2-Lane Reconstruction on 4-Lanes of Right-of-Way

The scope of the services is to prepare a set of plans for U.S. 83 from 2.5 miles north of the Haskell/Finney county line north to the Arkansas River Bridge, which includes the following: reconstruction of 2-lanes on offset alignment, development of right-of-way limits, and design for the future 4-lane expressway with partial access control. One set of passing lanes will also be constructed. Public involvement will be required as part of this project. Current plans are estimated to be 10 percent complete.

The Consultant Shortlist Committee will select three to five of the most highly qualified firms expressing interest and schedule an individual interview for the project. The consulting firms can more thoroughly discuss their experience related to the project at the interview and will

be expected to discuss their approach to this project in detail and the personnel to be assigned to this project. View categories at www.ksdot.org/divengdes/prequal.

The Consultant Selection Committee, appointed by the secretary of transportation, will conduct the discussions with the firms invited to the individual interview conferences. The committee will select one firm to perform the professional services required for completing the advertised project.

It is KDOT's policy to use the following criteria as the basis for selection of the consulting engineering firm:

1. Size and professional qualifications.
2. Experience of staff.
3. Location of firm with respect to project(s).
4. Work load of firm.
5. Firm's performance record.

The firm's accounting systems must have the following capabilities before the firm may be awarded a contract:

- Valid, reliable and current costs must be available within the system to support cost and pricing data.
- Capability to provide a means of measuring the reasonableness of incurred costs.
- Capability to identify and accumulate allowable costs by contract or project records that will reconcile with the general ledger.
- Ability to provide supporting documentation of actual expenditures for each billing, based on costs.

Effective January 1, 2014, Kansas is moving WORK services to an Alternative Benefit Plan (ABP) as directed by SHO #13-001 dated January 16, 2013. WORK services under the ABP will comply with Section 440.345 (EPSDT) and provisions of Section 5006(e) of the American Recovery and Reinvestment Act of 2009.

Kansas currently provides WORK services to Working Healthy eligible participants who meet a similar level of need for personal care services as persons in the HCBS I/DD, TBI and PD waivers. Current WORK consumers should not see any difference in the services they are currently receiving by the transfer of WORK into the ABP.

Medicaid anticipates the transfer of WORK services to the ABP to be cost neutral.

The Kansas Department for Children and Families (DCF), Faith-based and Community Initiatives, announces the release of a request for proposals to award a grant to an organization. The grantee will demonstrate expertise and capacity to assist fathers who are receiving government assistance and owe child support in the DCF East Region. The grant will fund services to fathers, through the replication of a pilot program developed by Connections to Success, for case management, mentoring, work readiness, fathering skills, relationship skills, financial management and family violence prevention training. These services have been shown to help low-income fathers find sustained employment, pay child support and improve their family relationships.

Eligible applicants include organizations that are located within the DCF East Region that (1) have experience effectively providing services to low-income families; (2) preferably, have been in business for five or more years with strong community partnerships; (3) have a volunteer-driven component with current active volunteers; (4) have some experience in job-placement for unemployed individuals; and (5) understand the barriers and obstacles of employment facing low-income families. DCF invites applications from government agencies; public universities and colleges; and private, nonprofit organizations, including faith-based and community organizations.

KDOT's approval is required to bid as a prime contractor. To bid as a prime contractor, KDOT needs to be notified of the intent to bid not later than the close of business on the Monday preceding the scheduled letting date. Failure to obtain prior approval to bid as a prime contractor on any projects listed below will be reason to reject the bid. The secretary of transportation reserves the right to reject bids that do not comply with all requirements for preparing a bidding proposal as specified in the 2007 edition of the Kansas Department of Transportation's *Standard Specifications for State Road and Bridge Construction*.

Kansas Ave., Suite 202, Topeka, on the proposal for the KDFFA to issue its Agricultural Development Revenue Bonds for the projects numbered below in the respective maximum principal amounts. The bonds will be payable solely from amounts received from the respective borrower, the obligation of which will be sufficient to pay the principal of, interest and redemption premium, if any, on the bonds when they become due.

The register identifies major classified streams, lakes and wetlands and the uses that are existing or attainable. Upon review since the last Kansas Surface Water Register dated De-

ember 15, 2010, 269 stream segments and three lakes are proposed for change of designated uses. Five new lakes are added with UAAs completed. Three new stream segments are added and two lakes are proposed for deletion (removed from classification).

Economic Impact:

Costs to the agency: The costs to KDHE of the updated and revised Kansas Surface Water Register adopted by the proposed amended regulation are from conducting the designated uses and recreational UAAs. Funds to cover the original designated use and recreational UAAs were specifically appropriated from the State Water Plan and state general funds. KDHE anticipates that any additional UAA work will be absorbed within the current budget and staff. Costs to implement the proposed amended regulation and updated Kansas Surface Water Register should not cause any significant annual cost increases.

Costs to the public: There are no known additional costs to the public of additional UAA work or implementing the proposed amended regulation.

Costs to other governmental agencies or units: There are no known additional costs associated with implementation of the proposed amended regulation.

Costs to the regulated community and consumers: The total estimated additional cost to the drinking water suppliers in the state is \$233,400 per year. There are approximately 1,000 drinking water suppliers in the state. Therefore, the average additional annual cost is estimated to be \$233 for each water supplier. The drinking water suppliers may increase the rates to their customers to offset the new proposed analytical fees.

Costs to other governmental agencies or units: Many of the drinking water suppliers in the state are operated by cities or rural water systems. The estimated additional \$233 per year may cause the drinking water suppliers to increase their rates. The rate increase would affect all customers including other government agencies.

Article 4.—CHILDREN’S INTERNET PROTECTION; PUBLIC LIBRARY REQUIREMENTS

54-4-1. Public library internet access policy; adoption and review. (a) The governing body of each public library shall adopt an internet access policy that meets the applicable requirements of subsection (b) and K.S.A. 2013 Supp. 75-2589, and amendments thereto.

(b) Each internet access policy shall meet the following requirements:

(1) State that the purpose of the policy is to restrict access to those materials that are child pornography, are harmful to minors, or are obscene;

(2) state how the public library will meet the applicable requirements of K.S.A. 2013 Supp. 75-2589, and amendments thereto;

(3) require the public library to inform its patrons of the procedures that library employees follow to enforce the applicable requirements of K.S.A. 2013 Supp. 75-2589, and amendments thereto; and

(4) require the public library to inform its patrons that procedures for the submission of complaints about the policy, the enforcement of the policy, and observed patron behavior have been adopted and are available for review.

(c) The governing body of each public library shall review its internet access policy at least once every three years. (Authorized by and implementing K.S.A. 2013 Supp. 75-2589; effective March 14, 2014.)
