Re: Automobiles and Other Vehicles—Publicly Owned Motor Vehicles—Private Use Forbidden; November 25, 2014

Synopsis: A vehicle is “publicly owned” for purposes of K.S.A. 8-301 if it is owned by a governmental entity, even if the governmental entity used private donations to purchase the vehicle. With the repeal of K.S.A. 8-307 in 1995, a violation of K.S.A. 8-301 is not a crime in itself, but some violations of K.S.A. 8-301 may constitute the crime of official misconduct under K.S.A. 2014 Supp. 21-6002(a)(1). Constitute Practice of Healing Arts to Others; Requirements and Limitations; December 18, 2014

Synopsis: Under K.S.A. 2014 Supp. 65-6119, paramedics are not strictly limited to working at the scene of a response or in an ambulance during patient transport. During emergencies, subsection (d)(3) of the statute allows paramedics to perform activities specifically authorized by medical protocols, even in hospital settings. Subsection (d)(2), which authorizes a paramedic to perform medical tasks while in voice contact with a physician or certain other health care professionals authorized by a physician, is not limited to emergency situations. To the extent Attorney General Opinion No. 90-134 reached a different conclusion, that opinion is withdrawn.

A physician may delegate medical tasks to an emergency medical services (EMS) attendant beyond those tasks specifically authorized in the EMS Act as long as the attendant is competent to perform the tasks, the delegation does not violate any other statute or regulation, and the other criteria for delegation specified in K.S.A. 2014 Supp. 65-28,127 are met. Re: Cities and Municipalities—General Provisions—City Retailers’ Sales Taxes; Use of Revenue; Technical Colleges; December 18, 2014

Synopsis: A city may levy a retailers’ sales tax for the purpose of providing funds to a technical college if doing so serves a valid public purpose. If the electors of a city, by voting to approve a proposed sales tax, determine that providing funds to a technical college serves a valid public purpose, a court would likely defer to that judgment. Re: Cities and Municipalities—Miscellaneous Provisions—Firearms and Ammunition; Regulation by City or County, Limitations

State Departments; Public Officers and Employees—Firearms—Personal and Family Protection Act; December 23, 2014

Synopsis: A city may not invoke the federal Gun-Free School Zones Act (GFSZA) to prohibit the carrying of firearms inside city buildings located within a school zone. A city may not prohibit the carrying of concealed handguns by persons licensed to do so except as provided by the Personal and Family Protection Act and K.S.A. 2014 Supp. 12-16,124. A city may not adopt regulations governing the carrying of firearms into city buildings except as provided by K.S.A. 2014 Supp. 12-16,124.
