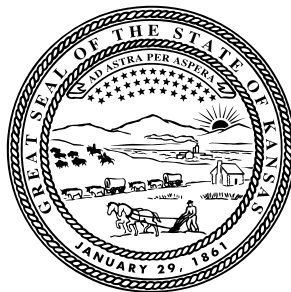

Notice is hereby given of the commencement of the selection process for civil engineering services for the Flint Hills Nature Trail for the Kansas Department of Wildlife, Parks and Tourism. The trail will be 117 miles long and run between Osawatomie and Herington, within a rail-banked right of way. The trail will transect Herington, Council Grove, Osage City, Ottawa and Osawatomie, and intersect numerous state and federal highways. Many portions of the trail will be bid out, with possible National Guard labor and Kanza Rail-Trail Conservancy assistance. A public hearing will be conducted at 1 p.m. Monday, November 18, in the office of the director of the Division of Property Valuation, fourth floor, Docking State Office Building, 915 S.W. Harrison, Topeka, to consider amendments to K.A.R. 93-6-2, 93-6-3 and 93-6-6, rules and regulations of the secretary of revenue establishing the qualifications for the designation of registered mass appraiser.

This 60-day notice of the public hearing shall constitute a public comment period for the purpose of receiving written public comments on the proposed amendments. All interested parties may submit written comments prior to the hearing to Roger Hamm, Deputy Director of Property Valuation, 4th Floor, Docking State Office Building, 915 S.W. Harrison, Topeka, 66612-1585 (roger.hamm@kdor.ks.gov).

All interested parties will be given a reasonable opportunity to present their views, orally or in writing, concerning the adoption of the proposed amendments during the hearing. In order to give all persons an opportunity to present their views, it may be necessary to request each participant to limit any oral presentations to five minutes.

Any individual with a disability may request accommodation in order to participate in the public hearing and may request the proposed amendments and economic impact statement in an accessible format. Request for accommodation should be made at least five working days in advance of the hearing by contacting Roger Hamm at 785-296-2365. Handicapped parking is located in State Parking Lot No. 2, southeast of the Docking State Office Building facing 10th Street, and the east entrance to the Docking State Office Building is accessible.

A summary of the proposed amendments and their economic impact follows:

**93-6-2. Education requirements.** Course hours to obtain the registered mass appraiser designation are in-

creased from 180 to 200 hours. Mandatory course hours are increased from 140 hours to 170 hours. International Association of Assessing Officer's course 400 on assessment administration is added to the list of mandatory courses. The remaining course may be obtained from courses approved by the director of property valuation. The Department of Revenue estimates the cost of obtaining the registered mass appraisal designation will range from \$2,540 to \$7,700, depending on the courses selected. These costs will be borne by the registered mass appraiser, except where the county elects to pay for the courses. There will be no economic impact on the general public, except as indicated above.

**93-6-3. Continuing education requirements.** Of the 120 hours of continuing education required to maintain the registered mass appraiser designation, no fewer than 60 hours may be accumulated through tested appraisal courses. No more than 21 hours may be accumulated through Internet courses that include a non-proctored exam. The remaining hours may be seminar hours. The Department of Revenue estimates the cost of continuing education will range from \$415 to \$850 per year, depending on the courses selected. These costs will be borne by the registered mass appraiser, except where the county elects to pay for the courses. There will be no economic impact on the general public, except as indicated above.

**93-6-6. Reciprocity.** A candidate for the registered mass appraiser designation may file an application with the secretary of revenue to substitute one or more case studies required for a professional designation from the International Association of Assessing Officers for the case study requirements of K.A.R. 93-6-5. There is no economic impact.

Application for ambulance service permit and ambulance vehicle license; permit renewal and license renewal.** The proposed amendment allows for a service to have a long-term vehicle maintenance program that would eliminate the annual submission of the safety and mechanical inspection form and allow its maintenance records to be reviewed during the annual service inspection. This would eliminate the cost associated with a service sending its ambulances out to have the vehicle checked by a certified mechanic and completing the safety and mechanical inspection form and the cost associated with the inspection by the mechanic.

These changes are not mandated by federal law and there is no economic impact expected on the board or other governmental agencies. Private businesses, individuals or consumers of the service should see a positive economic impact.

## Request for Comments

The Kansas Department of Health and Environment is soliciting comments regarding a proposed air quality construction permit. Westar Energy, Inc. (Westar) has applied for an air quality construction permit in accordance with the provisions of K.A.R. 28-19-300 to initiate an emission reduction project at its Jeffrey Energy Center, Units 1 and 2 in St. Marys, Kansas. Emissions of oxides of nitrogen (NO<sub>x</sub>), carbon monoxide (CO) and carbon dioxide (CO<sub>2</sub>) were evaluated during the permit review process. Westar Energy, Inc., 818 S. Kansas Ave., P.O. Box 889, Topeka, 66601, proposes to initiate a NO<sub>x</sub> reduction project on Units 1 and 2 at the Jeffrey Energy Center located at 25905 Jeffrey Road, St. Marys, 66536.

The proposed permit is to be issued in accordance with the provisions of K.A.R. 28-19-350, prevention of significant deterioration (PSD), which adopt the federal standards, procedures and requirements of 40 CFR 52.21 by reference. These air quality regulations apply to major stationary emission sources located in areas designated as "attainment" under the federal Clean Air Act (CAA). Attainment areas are areas where the air quality meets or is better than the national ambient air quality standards (NAAQS).

The PSD regulations require evaluation of emission reduction techniques to identify the best available control technology (BACT) for each pollutant for which the emission rate exceeds the PSD significant level. The purpose of BACT is to affect the maximum degree of reduction achievable, taking into account energy, environmental and economic impacts for each pollutant under review. Evaluation of the estimated emissions for the proposed Jeffrey Energy Center Units 1 and 2 project indicates that the emission rate of carbon monoxide exceeds the significance level. Westar conducted the required BACT analysis for CO. The department has reviewed Westar's BACT analysis and concurs with its finding that good combustion practices are BACT for CO.

An ambient impact analysis was performed on the potential air emissions of CO from the proposed modifications to the existing burner and combustion system on Units 1 and 2. The CO screening modeling analysis demonstrated no significant impact on the one-hour or eight-hour ambient air quality and that the emissions would not cause or contribute to any violation of ambient air standards. The EPA has not established Class II maximum allowable increments for CO. Accordingly, no calculation of the potential consumption of increment is possible. No Class I areas are located within 100 km of the facility. Any federal land manager who has reason to believe he or she may have a Class I area adversely impacted by the emissions from the expansion project has the opportunity to present KDHE with analysis of the adverse impact on the air quality-related values of that Class I area during the comment period. No adverse impacts on soils and vegetation in the area are expected.

A public comment period has been established until October 14 to allow citizens the opportunity to express

any concerns they may have about this proposed permitting action. All comments should be submitted in writing to Rick Bolfig, KDHE, Bureau of Air, 1000 S.W. Jackson, Suite 310, Topeka, 66612-1366, or presented at the public hearing.

Any member of the public may request a public hearing be conducted to provide comments on the proposed issuance of the draft air quality construction permit. The request for a hearing shall be in writing and shall set forth the basis for the request. Written requests to hold a public hearing should be sent to the attention of Rick Bolfig at the address listed above or by fax to 785-291-3953 and must be received by noon October 14. If no pertinent requests to hold the public hearing are received by noon October 14, the public hearing will be cancelled. A notice of the cancellation will be posted at the KDHE website at <http://www.kdheks.gov/bar/publicnotice.html>.

If a pertinent request is received, a public hearing is tentatively scheduled by KDHE at 6 p.m. October 16 at the St. Marys City Hall, 200 S. 7th, St. Marys. The hearing will continue until audience members have an opportunity to submit comments.

If a hearing is conducted, all interested parties will be given a reasonable opportunity to present their views orally or by submission of written materials during the hearing. In order to give all parties an opportunity to present their views, it may be necessary to request that each participant limit oral presentations to a specific time limit.

**Article 15.—GRIEVANCE PROCEDURE FOR INMATES**

**44-15-204. Special procedures for sexual abuse grievances; sexual harassment grievances and grievances alleging retaliation for filing same; reports of sexual abuse or sexual harassment submitted by third parties.** (a) Definitions. For the purpose of this regulation, each of the following terms shall have the meaning specified in this subsection:

(1) "Sexual abuse of an inmate by another inmate" means any of the following acts if the victim does not consent, is coerced into the act by overt or implied threats of violence, or is unable to consent or refuse:

(A) Contact between the penis and the vulva or the penis and the anus, including penetration, however slight;

(B) contact between the mouth and the penis, vulva, or anus;

(C) penetration of the anal or genital opening of another person, however slight, by a hand, finger, or object; or

(D) any other intentional touching, either directly or through the clothing, of the genitalia, anus, groin, breast, inner thigh, or the buttocks of another person, excluding contact incidental to a physical altercation.

(2) "Sexual abuse of an inmate by a staff member, contractor, or volunteer" means any of the following acts, with or without the consent of the inmate:

(A) Contact between the penis and the vulva or the penis and the anus, including penetration, however slight;

(B) contact between the mouth and the penis, vulva, or anus;

(C) contact between the mouth and any body part if the staff member, contractor, or volunteer has the intent to abuse, arouse, or gratify sexual desire;

(D) penetration of the anal or genital opening, however slight, by a hand, finger, or object, that is unrelated to official duties or if the staff member, contractor, or volunteer has the intent to abuse, arouse, or gratify sexual desire;

(E) any other intentional contact, either directly or through the clothing, of or with the genitalia, anus, groin, breast, inner thigh, or the buttocks, that is unrelated to official duties or if the staff member, contractor, or volunteer has the intent to abuse, arouse, or gratify sexual desire;

(F) any attempt, threat, or request by a staff member, contractor, or volunteer to engage in the acts described in paragraphs (a)(2)(A)-(E);

(G) any display by a staff member, contractor, or volunteer of that individual's uncovered genitalia, buttocks, or breast in the presence of an inmate; or

(H) voyeurism by a staff member, contractor, or volunteer.

(3) "Voyeurism by a staff member, contractor, or volunteer" means an invasion of privacy of an inmate by staff for reasons unrelated to official duties, including peering at an inmate who is using a toilet in the inmate's cell to perform bodily functions; requiring an inmate to expose the inmate's buttocks, genitals, or breasts; or taking images of all or part of an inmate's naked body or of an inmate performing bodily functions.

(4) "Sexual harassment" means either of the following:

(A) Repeated and unwelcome sexual advances, requests for sexual favors, or verbal comments, gestures, or actions of a derogatory or offensive sexual nature by one inmate directed to another; or

(B) repeated verbal comments or gestures of a sexual nature to an inmate by a staff member, contractor, or volunteer, including demeaning references to gender, sexually suggestive or derogatory comments about body or clothing, or obscene language or gestures.

(b) Submission of grievances concerning sexual abuse.

(1) Each inmate submitting a grievance concerning sexual abuse alleged to have already occurred shall state that inmate's intentions by writing "Sexual Abuse Grievance" clearly on the grievance form.

(2) Inmates shall not be required to use any informal grievance process, or to otherwise attempt to resolve with staff, an alleged incident of sexual abuse by a staff member, contractor, or volunteer, or a grievance in which it is alleged that sexual abuse by another inmate or by a staff member, contractor, or volunteer was the result of staff neglect or violation of responsibilities.

(3) Any inmate may submit a grievance to security staff, a unit team member, or administrative personnel in person or by utilizing the inmate internal mail system.

(4) Any inmate who alleges sexual abuse may submit a grievance without submitting it to a staff member who is the subject of the complaint. The grievance shall not be referred to a staff member who is the subject of the complaint.

(c) Warden's response.

(1) Upon receipt of each grievance report form alleging sexual abuse, a serial number shall be assigned by the warden or designee, and the date of receipt shall be indicated on the form by the warden or designee.

(2) Each grievance alleging sexual abuse shall be returned to the inmate, with an answer, within 10 working days from the date of receipt.

(3) Each answer shall contain findings of fact, conclusions drawn, the reasons for those conclusions, and the action taken by the warden. Each answer shall inform the inmate that the inmate may appeal by submitting the appropriate form to the secretary of corrections.

(4) In all cases, the original and one copy of the grievance report shall be returned by the warden to the inmate. The copy shall be retained by the inmate for the inmate's files. The original may be used for appeal to the secretary if the inmate desires. The necessary copies shall be provided by the warden.

(5) A second copy shall be retained by the warden.

(6) Each facility shall maintain a file for grievance reports alleging sexual abuse, with each grievance report indexed by inmate name and coded as a sexual abuse complaint. Grievance report forms shall not be placed in the inmate's institution file.

(7) If no response is received from the warden in the time allowed, any grievance may be sent by an inmate to the secretary of corrections with an explanation of the reason for the delay, if known, with a notation that no response from the warden was received.

(d) Appeal to the secretary of corrections.

(1) If the warden's answer is not satisfactory to the inmate, the inmate may appeal to the secretary's office by indicating on the grievance appeal form exactly what the inmate is displeased with and what action the inmate believes the secretary should take.

(2) The inmate shall send the appeal directly and promptly by U.S. mail to the department of corrections' central office in Topeka.

(3) If an appeal of the warden's decision is made to the secretary, the secretary shall have 20 working days from receipt to return the grievance report form to the inmate with an answer. The answer shall include findings of fact, conclusions made, and actions taken.

(4) If a grievance report form is submitted to the secretary without prior action by the warden, the form may be returned to the warden for further action, at the option of the secretary's designee.

(5) In all cases, a final decision on the merits of any portion of a grievance alleging sexual abuse, or an appeal thereof, shall be issued by the secretary within 90 days of the initial filing of the grievance.

(6) Computation of the 90-day time period shall not include time taken by inmates in preparing and submitting any administrative appeal.

(7) At any level of the administrative process, including the final level, if the inmate does not receive a response within the time allotted for reply, including any properly noticed extension, the inmate may consider the absence of a response to be a denial at that level and may proceed to the next level of appeal.

(8) An appropriate official may be designated by the secretary to prepare the answer.

(e) Imminent sexual abuse.

(1) Each inmate submitting a grievance concerning imminent sexual abuse shall state that inmate's intentions
