The Kansas Department of Health and Environment is soliciting comments regarding a proposed air quality operating permit. MGPI Processing, Inc. has applied for renewal of the Class I operating permit for their ethanol facility, in accordance with the provisions of K.A.R. 28-19-510 et al. The purpose of a Class I permit is to identify the sources and types of regulated air pollutants emitted from the facility; the emission limitations, standards and requirements applicable to each source; and the monitoring, record keeping and reporting requirements applicable to each source as of the effective date of permit issuance.

MGP Ingredients, Inc., 100 Commercial, Atchison, 66002, owns an existing beverage grade alcohol plant operated by MGPI Processing, Inc., located at 1300 Main, Atchison, Atchison County, Kansas.

The written request must be submitted to Lynelle Ladd, KDHE, Bureau of Air, 1000 S.W. Jackson, Suite 310, Topeka, 66612-1366, no later than noon Monday, July 15 in order for the Secretary of Health and Environment to consider the request.

The U.S. Environmental Protection Agency has a 45-day review period, which will start concurrently with the 30-day public comment period, within which to object to the proposed permit. If the EPA has not objected in writing to the issuance of the permit within the 45-day review period, any person may petition the administrator of the EPA to review the permit. The 60-day public petition period will directly follow the EPA's 45-day review period. Interested parties may contact KDHE to determine if the EPA's 45-day review period has been waived.

Any such petition shall be based only on objections to the permit that were raised with reasonable specificity during the public comment period provided for in this notice, unless the petitioner demonstrates that it was im-

practicable to raise such objections within such period, or unless the grounds for such objection arose after such period. ## HOUSE BILL No. 2213

AN ACT concerning retirement and pensions; relating to the Kansas public employees retirement system and systems thereunder; retirement annuity options; maximum retirement benefits; employee contributions; certain member elections; retirement benefit determinations, one-time payment; membership; amending K.S.A. 20-2610a, 74-4958, 74-4958a and 74-4965 and K.S.A. 2012 Supp. 74-4964, 74-49,135, 74-49,205, 74-49,301, 74-49,306, 74-49,308, 74-49,313 and 74-49,315 and repealing the existing sections.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Kansas:

Section 1. K.S.A. 20-2610a is hereby amended to read as follows: 20-2610a. (a) A judge may elect to have such judge's retirement annuity paid under one of the options provided in this section in lieu of having it paid in the form stated in K.S.A. 20-2610, and amendments thereto. Such election shall be made before the date of actual retirement. A specific person shall be designated as joint annuitant at the time of election of the joint and  $\frac{1}{2}$  to joint annuitant survivor option, joint and survivor option and the joint and  $\frac{3}{4}$  to joint annuitant survivor option. ~~Under no circumstances may~~ Except as specifically provided in this subsection, an option elected by a member as provided in this section shall not be changed or canceled nor shall the named joint annuitant be changed after the date of actual retirement of the judge. *If a retirant is divorced after the retirant's date of actual retirement, and the retirant has named the retirant's ex-spouse as a joint annuitant under subsection (c), the joint annuitant option may be canceled and the retirant's benefit returned to the maximum amount of such retirant's retirement benefit commencing the first month following the date such cancellation is ordered by the district court of the county where the divorce action was filed. The retirant shall not receive a refund or interest of any amounts already paid to fund the original joint annuitant benefit. The retirant may not name a subsequent joint annuitant once the original joint annuitant option has been canceled.*

(b) The amount of retirement annuity payable under an option shall be based on the age of the judge and, if applicable, the age of the joint annuitant, and shall be such amount as to be the actuarial equivalent of the retirement annuity otherwise payable under K.S.A. 20-2610, and amendments thereto, as prescribed in subsection (c). Whenever the amount of any benefit is to be determined on the basis of actuarial assumptions, the assumptions shall be specified in a way that precludes employer discretion. In no case shall the total amount of retirement annuity payable under any option provided in this section be more than 100% of the retirement annuity which would have been otherwise payable if no option had been elected under this section.

(c) The following retirement options, which are subject to the provisions of K.S.A. 74-49,123, and amendments thereto, are available:

(1) *Joint and  $\frac{1}{2}$  to joint annuitant survivor.* A reduced retirement annuity payable to the judge during the judge's lifetime in a monthly amount equal to the product of (A) the monthly payment of the retirement annuity otherwise payable under K.S.A. 20-2610, and amendments thereto, and (B) the percentage equal to 91% minus 0.4% for each year by which the age of the judge's joint annuitant is less than the judge's age, computed to the nearest whole year, or plus 0.4% for each year by which the age of the judge's joint annuitant is more than the judge's age, computed to the nearest whole year, with  $\frac{1}{2}$  of that monthly amount continued to the judge's joint annuitant during such joint annuitant's remaining lifetime, if any, after the death of the judge. In the event that the designated joint annuitant under this option predeceases the retired judge, the amount of the retirement annuity otherwise payable to the judge under this option shall be adjusted automatically to the retirement annuity which the judge would have received if no option had been elected under this section.

(2) *Joint and survivor.* A reduced retirement annuity payable to the judge during the judge's lifetime in a monthly amount equal to the product of (A) the monthly payment of the retirement annuity otherwise payable under K.S.A. 20-2610, and amendments thereto, and (B) the percentage equal to 83% minus 0.6% for each year by which the age of the judge's joint annuitant is less than the judge's age, computed to the nearest whole year, or plus 0.6% for each year by which the age of the judge's joint annuitant is more than the judge's age, computed to the nearest whole year, with that monthly amount continued to the joint annuitant during the joint annuitant's remaining lifetime, if any, after the death of judge. In the event that the designated joint annuitant under this option predeceases the retired judge, the amount of the retirement annuity otherwise payable to the judge under this option shall be adjusted automatically to the retirement annuity which the judge would have received if no option had been elected under this section.

(3) *Joint and  $\frac{3}{4}$  to joint annuitant survivor.* A reduced retirement annuity payable to the judge during the judge's lifetime in a monthly amount equal to the product of (A) the monthly payment of the retirement annuity otherwise payable under K.S.A. 20-2610, and amendments thereto, and (B) the percentage equal to 87% minus 0.5% for each year by which the age of the judge's joint annuitant is less than the judge's age, computed to the nearest whole year, or plus 0.5% for each year by which the age of the judge's joint annuitant is more than the judge's age, computed to the nearest whole year, with  $\frac{3}{4}$  of that monthly amount continued to the judge's joint annuitant during such joint annuitant's remaining lifetime, if any, after the death of the judge. In the event that the designated joint annuitant under this option predeceases the retired judge, the amount of the retirement annuity otherwise payable to the judge under this option shall be adjusted automatically to the retirement annuity which the judge would have received if no option had been elected under this section.

(4) *Life with 5 years certain.* A reduced retirement annuity payable to the judge during the judge's lifetime in a monthly amount equal to 98% of the monthly payment of the retirement annuity otherwise payable under K.S.A. 20-2610, and amendments thereto, and if the judge dies within the five-year certain period, measured from the commencement of retirement annuity payments, such monthly payments shall be continued to such judge's beneficiary during the balance of the five-year certain period.

(5) *Life with 10 years certain.* A reduced retirement annuity payable to the judge during the judge's lifetime in a monthly amount equal to 95% of the monthly payment of the retirement annuity otherwise payable under K.S.A. 20-2610, and amendments thereto, and if the judge dies within the ten-year certain period, measured from the commencement of retirement annuity payments, such monthly payments shall be continued to such judge's beneficiary during the balance of the ten-year certain period.

(6) *Life with 15 years certain.* A reduced retirement annuity payable to the judge during the judge's lifetime in a monthly amount equal to 88% of the monthly payment of the retirement annuity otherwise payable under K.S.A. 20-2610, and amendments thereto, and if the judge dies within the fifteen-year certain period, measured from the commencement of retirement annuity payments, such monthly payments shall be continued to such judge's beneficiary during the balance of the fifteen-year certain period.

(7) *Lump sum payment at retirement.* (A) Pursuant to this option, the judge must specify a lump sum amount to be paid to the judge upon the judge's retirement. The lump sum amount will be based on the actuarial present value of the benefit as provided in K.S.A. 20-2610, and amendments thereto. The lump sum amount designated by the judge must be in 10% increments and shall not exceed  $\frac{1}{2}$  of the actuarial present value of the benefit provided in K.S.A. 20-2610, and amendments thereto. If the judge's spouse elects a lump sum payment as provided in this section pursuant to the provisions of subsection (d), the lump sum payment will be based on the present value of the retirement option selected by the spouse. The lump sum amount designated by the spouse must be in 10% increments and shall not exceed  $\frac{1}{2}$  of the actuarial present value of the option selected in this section.

(B) Pursuant to this option, the judge must elect to have the remaining actuarial present value paid in a monthly amount under the provisions of K.S.A. 20-2610, and amendments thereto, or subsections (c)(1) through (c)(6) of this section.

(C) In the event that the designated joint annuitant pursuant to subsection (c)(1), (c)(2) or (c)(3), under this option predeceases the retirant, the amount of the retirement benefit otherwise payable to the retirant under the option shall be adjusted automatically to the retirement benefit which the retirant would have received if no option had been elected under this section.



(D) The provisions of this subsection shall be effective on and after July 1, 2001.

(d) If a judge, who is eligible to retire, dies without having actually retired, the judge's spouse, if the spouse is the sole beneficiary for the judge's accumulated contributions, may elect to receive benefits as a joint annuitant under one of the options provided in this section in lieu of receiving the judge's accumulated contributions.

(e) On and after May 1, 2004, if a judge with 10 or more years of credited service dies before attaining retirement age, the judge's spouse, if the spouse is the sole beneficiary for the judge's accumulated contributions, may elect to receive benefits under one of the options provided in this section in lieu of receiving the judge's accumulated contributions. Payments under one of the options provided in this section to the judge's spouse if so elected, shall commence on the date that the judge would have been eligible for normal retirement pursuant to subsection (a) of K.S.A. 20-2608, and amendments thereto, or would have been eligible for early retirement pursuant to subsection (b) or (c) of K.S.A. 20-2608, and amendments thereto, if such early retirement date occurs earlier.

(f) Benefits payable to a joint annuitant shall accrue from the first day of the month following the death of a member or retirant and, in the case of the joint and  $\frac{1}{2}$  to joint annuitant survivor option, the joint and survivor option and the joint and  $\frac{3}{4}$  to joint annuitant survivor option, shall end on the last day of the month in which the joint annuitant dies.

(g) The provisions of the law in effect on the retirement date of a judge under the retirement system for judges shall govern the retirement annuity payable to the retired judge and any joint annuitant, except, for retirement benefits payable after July 1, 1993, for judges who retired prior to July 1, 1982, in the event that the designated joint annuitant under the option provided in subsection (c)(1), (2) or (3), as applicable, predeceased the judge, the amount of the retirement benefit otherwise payable to the judge under the option provided in subsection (c)(1), (2) or (3), as applicable, shall be adjusted automatically to the retirement benefit which the judge would have received if no option had been elected under this section.

(h) Upon the death of a joint annuitant who is receiving a retirement benefit under the provisions of this section, there shall be paid to such joint annuitant's beneficiary an amount equal to the excess, if any, of the accumulated contributions of the retired judge over the sum of all retirement benefit payments made to such retired judge and such joint annuitant. Such joint annuitant shall designate a beneficiary by filing in the office of the retirement system such designation at the time of death of the retired judge. If there is no named beneficiary of such joint annuitant living at the time of death of such joint annuitant, any amount provided for by this section shall be paid to, in order of preference as follows:

- (1) The joint annuitant's surviving spouse;
- (2) the joint annuitant's dependent child or children;
- (3) the joint annuitant's dependent parent or parents;
- (4) the joint annuitant's nondependent child or children;
- (5) the joint annuitant's nondependent parent or parents; or
- (6) the estate of the deceased joint annuitant.

(i) In any event, benefits shall be adjusted as necessary to satisfy the incidental death benefits regulations under the federal internal revenue code.

Sec. 2. K.S.A. 2012 Supp. 74-4964 is hereby amended to read as follows: 74-4964. (1) A member may elect to have such member's retirement benefit paid under one of the options provided in this section in lieu of having it paid in the form stated in subsections (1) and (2) of K.S.A. 74-4958, and amendments thereto. Such election must be made before the date of actual retirement. Only a specific individual person may be designated as a joint annuitant at the time of election of the joint and  $\frac{1}{2}$  to joint annuitant survivor option, the joint and survivor option and the joint and  $\frac{3}{4}$  to joint annuitant survivor option. ~~Under no circumstances may~~ Except as specifically provided in this subsection, an option elected by a member as provided in this section shall not be changed or canceled nor shall the named joint annuitant be changed after the date of actual retirement of the member. If a retirant is divorced after the retirant's date of actual retirement, and the retirant has named the retirant's ex-spouse as a joint annuitant under subsection (5), the joint annuitant option may be canceled and the retirant's benefit returned to the maximum amount of such retirant's retirement benefit commencing the first month following the date such cancellation is ordered by the district court of the county where the divorce action was filed. The retirant shall not receive a refund or interest of any amounts already paid to fund the original joint annuitant benefit. The retirant may not name a subsequent joint annuitant once the original joint annuitant option has been canceled.

(2) The amount of a retirement benefit payable under an option shall be based on the age of the member and, if applicable, the age of the joint annuitant, and shall be such amount as to be the actuarial equivalent of the retirement benefit otherwise payable under subsections (1) or (2) of K.S.A. 74-4958, and amendments thereto, as prescribed under subsection (5). In no case shall the total amount of retirement benefit paid under any option provided in this section be more than 100% of the retirement benefit which would have been otherwise payable if no option had been elected under this section.

(3) If a member who was, up to the entry date of such member's employer, covered by a pension system under the provisions of K.S.A. 13-14a01 to 13-14a14, inclusive, or 14-10a01 through to 14-10a15, inclusive, and amendments thereto, so elects one of the options under this section, payment of such option shall be in lieu of any payments provided in subsection (3) of K.S.A. 74-4958, and amendments thereto.

(4) Such election of an option shall become null and void upon the death of a member prior to such member's retirement, except that if a member, who is eligible to retire in accordance with the provisions of subsections (1) and (2) of K.S.A. 74-4958, and amendments thereto, dies without having actually retired the member's spouse, if the spouse is beneficiary for the member's accumulated contributions, and no benefits are payable under subsections (1) and (2) of K.S.A. 74-4959, and amendments thereto, may elect to receive benefits under one of the options provided in this section, in lieu of receiving the member's accumulated contributions.

(5) The following retirement options which are subject to the provisions of K.S.A. 74-49,123, and amendments thereto, are available:

(A) *Joint and  $\frac{1}{2}$  to joint annuitant survivor.* A reduced retirement benefit is payable to the retirant during the retirant's lifetime in a monthly amount equal to the product of (A) the monthly payment of the retirement annuity otherwise payable under K.S.A. 74-4958, and amendments thereto, and (B) the percentage equal to 94.5% minus 0.2% for each year by which the age of the retirant's joint annuitant is less than the retirant's age, computed to the nearest whole year, or plus 0.2% for each year by which the age of the retirant's joint annuitant is more than the retirant's age, computed to the nearest whole year, with  $\frac{1}{2}$  of that monthly amount continued to the retirant's joint annuitant during such joint annuitant's remaining lifetime, if any, after the death of the retirant. In the event that the designated joint annuitant under this option predeceases the retirant, the amount of the retirement benefit otherwise payable to the retirant under this option shall be adjusted automatically to the retirement benefit which the retirant would have received if no option had been elected under this section.

(B) *Joint and survivor.* A reduced retirement benefit is payable to the retirant during the retirant's lifetime in a monthly amount equal to the product of (A) the monthly payment of the retirement annuity otherwise payable under K.S.A. 74-4958, and amendments thereto, and (B) the percentage equal to 88% minus 0.4% for each year by which the age of the retirant's joint annuitant is less than the retirant's age, computed to the nearest whole year, or plus 0.4% for each year by which the age of the retirant's joint annuitant is more than the retirant's age, computed to the nearest whole year, with that monthly amount continued to the joint annuitant during the joint annuitant's remaining lifetime, if any, after the death of retirant. In the event that the designated joint annuitant under this option predeceases the retirant, the amount of the retirement benefit otherwise payable to the retirant under this option shall be adjusted automatically to the retirement benefit which the retirant would have received if no option had been elected under this section.

(C) *Joint and  $\frac{3}{4}$  to joint annuitant survivor.* A reduced retirement benefit is payable to the retirant during the retirant's lifetime in a monthly amount equal to the product of (A) the monthly payment of the retirement annuity otherwise payable under K.S.A. 74-4958, and amendments thereto, and (B) the percentage equal to 91% minus 0.3% for each year by which the age of the retirant's joint annuitant is less than the retirant's age, computed to the nearest whole year, or plus 0.3% for each year by which the age of the retirant's joint annuitant is more than the retirant's age, computed to the nearest whole year, with  $\frac{3}{4}$  of that monthly amount continued to the retirant's joint annuitant during such joint annuitant's remaining lifetime, if any, after the death of the retirant. In the event that the designated joint annuitant under this option predeceases the retirant, the amount of the retirement benefit otherwise payable to the retirant under this option shall be adjusted automatically to the retirement benefit which the retirant would have received if no option had been elected under this section.

(D) *Life with 5 years certain.* A reduced retirement benefit is payable to the retirant during the retirant's lifetime in a monthly amount equal to 99% of the monthly payment of the retirement benefit otherwise payable under K.S.A. 74-4958, and amendments thereto, and if the retirant

dies within the five-year certain period, measured from the commencement of retirement benefit payments, such payments will be continued to the retirant's beneficiary during the balance of the five-year certain period.

(E) *Life with 10 years certain.* A reduced retirement benefit is payable to the retirant during the retirant's lifetime in a monthly amount equal to 98% of the monthly payment of the retirement benefit otherwise payable under K.S.A. 74-4958, and amendments thereto, and if the retirant dies within the ten-year certain period, measured from the commencement of retirement benefit payments, such payments will be continued to the retirant's beneficiary during the balance of the ten-year certain period.

(F) *Life with 15 years certain.* A reduced retirement benefit is payable to the retirant during the retirant's lifetime in a monthly amount equal to 92% of the monthly payment of the retirement benefit otherwise payable under K.S.A. 74-4958, and amendments thereto, and if the retirant dies within the fifteen-year certain period, measured from the commencement of retirement benefit payments, such payments will be continued to the retirant's beneficiary during the balance of the fifteen-year certain period.

(G) *Lump sum payment at retirement.* (i) Pursuant to this option, the member must specify a lump sum amount to be paid to the member upon the member's retirement. The lump sum amount will be based on the actuarial present value of the benefit as provided in K.S.A. 74-4958, and amendments thereto. The lump sum amount designated by the member must be in 10% increments and shall not exceed  $\frac{1}{2}$  of the actuarial present value of the benefit provided in K.S.A. 74-4958, and amendments thereto. If the member's spouse elects a lump sum payment as provided in this section pursuant to the provisions of subsection (6), the lump sum payment will be based on the present value of the retirement option selected by the spouse. The lump sum amount designated by the spouse must be in 10% increments and shall not exceed  $\frac{1}{2}$  of the actuarial present value of the option selected in this section.

(ii) Pursuant to this option, the member must elect to have the remaining actuarial present value paid in a monthly amount under the provisions of K.S.A. 74-4958, and amendments thereto, or subsections (5)(A) through (5)(F) of this section.

(iii) In the event that the designated joint annuitant pursuant to subsection (5)(A), (5)(B) or (5)(C) under this option predeceases the retirant, the amount of the retirement benefit otherwise payable to the retirant under this option shall be adjusted automatically to the retirement benefit which the retirant would have received if no option had been elected under this section.

(iv) The provisions of this subsection shall be effective on and after July 1, 2001.

(6) On and after July 1, 1996, if a member with 20 or more years of credited service dies before attaining retirement age, the member's spouse, if the spouse is the sole beneficiary for the member's accumulated contributions, may elect to receive benefits under one of the options provided in this section in lieu of receiving the member's accumulated contributions or in lieu of receiving benefits as provided in K.S.A. 74-4959, and amendments thereto. Payments under one of the options provided in this section to the member's spouse if so elected, shall commence on the date that the member would have attained retirement age.

(7) Benefits payable to a joint annuitant shall accrue from the first day of the month following the death of a member or retirant and, in the case of the joint and  $\frac{1}{2}$  to joint annuitant survivor option, the joint and survivor option and the joint and  $\frac{3}{4}$  to joint annuitant survivor option, shall end on the last day of the month in which the joint annuitant dies.

(8) The provisions of the law in effect on the retirement date of a member under the system shall govern the retirement benefit payable to the retirant and any joint annuitant, except, for retirement benefits payable after July 1, 1993, for retirants who retired prior to July 1, 1982, in the event that the designated joint annuitant under the option provided in subsection (5)(A), (B) or (C), as applicable, predeceased the retirant, the amount of the retirement benefit otherwise payable to the retirant under the option provided in subsection (5)(A), (B) or (C), as applicable, shall be adjusted automatically to the retirement benefit which the retirant would have received if no option had been elected under this section.

(9) Upon the death of a joint annuitant who is receiving a retirement benefit under the provisions of this section, there shall be paid to such joint annuitant's beneficiary an amount equal to the excess, if any, of the accumulated contributions of the retirant over the sum of all retirement benefit payments made to such retirant and such joint annuitant. Such joint annuitant shall designate a beneficiary by filing in the office of the retirement system such designation at the time of death of the

retirant. If there is no named beneficiary of such joint annuitant living at the time of death of such joint annuitant, any amount provided for by this section shall be paid to, in order of preference as follows:

- (A) The joint annuitant's surviving spouse;
- (B) the joint annuitant's dependent child or children;
- (C) the joint annuitant's dependent parent or parents;
- (D) the joint annuitant's nondependent child or children;
- (E) the joint annuitant's nondependent parent or parents; or
- (F) the estate of the deceased joint annuitant.

(1) ~~Except as otherwise provided in this section~~ Commencing with the first payroll period beginning on or after July 1, 2013, each participating employer shall, ~~beginning with the first payroll period for services performed after the entry date,~~ deduct from the compensation of each member ~~7%~~ 7.15% of such member's compensation as employee contributions, except that in the case of a member whose employment is covered by social security and the member is a member of the class certified in the case of *Brazelton v. (a) Except as provided in subsection (e), a member who has a nonforfeitable interest in the member's retirement annuity account, at any time after termination from service and the attainment of normal retirement age, shall receive an annuity based upon the balance in such member's retirement annuity account, using mortality rates established by the board by official action as of the member's annuity start date and interest rates established by the legislature as of the member's annuity start date, and such interest rate shall initially be 6%. The legislature may from time to time prospectively change the interest rate and the board may from time to time prospectively change the mortality rates, and the legislature expressly reserves such rights to do so.

The member may elect any option described in K.S.A. 74-4918, and amendments thereto, except the partial lump-sum option, subject to actuarial factors established by the board from time to time. The benefit option selected may include a self-funded cost-of-living adjustment feature, in which the account value is converted to a benefit amount that increases by a fixed percentage over time. One or more fixed percentages shall be established by the board, which may be changed from time to time. In lieu of a part of an annuity, for a member entitled to a benefit under subsection (a), the member may elect to receive a lump-sum of such member's retirement annuity account of any fixed dollar amount or percent, but in no event may the lump-sum option elected under this section and the lump-sum option elected under subsection (a) of K.S.A. 2012 Supp. 74-49,311, and amendments thereto, exceed 30% of the total value of such member's annuity savings account and retirement annuity account.

(d) Except as provided in subsection (e), in the case of an active or inactive member:

- (1) Who is vested in the member's retirement annuity account;
- (2) who has five or more years of service at death; and
- (3) who dies before attaining normal retirement age, with such member's spouse at time of death designated as such member's sole primary beneficiary, the member's surviving spouse on and after the date the member would have attained normal retirement age had such member not died, shall receive an annuity based upon employer credits and interest credits in the retirement annuity account, using factors established by the board by official action as of the beneficiary's annuity start date. The form of benefit shall be a single life annuity with 10-year certain.

(e) If a member's vested retirement annuity account is less than \$1,000 upon separation from service, or the total of the member's vested retirement annuity account and annuity savings account balance is less than \$1,000, the account balance or balances shall be mandatorily distributed to the member in accordance with section 401(a)(31)(B) of the federal internal revenue code. If the member does not elect to have such distribution paid directly to an eligible retirement plan specified by the participant in a direct rollover or to receive the distribution directly, then the board will pay the distribution to the member directly.

Sec. 12. K.S.A. 2012 Supp. 74-49,315 is hereby amended to read as follows: 74-49,315. A member's beneficiary shall be determined as provided in the ~~pre-2014 pre-2015~~ plan. Upon filing a written application with the board after the death of a member receiving a benefit under ~~subsection~~ subsections (a) or (b) of K.S.A. 2012 Supp. 74-49,313, and amendments thereto, the member's beneficiary is entitled to a \$4,000 death benefit as provided in K.S.A. 74-4989, and amendments thereto.

Sec. 13. K.S.A. 20-2610a, 74-4958, 74-4958a and 74-4965 and K.S.A. 2012 Supp. 74-4964, 74-49,135, 74-49,205, 74-49,301, 74-49,306, 74-49,308, 74-49,313 and 74-49,315 are hereby repealed.

**111-4-3245. Name of drawing.** The Kansas lottery shall conduct a drawing entitled "Ultimate Getaway" *(continued)*

Drawing," and will accept entries on and after the day Kansas lottery "Ultimate Getaway" instant tickets are first offered for sale to the general public and ending on June 8, 2013, as specified in these rules. The drawing will be held at a time, date and location designated by the executive director of the Kansas lottery and advertised to players through social media, the internet and traditional advertising methods, provided such time and date are after 6:00 p.m. on June 8, 2013. The time and date may be postponed by the executive director if conditions at the designated time are such that the executive director determines an orderly drawing may not be performed. Rules applicable to this drawing are contained in K.A.R. 111-4-3245 through 111-4-3250 and K.A.R. 111-3-1, *et seq.* (Authorized by and implementing K.S.A. 2012 Supp. 74-8710; effective, T-111-5-31-13, Jan. 16, 2013.)

**111-4-3246. Definitions.** (a) All definitions contained in the Kansas lottery act (K.S.A. 74-8701 *et seq.*) and lottery regulations are hereby incorporated by reference and govern unless otherwise indicated.

(b) "Ultimate Getaway Drawing" means the act of drawing prizes conducted by the Kansas lottery at the time and date described in these rules in which participants are selected to win various prizes as described in these rules.

(c) "Non-winning ticket" means any valid Kansas lottery "Ultimate Getaway" instant game ticket not eligible to win an instant prize under the rules of the "Ultimate Getaway" instant game. "Ultimate Getaway" instant tickets which entitle a person to a free admission button for the 2013 Wichita River Festival shall be considered non-winning tickets.

(d) "Receptacle" or "drum" means a container in which non-winning Kansas instant game lottery tickets are placed and from which the "Ultimate Getaway Drawing" entries are drawn. Receptacles or drums may be sealable and shall be capable of being mixed or rotated for the purpose of ensuring random distribution.

(e) "Bare arm technique" means a type of drawing where the person drawing the winning ticket from the receptacle or drum wears a long-sleeved shirt with sleeve rolled up above the elbow, a short-sleeved shirt (sleeve not extending past the elbow) or a no-sleeve shirt which exposes the drawer's bare arm and looks away from the drawing drum or receptacle while drawing. (Authorized by and implementing K.S.A. 2012 Supp. 74-8710; effective, T-111-5-31-13, Jan. 16, 2013.)

**111-4-3247. Prize.** (a) Three winners will be drawn in the "Ultimate Getaway Drawing" and each shall receive his or her choice of one of four vacation trip prize packages. The vacation trip prize packages available will be a beach spa vacation, or a beach golfing vacation, or a Las Vegas vacation, or a snow skiing vacation. Each trip prize package shall include seven nights lodging for two persons at a hotel to be determined by the Kansas lottery, round-trip airfare for two persons with departure and destination locations to be determined by the Kansas lottery based on the winner's location, mandatory federal and state income withholding taxes and any other applicable initial taxes and fees. The winner of a Las Vegas vacation package will receive \$3,000 cash. The winner of

a beach spa vacation, or a beach golfing vacation, or a snow skiing vacation will receive \$2,000 cash. Each prize package will have an approximate value of \$18,175.

(b) All prizes are subject to lottery validation, set-offs and deductions authorized by law.

(c) The Kansas lottery may, at its sole and absolute discretion, substitute a prize of approximate equal value.

(d) The grand prize winners of the trip packages in the "Ultimate Getaway Drawing" must book the trip within 90 days of notification. Travel must be completed within two years from the date of the "Ultimate Getaway Drawing." (Authorized by and implementing K.S.A. 2012 Supp. 74-8710; effective, T-111-5-31-13, Jan. 16, 2013.)

**111-4-3248. Method of entry.** (a) Entry into the "Ultimate Getaway Drawing" to be conducted at the time and date designated by the executive director shall be accomplished as follows:

(1) Obtain a valid "Ultimate Getaway" Kansas instant lottery ticket;

(2) Determine if the ticket is a winning ticket in accordance with "Ultimate Getaway" game rules. If the ticket is a winning ticket, it is not eligible for the "Ultimate Getaway Drawing" and shall be redeemed in accordance with the instant game rules, except that any ticket winning a free admission button for the 2013 Wichita River Festival (aka Wichita Riverfest) may instead be used to enter the drawing, and if so utilized, shall be considered a non-winning ticket for the purposes of entry into the drawing.

(3) If the ticket is a valid non-winning ticket, the ticket is eligible for the drawing and the holder of the ticket may use it to enter the "Ultimate Getaway Drawing."

(4) The holder of the non-winning ticket must complete the information form on the back of the ticket in a legible manner. Only one name shall appear on a non-winning ticket entered.

(5) Players may deposit entries for the "Ultimate Getaway Drawing" beginning on and after the day Kansas lottery "Ultimate Getaway" instant tickets are first offered for sale to the general public at any Kansas lottery event or location at which the lottery has specifically designated a receptacle for deposit of said entries until 5:00 p.m. on June 4, 2013, or until Lottery personnel thereafter retrieve said receptacle.

(6) Players may also deposit entries for the "Ultimate Getaway Drawing" in a receptacle designated for deposit of said entries only at the Kansas lottery selling location at the Wichita Riverfest in Wichita, Kansas, scheduled to begin on May 31, 2013, through 6 p.m. June 8, 2013, or until Lottery personnel thereafter retrieve said receptacle.

(7) Entries other than those entered at Kansas lottery events or locations as identified in these rules shall be mailed with proper postage to "Ultimate Getaway Drawing," P. O. Box 19226, Topeka, Kansas 66619-0226. Mailed entries must be received by the morning mail pickup on Tuesday, June 4, 2013. More than one entry may be mailed in one envelope.

(8) The holder of the ticket is not required to personally attend the "Ultimate Getaway Drawing" or be present at the time of the drawing to be determined a winner.

(b) There is no limit on the number of entries a person may make, but a person may only win one time in the drawing.

(c) Only valid non-winning "Ultimate Getaway" tickets which are mailed to the "Ultimate Getaway Drawing," at the above-stated address with proper postage and received by the morning mail pickup in Topeka, Kansas, on Tuesday, June 4, 2013, or non-winning "Ultimate Getaway" tickets entered into any other receptacle designated by the lottery as provided in the rules herein shall be eligible for the drawing. All tickets so mailed or deposited shall be secured by the lottery until the drawing is conducted. Ineligible tickets will be kept and destroyed by the lottery.

(d) Eligible entrants in the "Ultimate Getaway Drawing" must be 18 years of age or older.

(e) Completing the information form on the non-winning ticket and entering the ticket into the drawing constitutes authorization to publicly identify the person whose entry is drawn.

(f) The Kansas lottery shall not be responsible for any lost, destroyed, mutilated, unreadable, or altered ticket entries into the "Ultimate Getaway Drawing." Players enter this contest at their own risk. Each person who enters a non-winning ticket described in these rules that is eligible to enter the drawing agrees to release Kansas lottery and respective officers, directors, employees, agents, and sponsors from liability of any kind or nature for any loss, claims, damages, or injuries of any kind associated with participation in the drawing or with acceptance and use of any prize. (Authorized by and implementing K.S.A. 2012 Supp. 74-8710; effective, T-111-5-31-13, Jan. 16, 2013.)

**111-4-3249. Selection of winners.** The following process shall be used for the selection of the winners in the "Ultimate Getaway Drawing:"

(a) Kansas lottery personnel shall pick up all mail containing "Ultimate Getaway Drawing" tickets at the United States Post Office Box 19226, in Topeka, Kansas, with the final pick up at the Topeka post office in the morning mail pickup on Tuesday, June 4, 2013. Following the morning mail pickup on Tuesday, June 4, 2013, the envelopes containing mailed entries will be transported to lottery headquarters and opened by lottery personnel. All mailed entries shall then be transported to the Wichita Riverfest by lottery personnel and placed in the drawing receptacle or drum designated by the lottery for the "Ultimate Getaway Drawing" entries.

(b) Kansas lottery personnel shall pick up all "Ultimate Getaway Drawing" entries deposited at any Kansas lottery event or location, at which the lottery specifically designated a receptacle for deposit of said entries, periodically throughout the drawing. The final pick up at any open receptacles, other than the receptacle(s) at the Wichita Riverfest, shall be immediately after the close of the Kansas lottery claims centers in Topeka, Kansas, and Great Bend, Kansas, at 5:00 p.m. on June 4, 2013. All entries deposited at a designated receptacle for deposit of said entries, except those entries deposited at the Wichita Riverfest, shall be transported to lottery headquarters, if necessary, and opened by lottery personnel. All said entries shall then be transported to the Wichita Riverfest by

lottery personnel and placed in the drawing receptacle or drum designated for deposit of said entries by the lottery.

(c) The drawing shall be held at a location determined by the executive director of the Kansas lottery and shall be open to the public with lottery security personnel present. The drawing shall be audio and video taped.

(d) At the drawing on June 8, 2013, lottery security personnel will be present with the person designated by the executive director to perform the drawing. Prior to the drawing, if a drum is used, the drum shall be sealed and the contents mixed by rotating the drum at least 10 times. If a receptacle other than a drum is used, the contents shall be thoroughly mixed with a shovel or by other means.

(e) The designated individual shall then unseal the drum, if a drum is used, and using the bare-arm technique, while looking away, remove three entry tickets from the receptacle or drum, which shall be marked 1, 2, and 3, in the order drawn. The person whose name appears on each entry drawn shall be the winner of the prize identified in K.A.R. 111-4-3247, subject to validation by the lottery as set forth in these rules.

(f) After three prize entries have been drawn on June 8, 2013, and the entries have been verified as valid, 10 more valid entries will be drawn, one at a time, which entries drawn will serve as alternate entries. The alternate entries will be marked in order drawn, 1A, 2A, 3A, 4A, 5A, 6A, 7A, 8A, 9A, and 10A. The winners of a grand prize shall have until 5:00 p.m. on the thirtieth day following mailing of a claim form to the winner to present the fully-executed claim form to lottery headquarters. If the thirtieth day following the mailing of a claim form to any winner falls on a weekend or holiday, the thirtieth day shall be extended to the next business day. If a prize winner cannot be located or is declared ineligible, or fails to timely present a fully-executed claim form to lottery headquarters, the prize will be awarded to the next alternate ticket selected in the order drawn. The alternate winner will be notified by telephone by the Kansas lottery and a claim form will be mailed to the alternate winner. The alternate winner shall have 30 days from being notified by phone to claim a prize. The alternate winner process shall be repeated until the prize is properly claimed or until such time as no alternate winners remain, whichever occurs first.

(g) The Kansas lottery security official present shall review each ticket drawn to determine the validity of the entry into the "Ultimate Getaway Drawing" in accordance with these regulations. If it is a valid entry and the name is legible, the event manager and the security person present shall record the name of the winner. The prize winner shall be given or sent a prize claim form to be completed and returned as set forth in these rules.

(h) If any entry drawn is determined to be ineligible, it shall be discarded by the security person present and another entry drawn. This procedure will be repeated until the required number of apparently eligible selections is obtained.

(i) Only non-winning "Ultimate Getaway" instant tickets are eligible for the drawing.

(j) All "Ultimate Getaway" tickets remaining in the drum or receptacle after the winners and alternates have been selected, and all entries not received in compliance with these rules shall be destroyed pursuant to K.A.R. 111-3-34. **111-4-3250. Certification of drawing.** (a) The "Ultimate Getaway Drawing" shall be personally observed by a member of the Kansas lottery security department and a member of the Kansas lottery marketing department or other person or persons designated by the executive director of the lottery.

(b) Upon completion of the drawing, the security official and the event manager shall issue a report to the executive director, certifying that the name of each prize winner is correct, and that to the best of their knowledge the procedures required by these rules were followed in selecting the prize winners. (Authorized by and implementing K.S.A. 2012 Supp. 74-8710; effective, T-111-5-31-13, Jan. 16, 2013.)

(b) The price of pull tab tickets sold by a retailer for this game shall be \$1.00 each.

(c) Approximately 1,200,000 tickets shall be ordered initially for this pull tab game which shall be packaged in packs of 300 tickets each. The ticket numbers in each pack in this game shall start with 000 and end with 299. Additional ticket orders shall have the same prize structure, the same number of prizes per pool of 300,000 tickets, and the same odds as were contained in the initial ticket order.

(d) The play symbols for this game are as follows:

- Card Symbol of nine of hearts
- Card Symbol of 10 of spades
- Card Symbol of jack of diamonds
- Card Symbol of queen of clubs
- Card Symbol of king of hearts
- Card Symbol of ace of spades

(e) For this game, three play symbols shall appear under each of four tabs on the back of each ticket. On the front of each ticket shall appear a legend of all winning combinations using the play symbols for this game along with the corresponding prize amount for each combination, as follows: three nine of hearts card symbols equal \$1.00; three 10 of spades card symbols equal \$5.00; three jack of diamonds card symbols equal \$10.00; three queen of clubs card symbols equal \$25.00; three king of hearts card symbols equal \$100.00; three ace of spades card symbols equal \$1,000.00.

(f) All tabs on the back of each ticket are to be pulled open. For each combination of three play symbols matching the legend on the front of the ticket, the player wins the prize amount corresponding to each combination as shown in (e) above. All winning combinations shall be within a single window in a horizontal line.

**111-9-187. "Catch & Win" pull tab ticket lottery game number 536.** (a) The Kansas lottery shall conduct a pull tab lottery game entitled "Catch & Win." The rules for this game are contained in K.A.R. 111-8-1 *et seq.* and K.A.R. 111-9-187.

(b) The price of pull tab tickets sold by a retailer for this game shall be \$1.00 each.

(c) Approximately 1,200,000 tickets shall be ordered initially for this pull tab game which shall be packaged in packs of 300 tickets each. The ticket numbers in each pack in this game shall start with 000 and end with 299. Additional ticket orders shall have the same prize structure, the same number of prizes per pool of 300,000 tickets, and the same odds as were contained in the initial ticket order.

(d) The play symbols for this game are as follows:

- Symbol of an octopus
- Symbol of a treasure chest
- Symbol of a boot
- Symbol of a fish net
- Symbol of a star fish
- Symbol of a fish

(e) For this game, three play symbols shall appear under each of four tabs on the back of each ticket. On the front of each ticket shall appear a legend of all winning combinations using the play symbols for this game along with the corresponding prize amount for each combination, as follows: three octopus symbols equal \$1.00; three treasure chest symbols equal \$5.00; three boot symbols equal \$10.00; three fish net symbols equal \$25.00; three star fish symbols equal \$100.00; three fish symbols equal \$1,000.00.

(f) All tabs on the back of each ticket are to be pulled open. For each combination of three play symbols matching the legend on the front of the ticket, the player wins the prize amount corresponding to each combination as shown in (e) above. All winning combinations shall be within a single window in a horizontal line.

(g) The number and value of prizes in this game and winning combinations shall be as follows: (See corresponding play symbol values in subsection (e) above.)

#### Article 17.—SPECIFIC ONLINE DRAWING RULES

**111-17-7. Star Trek online drawing.** (a) The Kansas lottery shall conduct a series of three second-chance online drawings entitled "Star Trek Drawing." The Kansas lottery will accept entries into the first drawing through the Kansas Lottery website (website) starting at midnight, February 21, 2013, and ending at noon on April 9, 2013. Drawings will be announced with at least 24 hours advanced notice via the lottery's website, and other social media forums such as Facebook and Twitter. The first drawing will be conducted sometime after entry into the drawing has closed, but before noon on April 12, 2013. Players will be given notice of draw times via social media and the Internet not less than 24 hours before said drawings. The Kansas lottery will accept entries into the second drawing through the website starting at midnight, February 21, 2013, and ending at noon on May 14, 2013. The second drawing will be conducted sometime after entry into the drawing has closed, but before noon on May 17, 2013. Players will be given notice of draw times via social media and the Internet not less than 24 hours before said drawings. The Kansas lottery will accept entries into the third drawing through the website starting at midnight, February 21, 2013, and ending at noon on June 18, 2013. The third drawing will be conducted sometime after entry into the drawing has closed, but before noon on June 21, 2013. Players will be given notice of draw times via social media and the Internet not less than 24 hours before said drawings.

(b) The specific non-winning ticket eligible for entry into this second-chance online event drawing shall be a single \$2 ticket purchase of the Kansas lottery instant Star Trek game.

(c) A single non-winning \$2 instant Star Trek ticket purchase is only eligible for one entry.

(d) Each qualified entry can only win one prize in all of the three drawings combined.

(e) All qualified entries entered by the closing time for each drawing shall be eligible to win a prize in each drawing. All qualified entries shall remain eligible in any subsequent drawing in the series of Star Trek drawings to win a prize unless the qualified entry has previously won a prize or has been previously selected as an alternate winner in the "Star Trek Drawing."

(f) The Kansas lottery shall award one grand prize and five secondary prizes in each of the three individual drawings. The grand prize in the first drawing shall be a limited edition fine art print of James T. Kirk by Paul Oz, a Sunset fine art print, a Captain Kirk figure, a USS Classic Enterprise model kit, a Star Trek Klingon Monopoly, a Star Trek classic gold uniform shirt, a Star Trek Enterprise three-pack model kit, a watch, a stainless steel water bottle, an original series mug and book, and every Star Trek movie made to date on DVD. The grand prize in the second drawing, shall be a limited edition fine art print of Spock by Paul Oz, a Mr. Spock figure, a USS Enterprise A model kit, a Star Trek Monopoly, a crew in transporter lighted figure, a watch, a Mr. Spock model kit, a stainless steel water bottle, an original series mug and book, and every Star Trek movie made to date DVD. The grand prize in the third drawing conducted shall be the Escape fine art print by Brian Rood on canvas, an original series mug and book, and every Star Trek movie made so far on DVD. Each of the five secondary prize winners in each drawing shall win every Star Trek movie made to date on DVD.

(g) There will be three drawings held as identified in subsection (a) to select winners of prizes. Each drawing shall select 16 entrants. The first entrant drawn in each drawing shall be awarded the grand prize identified in subsection (f) for that drawing. The next five entrants drawn in each drawing (identified as numbers 2 through 6) will be awarded the secondary prizes identified in subsection (f) The next 10 entrants drawn in each drawing (identified as numbers 7 through 16) will be used as alternate winners, if necessary, in the order drawn.

(h) If any entry is drawn as a winner or as an alternate winner of a prize, the entry shall not be eligible to win a prize or to be an alternate prize winner in any subsequent drawing in the "Star Trek Drawing" and the entry shall be considered to be disqualified.

(i) A winner of a prize shall be notified via email that he or she has won a prize. A claim form will be mailed to the winner. The winner will be instructed how to verify his or her personal identification.

(j) A player who is among the first six winners selected in each drawing to receive a prize (not including alternate winners) must return his or her completed claim form, and the original non-winning ticket entered into the online event drawing within 30 days following the date of the online drawing.

(k) A player who is among the entrants selected as alternate winners in any of these drawings to receive a prize and as identified in subsection (f) must return his or her completed claim form, and original non-winning ticket entered into the online event drawing within 30 days following the date the alternate winner was sent a claim form via U. S. mail.

(continued)

(l) Completed claim forms and the non-winning ticket used to enter the drawing can be mailed by the winner via U.S. Mail to: Kansas lottery, 128 North Kansas Avenue, Topeka, Kansas 66603, or the winner can deliver the completed claim form and non-winning ticket to the Kansas lottery claims center in Topeka, Kansas, during the hours that the office is open to the public for business.

(m) If a player fails to answer any email, respond to any request for information, or fill out any forms required by the Kansas lottery within the time allotted in the winner's notification of winning a prize, said win shall be forfeited and the prize awarded to another alternate winner.

(n) Alternate winners will be notified by mail and follow the same rules for claiming a prize as described in subsections (i) through (m) above.

(o) Each person who enters a non-winning ticket described in these rules that is eligible to enter the drawing agrees to release Kansas lottery and respective officers,

directors, employees, agents, and sponsors from liability of any kind or nature for any loss, claims, damages, or injuries of any kind associated with participation in the drawing or with acceptance and use of any prize.

(p) The Kansas lottery reserves the right to substitute any prize for a prize of approximate equal value without prior notice.

(q) There is no limit on the number of entries a player can make into the drawing, but a player can only win one prize in each of the three drawings.

(r) Rules applicable to this online event drawing are contained in K.A.R. 111-17-7 and K.A.R. 111-16-1 *et seq.* (Authorized by K.S.A. 2012 Supp. 74-8710 and K.S.A. 74-8748; implementing K.S.A. 2012 Supp. 74-8710; effective, T-111-5-31-13, Jan. 16, 2013.)
