Notice of Hearing

Kansas Rehabilitation Services (KRS) invites individuals and organizations interested in employment services for people with disabilities to provide input on its State Plan Annual Update for Vocational Rehabilitation and Supported Employment Services. This update will be effective October 1, 2011.

To provide an opportunity for stakeholder input, KRS will conduct a public hearing on this update from 10:30 a.m. to noon Friday, June 3. The hearing will be an interactive Web cast using technology to connect people in 12 Kansas communities. Participants in each location will be able to share their comments or questions, which will be broadcast live to all locations.

During the meeting, participants will be asked for their input on several key questions:

- Are there new or emerging opportunities to collaborate with local organizations to improve employment opportunities for people with disabilities?
- Are there any gaps where employment-related services for people with disabilities need to be improved or developed? What are the barriers to the development of these services?
- Are there suggestions on how KRS can improve services and employment outcomes for persons with significant disabilities?
- Are there populations who are currently unserved or underserved by KRS? Are there suggestions for how KRS could improve access to services for these individuals?

Participants also will be asked to comment on the KRS performance related to its strategic goals. The goals are:

- Kansans with disabilities will achieve quality, competitive, integrated employment and self-sufficiency.
- KRS, its consumers, providers and partners will be accountable for the achievement of employment and the effective use of resources.
- KRS will emphasize the employment potential of students with disabilities and improve the outreach and outcomes for transition-aged students.
- KRS will emphasize meaningful involvement of people with disabilities, public/private partners, employers and other stakeholders in KRS programs, services and activities.

KRS Director Michael Donnelly will originate the Web cast from the Kansas Department of Social and Rehabilitation Services Learning Center, 2nd and MacVicar, Topeka.

House Bills

HB 2408, AN ACT concerning agritourism; transferring agritourism promotions from the department of commerce to the department of agriculture; amending K.S.A. 2010 Supp. 74-50,167 and 74-50,168 and repealing the existing sections; also repealing K.S.A. 2010 Supp. 74-50,173, by Committee on Appropriations.

HB 2409, AN ACT concerning the issuance of bonds; relating to the national bio and agro defense facility; providing for certain powers, duties and functions for the Kansas development finance authority and the department of administration; amending K.S.A. 2010 Supp. 74-8963 and repealing the existing section, by Committee on Appropriations.

Notice of Intent to Request Release of Funds

On or about May 18, 2011, the Kansas Department of Health and Environment will submit a request to the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) for the release of Lead-Based Paint Hazard Control Grant Program, authorized by Sec. 1011 of the Residential Lead-Based Paint Hazard Reduction Act of 1992 (Title X of the Housing and Community Development Act of 1992), Public Law 102-550, and funded through the Consolidated Appropriations Act of 2010, Public Law 111-117, for the following project: Safe At Home Wichita, for the purpose of lead hazard control intervention in housing units within Sedgwick County, the Unified Government of Wyandotte County, the city of Topeka and cities with EBL children throughout the state of Kansas. KDHE will complete 300 risk assessments to identify lead-based paint hazards; perform lead blood testing on children prior to lead hazard control work; complete lead hazard control work, interim controls and hazard abatement on 280 homes; temporarily relocate families during hazard control activities; provide training for lead abatement worker and lead abatement supervisors; and provide training on lead-safe maintenance practices for residents and others working in low-income housing.

The program targets families that have incomes of 80 percent of the area's medium income; have a house that was built before 1978; and have a child that lives in the house that is six years of age or younger, or a child that is six years or younger that visits the house at least 10 hours a week. The grant period is 36 months, from March 2011 until February 2014. The major partners are the city of Wichita, the Unified Government of Wyandotte County and the city of Topeka. The Kansas Department of Health and Environment is requesting the release of \$3,100,000 of federal assistance, as well as \$796,978 in matching contributions.

The proposed hazard control activities to be funded under these programs are categorically excluded from the National Environmental Policy Act requirements, but subject to compliance with some of the environmental laws and authorities listed at 24 CFR § 58.5. In accordance with 24 CFR § 58.5, a tiered review process has been structured, whereby some environmental laws and authorities have been reviewed and studied for the intended target areas listed above. Other applicable environmental laws and authorities will be complied with when individual projects are ripe for review.

Specifically, the target areas have been studied and are in compliance with the following laws and authorities that have been established in this Tier 1 review: Floodplain Management, Coastal Barriers Resource Act and Coastal Zone Management Act. In the Tiered 2 review, compliance with the following environmental laws and authorities will take place for proposed projects funded under the programs listed above: Historic Preservation, National Flood Insurance Program requirements, Explosive & Flammable Operations, and toxics/hazardous ma-

terials. Should individual aggregate projects exceed the threshold for categorical exclusion detailed at 24 CFR § 58.35(a), an Environmental Assessment will be completed and a separate Finding of No Significant Impact and Request for Release of Funds published. Copies of the compliance documentation worksheet are available at the address below.

An Environmental Review Record (ERR) that documents the environmental determinations for this project and more fully describes the tiered review process cited above is on file at Kansas Department of Health and Environment, 1000 S.W. Jackson, Suite 330, Topeka, 66612, and can be examined or copied weekdays (8 a.m. to 5 p.m.).

Public Comments

Any individual, group, or agency may submit written comments on the ERR to the Kansas Department of Health and Environment, Healthy Homes and Lead Prevention Program, at the address above. All comments received by May 17 will be considered by the Kansas Department of Health and Environment prior to authorizing submission of a Request for Release of Funds and Environmental Certification to HUD.

Release of Funds

The Kansas Department of Health and Environment certifies to HUD that Robert Moser, M.D., in his official capacity as secretary of the Kansas Department of Health and Environment, consents to accept the jurisdiction of the federal courts if an action is brought to enforce responsibilities in relation to the environmental review process and that these responsibilities have been satisfied. HUD's approval of the certification satisfies its responsibilities under NEPA and related laws and authorities, and allows the Kansas Department of Health and Environment to utilize federal funds and implement the program.

Objections to Release of Funds

HUD will consider objections to its release of funds and the Kansas Department of Health and Environment certification for a period of 15 days following either the anticipated submission date of May 18, 2011, or HUD's actual receipt of the request only if the objections are on one of the following basis: (a) that the certification was not executed by the certifying officer of the Kansas Department of Health and Environment; (b) the Kansas Department of Health and Environment has omitted a step or failed to make a decision or finding required by HUD regulations at 24 CFR Part 58; (c) the Kansas Department of Health and Environment has committed funds or incurred cost not authorized by 24 CFR Part 58 before approval of a release of funds by HUD; or (d) another federal agency acting pursuant to 40 CFR Part 1504 has submitted a written finding that the project is unsatisfactory from the standpoint of environmental quality. Article 10.—FIREFIGHTER'S RELIEF FUND TAX

40-10-16. Firefighters relief act; fund allocation.

(a) The annual redetermination allocation shall be calculated using a formula based on the population and the assessed tangible property valuation of the area served by the association that requests redetermination in relation to the population and the assessed tangible property valuation of the state. The assessed tangible property valuation of the area served by the association and the state to be used in the formula shall be as reported by the Kansas department of revenue's statistical report of property assessment and taxation for the year during which redetermination is requested. The populations of the area served by the association and the state to be used in the formula shall be those population totals certified by the Kansas secretary of state for the year during which redetermination is requested.

(b) The following formula shall be used to calculate a new base allocation percentage for the association that requests redetermination:

(1) The assessed tangible property valuation of the area served by the association shall be divided by the assessed tangible property valuation of the state, and the quotient shall be divided by two to form one-half of the new base allocation percentage.

(2) The population of the area served by the association shall be divided by the population of the state, and the

quotient shall be divided by two to form the second half of the new base allocation percentage.

(3) The sum of the amounts calculated in paragraphs (b)(1) and (2) shall be the new base allocation percentage for the association.

(c) The next distribution of firefighters relief funds following a redetermination shall be computed as follows:

(1) The new base allocation percentage for each association that was redetermined shall be added to the new base allocation percentage of any associations eligible for the distribution that were new or merged since the last distribution and the prior year's allocation percentage for all other active associations.

(2) The sum computed in paragraph (c)(1) shall be divided into 100.

(3) The quotient computed in paragraph (c)(2) shall be multiplied by each new base allocation percentage for associations that were redetermined, new, or merged in the prior year and each prior year's allocation percentage for other associations to receive distributions so that the total of all percentages of associations eligible for the distribution equals 100.

(d) The allocation formula prescribed by this regulation shall also be used when distributions are determined for new or merged associations. Any association that has failed to qualify for funds for two consecutive years may resume participation as a new association by submitting the information required by K.A.R. 40-10-2(d) and K.S.A. 40-1706(a), and amendments thereto. (Authorized by K.S.A. 40-1707(g); implementing K.S.A. 2010 Supp. 40-1706; effective May 27, 2011.)

Executive Order 11-08

Conditional and Temporary Relief from Motor Carrier Rules and Regulations

WHEREAS, K.S.A. 48-925(b) provides that the Governor may issue orders and proclamations which shall have the force and effect of law under subsection (b) of K.S.A. 48-924; and

WHEREAS, on the 6th day of April, 2011, I declared a state of local emergency for Shawnee County, as a result of a train derailment in the Burlington Northern Santa Fe Railroad Yard in Topeka; and,

WHEREAS, this disaster has caused or threatens to cause an emergency as defined in 49 C.F.R. 390.5, as adopted by K.A.R. 82-4-3f and which has or threatens to interrupt the delivery of essential services or essential supplies or otherwise immediately threatens physical harm or injury to persons, the public welfare and/or substantial damage to property; and

WHEREAS, conditions exist which require the operation of motor carriers and drivers of commercial motor vehicles for the purposes of providing direct assistance to supplement State and local efforts in the restoration of

services and relief in the affected area(s) of the State of Kansas.

NOW, THEREFORE, pursuant to the authority vested in me as Governor of the State of Kansas, I hereby declare there is a state of local emergency existing in the above-listed counties, and as a result, it is necessary to expedite all efforts of restoration of services and relief. In order to accommodate this need and to provide assistance to the citizens of Kansas in this emergency situation, I hereby order the following:

1. This declaration only applies to those motor carriers and persons operating commercial motor vehicles and directly participating in the restoration and relief efforts; and
2. in accordance with Title 49 C.F.R. § 390.23, the requirements contained in the Federal Motor Carrier Safety Regulations, Title 49 C.F.R. Parts 390-399 are hereby suspended through the duration of the motor carrier's assistance in the disaster relief effort not to exceed a period of five (5) days from the date of the initial declaration unless the order is rescinded or expanded by executive order or concurrent resolution of the legislature; and
3. all other applicable state and federal regulations shall apply to include but not limited to: Title 49 C.F.R. Part 382, Controlled Substances and Alcohol Use and Testing; the Kansas Motor Vehicle Driver's License Act, K.S.A. 8-234 et. seq. and Title 49 C.F.R. Part 383 Commercial Driver's License Standards as adopted by the Kansas Uniform Commercial Drivers' License Act, K.S.A. 8-2,125 et. seq., the federal Minimum Levels of Financial Responsibility (insurance requirements) Title 49 C.F.R. Part 387 as adopted by K.A.R. 82-4-3n and state insurance requirements as provided in K.A.R. 82-4-23; and, adherence to the regulations governing the Transportation of Hazardous Materials as provided Title 49 C.F.R. 397 and adopted by K.A.R. 82-4-3k and Parts: 107, 171-173, 177, 178 and 180 as adopted by K.A.R.82-4-20; and
4. the registration and fuel tax permits as enforced by the Kansas Department of Revenue are temporarily suspended; and
5. the licensing, certification and permitting rules and regulations as required by the Kansas Corporation Commission are temporarily suspended; and
6. participating motor carriers must still obtain the requisite over dimension/overweight permits as required by the Kansas Department of Transportation prior to operating; however, the fees associated with these permits are temporarily waived. Additionally, motor carriers and persons participating in restoration and recovery efforts will receive priority service and may operate during low visibility, night, holiday and curfew hours if the carriers and/or driver use clearance lights and/or escort vehicles.

This document shall be filed with the Secretary of State as Executive Order No. 11-08 and shall become effective immediately.
