A public hearing will be conducted at 10 a.m. Tuesday, February 9, at the office of the Kansas State Board of Healing Arts, 235 S. Topeka Blvd., Topeka, to consider the adoption of one proposed amended rule and regulation, 100-73-2, pertaining to the initial application for the licensure of radiologic technologists.

This 60-day notice of the public hearing shall constitute a public comment period for the purpose of receiving written public comments on the above-referenced rule and regulation. A summary of the proposed amended rule and regulation to be considered at the hearing and the economic impact follows:

K.A.R. 100-73-2. Application. This regulation establishes items that are included on the initial application for licensure and identifies the questions and materials that the applicant must complete when filling out the application for licensure as a radiologic technologist though the Kansas State Board of Healing Arts.

The amendment to K.A.R. 100-73-2 will not result in any economic impact to the public or licensees.

The regulation is not mandated by any federal law. No other methods were considered.

(c) Approximately 1,200,000 tickets shall be ordered initially for this pull tab game which shall be packaged in packs of 300 tickets each. The ticket numbers in each pack in this game shall start with 000 and end with 299. Additional ticket orders shall have the same prize structure, the same number of prizes per pool of 300,000 tickets, and the same odds as were contained in the initial ticket order.

(d) The play symbols for this game are as follows:

(e) For this game, three play symbols shall appear under each of four tabs on the back of each ticket. (f) All tabs on the back of each ticket are to be pulled open. For each combination of three play symbols matching the legend on the front of the ticket, the player wins the prize amount corresponding to each combination as shown in (h) below. All winning combinations shall be within a single window in a horizontal line.

Article 15.—RAFFLE GAMES

111-15-1. Name of the game; rules and regulations. The Kansas lottery shall conduct a lotto game entitled "Holiday Millionaire Raffle" beginning on or about October 18, 2009, for a drawing to be conducted on or about December 31, 2009.

The rules and regulations for the "Holiday Millionaire Raffle" game are contained in K.A.R. 111-15-1 through 111-15-10, and applicable generic rules are contained in K.A.R. 111-6-1 *et seq.* (Authorized by and implementing K.S.A. 74-8710; effective, T-111-10-8-09, Sept. 9, 2009.)

111-15-2. Definitions. The following definitions shall apply to the "Holiday Millionaire Raffle" game:

(a) "Available ticket(s)" or "ticket(s) available for sale" means one or any number of tickets from one through 150,000 that is available to sell during the "Holiday Millionaire Raffle" game.

(b) "Check-A-Ticket Machine" means an electronic machine operated by the Kansas lottery for the purpose of determining whether or not an online ticket is a winning ticket.

(c) "Computer pick" or "quick pick" means the selection of a six-digit number by the computer system, which appears on a ticket and is played by a player in the game. This is the only type of ticket sold by a retailer for the game.

(d) "Drawing" means the formal process of selecting winning numbers which determine the number of winners for each prize level of the game.

(e) "Electronic drawing machine" or "random number generator" means the electronic device approved by the executive director of the Kansas lottery to electronically select the winning numbers for this drawing.

(f) "Game ticket" or "ticket" means a computer generated ticket issued by a terminal to a person as a receipt for the ticket a person has purchased.

(g) "Online lottery game" means a lottery game connected by telephone lines, satellite, radio, or other similar communication methodology, owned or controlled by the lottery, to a central computer in which each player selects numbers out of a larger predetermined set or sets of numbers.

(h) "Order drawn" means the sequential order in which a "WINNING" ticket or tickets are selected during the drawing process.

(i) "Pari-mutuel prize" means all prizes that are advertised to be paid by a single cash payment as outlined in these rules, shall be paid on a pari-mutuel basis as a cash lump sum payment of the total cash held for all tickets sold in this game.

(j) "Retailer" or "agent" means a person or entity authorized by the Kansas lottery to sell lottery tickets.

(k) "Serial number" means the identifying number printed on the top line of the ticket.

(l) "Set Prize" means all prizes that are advertised to be paid by a single cash payment as outlined in these rules, and which will be equal to the prize amount established by these rules for the prize level.

(m) "Terminal" means a device authorized by a party lottery to function in an on-line, interactive mode with (continued) the lottery's computer system for the purpose of issuing lottery tickets and entering, receiving and processing lottery transactions, including purchases, validating tickets and transmitting reports.

(n) "Ticket Number" means the six-digit number that was selected by the computer, which appears on the face of the ticket and is identified on the ticket as such.

(o) "Validation" or "validate" means the process of determining whether a ticket presented for a prize is a winning ticket.

(p) "Winning number" or "winning numbers" means a six-digit number which is selected by an electronic drawing machine to be a winner of a prize in this drawing.

(q) "Winning ticket" or "winning tickets" means a raffle ticket which was available for sale for this game where the ticket number matches a winning number drawn for the raffle, in exact order, reading from left to right. (Authorized by and implementing K.S.A. 74-8710; effective, T-111-10-8-09, Sept. 9, 2009.)

111-15-3. Game description; retail sale of tickets. (a) "Holiday Millionaire Raffle" is a raffle drawing which offers a total of 150,000 online tickets available for sale. Each ticket shall bear a "TICKET NUMBER" on the face of the ticket. On a date specified in these rules, an electronic drawing machine, which has been approved by the executive director of the Kansas lottery, shall randomly select a total of 506 "WINNING NUMBERS." Each "WINNING NUMBER" consists of a six-digit number as it appears in exact order reading from left to right. A player wins by exactly matching his or her "TICKET NUMBER" to a "WINNING NUMBER" that was selected in the drawing. The first "WINNING NUMBER" selected during the drawing process shall be the grand prize winner. The second, third, fourth, fifth, and sixth "WINNING NUMBERS" selected during the drawing process shall be the second prize winners. The next 500 "WINNING NUMBERS" selected during the drawing process, which shall be drawn in the order of the seventh (7th) "WIN-NING NUMBER" through the five-hundred sixth (506th) "WINNING NUMBER," shall be the third prize winners. If 14,000 of the 150,000 tickets that are available for sale are sold, all prizes shall be paid as a cash lump sum payment. If less than 145,000 tickets available for sale are sold, all prizes shall be paid on a pari-mutuel basis as a cash lump sum payment of the total cash held for all tickets sold in this game. To play the "Holiday Millionaire Raffle," a player shall purchase a "Holiday Millionaire Raffle" ticket which bears a ticket number on the face of the ticket.

(b) A "Holiday Millionaire Raffle" ticket shall sell for \$20 (twenty) dollars.

(c) Tickets shall not be sold to any person under the age of 18 years. Each retailer may require a person purchasing tickets to produce proof of age.

(d) Each ticket shall be purchased from a terminal operated by a retailer.

(e) All tickets sold by a retailer shall be a "computer pick" or "quick pick" ticket.

(f) A validated ticket shall be the only proof of a game play. The only method of claiming a prize or prizes shall

be the submission of the winning ticket to and receipt of the ticket by the lottery or its authorized agent.

(g) The only guaranteed methods of win checking a ticket to determine whether the ticket bears a winning number shall be through the Kansas lottery check-a-ticket machines, or submission of a ticket to the Kansas lottery or an authorized retail agent.

(h) A ticket shall not be voided or cancelled by returning the ticket to the selling retailer, including tickets that are printed in error.

(i) There shall be a total of 150,000 available tickets for sale.

(j) Ticket sales will begin at the start of the business day central time on or about October 18, 2009.

(k) Ticket sales will end on or about the close of business day central time on December 30, 2009, or whenever all 150,000 tickets that are available for sale are sold, whichever comes first.

(l) The game will close on or about 4:30 a.m. on December 31, 2009.

(m) The drawing shall be conducted on or about December 31, 2009, before noon central time, at a secure location as determined by the executive director, after the game is closed and the external auditor has verified that the game is closed, under conditions and procedures promulgated by the executive director of the lottery.

(n) Each player shall have the sole responsibility for verifying the accuracy and condition of the data printed on the ticket. The purchase of a ticket is done at the player's own risk through the online retailer who is deemed to be acting on behalf of the player in entering the play or plays.

(o) If, for any reason, a player's bet is not accepted, the liability of the Kansas lottery or its agents shall be limited to a refund of the amount of the ticket purchase price.

(p) Winning ticket numbers shall be made available to the public on or about noon, December 31, 2009. (Authorized by K.S.A. 74-8710; implementing K.S.A. 74-8710 and 74-8718; effective, T-111-10-8-09, Sept. 9, 2009.)

111-15-4. Prize pool. (a) The prize pool in the lottery prize payment fund for all prize categories shall consist of fifty percent (50%) of total net sales for this drawing. Net sales shall be total sales, less any tickets excluded as being unavailable for sale.

(b) Any moneys remaining in the prize pool following this drawing, except unclaimed prizes, shall be placed in the general prize reserve pool for subsequent lottery games. (Authorized by K.S.A. 74-8710; implementing K.S.A. 74-8710 and K.S.A. 74-8731; effective, T-111-10-08-09, Sept. 9, 2009.)

111-15-5. Expected prize payout. (a) In the event 145,000 or more of the tickets available for sale in this raffle game are sold, all prizes awarded shall be paid as set cash prizes, with the following expected approximate prize payout percentages:

(b) In the event less than 145,000 tickets available for sale in this raffle game are sold, all prizes awarded as described in subsection (a) above shall be paid as parimutuel prizes, as a cash lump sum payment of the total cash held for all tickets sold in this game. In that instance, the money available from the funding sources for this game shall be divided among the winning tickets/plays in proportion to their respective prize percentages. Any pari-mutuel prizes awarded shall be calculated rounding down to the nearest dollar. Monies left over after prizes have been rounded down shall be applied to the general prize reserve pool for subsequent lottery games. (Authorized by and implementing K.S.A. 74-8710; effective, T-111-10-8-09, Sept. 9, 2009.)

111-15-6. Probability of winning. The following table sets forth the probability of winning and the probable distribution of winners in and among each prize category based upon selling the entire number of tickets available for sale for this game.

111-15-7. Prize payments. (a) Low tier prizes of \$599 or less may be paid at retailer locations pursuant to K.A.R. 111-6-8 and K.A.R. 111-15-8.

(b) The holder of a winning ticket may win only one prize per ticket and shall be entitled only to the prize won by the ticket number which matches the winning number in the raffle drawing.

(c) All prizes must be claimed within 365 days of the day of the drawing in which the prize was won. (Authorized by K.S.A. 74-8710; implementing K.S.A. 74-8710 and 74-8731; effective, T-111-10-8-09, Sept. 9, 2009.)

111-15-8. Claiming prizes; procedure and time period. (a) Prior to the payment of any prize, each ticket shall be validated by the retailer or lottery office pursuant to this act.

(b) The procedures for payment of a "Holiday Millionaire Raffle" prize on any single game ticket of \$599 or less are as follows:

(1) The claimant of a ticket purchased in Kansas may present the ticket to any Kansas lottery online retailer.

Upon validation of the ticket, the retailer shall immediately make payment for the prize to the claimant. If the retailer cannot validate the ticket, the claimant shall fill out a claim form provided by the retailer and personally present or mail the completed form, together with the ticket, to any office of the Kansas lottery. If the ticket is validated, then payment shall be made to the claimant by mail.

(2) The claimant may bring the ticket to any office of the Kansas lottery during the hours that the office is open to the public for business. Upon validation of the ticket, and completion of a claim form, payment shall be processed for the claimant.

(3) The claimant may mail the ticket with a completed claim form in any envelope to any office of the Kansas lottery. Claim forms may be obtained from any lottery retailer or any office of the Kansas lottery. Upon receipt of the ticket and completed claim form and validation of the ticket, payment shall be processed for the claimant.

If any evidence of alteration, mutilation, tear, or other ambiguity appears on the ticket, the retailer shall not make direct payment of a prize. The claimant shall submit a claim form with the ticket to the lottery.

(c) The procedure for the payment of a "Holiday Millionaire Raffle" prize on any single game ticket which totals \$600.00 or more shall be as follows:

(1) The claimant may bring the signed ticket to any office of the Kansas lottery during the hours that the office is open to the public for business. Upon validation of the ticket and completion of a claim form, payment shall be processed for the claimant.

(2) The claimant may mail the ticket with a completed claim form to any office of the Kansas lottery. Claim forms may be obtained from any lottery retailer or any office of the Kansas lottery. Upon receipt of the ticket and completed claim form and validation of the ticket, payment shall be processed for the claimant.

(d) Although tickets and claim forms may be presented or mailed to any Kansas lottery office, such prizes may only be paid by lottery headquarters.

(e) All prizes shall be claimed within 365 days of the drawing in which the prize was won. Any prize or prizes not claimed within the time specified shall be forfeited. If a prize is claimed by mail, the ticket and claim form must actually be received by the lottery within the claim period. (Authorized by K.S.A. Supp. 74-8710; implementing K.S.A. Supp. 74-8710 and 74-8720; effective, T-111-10-8-09, Sept. 9, 2009.)

111-15-9. Ticket validation requirements. (a) To be a valid ticket and eligible to receive a prize, a Kansas lottery raffle ticket shall satisfy all the requirements established by the Kansas lottery for validation of winning tickets sold through its online system.

(b) Ticket eligibility requirements include, but are not limited to:

(1) The numbers and date printed on the ticket shall correspond to the lottery's central system.

(2) The ticket shall be intact.

(3) The ticket may not be mutilated, altered, reconstituted, or tampered with.

(continued)

(4) The ticket may not be counterfeit or be a duplicate, facsimile, or facsimile of another ticket.

(5) The ticket shall have been issued through an authorized Kansas lottery retailer in an authorized manner.

(6) The ticket may not have been stolen or cancelled.

(7) The ticket data shall have been recorded on the central computer system prior to the drawing and the computer record shall match the ticket data in every respect.

(8) The ticket shall pass other confidential security checks performed by the Kansas lottery.

(c) Any question or dispute over the legitimacy or validation of any ticket or drawing in the game shall be determined by the executive director in his sole discretion.

(d) The Kansas lottery shall not be responsible for tickets which are altered in any manner.

(e) If a ticket is invalidated for any reason, the lottery's liability shall be limited to cost of a replacement ticket. (Authorized by and implementing K.S.A. Supp. 74-8710; effective, T-111-10-8-09, Sept. 9, 2009.)

111-15-10. Ticket responsibility. (a) Until such time as a signature, mark or name is placed on the back of a ticket in the area designated for a signature, mark or

name, a ticket shall be owned by the holder of the ticket. When a signature, mark or name is placed on a ticket in the place designated, the person whose signature, mark or name appears in that area shall be the owner of the ticket and shall be entitled to any prize attributable thereto.

(b) If the signature of more than one person appears on the back of the ticket in the designated place, the lottery shall make payment to the person presenting the ticket whose signature appears on both the ticket and the winner claim form. If all persons whose signatures appear in the appropriate space cannot identify one person to whom payment should be made, the lottery shall keep the prize until a determination of entitlement is made by the parties. In no event shall more than one person be entitled to a particular prize.

(c) The Kansas lottery shall not be responsible for lost or stolen tickets. (Authorized by K.S.A. 74-8710; implementing K.S.A. 74-8710 and 74-8720; effective, T-111-10-8-09, Sept. 9, 2009.)
