a business or combination of businesses, the individual has a substantial interest in that business or combination of businesses."

You state that the value of the transportation provided by Agenda: Kansas City is \$160 and thus would not reach the threshold for a substantial interest as its value is less than \$500. However, it is likely that the value of the prize from Midwest Airlines will be \$500 or more, thereby creating a substantial interest under K.S.A. 75-4301a (a) (3). If that is the case, Councilmember White would be required to file a Statement of Substantial Interests under K.S.A. 75-4301a *et seq.*

Since Councilmember White does not have a substantial interest in the Overland Park Convention and Visitor's Bureau or Agenda: Kansas City, the Commission will only consider Midwest Airlines in responding to questions 4 and 5.

You ask whether Councilmember White can make or participate in the making of a contract with Midwest Airlines if a substantial interest exists. K.S.A. 75-4304 prohibits a local official from participating in his capacity as a local official in the making of contracts in which that official has a substantial interest. It states in pertinent part:

(a) No local governmental officer or employee shall, in the capacity of such an officer or employee, make or participate in the making of a contract with any person or business by which the officer or employee is employed or in whose business the officer or employee has a substantial interest.

...

(c) A local governmental officer or employee does not make or participate in the making of a contract if the officer or employee abstains from any action in regard to the contract.

Thus, Councilmember White could not participate in the making of a contract between the City of Overland Park and Midwest Airlines if he has a substantial interest in Midwest Airlines.

As to discussion and/or voting on other matters relating to Midwest Airlines, pursuant to K.S.A. 75-4305, if Councilmember White files a Statement of Substantial Interests disclosing his substantial interest in Midwest Airlines, he may then participate and vote on ordinances or other matters related to Midwest Airlines. *See* Advisory Opinions 2008-11, 2003-24, 1999-05 and 1999-51.

As to your final question, the Kansas Governmental Ethics Commission can only opine on legal matters that fall under its jurisdiction.

#### Article 11.—MISCELLANEOUS PROVISIONS

**71-11-1. Practice of dentistry.** Each nonlicensed person who provides any service or procedure meeting either of the following conditions shall be deemed to be practicing dentistry, unless the person provides the service or procedure under the direct supervision of a dentist licensed and practicing in Kansas:

(a) Alters the color or physical condition of natural, restored, or prosthetic teeth; or

(b) requires the positioning and adjustment of equipment or appliances for the purpose of altering the color or physical condition of natural, restored, or prosthetic teeth. (Authorized by K.S.A. 74-1406(l); implementing K.S.A. 65-1422; effective Aug. 21, 2009.)

#### Article 3.—DUTIES OF SPONSORS OF TEMPORARY LICENCEES

**67-3-5. Supervising sponsor.** (a) "Supervising sponsor" shall mean the person who supervises a temporary licensee pursuant to K.S.A. 74-5812(d) and amendments thereto.

(b) In addition to the requirement pursuant to K.S.A. 74-5812(d) and amendments thereto that a temporary licensee be under the supervision of a person who holds a valid license, the supervising sponsor shall meet the following requirements:

(1) Have a license that is in good standing with the board, which shall mean that the license is not suspended or subject to any condition or limitation ordered by the board, whether by a consent agreement or a final order of the board; and

(2) have been licensed to engage in the practice of fitting and dispensing hearing instruments for at least five years immediately preceding the date on which supervision begins.
