#### Scope of Work

KDOT seeks a consultant to lead the development of a statewide Active Transportation Plan and Economic Impact Study (Plan) to: assess pedestrian and bicycle transportation infrastructure, practices, policies, and needs; develop an evaluation plan; make clear the connections between pedestrian/bicycle facilities and safety, transportation, economic development, health promotion, retainment of young talent, recreation, tourism, etc.; promote public awareness of the need for transportation choices in all future planning; develop a vision and goals to increase cycling and walking in the state; and develop

a plan of action over the course of 10 years to accomplish identified performance indicators.

#### Qualifications-Based Selection Process

No cost or pricing information shall be submitted with the Letter of Interest and will not be considered in the selection process to shortlist or rank proposals. Based on the qualifications submitted in the Letter of Interest and other information available to KDOT, on or about October 1, 2019 KDOT will shortlist up to five firms and notify all firms submitting Letters of Interest of the names of the shortlisted firms by return email. Thereafter, KDOT will issue a Request for Proposal (RFP) to the shortlisted firms soliciting a technical proposal. At KDOT's option, shortlisted firms may be interviewed by telephone conference call or asked to attend meetings or participate in other discussions with KDOT. Technical proposals will be evaluated on the basis of the factors listed below, evenly weighted, to rank the most qualified firm in order of preference as first, second, and third: 1) the quality of the response to the RFP; 2) qualifications and experience of consultant personnel proposed for services; 3) proposed (typical and atypical) approach to performance, data gathering, as well as efficiency and accuracy of services; and 4) past performance history. The highest ranked firm will be asked to enter into negotiations with KDOT for a contract, with compensation provisions for payment of actual direct costs plus fixed fee, subject to an upper limit of compensation. In the event KDOT cannot reach agreement with the highest ranked firm, it will terminate negotiations with such firm and commence negotiations with the next highest ranked firm, and so on, until either agreement is reached for a satisfactory scope of services for a fair and reasonable price, or KDOT decides to pursue other alternatives.

The firm's accounting systems must have the following capabilities before the firm may be awarded a contract.

- Valid, reliable, and current costs must be available within the system to support actual costs and pricing data.
- Capability to provide a means of measuring the reasonableness of incurred costs.
- Capability to identify and accumulate allowable costs by contract or project records which will reconcile with the general ledger.

#### **Executive Order No. 19-10 Establishing the Governor's Council on Medicaid Expansion**

**WHEREAS**, the future of Kansas depends on strong, healthy communities;

**WHEREAS**, life expectancy in Kansas has fallen below the national average, with the 7th highest rate of cervical cancer; 8th highest rate of death by diabetes, and 11th highest rate of non-elderly adults with pre-existing medical conditions;

**WHEREAS**, based on the latest estimates from the U.S. Census Bureau, 201,275, or 12%, of non-elderly Kansas adults went without health insurance in 2017;

**WHEREAS**, studies show that access to health insurance improves affordability of medical care, increases access to prescription drugs, and improves the likelihood of seeking preventative care so that chronic conditions can be diagnosed earlier and treated more effectively;

**WHEREAS**, rural hospitals in non-expansion states, such as Kansas, are six times more likely to close than rural hospitals in states that have expanded Medicaid;

**WHEREAS**, Medicaid expansion is associated with decreases in mortality for all causes, reduced reliance on emergency room care, and improvements in infant mortality, cancer screenings, and vaccinations;

**WHEREAS**, nearly one-third of uninsured Kansans who would qualify for Medicaid expansion experienced mental illness or substance abuse disorder within the last year, but less than 14% received treatment, largely due to lack of access to affordable care; and

**WHEREAS**, Kansas will forego more than \$2 billion in business activity and \$1.2 billion in gross state product through the end of this decade by not expanding Medicaid; and

**WHEREAS**, expanding Medicaid has proven to create jobs, boost state economies, strengthen state budgets, and protect rural hospitals;

**WHEREAS**, Kansas is uniquely positioned to benefit from lessons learned by the 36 other states that have already implemented expansion, submitted a Section 1115 Waiver to CMS, or are in the process of doing so;

(continued)

**WHEREAS**, it is critical that elected leaders and stakeholders understand the differing approaches of other expansion states in order to adopt best practices and avoid the risky, financially devastating experiments that damaged Medicaid expansion efforts elsewhere; and

**WHEREAS**, upholding values of transparency, inclusion, and accountability between legislators, healthcare stakeholders, industry executives, advocates, health policy experts, and our broader Kansas community will aid in the development of a successful, efficient plan to expand Medicaid in Kansas in 2020.

**NOW, THEREFORE**, pursuant to the authority vested in me as Governor of the State of Kansas, I hereby establish the Governor's Council on Medicaid Expansion ("Council"):

1. The Governor shall appoint the following to serve as members of the Council:
  - a. One representative from each of the following agencies, organizations, or constituencies:
    - i. Kansas Department of Health and Environment
    - ii. Kansas Hospital Association
    - iii. Community Care Network of Kansas
    - iv. Association of Community Mental Health Centers
    - v. Kansas Medical Society
  - b. At least one representative from a managed care organization.
  - c. At least one representative from the business community.
  - d. At least one representative of a community health foundation.
  - e. Representatives or members of non-profit organizations who have expertise in areas that could assist in advancing the goals, strategies, and operations of the Council.
  - f. Additional individuals the Governor determines have relevant experience or qualifications.
2. The Governor shall invite twelve legislators—including both Democrats and Republicans of both the Senate and House—to participate in the Council.
3. The Governor shall select an independent meeting facilitator to establish rules for the Council's meetings and conduct of business.
4. Members shall receive no compensation or reimbursements for expenses and shall serve voluntarily. Officers or employees of state agencies who are appointed to the Council as part of their duties shall be authorized to participate on the Council and may claim subsistence, allowance, mileage, or associated expenses from their respective agency budgets as permitted by law.
5. The Council shall be subject to the Kansas Open Records Act and the Kansas Open Meetings Act.
6. Plans, reports, or recommendations of any nature adopted by the Council shall be considered advice

to the Governor, and shall not be construed as official policies, positions, or interpretations of laws, rules, or regulations by any department or agency of state government, nor shall any such department or agency be bound in any manner to consider such advice when conducting their advisory and regulatory affairs.

7. The Council may:
  - a. publicly convene nonpartisan health policy experts to analyze and discuss other state models for Medicaid expansion,
  - b. inform and advise the Governor on the most common or effective models of Medicaid expansion in other states and on whether and how those models can be successfully applied and implemented in Kansas, or
  - c. using the most updated data available, identify three to five broad guideposts or goals for a Kansas Medicaid expansion plan to aid legislators and the public in the development of a proposal for the 2020 legislative session.
8. The Council shall be facilitated by the National Governors Association with staffing assistance from other state employees, experts, or organizations as appropriate.
9. The Council shall meet at least three times before January 2020 and otherwise as often as the facilitator determines necessary.
10. The Council shall submit a report in December 2019 detailing its work and recommendations as described above.

This document shall be filed with the Secretary of State as Executive Order No. 19-10. It shall become effective immediately and remain in force until rescinded.

A general discussion and workshop meeting on the business of the Wildlife, Parks and Tourism Commission will begin at 1:30 p.m. November 14, 2019 at the location listed above. The meeting will recess at approximately 5:00 p.m. and then resume at 6:30 p.m. at the same location for the regulatory hearing and more business.



There will be public comment periods at the beginning of the afternoon and evening meeting for any issues not on the agenda and additional comment periods will be available during the meeting on agenda items. Old and new business may also be discussed at this time. If necessary to complete business matters, the Commission will reconvene at 9:00 a.m. November 15, 2019 at the location listed above.

Any individual with a disability may request accommodation in order to participate in the public meeting and may request the meeting materials in an accessible format. In addition to the previously published notice, this 60-day notice period prior to the hearing constitutes a public comment period for the purpose of receiving written public comments on the proposed administrative regulations.

All interested parties will be given a reasonable opportunity at the hearing to express their views orally in regard to the adoption of the proposed regulations. During the hearing, all written and oral comments submitted by interested parties will be considered by the commission as a basis for approving, amending and approving, or rejecting the proposed regulations.

The regulations, in addition to the previously published notice, that will be heard during the regulatory hearing portion of the meeting are as follows:

**K.A.R. 115-4-2.** This permanent regulation sets general provisions for big game and wild turkey. The proposed amendments would allow the use of electronic carcass tagging as the agency moves towards electronic licensing and permitting.

**Economic Impact Summary:** No substantial negative economic impact to the department, other state agencies, small businesses, or individual members of the public is anticipated.

**K.A.R. 115-7-3.** This permanent regulation provides for taking and use of baitfish or minnows. The proposed amendments would require that crayfish, leeches, amphibians and mussels that are used as fishing bait conform to the same requirements for baitfish to reduce the risk of transmission of invasive species.

**Economic Impact Summary:** No substantial negative economic impact to the department, other state agencies, small businesses, or individual members of the public is anticipated.

**K.A.R. 115-7-4.** This permanent regulation sets requirements for fish processing and possession. The proposed amendments would allow use of electronic carcass tagging as the agency moves towards electronic licensing and permitting.

**Economic Impact Summary:** No substantial negative economic impact to the department, other state agencies, small businesses, or individual members of the public is anticipated.

**K.A.R. 115-25-5.** This exempt regulation sets the fall season, bag limit and permits for turkeys. The proposed version of the regulation would close the fall season in three of the five currently open units.

**Economic Impact Summary:** The proposed version of the regulation is expected to reduce fees to the department in the amount of \$82,884 and the collateral economic impact to the State of Kansas will be an estimated reduction of \$5,308,560. Otherwise, no substantial negative economic impact to the department, other state agencies, small businesses, or individual members of the public is anticipated.

**K.A.R. 115-25-6.** This exempt regulation sets the spring season, bag limit, permits and game tags. The proposed version of the regulation would reduce the spring bag limit for turkeys in three units from two birds to one bird.

**Economic Impact Summary:** The reduction in bag limit is estimated to reduce fees collected by the department in the amount of \$243,810. The collateral economic benefit to the State of Kansas for the spring turkey season is estimated to be \$58,135,600. Otherwise, no substantial negative economic impact to the department, other state agencies, small businesses, or individual members of the public is anticipated.

Permanent Administrative Regulation

Article 47. — AUDITS

**7-47-1. Audit implementation.** The requirements of this regulation shall not apply to local question elections, mail-ballot elections pursuant to K.S.A. 25-431 through 25-441 and amendments thereto, or statewide constitutional amendments.

(a) As used in K.S.A. 25-3009 and amendments thereto, the term "unofficial election night returns" shall include ballots cast and counted on election day, ballots cast in advance and counted on election day, and ballots cast by means of the uniformed and overseas citizens absentee voting act (UOCAVA) procedures and counted on election day. This term shall not include any ballots cast that are challenged or marked as provisional or any ballots that are cast in advance and received after election day.

(b) Training shall be provided by the secretary of state to each county election officer. Each county election offi-

(continued)

cer shall provide training to the election board, as specified in K.S.A. 25-3009 and amendments thereto, conducting the postelection audit. The training shall include the identification of voter intent specific to the vote-casting technologies in use across Kansas.

(c)(1) An auditable race and precinct shall be a race and precinct meeting the requirements in K.S.A. 25-3009, and amendments thereto, for an audit to be conducted. The random selection of races and precincts shall take place in a public setting, and the procedure to randomize the selection of races and precincts shall be determined solely by each county election officer and the secretary of state. Upon completion of the audit, each election board shall transmit to the secretary of state and the county election office the results of the audit no later than 48 hours before the meeting of the county board of canvassers.

(2) In even-year elections, within 24 hours of the closing of the final polling location in Kansas, the list of randomly selected races to be audited shall be transmitted

by the secretary of state to each county election officer. Each county election officer shall examine each race in the order specified until an auditable race is determined. Each county election officer shall then randomly select one percent of the total county precincts from the subset of auditable precincts. If no contested race exists, the election board shall audit the first race listed.

(3) In odd-year elections, each county election officer shall randomly select the races and then each precinct to be audited.

Ballot images may be used for the manual audit if imaging technology exists during the tabulation process on election night. (Authorized by and implementing K.S.A. 2018 Supp. 25-3009; effective, T-7-6-26-19, June 26, 2019; effective Sept. 27, 2019.)
