Executive Order 12-11

WHEREAS, K.S.A. 48-925(b) provides that the Governor may issue orders and proclamations which shall have the force and effect of law under subsection (b) of K.S.A. 48-924; and

WHEREAS, Drought conditions exist which require the operation of motor carriers and drivers of commercial motor vehicles for the purposes of providing direct assistance for relief efforts in the of State of Kansas; and

WHEREAS, The Kansas Emergency Management Act (K.S.A. 48-924 *et seq.*) states that the Governor shall be responsible for meeting the dangers to the state and its people from disasters, including drought; and

WHEREAS, Previous executive orders have been issued to aid in recovery efforts, Executive Order 12-11 shall supersede Executive Order 12-06.

NOW, THEREFORE, pursuant to the authority vested in me as Governor of the State of Kansas, I hereby acknowledge a state of emergency exists in Kansas and declare it necessary to assist and expedite all disaster recovery efforts. In order to accommodate this need and to provide assistance to the citizens of Kansas in this emergency situation, I hereby order the following:

1. This declaration applies to motor carriers hauling hay to livestock in drought stricken areas;
2. The registration and fuel tax permits as enforced by the Kansas Department of Revenue are temporarily suspended; and

3. The licensing, certification and permitting rules and regulations as required by the Kansas Corporation Commission are temporarily suspended; and
4. Participating motor carriers shall not operate during the period beginning 30 minutes after sunset and ending 30 minutes before sunrise, and shall comply with the flags, signs and lighting requirements applicable to overwidth vehicles as set forth in 8-1902; and
5. Participating motor carriers are not allowed to drive during inclement weather conditions. *Oversize or overweight loads shall not be transported when visibility is less than one-half mile, or when conditions of moderate to heavy rain, sleet, snow, fog, or smoke exist, or when highway surfaces are slippery due to ice, packed snow, or rain.*
6. Participating motor carriers are limited to a load that does not exceed 12 feet in width and does not exceed a height of 14 feet, six inches.

FURTHER, I direct that this executive order shall become effective immediately and shall continue in effect until rescinded or until drought conditions shall abate and drought emergency disaster declarations shall be lifted.

This document shall be filed with the Secretary of State as Executive Order No. 12-11 and shall become effective immediately.

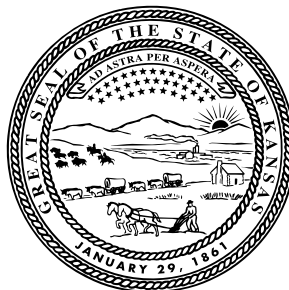

Notice of Hearing on Proposed Administrative Regulations

The Kansas Department of Health and Environment, Division of Environment, Bureau of Air, will conduct a public hearing at 10 a.m. Thursday, November 1, in the Flint Hills Conference Room, third floor, Curtis State Office Building, 1000 S.W. Jackson, Topeka, to consider the adoption of proposed amended air quality regulations K.A.R. 28-19-735, 28-19-750 and 28-19-750a to incorporate changes to the federal regulations incorporated therein. A summary of the proposed regulations and the estimated economic impact and environmental benefit follows:

Summary of Regulations:

K.A.R. 28-19-735. The proposed amendments will adopt by reference the provisions of 40 C.F.R. Part 61, National Emission Standards for Hazardous Air Pollutants (NESHAP), through July 1, 2010. The Part 61 hazardous air pollutant (HAP) regulations establish standards to limit the emissions of specific HAPs. The state's authority currently exists for the Part 61 rules promulgated through June 30, 2008. This proposed regulation is necessary to maintain the state's authority under existing delegation agreements to administer federal regulations and to ensure Kansas air quality regulations are consistent with federal requirements.

K.A.R. 28-19-750. The proposed amendments will adopt by reference the provisions of 40 C.F.R. Part 63, NESHAP, through July 1, 2010. Prior to the 1990 Clean Air Act Amendments (CAAA), Section 112 of the Clean Air Act directed the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency administrator to identify HAPs for regulation. Under this, a limited number of regulations were developed to address specific compounds originating in certain industries. In the 1990 CAAA, Congress established a list of HAPs for which the administrator was to develop controls. These are now administered under 40 C.F.R. Part 63, which the state implements in 28-19-750. The state's authority currently exists for the 40 C.F.R. Part 63 rules promulgated through June 30, 2008. This proposed regulation is necessary to maintain the state's authority under existing delegation agreements to administer federal regulations and to ensure Kansas air quality regulations are consistent with federal requirements.

K.A.R. 28-19-750a. The proposed amendments will adopt by reference 40 C.F.R. Part 65, Consolidated Federal Air Rule, through July 1, 2010. This federal regulation consolidates different requirements for the Synthetic Organic Chemical Manufacturing Industry (SOCMI) to enable easier compliance for facilities. Currently, the state's authority only exists for the 40 C.F.R. Part 65 rules promulgated through June 30, 2008. This proposed regulation is necessary to maintain the state's authority under existing delegation agreements to administer federal regulations and to ensure Kansas air quality regulations are consistent with federal requirements.

Economic Impact:

The proposed regulations are not anticipated to result in additional costs to KDHE, other state agencies or the private sector because the impacted facilities are already subject to the costs associated with the current federal standards that KDHE is proposing to adopt by reference.

Environmental Benefit:

As part of its adoption of the federal regulations, the EPA undertook scientific studies to determine the health effects of various HAPs. These amendments are necessary to protect public health, to maintain the state's authority under existing delegation agreements to administer the federal regulations, to ensure that the Kansas air quality regulations are current and consistent with the federal requirements, and to eliminate a dual regulatory structure between the EPA and KDHE.

The time period between the publication of this notice and the scheduled hearing constitutes a 60-day public comment period for the purpose of receiving written public comments on the proposed regulatory action. All interested parties may submit written comments prior to 5 p.m. Friday, November 2, to Miles Stotts, KDHE, Bureau of Air, 1000 S.W. Jackson, Suite 310, Topeka, 66612, by fax to 785-296-7455, or by email to mstotts@kdheks.gov. During the hearing, all interested parties will be given a reasonable opportunity to present their comments orally on the proposed regulatory action as well as an opportunity to submit their written comments. In order to give all parties an opportunity to present their comments, it may be necessary to require each participant to limit any oral presentation to an appropriate time frame.

The Kansas Department of Health and Environment, Division of Environment, Bureau of Air, will conduct a public hearing at 10 a.m. Thursday, November 1, in the Flint Hills Conference Room, third floor, Curtis State Office Building, 1000 S.W. Jackson, Topeka, to consider the adoption of proposed amended air quality regulation K.A.R. 28-19-350, prevention of significant deterioration (PSD) of air quality. A summary of the proposed regulation and the estimated economic impact and environmental benefit follows:

Summary of Regulation:

KDHE is proposing to amend **K.A.R. 28-19-350** specifically to implement the revised National Ambient Air Quality Standard (NAAQS) for fine particulate matter (PM_{2.5}), to incorporate the deferral for CO₂ emissions from bioenergy and other biogenic sources under the PSD Program, and to remove language that excludes stayed, remanded or vacated provisions. These proposed amendments update the adoption by reference of 40 C.F.R. §52.21 in K.A.R. 28-19-350 to align the state PSD program with the federal program.

When approved by the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency, the proposed amendments preserve the state's authority under existing delegation agreements to administer federal regulations and to ensure that Kansas air quality regulations are current and consistent with federal requirements. When the proposed amended regulation is adopted, KDHE will submit the regulation to the EPA for approval into the State Implementation Plan (SIP).

Economic Impact:

The proposed regulation does not subject the affected parties, KDHE or other regulatory agencies to additional capital and annual costs of compliance. The EPA expects only marginal cost increases to owners and operators of

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PM_{2.5} sources that become subject to the program (73 FR 28345, May 16, 2008). The EPA determined that these amendments are unlikely to increase significantly the number of New Source Review (NSR) permits that must be issued but may add to the analyses that sources and federal, state and local reviewing authorities must conduct. The regulation changes are expected to increase the burden for KDHE associated with major NSR permitting and emissions tracking, collecting and reviewing monitoring data, determining appropriate best available control technology or lowest achievable emission rate, and/or obtaining offsets.

Environmental Impact:

Numerous major stationary sources in Kansas emit particulate matter into the air. There is a direct correlation between regulation of these emissions and maintenance of Kansas air quality in order to address the significant health impacts of particulate pollution. KA.R. 28-19-350 enables KDHE to continue ongoing air protection activities with respect to preconstruction permitting of major stationary sources.

The time period between the publication of this notice and the scheduled hearing constitutes a 60-day public comment period for the purpose of receiving written public comments on the proposed regulatory action. All interested parties may submit written comments prior to 5 p.m. Friday, November 2, to Miles Stotts, KDHE, Bureau of Air, 1000 S.W. Jackson, Suite 310, Topeka, 66612, by fax to 785-296-7455, or by email to mstotts@kdheks.gov. During the hearing, all interested parties will be given a reasonable opportunity to present their comments orally on the proposed regulatory action as well as an opportunity to submit their written comments. In order to give all parties an opportunity to present their comments, it may be necessary to require each participant to limit any oral presentation to an appropriate time frame.

Permanent Administrative Regulations

Article 46.—CHILD ABUSE AND NEGLECT

30-46-10. Definitions. For the purpose of the child abuse and neglect registry, the following definitions shall apply.

(a) "Abuse" means "physical, mental or emotional abuse" or "sexual abuse," as these two terms are defined in K.S.A. 38-2202 and amendments thereto and as "sexual abuse" is further defined in this regulation, involving a child who resides in Kansas or is found in Kansas, regardless of where the act occurred. The term "abuse" shall include any act that occurred in Kansas, regardless of where the child is found or resides, and shall include any act, behavior, or omission that impairs or endangers a child's social or intellectual functioning.

The term "abuse" may include the following:

(1) Terrorizing a child, by creating a climate of fear or engaging in violent or threatening behavior toward the child or toward others in the child's presence that demonstrates a flagrant disregard for the child;

(2) emotionally abandoning a child, by being psychologically unavailable to the child, demonstrating no attachment to the child, or failing to provide adequate nurturance of the child; and

(3) corrupting a child, by teaching or rewarding the child for unlawful, antisocial, or sexually mature behavior.

(b) "Alleged perpetrator" means the person identified in the initial report or during the investigation as the person suspected of perpetrating an act of abuse or neglect.

(c) "Child" means anyone under the age of 18 or anyone under the age of 21 and in the custody of the secretary pursuant to K.S.A. 38-2255 and amendments thereto.

(d) "Child abuse and neglect registry" means the list of names for individuals identified by the department as substantiated perpetrators.

(e) "Child care facility" has the meaning specified in K.S.A. 65-503 and amendments thereto.

(f) "Department" means the Kansas department for children and families.

(g) "Investigation" means the gathering and assessing of information to determine if a child has been harmed, as defined in K.S.A. 38-2202 and amendments thereto, as the result of abuse or neglect, to identify the individual or individuals responsible, and to determine if the individual or individuals identified should reside, work, or regularly volunteer in a child care facility.

(h) "Neglect" has the meaning specified in K.S.A. 38-2202, and amendments thereto, involving a child who resides in Kansas or is found in Kansas, regardless of where the act or failure to act occurred. This term shall include any act or failure to act that occurred in Kansas, regardless of where the child is found or resides.

(i) "Sexual abuse" has the meaning specified in K.S.A. 38-2202, and amendments thereto, and shall include con-

tact solely between children only if the contact also involves force, intimidation, difference in maturity, or coercion.

(j) "Substantiated perpetrator" and "perpetrator" mean a person who has been validated by the secretary or designee, using clear and convincing evidence, to have committed an act of abuse or neglect, regardless of where the person resides and who is prohibited from residing, working, or volunteering in a child care facility pursuant to K.S.A. 65-516, and amendments thereto. These terms shall replace the term "validated perpetrator." (Authorized by K.S.A. 2011 Supp. 38-2225 and K.S.A. 39-708c; implementing K.S.A. 2011 Supp. 38-2226 and 38-2230; effective Jan. 2, 1989; amended Jan. 2, 1990; amended Oct. 1, 1993; amended Jan. 1, 1997; amended Oct. 3, 1997; amended July 9, 2004; amended July 6, 2009; amended, T-30-6-1-12, June, 1, 2012; amended Sept. 14, 2012.)
